THE OPENING TIP

- Following a dominating win over San Diego in the regular season finale, the No. 5 seeded University of San Francisco women's basketball team takes on No. 9 seeded LMU in the third round of the Credit Union 1 West Coast Conference Championship at noon on Saturday, Mar. 8, at Orleans Arena.
- San Francisco enters the conference tournament after concluding the regular season in sole possession of fifth place with an 11-9 league record. The green and gold most recently defeated San Diego 60-35 last Saturday at home as eight seniors were honored on Senior Day.
- Freja Werth led the Dons with a career-high 30 points in the win over the Toreros as she connected on a career-best 11 made field goals and shot 61.1 percent (11-for-18) from the field.
- LMU enters Saturday's third-round matchup following a convincing 66-52 victory over No. 8-seeded Santa Clara on Friday. Brandi Williams shined for the Lions, scoring a game-high 22 points on 46.2 percent (six-for-13).
- Maya Hernandez also propelled the Lions, posting a 14-point, 14-rebound double-double, while Naudia Evans and Carly Heidger added 16 and 12 points, respectively.
- San Francisco and LMU have faced off 92 times in program history, with the Dons holding a 51-41 advantage over the Lions since the first-ever meeting in the 1984-85 season.

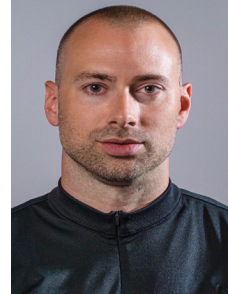

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS AT SAN FRANCISCO:

Molly Goodenbour, a two-time national champion at Stanford with over a decade of head coaching experience on the collegiate level, was named the ninth head coach in University of San Francisco women's basketball history on Sept. 28, 2016. This is Goodenbour's third coaching stint on the Hilltop, where she served as an assistant coach with the Dons during the 1994-95 and 2005-06 seasons.

In 2023-24, Goodenbour led San Francisco to a second-half resurgence as the team finished in a tie for third place in the West Coast Conference standings after starting the season with a 4-9 record. The program posted double-digit victories in WCC play for the fifth time in Goodenbour's tenure as the team finished at 10-6, highlighted by season sweeps of Pacific, Saint Mary's, Pepperdine, and LMU.

San Francisco also finished the season strong, rolling eventual WCC Tournament Champions Portland on the road, earning a 59-47 victory at Chiles Center. Under Goodenbour's guidance, Jasmine Gayles and Debora dos Santos earned All-WCC First Team honors. Dos Santos recorded a career season, averaging a double-double with 15.3 points and 10.6 rebounds per game, while Gayles led the squad in scoring at 16.8 points per game. Gayles also recorded the second 40-point game in program history, dropping 40 points in an 81-68 win at Pacific on January 13.

The 2022-23 season, under Goodenbour's leadership, concluded with an overall record of 19-13. Three Dons earned All-WCC selections, while two Dons earned WCC All-Academic Honors. The Dons also participated in their third straight WNIT.

Within the first six years on the Hilltop, Goodenbour posted impressive numbers, including becoming the winningest coach in San Francisco history through 50 games (27-23), as well as through two seasons at 34-28 (.548). Goodenbour quickly built up her impressive resume at USF, becoming the first coach to post winning overall and conference records in her first two seasons on the job.

Building off the program's strong start to the new decade, the Dons were once again punching a postseason ticket as they battled through a grueling non-conference schedule that kept them away from the Hilltop from Thanksgiving until after New Year's Day. Following an 0-4 start to WCC play, battling through injuries and COVID-19-related pauses, the Dons went on to rattle off wins in six of their next seven games and finished with the third seed heading into the WCC Tournament. USF would go on to defeat Santa Clara in Vegas before returning home to host Air Force in the WNIT. Since the start of the 2020-21 season, Goodenbour's Dons have made consecutive WNIT appearances and won at least one game in back-to-back WCC Tournaments. Led by two-time All-WCC First Team selection Ioanna Krimili, USF's 2020-21 team led the conference in total points and points per game while being a top-four program in team plus/minus.

Goodenbour's third WCC Tournament in 2019 saw her lead the Dons to a first-round victory over Portland, marking the seventh year in a row the Dons advanced beyond their opening game. Goodenbour's 2017-18 squad placed three WCC All-Conference and All-Academic honorees. Anna Seilund earned First-Team All-WCC and Second-Team All-WCC recipients Michaela Rakova and Kalya Simon.

She finished her first year on the Hilltop in 2016-17 with an 18-13 overall record that included an 11-7 mark in West Coast Conference play, enough for a fourth-place finish, the Dons' highest since the 2002-03 season. In the process, Goodenbour became the first USF head coach since Sue Rojewicz in 1982-83 to post a winning record in her first year at the helm and compiled the second-best record by a first-year coach in program history. In addition, USF's 11 WCC wins under Goodenbour were the most since the 1996-97 campaign. Under Goodenbour, the Dons led the conference in free-throw percentage at 77.8%, which stands as the best single-season percentage in program history. Goodenbour's team also led the WCC in 3-point shooting (34.6%) in 2016-17.

Their 217 three-pointers made were the most in program history, including a program-best 15 3s in a win over Portland on Feb. 18, 2017. Goodenbour's squad placed four student-athletes on the WCC All-Academic team in 2016-17 and boasted a pair of All-WCC honorees in first-teamer Rachel Howard and second-team recipient Anna Seilund.

OTHER CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

Goodenbour came to USF from Cal State East Bay, where she was named head coach in June of 2016. She has previous head coaching experience at Santa Rosa Junior College, Cal State-Chico, UC Irvine, and Cal-State Dominguez Hills. Her overall career record, including two seasons at Santa Rosa JC, stands at 222-142 (.610).

Before her appointment at Cal State-East Bay, Goodenbour spent four seasons as the head coach at Cal State-Dominguez Hills. After taking over a program that had posted a 7-48 record in the previous two seasons, Goodenbour led the Toros to a 77-34 (.694) record in her four seasons. Under her guidance, the Toros won California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA) Tournament Championships in 2013-14 and 2014-15 and CCAA regular season titles in 2014-15 and 2015-16 and made three consecutive NCAA Division II Women's Basketball Championship appearances from 2013-16. Her 2014-15 squad won a school-record 26 games and earned the No. 2 seed in the NCAA West Regional.

Goodenbour began her career at Santa Rosa Junior College in 2002-03. After one season as an associate head coach, she took over the head coaching duties for two seasons (2003-05), leading the Bear Cubs to a 69-21 record, two conference championships, and a quarterfinal appearance in the California state championship.

Her second coaching stint at San Francisco came during the 2005-06 season when she served as an assistant on Mary Hile-Nepfel's staff. Following the season, she was appointed head coach at Chico State where she led the Wildcats to a 52-11 record and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. In 2007-08, she was named the CCAA's Coach of the Year after guiding her team to a 28-6 overall record, regular season and conference tournament titles along with a Sweet 16 appearance. The Wildcats finished the year ranked No. 17 in the nation among all Division II teams.

Goodenbour's first Division I head coaching job came at UC Irvine, where she served as the Anteater's coach from 2008-12. The Anteaters qualified for the Big West Tournament in her four seasons at the helm, posting the highest single-season win total (15 in 2010-11) in nearly a decade and had eight players earn all-conference honors during her four-year tenure.

PERSONAL HIGHLIGHTS:

A native of Waterloo, Iowa, Goodenbour was a standout performer at Stanford, where she was a four-year letterwinner under Tara VanDerveer from 1989-93. She helped the Cardinal to four straight Pac-10 championships, three NCAA Final Fours, and a pair of NCAA Championships in 1990 and 1992. Goodenbour was named the most valuable player of the 1992 Final Four after setting an NCAA Tournament record for most postseason three-pointers made with 18. She finished her collegiate career with 1,040 points and still ranks among the school's career top-10 in three-pointers made (178), assists (441), and free throw percentage (.793).

She embarked on her professional playing career in 1995-96 with Linkspring of the Swedish Basketball Federation. A year later, Goodenbour returned to the United States, where she played for the Richmond Rage (1996-97) and Portland Power (1997-98) of the American Basketball League. She also played one season with the WNBA's Sacramento Monarchs before retiring to pursue her coaching career.

OTHER NOTABLES:

After graduating from Stanford with a degree in biology, Goodenbour was selected to the U.S. National team, which won a gold medal at the 1993 World Championship Qualifying Tournament in Brazil.

Goodenbour is married to Pat Fuscaldo, a former USF men's assistant coach who also served as head men's basketball coach at Sonoma State University for 26 seasons.

GAME ONE NOTES:**THEY TURNED THE SEASON AROUND:**

Despite a slow start to the 2023-24 season, starting 4-9, San Francisco strung together 10 wins in the following 16 games to finish the regular season 14-15 to finish in a tie for third place in the WCC standings. Despite earning the No. 4 seed in the West Coast Conference Tournament, the green and gold ultimately fell to Pacific 76-71 in the quarterfinal round.

DOUBLE-DIGIT LEAGUE WINS:

San Francisco finished the 2023-24 season in a tie for third place in the WCC standings with a 10-6 record. The Dons' 10 wins marks the 11th time in program history the team has accumulated a double-digit win total in league play.

CONSISTENCY LED TO SUCCESS:

In all 16 WCC games, San Francisco used the same starting lineup of Luana Leite, Jasmine Gayles, Cami Fulcher, Freja Werth, and Debora dos Santos. During league play, the starters contributed to 86 percent of the team's scoring, averaging 57 points per game. As a team, the Dons averaged 66.3 points per game during WCC play.

2023-24 WCC ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS:

Jasmine Gayles and Debora dos Santos earned WCC All-Conference First Team honors at the end of the 2023-24 regular season, becoming the first two players to receive First Team recognition in the same season since 2005 when Mary Jane Krueger and Dominique Carter made the All-WCC First Team.

DOS SANTOS HAD A CAREER YEAR:

Debora dos Santos posted career numbers during the 2023-24 season, finishing the campaign averaging 15.3 points and 10.6 rebounds per game. Becoming the only player in the WCC to average a double-double last season, dos Santos also ranked nationally in total rebounds (33rd - 317), rebounds per game (t-15th - 10.6), and double-doubles (t-19th - 17).

A force on the offensive end, dos Santos totaled 25 double-digit scoring performances, reaching the 20-point threshold seven times, including three straight to end the season against Saint Mary's, San Diego, and Pacific.

She also contributed on the boards, posting double figures in rebounding 19 times while ranking first in the WCC in total rebounds at 317. Her career-high 18 rebounds at LMU on January 4, 2024, marked the WCC-single game high for rebounds during the 2023-24 season.

WCC NEWCOMER OF THE YEAR:

In her first season on the Hilltop, Freja Werth established herself as a significant piece to the program's success, serving as the Dons' third-leading scorer at a career-high 9.7 points per game. Earning the start in all 30 games, Werth totaled 15 double-digit scoring performances, including posting a season-high 20 points against Columbia on December 28, knocking down six of her eight attempts from the three-point line in the process.

A strong rebounder, Werth ranked second on the team at 5.7 per game while posting two games with double-digit boards. Notably, she recorded 12 rebounds along with 13 points for her second-career double-double in a 75-70 win over Brown on January 1.

2024-25 SAN FRANCISCO WOMEN'S BASKETBALL SEASON NOTES/NEWS

NOTABLE RETURNERS:

Notable returners for the Dons include reigning WCC Newcomer of the Year Freja Werth and All-WCC First Team selection Debora dos Santos. Werth ranked third on the team in scoring, averaging 9.9 points per game, while dos Santos averaged 15.3 points and 10.6 rebounds, the lone player in the league to average a double-double.

THE NEWCOMERS:

Along with returning 12 players from last season, including four starters, San Francisco welcome graduate transfer Emma Trawally Porta (Detroit Mercy) and true freshmen Angeliki Ziaka (Athens, Greece) and Kiana Moniz (San Francisco, Calif.) as newcomers to the program.

NEW COACHING STAFF:

Following a handful of coaching departures, Molly Goodenbour has hired four new coaches to join her and Associate Head Coach Janell Jones on staff. Jamie Turner (former head coach at Sacramento State and San Jose State), Greg Rahn (former associate head coach at Dominican), Isaac Lu (former head coach at Western Nebraska Community College), and Jasmine Gayles (former player) enter their first season as coaches on the Hilltop.

PICKED TO FINISH SIXTH:

San Francisco, selected sixth in the 2024-25 WCC Preseason Coaches Poll, received 53 points, while Gonzaga (92 points), Washington State (91 points), Portland (84 points), Oregon State (77 points), and Pacific (63 points) were slotted as the league's top teams.

WCC PRESEASON HONORS:

For the fourth consecutive season, a member of the program was named to the West Coast Conference All-Conference Preseason Team. Debora dos Santos earned the honor ahead of the 2024-25 season after averaging a career-best 15.3 points and 10.6 rebounds per game in 30 contents to guide the Dons to a tie for third place in the conference standings.

NON-CONFERENCE PLAY IS ON THE ROAD:

San Francisco's eight-game nonconference slate features five true road games and a matchup against Boise State at Chase Center on November 21. The Dons face off against four teams that made postseason appearances, including Columbia (NCAA), Boise State (WNIT), Northern Arizona (WNIT), and Seton Hall (WBIT).

A VETERAN ROSTER:

The 2024-25 San Francisco's roster features eight upperclassmen, seven seniors (Cami Fulcher, Debora dos Santos, Lorena Barbosa, Freja Werth, Aya Keita, Luana Leite, and Mia Vuksic) and one junior (Marina Hernandez). The Dons also have three graduate students on the roster (Emma Trawally Porta, Seynabou Thiam, and Sol Castro).

MORE OPTIONS IN 2024-25:

Last season in 2023-24, San Francisco only had six players on the 13-player roster to compete in all 30 games. Notable players who missed the entire season were Elle Papahronis and Sol Castro, while Mia Vuksic (24 games) and Lorena Barbosa (15 games) also missed time due to injury.

SEASON OPENERS:

Heading into the 2024-25 season, San Francisco has won six of the last eight season openers, with the only losses coming to UC Davis (2020-21) and UC Santa Barbara (2023-24) during the Molly Goodenbour era. In eight season openers, the Dons are averaging 80.9 points per game while holding opponents to 38.9 percent shooting.

AN INTERNATIONAL PRESENCE:

San Francisco features 12 players from countries outside the United States, including Argentina, Brazil, Croatia, Greece, Hungary, Senegal, Spain, and Sweden.



GAME TWO NOTES:**REBOUNDING STOLE THE SHOW:**

San Francisco recorded 52 rebounds in the narrow five-point loss at Colorado State to open the season. As a team, the Dons reached the 50-rebound threshold for just the 16th time in the Molly Goodenbour era, and the 52 against the Rams marked the most since recording 53 in an 80-79 win at Santa Clara during the 2022-23 season.

16 OFFENSIVE BOARDS:

Active on the offensive side at Colorado State, San Francisco totaled 16 offensive rebounds, the seventh straight game the Dons have reached double-digit offensive boards dating back to February 15 of the 2023-24 season.

THE DEFENSE HELD ITS GROUND:

San Francisco held Colorado State to just 29.3 percent shooting, the lowest since the team held LMU to 23.6 percent shooting in a 63-38 win on January 1, 2024. The Dons also forced nine turnovers, blocked four shots, and tallied three steals.

FREJA LED THE WAY:

Freja Werth scored a team-high 13 points against Colorado State, shooting four-for-nine from the field. Werth is averaging 14.0 points per game while shooting 54.0 percent (27-for-50) from the field in the last five games.

THE FRESHMAN CAN SHOOT:

Angeliki Ziaka scored her first two collegiate baskets from long range, connecting on two of her four three-point attempts to finish the game with six points.

A SOLID DEBUT FOR EMMA:

Emma Trawally Porta, playing her first game as a Don following three seasons at Detroit Mercy, scored nine points, collected two rebounds, and shot 50 percent from the field. Her shooting percentage marked the second highest in a season opener in her career. She shot 62.5 percent last season, scoring 10 points, against Eastern Michigan on November 6, 2023.

A FAMILIAR FOE:

During her time in the Division II ranks, Molly Goodenbour coached against UC Santa Barbara's Renee Jimenez while Jimenez was at the helm of CSUSB, Cal State Monterey Bay, and Cal State San Marcos. Goodenbour holds a 6-3 overall record over Jimenez in her career at Cal State Dominguez Hills, going 4-1 against CSUSB, 2-0 against Cal State San Marcos, and 0-2 against Cal State Monterey Bay.

GAME THREE NOTES:**SUCCESS IN HOME OPENERS:**

Since becoming head coach before the 2016-17 season, Molly Goodenbour has guided San Francisco to an 8-1 record in home openers following the 59-37 win over UC Santa Barbara on Saturday, Nov. 9.

ANOTHER STRONG DEFENSIVE PERFORMANCE:

San Francisco held UC Santa Barbara to 37 points and 20.8 percent (11-for-53) shooting. The last time the Dons had a team to under 40 points and 25 percent shooting was LMU on January 4, 2024, in a 63-38 win at Gersten Pavilion. The Gauchos' 20.8 percent from the field marked the lowest shooting percentage by an opponent of the Molly Goodenbour era.

A SHUT DOWN DEFENDER:

Angeliki Ziaka shut down UC Santa Barbara, as she recorded four blocks and three steals in just her second collegiate game, becoming the first player to record at least four blocks and three steals in a game since Mikayla Williams totaled six blocks and three steals in a 79-61 win over CSUN on November 16, 2019.

ELLE IS ON THE BOARD:

Elle Papahronis scored her first career points in the win over UC Santa Barbara, finishing the game with 10 points while going five-for-six at the free throw line.

DOUBLE-DIGIT REBOUNDS:

Emma Trawally Porta recorded 10 rebounds in the win over UC Santa Barbara, the first time recording double-digit rebounds this season and the 16th time in her career.

GAME FOUR NOTES:**BENCH SUPPORT:**

San Francisco scored 62 points in the win over Portland State, with a season-high 30 contributed by the bench. Sol Castro and Elle Papahronis led the way, combining for 25 while shooting 69.2 percent (nine-for-13) from the field. Emma Trawally Porta added five points in the win, connecting on two of her three field-goal attempts.

THE DEFENSE CAME THROUGH AGAIN:

The Dons' defense remained strong against Portland State, limiting the Vikings to 32.8 percent shooting (21-for-64) to secure the win. Through the first three games, the Dons rank tied for 28th in the nation in scoring defense (48.3 points per game), tied for 39th in blocks per game (5.7), and field goal percentage defense (28 percent).

SOL FOUND HER GROOVE:

Guiding the team off the bench in the victory over Portland State, Sol Castro recorded an efficient performance, finishing with 13 points, seven rebounds, and two assists. The forward went six-for-seven from the field in 15 minutes of action.

DEB KEEPS ROLLING:

Debora dos Santos added another double-digit scoring performance in the win over Portland State, recording 17 points on eight-for-18 shooting. Dating back to last season, dos Santos has reached double figures in six of the last 10 games.

GAME FIVE NOTES:**FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK:**

Elle Papahronis earned San Francisco's first weekly award of the season after earning WCC Freshman of the Week on Monday, Nov. 18. Papahronis averaged 13.5 points, 3.5 rebounds, and two assists on 40 percent shooting off the bench in two games against Portland State and San Diego State. Against the Aztecs, she finished with a team-high 15 points in 33 minutes of action.

FIRST DOUBLE-DOUBLE AS A DON:

Emma Trawally Porta posted her first double-double of the season after recording 12 points and 10 rebounds at San Diego State. In 30 minutes, Trawally Porta shot an efficient 71.4 percent (five-for-seven) and knocked down a team-high two three-pointers.

IT'S A BLOCK PARTY:

Emma Trawally Porta added three blocks at San Diego State, putting her season total to 11. Through four games to start the season, Trawally Porta ranks tied for 22nd in the nation in total blocks and tied for 17th in blocks per game (2.7).

BEST SHOOTING PERFORMANCE TO DATE:

As a team, San Francisco shot 42 percent (21-for-50) from the field at San Diego State, its highest shooting percentage of the season. The Dons previously shot 41.1 percent (vs. Portland State), 35.2 percent (vs. UCSB), and 27.1 percent (at Colorado State).



GAME SIX NOTES:**BREAK OUT GAME FOR FREJA:**

Scoring in double figures for the second time this season, Freja Werth recorded a game-high 18 points against Boise State on Thursday, Nov. 21, at Chase Center. Werth shot a stellar 58.3 percent (seven-for-12) from the field and connected on all four of her attempts from distance. She also added five rebounds and one steal.

BARBOSA AND LEITE CONTRIBUTED:

Scoring a career-high nine points off the bench, Lorena Barbosa shot a stellar 66.7 percent (four-for-six) from the field in 13 minutes of action. Beginning to return to form, Luana Leite scored six points, adding five rebounds and four assists. Defensively, she led the team in steals with two.

BACK ON THE EAST COAST:

San Francisco returns to the East Coast for the first time since 2013 when it takes on Seton Hall on Monday, Dec. 1, at Walsh Gymnasium. In total, the Dons have played six away games on the East Coast in program history, with the most recent coming in 2013 with a loss at Fordham (80-66) on Friday, Nov. 8, and a win at Columbia (83-69) on Sunday, Nov. 10. Overall, San Francisco has faced off against 23 East Coast programs, winning 62.5 percent of its contests (25-15).

GAME SEVEN NOTES:**EMMA STEPPED UP:**

Emma Trawally Porta posted season highs in points, three-pointers, and made field goals in the narrow 59-53 loss at Seton Hall on Monday, Dec. 2. In 31 minutes off the bench, Trawally Porta led San Francisco in scoring, posting a season-high 15 points. Trawally Porta shot 54.5 percent (six-for-11), marking the fourth time she has shot 50 percent or better in a game, and knocked down three of her five three-point attempts. Thriving on the glass, she added nine rebounds to lead both programs.

ANOTHER STRONG DEFENSIVE OUTING:

For the fifth time in the last six games to start the season, San Francisco held an opponent to under 60 points after allowing 59 at Seton Hall. The Dons also held the Pirates to 35.3 percent (18-for-51) shooting, the fifth time an opponent has shot 40 percent or worse against the green and gold.

ONE OF THE TOP WCC PROGRAMS IN FIRST NET RANKING:

The 2024-25 NCAA Women's Basketball NET Rankings dropped for the first time this season, and San Francisco came in at 120, the second-highest ranking for a WCC team. Portland, the only other team ranked higher than USF, entered at 98.

GAME EIGHT NOTES:**FREJA HAD A GAME:**

Freja Werth scored a career-high 24 points in the narrow loss at Columbia on Wednesday, Dec. 4, surpassing her previous best of 20 points set last season against the Lions on the Hilltop. Werth also posted her third-career double-double, adding a game-high 10 rebounds. She also remained perfect from the free-throw line this season, knocking down all four of her attempts.

BACK IN A RHYTHM:

Coming alive in the second half against Columbia, Debora dos Santos finished the game with 16 points, her second-highest point total of the season, while shooting a team-best 77.8 percent (seven-for-nine) from the field.

THE OFFENSE CAME ALIVE:

As a team, San Francisco recorded a new season-high of 79 points, surpassing the previous high by 17. Notably, the Dons also posted a new high in team field goal percentage at 46.2 percent.

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF FREE POINTS:

San Francisco shot a season-high 81.3 percent from the free-throw line at Columbia, knocking down 10 of its 13 attempts. The previous best as a team was 68.2 percent against UC Santa Barbara on November 9. Freja Werth and Elle Papahronis knocked down four free throws, while Luana Leite and Debora dos Santos combined for five. The Dons also shot over 80 percent from the free-throw line for the third time in the last two seasons, the last time coming against San Diego on March 2 of the 2023-24 season.

GAME NINE NOTES:**TWO 20-POINT PERFORMANCES:**

For the first time this season, San Francisco had two players reach the 20-point threshold in a game, with Freja Werth and Emma Trawally Porta scoring 23 and 20 points, respectively. The last time two players scored 20 or more points in a game was on February 3, 2024, when Jasmine Gayles (22) and Debora dos Santos (20) reached the threshold at San Diego.

SEASON-HIGH IN THREE-POINTERS:

As a team, San Francisco reached a new high in total three-pointers made this season with 10, while shooting 41.6 percent from distance. Freja Werth and Emma Trawally Porta combined for nine of the Dons' 10 three-pointers, with Werth knocking down a season-best five. Trawally Porta went perfect from distance as she connected on a career-best four in 31 minutes off the bench.

A NEAR DOUBLE-DOUBLE FOR THE FRESHMAN:

Angeliki Ziaka posted her best performance to date on the road at Northern Arizona, recording a career-high 14 points and eight assists. She also led the team in blocks for the third time this season, tallying two. The freshman point guard ranks second on the team and tied for ninth in the WCC in blocks with 11.

MORNING HOME GAME:

For the just the second time in over the past decade, San Francisco is set to play a morning home game when it hosts Arizona State on Tuesday, Dec. 17 at 11:00 am PT. The game time marks the first morning home contest for the Dons since 2022 when the team defeated Penn 73-65.

GAME TEN NOTES:**ENDED NON-CONFERENCE ON A HIGH NOTE:**

San Francisco picked up its third win of the season in a narrow 67-64 victory over Arizona State on Tuesday, Dec. 17, at War Memorial at the Sobrato Center, ending its five-game skid.

WIN OVER A POWER 4/BIG 12 OPPONENT:

San Francisco edged out Arizona State for its first win over a Big 12 opponent since the 1996-97 season when it defeated Texas A&M, 85-55, on the road. The victory also marked the first Power 4 win since December 5, 2021, when the program beat Southern California, 78-63, at the Galen Center.

TWO DOUBLE-DOUBLES:

Debora dos Santos and Emma Trawally Porta led San Francisco throughout the 40 minutes against Arizona State, as dos Santos totaled a 17-point, 14-rebound double-double while Trawally Porta added 13 points and 12 rebounds for her first double-double as a Don. The last time the Dons had two players record double-doubles in a game was on February 29, 2020 when Leilah Vigil (26 points, 10 assists) and Mikayla Williams (15 points, 13 rebounds) posted double-doubles at Saint Mary's.

PERFECT FROM THE LINE:

Freja Werth posted 16 points in a season-high 38 minutes while remaining perfect from the free-throw line, knocking down all seven of her attempts from the charity stripe. In nine games, Werth is 22-of-22 from the free throw line and is the lone player in the WCC with at least 20 attempts without a miss.



GAME ELEVEN NOTES:**DOWNED THE ZAGS:**

For the first time since 2017, San Francisco defeated Gonzaga in a 73-58 triumph on Thursday, Dec. 19 at War Memorial at the Sobrato Center. The Dons never trailed during the contest, earning a wire-to-wire victory over the Bulldogs for the first time since February 10, 2001, when the Dons earned an 88-60 win on the Hilltop. Kim Whisler led the green and gold in scoring, with 20 points on 88.9 percent (eight-for-nine) shooting in 26 minutes.

DEFENSE WAS KEY:

As a team, the green and gold totaled 10 steals, matching the season-best set at Northern Arizona on December 14. San Francisco also held Gonzaga to 58 points, marking the sixth time the Dons have held an opponent to under 60 points. San Francisco is also one of two teams in the WCC to hold six opponents to under 60 points in a game this season, tied with undefeated Portland.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

After leading the team to two wins over Arizona State and Gonzaga last week, Debora dos Santos was named WCC Player of the Week on Monday, Dec. 23. Averaging a double-double in two contests, dos Santos finished the week with 16.0 points and 11.0 rebounds, with 1.5 steals and 3.0 blocks per game.

EMMA CONTINUES TO BALL:

Emma Trawally Porta led the team with 18 points in the win over Gonzaga, scoring in double figures for the fifth straight game. In the last five contests, Trawally Porta is averaging 15.6 points and 8.0 rebounds per game on 53.7 percent shooting.

DEB CAME TO PLAY DEFENSIVELY:

In the win over Gonzaga, Debora dos Santos matched a career-high in blocks, totaling four in 27 minutes. Dos Santos also added two steals and grabbed eight rebounds (six defensive).

LUANA RETURNS TO FORM:

Luana Leite nearly recorded a triple-double with 12 points, seven rebounds, and 10 assists in the win over Gonzaga. Leite was also perfect from the free-throw line, knocking down all seven of her attempts.

SEASON DEBUT:

Mia Vuksic made her season debut after missing the first nine games due to injury. In just three minutes of action, Vuksic scored four points and connected on her lone three-point attempt.

GAME TWELVE NOTES:**2-0 TO START WCC PLAY:**

San Francisco downed LMU on the road, 85-73, on Saturday, Dec. 28 to begin West Coast Conference play with a 2-0 record. The perfect record in the first two league games marks the first time the Dons won their opening two WCC games since the 2016-17 campaign. That season, the green and gold defeated San Diego and Santa Clara to open 2-0.

21 POINTS IN 19 MINUTES:

Debora dos Santos scored a season-high 21 points while shooting 66.7 percent (eight-of-12) from the field. She also added six rebounds, two assists, one block, and a steal in 19 minutes.

MIA MADE AN IMPACT:

Mia Vukšić recorded a season-high 13 points in 12 minutes off the bench, connecting on four of her six field-goal attempts. Vukšić also knocked down three baskets from beyond the arc and went a perfect two-for-two at the free-throw line.

ACTIVE HANDS:

As a team, San Francisco recorded a season-high 16 steals as three players led the way with three apiece. The Dons' 16 steals marked the most in a game since tallying 17 in a 73-46 win against UC Davis on November 18, 2021.

50 PERCENT FROM THE FIELD:

San Francisco shot 55.2 percent from the field in the win at LMU, knocking down 32 of its 58 attempts. The Dons last shot over 50 percent on February 9, 2023, at Saint Mary's, connecting on 51 percent of their field goals. Head Coach Molly Goodenbour's teams are 29-2 when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.

DONS ARE SCORING IN CONFERENCE PLAY:

In two WCC contests, the green and gold average 79.0 points per game, second-best in the conference. The Dons' 13.5 scoring margin is also third best in the WCC, only trailing Portland (25.0) and Washington State (22.0).

THREES ARE FALLING:

San Francisco tops the league in three-point percentage during WCC play, at 50.0 percent in two games. The Dons have connected on 19 of their 38 attempts. Emma Trawally Porta ranks first on the team and tied for second in the WCC in three-point percentage at 62.5 percent against the first two conference opponents.

GAME THIRTEEN NOTES:**FOUR IN A ROW AND THREE STRAIGHT WCC WINS:**

San Francisco has won four straight overall and is 3-0 in WCC action, with each of its wins coming by double digits. The Dons have won their first three WCC games for the first time since the 2000-01 season.

BATTLE OF SOLID DEFENSIVE TEAMS:

In San Francisco's win over Santa Clara, both teams struggled from the field as the Dons shot 31.9 percent while the Broncos connected on 31.7 percent of their attempts. The Dons and Broncos rank in the top 50 in the nation in opponent field goal percentage defense, with the Dons in 41st (36.3 percent) and the Broncos in 45th (36.4 percent).

DEB HELD A BLOCK PARTY:

Debora dos Santos recorded a career-high five blocks in the win at Santa Clara on Monday, Dec. 30, surpassing her previous best of four. Dos Santos also becomes the first player to record five or more blocks in a game for the Dons since Lucija Kostic also totaled five in a win over Morgan State on November 9, 2021. Overall, dos Santos leads the team and ranks fifth in the WCC in total blocks with 19.

ANOTHER 20 PIECE:

Freja Werth reached the 20-point threshold for the third time this season as she posted 22 points while adding eight rebounds, two assists, three steals, and one block in the win at Santa Clara. In her previous three seasons of collegiate basketball, Werth has only scored 20 or more points in a game once, with 20 against Columbia in the 2023-24 season.

AUTOMATIC FROM THE LINE:

Freja Werth was also a perfect six-for-six at the free-throw line against the Broncos, increasing her conference-leading percentage to 96.7 percent. Only missing one free throw this season, Werth is the lone player in the WCC with at least 32 free-throw attempts, and only one miss this season.

EMMA CONTINUES TO SCORE EFFICIENTLY:

Emma Trawally Porta scored 17 points on 50 percent shooting in the win at Santa Clara. For the third straight game, ninth overall, Trawally Porta shot 50 percent or better from the field. In three WCC games, she ranks third in the conference in field-goal percentage at 55.9 percent.

ON THE RISE IN THE NET RANKINGS:

San Francisco is the second-highest-ranked team in the WCC as it lands at 104th following its victory over Santa Clara last Monday. The green and gold only trail Portland as the Pilots rank 68th.



GAME FOURTEEN NOTES:**FOUR STRAIGHT WCC BLOWOUTS:**

In the first four games of conference play, San Francisco has earned double-digit wins over Gonzaga, LMU, Santa Clara, and Saint Mary's, marking the first time in program history that the Dons have won four WCC games in a row by double-digits.

FIVE IN DOUBLE FIGURES:

In San Francisco's 87-73 win over Saint Mary's last Thursday, five players scored in double figures for the first time this season. Angeliki Ziaka led the team with 22 points off the bench, while Emma Trawally Porta (21 points), Freja Werth (15 points), Debora dos Santos (12 points), and Luana Leite (11 points) helped pace the team.

The last time the Dons had five players reach double-digit points in a game was on February 10, 2024, when Cami Fulcher (15 points), Luana Leite (14 points), Debora dos Santos (14 points), Jasmine Gayles (13 points), and Freja Werth (12 points) guided the green and gold to a win over Pacific.

SHE CAN PASS IT:

Luana Leite posted a career-high 13 assists in the win over Saint Mary's, marking the fourth time she has recorded double-digit assists in a game. Her 13 assists also mark the WCC single-season high in assists, passing LMU's Naudia Evans and Saint Mary's Zeryhia Aokuso who tallied 12 earlier in the season.

A BREAKOUT GAME FOR THE FRESHMAN:

Angeliki Ziaka recorded a career-high 22 points in 25 minutes off the bench in the Dons' fifth-straight win last Thursday. Ziaka's point tally marks the first time she has surpassed the 20-point threshold in a game. Her career-best six-made three-pointers fell just three short of tying the USF single-game record for three-point baskets held by Ioanna Krimili (She totaled nine three-pointers on January 30, 2021, at LMU).

SECOND IN SCORING DURING CONFERENCE PLAY:

Emma Trawally Porta posted a season-high 21 points in the win over Saint Mary's, her second 20+ point game of the season. In four WCC games, she ranks second in scoring, averaging 18.5 points per game, and in field-goal percentage at 58.0 percent.

FINDING THEIR RANGE:

San Francisco continues to succeed from beyond the three-point line at the start of league play, leading the WCC at 39.0 percent (41-for-105). Shooting 28.7 percent (50-for-174) from three during the non-conference slate, the Dons' 10.3 percent difference marks the most significant change by any team from non-conference to WCC play.

GAME FIFTEEN NOTES:**ANOTHER DOUBLE-DIGIT WIRE-TO-WIRE VICTORY:**

San Francisco dropped Pepperdine by 16 points, 76-60 last Saturday, and never trailed during the contest. The wire-to-wire win marks the third time the Dons have defeated a WCC opponent while leading the entire game this season.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK:

After setting career highs in multiple statistical categories and guiding San Francisco to two conference victories, Angeliki Ziaka was named West Coast Conference Freshman of the Week. Ziaka shined in two home wins over Saint Mary's and Pepperdine, averaging 15.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, and 3.5 assists per game while shooting 52.4 percent from the floor and 50 percent from beyond the three-point line.

DEB BROKE OUT:

Debora dos Santos totaled a season-best 26 points on 62.5 percent (10-for-16) shooting in 30 minutes of action. Her 10 made field goals also matched a season-high while guiding the Dons defensively with eight rebounds and four blocks.

SECOND-HALF SURGE:

After scoring just eight points on three-of-five shooting against Pepperdine, Freja Werth guided the team with 14 second-half points to finish the game with 22. Recording her best shooting performance of the season, Werth connected on seven of her 10 field-goal attempts, shooting a season-high 70 percent from the floor.

SHE DOESN'T MISS:

Freja Werth ranks first in the WCC and second in the nation with a 97.7 free-throw percentage. She only trails New Mexico's Viane Cumber (97.9 percent) for the top spot in Division I. Werth has connected on 43 of her 44 attempts this season and matched a career-high with seven in the win over Pepperdine.

GAME SIXTEEN NOTES:**TOUGH NIGHT ON THE ROAD:**

San Francisco's six-game winning streak was snapped when it dropped a 64-57 decision at Oregon State on Thursday, Jan. 9. Freja Werth led the team in scoring with 18 points, while Emma Trawally Porta posted a 10-point, 11-rebound double-double.

A FULCHER SIGHTING:

Cami Fulcher scored a season-high 17 points in the loss at Oregon State, shooting 50 percent (six-for-12) from the field and knocking down four three-pointers. Coming up one point shy of her career-high, Fulcher scored in double figures for the first time since February 29, 2024, when she posted 15 in an overtime win at Saint Mary's.

TURNOVERS WERE AT A MINIMUM:

San Francisco committed only six turnovers at Oregon State, a season-low for the program. The six turnovers also mark the team's lowest number in a game since February 25, 2023, when it committed six at LMU.

GAME SEVENTEEN NOTES:**WERTH HAS BEEN SOLID:**

Leading the offensive charge for the green and gold last week, Freja Werth averaged 19.0 points per game, shooting seven-for-15 from beyond the arc. The senior continues to be one of the WCC's best in conference play, ranking third in scoring (16.9 PPG), second in both three-point percentage (40.9) and free throw percentage (88.2), and eighth in field goal percentage (43.8). On a national scale, Werth ranks tied for 13th in the country in free throw percentage, shooting 92.9 percent from the line throughout the season, missing just four out of 56 shots from the charity stripe.

TWO PASSERS ON THE RISE:

During WCC play, Luana Leite and Angeliki Ziaka rank in the top 10 in assist/turnover ratio. Leite enters the week second at 3.6, and Ziaka is sixth at 1.7. Leite is also second in the WCC in total assists with 40, while Ziaka ranks 12th overall with 22 in six games played.

PLENTY OF STEALS:

San Francisco is the only team in the WCC with five players in the top 20 in steals during league play. Freja Werth, Debora dos Santos, Angeliki Ziaka, Luana Leite, and Emma Trawally Porta all have at least nine steals through seven games. Werth leads the way with 14, ranking seventh, while Leite (11th - 12), Ziaka (13th - 11), dos Santos (16th - 10), and Trawally Porta (20th - nine) have contributed defensively.



GAME EIGHTEEN NOTES:**ANGIE CONTINUES TO IMPROVE:**

Angeliki Ziaka scored a game-high 20 points in the loss to Washington State last Thursday, reaching the 20-point threshold in a game for the second time this season. Ziaka posted her best shooting performance of her career, knocking down a season-high nine of her 11 field goals for an 81.8 shooting percentage.

MARINA MADE AN APPEARANCE:

Marina Hernandez earned high-end minutes against Washington State, logging a season-high 18 off the bench. Hernandez also recorded a career-high five points and knocked down her second-career three-pointer.

SECOND-HALF ADJUSTMENTS:

Despite the loss, San Francisco outscored Washington State in the second half, 37-29, last Thursday at home. In the third quarter, the Dons shot 50 percent (seven-for-14) from the field while forcing the Cougars into six turnovers.

GAME NINETEEN NOTES:**MATCHING A CAREER-HIGH:**

Freja Werth led all scorers at Pacific last Saturday with 24 points, matching her career-high set at Columbia on December 4, 2024. Werth was near perfect from the free-throw line, knocking down nine of her 11 attempts. She also added a game-high 10 rebounds for her second double-double of the season.

CONTRIBUTION OFF THE BENCH:

In 16 minutes off the bench at Pacific, Mia Vuksic scored a season-high 14 points on 71.4 percent (five-for-seven) shooting. Her season-best four three-pointers were the most in a game since recording four against UTEP on November 27, 2021, while playing at Kansas.

GAME TWENTY NOTES:**BACK ON TRACK:**

Following a four-game skid, San Francisco returned to the Hill and defeated Oregon State, 54-52, last Thursday, splitting the season series. The last time the Dons defeated the Beavers was December 2, 2007, in a 64-62 decision in Corvallis.

STRONG ON THE GLASS:

As a team, San Francisco outrebounded Oregon State 37-33 and collected 18 offensive boards, the third most in a game this season. The Dons also outperformed the Beavers in second-chance points, 19-6.

FREJA KEEPS THE TRAIN GOING:

Reaching the 20-point threshold for the third time in the last four games, Werth posted a game-high 20 points on 41.2 percent (seven-for-17) shooting. She also led the Dons with four three-pointers and tied Kéita for the team lead in rebounding with eight.

ANOTHER SOLID SHOOTING PERFORMANCE:

Mia Vuksic scored in double-figures off the bench, accumulating 13 points in a season-high 20 minutes. Shooting efficiently from the floor, she knocked down five of her eight attempts while recording two three-pointers.

GAME TWENTY-ONE NOTES:**THE CAREER SEASON CONTINUES:**

Freja Werth continued her string of 20-point games, posting a career-high 26 points at San Diego while shooting a flawless 10-for-10 from the free-throw line. She notched her eighth 20-point scoring performance this season, the most in her career, and sixth during WCC play. She currently ranks second in the conference at 18.0 points per game in 11 WCC contests.

AYA CONTRIBUTED:

Aya Keita scored in double figures for the first time this season with 10 points in 21 minutes of action. Setting the tone early in the game, she scored seven points in the opening quarter and finished shooting 66.7 percent (four-for-six) from the field.

GOOD CHANCE FOR A WIN WITH A LEAD AT HALF:

San Francisco posted its 10th win of the season with a lead at the halftime break against San Diego last Saturday. Following the win, the Dons improved to 10-3 this season when leading at halftime. Overall, in nine seasons at the helm, Head Coach Molly Goodenbour is 96-30 when leading after the opening 20 minutes.

GAME TWENTY-TWO NOTES:**NEAR PERFECT FROM THE LINE:**

San Francisco shot a season-best 93.3 percent (14-of-15) from the free throw line in the loss to LMU last Thursday. The last time San Francisco shot over 90 percent from the line as a team was on December 19, 2022, when it knocked down 10 of 10 from the charity stripe in a 73-63 win over Pepperdine at home.

BACK ON TRACK:

Scoring a combined 12 points in the last five games, Emma Trawally Porta led San Francisco with 16 points in 29 minutes while shooting 55.5 percent (five-for-nine) from the field. She also posted double-digit points for the first time since scoring 10 at Oregon State on January 9.

GAME TWENTY-THREE NOTES:**ELLE WAS ACTIVE ON THE GLASS:**

Active on the glass, Elle Papahronis posted a career-high nine rebounds and added eight points and two steals. In just her first season as a guard, Papahronis has totaled five or more rebounds in a game nine times, including four of the last six.

OFFENSIVE REBOUNDING:

San Francisco grabbed 17 offensive rebounds against Santa Clara last Saturday, marking the fourth-highest total in a game this season. The Dons have also accumulated double-digit offensive rebounds in all but three games this season, compiling 286 overall, third most in the WCC.

GAME TWENTY-FOUR NOTES:**LARGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY:**

San Francisco posted a 24-point win at Pepperdine last Thursday, winning 72-48 at Firestone Fieldhouse. The win marked the team's most extensive margin of victory this season and the first time the Dons have defeated an opponent by 24 or more points since defeating Pepperdine 78-54 on the road last season. The green and gold also earned a 25-point victory at LMU in 2023-24, prevailing 63-38 on January 4, 2024.

SEASON-HIGH:

Emma Trawally Porta scored a season-high 22 points, one point shy of matching her career-high of 23 set against Northern Kentucky on January 1, 2024, while playing at Detroit Mercy. Her 22-point performance also marked the third time she has surpassed the 20-point threshold in a game and the first since scoring 21 in a win over Saint Mary's on January 2.

ANGIE FOUND HER RANGE:

Angeliki Ziaka scored 16 points at Pepperdine while shooting an efficient 42.9 percent (six-for-14) from the field. Leading the team in three-pointers throughout the contest, she knocked down four, the second time in her first collegiate season she has connected on four or more three-point field goals.

GAME TWENTY-FIVE NOTES:**100 ASSISTS AND COUNTING:**

Luana Leite surpassed 100 assists on the season last week at Saint Mary's, as she totaled six in the narrow three-point loss. Her assist total marks the second straight season she has accumulated at least 100 assists in a season. Her 107 assists in 2024-25 rank tied for third in the WCC.

GAME TWENTY-SIX NOTES:**1,000 CAREER POINTS:**

Freja Werth scored her 1,000th career point in the first quarter of San Francisco's 80-67 win over Pacific last Saturday. Throughout her four-year career at UAlbany and San Francisco, Werth has averaged 252.8 total points per season, with 694 coming during her two seasons on the Hilltop.

FIVE IN DOUBLE FIGURES:

For the second time this season, San Francisco had five players score in double figures during the Dons' victory over Pacific. Freja Werth led the team with 18 points, while Aya Keita (14 points), Cami Fulcher (14 points), Emma Trawally Porta (12 points), and Luana Leite (12 points) helped guide the team offensively. During Head Coach Molly Goodenbour's tenure on the Hilltop, the Dons are 11-2 when five players have scored double-digit points in a game in the last nine seasons.

THEY HAD A LEAD AT HALFTIME:

For the 17th time this season, San Francisco held a halftime advantage when leading Pacific, 41-33, last Saturday. The Dons are 12-5 this season when holding a halftime lead.

SHOT OVER 50 PERCENT:

San Francisco shot over 50 percent in its win over Pacific, marking the third time the Dons have shot over 50 percent from the field this season. The green and gold are 3-0 when shooting over 50 percent, defeating LMU, Pacific, and Saint Mary's. The Dons' three games shooting over 50 percent from the floor is the most in a single season since 2022-23 when the team recorded five games.

GAME TWENTY-SEVEN NOTES:**A SEASON-HIGH FOR LU:**

Luana Leite scored a season-high 19 points at Washington State last Thursday. Her double-digit scoring performance marked the seventh time in her career she has scored in double figures in two seasons. Her 19 points came four shy of matching her career-high of 23 set at Portland State on December 16, 2023.

SUCCESS AT THE FREE THROW LINE:

As a team, San Francisco shot an efficient 81.0 percent from the free throw line at Washington State. Luana Leite, Elle Papahronis, Mia Vuksic, and Cami Fulcher combined for a perfect 11-for-11 at the charity stripe. The Dons have shot over 80 percent from the free throw line eight times this season, the most since the 2022-23 season.

GAME TWENTY-EIGHT NOTES:**SWEPT THE ZAGS:**

San Francisco made history with a 70-68 victory over Gonzaga last Saturday at the McCarthy Athletic Center, completing a season sweep against the Bulldogs for the first time in 23 years and snapping their 14-game win streak. The win over the Bulldogs marked the first time the green and gold have won a game in Spokane since 2006 while sweeping the Zags in a single season for the first time since 2002.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK X2:

For the second time this season, Ziaka was named the Heluva Good Dip West Coast Conference Freshman of the Week. In the win over Gonzaga, her 12 points included a clutch three-pointer to secure the victory. Additionally, she grabbed four rebounds, dished out three assists, and recorded two steals. For the week, she averaged 7.5 points, 2.5 rebounds, and 3.0 assists per game.

Z CAME UP BIG:

With Emma Trawally Porta in foul trouble early in the game at Gonzaga, Seynabou Thiam secured the paint and collected a season-high six rebounds in 12 minutes of action. She added one steal and knocked down one of her two free-throw attempts.

GAME TWENTY-NINE NOTES:**HEARTBREAKING LOSS:**

San Francisco dropped a hard-fought 68-67 decision to Portland last Thursday, losing in the final seconds after holding a two-point lead. The one-point loss marks the seventh game decided by three points or less this season for the Dons, registering a 3-4 record in those contests.

FREJA KEEPS CHUGGING ALONG:

Freja Werth matched a career-high in points with 26 against Portland last Thursday, tying her previous mark set in the win at San Diego on January 25. Werth shot an efficient 56.3 percent from the field, matching her career-high with nine made field goals. Defensively, she guided the green and gold with four steals while finding success from range, knocking down four of her five attempts from the three-point line.

THREE-POINTERS KEPT THEM IN THE GAME:

As a team, San Francisco shot 64.3 percent (nine-for-14) from the three-point line, the highest three-point percentage in a game this season. Three players had two or more three-pointers throughout the contest, led by Freja Werth's team-high four. The last time San Francisco shot over 60 percent from the three-point line was on November 21, 2023, shooting 62.5 percent on 10 made three-point field goals.

GAME THIRTY NOTES:**30 IN HER FINAL HOME GAME:**

Scoring half of San Francisco's total points in the 60-35 win over San Diego last Saturday, Freja Werth scored a career-best 30 points on 11 made field goals. Her 30-point performance marks the first Dons to score 30 or more points in a game since Jasmine Gayles totaled 40 at Pacific on January 13, 2024. Werth is also one of eight players in the WCC this season to reach the 30-point threshold in a game.

DEFENSE PLAYED A PART:

In the win over San Diego, San Francisco held the Toreros to just 27.8 percent shooting last Saturday, marking the second-lowest shooting percentage by an opponent. The Toreros scored 35 points, the lowest by any opponent against the green and gold this season and the fewest the Dons have allowed in a game since November 17, 2015, against Holy Names (31). The Dons also matched a season-high in blocks with eight as Aya Keita, Seynabou Thiam, and Emma Trawally Porta registered two apiece.

THREE ALL-CONFERENCE HONOREES:

The West Coast Conference officially announced its season-ending awards for the 2024-25 women's basketball season on Tuesday morning. For San Francisco, Freja Werth earned All-WCC First Team honors, marking the fifth straight season a member of the green and gold merited an All-Conference First Team selection. Additionally, Emma Trawally Porta earned an All-WCC Second Team selection, while Angeliki Ziaka made the All-Freshman Team.

Four of LMU's five starters scored double-digit points in the win over Santa Clara, led by Brandi William's game-high 22 points. Along with Williams, Naudia Evans (16 points), Maya Hernandez (14 points), and Carly Heidger (12 points) helped guide the program to the double-digit win over the Broncos.

Maya Hernandez posted her seventh double-double of the season with 14 points and 14 rebounds in the win over Santa Clara in the second round of the West Coast Conference Championship. Recording back-to-back double-doubles, her 14 rebounds were two short of her career-high of 16 set against Pacific on January 16.

Naudia Evans leads LMU in multiple statistical categories, including points per game, assists, and free-throw percentage. Her 15.8 points per game leads the team and ranks sixth in the WCC, while her 175 assists tops the league. Evans was also named to the WCC All-Conference Second Team in her first season with the program.

LMU ranks second in the WCC and 82nd nationally in turnover margin at 4.4. In 29 games, the Lions have turned the ball over 349 times while forcing 476 turnovers. The team has recorded nine games this season with single-digit turnovers, highlighted by a season-low four in the dominating win over Santa Clara on Friday.

- San Francisco and LMU have faced off 60 times in program history, with the Dons holding a 51-41 advantage over the Lions since the first-ever meeting in the 1984-85 season.
- The two programs split two games during the 2024-25 regular season, earning victories on the road. The Dons overpowered the Lions in Los Angeles on December 28, 2024, earning a convincing 85-73 win. The Lions responded on January 30, overcoming a 16-point halftime deficit to win 73-68 on the Hilltop.
- Emma Trawally Porta led San Francisco in the most recent meeting with 16 points, while Freja Wettyh and Angeliki Ziaka added 15 and 11 points, respectively.

SAN FRANCISCO NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

1995**NCAA First Round – March 16, 1995 - Seattle, Wash.**

Arkansas 67, San Francisco 58

USF made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1995 as the No. 11 seed in the West Region. The Dons traveled to the University of Washington in Seattle to face Arkansas. Brittany Lindhe led the way with 21 points, while Jamie Shadian and Renee Demirdjian each added 11 as the Dons got its first taste of the Dance.

Valerie Gillon dominated with a 28-point, nine-rebound performance, while Andrea Kagie added 15 points off the bench. USF led 31-29 at halftime and never trailed in the second half.

NCAA Second Round – March 18, 1996 - Durham, N.C.

San Francisco 64, No. 13 Duke 60

San Francisco garnered the biggest win in school history as the Dons shocked regional host, then-No. 13 Duke, 64-60, at Cameron Indoor Stadium. For the Blue Devils, it was the first non-conference loss at home since 1991. Brittany Lindhe led the Dons with 17 points, Julie Murgent scored 14 points off the bench, and Renee Demirdjian added a dozen in the victory.

NCAA Sweet Sixteen – March 23, 1996 - Chicago, Ill.

No. 2 Connecticut 72, San Francisco 44

The eyes of the country were on San Francisco as the team faced defending national champions, Connecticut, in the Sweet Sixteen. In front of the largest crowd (7,190) to watch a women's basketball game in Illinois, the Dons fell short, dropping the 72-44 decision to the Huskies. The game was tied 13-13 midway through the first half before UConn pulled away for a 37-28 halftime lead. Valerie Gillon scored 13 points in her final collegiate contest, while Julie Murgent came off the bench to add 10 points.

USF garnered a No. 13 seed, but the contest ended up lopsided as the No. 4 seed Cardinal came away with an 85-58 victory on their home floor of Maples Pavilion. Rachel Howard was the Dons' top scorer with 14 points, while Taylor Proctor (13 pts., two reb) and Michaela Rakova (12 pts., four reb) were the other Dons in double figures.
