QUICKLY - Utah State softball (10-8, 0-0 WAC) concludes tournament play at the 18th annual Capital Classic in Sacramento, Calif. The Aggies begin the Capital Classic against Iona and will also take on host Sacramento State on Friday, March 19. On Saturday March 20, USU will take on the Hornets for the second time in as many days. The Aggies will end the tournament, facing Colorado State on Sunday, March 21.

SERIES HISTORY VS OPPONENTS -

Iona - In a busy week, the Gaels of Iona dropped a doubleheader to Saint Mary's on March 18. Iona is now 4-10 heading into the Capital Classic. This is the first ever meeting between the Aggies and the team from New Rochelle, N.Y. The Gaels are led by Eileen McCann who is hitting .406 this season with 16 RBI. In the circle, both Sarah Jackson and Alyssa Maiesse have two wins for Iona this season.

Sacramento State - The Hornets hold an impressive 22-8 series lead over Utah State. Last season, the two teams met at the Cal Poly Tournament with the Hornets earning a 5-2 win. This season, Sacramento State is 6-17. The Hornets have five players hitting over .300, including the team leader Desiree Beltran who is hitting .462. The Hornets are only 1-7 at home this season.

Colorado State - The Rams have won six-straight games after defeating Sacramento State, 8-6, on March 18. CSU improves to 18-8 with the win. The Aggies and the Rams met earlier this season in Fort Collins, Colo. with CSU earning the 5-3 win. Overall, Utah State has a 27-18 series lead. Rebecca Penland is hitting 410 for the Rams with 26 RBI.

COACH'S OPENERS - Carissa Millsap-Kalaba is the eighth Aggie softball head coach and became the fifth USU head coach to win their opening game at the helm of the Aggies with a 7-5 win against Maine on Feb. 12. USU is now 5-3 in head coach openers... Kalaba joined John Horan in 1976, Lloydene Searle in 1980, Pam McCreesh in 1998 and Candi Letts in 2007 for winning their first game for USU.

AGGIES DEFEAT NO. 1 WASHINGTON - Utah State softball showed no fear in upsetting the reigning NCAA Women's College World Series champions and current No. 1 Washington, 7-4, Friday morning in the opening game of the

Campbell-Cartier Classic in San Diego.

Freshman Kali Cancelosi's three RBI led the Aggies to their biggest upset since defeating No. 2 Texas A&M in College Station in 1987. In that battle, USU shut out Texas A&M, 1-0. Senior Kate Greenough was in the circle for the Aggies Friday, improving to 2-1 with the win, while freshman Shelbi Tyteca earned her second save of the year. With the win USU improves to 5-1 this season, the Aggies' best start since 1990.

The last time that the Aggies had even faced a No. 1 team was 1998 when USU fell to No. 1 Arizona, 19-2. Utah State also fell to No. 1 Arizona, 8-0, in 1997. The last time that Utah State defeated a ranked team was a 2-0 win over No. 15 Oregon State in Corvallis in 2008.

USU IN SEASON-OPENERS - The Aggies are 23-12 all-time in season-openers, snapping a two-game losing streak with a 7-5 win over Maine at the Red Desert Classic in St. George last week... USU lost to No. 1 Tennessee, 11-3, in the first game of the 2009 season... Utah State lost the 2008 opener, 10-1 vs. UC Davis but won the first game of the 2007 season, 11-2 over Southern Utah.

HOT HITTING - Junior Joreigh Landers is the only Aggie hitting over .500, hitting .333 in the first 18 games. Landers has 17 hits and nine RBI to go along with 11 runs scored. Senior Rachel Evans continues to have a solid final season as an Aggie, hitting .297. Evans has 11 hits and six runs scored this season.

GETTING THE WINS - This season, Utah State has reached the 10-win mark just 18 games into the season. Last season, the Aggies did not get to the double-digit win mark until April 21 against New Mexico State, 42 games into the season.

SEASON 35 - The 2010 season marks the 35th year of softball at Utah State... The Aggies enter the season with a 782-875-3 (.472) overall record... USU has one college World Series appearance (1984, tied for 7th) and four NCAA Tournament appearances (1984, 1989, 1992, 1993)... Utah State won the 1980 and 1981 AIAW National Championships... This is USU's fifth year in the Western Athletic Conference (WAC).

PEARLY ANNIVERSARY OF NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP - Utah State is celebrating the 30th anniversary of the Aggies' 1980 AIAW National Championship.

BE HOME LATE - USU's April 2 home-opener is the latest home-opener since 2007's April 3 opener... It is the 25th time in the 35 years of Utah State softball that the Aggies' first home game is in the month of April:

The Aggies have the latest home-opener in the WAC... USU also has the latest home-opener in the state of Utah, later than Weber State (making the program's return debut April 1 vs. Nevada), Utah (March 30 vs. Southern Utah), BYU

(March 31 vs. Utah State), Utah Valley (March 13 vs. College of Idaho), Southern Utah (March 12 vs. South Dakota State) and Dixie State (Feb. 20 vs. Southern Utah).

TIDBITS ABOUT UTAH STATE -

-- USU returns nine players from last year's team, six of whom are seniors.

-- In the circle, freshman Mandy Harmon leads the team with a 4-3 record and a 3.95 ERA. Senior Kate Greenough is 4-4 with a 3.85 ERA. She leads the team with 27 strikeouts.

-- The Aggies also welcome back the versatile Kelley Kaneshiro, who missed the bulk of the 2009 season with an injury. Kaneshiro was the top batter for USU in 2008, hitting .359 in 44 games. Kaneshiro has found her stride, hitting .269 this season. She already has a team-leading five home run this season.

-- The Aggies have three players with at least three multiple RBI games this season. Nicole (Rupp) Tindall leads the way with four multiple RBI games, including one four RBI game. Kelley Kaneshiro and Emily Reilly both have three multiple RBI games.

-- Senior Emily Reilly is having a strong start to her final season as an Aggie. Reilly is hitting .267 this season with 12 hits and 10 RBI. Last season, she only had eight RBI the whole season.

-- The Aggies have stolen 19 bases in the first 18 games. Junior Joreigh Landers is 4-for-5 on the base paths this season, while freshman Shelbi Tyteca is a perfect 3-for-3. USU has only been caught on the base paths five times this season.

-- USU has had five different pitchers see action this season. Greenough and Harmon have seen the most action followed by Stacey Ellingsworth, Shelbi Tyteca and Xiao Xue Chang.

-- Redshirt-sophomore Kelley Kaneshiro enters the season either on or within striking distance of some USU career records, as she is sixth on the career home run list with 15. Jennifer Power (1991-94) and Breanne Smith (1999-2002) are tied for fourth with 18 HR's each.

-- Kaneshiro currently has a .335 batting average, just passing the required minimum of 150 at bats to qualify for the career list. The career record is .361 by Kristie Skoglund (1984-87).

-- Senior outfielder Nicole (Rupp) Tindall is now fourth on USU's career stolen bases list with 29 swipes, she is five behind Tiffany Pugmire (1987-90). The all-time stolen base leader is Janet Leising (1980-83) with 36. Fellow senior outfielder Emily Reilly is tied for sixth in stolen bases with 27 with Ramm.

-- Utah State has three players in double digits in runs scored. Kaneshiro is first with 12. Both Landers and Tindall have 11 runs scored.

-- Utah State had nine student-athletes earn academic all-WAC honors last season, and six return this season in senior outfielders Emily Reilly and Nicole (Rupp) Tindall, senior catcher Simone Hubbard, senior infielder Rachel Evans, senior pitcher Kate Greenough.

Kalaba led the Eagles to five-straight playoff appearances, the longest streak in the program's 17-year history.

Her teams also finished no lower than fifth in the tough Golden State Athletic Conference (GSAC), posting an overall mark of 59-61... During her tenure at Biola, she compiled an overall record of 143-93 (.606 winning percentage), averaging just under 29 wins per year.

-- Under Millsap-Kalaba, the Eagles ended the 2009 season with a record of 19-21, advancing to the GSAC Tournament as the fifth-seed, falling to Azusa Pacific. Biola was third in the conference with a 1.84 ERA and fourth in batting with a .273 team average.

-- In her first four seasons at Biola, the Eagles averaged 31 wins per year. In 2005, she led the Eagles to a 34-16 mark and the team's first NAIA Region II appearance in three seasons. In 2006, she led Biola to a 32-14 record, which was third-best season in the program's history.

-- She had three players earn all-GSAC honors in 2009, as well as two GSAC scholar-athletes.

-- In addition to coaching at Biola, Millsap-Kalaba has coached the Jets Gold U18 team from 2002-2009. She was also the head coach at Arcadia High School in Arcadia, Calif., from 2000-04.

-- After transferring from Hofstra University, Kalaba played two seasons at UCLA where the Bruins won the Women's College World Series title in 1999.

-- Her husband, Joe, was an assistant coach for her at Biola, and is now the travel coordinator for the Utah State Athletics Department.

UP NEXT - The Aggies open its fifth season in the WAC on March 26 in Ruston, La. Utah State will play a single game on Friday and a doubleheader on Saturday, March 27. Last season in Logan, the Lady Techsters captured two of three games from the Aggies.

USU won a 2-1 decision with Kate Greenough earning her seventh win of the season against Louisiana Tech.

USU SOFTBALL PICKED TO FINISH EIGHTH IN WAC PRESEASON SOFTBALL POLL

Utah State softball was selected eighth in the Western Athletic Conference pre-season poll, earning seven points.

The WAC softball coaches selected Fresno State to win the 2010 WAC regular-season crown. This is the 13th time in the last 15 years that the Bulldogs have been the preseason favorite to take the crown.

The coaches also voted on 2010 preseason award winners. Fresno State junior Morgan Melloh earned preseason Pitcher of the Year honors for the second-straight season, while Louisiana Tech senior shortstop Amberly Waits earned preseason Player of the Year honors.

Fresno State took the top spot in the preseason poll with 48 points, including six of the eight first-place votes. Nevada edged the Rainbow Wahine for second place with 41 points to Hawai'i's 34. The Wolf Pack also earned one of the first place votes. New Mexico State was picked fourth with 29 points and the final first-place vote. Louisiana Tech was just one point behind in fifth place with 28 points. San Jose State was picked to finish sixth with 19 points, while Boise State was picked to finish seventh with 18 points. The Aggies round out the poll with seven points.
