THE OPENING TIP

- The University of San Francisco women's basketball team (19-14) hits the road for the second round of the women's National Invitational Tournament when it takes on Montana State (25-7) at 1:00 p.m. PT/2:00 p.m. MT on Sunday, Mar. 22, at Brick Breeden Fieldhouse.
- San Francisco enters its second-round matchup following a dominating 80-50 victory over Utah Valley last Thursday at War Memorial at the Sobrato Center. Candy Edokpaigbe paced the Dons with 20 points, her team-leading 14th 20-point game of the season, while shooting 80 percent (eight-for-10) from the field. She also connected on her lone three-point attempt, grabbed four rebounds, and dished out three assists.
- In 30 minutes of action, Mara Neira matched a season-high in three-pointers, knocking down five of her 11 attempts from distance.
- Leading the second unit, Michelle Ugwah scored nine of the Dons' 28 bench points while shooting 50 percent (three-for-six) from the field and recorded three boards in 17 minutes.
- As a team, San Francisco shot 56.9 percent from the field, the second-highest shooting percentage in a game this season. The green and gold also connected on 50 percent of its attempts from the three-point line, the first time the teams have shot 50 percent or better from distance this season. Five different players connected from long range throughout the contest, led by Neira's five.

MOLLY GOODENBOUR

HEAD COACH | 10TH SEASON AT SAN FRANCISCO | 20TH OVERALL

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS AT SAN FRANCISCO:

Molly Goodenbour, a two-time national champion at Stanford with over a decade of head coaching experience on the collegiate level, was named the ninth head coach in University of San Francisco women's basketball history on Sept. 28, 2016. This is Goodenbour's third coaching stint on the Hilltop, where she served as an assistant coach with the Dons during the 1994-95 and 2005-06 seasons.

Goodenbour completed her ninth season on the Hilltop following the conclusion of the 2024-25 season, leading San Francisco to a 15-16 overall record and a fifth-place finish in the West Coast Conference standings at 11-9. The Dons' 11 league wins last season marked the most victories in WCC play since 2016-17, when the program compiled an 11-7 record in Goodenbour's first season at the helm.

Guiding the program to one of its best-ever starts in conference play, Goodenbour led the Dons to a perfect 5-0 record, defeating teams by an average of 13.8 points. During the five-game winning streak, the green and gold earned convincing triumphs over Gonzaga, LMU, Santa Clara, Saint Mary's, and Pepperdine.

In 2023-24, Goodenbour led San Francisco to a second-half resurgence as the team finished in a tie for third place in the West Coast Conference standings after starting the season with a 4-9 record. The program posted double-digit victories in WCC play for the fifth time in Goodenbour's tenure as the team finished at 10-6, highlighted by season sweeps of Pacific, Saint Mary's, Pepperdine, and LMU.

San Francisco also finished the season strong, rolling eventual WCC Tournament Champions Portland on the road, earning a 59-47 victory at Chiles Center. Under Goodenbour's guidance, Jasmine Gayles and Debora dos Santos earned All-WCC First Team honors. Dos Santos recorded a career season, averaging a double-double with 15.3 points and 10.6 rebounds per game, while Gayles led the squad in scoring at 16.8 points per game. Gayles also recorded the second 40-point game in program history, dropping 40 points in an 81-68 win at Pacific on January 13.

The 2022-23 season, under Goodenbour's leadership, concluded with an overall record of 19-13. Three Dons earned All-WCC selections, while two Dons earned WCC All-Academic Honors. The Dons also participated in their third straight WNIT.

Within the first six years on the Hilltop, Goodenbour posted impressive numbers, including becoming the winningest coach in San Francisco history through 50 games (27-23), as well as through two seasons at 34-28 (.548). Goodenbour quickly built up her impressive resume at USF, becoming the first coach to post winning overall and conference records in her first two seasons on the job.

Building off the program's strong start to the new decade, the Dons were once again punching a postseason ticket as they battled through a grueling non-conference schedule that kept them away from the Hilltop from Thanksgiving until after New Year's Day. Following an 0-4 start to WCC play, battling through injuries and COVID-19-related pauses, the Dons went on to rattle off wins in six of their next seven games and finished with the third seed heading into the WCC Tournament. USF would go on to defeat Santa Clara in Vegas before returning home to host Air Force in the WNIT. Since the start of the 2020-21 season, Goodenbour's Dons have made consecutive WNIT appearances and won at least one game in back-to-back WCC Tournaments. Led by two-time All-WCC First Team selection Ioanna Krimili, USF's 2020-21 team led the conference in total points and points per game while being a top-four program in team plus/minus.

Goodenbour's third WCC Tournament in 2019 saw her lead the Dons to a first-round victory over Portland, marking the seventh year in a row the Dons advanced beyond their opening game. Goodenbour's 2017-18 squad placed three WCC All-Conference and All-Academic honorees. Anna Seilund earned First-Team All-WCC and Second-Team All-WCC recipients Michaela Rakova and Kalyn Simon.

She finished her first year on the Hilltop in 2016-17 with an 18-13 overall record that included an 11-7 mark in West Coast Conference play, enough for a fourth-place finish, the Dons' highest since the 2002-03 season. In the process, Goodenbour became the first USF head coach since Sue Rojcewicz in 1982-83 to post a winning record in her first year at the helm and compiled the second-best record by a first-year coach in program history. In addition, USF's 11 WCC wins under Goodenbour were the most since the 1996-97 campaign.

Under Goodenbour, the Dons led the conference in free-throw percentage at .778, which stands as the best single-season percentage in program history. Goodenbour's team also led the WCC in three-point shooting (.346) in 2016-17.

Their 217 three-pointers made were the most in program history, including a program-best 15 three-pointers in a win over Portland on February 18, 2017. Goodenbour's squad placed four student-athletes on the WCC All-Academic team in 2016-17 and boasted a pair of All-WCC honorees in first-teamer Rachel Howard and second-team recipient Anna Seilund.

OTHER CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

Goodenbour came to USF following previous head coaching experience at Santa Rosa Junior College, Chico State, UC Irvine, and Cal State Dominguez Hills. Her overall career record, including two seasons at Santa Rosa JC, stands at 222-142 (.610).

Before her appointment at Cal State-East Bay, Goodenbour spent four seasons as the head coach at Cal State-Dominguez Hills. After taking over a program that had posted a 7-48 record in the previous two seasons, Goodenbour led the Toros to a 77-34 (.694) record in her four seasons. Under her guidance, the Toros won California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA) Tournament Championships in 2013-14 and 2014-15 and CCAA regular season titles in 2014-15 and 2015-16 and made three consecutive NCAA Division II Women's Basketball Championship appearances from 2013-16. Her 2014-15 squad won a school-record 26 games and earned the No. 2 seed in the NCAA West Regional.

Goodenbour began her career at Santa Rosa Junior College in 2002-03. After one season as an associate head coach, she took over the head coaching duties for two seasons (2003-05), leading the Bear Cubs to a 69-21 record, two conference championships, and a quarterfinal appearance in the California state championship.

Her second coaching stint at San Francisco came during the 2005-06 season when she served as an assistant on Mary Hile-Nepfel's staff. Following the season, she was appointed head coach at Chico State where she led the Wildcats to a 52-11 record and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. In 2007-08, she was named the CCAA's Coach of the Year after guiding her team to a 28-6 overall record, regular season and conference tournament titles along with a Sweet 16 appearance. The Wildcats finished the year ranked No. 17 in the nation among all Division II teams.

Goodenbour's first Division I head coaching job came at UC Irvine, where she served as the Anteater's coach from 2008-12. The Anteaters qualified for the Big West Tournament in her four seasons at the helm, posting the highest single-season win total (15 in 2010-11) in nearly a decade and had eight players earn all-conference honors during her four-year tenure.

PERSONAL HIGHLIGHTS:

A native of Waterloo, Iowa, Goodenbour was a standout performer at Stanford, where she was a four-year letterwinner under Tara VanDerveer from 1989-93. She helped the Cardinal to four straight Pac-10 championships, three NCAA Final Fours, and a pair of NCAA Championships in 1990 and 1992. Goodenbour was named the most valuable player of the 1992 Final Four after setting an NCAA Tournament record for most postseason three-pointers made with 18. She finished her collegiate career with 1,040 points and still ranks among the school's career top-10 in three-pointers made (178), assists (441), and free throw percentage (.793).

A NEW GROUP FOR A NEW CAMPAIGN:

Notable returners from last season's roster include Sol Castro and Paula Tirado, while San Francisco added six talented transfers, including Olivia Williams (UC Irvine), Mara Neira (Presbyterian/Appalachian State), Meghan McIntyre (Southern Oregon), Nevaeh Ferrara Horne (North Dakota), Michelle Ugwah (Morehead State), and Candy Edokpaigbe (Seattle U). Noelia Mourão, Aina Cargol, Amy Pateman, Nataša Taušová, and Sophia Priestley join the team on the Hilltop as freshmen.

AN INTERNATIONAL PRESENCE:

San Francisco features 11 players from countries outside the United States, including Argentina, Canada, Ireland, Italy, New Zealand, Norway, Slovakia, and Spain. San Francisco's 11 international players rank tied with Hawaii for third in Division I, while the nine total represented countries (including the United States) are the second most in the nation, tied with Columbia, Washington State and Xavier.

STUDS PLAYING OVERSEAS:

San Francisco had four incoming student-athletes compete for their national teams last summer. Freshmen Aina Cargol and Noelia Mourão guided Spain to a first-place finish at the FIBA U18 Women's EuroBasket in La Palma, Spain. Olivia Williams appeared in two games for New Zealand in the FIBA Women's Asia Cup Division A. Candy Edokpaigbe guided Italy to a third-place finish and averaged 13.9 points, 4.0 rebounds, and 1.6 assists at the FIBA U20 Women's EuroBasket in Matosinhos, Portugal.

CANDY PUT ON A SHOW IN PORTUGAL:

Candy Edokpaigbe competed for Italy in the 2025 FIBA U20 Women's EuroBasket this past summer and averaged an impressive 13.9 points, 4.0 rebounds, and 1.6 assists per game in seven games. In her second game of the tournament, Edokpaigbe put on a show with 23 points, seven rebounds, and one assist in a win over the Czech Republic. She finished the tournament with five double-digit scoring games, shooting 47.7 percent (32-for-67) in those contests.

AINA AND NOELIA WIN GOLD:

Incoming freshmen Aina Cargol and Noelia Mourão helped lead Spain to the gold medal in the FIBA U18 Women's EuroBasket in La Palma, Spain, last summer. The title marks the first gold medal Cargol and Mourão have earned with their country. The duo helped guide Spain to a bronze medal at the 2024 FIBA U17 Women's Basketball World Cup.

CONTRACT EXTENSION:

Last May, Head Coach Molly Goodenbour signed a three-year contract extension, extending her through the 2027-28 season. Through 20 seasons as a head coach with nine on the Hilltop, Goodenbour has compiled a 307-274 record, with 134 victories coming at San Francisco. She has totaled five 20-win seasons and has guided the green and gold to six straight seasons with double-digit wins.

2025-26 SEASON NOTES

COMING OFF AN IMPRESSIVE SEASON:

San Francisco enters the 2025-26 season after finishing 2024-25 with a 15-16 overall record and placed fifth in the West Coast Conference (WCC) standings at 11-9. The program's 11 league victories mark the first time the Dons have secured at least 11 wins during conference play since the 2016-17 season. Along with its regular-season success, accentuated by a sweep of Gonzaga, San Francisco secured its first win in the conference tournament since 2022, defeating LMU, 75-66, at Orleans Arena.

SWEPT THE ZAGS:

San Francisco made history last season against Gonzaga, as it completed its first sweep of the Bulldogs in 23 years. In the first meeting, the Dons dominated and earned a 15-point victory on the Hilltop, 73-58, on December 19, 2024. The program completed the season sweep on February 22, 2025, in Spokane, 70-68. The green and gold's win over the Bulldogs on the road marked the first time the team has won a game in Spokane since 2006, while sweeping the Zags in a single season for the first time since 2002.

THE NONCONFERENCE SLATE RUNS THROUGH THE HILLTOP:

Seven of San Francisco's 11 nonconference contests to begin the 2025-26 campaign will be played at home as San Francisco hosts UNC Greensboro in the season opener, facing off against the Spartans for the first time in program history, on Wednesday, Nov. 5. The green and gold will also host Seton Hall (Friday, Nov. 14), UC San Diego (Sunday, Nov. 16), Lehigh (Wednesday, Nov. 25), CSU Monterey Bay (Sunday, Nov. 30), Colorado State (Saturday, Dec. 13), and Sacramento State (Wednesday, Dec. 17) at Chase Center.

Since the start of the 2016-17 season, Head Coach Molly Goodenbour's first season at the helm, San Francisco is 33-16 (.673) in nonconference games played at War Memorial at the Sobrato Center and Chase Center. San Francisco defeated Sacramento State, 61-55, on Wednesday, Dec. 17 at Chase Center to improve the program's nonconference home record.

PICKED TO FINISH SIXTH AGAIN:

The West Coast Conference announced its All-Preseason Team on Thursday, Oct. 23, and San Francisco was slotted to finish sixth out of the 12-team league. The Dons were also picked to finish sixth in last season's preseason poll, but ended the 2024-25 campaign in fifth place with an 11-9 conference record.

FAMILIAR FACES ON STAFF:

Ryan Yablonsky was hired in September as an assistant coach for the upcoming 2025-26 season. Yablonsky enters his first season on the Hilltop after spending one season as an assistant coach at San Diego. In his one season with the Toreros, he worked closely with All-WCC selections Kylie Horstmeyer and Truitt Reilly while helping develop opponent scouting reports.

Aya Keita, a four-year player for Molly Goodenbour at San Francisco, was hired as the Director of Women's Basketball Operations, last August. While with the Dons from 2021-25, Keita averaged 3.3 points, 1.6 rebounds, and 0.9 assists per game.

BACK AT CHASE CENTER:

For the seventh time in the last eight years, San Francisco is set to play a game at Chase Center, the home of the Golden State Warriors. San Francisco is set to host Sacramento State at 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, Dec. 17, the 18th meeting between the two programs. The Dons, winners of six straight dating back to 2015, have compiled an impressive 12-5 record over the Hornets in program history.

CANDY SHINES IN DEBUT:

Candy Edokpaigbe scored a career-high 26 points in San Francisco's 64-40 victory over UNC Greensboro on Wednesday, Nov. 5. Edokpaigbe's 20+ point scoring performance marks the third of her career and became the fourth player on a Molly Goodenbour coached team to score 20 or more points in a season opener since 2016-17 (Michaela Rakova, Ioanna Krimili (2x), and Jasmine Gayles (2x)).

AINA CAME TO PLAY:

Aina Cargol reached the 20-point threshold in a game on Friday, Nov. 14, scoring 20 points against Seton Hall at War Memorial at the Sobrato Center. Posting her best shooting performance in just her third-career game, Cargol shot 58.3 percent (seven-for-12) from the field and knocked down two of her three three-point attempts. She is the second player this season to score 20 or more points in a game, with Candy Edokpaigbe registering 26 in the 64-40 win over UNC Greensboro in the season opener.

A CANDY DOUBLE-DOUBLE:

Candy Edokpaigbe posted an impressive 24-point, 10-rebound double-double in the win over UC San Diego on Sunday, Nov. 16, her first as a Don and third of her career. In 38 minutes in the win over the Tritons, Edokpaigbe shot 47.4 percent (nine-for-19) from the field, connected on six of her seven free-throw attempts, and registered two steals. Her accomplishment marks the highest scoring double-double for the program since Freja Werth recorded a 30-point, 10-rebound double-double in the win over San Diego on March 1, 2025.

NOELIA BROKE OUT:

Noelia Mouriño reached career-highs in just her fourth-career game as she scored 16 points and grabbed eight rebounds. She had her best shooting performance to date, connecting on eight of her 14 shot attempts, with seven coming at the rim.

WCC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK:

After two impressive performances at home, Aina Cargol was named West Coast Conference Freshman of the Week on Monday, Nov. 17. In two games on the Hilltop against Seton Hall and UC San Diego, Cargol averaged 15.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, and 4.5 assists. She broke out offensively against Seton Hall on Friday, Nov. 14, scoring a career-high 20 points on 58.3 percent (seven-for-12) shooting, while adding three rebounds and three assists. She followed with 11 points and a career-best six assists in San Francisco's 80-69 victory over UC San Diego on Sunday, Nov. 16.

ACTIVE ON THE GLASS:

Noelia Mouriño registered impressive numbers in San Francisco's road game at Long Beach State on Thursday, Nov. 20, guiding the team with nine points, 17 rebounds, and three assists in a 68-55 victory. Her rebounding effort marked the first time she has posted double-digit boards in a game and set the West Coast Conference's single-game high to this point this season to date, passing Oregon State's Néné Sow (15).

SHE'S BACK:

After missing the majority of the 2024-25 season due to injury, Sol Castro made her season debut and scored 14 points and eight rebounds in 15 minutes off the bench. Her 14 points mark the most Castro has scored in a season debut in her career, surpassing her 12-point performance at St. Bonaventure in the opening game of the 2021-22 season when she played at Robert Morris.

BACK-TO-BACK WCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOREE:

Candy Edokpaigbe led San Francisco in scoring in two wins last week over Lehigh and CSU Monterey Bay, averaging 19.5 points per game on an impressive 73.9 percent shooting. Registering her fourth 20+ scoring performance of the season in the win over Lehigh on Tuesday, Nov. 25, Edokpaigbe scored a team-best 25 points and knocked down a career-high 11 field goals in 38 minutes of action. Playing 14 minutes against CSU Monterey Bay on Sunday, Nov. 30, she posted 14 points while only missing three shots, as she went six-for-nine from the field, with two three-pointers.

NEARLY AT FULL STRENGTH:

Following missing the first six games of the 2025-26 season, Olivia Williams, the transfer guard from UC Irvine, recorded seven points, three rebounds, and two steals in 14 minutes off the bench in the 92-52 victory over CSU Monterey Bay on Sunday, Nov. 30. The last game Williams appeared in before making her season debut for the green and gold was last season in the Big West Championship Semifinals where she totaled one assist in 11 minutes.

CAREER HIGH FOR NATAŠA

Nataša Taušová showed out against Colorado State on Saturday, Dec. 13, leading the team with a career-high 14 points. Taušová shot 44.4 percent from the floor and knocked down two three-pointers. She also matched career-highs in rebounds with five.

MONEY AT THE FREE THROW LINE:

In the last five games, Candy Edokpaigbe is shooting 96.0 percent from the free throw line, knocking down 24 of her 25 attempts. In the West Coast Conference opener against Oregon State on December 28, Edokpaigbe connected on all eight of her attempts from the charity stripe, setting a new season-high. Through 12 games this season, she leads the team in free-throw percentage at 79.6 percent.

MARA FOUND HER SHOT:

Breaking out in the Dons' 28-point third quarter in the win over Portland on Tuesday, Dec. 30, Mara Neira scored all 16 of her points in the 10-minute period. In the third, Neira went six-for-eight from the field and four-of-five from the three-point line. In 23 total minutes played throughout the contest, Neira shot 54.5 percent (six-for-11) from the field and knocked down four three-pointers.

OT THRILLER:

San Francisco earned a come-from-behind 85-82 overtime victory at LMU on Sunday, Jan. 4 at Gersten Pavilion. Trailing 74-71, Aina Cargol drained a game-tying three-pointer in the final seconds to force the extra period. Since Molly Goodenbour took over the program before the 2016-17 season, San Francisco is 7-6 in overtime games during the regular season (7-7 overall). The team dropped a 72-65 decision to Santa Clara in the first round of the West Coast Conference Championship in 2020.

ANOTHER WEEKLY HONOR FOR THE FRESHMAN:

For the second time this season, Aina Cargol has been named West Coast Conference Co-Freshman of the Week, shared with Gonzaga's Lauren Whittaker. Cargol paced San Francisco in three wins, averaging 12.7 points, 3.7 rebounds, and 6.7 assists per game in wins over Portland, San Diego, and LMU. Recording back-to-back double-digit games, Cargol finished the week with a 17-point, eight-assist performance in an 85-82 overtime victory at LMU on Sunday, Jan. 4. Scoring 13 of her 17 points in the second half and overtime, Cargol connected on the game-tying three with 14 seconds left to send the contest into an extra period. In the overtime period, she knocked down six of her eight free-throw attempts to help seal the victory.

FIRST-CAREER DOUBLE-DOUBLE:

Noelia Mouriño recorded her first-career double-double with 16 points and 12 rebounds in San Francisco's 85-72 victory at Washington State on Saturday, Jan. 17. Mouriño becomes the third player this season to record a double-double and the program's first freshman since Ioanna Krimili totaled 13 points and 11 assists in the Dons' 108-82 win at Sacramento State on December 22, 2020.

CAREER-HIGHS FOR PAULA AND AINA:

Aina Cargol and Paula Tirado recorded career-highs in points, with Cargol totaling 21 and Tirado with 15 off the bench at Washington State. Cargol also posted highs in rebounds (six), three-pointers (four), and minutes (40), while Tirado shot 75 percent (six-for-eight) from the floor, her best shooting percentage in a game with at least eight shots in her career.

THE SPANIARDS WENT OFF:

San Francisco is the only Division I program to date that had three or more players from Spain score in double figures during a single game against another Division I opponent this season. Specifically, in the green and gold's victory at Washington State on January 17, Aina Cargol (21), Noelia Mouriño (16), and Paula Tirado (15) reached double figures. While FIU had four players from Spain—Judit Valero (Sant Feliu de Llobregat, Barcelona, Spain), Adama Badjie Coly (Mataro, Spain), Caludia Marina (Madrid, Spain), and Grecia Ferrer Leal (Baladona, Spain)—score 10 or more points in a game on December 30, that performance came in a 122-30 victory over Florida National, an NAIA team, rather than a Division I opponent.

TAUŠOVÁ CONTINUES TO SHOW GROWTH:

Nataša Taušová recorded multiple career-highs in the 68-61 victory over Pacific on Saturday, Jan. 24, as she totaled 15 points on 50 percent (six-for-12) shooting, three three-pointers, and two blocks. Her six made field goals matched a career-best, and she shot 50 percent or better from the floor for the sixth time this season.

A SOL DOUBLE-DOUBLE:

In 17 minutes off the bench, Sol Castro recorded a 10-point, 10-rebound double-double, her first of the season, and shot 57.1 percent (four-for-seven) from the field. Castro's performance marks her fifth-career double-double, with her last coming March 1, 2022, when she posted 16 points and 10 rebounds against Purdue Fort Wayne while playing at Robert Morris.

ALL-WCC SELECTIONS:

Candy Edokpaigbe and Aina Cargol earned All-WCC honors on Tuesday, Mar. 3. Edokpaigbe earned All-WCC First Team honors, marking the sixth straight season a member of the green and gold merited an All-Conference First Team selection. Additionally, Cargol was named an All-WCC Honorable Mention selection and was named to the All-Freshman Team.

SUCCESS AT THE WCC CHAMPIONSHIP:

San Francisco posted two games at the Credit Union 1 West Coast Conference Championship in Las Vegas, Nev., defeating San Diego and Pepperdine in the second and third rounds to reach the quarterfinals for the sixth straight year. The green and gold's two wins in the conference tournament are the most by the team since winning the title in 2016.

SAN FRANCISCO WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

1995

NCAA First Round – March 16, 1995 - Seattle, Wash.

No. 6 Arkansas 67, No. 11 San Francisco 58

San Francisco made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1995 as the No. 11 seed in the West Region. The Dons traveled to the University of Washington in Seattle to face Arkansas. Brittany Lindhe led the way with 21 points, while Jamie Shadian and Renee Demirdjian each added 11 as the Dons got its first taste of the Dance.

Valerie Gillon dominated with a 28-point, nine-rebound performance, while Andrea Kagie added 15 points off the bench. USF led 31-29 at halftime and never trailed in the second half.

NCAA Second Round - March 18, 1996 - Durham, N.C.

No. 12 San Francisco 64, No. 4 Duke 60

San Francisco garnered the biggest win in school history as the Dons shocked regional host, then-No. 13 Duke, 64-60, at Cameron Indoor Stadium. For the Blue Devils, it was the first nonconference loss at home since 1991. Brittany Lindhe led the Dons with 17 points, while Julie Murdent scored 14 points off the bench, and Renee Demirdjian added 12.

NCAA Sweet Sixteen – March 23, 1996 - Chicago, Ill.

No. 1 Connecticut 72, No. 12 San Francisco 44

The eyes of the country were on San Francisco as the team faced defending national champions, Connecticut, in the Sweet Sixteen. In front of the largest crowd (7,190) to watch a women's basketball game in Illinois, the Dons fell short, dropping the 72-44 decision to the Huskies. The game was tied 13-13 midway through the first half before UConn pulled away for a 37-28 halftime lead. Valerie Gillon scored 13 points in her final collegiate contest, while Julie Murdent came off the bench to add 10 points.
