



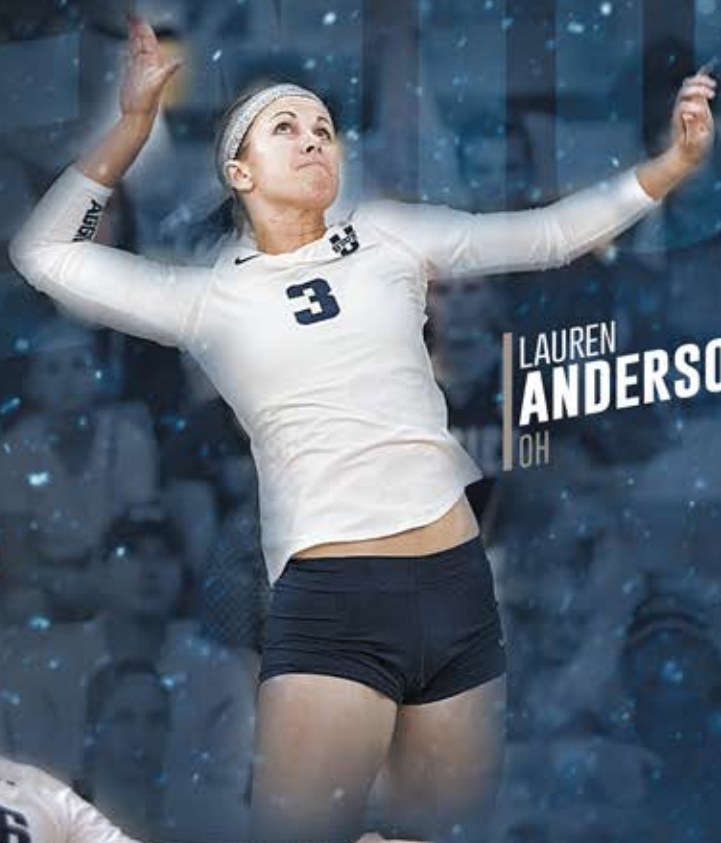

## MEDIA SERVICES

The 2017 Utah State University volleyball guide has been prepared to assist the working media and is designed to aid all media members in their coverage of Aggie volleyball. Questions, requests for additional information, player interviews, photographs and press credentials should be directed to Assistant Athletics Director for Media Relations Kyle Cottam, Athletic Media Relations, 7400 Old Main Hill, Logan, UT, 84322 or by phone (435) 797-2066.

## MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Credentials for Utah State home volleyball matches will be issued through the Utah State Athletic Media Relations Office for working press only when needed. We urge all members of the media to send their credential requests on company letterhead to Assistant Athletics Director for Media Relations Kyle Cottam, well in advance to insure the availability of credentials. If desired, credentials can be left at the "Will Call" booth at the main entrance of Kirby Court at Wayne Estes Center.

## MATCH DAY SERVICES

The Utah State University Athletic Media Relations Office provides pre-match notes, statistics and scorecards prior to each home match. A complete box score will be available approximately five minutes after the conclusion of each match. Power outlets are located throughout the main working area of press row. Those members of the media with special needs should contact the USU Athletic Media Relations Office well in advance in order to complete the arrangements. All other stations requesting broadcast space must pay a right's fee to the Utah State University Athletics Department.

## PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photographers may shoot matches from the court. However, those photographers working on the floor must stay well beyond the lines of the court.

## COACH DUBOSE INTERVIEWS

Utah State head volleyball coach Grayson DuBose will be available after each home match for interviews after a brief cooling off period. DuBose also will be available for one-on-one and telephone interviews throughout the week. The best time to reach DuBose is weekday mornings from 9-11 a.m. Interviews with DuBose can be arranged by contacting the Athletic Media Relations Office.

## PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Utah State University welcomes media representation at volleyball practice sessions at Kirby Court at the Wayne Estes Center. We encourage all media members to contact the Utah State Athletic Media Relations Office for player interview requests and practice times. In most cases, players will be available for interviews before and after practice.

## POST-MATCH INTERVIEWS

The Utah State locker room is closed to the media on match days. Post-match interviews with Coach DuBose and select players will take place after a brief cooling off period in a designated area.

## DIRECTIONS TO LOGAN

Logan, Utah, is home to Utah State University and is located approximately 80 miles north of Salt Lake City, Utah.

### From Salt Lake International Airport:

Take I-80 East out of the airport to 215 North, which will run into I-15 North. Follow I-15 North to exit 362 (Highway 89-91) in Brigham City. Follow Highway 89 into Logan, where it becomes Main Street until you reach 1000 North and turn right. Follow 1000 North east where it will run into the campus. The media parking lot is located directly north of the arena. Entrance to the lot is off of 900 East, between 900 and 1000 North.

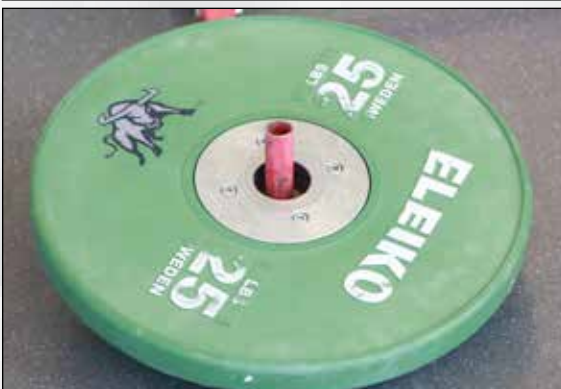

# ICON SPORTS PERFORMANCE CENTER



Completed in June of 2013, Utah State's \$6.5 million, 26,329-square-foot ICON Sports Performance Center features areas for weight training, cardiovascular workouts and speed and agility training, as well as offices for staff. Built on existing university property at the northwest corner of Maverik Stadium, the state-of-the-art multi-level facility alleviated overcrowding in the previous 5,800-square-foot strength and conditioning center and accommodates almost 400 student-athletes from 16 sports programs. The ICON Sports Performance Center is the largest such facility in the Mountain West and rivals any strength and conditioning complex in the country.



# JIM AND CAROL LAUB ATHLETICS & ACADEMICS COMPLEX



The three-story, 69,000-square-foot Jim and Carol Laub Athletics-Academics Complex is a state-of-the-art multi-purpose facility that meets all of the athletic and academic needs of Utah State's 16 sports programs and nearly 400-plus student-athletes. Within the facility, which was completed in the summer of 2008, is the 11,000-square-foot Dale Mildener Sports Medicine Complex and Dr. John Worley Sports Medicine Research Center, the Steve Mothersell Athletics Hall of Honor and the 7,000-square-foot J. Ken "Kenny" Seamons Equipment Room. Also located on the first floor are locker rooms for football, while the second floor features a 120-seat auditorium. The student-athlete academics center is located on the third floor, which includes numerous study hall and tutor areas, a computer lab and the Dr. Randall and Julianne Stockham Student-Athlete Academics Hall of Honor. The third floor also houses coaches' offices and meeting rooms for the track & field and cross country programs as well as the compliance offices.

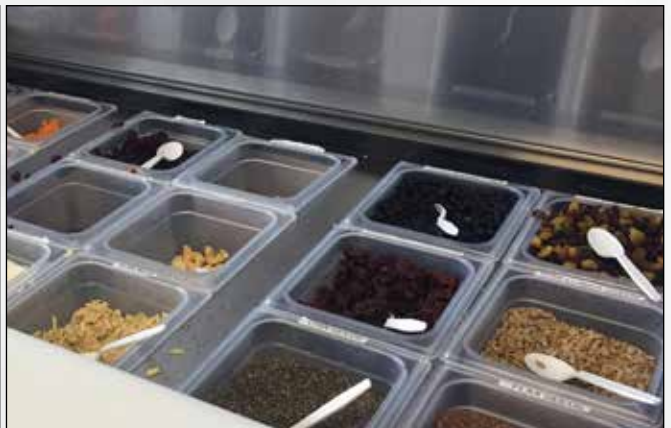


# FUELING STATION



The Aggie Fueling Station, located on the bottom floor of the ICON Sports Performance Center, was created prior to the start of the 2016-17 school year by representatives from the nutritional program and athletics, who had a goal of working together to provide student-athletes with the food they need to complement the physical demands of training and nutrition. The fueling station is stocked with appetizing food focused on combining convenience and nutrition.

Student-athletes can choose from a variety of fresh fruits and vegetables, cheese, milk, chicken, yogurt, beef jerky, peanut butter, trail mixes and much more. Workers at the fueling station prepare fruits and vegetables, measuring out serving sizes, restock the serving area and plan the daily special. In addition to food preparation, volunteers are on site to answer nutrition questions from student-athletes and give presentations about health and wellness to all 16 of Utah State's sports programs.

# CACHE VALLEY

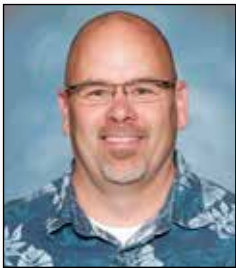


The Cache Valley, a fertile green valley with lakes and streams, is surrounded by the Wellsville Mountains (above photo) on the west and the Bear River Range on the east. Just east of Logan is the Wasatch-Cache National Forest, accessed by Logan Canyon Scenic Byway (Hwy. 89). Logan Canyon is filled with geological wonders, including vertical rock formations, caves and wind tunnels. Thirty minutes from Logan, Beaver Mountain Ski Resort is a popular winter getaway. Fifteen minutes beyond Beaver Mountain, the summit of Logan Canyon is a breathtaking view of turquoise-colored Bear Lake.



# COACHING STAFF





## GRAYSON DUBOSE HEAD COACH (166-167, 12TH SEASON) Brigham Young, 1993

Grayson DuBose is entering his 12th season as Utah State's head volleyball coach after being hired on March 27, 2006.

In his 11 years at USU, DuBose (pronounced Do-Boze) has brought stability to one of the top programs in the region as he has coached two All-Americans and 24 all-conference selections. Off the court, 38 of his student-athletes have earned academic all-conference honors a total of 90 times, as well as six academic all-district recipients. He enters the 2017 season as the longest tenured coach in USU volleyball history and is second on the all-time wins list.

"I consider it a distinguished honor to be the head coach of the Utah State University volleyball program. My family and I love Logan and the University, and we're proud to call this place home," DuBose said. "During my time here, I have deeply enjoyed sharing the passion for the sport of volleyball with not just our student-athletes, but our staff, administration and community."

In 2016, DuBose led the Aggies to eight more victories than the previous season. The USU offense was especially sound as the team recorded a school-record .238 hitting percentage (1,465-562-3,797). Additionally, Utah State finished among the top four of the Mountain West in kills, assists and digs. Junior outside Lauren Anderson went on to earn all-Mountain West honors at the end of the season, leading the team with 377 kills and finishing among the top 10 in the MWV with 3.52 kills per set. Off the court, USU student-athletes also found success as 10 Aggies were named academic all-conference. Additionally, five more were named Mountain West Scholar Athletes.

In 2015, DuBose captured his 150th victory as head coach of the Aggies in a 3-1 win over Eastern Kentucky on Sept. 19. Additionally, five student-athletes earned Mountain West Scholar Athlete honors as well as nine being named academic all-Mountain West.

In 2014, DuBose led the Aggie volleyball program into new territory, as USU opened up a new volleyball competition facility, Kirby Court at the Wayne Estes Center. DuBose had an integral voice in the design and layout of the new facility, which includes space for a competition court, two practice courts, team film room, team lounge, team locker room, strength and conditioning center, meeting rooms, coaches offices and an athletic training room. The new facility saw the Aggies go 7-6 at home, marking the ninth consecutive year that USU has had a winning record at home un-

der DuBose. Individually, DuBose mentored senior Kaitlyn VanHoff to all-Mountain West honors in addition to his charges earning nine academic all-Mountain West citations and six Mountain West Scholar-Athlete accolades.

DuBose led Utah State into the Mountain West in 2013, where the Aggies posted a 20-11 overall and 13-7 MW record. The 20-win season was the second in a row and third in the last four years, all under DuBose, and also marked the first time that USU had posted back-to-back 20-win seasons since 2000 and 2001. Overall, it was the Aggies' 12th 20-win season in 38 seasons of USU volleyball. USU spikers also had success in the classroom in 2013, earning seven academic all-Mountain West honors and five Mountain West Scholar-Athlete accolades.

Under DuBose's leadership, USU notched the 600th all-time win in program history with its first victory of the 2013 season. The Aggies are believed to be the 102nd program in NCAA history to reach the 600-win plateau, according to available records. Sophomore opposite side hitter Elle Brainard capped the season by becoming the first Aggie volleyball player to earn all-Mountain West honors.

In 2012, DuBose led USU to the regular-season Western Athletic Conference title, as the Aggies collected nine conference postseason awards, including DuBose being named WAC Coach of the Year, while redshirt-freshman Brainard was tabbed WAC Freshman of the Year. The Coach of the Year award was DuBose's second as head coach of the Aggies and the first time in school history that a USU volleyball coach had earned multiple Coach of the Year honors. Paige Neves, Rachel Orr, Shay Sorensen and Josselyn White all earned first-team all-WAC honors, while Brainard and VanHoff were tabbed to the second-team. Brainard was also named to the all-freshmen team.

USU's three first-team honorees in 2012 were the most in its eight years in the WAC and only the second time in school history to earn three first-team all-conference honors, joining 2000 when three Aggies collected first-team all-Big West Conference honors in Amy Crosbie, Denae Mohlman and Melissa Schoepf.

Utah State's five all-conference selections in 2012 were also the most during its time in the WAC, as well as the most since having five Big West honoree in 2001, including Neves' older sister, Chelsi, who was a first-team selection with Michelle Matheson. Three other Aggies also earned honorable mention all-Big West honors.

Utah State's block was especially strong in 2012 as the team finished ninth in the nation with 3.00 blocks per set, continuing a tradition of being among the national leaders. The trend followed the 2011 team which ranked 10th with 2.79 blocks per set and the 2010 team that ranked ninth with 2.89 blocks per set. The 2012 season was also another well-decorated one off the court, as eight Aggie players earned academic all-WAC accolades.

Under DuBose's leadership in 2011, Liz McArthur and Shay Sorensen earned all-WAC honors, while Paige Neves was named to the all-freshman team. Off the court, the Aggies also had noteworthy success with eight players earning academic all-WAC honors, including McArthur earning first-team CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII honors for the second-straight year.

Utah State had one of its best seasons in school history in 2010, winning its first-ever WAC Tournament Championship and advancing to its fourth NCAA Tournament in school history. Overall, Utah State became just the third team in the history of the WAC to win its tournament championship as it was the first school in 11 years to defeat perennial power Hawai'i in the championship match. USU finished the year with a 24-9 record, including a third-place conference finish with a 9-7 league mark. Those 24 wins in 2010 were not only the seventh-most in school history, but the most since 1982. Utah State also had four players earn all-WAC honors during the season, including McArthur, who was named to the first team. McArthur was also named the Most Valuable Player of the 2010 WAC Tournament and went on to earn American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) honorable mention All-American honors. USU also had seven players earn academic all-WAC honors in 2010, while senior middle blocker Katie Astle joined McArthur on the academic all-district team. DuBose also received national attention in 2010 as he was named one of five finalists for the Collegiate Volleyball Update National Coach of the Year award.

The 2008 and 2009 squads combined for 26 victories over the two years as four Aggies earned all-conference accolades in 2008 with eight more earning academic all-WAC honors. In 2009, Liz McArthur was awarded the first of three all-WAC citations in her career and was one of nine Aggies recognized with academic all-WAC honors.

DuBose also had plenty of success during the 2007 season as he led Utah State to a 17-13 record and a third-place conference finish with an 11-5 mark. Among those 11 league victories was one of the biggest wins in school history as USU posted a three-set sweep at No. 10 Hawai'i, snapping a 108-match home conference winning streak for the Rainbow Wahine.

Following the 2007 season, DuBose had four players recognized by the WAC as senior Amanda Nielson was named first-team all-conference and an AVCA honorable mention All-American, while setter Chelsea Fowles was named the Freshman of the Year in the WAC. DuBose was also honored in 2007 as he became the first volleyball coach in school history to garner conference Coach of the Year honors.

In his 11 complete seasons at the helm of the Aggie program, DuBose has a 166-167 (.498) record, coaching his 300th career match as head coach vs. San Diego State on Nov. 14, 2015. DuBose earned his 100th career win with the Aggies' victory against Seattle on Sept. 20, 2012. DuBose became just the second coaching position to reach 100 wins as Marilyn McReavy and Mary Jo Peppler hold the school record with 209 wins as they were co-head coaches from 1976-81. USU has won 20 matches a total of 12 times in school history, including three under DuBose in the 2010, 2012 and 2013 seasons.

Prior to accepting the head coaching position at Utah State, DuBose spent four seasons (2003-06) as an assistant on Brigham Young University's men's volleyball team, helping the Cougars win the national title in 2004.

In his four seasons at Brigham Young, DuBose helped lead the Cougars' men's program to a 90-30 (.750) record, including a National Championship in 2004 and a second-place finish at the 2003 NCAA Tournament. During his time at BYU, he coached nine All-Americans, including the 2004 NCAA Player of the Year.

DuBose began his collegiate coaching career at Utah State from 1999-2000 as an assistant to Tom Peterson. During that time, the Aggies won the Eastern Division of the Big West Conference in 1999 and advanced to the school's first-ever NCAA Tournament in 2000, defeating Missouri in the first round. USU finished the 2000 season ranked 22nd in the country, the program's first-ever top 25 ranking.

DuBose began his coaching career as an assistant at Brighton High School in Sandy, Utah, from 1997-98 and also assisted with the Cache Valley Juniors and the Mountain West Volleyball Club during that time period. Following his two-year stint at Utah State, DuBose spent one year as an assistant to Peterson at the University of New Mexico, working with the women's program, before following Peterson to Brigham Young.

DuBose played two years of collegiate volleyball at Golden West Community College in Huntington Beach, Calif., after graduating from Edison High School in Huntington Beach, where he earned all-county honors his senior season.

A native of Otto, Wyo., Palmer played for two seasons on Utah State's volleyball team in 2002 and 2003 and set a then single-season digs record as a senior with 362. # 2017 SEASON PREVIEW

When it comes to the 2017 season, 12th-year head coach Grayson DuBose has a common theme with his players: match experience.

The match experience begins with the backline with returning defensive specialist Tasia Taylor, who will take on the role of libero this coming fall, following the graduation of two-year starter Hannah Gleason. Taylor has appeared in every match for the Aggies during her first two years and has not missed a set, playing in all 62 matches and 226 sets. She has been among the top five on the team in digs each season, totaling more than 400 in her career.

"Tasia steps into that role (libero), having had experience and having been trained and learning from a great libero in Hannah Gleason," DuBose said. "It was the same with Hannah before that. We've been able to stagger out liberos and have them get opportunities to learn and grow from each other."

Joining Taylor on the back row will be freshman Madi Olson, who spent all of the 2016 season as a redshirt, but saw significant time on the court during the spring. Olson was a three-year starter at Lone Peak High School in Alpine, Utah, leading the Knights in digs during her junior and senior seasons.

"I'm looking forward to what those two will bring to the table," DuBose said. "Tasia will step into that teaching role and Madi will be able to learn from her."

Utah State will replace another graduated senior at setter in Erica Moscoso, but already have a match-tested setter in junior Kassidy Johnson. Johnson has appeared in 37 matches and close to 100 sets during her career, already totaling four double-doubles. She gained most of her experience during her freshman year, starting for the Aggies in 12 matches and highlighting the year with a career-high 54 assists against Utah Valley.

"Kassidy has great experience," DuBose said. "And not just practice experience, but actual match experience the last two years. She's been able to build upon that this past spring and we anticipate her being able to continue to build on that while she's here."

Freshman Jaysa Funk will provide depth after spending all of last season as a redshirt. Much like high school teammate Olson, Funk saw time during the spring directing the USU attack.

"Jaysa was able to redshirt last year, which was great for her as far as learning the system and learning how to be a collegiate athlete," DuBose said. "She's really embraced the opportunity to go and learn how to be a better setter and teammate. All those things have been very positive for us."

Match experience also carries over into the middle, where Utah State has a pair of returning starters in senior Carly Lenzen and junior Lauren O'Brien. The duo has led the Aggies in blocking each of the past two seasons and has also been among the top five each year in kills.

"Carly has done a fabulous job," DuBose said. "There's been very few people that I've coached over the years that understand our blocking system as well as she does. She knows where people need to be, she understands scouting reports, she understands how to teach and guide and be a mentor to the younger middles in our program."

"She has this thing called match experience, which is fabulous to have," he continued. "And she has a lot of it. She's been in a lot of tough situations, so there's very few things that are going to come across that she's going to see that will surprise her or catch her off guard. She is just a great leader for us in that front row."

"Lauren O'Brien has also been able to gain experience in the last couple of years, which has been very fortuitous for us because she works hard and is a really good example of what we want our middles to be," DuBose said. "She puts out great effort and communicates very well."

Joining them in the middle is sophomore Ashley Wesenberg, who saw action in three matches last season, and incoming freshman Bailey Downing, an honorable mention high school All-American from Lovejoy High School in Lucas, Texas.

"Ashley Wesenberg learned some valuable traits last year, and if she can continue to develop, we'll see what kind of role she'll continue to play for our team," DuBose said. "Bailey Downing comes in as a big recruit, having been well trained in the Texas Advantage Volley-

ball club system. She has a neat opportunity to help our program get to another level as far as experience and her work ethic goes."

On the outside, Utah State returns two of its top three attackers in senior outside Lauren Anderson and senior opposite Kayla DeCoursey. Anderson was an all-Mountain West selection in 2016 after leading the Aggies with 377 kills and was a member of the MW All-Star team that finished second in the Global Volleyball Challenge this past July. DeCoursey is coming off her best year in an Aggie uniform, after finishing third on the team with 255 kills and leading all outsides with a .266 hitting percentage (255-83-646).

"Lauren Anderson is coming off of a nice season and we anticipate that she'll be able to build on that and grow from there," DuBose said. "Kayla DeCoursey, arguably, was the best opposite in the league the last two years. She can hit with range and savvy."

Fellow senior Rachel Gale-Hammond also returns after leading the team in kills two years ago, recording the sixth-most attempts in school history (1,186) during the 2015 season. Gale-Hammond turned those chances into a team-best 355 kills that year.

"Rachel Gale-Hammond put together a really nice spring as far as developing where we needed her to," DuBose said. "She worked on her ball control enough that I think she's going to be a really consistent outside hitter for us."

A trio of newcomers will provide depth on the outside in redshirt freshman Ashlee Thornock, junior college transfer Ally Packard and freshman Gabbi Shumway. Thornock spent all of the 2016 season as a redshirt, but had plenty of reps during the spring. Packard was a two-year starter at Snow College and finished her career with the Badgers with more than

300 kills and 350 digs. Shumway helped Lone Peak to a Utah state championship in 2016.

"Ashlee Thornock was able to gain some experience during practice situations last year," DuBose said. "Ally Packard adds to that mix as far as having some experience at Snow College and will come in and adapt to the game pretty quickly and she'll be able to help us in our gym and our culture.

"Gabbi Shumway comes in as a player who fans will enjoy watching," he continued. "She's a dynamic kid and has a good arm and can do some fun stuff. Really, we have a lot of experience and we're fortunate to have that experience in those outside hitter and opposite positions. I think that's going to help us as the season goes on."

The Aggies will open the 2017 campaign in Fayetteville, Ark., in a tournament hosted by Arkansas, Aug. 25-26. USU will be one of four teams in the tournament, joining first-time opponents CSU Bakersfield and Louisiana-Monroe. CSUB finished the 2016 campaign with an overall mark of 14-15, but finished tied for second in the WAC with a league mark of 10-4. ULM was 9-25 last season, including a league mark of 3-13 in the Sun Belt. Arkansas was 9-21 last season under first-year head coach Jason Watson.

Utah State will then host a tournament on Sept. 1-2, welcoming Montana State and former Big West rivals Pacific and UC Santa Barbara to Kirby Court at the Wayne Estes Center. The weekend will mark the fourth consecutive year that the Aggies have hosted a tournament.

Montana State finished the 2016 season with an overall mark of 5-20 under second-year head coach JJ Riley, a former assistant at Utah. The Aggies have not faced Pacific since the 2013 season and UCSB since 2008, but have a long history with both schools, having been a part of the Big West from 1990-2004. Pacific finished the 2016 season 15-15 and 9-9 in the West Coast Conference, while UCSB finished 17-12 overall and 8-8 in the Big West.

Utah State will face its first in-state opponent in Utah Valley on Sept. 5, before traveling to Flagstaff, Ariz.,

to take part in the Northern Arizona Tournament, facing Arizona State and CSU Bakersfield for the second time in tournament play. NAU finished second in the South Division of the Big Sky Conference last season, wrapping up the year with a 12-4 league mark and an overall record of 24-8. Arizona State was 12-20 last season, including a 5-15 finish in the Pac-12.

The Aggies will then face a pair of in-state opponents in back-to-back matches, traveling to Weber State on Sept. 12 and to Southern Utah on Sept. 15. Both schools feature former assistants to DuBose at Utah State in WSU head coach Jeremiah Larsen and SUU head coach Craig Choate.

Utah State then opens its Mountain West slate, hosting San Diego State and Fresno State, Sept. 21 and 23, respectively. The Aggies will take their first conference road trip the following weekend with stops at UNLV and New Mexico on Sept. 28 and 30, respectively.

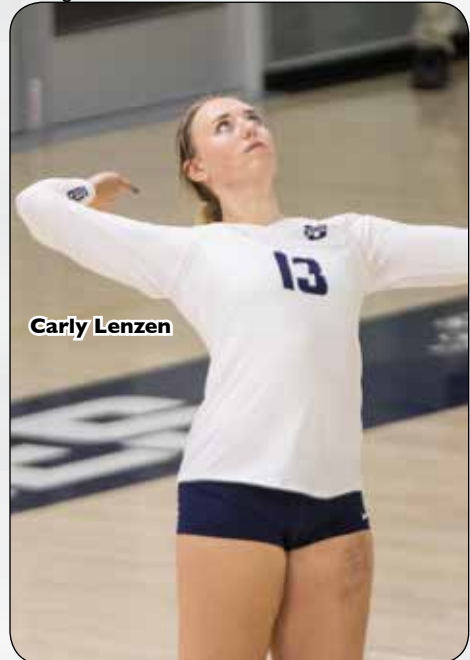
USU opens the month of October with three straight home matches, hosting Wyoming, Colorado State and Boise State, Oct. 5, 7 and 10, respectively. The three-match homestand is followed by a three-match road swing at Air Force (10/12), Fresno State (10/19) and San Diego State (10/21). The Aggies close out the month with home matches against New Mexico and UNLV on Oct. 26 and 28, respectively.

Utah State will begin the final month of the season on the road at Colorado State (11/2), Wyoming (11/4) and Boise State (11/7), before returning home to host Air Force (11/11) and Nevada (11/16). The match against the Wolf Pack will coincide with Senior Night, when the Aggies will recognize their senior class of outside hitters Rachel Gale-Hammond and Lauren Anderson, opposite Kayla DeCoursey and middle Carly Lenzen.

The 2017 regular season will conclude with the season finale at San José State on Nov. 18. However, the season could continue with an NCAA Tournament berth or a bid to a second postseason tournament, similar to the NIT, which is scheduled to begin play this coming season.

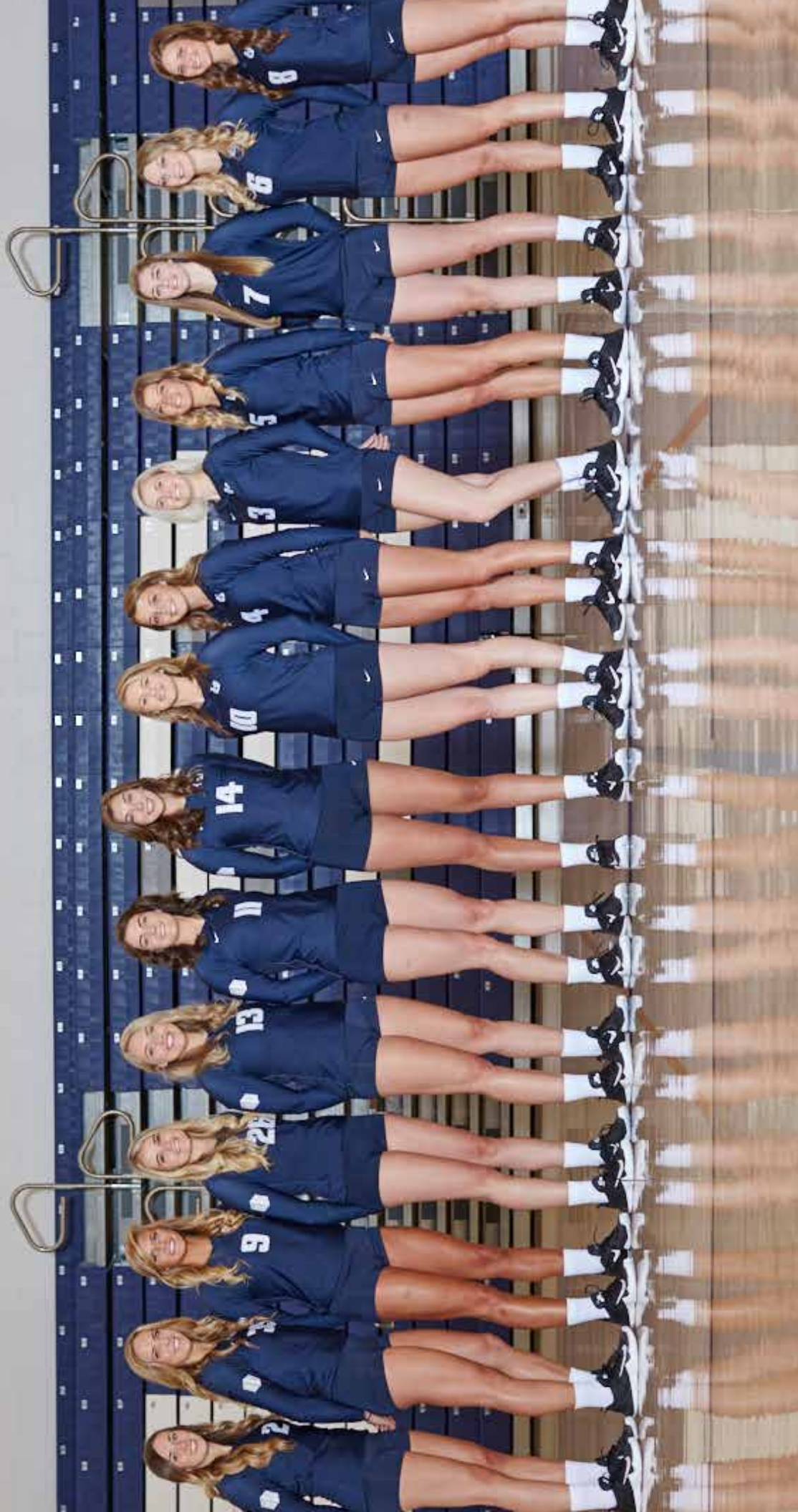

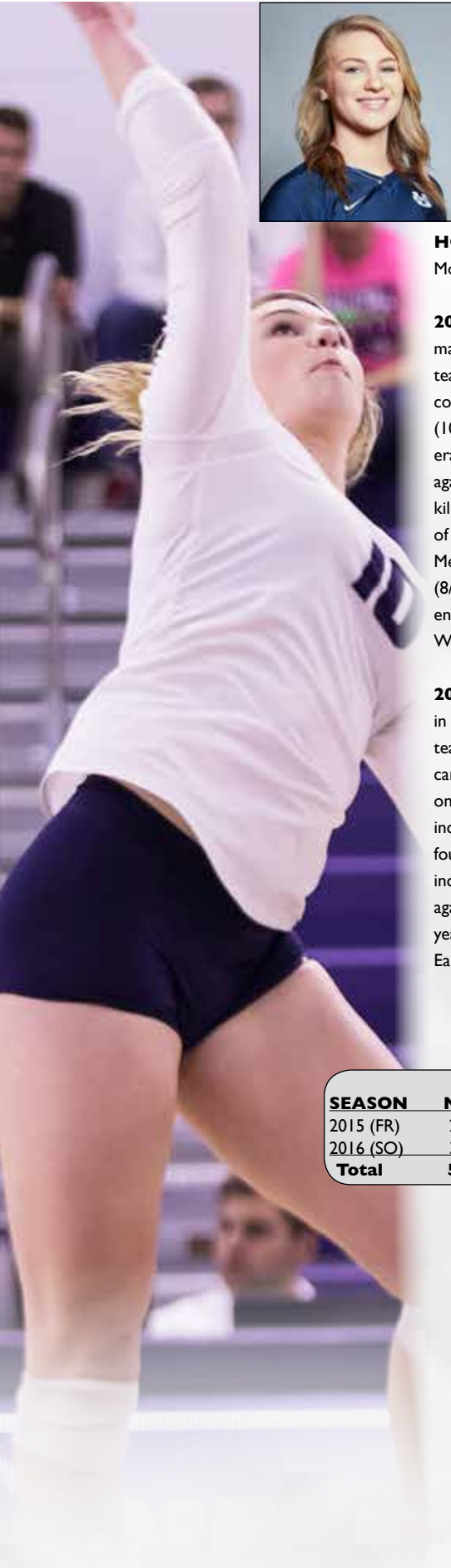

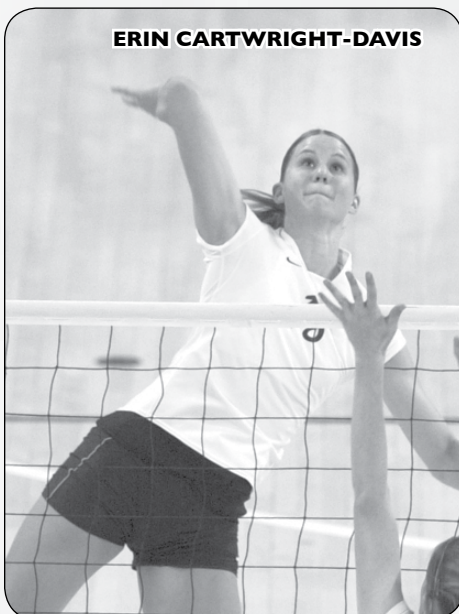

## 2016 SEASON IN REVIEW

Utah State improved by eight wins from the previous season in 2016 and also set a school record after hitting .238 (1,465-562-3,797) during the year. Senior libero Hannah Gleason finished her career as the USU record holder in sets played (450) and fourth in the Utah State record books with 1,410 career digs.

The year opened with three losses at the Oregon State-hosted Ultra Ankle Challenge, but turned around quickly with three victories over the next four matches, including a 3-0 win over UC Riverside to open the Utah State Invitational.

During the match, Gleason recorded a school-record-tying seven service aces and led the team with 15 digs. Senior outside Kaylie Kamalu-Smith led the offense with a team-best 10 kills, hitting a career-high .417 without an error on 24 attempts.

The Aggies then bookended a pair of victories over Southeastern Louisiana and Utah Valley with losses against Portland State and Utah before opening its Mountain West slate with a 3-2 win at Nevada. During the match, Kamalu-Smith recorded a career-high 30 kills as part of a season-high 71 kills for the Aggies. Senior setter Erica Moscoso recorded a career-high 64 assists while directing the attack.

Utah State bounced back from three losses over its next three matches by posting a 3-1 win on the road at Air Force. The match was the fourth consecutive four-set victory for the Aggies as junior middle Carly Lenzen recorded a season-high-tying 12 kills and a team-best six blocks. Additionally, Lenzen hit a career-high .611 (12-1-18) during the contest.

Following a loss on the road to Boise State, Utah State wrapped up a four-match homestead with three victories over New Mexico, San Diego State and Nevada, completing a season sweep over the Wolf Pack. Kamalu-Smith recorded double-digit kills in all three matches and junior outside Lauren Anderson tallied a career-high 23 kills, hitting a career-high .435 (23-3-46), in the victory over Nevada.

Three more losses followed to Wyoming, Colorado State and Boise State, before Utah State posted a 3-0 victory over Air Force, marking the Aggies' second conference sweep of the season. During the match, USU hit a season-high .384 (47-9-99) as Anderson and Lenzen recorded double-digit kills with 13 and 10, respectively.

Utah State's 3-2 win over New Mexico two matches later gave the Aggies their third conference sweep of the year. USU came back from two sets down in the match to record the win as Kamalu-Smith led the offense with 26 kills and coupled that with 12 digs for her sixth double-double of the year. Senior setter Erica Moscoso also logged a double-double, finishing with 54 assists and 13 digs.

Following a loss at Fresno State, USU closed out the 2016 season with back-to-back wins over San José State and Weber State. Both matches ended 3-0 in the Aggies' favor as Kamalu-Smith hit a career-best .625 (17-2-24) against the Spartans and the 2016 seniors 'Lit the A Blue' one final time on Senior Night against the Wildcats.

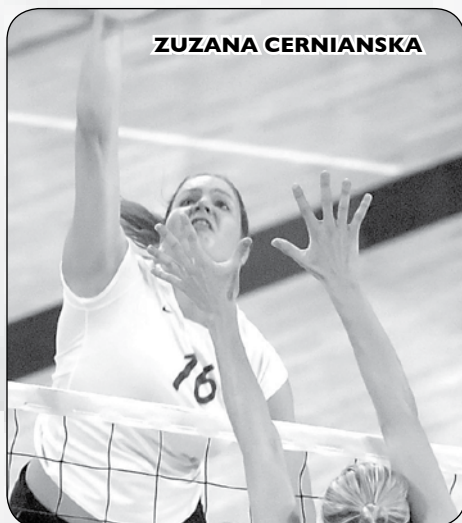

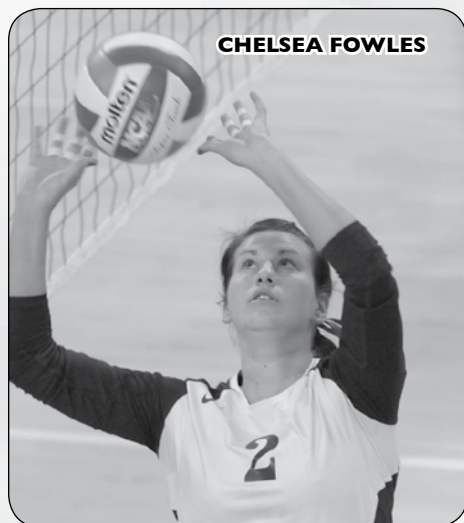

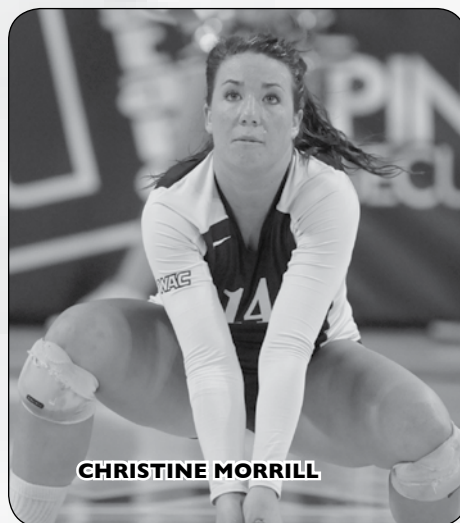

**Annette Viola Cottle (1993)** - Annette Viola Cottle was a four-time AIAW All-American in volleyball from 1976-79. She also was named to the Region VII all-conference team four straight years. Cottle earned the Broderick Award in 1978 as the most outstanding volleyball player in America after leading Utah State to the national championship—the school's first-ever team national title. She also helped the Aggies capture second place in the 1979 AIAW Championships. Cottle won a gold medal in the 1979 U.S. Sports Festival and she was a member of the 1979 World University team which finished fifth. She also participated in basketball at Utah State. Cottle served as head volleyball coach at Utah State from 1982-84. She was a six-time United States Volleyball Association All-American (1981, 1989-93) and two-time USVA MVP in the Senior Division (1991 and 1993). Cottle was the recipient of the 1993 Leadership Award from the Utah Network for Girls and Women in Sports.



**Elaine Roque (1994)** - Elaine Roque transferred from UCLA to Utah State in 1979 and established herself as perhaps the greatest volleyball player in school history. Roque, who earned first-team All-America honors as a senior, helped the Aggies attain the nation's No. 1 ranking during the 1979 season. She eventually led USU to a second-place finish in the AIAW nationals at 35-5. Following graduation, Roque has become one of the premiere professional players. She was named Sportswoman of the Year in 1990 and 1992. In addition, Roque twice has been voted Best Blocker on the WPVA Tour (1991 and 1993). She ranked fourth in World Beach Volleyball in 1994. Roque and her partner Gail Castro also ranked third on the 1994 WPVA Tour. She represented the United States in the 1994 World Series Tournament in Puerto Rico.



**Karolyn Kirby (1995)** - Karolyn Kirby was a two-time AIAW volleyball All-American at Utah State, leading the Aggies to three-straight top 10 national finishes from 1979-81. Kirby helped USU to a combined record of 106-38 (.736) during her three-year career, including a second-place finish in the 1979 AIAW Nationals at 35-5. The Aggies finished eighth nationally in 1980 and third in 1981. Kirby also was a two-time Intermountain All-Conference selection (1980-81). A member of the Women's Professional Volleyball Association (WPVA), she teamed with Liz Masakayan to dominate the tour in 1993 and 1994, winning 23 of the 26 circuit events, losing only eight games in the process and producing a 55-match winning streak during one stretch. Kirby and Masakayan also won the title at the 1994 Goodwill Games in St. Petersburg, Russia.



**Lauren Goebel Keller (2010)** - Lauren Goebel Keller was a great setter/outside hitter for Utah State. A two-time Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) All-American, Goebel Keller helped Utah State to a national runner-up finish in 1979, an eighth-place national finish in 1980 and a third-place national finish in 1981. During the 1979 season, USU went 10-0 in the Intermountain Athletic Conference (IAC) and finished with a 35-5-2 mark as it lost to Hawai'i in five sets in the national championship match. Goebel Keller, who was also a two-time all-IAC selection, helped Utah State to a 134-57-2 (.699) record during her four-year career, including a 28-2 (.933) conference mark. Goebel Keller, who served as the team's captain from 1980-82, was also a two-time United States Volleyball Association (USVBA) All-America. Goebel Keller spent four years (1976-79) on the Women's Junior National and Women's National Volleyball teams.



**Lucia Chudy (2015)** - Lucia Chudy was a great middle blocker for Utah State during its glory days in the late 1970's. A two-time Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) All-American and two-time all-IAC selection, Chudy helped Utah State volleyball to its only national championship in 1978 followed by a national runner-up finish in 1979, to go along with a 10th-place finish at the AIAW National Tournament in 1977. During the 1977 season, USU set the school-record for wins as it finished the year with a 46-11-2 record, including a 10-1 mark in the Intermountain Athletic Conference (IAC), as it went on to take first-place at the AIAW Regional Tournament. During its national championship run in 1978, USU posted a 42-4-2 record and began the season by winning its first 26 matches. USU also went 10-2 in conference play that season and concluded its national championship run by defeating UCLA in four sets in the AIAW National Championship match in Tuscaloosa, Ala. During the 1979 season, USU went 10-0 in conference play and finished with a 35-5-2 mark as it lost to Hawai'i in five sets in the national championship match. Chudy's success in volleyball continued after her college career, as she was a member of the U.S. Olympic Team in 1980-1981. She played professional volleyball in Italy for 10 years and was an assistant volleyball coach at Brown University from 1999-2004, helping the Bears win Ivy League championships in 2000 and 2002.



It was a dream season for the Utah State volleyball team in 1978. Coached by Marilyn (McReavy) Nolen and Mary Jo Pepler, the 1978 Aggies became the first team in Utah State history to capture a National Championship by defeating UCLA in four games in Tuscaloosa, Alabama. Led by All-American's Annette Cottle, Sandy Lynn and Lucia Chudy, Utah State notched a 42-4-2 record during the season, including 26-straight wins to start the year. USU then concluded its season with a 12 match winning streak, including its victory in the AIAW (Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women) championship match against the Bruins. Along with All-America honors, Cottle received the Broderick Award as the nation's top player, while Lynn was named to the AIAW all-tournament team. Other members of the 1978 National Championship team included Gayle Adamowicz, Jan Corley, Katrinka Crawford, Drora Epstein, Jill Hirschinger, Deia Kidd, Sheryl Meyer and Jo Vrazel.

Former Aggie great **Karolyn Kirby** was inducted into the International Volleyball Hall of Fame in Holyoke, Mass., in October, 2004.

Kirby won a gold medal in beach volleyball at the 1992 Olympic games in Barcelona, Spain, and played 10 seasons (1989-1998) in the WPVA/AVP. From 1985-1987, Kirby played indoor volleyball for team USA as the starting setter and captained the team in 1987.

Kirby was deemed the "Best Player in the World" by the FIVB for three straight years (1992-94) and was named Most Valuable Player of the WPVA four times. Kirby retired from professional volleyball in 1998, leaving the game as the all-time winningest player with 64 tournament wins. She was also recently named a "Top Ten Player of the Century" by USA Volleyball. Kirby also earned WPVA "Best Setter" honors in six of her 10 years on the tour.

She most recently coached the Bulgarian National Beach team for three years (2000-02) and helped them to a ranking of ninth in the world. In the 2000 Summer Olympic games in Sydney, Australia, Kirby guided the team to a 17th place finish. Kirby also earned a gold medal on the U.S. Indoor volleyball team at the 1994 Goodwill Games in St. Petersburg, Russia.



## NOELLE E. COCKETT UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

Noelle E. Cockett was appointed as Utah State University's 16th President in October 2016, beginning her official tenure in January 2017. She is USU's first female president and the only female president with Utah's higher education system.

Since becoming president, Cockett has worked to improve the mission and vision of the university. The dedicated and award-winning faculty at USU are scholar-educators who have shared a commitment to teaching excellence and rigorous research to help students succeed. In March 2017, Jake Christensen and Thomas Hill were named 2017 Goldwater Scholars, and fellow undergraduate A. J. Walters, received an honorable mention, in the prestigious national competition that recognizes outstanding achievements in science and mathematics. Cockett has also been working to improve the facilities students enjoy as part of their education. In April, she was proud to be a part of the ground-breaking for the new Life Sciences building on the Logan campus that will benefit students in more than 30 majors taking foundational biology classroom and lab courses housed in the new facility.

As always, friends, alumni and donors of the university contribute to the livelihood of USU. In early May 2017, the university announced a major expansion of the highly selective Huntsman Scholar Program and the launch of the Center of Growth and Opportunity thanks to a joint \$50 million gift to the Jon M. Huntsman School of Business from the Huntsman Foundation and the Charles Koch Foundation. The joint gift is the largest in the school's history and enables the university to continue fostering innovative research and teaching to improve lives and communities.

Prior to being named Utah State's President, Cockett was serving as Executive Vice President and Provost at USU and held that position since 2013. Prior to that, she served USU as Vice President for Extension from 2006 to 2013; Dean of the College of Agriculture and Applied Sciences from 2002 to 2013; and Director of the Utah Agriculture Experiment Station from 2009 to 2013.

Cockett has built a distinguished career in sheep genomics research, maintaining an active research program even while serving in various leadership positions at Utah State University. Her research program has centered on the identification of genetic markers associated with economically important traits in sheep, as well as the development of resources that advance research on the sheep genome. Cockett and her colleagues published an article describing the sheep genome sequence in *Science* in 2014. Her current project focuses on the identification of genetic regions associated with entropion in newborn lambs. Cockett has served as the United States coordinator for sheep genome mapping since 1993 and is an active member of the International Sheep Genomics Consortium.

As an active researcher, Cockett has received many awards and accolades throughout her career including a Young Scientist Award from the Western Section

of the American Society of Animal Science (ASAS), the Utah Governor's Medal for Science and Technology (2004 and 2015) and one of USU's top honors, the D.Wynne Thorne Research Award.

After receiving her master's and doctorate in animal breeding and genetics from Oregon State University in 1983 and 1985, respectively, Cockett spent five years as a research geneticist at the United States Department of Agriculture, Agriculture Research Service U.S. Meat Animal Research Center in Clay Center, Nebraska. She joined Utah State University in 1990 as a researcher and assistant professor in the Department of Animal, Dairy and Veterinary Sciences in the College of Agriculture and Applied Sciences.

Cockett, who earned her bachelor's degree from Montana State in animal science in 1980, grew up on a beef cattle ranch in eastern Montana and is married to John Cockett, Director of Technology in USU's Emma Eccles Jones College of Education and Human Services. Noelle and John have two children, Dylan and Chantelle.

**JOHN HARTWELL**  
**UNIVERSITY VICE PRESIDENT/  
 DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS**

Since being named Vice President and Director of Athletics at Utah State on June 2, 2015, John Hartwell has cast his vision for Aggie Athletics, which embodies maximum effort academically, athletically and socially to ensure success in both the classroom and on the fields of competition.

Hartwell has also focused on maximizing and increasing the department's revenue streams, along with planning for future facility renovations, which includes Maverik Stadium and the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum.

In his brief time at Utah State, Hartwell has already rebranded the fundraising arm of Utah State Athletics with the creation of Aggies Unlimited, which puts all giving under one umbrella.

Utah State also entered into a new partnership with the Larry H. Miller Sports & Entertainment Group to be its flagship radio station for Aggie Athletics, which gives USU additional advertising opportunities throughout Cache Valley and the Wasatch Front, in addition to more control over each broadcast.

Additionally, Hartwell has overseen the completion of the \$36 million, 85,000-square foot West Stadium Center on the west side of Maverik Stadium, which includes 24 luxury suites, 20 loge boxes, over 700 covered club seats and a premium club area that is also used to host a student-athlete training table. Renovations also included new video boards on both the north and south ends of the stadium, along with a new public address system, while major concourse work significantly increased restrooms and upgraded concessions.

Under Hartwell's leadership, Utah State has seen unparalleled athletic success during the past two academic years, highlighted by its men's tennis program winning the school's first Mountain West regular season and tournament championships since joining the Conference in 2013. In fact, men's tennis has won back-to-back regular season championships the past two years, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament as a team in 2017 for the first time in program history as it finished the season with a school-record 23 wins and a final national ranking of No. 45.

Aggie softball has also seen increased success over the past two seasons as they finished the 2017 campaign with a 33-18 record, including a 14-9 Mountain West mark, and advanced to the National Softball Invitational, marking the program's first postseason appearance since 1993. In fact, those 33 overall wins and 14 league victories are its most since 1996, as USU finished the 2017 season tied for third place in the league.

Other Utah State sports that have excelled the past two seasons in the Mountain West include its men's track & field programs, as they finished second at both the indoor and outdoor conference championships in 2016, and third at both championships during the 2017 academic year. Additionally, USU's football program played

in a school-record fifth-straight bowl game in 2016.

Even more impressive is Utah State's continued successes by its student-athletes in the classroom as they have an 89 percent graduation success rate, which is the highest in the Mountain West, and a cumulative 3.196 grade-point average. During the 2016-17 academic year, USU had 148 student-athletes earn academic all-Mountain West honors, while 106 were named Mountain West Scholar-Athletes. Additionally, USU recognized 195 student-athletes at its annual Joe E. and Elma Whitesides Luncheon for earning a 3.2 or better GPA.

Hartwell came to Utah State after spending three years as the Athletics Director at Troy, where he laid the groundwork for the future of Trojan Athletics by spearheading several significant upgrades to its athletic facilities, including the addition of a new \$2 million practice facility for the golf teams, a \$3 million renovation and expansion of the softball facility and a \$2.1 million improvement to Veterans Memorial Stadium, while also securing funding for lights to be installed at the soccer and track complex. Hartwell also unveiled the North End Zone Project for Veterans Memorial Stadium, a \$25 million project that will be the new home for Trojan football.

Troy's athletics programs have also seen vast improvement on the fields of play due to Hartwell's leadership and oversight, including the football program that recorded its first 10-win season since joining the FBS and tied for the largest turnaround in the FBS in 2016, not to mention the Trojans being the first Sun Belt Conference team to ever appear in either the Associated Press or Coaches Poll. Men's basketball won the 2017 Sun Belt Conference Tournament and advanced to its first NCAA Tournament since 2003, while the women's basketball program has won back-to-back Sun Belt Tournament championships and appeared in two-straight NCAA Tournaments. Troy's golf programs have also excelled as the women's program has won three of the past four Sun Belt titles, while men's golf has advanced to three-straight NCAA Regionals. Troy's baseball team finished third in the Sun Belt in 2016 and defeated three ranked teams, including No. 5 Auburn.

Under Hartwell, Troy Athletics saw a significant enhancement in fundraising and external relations as he completely overhauled Troy's External Affairs division of the Athletics Department to increase revenues and enhance the fan and game day experience. As part of this makeover was the creation of a new external model, which included the addition of a Senior Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs; bringing corporate sponsorships in house with a partnership with Rockbridge Sports Group; and the development of the Troy Affinity Program to further engage Troy students in athletics.

Hartwell's strong business background also proved to be valuable at Troy as he negotiated a new footwear and apparel deal with Adidas, while also securing home-and-home football games with Duke and North Carolina State in addition to yielding a home basketball game with Mississippi. Hartwell's tenure at Troy also saw a record number of student-athletes earn a 3.0 grade-point-average, an upward trend in APR scores and additional staff positions in Troy's academic support department. During the 2014-15 academic year, Troy student-athletes finished with a 3.01 cumulative grade-point-average and over 57 percent of Troy's student-athletes had a 3.0 GPA or higher.

# USU VP/DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS JOHN HARTWELL

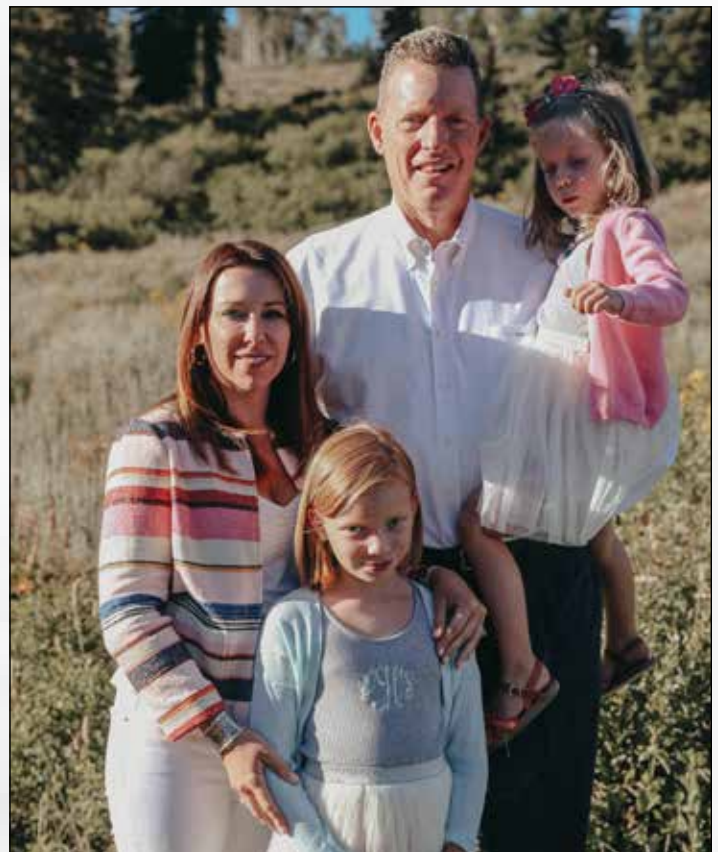


A 1987 graduate of The Citadel, the 52-year old Hartwell spent four-plus years as a certified public accountant with Ernst & Young before returning to his alma mater to serve as the Director of Internal Audit in 1991. From 1994 to 1997, he was in private business as the Chief Financial Officer for a \$36 million beverage distributor on the South Carolina coast.

Hartwell's direct experience in athletics administration began as the Assistant Athletics Director for Business at Georgia State in 1997. He was promoted to Associate Athletics Director for Internal Affairs in 1999, and his responsibilities expanded to include sport supervision for baseball, men's and women's golf, men's and women's track & field and cross country. He also had oversight over the Panthers' athletic facilities and game management in addition to his previous responsibilities of all financial aspects of the department. While at Georgia State, Hartwell earned a master's degree in sports administration.

Athletics has always been a big part of Hartwell's life, starting in high school where he was an all-state basketball selection at UMS-Wright in Mobile, Ala. The 6-foot-7 forward played alongside former North Carolina State and Alabama head coach Mark Gottfried in high school. Hartwell went on to play collegiately at The Citadel, where he was a three-year starter, a four-year letterman and captain of the team as a senior in 1987.

Hartwell is married to Dr. Heather Seale Hartwell, and they have two daughters, Lauren (8) and Madison (5). Hartwell also has a 25-year old son, Hunter; a Vanderbilt graduate who works for Deloitte Consulting.



At Troy, Hartwell served on the NCAA Division I Basketball Issues Committee, the Division I-A Board of Trustees Executive Committee, and the NCAA Division I Council as the Sun Belt Conference representative. He has also been an instructor at the Division I-A Institute for aspiring athletic directors.

Prior to being the Director of Athletics at Troy, Hartwell spent nine-plus years at the University of Mississippi, where he was the Senior Executive Associate Athletics Director, serving as the number two administrator in athletics.

Hartwell served as the Treasurer and Chief Operating Officer of the Mississippi Athletic Association Foundation, a 501 (c)(3) organization that generated over \$17 million annually for the Ole Miss Athletics Department through priority seating and major gifts.

He was responsible for the day-to-day administrative oversight of the football, men's basketball and baseball programs, along with sport oversight of the softball and men's and women's track & field and cross country programs. Hartwell also oversaw the Rebels' business office, ticket office, equipment room, merchandise sales, concessions and football scheduling. Hartwell scheduled several marquee football games for the Rebels, including a home-and-home series with Texas that began in 2012.

Hartwell managed the growth of the Ole Miss athletic budget from \$26 million in the 2003 fiscal year to over \$47 million in the 2012 fiscal year. He also chaired the search to hire men's basketball head coach Andy Kennedy in 2006. He was heavily involved in negotiations that increased revenues with contracts for apparel and footwear (Nike), merchandise sales (Sports Avenue/LIDS), concessions (Centerplate), wireless provider (C Spire) and video boards (Daktronics). He served on the Southeastern Conference Ticket Committee and started the annual SEC Chief Financial Officers Forum.

# MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE

## THIS IS THE MOUNTAIN WEST

From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the MW continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship. Now in its 18th year, the MW has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics.

The Mountain West has marked several achievements during its first 17 years, most notably becoming the first to establish a sports television network dedicated solely to an intercollegiate athletic conference (The Mtn.). The Mountain West also was the first to experiment with the coaches' challenge in the college football instant replay system, and was the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS conference to participate in four BCS bowl games, winning three. In the inaugural year of the new College Football Playoff system, Boise State earned the automatic slot into a New Year's Six bowl game as the highest-ranked champion from the Group of Five 5 conferences. The Broncos defeated then 10th-ranked Arizona 38-30 in the VIZIO Fiesta Bowl. In 2011-12, the Mountain West was among the first conferences to implement a league-wide state-of-the-art basketball instant replay system.

The Mountain West is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful terrain and landscapes in the nation can be found within Mountain West boundaries, including the majestic Rocky Mountain range, which borders five MW institutions (Air Force, Boise State, Colorado State, New Mexico and Utah State). The high plains of Wyoming (elevation 7,220 feet – the highest Division I campus in the nation) contrast with the desert cities of Las Vegas and Reno, home to UNLV and Nevada, respectively, while Fresno State, San Diego State and San Jose State add a West coast influence with their locations in Central, Southern and Northern California. The inclusion of the Hawai'i football program extends the Mountain West footprint to the beautiful islands in the

Pacific Ocean, while the addition of the women's soccer program at Colorado College gives the MW an additional presence in the Rocky Mountains.

## HISTORY OF THE MOUNTAIN WEST

The Mountain West was conceived on May 26, 1998, when the presidents of eight institutions — Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming — decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference. The split from a former 16-team conference re-established continuity and stability among the membership within the new league and signaled the continuation of its tradition-rich, long-standing athletic rivalries. Three of the MW's eight original members have been conference rivals since the 1960s (New Mexico, Wyoming and Colorado State), while San Diego State (1978) and Air Force (1980) were longtime members as well. UNLV and TCU entered the fold in 1996 and the Rebels continued as one of the original eight institutions that formed the MW in 1999. TCU re-joined the group with its first year of competition in the Mountain West in 2005-06. With conference realignment sweeping the nation in recent years, the MW has been proactive in addressing membership changes. Boise State University joined the Mountain West in 2011-12, followed by Fresno State and the University of Nevada on July 1, 2012. Also on July 1, 2012, the University of Hawai'i became a football-only member of the Conference. On July 1, 2013, the Mountain West further expanded when San José State University and Utah State University joined the Conference, bringing to 11 the number of full-time member institutions and 12 football-playing members. On July 1, 2014, the Colorado College women's soccer program became the first non-football affiliate member of the Mountain West, expanding that sport to 12 Conference participants.

When the Mountain West officially began operations on July 1, 1999, the new league had in place a seven-year contract with ESPN, giving the broadcaster exclusive national television rights to MW football and men's basketball, and three-year agreements to send the league's football champion to the Liberty Bowl and a second team to the Las Vegas Bowl. Commissioner Thompson also arranged a third bowl tie-in each of the first three seasons (1999 Motor City, 2000 Silicon Valley, 2001 New Orleans) before securing a four-year deal with the Emerald Bowl in San Francisco in 2002.

Entering the 2016 season, the MW has six contracted bowl affiliations — the Las Vegas Bowl, San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl, Hawai'i Bowl, Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, Gildan New Mexico Bowl and NOVA® Home Loans Arizona Bowl. The league also has a secondary agreement with the Cactus Bowl.

An innovator in the postseason bowl structure, the MW engineered many "firsts," as league teams have participated in six inaugural bowl games (2000 Silicon Valley, 2001 New Orleans, 2002 San Francisco (Emerald), 2005 Poinsettia, 2006 New Mexico, 2015 Arizona), as well as placing the first non-automatic-qualifying FBS team into a BCS bowl game with Utah's appearance in the 2005 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and into the College Football Playoff (CFP) with Boise State's selection to the 2014 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.
