TIME TO TIP-OFF

- Following a rousing victory to celebrate the end of final exams, the Sacramento State women's basketball team heads to the Bay Area for its penultimate non-conference contest, taking on San Francisco on Wednesday (Dec. 16) at 4 p.m.
- The game will be played at the Chase Center, the home of the WNBA's Golden State Valkyries and the NBA's Golden State Warriors

THE COACHES

- Sacramento State's Aaron Kallhoff enters his third year at the helm of the Hornets' program, posting a 27-48 mark and a 105-124 overall record in seven-plus seasons as a head coach
- Kallhoff claimed his 100th career win as a head coach in Sacramento State's 2025-26 season-opening win over Stanton University
- Molly Goodenbour is in her 10th season at San Francisco, posting a 140-147 record

NEW NEST

- After spending most of its history playing at The Nest, both the Sacramento State men's and women's basketball teams transition its home contests to the Hornet Pavilion located inside The WELL, an on-campus fitness complex that has renovated a portion of the facility to serve as the new home of the Hornets
- The venue will seat approximately 3,000 fans -nearly tripling the capacity of The Nest
- It was a giant facelift for the facility featuring (among other enhancements): re-striping of all courts to include the game court, telescopic bleachers around the center court, two new video boards, LED ribbon boards, new scoreboards, a new sound system, removal and replacement of existing lighting, new press tables and courtside seats, and new branding promoting Sacramento State and the city of Sacramento

"BIG" NEWS FOR 2026

- The 2025-26 campaign marks the 30th -- and final -- season as a member of the Big Sky Conference for the Hornets, who announced plans to move to the The Big West beginning in 2026-27
- Sacramento State has faced four of its future league rivals this year: UC San Diego (Nov. 12), Long Beach State (Nov. 15), Cal State Fullerton (Nov. 21), and California Baptist (Nov. 29)
- Another league opponent -- Causeway rival UC Davis -- is also on the schedule (Nov. 24), but the Aggies are departing for the Mountain West Conference following this year
- The Big West will be the third conference for the Hornets in their Division I history after playing in the America West Conference along with Cal Poly, CSUN, and Southern Utah from 1994-96, and then joining the Big Sky in 1996-97

ABOUT THE DONS

- San Francisco enters the week with a 6-4 overall record, but has lost its last two straight at Arizona State (67-44) and Colorado State (69-52)
- The Dons are 4-2 at home this year, winning four straight before falling to the Rams on Dec. 13
- Wednesday's contest marks the second in a run of four straight home games for USF, which includes West Coast Conference openers against Oregon State and Portland at the end of the month
- Sophomore guard Candy Edokpaigbe leads the team in scoring at 17.2 ppg, shooting .541 from the field and averaging 5.1 rpg to boot
- Five other players are averaging better than six points per contest, including freshman forward No-

elia Mourino, who leads the team with 6.6 rpg and shoots .465 from the field to go with 7.4 ppg

SERIES NOTABLES

- San Francisco leads the all-time series with Sacramento State. 12-5
- Wednesday's game marks the first between the two programs since the 2020-21 season won by the Dons, 108-82, in Sacramento
- USF has won the last six straight meetings between the two schools
- The Hornets haven't won a game in the series since 2012-13 -- a 68-60 home triumph
- Sacramento State is just 2-6 on the road against San Francisco, losing the last four
- The Hornets' last road win against the Dons came on Jan. 5, 2010, a 77-74 triumph

CONFERENCE CALL

- Sacramento State is a combined 29-83 against the current West Coast Conference alignment
- Prior to the Dec. 4 meeting at Pacific, the Hornets hadn't faced a WCC opponent since a 70-65 defeat at Santa Clara on Nov. 29, 2023, at home
- Sacramento State's last win over a WCC school was a 73-63 triumph over the Broncos on Nov. 14, 2022 -- a win that snapped an eight-game skid against the WCC dating back to the Hornets' WNIT win over Pacific in 2015 (not including a pair of losses to conference newcomer Seattle U in 2019-20 and 2021-22)

CUT TO THE "CHASE"

- The Chase Center represents the third current or former NBA arena that will have hosted a Sacramento State women's basketball game
- The Hornets hosted Cal Poly at ARCO Arena -then the home of the Sacramento Kings -- on Dec. 11, 1993, winning by the score of 89-58, then battled USC on Dec. 9, 2000, falling 87-61
- Causeway rivals Sacramento State and UC Davis then played one another as part of a doubleheader at the Golden 1 Center -- the current home of the Kings -- during the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons

CENTURY CLUB

- Sacramento State's 102-42 win over Simpson marked the program's 31st 100-point game
- It was the second time this season that the Hornets have eclipsed the 100-point plateau, joining their 124 points against Stanton
- The 124 points against the Elks rank fourth on the school's all-time scoring list
- It marked the first time since the 2016-17 season that the Hornets have scored at least 100 points in a game twice in the same year after posting 102 against Stanislaus State (Nov. 29) and 110 at Southern Utah (Feb. 25)

IN THE MARGINS

- Sacramento State's 60-point margin of victory over Simpson on Dec. 15 is the fourth-largest in the program's history, trailing the school-record 85-point win over Stanton earlier this year, a 71-point win over San Francisco State in 1974 and a 64-point victory against Stanislaus State in 1979
- Five of the Hornets' six victories this year have come by double-digits
- Of those five, four have been by 20-or-more points: Stanton (+85), Nevada (+20), Cal State Fullerton (+20), and Simpson (+60)

KEEPING IT 1,000

• Versteeg enters this week's contest continuing to inch her way toward a milestone, needing just 86

- Should she reach the plateau, Versteeg would become the 19th Hornet to accomplish the feat and the first since Summer Menke did it in 2022
- · Versteeg's 914 career points rank second among active Big Sky student-athletes as of Dec. 15, trailing only Montana's Mack Konig (1,127)

"PIC" TO CLICK

- Junior guard Natalie Picton was the "pick to click" on Monday against Simpson, scoring a collegiate-best 27 points in only 22 minutes on 9-of-13 from the field, draining five three's and adding a 4-for-4 night at the line
- The nine makes from the field were also a collegiate best, while her six assists (against zero turnovers) were a Sacramento State career high
- Picton's performance eclipsed her previous high of 24 points set last season against Idaho State while at Montana State and matched earlier this year against UC Davis and marked her third career 20-plus point game of her career
- Her 5-for-7 night from beyond the arc marked the second time this season she has hit at least five three-pointers in a game, falling one shy of her 6-for-8 performance against the Aggies on Nov. 24
- \bullet As of Dec. 15, Picton's 27 points are tied for the fifth-most by a Big Sky player this year, while her six three's against UC Davis are tied for the second-most in the league

SHADES OF GRAY

- · Sophomore guard Rubi Gray continued her run of double-digit scoring performances prior to final exams against Simpson, finishing with 15 points in only 17 minutes against the Red Hawks, adding a pair of rebounds and three assists
- The native of Tasmania has now reached double figures in each of her last eight games -- which includes a trio of 20-plus point performances -- averaging 18.8 ppg and 3.5 rpg while shooting .491 (55-for-112) from the field overall
- · Her 24 points against Pacific (Dec. 4) matched her output against UC San Diego on Nov. 12 and were just two shy of her career high of 26 against Cal State Fullerton on Nov. 21
- Following a slow start to the year, Gray has shot better than 44 percent from the field in six of her last eight contests

20-20-20 VISION

- Gray's three 20-point performances this year are tied for fifth among Big Sky scorers entering the week
- She is one of 14 players in the league (as of Dec. 14) with multiple 20-point games this year

HERE'S A QUARTER

- Of Sacramento State's 33 points in the first quarter against Simpson, the 1-2 punch of Picton (13) and Gray (10) combined for 23 of those
- The two performances marked the sixth and seventh double-digit quarters by a Hornet this year -- the fourth by Gray and the second by Picton
- · Picton's 13 points are the second-most in a single quarter this year, trailing only Gray's 14-point first quarter against Cal State Fullerton on Nov. 21
- · Aside from Gray and Picton, sophomore Pinja Paananen is the only other Hornet to finish with 10 points in a quarter this year (10 in the fourth against Stanton in the season opener)

HISTORIC HELPING HANDS

- With her 58 assists over her first 11 games this season, Versteeg now has 504 for her career, placing her second on the school's all-time list, trailing only record-holder Fantasia Hilliard (726 from 2011-15), on that chart
- That total also puts her among the top 15 in Big Sky history, passing Southern Utah's Rebecca Cardenas (494 from 2016-20) and Eastern Washington's Jennifer Sutter (492 from 1993-97)
- Montana State's Hannah Caudill (2014-18) is ahead in 13th with 508, with Montana's Margaret Williams (1982-87) with 511 in 12th

HOLD THE LINE

- Picton has been nearly automatic from the line this season, shooting 94 percent (17-for-18) from the stripe
- The Welland, Ontario, native has drained her last 15 free throws without a miss, hitting her last three in a win over UC San Diego on Nov. 12, then 12 straight against Long Beach State, Cal State Fullerton, UC Davis, and Simpson
- · Close behind Picton is Rubi Gray, who is 19-for-22 (.864) from the line on the year and has made her last 14 attempts from the stripe dating back to the Hornets' match-up with Chattanooga on Nov. 28

28 percent by Northern Arizona at the 2025 Big Sky Tournament and 26 percent against Simpson on Dec. 15

- The Red Hawks' .264 field goal percentage is the lowest by a Hornet opponent this year and the lowest since Weber State shot just .211 on Feb. 20 last season -- a program Division I era single-game record
- · Nine of those 19 opponents have made 20 (or fewer) field goals in a game, including only 12 by Weber State on Feb. 20 last season
- Sacramento State has been even stingier from beyond the arc, holding 18 of its last 19 opponents dating back to last year to under 40 percent from distance -- 15 of those shooting less than 30 per-
- · Meanwhile, the Hornets' offense has shot 40 percent or better 11 times in that same span

A "KEY" INGREDIENT

- · Junior forward Keanna Salave'a had herself the best shooting night of her Hornet career on Monday against Simpson, hitting 6-of-7 from the field en route to a season-high tying 12 points in 12 minutes
- Salave'a added five rebounds -- the eighth time this year that she has grabbed five-or-more boards in a game this year
- The junior from Vancouver, Wash., is averaging a team-best 5.6 rpg, ranking among the top 15 in rebounding (t13th), total rebounds (t10th), and offensive rebounds (t4th)
- · Her work on the offensive end (28 rebounds) accounts for nearly half of her rebound total (62)

DELICIOUS DISH

- · Versteeg has posted five-or-more assists in eight of the team's 11 games
- · Her total of 58 assists and her 5.27 assists per game puts her atop the Big Sky in both categories entering this week, while ranking No. 31 and No. 35 in the nation, respectively, as of Dec. 15
- Her 58 assists are three ahead of last year's 11game pace when she finished the campaign tying her own single-season record of 208
- · With her seven assists against Cal State Fullerton

on Nov. 21 -- which tied her season high -- Versteeg posted her 32nd career game with seven-or-more assists with all of those coming in the last two-plus seasons (a total of 75 games)

MISS STEAL YOUR BALL

- While putting up a career-high point total against Simpson, Picton did not ignore her defensive duties, finishing with three of the team's combined 20 steals on the night
- Picton has multiple steals in 10 of the team's 11 games this year
- Her 27 swipes put her fourth in the Big Sky standings in that category as of Dec. 15 and fifth at 2.5 spa
- As a team, the Hornets have posted 20-or-more steals twice this year against Stanton (26) and Simpson (20)
- The 26 steals against Stanton were four shy of the program's single-game mark of 30 set against Portland State on Feb. 7, 2015
- The total was also the highest in six seasons for the Hornets, who last posted a 20-plus steal game against Cal Maritime on Nov. 13, 2019, finishing with 28 in that contest
- Individually, Fatoumata Jaiteh's seven steals against Cal State Fullerton on Nov. 21 currently stand as the most by a Big Sky player in a game

TIME IS ON THEIR SIDE

- The backcourt duo of Picton and Versteeg rank 2-3 in the Big Sky in terms of minutes played as of Dec 15
- Picton is played just over 80 percent of the team's minutes (354 of 440), with Versteeg close behind at 77 percent (338 of 440)
- Picton's 35.36 mpg trails only Northern Arizona's Naomi White (36.81 mpg), while Versteeg is third at 33.8 mpa
- · Thanks to those minutes, Versteeg has moved into fifth on the all-time minutes played list with 3,266 and, if she's able to replicate her total from each of the last two seasons, would break Kylie Kuhns' school career record of 3,804 minutes from 2009-13
- · Meanwhile, for Picton, her time on the court is a

big step up from last season when she played a total of 497 minutes in 31 games at Montana State, and is well above her average of 29.1 mpg in 29 games during her freshman season with the Bobcats in 2023-24

DE-FENSE (CLAP, CLAP)...

- Sacramento State hasn't given up much this season, ranking third in the Big Sky Conference in scoring defense (59.5 ppg) and rebounding defense (35.4 rpg), second in field goal percentage defense (.369), and leading the league in three-point percentage defense (.251) -- the latter ranking No. 23 in the NCAA (as of Dec. 15)
- It's a continuation of a trend that has seen the Hornets post two of the stingiest scoring defenses in school history in the last three years as they allowed 59.9 ppg in 2022-23 (second in school history) and gave up 63.6 ppg in 2024-25 (fourth in school history)
- The school record is 56.8 ppg allowed over 23 games in 1984-85

BENCH BOOST

- Sacramento State's second unit has come on to outscore its counterparts in seven of the team's 11 games this season
- Hornet reserves have combined for 20-or-more points six times in 11 games this year
- Sacramento State ranks fourth in the Big Sky in bench points per game at 24.5 ppg

NOT HALF BAD

- Sacramento State is 5-1 this season when leading at the half and a combined 18-5 when winning the first 20 minutes under Head Coach Aaron Kallhoff over the last two-plus seasons
- Last season (2024-25), the Hornets were a near-perfect 10-1 when leading at the break
- The 58 first-half points on Dec. 15 against Simpson were the second most in a single half this year, trailing only the 71-point opening half against Stanton, and the third half with at least 50 points

ATTACKING THE PAINT

- Sacramento State is a combined 6-1 this year when outscoring its opponents in the paint
- The Hornets have scored 30-or-more points in the key in all six of those wins, including 86 points in the season opener in a lop-sided win over Stanton, 54 against Simpson on Dec. 15, and 44 more in a 20-point victory against Cal State Fullerton

HITS OF THE 70s

- During the Aaron Kallhoff era, 70 points seems to be the magic number for the Hornets

- After senior Fatoumata Jaiteh went down with an injury against UC Davis on Nov. 24, the Hornets have been in search of her replacement in the starting five
- Featuring the same starting lineup in each of the team's first seven games,
 Sacramento State has trotted out a different starting five in each of its last four contests
- Tali Fa'i (vs. Chattanooga), Keanna Salave'a (at Pacific), and Pinja Paananen (Simpson) earned their first career starts as Hornets, while Brooklyn Taylor picked up her first start of the year and the second of her career at California Baptist

RECYCLED NOTES SHE CAN DO BOTH

- All nine of the Hornets' newcomers made their debuts in the green and gold in Monday's win over Stanton -- among them, redshirt freshman Jaety Mandaquit, who walked on the team after wrapping up her second season with the Sacramento State women's soccer team
- Mandaquit becomes only the third two-sport student-athlete in the women's basketball program's Division I history, the first since 2001-02, and only the second women's soccer player to make the jump
- The other two student-athletes were: Allison Espinosa, a two-time All-American (1989-90) in volleyball who played women's basketball in 1990-91 and 1991-92 (42 career games, 3.8 ppg, 3.0 rpg, .477 FG%), and Lori Kerswell, a two-time All-Big Sky selection who played four years with the women's soccer team and joined the women's basketball team for one year in 2001-02 (22 games, nine starts, 4.3 ppg, 2.5 rpg).

- Trading her cleats for sneakers, Monday's debut for Mandaquit marked her first organized basketball contest since her junior year of high school
- She finished the win over Stanton with two points, three rebounds, and a pair of steals in 11 minutes against the Elks, scoring her first collegiate points with a lay-up in the third quarter
- Hailing from Hilo, Hawai'i, Mandaquit is only the second Hornet to come from the "Aloha State" and the first since Jordan Kealoha (Honolulu) played two seasons for Sacramento State in 2010-12

A RARE BREED

- According to a preseason survey of schools across the country, Mandaquit is one of only four two-sport women's basketball student-athletes across the country
- Lamar's Molly Powell and UCLA's Megan Grant are doubling-up in women's basketball and softball, while Saint Louis' Ellie Paloucek joined the Billikens' women's basketball team after playing soccer in the fall

M.V.DI M.V.DI

- For the first time in the history of the program, the preseason Big Sky Conference MVP resides in Sacramento as senior guard Benthe Versteeg was named the league's top player to kick-off the 2025-26 campaign
- It's another award on the mantel for the decorated Versteeg, who enters this season as a two-time All-Big Sky selection (first-team honors as a junior), a two-time Big Sky all-tournament team choice, and a two-time all-defensive team selection
- She is the only Hornet to make the league's all-tournament team twice in the program's history and the only player to earn a spot on the all-tournament team without being a member of one of the four semifinal qualifiers in each of the last two years

HONORS FROM THE WORLDWIDE LEADER

- In addition to her MVP award from the Big Sky, Versteeg was named the league's preseason player of the year pick by Charlie Creme on ESPN.com
- She becomes the second Hornet in the last four years to earn the honor after Isnelle Natabou was picked by the media outlet prior to 2022-23

TOP HALF HORNETS

- Sacramento State was picked to finish in the upper half of the Big Sky standings, selected fifth by the coaches and fourth by the media
- The Hornets received 50 points total to finish ahead of Eastern Washington (38) in fifth, trailing preseason favorite Montana State (74 points, 5 first-place votes), Montana (72 points, 3 first-place votes), Idaho (65 points, 1 first-place vote), and Idaho State (57 points, 1 first-place vote)
- Among the media that cover the league, Sacramento State received a pair of first-place nods and 177 points overall, finishing behind Montana State (11 first-place votes, 238 points), Montana (7 first-place votes, 224 points), and Idaho (7 first-place votes, 220 points)
- Last season, the Hornets were picked fourth by the coaches and sixth by the media

PICTON HONORED WITH KAY YOW SERVANT LEADER AWARD

- Junior guard Natalie Picton was recognized as one of 61 women's basketball student-athletes across all divisions nationwide -- and the only one from the Big Sky -- with the Kay Yow Servant Leader Award
- Now in its second year, the award honors student-athletes "of great character who put the needs of others before their own, who uplift others, and who do it with grace and humility"
- Student-athletes are nominated by their coach, and are people who exemplify Coach Yow's spirit and who reflect her resolve, grace, generosity, and servant's heart

ON THE RISE

- Thanks to its 15-win season in 2024-25, Sacramento State boasted a nine-game improvement in the win column from the 2023-24 season tied for the third-best year-to-year improvement in the program's Division I history
- The Hornets matched the nine-game improvement from 2010-11 (4-25) to 2011-12 (13-18) and trails only the 11-win improvements from 2020-21 (3-22) to 2021-22 (14-16) and, again, from 2021-22 (14-16) to 2022-23 (25-8)
- Sacramento State's 15 wins in 2024-25 were the second-highest total in the last 10 years, behind the Big Sky championship/NCAA Tournament season (25-8) in 2022-23
- The nine wins at home were tied for the fifth-most in school history.

- Sacramento State's campus extends 300 acres and is situated only six miles from the California State Capitol
- Designated a "Tree Campus USA" by the Arbor Day Foundation since 2012, the campus features more than 3,586 trees with a mixture of native and non-native species

in the green and gold as Benthe Versteeg looks for a repeat of her last two record-setting campaigns

- After setting the school single-season record with 208 assists in 2023-24,
 Versteeg matched her own mark with 208 helpers in 2024-25, which ranked her tied for eighth in the Big Sky record books
- It marked the 12th time in Big Sky history that a player accumulated 200 assists in a season and only the third to accomplish the feat since 2012, joining Northern Arizona's Regan Schenck (231 in 2022-23)
- Versteeg's 6.50 apg last year is tied for the second-highest single-season mark in program history along with Fantasia Hilliard's 2013-14 average -- both of which trailed Versteeg's 6.71 apg in 2023-24
- Versteeg has now led the Big Sky in assists per game in back-to-back seasons
 the first player in league history to do so since Hilliard did so in three straight years from 2012-15 and only the fourth overall since 1988-89 (Montana's Skyla Sisco and Eastern Washington's Jennifer Sutter)
- Versteeg's performance last year marked only the sixth time a Hornet led the league in assists, joining Lianna Tillman (6.04 apg) in 2021-22, Rexanne Rodriguez (5.65 apg) in 2000-01, Tika Koshiyama-Diaz (5.48 apg) in 2010-11, and Hilliard, who did it in three straight seasons: 2012-13 (5.9 apg), 2013-14 (6.5 apg), and 2014-15 (5.8 pg)

PUT A LID ON IT

- A big part of Sacramento State's success last season came on the defensive end where the Hornets limited opponents to just 63.55 ppg, a .381 field goal percentage, and .310 from beyond the arc
- The scoring average ranked as the fourth lowest in school history (and the lowest since surrendering only 59.9 ppg in 2022-23)
- The three-point percentage was the lowest since Sacramento State limited opponents to just .303 from distance in 2018-19
- Overall, the opponent's .3812 field goal percentage was the lowest in the program's Division I history and the lowest -- by mere percentage points (.0007 to be exact) -- since the 1988-89 squad held opponents to .3805 shooting from the floor

SHINING ON THE WORLD STAGE

• Two Hornets saw action on the international stage over the summer as Noemi Arvai represented Hungary at the FIBA U19 Women's World Cup, finishing eighth, while Pinja Paananen joined her Finland teammates at the FISU Summer World University Games in Germany, finishing eighth after posting wins over Argentina, the Czech Republic, and India in group play

WORLDWIDE LEADER

- Of Sacramento State's 15-member roster for 2025-26, six of those student-athletes hail from outside the United States
- The Hornets' roster represents seven different countries: the United States, The Netherlands, Canada, Finland, Australia, Italy, and Hungary
- With the additions of Italy's Elisa Leghissa, Finland's Pinja Paananen, and Canada's Natalie Picton, Sacramento State has now had 21 international players in the program's Division I history -- 19 coming in the last eight years
- The six international players rank seventh among schools who responded to a preseason survey (Wagner leads the way with 13 total), while the seven countries represented (including the United States) are tied for third behind San Francisco and Columbia (nine each) and tied with Wagner and Tulsa
- Australia leads the way with four former Hornets, followed by three from Germany and Canada, two from Spain and France, and one each from Italy, Finland, The Netherlands, the Czech Republic, Poland, Hungary, and Brazil
- Leghissa and Paananen are the first student-athletes from their respective nations to represent Sacramento State, while Picton is the first Canadian Hornet since Sarah Craig (Calgary, Alberta) in 2003-04

UNITED STATES OF SACRAMENTO

- In addition to the student-athletes from six different countries, this year's edition of the Hornets also hail from five different states
- Alongside five native Californians (Jeniece Harmon, Brooklyn Taylor, Jamiah Fontenberry, Tali Fa'i, and Sophia Lee), Sacramento State also features natives of Washington (Keanna Salave'a and Fatoumata Jaiteh), Texas (Elizabeth Abiara), Arizona (Ajong Lual), and Hawai'i (Jaety Mandaquit)
- Abiara becomes only the third Texan to play for the Hornets since 1988-89
- Jaiteh and Salave'a are the latest Washingtonians to compete for Sacramento State as the "Evergreen State" is home to 18 Hornets during the program's Division I era -- the most of any state outside of California
- Mandaquit is only the second Hornet to hail from the "Aloha State" and the first since Jordan Kealoha (Honolulu) played two seasons for Sacramento State in 2010-12
- In the program's Division I era, Hornets have called 25 different states home

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- Three of Sacramento State's 2025-26 opponents reached the NCAA Tournament a season ago: California was a No. 8 seed and Big Sky championship Montana State was a No. 13 seed -- both losing in the first round
- Meanwhile, Big West Tournament champion UC San Diego was part of the NCAA's "First Four," before falling to Southern University
- In addition, three other opponents also earned postseason berths: Big Sky rival Northern Arizona was selected to compete in the NCAA Women's Basketball Invitation Tournament, reaching the second round, while Chattanooga (second round) and Pacific (first round) earned berths in the Postseason Women's NIT.

A TALL ORDER

- This year's Sacramento State squad is among the tallest in the program's Division I history, featuring eight players standing six feet or taller
- The number broke the previous mark of seven set in 2001-02 and tied on five other occasions
- The average height for this year's squad is 71.13 inches (roughly five feet, 11 and 1/8 inches... if you're into fractions), which stands second only to the 2023-24 squad that averaged 71.43 inches (roughly five feet, 11 13/32 inches)
- Individually, sophomore Ajong Lual stands at 6-foot-5, which is tied for the tallest player in the program's history along with Alicja Falkowska (2021-22), Isnelle Natabou (2021-23), and Paula Haw (2023-25)

CHAMPIONSHIP PEDIGREE

- Benthe Versteeg is the last remaining piece from the Hornets' 2022-23 Big Sky regular season and tournament championship run that ended in a trip to UCLA for the program's first-ever NCAA berth; however, she is not the only member of the roster with championship experience
- Junior Natalie Picton joins Sacramento State after helping Montana State to a Big Sky regular season and tournament title in 2024-25
- Senior Fatoumata Jaiteh enters her second year with the green and gold after helping Northern Arizona to a share of the 2023 Big Sky regular season crown
- Junior transfer Keanna Salave'a helped her University of Providence team to a Frontier League tournament title as a sophomore and twice helped the Argos to the NAIA National Tournament -- including a national runner-up finish as a freshman in 2023-24

BENCH BOSSES

- Joining third-year head coach <u>Aaron Kallhoff</u> on the bench are associate head coach De'Audra Brown, associate head coach Michael Floyd, and assistant coach Jodi Page, along with Women's Basketball Chief of Staff Elexus Trenkle
- A sideline veteran at both the junior college and Division I levels, <u>Brown</u> was elevated to her current position in March of 2024. She was named to the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's "30-under-30" coaches list in 2017 and has stops at Hawai'i, New Mexico State, Eastern Arizona College and Seward County CC
- Floyd is the newest member of the staff after spending the last nine seasons at Santa Clara, including helping the Broncos to 14 wins as the program's interim head coach in 2024-25, while enjoying coaching stops at Alabama State, Spring Hill College, Alabama, Troy University, Alabama Southern CC, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, South Alabama, and the University of West Alabama
- Page is in her third year with the Hornets after spending a season at UNC Greensboro in 2022-23, along with stops at New Mexico State, Cal State Fullerton, Arizona State, and Eastern Washington, as well as 20 years coaching in her native Australia
- <u>Trenkle</u> is in her third season at Sacramento State after serving as the men's basketball director of operations at Tarleton in 2022-23 and a graduate assistant for the Texans in 2021-22

NATION'S BEST PLAY IN SACRAMENTO

- For the seventh time in NCAA Tournament history, Sacramento will be a host site for "March Madness" as the Golden 1 Center hosts the regional games of the 2026 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament on March 27-30
- It is the first time that Sacramento will host the NCAA women's basketball tournament and the first time that the city hosts something other than the first or second rounds of the NCAA men's or women's tournaments, with two teams advancing to the Women's "Final Four" in Phoenix, Ariz.
- The Golden 1 Center has hosted the men's first and second rounds in 2017 and 2023, and will again do so in 2027
- ARCO Arena also hosted men's first and second round games in 1994, 1998, 2002, and 2007
