3 ALL-AMERICANS

Alisa Nicodemus became the first Aggie to earn All-American accolades in cross country when she placed 14th at the 1992 NCAA Championships. Since then, Trevor Ball (2005) and Dillon Maggard (2016) have also garnered All-American honors.

7 FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Utah State swept the men's and women's awards in 2005 as Seth Wold placed fourth with a time of 25:16.08 and Vanessa Hawkins finished ninth with a time of 18:17.79 at the Western Athletic Conference Championships. Other Aggies to garner the award include Tylee Newman-Skinner on the women's side (2012), and Tony Jones (2006), Chio Lopez (2007), Colby Wilson (2013) and Luke Beattie (2016) on the men's side.

9 CHAMPIONS

Alisa Nicodemus was the first female cross country student-athlete in Utah State history to capture an individual conference title (Big West, 1992). Two years later, Mike Davidson (Big West, 1994) won the first men's conference title in school history. Nicodemus was a two-time champion as she went back-to-back in 1992 and 1993, while Brian McKenna on the men's side also has two conference championships to his name in 2009 and 2011. A total of seven different Aggies have captured nine individual conference crowns with McKenna's feat in 2011 being the most recent.

13 CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Aggies have won 13 team championships – 10 on the men's side and three more on the women's side. During their eight seasons in the Western Athletic Conference, the USU men captured six titles, including a five-peat from 2005-2009.

37 SEASONS

Gregg Gensel is in his 37th year of coaching track & field and cross country at Utah State. He is in his 30th season as head coach of the men's program and 25th year at the helm of the women's team.

70 ACADEMIC AWARDS

Since joining the Mountain West in 2013, Utah State has garnered 70 academic all-conference awards, including 39 on the women's side and 31 on the men's side. Thirteen different Aggie women were honored in 2016, while nine men were also lauded.

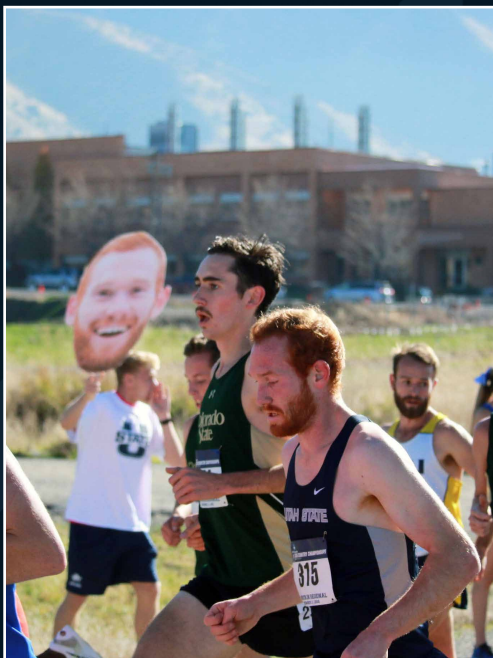

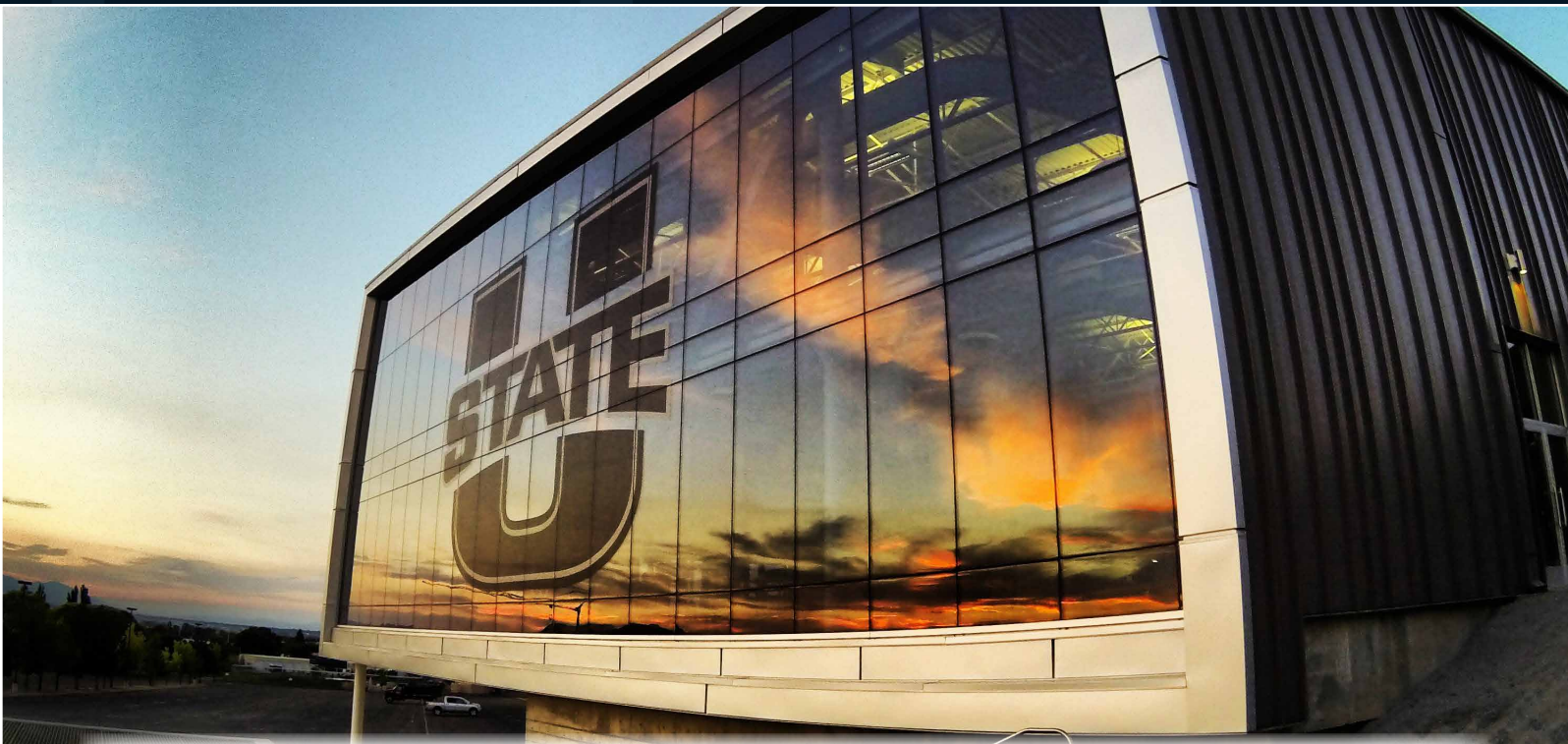

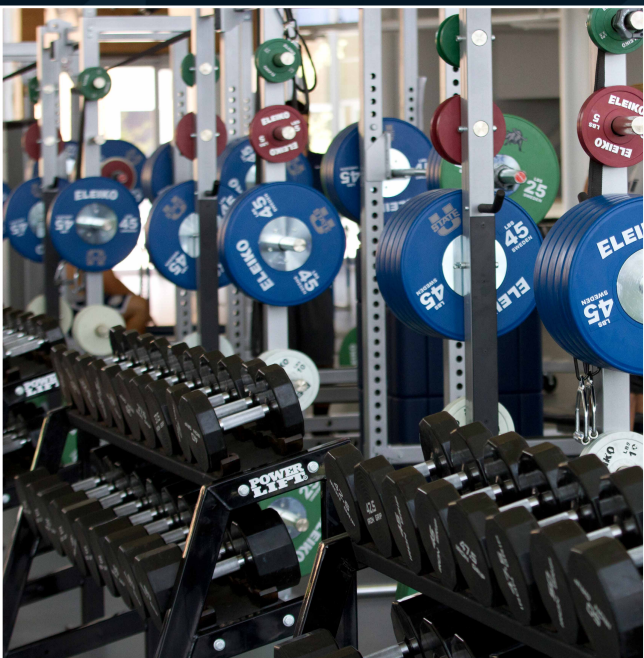

Completed in June of 2013, Utah State's \$6.5 million, 26,329-square-foot ICON Sports Performance Center features areas for weight training, cardiovascular workouts and speed and agility training, as well as offices for staff. Built on existing university property at the northwest corner of Maverik Stadium, the state-of-the-art multi-level facility alleviated overcrowding in the previous 5,800-square-foot strength and conditioning center and accommodates almost 400 student-athletes from 16 sports programs. The ICON Sports Performance Center is the largest such facility in the Mountain West and rivals any strength and conditioning complex in the country.

Completed prior to the start of the 2012 season, the Steve & Dona Reeder Cross Country Course has provided collegiate and high school student-athletes throughout the state and region a quality course to compete and train on. The cross country course, which is located at the Innovation Campus Wellness Park, is named after former distance coach Steve Reeder and his wife, Dona. Reeder spent 35 years as the Aggies' distance before retiring at the end of the 2014-15 season. Utah State hosted the 2016 NCAA Mountain Regional Championships and will host the event again for the second consecutive year on Nov. 10, 2017.

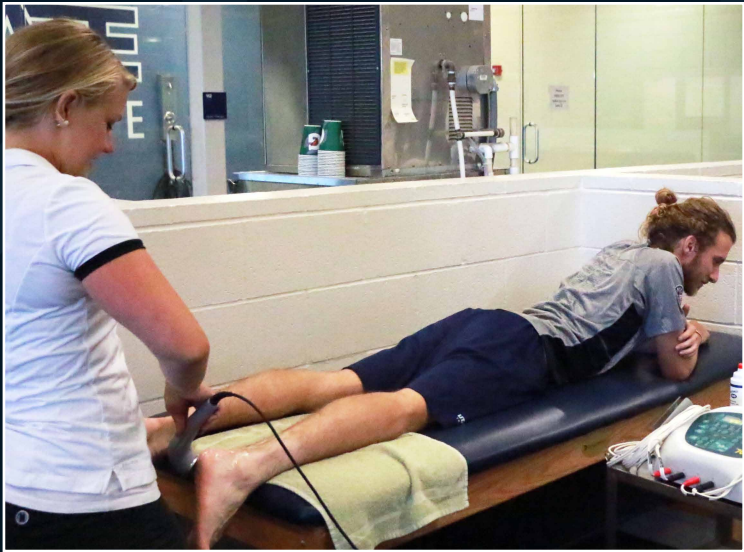

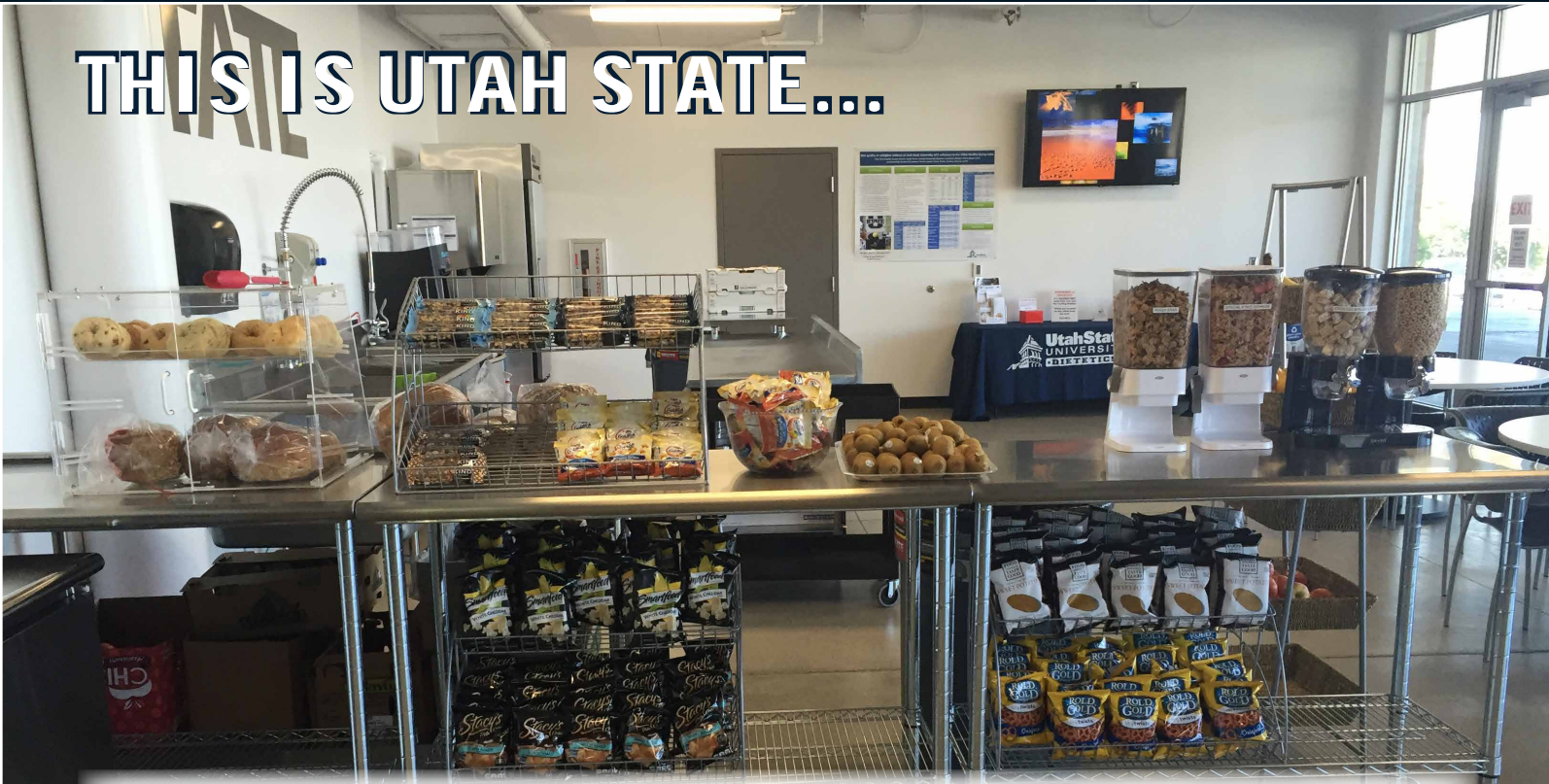
The three-story, 69,000-square-foot Jim and Carol Laub Athletics-Academics Complex is a state-of-the-art multi-purpose facility that meets all of the athletic and academic needs of Utah State's 16 sports programs and nearly 400-plus student-athletes. Within the facility, which was completed in the summer of 2008, is the 11,000-square-foot Dale Mildenberger Sports Medicine Complex and Dr. John Worley Sports Medicine Research Center, the Steve Mothersell Athletics Hall of Honor and the 7,000-square-foot J. Ken "Kenny" Seamons Equipment Room. Also located on the first floor are locker rooms for football, while the second floor features a 120-seat auditorium. The student-athlete academics center is located on the third floor, which includes numerous study hall and tutor areas, a computer lab and the Dr. Randall and Julianne Stockham Student-Athlete Academics Hall of Honor. The third floor also houses coaches' offices and meeting rooms for the track & field and cross country programs.

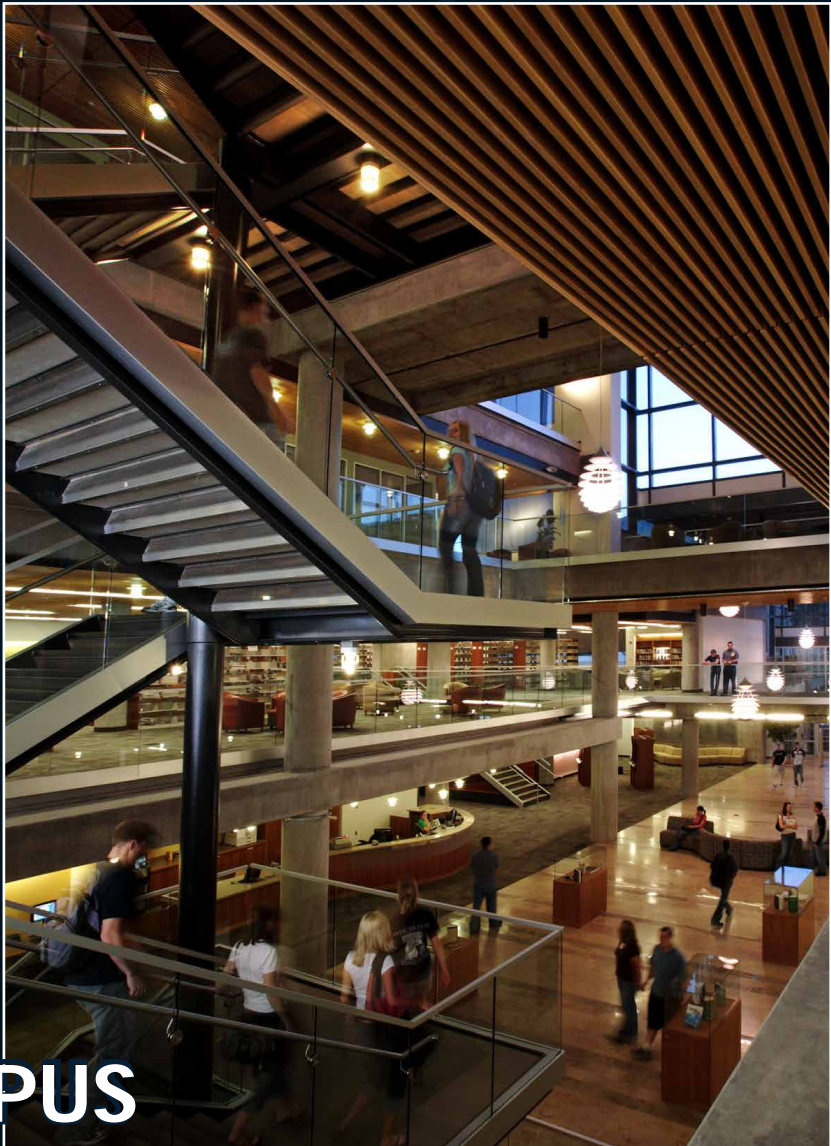
The Aggie Fueling Station, located on the bottom floor of the ICON Sports Performance Center, was created prior to the start of the 2016-17 school year by representatives from the nutritional program and athletics, who had a goal of working together to provide student-athletes with the food they need to complement the physical demands of training and nutrition. The fueling station is stocked with appetizing food focused on combining convenience and nutrition. Student-athletes can choose from a variety of fresh fruits and vegetables, cheese, milk, chicken, yogurt, beef jerky, peanut butter, trail mixes and much more. Workers at the fueling station prepare fruits and vegetables, measuring out serving sizes, restock the serving area and plan the daily special. In addition to food preparation, volunteers are on site to answer nutrition questions from student-athletes and give presentations about health and wellness to all 16 of Utah State's sports programs.

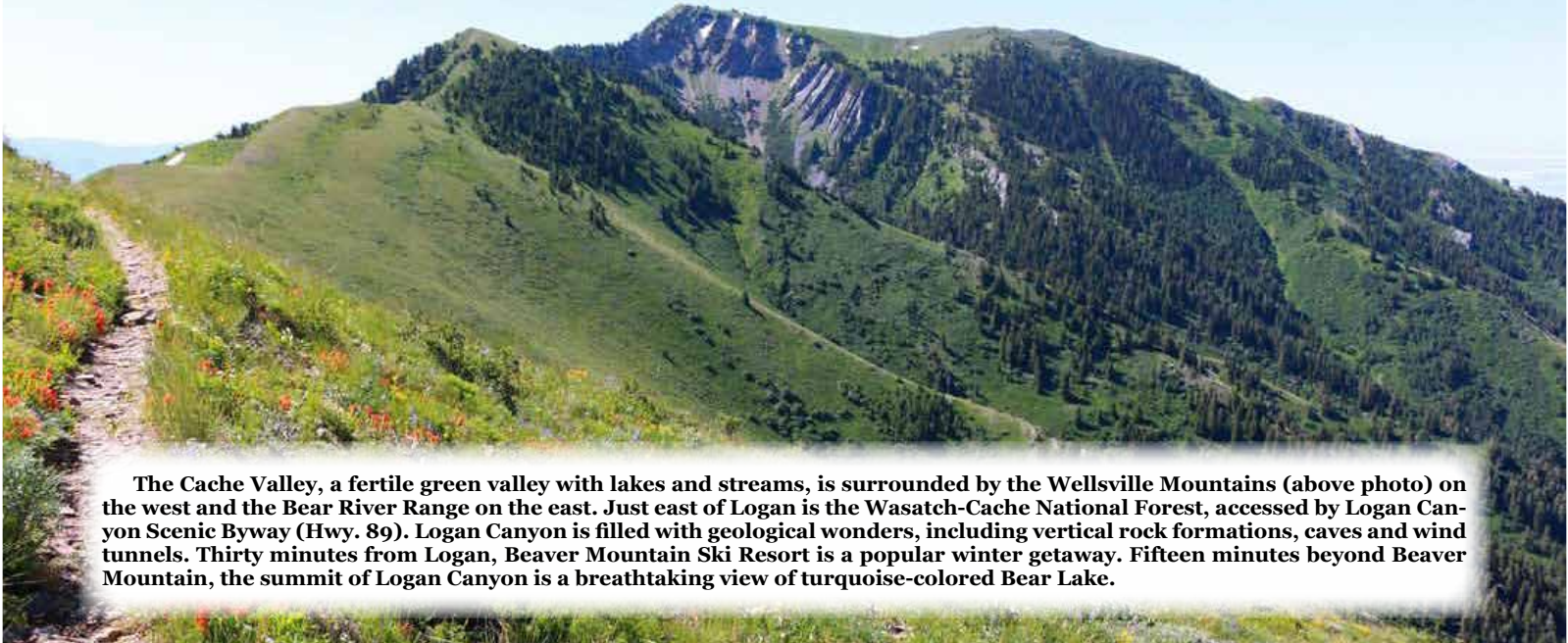

The Cache Valley, a fertile green valley with lakes and streams, is surrounded by the Wellsville Mountains (above photo) on the west and the Bear River Range on the east. Just east of Logan is the Wasatch-Cache National Forest, accessed by Logan Canyon Scenic Byway (Hwy. 89). Logan Canyon is filled with geological wonders, including vertical rock formations, caves and wind tunnels. Thirty minutes from Logan, Beaver Mountain Ski Resort is a popular winter getaway. Fifteen minutes beyond Beaver Mountain, the summit of Logan Canyon is a breathtaking view of turquoise-colored Bear Lake.

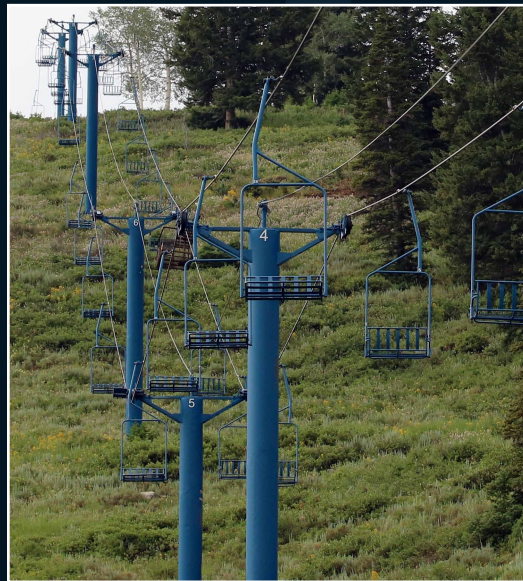
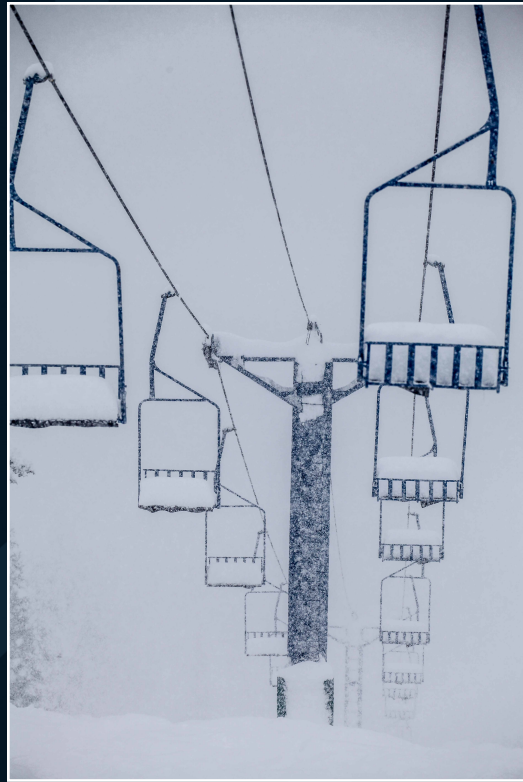

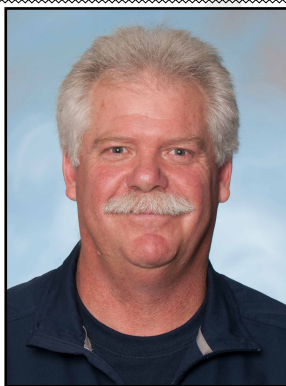

GREGG GENSEL

HEAD CROSS COUNTRY/ TRACK & FIELD COACH

Gregg Gensel is in his 36th year of coaching track & field and cross country at Utah State. He is in his 30th season as head coach of the men's program and his 25th year at the helm of the women's team.

Prior to being named head coach in 1988, the 61-year-old Gensel was an assistant coach for five years and a graduate assistant coach for one year. As an assistant, he worked with all field events and with the sprinters. Currently, Gensel works specifically with cross country, track distance runners and high jumpers, along with his head coaching responsibilities.

During his illustrious tenure at Utah State, Gensel has coached the Aggies to 36 conference championships in both men's and women's cross country and track & field, including the women sweeping the 2012 Indoor and Outdoor WAC

Track & Field Championships, as well as the Aggie men winning the 2011 WAC Cross Country Championships. It also includes the USU men winning the triple crown of the WAC Cross Country, Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Championships during the 2009-10 season. The Aggie women have won four cross country and track & field titles since 2005, while the men have won 13 cross country and track & field titles over that same

period of time.

Gensel has coached 278 individual conference champions and 32 different student-athletes that have garnered 66 All-American accolades. During the 2016-17 campaign alone, Gensel had five student-athletes earn All-America honors, beginning with Dillon Maggard, who earned the school's third cross country All-America citation – the second on the men's side – as he placed 12th with a time of 30:03.9 in the men's 10-kilometer race at the NCAA Cross Country National Championships.

Maggard then went on to garner second-team All-America honors by placing 13th in the mile with a school-record time of 4:01.25 at the NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships. The native of Kirkland, Wash., now has four All-America honors, the most by any current Aggie.

During the 2017 outdoor season, four more Aggies earned various All-America accolades, highlighted by Sindri Gudmundsson. The native of Kopavogur, Iceland, earned first-team All-America honors after placing sixth in the finals of the men's javelin with a mark of 73.28 meters (240-5) at NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Finals at historic Hayward Field in Eugene, Ore. He became the first Aggie javelin thrower to earn All-America honors in 28 years (John Kelly in 1989, who was also Gensel's first All-American).

By finishing sixth, Gudmundsson scored three points for the men's team, helping the Aggies finish tied for 65th overall. Gudmundsson advanced to his first-ever Outdoor Finals by placing first in the javelin with a mark of 76.18m (249-11) at the NCAA West Preliminary Championships on May 25 in Austin, Texas.

Earning second-team All-America accolades at the NCAA Outdoor Finals included AJ Bouly in the 400-meter hurdles and Clay Lambourne in the 800-meter run, while Brenn Flint garnered honorable mention All-America recognition in the shot put.

Utah State placed fourth on the men's side and sixth on the women's side at the 2016 Mountain West Cross Country Championships. During the MW Indoor and Outdoor Track & Field Championships, the Aggie men finished third both times, while the women placed ninth and eighth, respectively.

The men's and women's cross country programs were honored by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) All-Academic honors for their performance in the classroom during the 2016 season. USU men's team (3.31) and women's team (3.67) were recognized for notching a cumulative GPA of at least 3.00 or higher.

Individually, distance runner Kashley Carter earned USTFCCCA accolades

for maintaining a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 and finishing in the top-25 (or 10 percent) at regionals, where she placed 15th with a six-kilometer time of 20:28.50 at the 2016 Mountain Region Championships in Logan, Utah.

For the third consecutive year, javelin thrower Devin Wright was tabbed to the CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII Men's Track & Field/Cross Country Team, while Carter garnered her first academic all-district accolade. Wright then went on to earn CoSIDA Academic All-America second-team honors.

Gensel has been named the Conference Coach of the Year 36 times during his career, including five citations during the 2011-12 season alone.

A native of Long Beach, Calif., Gensel attended Utah State and was a middle-distance runner for the Aggies, finishing sixth in the 1,500 meters at the Pacific Coast Athletic Association Championships in 1981 (now the Big West Conference). In addition to competing for USU's track and field team, Gensel was a member of the Aggie cross country squad.

Artie Gulden, a former distance runner at Bucknell University, is in his third year as an assistant head cross country and track & field coach at Utah State. His main responsibility with the Aggies is working with the distance runners.

In 2016, Gulden coached Dillon Maggard, who earned the school's third cross country All-America honor – the second on the men's side – as he placed 12th with a time of 30:03.9 in the men's 10-kilometer race at the NCAA Cross Country National Championships.

Maggard qualified for nationals by placing eighth with a time of 31:02.20 at the NCAA Mountain Regional Championships, where he helped the Aggie men finish eighth (out of 17) in the team standings with 230 points. The native of Kirkland, Wash., also earned first-team all-conference accolades after placing fourth with a time of 24:08.10 at the Mountain West Cross Country Championships. He led the men to a fourth-place team finish with 131 points.

Under Gulden's tutelage, two other Aggies were recognized for their performances at the MW Cross Country Championships. Kashley Carter earned second-team all-conference accolades for the second consecutive year as she placed eighth with a time of 20:45.20, while Luke Beattie was named the MW Men's Freshman of the Year after placing 35th with a time of 24:47.30.

The men's and women's cross country programs were honored by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) All-Academic honors for their performance in the classroom during the 2016 season. USU men's team (3.31) and women's team (3.67) were recognized for notching a cumulative GPA of at least 3.00 or higher.

Individually, Carter earned USTFCCCA accolades for maintaining a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 and finishing in the top-25 (or 10 percent) at regionals, where she placed 15th with a six-kilometer time of 20:28.50 at the 2016 Mountain Region Championships in Logan, Utah.

Before joining Utah State's program, Gulden spent two seasons at Idaho State, where he worked with the Bengals' distance runners.

While at Idaho State, Gulden coached Kylie Hutchison, who earned all-Big Sky Conference and all-Mountain Region honors in 2015. He also coached Kylie's younger sister, Presli, who qualified for the USATF Junior Championships in the 5,000 meters.

Prior to joining the staff at Idaho State, Gulden coached at Highland High School in Pocatello, Idaho, during the 2012-13 season. He also coached at the Montgomery Academy in Montgomery, Ala., during the 2005-06 and 2006-07 seasons.

Gulden is the son of legendary Bucknell cross country and track & field head coach Art Gulden, who coached the Bison for 31 years. Bucknell captured 68 conference titles under Art Gulden.

Gulden earned his bachelor's degree from Bucknell in 2003. He then went on to earn a master's degree in urban and historical geography from Wisconsin (2005), and a second master's degree in business administration from BYU (2008).

Gulden, who is originally from Lewisburg, Pa., served a two-year LDS Church Mission to Utah, where he served three months on the campus of Utah State in 1999. He and his wife, Andrea, have one son, AJ (13), and two daughters, Allie (11) and Anna (8).

Montana State, 1980 • First Year

Noelle E. Cockett was appointed as Utah State University's 16th President in October 2016, beginning her official tenure in January 2017. She is USU's first female president and the only female president with Utah's higher education system.

Since becoming president, Cockett has worked to improve the mission and vision of the university. The dedicated and award-winning faculty at USU are scholar-educators who have shared a commitment to teaching excellence and rigorous research to help students succeed. In March 2017, Jake Christensen and Thomas Hill were named 2017 Goldwater Scholars, and fellow undergraduate A. J. Walters, received an honorable mention, in the prestigious national competition that recognizes outstanding achievements in science and mathematics. Cockett has also been working to improve the facilities students enjoy as part of their education. In April, she was proud to be a part of the ground-breaking for the new Life Sciences building on the Logan campus that will benefit students in more than 30 majors taking foundational biology classroom and lab courses housed in the new facility.

As always, friends, alumni and donors of the university contribute to the livelihood of USU. In early May 2017, the university announced a major expansion of the highly selective Huntsman Scholar Program and the launch of the Center of Growth and Opportunity thanks to a joint \$50 million gift to the Jon M. Huntsman School of Business from the Huntsman Foundation and the Charles Koch Foundation. The joint gift is the largest in the school's history and enables the university to continue fostering innovative research and teaching to improve lives and communities.

Prior to being named Utah State's President, Cockett was serving as Executive Vice President and Provost at USU and has held that position since 2013. Prior to that, she served USU as Vice President for Extension from 2006 to 2013; Dean of the College of Agriculture and Applied Sciences from 2002 to 2013; and Director of the Utah Agriculture Experiment Station from 2009 to 2013.

Cockett has built a distinguished career in sheep genomics research, maintaining an active research program even while serving in various leadership positions at Utah State University. Her research program has centered on the identification of genetic markers associated with economically important traits in sheep, as well as the development of resources that advance research on the sheep genome. Cockett and her colleagues published an article describing the sheep genome sequence in *Science* in 2014. Her current project focuses on the identification of genetic regions associated with entropion in newborn lambs. Cockett has served as the United States coordinator for sheep genome mapping since 1993 and is an active member of the International Sheep Genomics Consortium.

As an active researcher, Cockett has received many awards and accolades throughout her career including a Young Scientist Award from the Western Section of the American Society of Animal Science (ASAS), the Utah Governor's Medal for Science and Technology (2004 and 2015) and one of USU's top honors, the D. Wynne Thorne Research Award.

After receiving her master's and doctorate in animal breeding and genetics from Oregon State University in 1983 and 1985, respectively, Cockett spent

five years as a research geneticist at the United States Department of Agriculture, Agriculture Research Service U.S. Meat Animal Research Center in Clay Center, Nebraska. She joined Utah State University in 1990 as a researcher and assistant professor in the Department of Animal, Dairy and Veterinary Sciences in the College of Agriculture and Applied Sciences.

Cockett, who earned her bachelor's degree from Montana State in animal science in 1980, grew up on a beef cattle ranch in eastern Montana and is married to John Cockett, Director of Technology in USU's Emma Eccles Jones College of Education and Human Services. Noelle and John have two children, Dylan and Chantelle.

JOHN HARTWELL

VICE PRESIDENT/ATHLETICS DIRECTOR
Citadel, 1987 • Third Year

Since being named Vice President and Director of Athletics at Utah State on June 2, 2015, John Hartwell has cast his vision for Aggie Athletics, which embodies maximum effort academically, athletically and socially to ensure success in both the classroom and on the fields of competition.

Hartwell has also focused on maximizing and increasing the department's revenue streams, along with planning for future facility renovations, which includes Maverik Stadium and the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum.

In his brief time at Utah State, Hartwell has already rebranded the fundraising arm of Utah State Athletics with the creation of Aggies Unlimited, which puts all giving under one umbrella.

Utah State also entered into a new partnership with the Larry H. Miller Sports & Entertainment Group to be its flagship radio station for Aggie Athletics, which gives USU additional advertising opportunities throughout Cache Valley and the Wasatch Front, in addition to more control over each broadcast.

Additionally, Hartwell has overseen the completion of the \$36 million, 85,000-square foot West Stadium Center on the west side of Maverik Stadium, which includes 24 luxury suites, 20 loge boxes, over 700 covered club seats and a premium club area that is also used to host a student-athlete training table. Renovations also included new video boards on both the north and south ends of the stadium, along with a new public address system, while major concourse work significantly increased restrooms and upgraded concessions.

Under Hartwell's leadership, Utah State has seen unparalleled athletic success during the past two academic years, highlighted by its men's tennis program winning the school's first Mountain West regular season and tournament championships since joining the Conference in 2013. In fact, men's tennis has won back-to-back regular season championships the past two years, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament as a team in 2017 for the first time in program history as it finished the season with a school-record 23 wins and a final national ranking of No. 45.

Aggie softball has also seen increased success over the past two seasons as they finished the 2017 campaign with a 33-18 record, including a 14-9 Mountain West mark, and advanced to the National Softball Invitational, marking the program's first postseason appearance since 1993. In fact, those 33 overall wins and 14 league victories are its most since 1996, as USU finished the 2017 season tied for third place in the league.

Other Utah State sports that have excelled the past two seasons in the Mountain West include its men's track & field programs, as they finished second at both the indoor and outdoor conference championships in 2016, and third at both championships during the 2017 academic year. Additionally, USU's football program played in a school-record fifth-straight bowl game in 2016.

Even more impressive is Utah State's continued successes by its student-

athletes in the classroom as they have an 89 percent graduation success rate, which is the highest in the Mountain West, and a cumulative 3.196 grade-point average. During the 2016-17 academic year, USU had 148 student-athletes earn academic all-Mountain West honors, while 106 were named Mountain West Scholar-Athletes. Additionally, USU recognized 195 student-athletes at its annual Joe E. and Elma Whitesides Luncheon for earning a 3.2 or better GPA.

Hartwell came to Utah State after spending three years as the Athletics Director at Troy, where he laid the groundwork for the future of Trojan Athletics by spearheading several significant upgrades to its athletic facilities, including the addition of a new \$2 million practice facility for the golf teams, a \$3 million renovation and expansion of the softball facility and a \$2.1 million improvement to Veterans Memorial Stadium, while also securing funding for lights to be installed at the soccer and track complex. Hartwell also unveiled the North End Zone Project for Veterans Memorial Stadium, a \$25 million project that will be the new home for Trojan football.

Troy's athletics programs have also seen vast improvement on the fields of play due to Hartwell's leadership and oversight, including the football program that recorded its first 10-win season since joining the FBS and tied for the largest turnaround in the FBS in 2016, not to mention the Trojans being the first Sun Belt Conference team to ever appear in either the Associated Press or Coaches Poll. Men's basketball won the 2017 Sun Belt Conference Tournament and advanced to its first NCAA Tournament since 2003, while the women's basketball program has won back-to-back Sun Belt Tournament championships and appeared in two-straight NCAA Tournaments. Troy's golf programs have also excelled as the women's program has won three of the past four Sun Belt titles, while men's golf has advanced to three-straight NCAA Regionals. Troy's baseball team finished third in the Sun Belt in 2016 and defeated three ranked teams, including No. 5 Auburn.

Under Hartwell, Troy Athletics saw a significant enhancement in fundraising and external relations as he completely overhauled Troy's External Affairs division of the Athletics Department to increase revenues and enhance the fan and game day experience. As part of this makeover was the creation of a new external model, which included the addition of a Senior Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs; bringing corporate

sponsorships in house with a partnership with Rockbridge Sports Group; and the development of the Troy Affinity Program to further engage Troy students in athletics.

Hartwell's strong business background also proved to be valuable at Troy as he negotiated a new footwear and apparel deal with Adidas, while also securing home-and-home football games with Duke and North Carolina State in addition to yielding a home basketball game with Mississippi. Hartwell's tenure at Troy also saw a record number of student-athletes earn a 3.0 grade-point-average, an upward trend in APR scores and additional staff positions in Troy's academic support department. During the 2014-15 academic year, Troy student-athletes finished with a 3.01 cumulative grade-point-average and over 57 percent of Troy's student-athletes had a 3.0 GPA or higher.

At Troy, Hartwell served on the NCAA Division I Basketball Issues Committee, the Division I-A Board of Trustees Executive Committee, and the NCAA Division I Council as the Sun Belt Conference representative. He has also been an instructor at the Division I-A Institute for aspiring athletic directors.

Prior to being the Director of Athletics at Troy, Hartwell spent nine-plus years at the University of Mississippi, where he was the Senior Executive Associate Athletics Director, serving as the number two administrator in athletics.

Hartwell served as the Treasurer and Chief Operating Officer of the Mississippi Athletic Association Foundation, a 501 (c)(3) organization that generated over \$17 million annually for the Ole Miss Athletics Department through priority seating and major gifts.

He was responsible for the day-to-day administrative oversight of the football, men's basketball and baseball programs, along with sport oversight of the softball and men's and women's track & field and cross country programs. Hartwell also oversaw the Rebels' business office, ticket office, equipment room, merchandise sales, concessions and football scheduling. Hartwell scheduled several marquee football games for the Rebels, including a home-and-home series with Texas that began in 2012.

Hartwell managed the growth of the Ole Miss athletic budget from \$26 million in the 2003 fiscal year to over \$47 million in the 2012 fiscal year. He also chaired the search to hire men's basketball head coach Andy Kennedy in 2006. He was heavily involved in negotiations that increased revenues with contracts for apparel and footwear (Nike), merchandise sales (Sports Avenue/LIDS), concessions (Centerplate), wireless provider (C Spire) and video boards (Daktronics). He served on the Southeastern Conference Ticket Committee and started the annual SEC Chief Financial Officers Forum.

A 1987 graduate of The Citadel, the 52-year old Hartwell spent four-plus years as a certified public accountant with Ernst & Young before returning to his alma mater to serve as the Director of Internal Audit in 1991. From 1994 to 1997, he was in private business as the Chief Financial Officer for a \$36 million beverage distributor on the South Carolina coast.

Hartwell's direct experience in athletics administration began as the Assistant Athletics Director for Business at Georgia State in 1997. He was

promoted to Associate Athletics Director for Internal Affairs in 1999, and his responsibilities expanded to include sport supervision for baseball, men's and women's golf, men's and women's track & field and cross country. He also had oversight over the Panthers' athletic facilities and game management in addition to his previous responsibilities of all financial aspects of the department. While at Georgia State, Hartwell earned a master's degree in sports administration.

Athletics has always been a big part of Hartwell's life, starting in high school where he was an all-state basketball selection at UMS-Wright in Mobile, Ala. The 6-foot-7 forward played alongside former North Carolina State and Alabama head coach Mark Gottfried in high school. Hartwell went on to play collegiately at The Citadel, where he was a three-year starter, a four-year letterman and captain of the team as a senior in 1987.

Hartwell is married to Dr. Heather Seale Hartwell, and they have two daughters, Lauren (8) and Madison (5). Hartwell also has a 25-year old son, Hunter, a Vanderbilt graduate who works for Deloitte Consulting.

Coleman Barnes is in his first year with Utah State Athletics as Assistant Vice President and Deputy Director of Athletics for External Affairs. Barnes will lead USU's athletic development staff, including the Big Blue Scholarship Fund and Aggies Unlimited. He will also oversee USU athletics' external departments, which include marketing and promotions, media relations, ticket sales and Aggie Sports Properties.

Barnes comes to Utah State after spending the past four years at Miami University, where he served as the Associate Athletics Director/Senior Director of Development for three-and-a-half years, before being promoted to Executive Associate Athletics Director/Senior Director of Development this past January.

During his time at Miami, Barnes served as a co-manager for the Graduating Champions Campaign, raising more than \$65 million toward the \$80 million goal. In 2015, Barnes' team raised a then-record \$28.3 million in gifts and pledges, including \$5.02 million in cash.

Barnes has also boosted Miami's Red & White Club membership to over 2,000 members, a 27-percent increase since his arrival in 2013 and has increased revenue by 24 percent, up to \$880,000 per year.

Prior to Miami, Barnes spent two years at the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB), as the Associate Athletics Director for Development. Barnes oversaw Blazer Boosters, the fundraising unit for UAB Athletics, increasing the annual fund membership by 54 percent through a 16-month initiative.

Prior to UAB, Barnes served as the Executive Director of The Bulldog Foundation and Associate Athletics Director for Development at Fresno State from 2008-11. As an executive administrator, Barnes oversaw all components of the development office that raised approximately \$6 million annually. He also managed a development team that successfully secured funding for a \$6 million sports medicine center and a \$1.2 million turf project.

From 2005-08, Barnes served as the Assistant Director for the UMAA Foundation, the fundraising unit for Ole Miss Athletics, playing an integral role in raising nearly \$13 million annually.

Prior to Ole Miss, Barnes was a Development Associate for the Hurricane Club at the University of Miami (2004-05) and an intern in the Harvard University Athletics Ticket Office (2003-04).

Barnes graduated with a bachelor of arts degree in education from the University of Kentucky in 2002 with a major in kinesiology and a minor in business. He was also a three-year letterwinner as the long snapper on the Wildcats' football team. In 2004, Barnes earned a master's of science degree in kinesiology with an emphasis in sport management from Kentucky. He will complete his Ph.D. in higher education from Ole Miss in August.

A native of Bardstown, Ky., Barnes is married to the former Mary Beth Justice and the couple has two children, Caroline (6) and William (5).

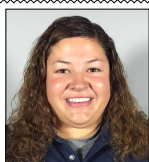
Doggett graduated with a degree in speech communication from San Diego State. She was raised in Nezperce, Idaho before moving to Visalia, Calif., for junior high and high school.
