MANNY MARTINS

HEAD COACH

CAL POLY POMONA, 2006 • SECOND SEASON



Utah State University Vice President and Director of Athletics John Hartwell announced Manny Martins as the head soccer coach at USU on May 24, 2021, becoming the fourth head coach in the program's history. Martins is the just the second minority head coach in USU history and the first since Marlon Sano led the volleyball program during the 1992

and 1993 seasons.

In his first season in Logan, Martins led the Aggies to their most victories during the Mountain West era as Utah State opened the 2021 season with a 7-1-1 mark in non-conference play, the best record heading into conference play in school history. The non-conference slate included a 2-1 overtime victory at No. 18 BYU, the first win over a ranked opponent in USU history and the only loss for the Cougars at home in 2021. Under Martins, Utah State scored 30 goals, the most since the 2016 season as the Aggies set a school record with 34 total assists. Three members of the Utah State roster earned postseason conference honors as senior midfielder Ashley Cardozo was named first-team all-MW, junior keeper Diera Walton was named second-team all-MW and redshirt freshman defender Addy Symonds was named to the all-newcomer team.

In addition to league honors, Cardozo and sophomore defender Kelsey Kaufusi were named to the MW All-Tournament Team as the Aggies qualified for the tournament for the first time since 2016. The duo of Cardozo and Kaufusi were also recognized by the United Soccer Coaches with first- and third-team all-Pacific Region honors, respectively. Upon graduation, Cardozo signed a professional contract with FC Nantes in France.

Martins joined the Aggies after seven years as a member of the University of Oregon's coaching staff and brings 22 years of soccer coaching experience within the college ranks, as well as time with the United States' women's national team.

With the Ducks, Martins helped put together the highest-rated recruiting class in Oregon history in 2019, leading to one of the most successful seasons in UO history during the 2020 campaign. The class ranked No. 17 in the nation that year as freshman Ally Cook finished third in goals scored in 2019 before leading the team in goals scored a season ago. Martins also mentored a defense that set the Oregon goals-against-average as UO keeper Abby Steele broke the all-time career shutout record.

The Ducks were ranked as high as No. 14 in the country during Martins' tenure and individual players went on to find success in the professional ranks. Jazmin Jackmon became the first Duck to be selected in the NWSL draft, going in the third round to the Houston Dash. Marissa Everett became the first UO alum to score in an NWSL game when she found the net while playing for the Portland Thorns. And, Marlo Sweatman became the first Duck to appear in the FIFA World Cup after she helped Jamaica qualify for the world tournament for the first time in that country's history.

Martins has been associated with the U.S. women's national team since 2013 and was an analyst and opposition scout during the women's 2019 FIFA World Cup Championship run. Martins was also a member of the women's national team staff during the 2018 U20 World Cup and the 2016

U17 World Cup. In 2018, the women advanced to the finals of the CONCACAF Championships, while capturing the CONCACAF Championship in 2016.

Prior to his current position at Oregon, Martins was a member of the UCLA women's soccer staff from 2011-13, helping the Bruins gather the top recruiting class in 2013. UCLA also had the No. 3 recruiting class in 2012. The Bruins enjoyed a wealth of success during Martins' tenure, capturing 15 or more victories each year and losing only one match at home over the course of the two years. With the Bruins, Martins coached a pair of No. 1 draft picks in women's professional soccer: Sydney Leroux (2012/Atlanta Beat/WPS) and Zakiya Bywaters (2013/Chicago Red Stars/NWSL). Martins also coached four NSCAA All-Americans during his stay in Los Angeles.


Martins was instrumental in developing various clubs in the Los Angeles area, serving as the director of coaching and player development for Los Angeles Premier FC, a member of the WPSL, and the Los Angeles Rampage. Martins served as head coach of both teams during his time with the clubs and was named the WPSL Coach of the Year in 2010.

Martins' first head coaching position came at Los Angeles Mission College, guiding the Eagles from 2006-11. Martins began his collegiate coaching career at LAMC, serving as an assistant from 2001-04, before spending three years as an assistant at Cal Poly Pomona from 2004-06.

Martins cut his coaching teeth at his alma mater of Sylmar High School, becoming the head coach in 1998 and leading the program to a 101-54-22 record in seven seasons.

Martins was born in Portugal and moved to San Fernando, Calif., in 1993. He played soccer at Sylmar HS and LAMC. Martins earned a degree in kinesiology at Cal Poly Pomona in 2006 and holds a USSF A License and an NSCAA Director of Coaching diploma. He is fluent in Portuguese, Spanish, English and Creole. Martins and his wife, Lorena, have three children: Isaiah, Emma and London.





JESSICA EVANSON

ASSISTANT COACH
UTAH VALLEY, 2015 • THIRD SEASON

Jessica Evanson was named an assistant coach in December of 2019 and will enter her third season with the Aggies in 2022.

During the 2021 season, Evanson was part of the staff that saw three players earn Mountain West honors, while Ashley Cardozo and Kelsey Kaufusi were

named to various all-region teams.

In Evanson's first year on staff in 2020, Utah State posted its first winning record since 2017 as the Aggies posted a 5-4-1 mark during the COVID-shortened season. Evanson also helped to mentor Kelsey Kaufusi to second-team all-Mountain West honors.

Evanson was most recently the assistant coach for both the men's and women's programs at Salt Lake Community College. Under her watch, the SLCC keepers carried a goals-against-average of 0.73, as the Bruins finished the season with a 12-1-1 overall record and an unbeaten 9-0-1 record in league play. One of her keepers, Siu Pauni led the Bruins with more than 1,000 minutes in goal, playing in 12 games with eight starts and logging a team-best 26 saves. The Bruin attack was also strong under Evanson, as SLCC totaled 72 goals, averaging 5.14 per game and outscoring opponents by more than a 7:1 ratio.

On the men's side, SLCC keepers carried a goals-against-average of 0.92 and totaled five shutouts as the Bruins finished the 2019 season with an overall mark of 14-1-1. The Bruin men wracked up 63 goals during year, outscoring opponents by more than a 5:1 ratio. Individually, sophomore Cassidy Adams earned NJCAA All-American honors on the women's side, while freshman Ryen Jiba and sophomore Isaac Roy earned NJCAA All-American honors on the men's side. Additionally, Jiba was named the Region 18 Player of the Year, while Roy was named the Region 18 Co-Golfer of the Year.

Evanson was a stalwart goalkeeper in her own right, appearing in 58 matches with 28 starts at Utah Valley University from 2011-15. Evanson led the Wolverines with more than 2,000 minutes in goal as a junior, appearing and starting in 22 contests during the year and leading UVU with 81 saves and a goals-against-average of 0.84. In all, Evanson recorded more than 4,682 minutes in goal for the Wolverines in her career, carrying a goals-against-average of 1.08 and totaling 201 career saves.

Evanson was named first-team all-WAC, the WAC Defensive Player of the Year and the WAC Tournament MVP as a junior and was later named as the UVU Female Athlete of the Year as a senior. She was also strong in the classroom, earning a pair of academic all-WAC accolades, and was a leader on the pitch, serving as the team captain.

Evanson returned to UVU following her playing career and cut her coaching teeth as the direction of operations and later as a student manager with the Wolverines. She also worked as the director of goalkeepers with the Utah Arsenal Futbol Club during her time in Utah County.

Evanson graduated with a degree in psychology from Utah Valley in 2015 and returned to UVU to earn her master's in business administration in 2019. Evanson graduated from Sky View High School in 2011, where she was named an all-region goalkeeper for the Bobcats and was also a member of the state championship track & field team and 4x400-meter state championship relay team.



ERIN CARRILLO-BAUTISTA

ASSISTANT COACH
OREGON, 2021 • SECOND SEASON

Erin Carrillo-Bautista was named an assistant coach at Utah State in 2021 and will enter his second season with the Aggies in 2022. Carrillo-Bautista followed USU head coach Manny Martins from Eugene, where the duo served on the same coaching staff at the University of Oregon and at Lane United in the USL League 2.

During the 2021 season, Carrillo-Bautista was part of the staff that saw three players earn Mountain West honors, while Ashley Cardozo and Kelsey Kaufusi were named to various all-region teams.

Carrillo-Bautista was an assistant coach under Martins with Lane United heading into the 2021 season, and helped with all aspects of the team, including training, scouting and day-to-day operations. Carrillo-Bautista

was active at the club level in Eugene and was an assistant coach for the Eugene Timbers club program, coaching various age groups. He cultivated more coaching experience as a volunteer assistant at Bushnell University, an NAIA program in Eugene.

Martins and Carrillo-Bautista first met at the University of Oregon, where Carrillo-Bautista was serving as the team manager for the women's soccer program. There, Carrillo-Bautista was able to take part in team film sessions and gained valuable insights on tactical analysis, as well as oppositional analysis. During his time there he was also able to learn the amount of preparation and attention to detail that goes into building a successful team environment.

As a player, Carrillo-Bautista was brought up through Timbers Academy in Portland, Ore., while also playing club with the Washington Timbers. Carrillo-Bautista was recruited by several Division II and Division III programs before he stepped away from playing to focus on a degree at Oregon, graduating with a dual major in Spanish and sports business.





AMBER MARSHALL

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH UTAH STATE, 2020 • SECOND SEASON

Amber Marshall was elevated to a volunteer assistant coach in 2022 after serving as the director of operations and player development during the 2021 season.

During the 2021 season, Marshall was part of the staff that saw three players earn Mountain West honors, while Ashley

Cardozo and Kelsey Kaufusi were named to various all-region teams.

Marshall appeared and started in 55 matches for Utah State during her career, from 2017-19 leading the Aggies in minutes played during the 2019 season with close to 1,800 minutes on the pitch. In all, Marshall played in all but 15 minutes during the year and was named second-team all-Mountain West. Marshall finished her career with two goals and two assists, spending time as a holding defensive mid and a center back. Marshall was a three-time academic all-Mountain West selection and a three-time MW Scholar Athlete.

Following her career at Utah State, Marshall signed with the Houston Dash of the NWSL.

Imelda Williams joins the Utah State staff in 2022 as the director of soccer operations.


In her new role, Williams will assist with team travel and equipment, along with other duties as assigned by the Utah State coaching staff.

The Aggies won their first Western Athletic Conference Tournament title in 2011. USU opened the tournament with a 1-0 shutout against Idaho, following suit with the same score against host Fresno State in the championship game. Molli Merrill, Natalie Norris, Kendra Pemberton and Jade Tarver were named to the all-tournament team, while Merrill was named tournament MVP. 

Following the inaugural 1996 season for Utah State soccer, freshman Brenna Hansen, a midfielder from Boise, Idaho, tragically died in a plane crash in Idaho during a January snow storm. The following year, Utah State soccer retired the number 8 to honor Brenna's memory. Hansen appeared in 13 of the Aggies' 18 matches during the 1996 season, making one start against Mesa State on Oct. 13.



Built in 2002, Chuck and Gloria Bell Field is the on-campus home field for Aggie soccer. The complex includes a two-level press box, sideline bleacher seating, as well as a grassy hill for seating along the south goal line. A new digital score and videoboard was added prior to the 2016 season. The Wasatch Front mountain range provides a beautiful backdrop for the soccer field, which is located just north of the Stan Laub Indoor Training Center and near Maverik Stadium, the Jim & Carol Laub Athletics Academics Complex and the ICON Sports Performance Center.





Completed in June of 2013, Utah State's \$6.5 million, 26,329-square-foot iFit Sports Performance Center features areas for weight training, cardiovascular workouts and speed and agility training, as well as offices for staff. Built on existing university property at the northwest corner of Maverik Stadium, the state-of-the-art multi-level facility alleviated overcrowding in the previous 5,800-square-foot strength and conditioning center and accommodates almost 400 student-athletes from 16 sports programs. The ICON Sports Performance Center is the largest such facility in the Mountain West and rivals any strength and conditioning complex in the country.





The three-story, 69,000-square-foot Jim and Carol Laub Athletics-Academics Complex is a state-of-the-art multi-purpose facility that meets all of the athletic and academic needs of Utah State's 16 sports programs and nearly 400-plus student-athletes. Within the facility, which was completed in the summer of 2008, is the 11,000-square-foot Dale Mildenerger Sports Medicine Complex and Dr. John Worley Sports Medicine Research Center, the Steve Mothersell Athletics Hall of Honor and the 7,000-square-foot J. Ken "Kenny" Seamons Equipment Room. Also located on the first floor are locker rooms for football, while the second floor features a 120-seat auditorium. The student-athlete academics center is located on the third floor, which includes numerous study hall and tutor areas, a computer lab and the Dr. Randall and Julianne Stockham Student-Athlete Academics Hall of Honor. The third floor also houses coaches' offices and meeting rooms for the track & field and cross country programs as well as the compliance offices.





The Aggie Fueling Station, located on the bottom floor of the ICON Sports Performance Center, was created prior to the start of the 2016-17 school year by representatives from the nutritional program and athletics, who had a goal of working together to provide student-athletes with the food they need to complement the physical demands of training and nutrition. The fueling station is stocked with appetizing food focused on combining convenience and nutrition. Student-athletes can choose from a variety of fresh fruits and vegetables, cheese, milk, chicken, yogurt, beef jerky, peanut butter, trail mixes and much more. Workers at the fueling station prepare fruits and vegetables, measuring out serving sizes, restock the serving area and plan the daily special. In addition to food preparation, volunteers are on site to answer nutrition questions from student-athletes and give presentations about health and wellness to all 16 of Utah State's sports programs.






NOELLE E. COCKETT

University President

Noelle E. Cockett was appointed as Utah State University's 16th president in October 2016, beginning her official tenure in January 2017.

At the time of the announcement, Cockett was serving as executive vice president and provost at USU and had held that position since 2013. Prior to that, she served USU as vice president for Extension from 2006 to 2013; dean of the College of Agriculture and Applied Sciences from 2002 to 2013; and director of the Utah Agriculture Experiment Station from 2009 to 2013.

Since becoming president, Cockett has prioritized diversity and inclusion and led USU in efforts to create the Latinx Cultural Center; develop the annual Inclusive Excellence Symposium; expand staffing, funds, and gathering space for the USU Inclusion Center; create the Center for Intersectional Gender Studies and Research; provide additional space and resources to the Veterans Resource Center; double the staffing of the Office of Equity, and expand the impact of the Aggies Think Care Act Initiative.

She also formed a Diversity and Inclusion Task Force in 2019, whose recommendations included the addition of a cabinet-level leader for diversity and inclusion. USU welcomed its inaugural vice president for diversity, equity, and inclusion in 2022.

Cockett has built a distinguished career in sheep genomics research, maintaining an active research program while serving in leadership positions at USU. Her research program has centered on the identification of genetic markers associated with economically important traits in sheep, as well as the development of resources that advance research on the sheep genome. Cockett has served as the United States coordinator for sheep genome mapping since 1993 and is an active member of the International Sheep Genomics Consortium.

Since June 2020, Cockett has chaired the Gene Editing in Agriculture Task Force, which was convened by the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU) and the American Association of Veterinary Medical Colleges (AAVMC). In 2021, the task force recommended federal regulations around gene-edited animals be updated significantly.

As a researcher, Cockett has received many awards and accolades, including a Young Scientist Award from the Western Section of the American Society of Animal Science (ASAS), the Utah Governor's Medal for Science and Technology (2004 and 2015), and one of USU's top honors, the D. Wynne Thorne Research Award.

JOHN HARTWELL

University Vice President/
Director of Athletics

Since being named Vice President and Director of Athletics at Utah State on June 2, 2015, John Hartwell has cast his vision for Aggie Athletics, which embodies maximum effort academically, athletically and socially to ensure success in both the classroom and on the fields of competition.

Under Hartwell's leadership, Utah State Athletics has seen unparalleled success with seven Mountain West regular season championships, in addition to a Mountain Rim Gymnastics crown, and four more postseason titles, while six coaches have been named its Conference Coach of the Year.

During the 2021-22 academic year, Utah State's sports had a banner season, as its football and volleyball programs both won MW Championships for the first time, while its gymnastics program won its first-ever MRGC title. Furthermore, USU's women's cross country program finished 28th in the nation for its second-best finish ever, its soccer program tied for third in the league, which is its best finish since 2016, and its softball program finished fourth in the conference for its best placing since 2017. Ironically, football and soccer had first-year head coaches and volleyball had a second-year head coach in 2021, all three of which are Hartwell hires.

In 2021, Utah State football had its best season ever under first-year head coach Blake Anderson, who was named the AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year, as it tied the school record for victories with 11, posted its first win against a top-25 opponent in six seasons with its 46-13 victory at No. 19 San Diego State in the MW Championship Game, and recorded its first-ever bowl win against a Power 5 opponent with its 24-13 victory against Oregon State in the Jimmy Kimmel LA Bowl. USU, which had a pair of Power 5 wins in the same season for the first time ever, finished the year ranked 24th in the nation, marking just the fifth time in program history that it has concluded a season nationally ranked.

Volleyball finished the 2021 season with a 22-9 record for its most wins since 2010 as it won its first conference championship since 2012, as Rob Neilson was named the MW Coach of the Year. USU's women's cross country program competed in the NCAA Championships for just the second time ever and for the first time since 2017, as both appearances have been under Hartwell. Soccer finished with a 13-6-3 record for its most wins since 2012 as it advanced to the semifinals of the MW Tournament for just the third time ever. And, gymnastics won its first conference title since 2005 as it posted a 15-11 record for its most wins since 1999, as it finished the season ranked 23rd in the nation.

Utah State's men's basketball program has also had plenty of success under Hartwell's guidance, as it won consecutive MW Tournament titles in 2019 and 2020, and qualified for the NCAA Tournament three-straight years (2019-21), along with advancing to the National Invitation Tournament this past season under first-year head coach Ryan Odom.

All of Utah State's recent success has been noticed nationally, as well, as Stadium Network listed Hartwell as the 18th-best Athletics Director in the nation, including the fourth-best non-Power 5 AD, in June of 2020.

Hartwell has focused his time on maximizing and increasing the department's revenue streams, along with planning for future facility renovations to both Maverik Stadium and the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum.

In his time at Utah State, Hartwell has rebranded the fundraising arm of the athletics department with the creation of Aggies Unlimited, which puts all giving under one umbrella.

Utah State also entered into a partnership with the Larry H. Miller Sports & Entertainment Group to be its flagship radio station for Aggie Athletics, which gives USU additional advertising opportunities throughout Cache Valley and the Wasatch Front, in addition to more control over each broadcast.

Hartwell's strong business background has also proved to be valuable at Utah State as he negotiated a new footwear and apparel deal with Nike in 2020. And most recently, Utah State partnered with Opendorse to help enhance name, image and likeness (NIL) opportunities for its student-athletes.

During his Utah State tenure, Hartwell has overseen the completion of the \$36 million, 85,000-square foot West Stadium Center on the west side of Maverik Stadium, which includes 24 luxury suites, 20 loge boxes, over 700 covered club seats and a premium club area that is also used to host a student-athlete training table. Renovations also included new video boards on both the north and south ends of the stadium, along with a new public address system, while major concourse work significantly increased restrooms and upgraded concessions.

Utah State is also securing funding for a new 110,000-square-foot, \$30 million indoor practice facility, which will also house USU's new golf training facility, along with locker rooms and office space for its soccer program.

Even more impressive is Utah State's continued successes by its student-athletes in the classroom as they have a 93 percent graduation success rate, which is the highest in the Mountain West, and a cumulative 3.37 grade-point average, the highest in the history of USU Athletics. During the 2021-22 academic year, 72 percent of USU's student-athletes posted a 3.0 or higher grade point average, while 241 student-athletes were honored at its annual Whitesides Luncheon for achieving a cumulative 3.2 grade point average or a 3.2 GPA during the last two semesters. Furthermore, 201 student-athletes earned academic all-MW honors, while 192 were named MW Scholar-Athletes.

During the COVID-19 shortened 2020-21 academic year, Utah State's men's basketball team received the program's third-ever at-large berth to the NCAA Tournament after finishing second in the MW during the regular season and advancing to the championship game of its conference tournament for the third-straight year. Furthermore, USU's men's cross country team advanced to the NCAA Championships for the third time in four seasons, its first three appearances in school history, and finished 11th nationally for its best-ever national finish. And, its gymnastics program qualified for NCAA Regionals for the first time since 2017 as it tied for third and finished the year ranked 22nd in the nation.

In 2019-20, Utah State men's basketball won its second-straight MW Tournament title, while men's cross country won its first-ever MW Championship, followed by a 16th-place finish at the NCAA National Championships. Furthermore, Aggie football played in its eighth bowl game since 2011 and Aggie gymnastics notched its first winning season since 1999, which included a pair of victories against top-20 opponents, as it finished the year ranked 29th in the nation. In all, the 2019-20 academic year marked just the fourth time in school history that football advanced to a bowl game and men's basketball qualified for the NCAA Tournament, including the first time in back-to-back years. Additionally, men's cross country coach Artie Gulden and gymnastics coach Amy Smith were named their conference's Coach of the Year, both of which are Hartwell hires.

The 2018-19 Utah State academic year saw both its football and men's basketball teams nationally ranked as USU was one of just five institutions to have both programs ranked in the final Associated Press polls. Collectively, USU produced a combined 39-9 record between football (11-2) and men's basketball (28-7), which is a single-season school record. That 39-9 mark was also tied for the fourth-best winning percentage and seventh-most wins nationally, as football tied the school record for wins with its 11-2 record, while men's basketball went 28-7 to tie for the third-most victories in program history.

Furthermore, first-year head coach Craig Smith, who Hartwell hired, led Utah State's men's basketball program to its first-ever MW regular-season title and tournament championship after entering the season picked ninth in the preseason polls. Additionally, the football program was picked to finish fourth in the Mountain Division of the Mountain West, but posted a 7-1 league mark to tie for first in the division. At season's end, both program's head coaches were named MW Coaches of the Year.

Not to be outdone, the 2017-18 academic year was arguably the best in school history under Hartwell as Aggie Athletics ranked 78th nationally in the Learfield Director's Cup Standings, which is by far the best finish for USU in the Cup's 25 years,

while its 375-plus student-athletes achieved a then-school-record 3.25 grade-point average.

In 2017-18, Utah State's men's tennis program won its third-straight MW regular-season championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in as many years. In fact, men's tennis won the school's first MW regular season (2016) and tournament championships (2017) since joining the conference in 2013, and finished the 2017 campaign with a school-record 23 wins and a final national ranking of No. 45.

Additionally, Utah State's track & field/cross country teams had their best seasons in school history in 2017-18, highlighted by the men's programs finishing the year ranked 10th nationally by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association. During the 2017-18 seasons, the Aggie men placed 27th in their first-ever appearance in the NCAA Cross Country Championships, followed by a 28th-place finish at the NCAA Indoor Championships and an 18th-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships, as its student-athletes combined to garner 12 All-America honors. On the women's side, USU's cross country program finished 14th in its first-ever appearance at the NCAA Championships, while its student-athletes combined to garner three All-America honors.

Aggie football also excelled during the 2017-18 academic year, playing in its sixth bowl game in the past seven seasons.

Utah State's softball program finished the 2017 campaign with a 33-18 record, including a 14-9 MW mark, and advanced to the National Softball Invitational, marking the program's first postseason appearance since 1993. In fact, those 33 overall wins and 14 league victories were its most since 1996, as USU finished the 2017 season tied for third place in the league.

Hartwell came to Utah State after spending three years as the Athletics Director at Troy, where he laid the groundwork for the future of Trojan Athletics by spearheading several significant upgrades to its athletic facilities, including the addition of a new \$2 million practice facility for the golf teams, a \$3 million renovation and expansion of the softball facility and a \$2.1 million improvement to Veterans Memorial Stadium, while also securing funding for lights to be installed at the soccer and track complex. Hartwell also unveiled the North End Zone Project for Veterans Memorial Stadium, a \$25 million project that is now the home for Trojan football.

Troy's athletics programs also saw vast improvement on the fields of play due to Hartwell's leadership and oversight, including the football program posting a 31-8 record during its last three seasons under Neal Brown, who Hartwell hired, not to mention the Trojans being the first Sun Belt Conference team to ever appear in either The Associated Press or Coaches Poll. Men's basketball won the 2017 Sun Belt Conference Tournament and advanced to its first NCAA Tournament since 2003, while the women's basketball program won back-to-back Sun Belt Tournament championships and appeared in two-straight NCAA Tournaments in 2017 and 2018. Troy's golf programs also excelled as the women's program won three of the past five Sun Belt titles while Hartwell was there, while men's golf advanced to three-straight NCAA Regionals from 2016-18. Another Hartwell hire, Mark Smartt, led Troy baseball to a 42-win season and an at-large NCAA bid in 2018.

Under Hartwell, Troy Athletics saw a significant enhancement in fundraising and external relations as he completely overhauled Troy's External Affairs division of the Athletics Department to increase revenues and enhance the fan and game day experience. Part of the makeover was the creation of a new external model, which included the addition of a Senior Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs; bringing corporate sponsorships in house with a partnership with Rockbridge Sports Group; and the development of the Troy Affinity Program to further engage Troy students in athletics.

Hartwell's tenure at Troy also saw a record number of student-athletes earn a 3.0 grade-point-average, an upward trend in APR scores and additional staff positions in Troy's academic support department. During the 2014-15 academic year, Troy student-athletes finished with a 3.01 cumulative grade-point-average and over 57 percent of Troy's student-athletes had a 3.0 GPA or higher.

At Troy, Hartwell served on the NCAA Division I Basketball Issues Committee, the Division I-A Board of Trustees Executive Committee, and the NCAA Division I Council as the Sun Belt Conference representative. He has also been an instructor at the Division I-A Institute for aspiring athletic directors.

Prior to being the Director of Athletics at Troy, Hartwell spent nine-plus years at the University of Mississippi, where he was the Senior Executive Associate Athletics Director, serving as the number two administrator in athletics.

Hartwell served as the Treasurer and Chief Operating Officer of the Mississippi Athletic Association Foundation, a 501 (c)(3) organization that generated over \$17 million annually for the Ole Miss Athletics Department through priority seating and major gifts.

He was responsible for the day-to-day administrative oversight of the football, men's basketball and baseball programs, along with sport oversight of the softball and men's and women's track & field and cross country programs. Hartwell also

oversaw the Rebels' business office, ticket office, equipment room, merchandise sales, concessions and football scheduling. Hartwell scheduled several marquee football games for the Rebels, including a home-and-home series with Texas that began in 2012.

Hartwell managed the growth of the Ole Miss athletic budget from \$26 million in the 2003 fiscal year to over \$47 million in the 2012 fiscal year. He also chaired the search to hire men's basketball head coach Andy Kennedy in 2006. He was heavily involved in negotiations that increased revenues with contracts for apparel and footwear (Nike), merchandise sales (Sports Avenue/LIDS), concessions (Centerplate), wireless provider (C Spire) and video boards (Daktronics). He served on the Southeastern Conference Ticket Committee and started the annual SEC Chief Financial Officers Forum.

A 1987 graduate of The Citadel, the 57-year old Hartwell spent four-plus years as a certified public accountant with Ernst & Young before returning to his alma mater to serve as the Director of Internal Audit in 1991. From 1994 to 1997, he was in private business as the Chief Financial Officer for a \$36 million beverage distributor on the South Carolina coast.

Hartwell's direct experience in athletics administration began as the Assistant Athletics Director for Business at Georgia State in 1997. He was promoted to Associate Athletics Director for Internal Affairs in 1999, and his responsibilities expanded to include sport supervision for baseball, men's and women's golf, men's and women's track & field and cross country. He also had oversight over the Panthers' athletic facilities and game management in addition to his previous responsibilities of all financial aspects of the department. While at Georgia State, Hartwell earned a master's degree in sports administration.

Athletics has always been a big part of Hartwell's life, starting in high school, where he was an all-state basketball selection at UMS-Wright in Mobile, Alabama. Hartwell went on to play collegiately at The Citadel, where he was a three-year starter, a four-year letterman and a team captain as a senior in 1987.

Hartwell is married to Dr. Heather Seale Hartwell, and they have two daughters, Lauren (13) and Madison (9). Hartwell also has a 30-year old son, Hunter, and daughter-in-law, Caroline.

From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the MW continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship. Now in its 23rd year, the MW has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics.

The Mountain West has marked several achievements during its first 22 years, most notably becoming the first to establish a sports television network dedicated solely to an intercollegiate athletic conference (The Mtn.). The Mountain West also was the first to experiment with the coaches' challenge in the college football instant replay system and was the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS conference to participate in four BCS bowl games, winning three. In the inaugural year of the new College Football Playoff system, Boise State earned the automatic slot into a New Year's Six bowl game as the highest-ranked champion from the Group of Five 5 conferences. The Broncos defeated then 10th-ranked Arizona 38-30 in the VIZIO Fiesta Bowl. In 2011-12, the Mountain West was among the first conferences to implement a league-wide state-of-the-art basketball instant replay system.

Changes in the NCAA governance structure set the table for another Conference first, when two members of the MW Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) were included in the June 2014 meeting of the Mountain West Board of Directors. New Mexico track and field athlete Kendall Spencer, the national chair of the 2014-15 NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, and Air Force Academy volleyball player Emma Dridge joined the BOD members in this historic meeting to advance the discussion on student-athlete involvement in the NCAA and MW governance structure. For the last seven academic years, MW student-athletes have participated in monthly membership calls and have joined MW administrators in the annual Joint Council Spring Meetings in Arizona.



The Mountain West is well-represented within the new NCAA governance structure, including individuals who were appointed to serve on committees tasked with managing the day-to-day business of Division I athletics. Kendall Spencer, the former chair of the DI Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and a UNM track & field athlete, was the first student-athlete in the history of the organization to serve on the Division I Board.

Additionally, the Mountain West was the only conference to have the same member institution with No. 1 overall picks in both the NFL and NBA drafts in the same year (Utah's Alex Smith and Andrew Bogut, respectively in 2005). With UNLV's Anthony Bennett claiming the No. 1 pick in the 2013 NBA Draft, the Mountain West is one of three conferences to have multiple No. 1 NBA draft selections since 2000. Also, with San Diego State's Stephen Strasburg earning the No. 1 pick in the 2009 MLB Draft, the Mountain West is one of three conferences to have the No. 1 selection in each of the NFL, NBA and MLB drafts since the MW was founded in 1999.

The Mountain West is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful terrain and landscapes in the nation can be found within Mountain West boundaries, including the majestic Rocky Mountain range, which borders five MW institutions (Air Force, Boise State, Colorado State, New Mexico and Utah State). The high plains of Wyoming (elevation 7,220 feet – the highest Division I campus in the nation) contrast with the desert cities of Las Vegas and Reno, home to UNLV and Nevada, respectively, while Fresno State, San Diego State and San José State add a West coast influence with their locations in Central, Southern and Northern California. The inclusion of the Hawai'i football program extends the Mountain West footprint to the beautiful islands in the Pacific Ocean, while the addition of the women's soccer program at Colorado College gives the MW an additional presence in the Rocky Mountains.


