BULLS NOTEBOOK: FIVE NOTES FOR WEEK SEVEN

1. CLIMBING THE RANKS

After a win over No. 20 UConn the Bulls jumped from 16 to 7 in the latest RPI rankings. RPI is determined based on a team's wins and losses and strength of schedule. In the NSCAA Coaches Poll, the Bulls jumped from No. 24 to No. 18 to be the highest ranked team in the American Athletic Conference.

2. DEFENSE WINS GAMES

After a stellar weekend on the backline and in goal, senior Jackie Simpson and sophomore Kat Elliott were named conference players of the week. Simpson earned the Defensive Player of the Week honor after scoring the game-winning goal against No. 20 UConn Thursday night. Simpson also led a backline that allowed no goals and held Temple to just seven shots. Elliott was named the Goalkeeper of the Week for the third time this season after tallying a career-high eight saves against UConn and earning two shutout wins.

3. CONFERENCE STREAK

Dating back to last season, the Bulls are on a nine-game unbeaten streak against conference opponents (including the conference tournament). In regular season conference games, the Bulls are on a six-game winning streak, the longest streak in the conference. USF was the only team to open conference play with two wins as every other team had a least one loss or tie.

4. ROAD WARRIORS

USF boasts a 4-1-1 record away from Corbett Stadium this season. USF started off the season on the road and picked up a 2-1, double overtime win at Baylor. The Bulls have also defeated Troy, South Alabama and Charlotte away from home. USF tied No. 8 Clemson and fell to No. 17 Texas Tech on the road. The Bulls have five more road games this season and will finish conference play with three straight road matches.

5. BULLS BOAST DEPTH

22 different Bulls have seen action on the field this season in at least one match with 13 appearing in all nine. Through nine contests, the Bulls have scored 21 goals off the feet of nine different players. Six players have recorded multiple goals, led by Olivia Chance with six and Ocean Parr with four.

HEAD COACH DENISE SCHILTE-BROWN



Schilte-Brown is in her ninth year at the helm of the University South Florida women's soccer program and 17th year as a head coach overall with stops at Virginia Commonwealth and her alma mater, University of Maryland-Baltimore County. In her eight seasons at USF, Schilte-Brown has amassed a record of 61-49-25 and a 145-114-37 slate overall. She has led the Bulls to four BIG EAST Championship appearances in her six previous seasons and has only missed two postseason conference tournaments in 15 seasons. Under Schilte-Brown, the Bulls advanced to the program's first ever NCAA Tournament in 2010, where they knocked off Auburn in the first round.

QUICK HITTERS

- The first RPI rankings of the season have the Bulls as the highest ranked team in the American Conference at 16. Clemson, the Bulls' opponent on Sept. 13, has the top RPI in the country.
- Kat Elliott earned her third American Goalkeeper of the Week honor after posting two shutouts and setting a career high with eight saves against UConn.
- Jackie Simpson was named the American Defensive Player of the Week after scoring the game-winning goal against UConn
- USF defeated ECU and Cincinnati each twice last season. The Bulls topped both teams in the regular season before defeating them once more in the conference tournament to advance to the finals.
- The Bulls have held opponents to just five goals and are limiting the opposition to just 9.9 shots per game. USF has outscored opponents 23-5 and is averaging 18.7 shots per game.
- The Bulls' 7-1-1 non-conference record is the best non-conference record since 1998 and is the best in the Denise Schilte-Brown era.
- Nine different players have scored at least one goal this season with five recording multiple goals. Eight players have recorded at least one assist and six players have recorded a goal and an assist.

GAME TWELVE-CINCINNATI

The Bearcats are 6-2-4 overall and are riding a seven-match unbeaten streak. Cincinnati started off conference play against SMU and Houston, going 1-0-1 on the weekend. The Bearcats and Mustangs played to a 2-2 draw and defeated the Cougars 1-0.

Danielle Rotheram leads the Bearcats with 15 points (six goals, three assists) on the season. Rotheram recorded a hat trick for Cincinnati earlier this season and has played in all 12 games. In goal, Natalie Smith and Sam Pavlika have split time with each allowing five goals on the season. Pavlika boasts a 4-0-3 record while Smith sits at 2-2-1.

GAME THIRTEEN-EAST CAROLINA

ECU is 6-5-1 on the season and 1-1-0 in conference play after splitting the opening weekend. The Pirates topped Houston before falling to SMU to open their conference slate. ECU has allowed 13 goals on the season, while scoring 13 of their own.

Leading the way for the Pirates is Lana Spitler with 13 points (five goals, three assists). Kendall Frey is just behind with 10 points (three goals, four assists). In goal, Sandra Baron has played every minute of every game this season while recording 36 saves.

LAST TIME OUT

The Bulls have won their last six regular season conference matches and have a nine-game undefeated streak including last year's conference tournament. USF began the 2015 conference season with back-to-back shutout wins over No. 20 UConn and Temple. The Bulls avenged last season's defeat in the conference tournament by picking up a 1-0 win over the Huskies on Thursday night.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Bulls return home to Corbett Stadium for the final two home matches of the season. USF will face Tulsa on Thursday, Oct. 8 and Memphis on Sunday, Oct. 11. The Memphis game will be Senior Day and the seven seniors will be honored during pregame.
