

STAN ALBRECHT

University President

Stan L. Albrecht was named Utah State University's 15th president and assumed his new position on Feb. 1, 2005.

At the time of the announcement, Albrecht was serving as executive vice president and provost at Utah State, a position he held since 2001. He previously served as its dean of the College of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences from 1998-2001.

Albrecht celebrated ten years of education, innovation and growth at the university during the 2015-16 school year. Since taking the helm, he has seen the university through many changes and successes.

Madelyn Fife, a Utah State honors student and Huntsman Scholar double-majoring in economics and political science, was one of only 54 students nationwide to win a 2016 Harry S. Truman Scholarship. Fife is only the fourth USU student to receive this prestigious scholarship in the last 36 years.

Utah State students succeed because of dedicated faculty and researchers who work hard to carry out USU's mission. The faculty is involved in innovative research projects that often include opportunities for undergraduate students to be involved. A total of more than \$220 million of new sponsored awards funding was granted in fiscal year 2014 — the highest level of external support ever recorded. And the excellence continues across our campus. For example, the Emma Eccles Jones College of Education and Human Services was ranked 33rd in the nation overall against all graduate college of education by U.S. News and World Report in the 2016 edition of "America's Best Graduate Schools."

Utah State's Year of Water was in 2015, a year in which the university highlighted its water expertise and leadership across disciplines. USU's water specialists today, in fact, are among the nation's and the world's leading experts on many water-related issues, particularly in the areas of management, ecosystems, climate, water education and society's understanding of this precious resource.

There are also many physical changes on the campus as well. The Huntsman Hall, the state-of-the-art addition that wraps around the George S. Eccles Business Building, was opened in the spring of 2016. Students were also excited that the USU Student Recreation & Wellness Center building opened in the fall of 2015. Those attending Aggie football games will be able to observe first-hand the major renovation the newly named Maverik Stadium. Across the state new classroom buildings were opened at our campuses in Price, Tooele and Brigham City.

Prior to his arrival at Utah State, Albrecht served as an administrator and

professor at the University of Florida from 1993-98. He also served for 18 years at Brigham Young University (1974-92), including three years as academic vice president and associate provost. He began his career as an assistant professor of sociology at Utah State University in 1970 through 1974.

A sociologist, Albrecht has written extensively, including as a co-author of the textbooks Social Psychology and Social Science Research Methods, both published by Prentice-Hall. He has authored numerous scholarly papers on a wide range of topics, including the environment, energy development and rural health.

Albrecht received his doctorate from Washington State University in 1970, a master's degree from Washington State University in 1968 and bachelor's degree from Brigham Young University in 1966. All three degrees were in sociology.

He is a member of the Science Committee for the Minerals Management Service of the U.S. Department of Interior. He has served as a council member of the Society for Human Ecology and as vice president of the Rural Sociological Society.

Albrecht is married to Joyce Albrecht, Utah State's Director of Stewardship Programs.

JOHN HARTWELL

University Vice President/ Director of Athletics

Since being named Vice President and Director of Athletics at Utah State on June 2, 2015, John Hartwell has cast his vision for Aggie Athletics, which embodies maximum effort socially, academically and athletically to ensure success in both the classroom and on the fields of competition.

Hartwell has also focused on maximizing and increasing the department's revenue streams, along with planning for future facility renovations to both Maverik Stadium and the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum.

In his brief time at Utah State, Hartwell has already rebranded the fundraising arm of Utah State Athletics with the creation of Aggies Unlimited, which puts all giving under one umbrella.

Additionally, Hartwell has overseen the completion of the \$36 million, 85,000 square feet West Stadium Center on the west side of Maverik Stadium, which includes 24 luxury suites, 20 loge boxes, over 700 covered club seats and a premium club area that will also be used to host a student-athlete training table. Renovations also included new video boards on both the north and south ends of the stadium, along with a new public address system, while major concourse work significantly increased restrooms and upgraded concessions.

Under Hartwell's leadership, Utah State saw unparalleled athletic success during the 2015-16 academic year as its men's tennis program won the school's first-ever Mountain West Championship, the men's indoor and men's outdoor track & field programs both finished second at its conference championships, and its football program played in its school-record fifth-straight bowl game.

Furthermore, Utah State's softball program concluded its best season in 20 years, posting a 26-25 overall record while going 12-12 in Mountain West action, as its 26 wins and 20 league wins are its most since 1996. The Aggies finished the 2016 campaign in a three-way tie for third place in the league standings, their highest conference finish since the 1993 squad claimed a share of the Big West title.

Even more impressive was Utah State's continued successes by its student-athletes in the classroom as they have an 87 percent graduation success rate and a cumulative 3.15 grade-point average. During the 2015-16 academic year, USU had 171 student-athletes earn academic all-Mountain West honors, while 102 were named Mountain West Scholar Athletes. Additionally, USU recognized 202 student-athletes at its annual Joe E. and Elma Whitesides Luncheon for earning a 3.2 or better GPA.

Hartwell came to Utah State after spending the three years as the Athletics Director at Troy, where he laid the groundwork for the future of Trojan Athletics by spearheading several significant upgrades to its athletic facilities, including the addition of a new \$2 million practice facility for the golf teams, a \$3 million renovation and expansion of the softball facility and a \$2.1 million improvement to Veterans Memorial Stadium, while also securing funding for lights to be installed at the soccer and track complex. Hartwell also unveiled the North End Zone Project for Veterans Memorial Stadium, a \$20 million project that will be the new home for Trojan football.

During the 2014-15 academic year, five Troy programs competed in postseason play, highlighted by a pair of Sun Belt Conference championships by the women's golf and men's tennis teams, while the women's basketball team won 20 games for the first time since 1996-97 and made just its second postseason

appearance in school history. Within the past year, three of Hartwell's new coaching hires - Beth Mullins (softball), Scott Kidd (men's tennis) and Bart Barnes (women's golf) - have been named Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year, including back-to-back awards by Barnes.

Under Hartwell, Troy Athletics saw a significant enhancement in fundraising and external relations as he completely overhauled Troy's External Affairs division of the Athletics Department to increase revenues and enhance the fan and game day experience. As part of this makeover was the creation of a new external model, which included the addition of a Senior Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs; bringing corporate sponsorships in house with a partnership with Rockbridge Sports Group; and the development of the Troy Affinity Program to further engage Troy students in athletics.

Hartwell's strong business background also proved to be valuable at Troy as he negotiated a new footwear and apparel deal with Adidas, while also securing home-and-home football games with Duke and North Carolina State in addition to yielding a home basketball game with Mississippi. Hartwell's tenure at Troy also saw a record number of student-athletes earn a 3.0 grade-point-average, an upward trend in APR scores and additional staff positions in Troy's academic support department. During the 2014-15 academic year, Troy student-athletes finished with a 3.01 cumulative grade-point-average and over 57 percent of Troy's student-athletes had a 3.0 GPA or higher.

At Troy, Hartwell served on the NCAA Division I Basketball Issues Committee, the Division I-A Board of Trustees Executive Committee, and the NCAA Division I Council as the Sun Belt Conference representative. He has also been an instructor at the Division I-A Institute for aspiring athletic directors the past two years.

Prior to being the Director of Athletics at Troy, Hartwell spent nine-plus years at the University of Mississippi, where he was the Senior Executive Associate Athletics Director, serving as the number two administrator in athletics.

Hartwell served as the Treasurer and Chief Operating Officer of the Mississippi Athletic Association Foundation, a 501 (c)(3) organization that generated over \$17 million annually for the Ole Miss Athletics Department through priority seating and major gifts.

He was responsible for the day-to-day administrative oversight of the football, men's basketball and baseball programs, along with sport oversight of the softball and men's and women's track & field and cross country programs. Hartwell also oversaw the Rebels' business office, ticket office, equipment room, merchandise sales, concessions and football scheduling. Hartwell scheduled several marquee football games for the Rebels, including a home-and-home series with Texas that began in 2012.

Hartwell managed the growth of the Ole Miss athletic budget from \$26 million in the 2003 fiscal year to over \$47 million in the 2012 fiscal year. He also chaired the search to hire men's basketball head coach Andy Kennedy in 2006. He was heavily involved in negotiations that increased revenues with contracts for apparel and footwear (Nike), merchandise sales (Sports Avenue/LIDS), concessions (Centerplate), wireless provider (C Spire) and video boards (Daktronics). He served on the Southeastern Conference Ticket Committee and started the annual SEC Chief Financial Officers Forum.

A 1987 graduate of The Citadel, the 51-year old Hartwell spent four-plus years as a certified public accountant with Ernst & Young before returning to his alma mater to serve as the Director of Internal Audit in 1991. From 1994 to 1997, he was in private business as the Chief Financial Officer for a \$36 million beverage distributor on the South Carolina coast.

Hartwell's direct experience in athletics administration began as the Assistant Athletics Director for Business at Georgia State in 1997. He was promoted to Associate Athletics Director for Internal Affairs in 1999, and his responsibilities expanded to include sport supervision for baseball, men's and women's golf, men's and women's track & field and cross country. He also had oversight over the Panthers' athletic facilities and game management in addition to his previous responsibilities of all financial aspects of the department. While at Georgia State, Hartwell earned a master's degree in sports administration.

Athletics has always been a big part of Hartwell's life, starting in high school where he was an all-state basketball selection at UMS-Wright in Mobile, Ala. The 6-foot-7 forward played alongside current North Carolina State head coach Mark Gottfried in high school. Hartwell went on to play collegiately at The Citadel, where he was a three-year starter, a four-year letterman and captain of the team as a senior in 1987.

Hartwell is married to Dr. Heather Seale Hartwell, and they have two daughters, Lauren (7) and Madison (4). Hartwell also has a 24-year old son, Hunter, a Vanderbilt graduate who works for Deloitte Consulting.



JANA DOGETT
Deputy Athletics Director/
Senior Woman Administrator
11th Year at USU

Jana Doggett is entering her 11th year with the Utah State Athletics Department and second year as its Deputy Athletics Director after spending five years as Executive Associate Athletics Director and five years as the Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Operations. Doggett also serves as the department's Senior Woman Administrator.

Doggett, who was named one of the top 10 SWA's in the nation at the Division I level by College AD in 2015, served as Utah State's Interim AD during the summer of 2015.

With her current position, Doggett is the athletic department's second-in-command and oversees the department's external operations, which includes aggies unlimited, event management, media relations, marketing/new media, video, Aggie Sports Properties, Special events, licensing and concession sales. She also supervises the sports of track, softball and golf.

Doggett has also been the athletics department lead liaison with the construction of the Wayne Estes Center, USU's Olympic Sports Complex and the current renovations to the west side of Maverik Stadium, as well as renovations to the Ralph Maughan Track Stadium and the gymnastics training center.

Prior to her current position, Doggett spent 11 years in the athletics department at San Diego State, from 1993-2003, including six years as an Associate Director of Athletics. She also worked at the National Multiple Sclerosis Society San Diego Area Chapter.

At San Diego State, she supervised all 18 of the athletic department's head coaches as well as the ticket office, marketing and promotions, financial aid, academics, compliance, event management, video production, weight and equipment rooms, sports medicine and business services.

Doggett graduated with a degree in speech communication from San Diego State. She was raised in Nezperce, Idaho before moving to Visalia, Calif., for junior high and high school.

Doggett married current USU associate head men's basketball coach Tarvish Felton on May 28, 2011 and the couple has a 17-year old daughter, DeAubrey Ann Bowers and a 2-year old son, Deekan G. Felton.

Entering her third year at Utah State is Michelle Bowman, who was promoted to Assistant Athletics Director for Compliance in 2016. Beginning his 17th year in charge of Utah State's Student-Athlete Academic Services is Dr. Brian Evans, who was promoted to Senior Associate Athletics Director in 2013. Evans joined the USU staff in July, 2000 after spending three years as Assistant Director of Athletic Academic Services at Texas Tech from 1997-2000. Previously, he was the Academic Coordinator at Montana State from 1995-97.

Evans oversees the student-athlete academic services unit, directing academics and certification of initial and continuing eligibility of Utah State student-athletes. He directs a staff of five full-time assistants, and has administrative oversight of the gymnastics and women's soccer programs. Following the 2014 and 2015 gymnastics season, Evans was named the North Central Region Administrator of the Year as voted on by coaches in the region.

Under Evans' guidance, Utah State has led its conference in number of academic all-league honorees in nine of the past 12 years, as it finished second in the Mountain West during the 2015-16 academic year as the Aggies had 273 student-athletes recognized for academic excellence, as 171 student-athletes received academic all-Mountain West honors, while 102 were named Mountain West Scholar-Athletes. Overall, USU has led its conference in most academic all-league honorees 14 times in the last 17 years.

A native of Nebraska, the 1987 Colorado journalism graduate earned a master's degree in athletic administration from Idaho State in 1988 and a doctorate of higher education administration from Montana State in 2000.

Big Blue Scholarship Fund
First Year at USU

Paul Finn is in his first season at Utah State as Assistant Athletics Director and Executive Director of the Big Blue Scholarship Fund.

In his role, he is responsible for the operations and donor relations with the membership of the Big Blue Scholarship Fund. While trying to recruit new donors to the program, Finn also oversees the ticket office operations, and outbound ticket sales.

Finn joins the Aggies after having served as the Assistant Athletic Director for Ticket Sales and Service at Washington State from 2009-16. At WSU, Finn directed all of the ticket sales and service, and created and oversaw the first outbound sales team in school history. Additionally, Finn managed the ticketing and sales of WSU's new premium seating addition to Martin Stadium.

Entering his 11th year at Utah State is Jake Garlock, who was promoted to Associate Athletics Director for Compliance in July, 2013. In his position, Garlock is in charge of maintaining USU's compliance in accordance with the NCAA and Mountain West Conference rules. He also has administrative oversight of men's and women's tennis and volleyball programs, as well as the equipment room.

Prior to joining the athletics department, Garlock spent one year as a practicing trial attorney.

Garlock, who is originally from Salem, Ore., graduated from Brigham Young with a bachelor's degree in psychology in 2002 and received his law degree from Willamette in 2005.
