THE BREAKDOWN

- Fresno State enters the 2022-23 season bringing back eight returners which includes four seniors in Jemarl Baker, Jordan Campbell, Anthony Holland and Isaiah Hill along with juniors Destin Whitaker, Donovan Yap and Leo Colimerio and sophomore Steven Vasquez.
- Hill is the Bulldogs' leading returning scorer (10.1 PPG) and Holland is the top returning rebounder (6.2 RPG).
- Fresno State head coach Justin Hutson is in his fifth season back home in the Central Valley and sports a 70-54 overall record, which includes two 23-win seasons (2018-19 and 2021-22).
- The Bulldogs are coming off a 23-win campaign in 2021-22 and a postseason title after winning The Basketball Classic in April.
- Seven new players have joined the program: guards Jordan Brinson (Salt Lake CC), Alexander Gorton (Palm Beach Atlantic), Joseph Hunter (San Joaquin Memorial HS) and Jeff Sims (Santa Rosa Academy) joining forward Isaih Moore (Southern Miss) and centers Chuks Isitua (IUPUI) and Eduardo Andre (Nebraska).

BULLDOG BONES

OPENING TIP

- Fresno State will host the San Francisco Dons on Wednesday at 7 p.m. PT at the Save Mart Center.
- Tickets for the game start at \$10 (free for Fresno State and high school students with valid ID).
- The game will be broadcast on FOX26.2 (TV), the MWN (online) and the Bulldog Sports Network (radio).
- Fresno State is seeking its first win over USF since a 78-71 home win over the Dons on Nov. 19, 2015.
- Fresno State has won three of the last five games in the all-time series (3-1 all-time at the Save Mart Center).
- This is the second game in a six-game stretch of the Bulldogs exclusively playing KenPom Top 150 teams, who also all finished in the NET Top 150 at the end of last season.

NATIONAL RESPECT IN COMPUTER RANKINGS, PROJECTIONS

- Fresno State is currently ranked No. 65 in the nation in the 2023 T-Rank College Basketball Projections, which accounts for roster makeup and scheduling in performance projection analytics.
- The T-Rank projections feature eight Mountain West teams in the Top 100, including five in the Top 70.
- Through games played on Nov. 14, 2022, Fresno State is the fourth-highest rated MW program in the T-Rank projections (San Diego State [16], Utah State [30], Wyoming [63], Fresno State [65]).
- Fresno State is currently ranked No. 111 in the 2023 Pomeroy College Basketball Ratings.

HILL NETS DOUBLE-DIGITS ON NEUTRAL FLOOR AGAINST BIG WEST FAVORITE, UCSB

- Fresno State senior guard Isaiah Hill scored 12 points (5-for-5 FT) in the Bulldogs' 61-54 loss to Big West preseason favorite UCSB on Veterans Day at Kaiser Permanente Arena in Santa Cruz, Calif.

MOORE PRODUCES DOUBLE-DOUBLE IN BULLDOG DEBUT

- Fresno State senior forward Isaih Moore, who is from Columbia, S.C., scored 19 points (5-for-5 FT) and added 10 rebounds (four offensive) in the Bulldogs' season-opening 69-66 win over Fresno Pacific on Nov. 9.
- Moore's double-double was the first in a Bulldog debut since Torren Jones had 13 points and 14 rebounds in a thrilling 69-66 win over Pepperdine back on Nov. 13, 2015.
- This was also the first time a Bulldog has scored at least 19 points in a debut since Braxton Huggins scored 23 points in a season-opening win in 2018.

NOTHING BUT NET

- Fresno State ranked No. 77 in the final 2021-22 NCAA Men's Basketball NET Rankings (April 4, 2022), but the Bulldogs were No. 73 on Selection Sunday, which made their all of their home games count as Quad 1 contests and neutral site and road games as Quad 2 for their opponents.
- Last season, the Bulldogs ranked as high No. 45 nationally in the NET entering MW play (Dec. 27, 2022).
- Fresno State had checked in at No. 93 in the first release of the 2021-22 season (Dec. 5, 2022).
- In 2022-23, Fresno State will play three nonconference games against teams ranked in the Top 75 of the NET at the end of last season (San Francisco [26], North Texas [55] and Saint Mary's [19] or Vanderbilt [62]).
- The NCAA's NET rankings assist the NCAA Tournament selection committee seed and select at-large bids.

OPENING SUCCESS

- Fresno State is 11-0 in home openers since joining the Mountain West (23 straight wins in home openers).
- Fresno State is 82-19 all-time in home openers and 75-26 all-time in season openers.

THIS-AND-THAT

- Fresno State has won 32 consecutive contests against non-Division I opponents. The Bulldogs' last loss to a non-D-I opponent was a 62-60 home loss to Sonoma State at Selland Arena on Dec. 8, 1989.
- Fresno State is 16-4 when Anthony Holland has scored 10 or more points (20-5: 9 or more points • 21-6: 8 or more points).
- Fresno State is 12-4 when Jordan Campbell has scored 10 or more points (12-2 when Campbell makes a 3-pointer).

DIALING UP THE HEAT ON D

- Last season, Fresno State ranked fifth in the nation in scoring defense (59.4 ppg allowed).
- Fresno State has limited its opponents to fewer than 70 points in 32 of its last 38 games, including in both games this season.
- Fresno State limited its opponents to fewer than 70 points in 31 of its 36 games during the 2021-22 season.
- Fresno State limited five of its opponents to 43 points or less during 2021-22 season.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

"I come from a family of educators. My father was a teacher. My aunt was a teacher. Academics are very important to me. It's in my DNA." - Fresno State head coach Justin Hutson

- Fresno State was rewarded for a second straight season with the NABC Team Academic Excellence Award (team GPA 3.0 or higher) with Baker and former Bulldog Orlando Robinson being named to the 2021-22 NABC Honors Court (GPA 3.2 or higher).
- Eight Bulldogs were named Academic All-Mountain West with Baker earning MW Scholar-Athlete honors.

NEW ADDITIONS ON HUTSON'S STAFF

For the first time since being hired in 2018, Fresno State head coach Justin Hutson had to hire new assistant coaches after a season. Vonn Webb and Nelson Hernandez were hired as assistant coaches this summer to fill the positions vacated by Tarvish Felton (New Mexico) and Tim Shelton (Oregon State). Hutson also added former Sacramento State head coach Jerome Jenkins as Special Assistant to the Head Coach and promoted Jazmin Pulido to Assistant Director of Basketball Operations.

BULLDOG BONES (THE JUSTIN HUTSON ERA)

- In Hutson's tenure (since 2018), Fresno State is 24-0 when shooting at least 50 percent from the field (27 straight wins dating back to February 2018 prior to Hutson's hiring in April 2018).
- Fresno State is 7-0 when scoring at least 90 points (22-2 when scoring at least 80 points).
- Fresno State is 26-3 when allowing under 60 points (1-0 this season).
- Fresno State is 41-8 when making 45 percent or more of its field goal attempts.
- Fresno State is 53-10 when having the same or better A-T/O ratio than its opponent (1-0 this season).
- Fresno State is 29-6 when at least four Bulldogs score 10 or more points.
- Fresno State is 9-0 when at least five Bulldogs score 10 or more points.
- Since the start of the 2020-21 season, two Bulldogs have had 10 rebounds in the same game four times:
 - >>> 12/19/20 [vs. Fresno Pacific]: Robinson (11) & Holland (10)
 - >>> 3/10/21 [vs. New Mexico • MW First Round • Las Vegas]: Robinson (12) & Holland (10)
 - >>> 1/11/22 [vs. San Jose State]: Robinson (12) & Holland (11)
 - >>> 1/28/22 [vs. Boise State]: Holland (10) & Colimerio (10)
- Fresno State has only been outscored by autonomy-five conference schools [TCU, Northwestern, Miami, Cal (three times), Oregon and Utah] by a combined score of 545-547 (-2).

FRESNO STATE CONTENDING IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

Since joining the Mountain West in 2012, Fresno State has won the 2016 conference tournament championship and finished as high as second in the regular season. The Bulldogs have finished no lower than seventh in league play in its first 10 seasons in the Mountain West, which includes six first round byes in the MW Tournament. In the last seven MW campaigns, the 'Dogs won an average of 10.3 MW contests per year -- twice going 13-5 against MW opponents, including Hutson's first season at Fresno State during the 2018-19 season. Fresno State has averaged nearly 10 conference victories per season (9.7) in Hutson's first four seasons as the Bulldogs' head coach.

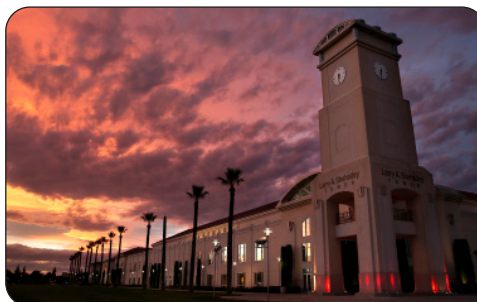

Since 2003, the Save Mart Center has served as the home of the Fresno State men's and women's basketball programs. The arena is also currently the home venue for the Bulldogs' volleyball programs and recognized around the nation as being one of the finest on-campus collegiate arenas. The Save Mart Center was named the No. 2 top collegiate venue by Pollstar in 2015, the leading trade publication for the concert and entertainment industry.

With its size, scope, unique architectural features and video, sound and telecom systems, the Save Mart Center serves as a major provider of entertainment and sporting events in the San Joaquin Valley.

Seating capacity for the arena ranges from 15,000 to 18,000 seats, with 15,596 listed as the official number for basketball.

The Save Mart Center is a premier entertainment destination for headline events and tours. Designed by Sink Combs Dethlefs (Denver, Colo.), the Save Mart Center is approximately 450,000 square feet and contains 32 private suites, 1,000 Arena Builder seats (commonly referred to as "club seats"), a club level concourse, team locker rooms and athletics training facilities. The entire facility is approximately 48 acres and located off Shaw Avenue adjacent to Highway 168.

The total project value exceeded \$100 million and represented the largest privately funded project in the history of the California State University system. The Save Mart Center was financed through revenue from corporate sponsorships, private gifts, leasing of luxury suites, sale of Arena Builder and personal seat licenses, as well as revenue from advertising and signage agreements.

Next to the Save Mart Center is the West Complex, a \$17.6 million, two-story, 92,000-square-foot building which features the Student Recreation Center, the Lyles Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship and the Leon and Pete Peters Educational Research Center.

The Save Mart Center has hosted four major collegiate sporting championships, which most recently came in March 2012 when Fresno State hosted an NCAA women's basketball championship regional for the second time.

In March 2004, the facility served as the host site for the McCaffrey Western Athletic Conference Basketball Tournament. The following year, the Save Mart Center was the venue for the first and second rounds of the 2005 NCAA women's basketball championship. In 2007 and 2012, Fresno State was one of four schools that hosted the regional semifinals and championship games for the NCAA women's basketball tournament.

 Travelling EAST: Take the Highway 180 exit (east) from Freeway 99. Continue to the Highway 168 exit (Clovis). Take the Shaw Avenue exit, turn left, and head west to the campus.

TRAVELING EAST (FROM CENTRAL COAST):

Take Freeway 41 North and exit on Shaw Avenue. Make a right and head East on Shaw for 2 miles. The arena is located just west of Chestnut and Shaw Avenue.

FROM THE AIRPORT:

Go West on Clinton Way. Make a right on Cedar Avenue. Go North on Cedar Avenue until you get to Shaw Avenue. Make a right on Shaw Avenue. The arena is located just east of Fresno State.

2022-23 SEASON PREVIEW: RISING IN THE MW

2022-23 SCHEDULE OVERVIEW

The excitement is continuing to build for the 2022-23 Fresno State men's basketball season, which officially tipped off at the Save Mart Center in November 2022.

In October 2022, the Bulldogs released their nonconference schedule in coordination with the announcement of the Mountain West national television package.

Fresno State, who went 23-13 last season and won the 2022 The Basketball Classic in April, begins its 2022-23 regular season slate on Nov. 7 when the Bulldogs host the Fresno Pacific Sunbirds.

At least four 2022 NCAA Tournament teams will visit the Save Mart Center during the 2022-23 campaign, including San Francisco (Nov. 16), Wyoming (Dec. 28), San Diego State (Feb. 15) and Colorado State (Feb. 18).

NATIONAL EXPOSURE FOR THE BULLDOGS

The Bulldogs will once again get national exposure in November during Feast Week by playing in the 2022 Paycom Wooden Legacy, which also features Washington, Saint Mary's College and Vanderbilt, on the ESPN Family of Networks.

This is Fresno State's second appearance in the Wooden Legacy - previously playing in the Southern California-based tournament in 2018 when it had an eight-team field with the Bulldogs earning a third-place finish with wins over Miami and Hawai'i and a close loss to Miami on the campus of Cal State Fullerton. This season's event will be played at the Anaheim Convention Center.

Last fall, Fresno State won the 2021 Venue Twin Southern California Challenge with victories over Santa Clara and Pepperdine on CBS Sports Network (CBSSN).

Fresno State will also have 10 of its MW games broadcast on either CBSSN or FS1, with the other eight on the Mountain West Network this season, including up to seven also included in a local television package on CW59 via LEARFIELD.

FOUR STARTERS RETURN FOR THE 2022-23 SEASON

With four returning starters - **Isaiah Hill** (10.1 PPG), **Anthony Holland** (9.6 PPG), **Jordan Campbell** (7.1 PPG) and **Leo Colimerio** (5.3 PPG), Fresno State returns most of its core rotation from last season's championship season, while also adding seven new players to its roster.

The Bulldogs will need to replace the production of Orlando Robinson, who finished his collegiate career ranked No. 12 on the program's all-time scoring list (1,415 points in 90 games over three seasons). Robinson was a national defensive All-American in 2021-22 and also earned First Team All-MW honors in 2022.

In addition to the four returning starters, Hunter also brings back Jemarl Baker, Jr. (Kentucky/Arizona), Steven Vasquez, Destin Whitaker and Donovan Yap (UNLV) for the 2022-23 season.

HUNTER NAMED PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Fresno State's Joseph Hunter was named the 2022-23 Preseason Mountain West Men's Basketball Freshman of the Year, the conference office announced on Oct. 19 before the start of the league's virtual media days.

Hunter, who prepped at San Joaquin Memorial High School in Fresno, is one of the highest-rated high school recruits in program history and now the first Bulldog to earn preseason MW Freshman of the Year honors.

Hunter was a four-star recruit out of San Joaquin Memorial and ranked as one of the nation's Top 100 recruits (No. 64 overall, No. 5 shooting guard nationally and the No. 8 recruit in California), according to 247 Sports.

A two-time CIF Champion (2018-19 & 2019-20), Hunter led the Central Section as a senior in 2021-22 with an average of 31.8 points per game and finished with 2,337 career points - sixth best in section history and second best in school history behind Jalen Green, who was drafted No. 3 overall by the Houston Rockets in 2021. Hunter also averaged seven rebounds, seven assists and a steal per game for the Panthers this past season while leading Memorial to a 23-8 overall record and a 10-0 championship run in the County/Metro Athletic Conference.

Hunter broke San Joaquin Memorial's program record for most points in a game (54 against Madera South in February 2022 - the previous mark was 52 points, set by Roscoe Pondexter in 1971) and was named the Fresno Bee's Boys Basketball Player of the Year.

Hunter, a pre-business major, chose to attend Fresno State to represent for his hometown and achieve his dreams and make the NBA - like 31 other Bulldogs have done in the program's history.

BULLDOGS PICKED TO FINISH 7TH IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

With the Mountain West on the rise after sending four teams to the NCAA Tournament in 2022, the conference is loaded with veteran teams stocked with talented transfers, experienced returners and some elite, and potentially high-impact, freshmen, like Hunter.

Fresno State was rated as high as No. 64 nationally (fourth in the MW) in the 2023 T-Rank College Basketball Projections, which accounts for roster makeup and scheduling in performance projection analytics, and featured seven MW teams in the preseason Top 100 in the nation, as of Oct. 19, 2022.

In the official 2022-23 MW Predicted Order of Finish, as voted on by a select group of MW media, Fresno State was picked to finish seventh.

2021-22 SEASON REVIEW: BULLDOGS WIN CHAMPIONSHIP IN APRIL

FRESNO STATE WINS 2021 VENUE TWIN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA CHALLENGE

- Fresno State won the 2021 Venue Twin Southern California Surf Division Championship - a multi-team event, including one home game and two neutral site games at JSerra Pavillion in San Juan Capistrano, Calif., in late November.
- Fresno State's **Orlando Robinson** was named the Surf Division Most Valuable Player and to the all-tournament team while leading the 'Dogs to a 3-0 record (all three wins were by exactly seven points each).
- Robinson averaged 21.7 points (22-for-41 FG, 53.7 percent), 8.0 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 1.3 blocks per game to lead the Bulldogs to a home win over Idaho and neutral site victories over Pepperdine and Santa Clara at JSerra.
- In the championship game, Fresno State held Santa Clara, who entered averaging 88 points per contest on 55 percent shooting, to a then season-low 52 points on a 36 percent clip from the field.
- Fresno State's **Isaiah Hill** scored 19 points in the 70-63 win over Pepperdine.
- In the three wins, Hill had 11.3 points, 4.7 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game.
- Robinson had a double-double (27 points and 10 rebounds) in the 69-62 win over Idaho.
- With the 59-52 win over SCU, Fresno State earned its first of three wins over KenPom Top 100 teams.

DIALING UP THE HEAT ON D

Fresno State head coach Justin Hutson has been known throughout his career as a great defensive coach.

In his first season at Fresno State (2018-19), the Bulldogs ranked 24th nationally in 3-point field goal percentage defense (225-735, 30.6 percent).

During the 2021-22 season, Hutson and the 'Dogs dialed it up the again and ranked fifth in the nation in scoring defense (59.4 points allowed per game).

- In December 2021, Fresno State's tenacious defense limited opponents to 52.9 points per game with a 38.0 field goal percentage defense (149-392 FG), which included a 27.3 3-point field goal percentage defense (45-165 3FG), and forced an average of 13.5 turnovers per game (eight games played in December).
- Fresno State held six teams to 20 points or less in the first half (FPU, USD, CSUN, WSU, AFA & SUU) and limited its opponents to fewer than 70 points in 31 of its 36 games during the 2021-22 season.

THE 40's & 30's

- Fresno State's swarming defense limited seven opponents to fewer than 50 points during the 2021-22 season.
- In those games, Fresno State was 7-0 while holding Air Force to 40 points (Feb. 22), four teams to exactly 43 points (San Diego, CSUN, Weber State and San Jose State) and Cal Poly (Dec. 17) & Southern Utah (March 28) to 48 points.
- In Fresno State's first six seasons in the MW, the Bulldogs had limited six opponents to fewer than 50 points.

ROBINSON NAMED TO NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR LISTS

Fresno State's Orlando Robinson was named to the Mid-Season Watch List for the 2021-22 Lute Olson National Player of the Year award. Robinson was one of 30 players included on the watch list for the award, which is presented annually to the top player in Division I college basketball, and named in honor of Hall of Fame coach Lute Olson, who won 776 games in 34 seasons, 24 of which were spent at Arizona. Robinson was also named First Team All-MW and NABC All-District 17 and to the Midseason Team for the 2022 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Player of the Year.

HISTORY MADE BY TAKING CARE OF THE BASKETBALL

In the Bulldogs' 61-59 loss to Wyoming on Feb. 6, 2022, Fresno State set a single-game program record with just two turnovers against the Cowboys, who later made the 2022 NCAA Tournament. Fresno State was one of 10 teams in the nation to commit two or fewer turnovers in a game. Of note, both turnovers were after committing an offensive foul (no lost ball or bad pass turnovers).

- In his first three seasons with the Bulldogs, Fresno State was 15-4 when Holland scored 10 or more points (19-5: 9 or more points; 20-6: 8 or more points).
- Holland was unavailable for the Bulldogs' Dec. 28 MW opener at Boise State (health & safety protocols).
- In the 2021 MW Tournament, Holland played 78 of the possible 80 minutes with six assists and just one turnover. Holland also recorded a double-double (15 points/10 rebounds) in a first round win over New Mexico.

- With two road games to close MW play (at San Diego State and then at Wyoming - both NCAA Tournament teams), Fresno State played three straight games past the regulation buzzer [double overtime at SDSU, overtime at Wyoming and overtime versus San Jose State in the 2022 MW Tournament].

FRESNO STATE HEAD COACH

5TH SEASON | CSU BAKERSFIELD (1994)



Justin Hutson, one of the West's best recruiters and a veteran of the Mountain West conference, is entering his fifth season as Fresno State's head men's basketball coach (19th in program history).

In his first four seasons at Fresno State, Hutson produced a 69-53 record - with the 69 victories the second-most by a Bulldogs' head men's basketball coach in his first four seasons during the program's Division I era. Hutson has twice won 23 games in a season (2018-19 and 2021-22).

With a 23-13 overall record during the 2021-22 season, Hutson guided the Bulldogs to the 2022 The Basketball Classic, presented by ERACISM, Championship on April 1, 2022 - going 4-0 in the postseason single-elimination national tournament. Fresno State also won the 2021 Venue Twin Southern California Challenge during Feast Week and was rated as high as 45th in the NCAA's NET rankings entering MW play in December 2021.

Long known for his defensive coaching acumen and production, Hutson's 2021-22 squad ranked fifth nationally in scoring defense - allowing an average of just 59.4 points per game.

Orlando Robinson earned national recognition throughout the 2021-22 season, including being named a 2021-22 Lefty Driesell Defensive All-American and to multiple national player of the year midseason watch lists. Robinson, who played three seasons at Fresno State before starting his professional basketball playing career in the NBA Summer League, was also a 2021-22 First Team All-MW and NABC All-District 17 honoree.

Hutson, a native of Bakersfield, Calif., was a finalist for the 2022 Skip Prosser Man of the Year award. During his time coaching the 'Dogs, Hutson has produced eight all-conference honorees, including two first-team All-MW selections (Deshon Taylor and Orlando Robinson), and earned the 2018-19 Joe B. Hall National Coach of the Year award, which recognizes the top first-year coach in Division I college basketball. Academically, Fresno State has earned the NABC's Team Excellence Award in each of the past two seasons for the first time in program history.

Hutson led Fresno State to a 23-9 record during his first season back home in the Valley in 2018-19. Before being hired at Fresno State, Hutson was a rising Division I assistant coach for 10 seasons at San Diego State (2006-11, '13-18), two seasons at UNLV (2011-13), two seasons at Cal Poly (2004-06) and two seasons at CSU Bakersfield (1998-2000).

During the 2018-19 season, Fresno State ranked ninth nationally in 3-point field goals per game (10.7), 16th in total 3-point field goals (342) and 24th nationally in both 3-point field goal percentage defense (225-735, 30.6 percent) and 3-point field goal percentage offense (342-897, 38.1 percent). The Bulldogs' defense also led the MW in steals (228 total, 7.1 steals per game) and turnovers forced (13.7 per game). Three Bulldogs earned All-MW honors and senior guard/forward Sam Bittner earned the program's first Academic All-American recognition. Fresno State was also one of two MW teams to go 7-2 on the road in conference play, which tied for the second-most MW road wins by a team in the first 20 seasons of MW basketball.

During his time at San Diego State, Hutson helped elevate the Aztecs to a national program. In his first five seasons (2006-11), SDSU won three MW titles and earned postseason berths in each of those campaigns. In 2010-11, San Diego State won 20 straight games to begin the season, won the MW regular-season and tournament titles, and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA tournament before finishing with a school-record 34 victories. SDSU ended the year ranked No. 6/11 nationally in 2011.

In his two years at UNLV, Hutson helped coach the Rebels to a pair of 25-win seasons and two NCAA appearances. He played a key role in recruiting UNLV's highly regarded incoming class in 2012-13, which included the 2013 No. 1 overall NBA Draft selection, Anthony Bennett, who Hutson recruited.

Upon returning to San Diego State, the Aztecs won the MW regular-season championship in 2014 and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA tournament before finishing with a No. 13/12 national ranking. In his last four seasons at SDSU, which produced a pair of additional MW regular-season titles, the Aztecs appeared in the third round of the 2015 NCAA tournament, went to the semifinals of the 2016 NIT and won the 2018 MW Tournament to secure a NCAA Tournament first round appearance. SDSU's defensive numbers also improved to an elite level when he decided to rejoin the Aztec coaching staff. As the defensive coordinator, San Diego State finished in the top 15 nationally in both scoring defense and field-goal percentage defense in his first four seasons back. San Diego State finished second in scoring defense in 2014 and 2015, third in 2016 and 15th in 2017. As far as field-goal percentage defense, the Aztecs were eighth in 2014, seventh in 2015, first in 2016 and eighth in 2017.

In both of his stints on the Montezuma Mesa, Hutson played a pivotal part in SDSU's recruiting efforts as the team's recruiting coordinator. He was the point person in recruiting future All-Americans and NBA Draft picks Kawhi Leonard, Jamaal Franklin and Xavier Thames, while also helping land D.J. Gay, who left SDSU as the school's all-time leader in career wins, and Chase Tapley, who was a four-year starter. Later, Hutson led the charge in the Aztecs inking Malik Pope and Jeremy Hemsley. In a poll of Division I coaches conducted by then-ESPN's Jeff Goodman in the summer of 2013, Hutson was considered the eighth-best recruiting assistant nationally and the best on the West Coast.

Hutson is 28-12 all-time as a Division I head or assistant coach when coaching against one of his former teams (CSUB, Cal Poly, SDSU & UNLV).

Hutson was the head varsity coach at Bakersfield High - leading the Drillers to a CIF Central Section title and four appearances in the playoffs in four seasons. His 2004 team was ranked as high as No. 22 in the nation and fourth in California, while his 2003 squad finished the season with a 25-5 record and won the section title. As a collegiate player, Hutson won two NCAA Division II championships at CSU Bakersfield. In the 1993 championship season, the Roadrunners were undefeated with a 33-0 record and followed that up with a 27-6 record during the 1994 season.
