#### THE OPENING TIP

- The University of San Francisco women's basketball team (1-0) hits the road for the first time this season when it travels to take on Boise State (1-0) at 1:00 p.m. PT/2:00 p.m. MT on Sunday, Nov. 9, at ExtraMile Arena.
- San Francisco is coming off an impressive 64-40 victory over UNC Greensboro last Wednesday in the season opener on the Hilltop. The win over the Spartans marks the Dons' second 20+ point victory against a nonconference opponent dating back to last season. It is also the largest margin of victory in a season-opening win in the Molly Goodenbour era.
- Candy Edokpaigbe led the Dons with a career-high 26 points while Meghan McIntyre posted a near triple-double with 11 points, 10 rebounds, and seven assists. Nevaeh Ferrara Horne dominated the glass with a career-high 11 rebounds.
- As a team, San Francisco recorded a dominant defensive performance, holding UNC Greensboro to just 18.2 percent (12-for-66) from the field. The field-goal percentage marks the lowest an opponent has shot against the Dons in over 12 years. The Spartans' 12 field goals are also the fewest allowed by the Dons in a game since holding UC Santa Barbara to 11 in a 59-37 win on November 9, 2024.

# **MOLLY GOODENBOUR**

HEAD COACH | 10TH SEASON AT SAN FRANCISCO | 20TH OVERALL

#### **CAREER HIGHLIGHTS AT SAN FRANCISCO:**

Molly Goodenbour, a two-time national champion at Stanford with over a decade of head coaching experience on the collegiate level, was named the ninth head coach in University of San Francisco women's basketball history on Sept. 28, 2016. This is Goodenbour's third coaching stint on the Hilltop, where she served as an assistant coach with the Dons during the 1994-95 and 2005-06 seasons.

Goodenbour completed her ninth season on the Hilltop following the conclusion of the 2024-25 season, leading San Francisco to a 15-16 overall record and a fifth-place finish in the West Coast Conference standings at 11-9. The Dons' 11 league wins last season marked the most victories in WCC play since 2016-17, when the program compiled an 11-7 record in Goodenbour's first season at the helm.

Guiding the program to one of its best-ever starts in conference play, Goodenbour led the Dons to a perfect 5-0 record, defeating teams by an average of 13.8 points. During the five-game winning streak, the green and gold earned convincing triumphs over Gonzaga, LMU, Santa Clara, Saint Mary's, and Pepperdine.

In 2023-24, Goodenbour led San Francisco to a second-half resurgence as the team finished in a tie for third place in the West Coast Conference standings after starting the season with a 4-9 record. The program posted double-digit victories in WCC play for the fifth time in Goodenbour's tenure as the team finished at 10-6, highlighted by season sweeps of Pacific, Saint Mary's, Pepperdine, and LMU.

San Francisco also finished the season strong, rolling eventual WCC Tournament Champions Portland on the road, earning a 59-47 victory at Chiles Center. Under Goodenbour's guidance, Jasmine Gayles and Debora dos Santos earned All-WCC First Team honors. Dos Santos recorded a career season, averaging a double-double with 15.3 points and 10.6 rebounds per game, while Gayles led the squad in scoring at 16.8 points per game. Gayles also recorded the second 40-point game in program history, dropping 40 points in an 81-68 win at Pacific on January 13.

The 2022-23 season, under Goodenbour's leadership, concluded with an overall record of 19-13. Three Dons earned All-WCC selections, while two Dons earned WCC All-Academic Honors. The Dons also participated in their third straight WNIT.

Within the first six years on the Hilltop, Goodenbour posted impressive numbers, including becoming the winningest coach in San Francisco history through 50 games (27-23), as well as through two seasons at 34-28 (.548). Goodenbour quickly built up her impressive resume at USF, becoming the first coach to post winning overall and conference records in her first two seasons on the job.

Building off the program's strong start to the new decade, the Dons were once again punching a postseason ticket as they battled through a grueling non-conference schedule that kept them away from the Hilltop from Thanksgiving until after New Year's Day. Following an 0-4 start to WCC play, battling through injuries and COVID-19-related pauses, the Dons went on to rattle off wins in six of their next seven games and finished with the third seed heading into the WCC Tournament. USF would go on to defeat Santa Clara in Vegas before returning home to host Air Force in the WNIT. Since the start of the 2020-21 season, Goodenbour's Dons have made consecutive WNIT appearances and won at least one game in back-to-back WCC Tournaments. Led by two-time All-WCC First Team selection Ioanna Krimili, USF's 2020-21 team led the conference in total points and points per game while being a top-four program in team plus/minus.

Goodenbour's third WCC Tournament in 2019 saw her lead the Dons to a first-round victory over Portland, marking the seventh year in a row the Dons advanced beyond their opening game. Goodenbour's 2017-18 squad placed three WCC All-Conference and All-Academic honorees. Anna Seilund earned First-Team All-WCC and Second-Team All-WCC recipients Michaela Rakova and Kalyn Simon.

She finished her first year on the Hilltop in 2016-17 with an 18-13 overall record that included an 11-7 mark in West Coast Conference play, enough for a fourth-place finish, the Dons' highest since the 2002-03 season. In the process, Goodenbour became the first USF head coach since Sue Rojcewicz in 1982-83 to post a winning record in her first year at the helm and compiled the second-best record by a first-year coach in program history. In addition, USF's 11 WCC wins under Goodenbour were the most since the 1996-97 campaign.

Under Goodenbour, the Dons led the conference in free-throw percentage at .778, which stands as the best single-season percentage in program history. Goodenbour's team also led the WCC in three-point shooting (.346) in 2016-17.

Their 217 three-pointers made were the most in program history, including a program-best 15 three-pointers in a win over Portland on February 18, 2017. Goodenbour's squad placed four student-athletes on the WCC All-Academic team in 2016-17 and boasted a pair of All-WCC honorees in first-teamer Rachel Howard and second-team recipient Anna Seilund.

#### OTHER CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

Goodenbour came to USF following previous head coaching experience at Santa Rosa Junior College, Chico State, UC Irvine, and Cal State Dominguez Hills. Her overall career record, including two seasons at Santa Rosa JC, stands at 222-142 (.610).

Before her appointment at Cal State-East Bay, Goodenbour spent four seasons as the head coach at Cal State-Dominguez Hills. After taking over a program that had posted a 7-48 record in the previous two seasons, Goodenbour led the Toros to a 77-34 (.694) record in her four seasons. Under her guidance, the Toros won California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA) Tournament Championships in 2013-14 and 2014-15 and CCAA regular season titles in 2014-15 and 2015-16 and made three consecutive NCAA Division II Women's Basketball Championship appearances from 2013-16. Her 2014-15 squad won a school-record 26 games and earned the No. 2 seed in the NCAA West Regional.

Goodenbour began her career at Santa Rosa Junior College in 2002-03. After one season as an associate head coach, she took over the head coaching duties for two seasons (2003-05), leading the Bear Cubs to a 69-21 record, two conference championships, and a q uarterfinal appearance in the California state championship.

Her second coaching stint at San Francisco came during the 2005-06 season when she served as an assistant on Mary Hile-Nepfel's staff. Following the season, she was appointed head coach at Chico State where she led the Wildcats to a 52-11 record and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. In 2007-08, she was named the CCAA's Coach of the Year after guiding her team to a 28-6 overall record, regular season and conference tournament titles along with a Sweet 16 appearance. The Wildcats finished the year ranked No. 17 in the nation among all Division II teams.

Goodenbour's first Division I head coaching job came at UC Irvine, where she served as the Anteater's coach from 2008-12. The Anteaters qualified for the Big West Tournament in her four seasons at the helm, posting the highest single-season win total (15 in 2010-11) in nearly a decade and had eight players earn all-conference honors during her four-year tenure.

## PERSONAL HIGHLIGHTS:

A native of Waterloo, Iowa, Goodenbour was a standout performer at Stanford, where she was a four-year letterwinner under Tara VanDerveer from 1989-93. She helped the Cardinal to four straight Pac-10 championships, three NCAA Final Fours, and a pair of NCAA Championships in 1990 and 1992. Goodenbour was named the most valuable player of the 1992 Final Four after setting an NCAA Tournament record for most postseason three-pointers made with 18. She finished her collegiate career with 1,040 points and still ranks among the school's career top-10 in three-pointers made (178), assists (441), and free throw percentage (.793).

#### TBA AN INTERNATIONAL PRESENCE:

#### 2025-26 SAN FRANCISCO WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

#### **COMING OFF AN IMPRESSIVE SEASON:**

San Francisco enters the 2025-26 season after finishing 2024-25 with a 15-16 overall record and placed fifth in the West Coast Conference (WCC) standings at 11-9. The program's 11 league victories mark the first time the Dons have secured at least 11 wins during conference play since the 2016-17 season. Along with its regular-season success, accentuated by a sweep of Gonzaga, San Francisco secured its first win in the conference tournament since 2022, defeating LMU, 75-66, at Orleans Arena.

San Francisco made history last season against Gonzaga, as it completed its first sweep of the Bulldogs in 23 years. In the first meeting, the Dons dominated and earned a 15-point victory on the Hilltop, 73-58, on December 19, 2024. The program completed the season sweep on February 22, 2025, in Spokane, 70-68. The green and gold's win over the Bulldogs on the road marked the first time the team has won a game in Spokane since 2006, while sweeping the Zags in a single season for the first time since 2002.

#### THE NONCONFERENCE SLATE RUNS THROUGH THE HILLTOP:

Seven of San Francisco's 11 nonconference contests to begin the 2025-26 campaign will be played at home as San Francisco hosts UNC Greensboro in 0-0 the season opener, facing off against the Spartans for the first time in program history, on Wednesday, Nov. 5. The green and gold will also host Seton Hall (Friday, Nov. 14), UC San Diego (Sunday, Nov. 16), Lehigh (Wednesday, Nov. 25), 0-0 CSU Monterey Bay (Sunday, Nov. 30), Colorado State (Saturday, Dec. 13), and Sacramento State (Wednesday, Dec. 17) at Chase Center.

Since the start of the 2016-17 season, Head Coach Molly Goodenbour's first season at the helm, San Francisco is 29-14 (.674) in nonconference games played at War Memorial at the Sobrato Center and Chase Center. San Francisco defeated UNC Greensboro, 64-40, last Wednesday to improve the program's nonconference home record.

#### PICKED TO FINISH SIXTH AGAIN:

The West Coast Conference announced its All-Preseason Team on Thursday, Oct. 23, and San Francisco was slotted to finish sixth out of the 12-team league. The Dons were also picked to finish sixth in last season's preseason poll, but ended the 2024-25 campaign in fifth place with an 11-9 conference record.

#### **CONTRACT EXTENSION:**

3-0 Last May, Head Coach Molly Goodenbour signed a three-year contract 51-12 extension, extending her through the 2027-28 season. In 20 seasons as a head coach with nine on the Hilltop, Goodenbour has compiled a 307-274 record, with 134 victories coming at San Francisco. She has totaled five 20-win seasons and has guided the green and gold to six straight seasons with double-digit wins.

44-53 FAMILIAR FACES ON STAFF: 51-37 Ryan Vablant Ryan Yablonksy was hired in September as an assistant coach for the upcoming 2025-26 season. Yablonsky enters his first season on the Hilltop after 32-2 1-30 spending one season as an assistant coach at San Diego. In his one season with the Toreros, he worked closely with All-WCC selections Kylie Horstmeyer and 109-28 Truitt Reilly while helping develop opponent scouting reports.

88-49 Aya Keita, a four-year player for Molly Goodenbour at San Francisco, was hired as the Director of Women's Basketball Operations, last August. While with the Dons from 2021-25, Keita averaged 3.3 points, 1.6 rebounds, and 0.9 assists per 66-50 game. 65-83

## A NARROW VICTORY TO BEGIN THE SEASON:

Boise State nearly dropped its season opener at home last Monday as it defeated NAIA Eastern Oregon, 59-51. The Broncos trailed at halftime, 26-23, but dominated the second half, outscoring the Mountaineers, 36-25, to earn the eight-point victory.

#### **HUTTON HAD AN IMPRESSIVE SEASON DEBUT:**

Libby Hutton posted a 15-point, 11-rebound double-double in the win over Eastern Oregon, her first double-double of her career. The sophomore forward from Perth, Australia, appeared in 30 games last season, averaging 3.0 points and 1.7 rebounds per game.

#### IT'S TATUM'S TIME:

Before the start of the season, Tatum Thompson was named the 2025-26 Mountain West Preseason Player of the Year. Last season, Thompson was named to the MW All-Conference Team as she averaged a team-leading 13.6 points and 6.8 rebounds per game. She ranked 12th in the league in scoring and seventh in rebounding a year ago, recorded seven double-doubles, and scored in double figures 24 times.

#### A SOLID RETURNING CAST:

Boise State returned its top-four scorers from the 2024-25 season. Tatum Thompson (13.6 points per game), Natalie Pasco (12.5), Dani Bayes (9.1), and Mya Hansen (7.8) combined for 59.9 percent of the Broncos' points last season.

#### PICKED FOURTH IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST:

After finishing the 2024-25 season with an 18-15 overall record and tying for seventh-place finish in the Mountain West Conference standings, Boise State was slotted to finish fourth in the 2025-26 MW Preseason Poll. The Broncos also received one first-place vote, while UNLV (19 first-place votes), San Diego State (three first-place votes), and Colorado State (one first-place vote) earned the top three spots in the poll.

## SERIES HISTORY

- San Francisco and Boise State have faced off six times since the first-ever meeting in the 1990-91 season. The Broncos hold a 4-2 edge over the Dons, and broke a two-game skid with a 59-57 victory last season at Chase Center.
- Tatum Thompson led the Broncos in scoring, posting 12 points in 30 minutes, while Dani Bayes added 10 points and four rebounds off the bench.
- Freja Werth was the lone Don in double figures in the last season's matchup, registering 18 points on 58.3 percent (seven-for-12) shooting.

#### NCAA First Round - March 16, 1995 - Seattle, Wash.

No. 6 Arkansas 67, No. 11 San Francisco 58

No. 1 Connecticut 72, No. 12 San Francisco 44

The eyes of the country were on San Francisco as the team faced defending national champions, Connecticut, in the Sweet Sixteen. In front of the largest crowd (7,190) to watch a women's basketball game in Illinois, the Dons fell short, dropping the 72-44 decision to the Huskies. The game was tied 13-13 midway through the first half before UConn pulled away for a 37-28 halftime lead. Valerie Gillon scored 13 points in her final collegiate contest, while Julie Murdent came off the bench to add 10 points.
