2023 COACHING STAFF



MANNY MARTINS

Head Coach • Cal Poly Pomona, 2006

Third Season • Career Record: 21-11-11

Manny Martins was introduced as the head soccer coach at Utah State on May 24, 2021, becoming the fourth head coach in the program's history. Martins is the just the second minority head coach in USU history and the first since Marlon Sano led the volleyball program during the 1992 and 1993 seasons.

In the 2022 season, Utah State advanced to the Mountain West tournament quarterfinals, reaching the conference tournament in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2013-14. The Aggies led the league in total points scored (87), total assists (31), total shots (300), total shots on goal (141) and were tied for first in goals scored (28). USU landed three players on Mountain West all-conference teams as juniors Kelsey Kaufusi and Alex Day plus freshman Kaylie Chambers were all named second-team all-Mountain West. Chambers also earned MW all-newcomer team honors. Utah State had six players receive academic all-district honors from the association of College Sports Communicators (formerly CoSIDA). Sophomores Bizzy Arevalo, Addy Symonds and Tenzi Knowles, juniors Kelsey Kaufusi and Kaylie Olsen, and senior Sara Taylor all were awarded the honor.

In his first season in Logan, Martins led the Aggies to their most victories during the Mountain West era as Utah State opened the 2021 season with a 7-1-1 mark in non-conference play, the best record heading into conference play in school history. The non-conference slate included a 2-1 overtime victory at No. 18 BYU, the first win over a ranked opponent in USU history and the only loss for the Cougars at home in 2021. Under Martins, Utah State scored 30 goals, the most since the 2016 season as the Aggies set a school record with 34 total assists. Three members of the Utah State roster earned postseason conference honors as senior midfielder Ashley Cardozo was named first-team all-MW, junior keeper Diera Walton was named second-team

all-MW and redshirt freshman defender Addy Symonds was named to the all-newcomer team.

In addition to league honors, Cardozo and sophomore defender Kelsey Kaufusi were named to the MW all-tournament team as the Aggies qualified for the tournament for the first time since 2016. The duo of Cardozo and Kaufusi were also recognized by the United Soccer Coaches with first- and third-team all-Pacific Region honors, respectively. Upon graduation, Cardozo signed a professional contract with FC Nantes in France.

Martins joined the Aggies after seven years as a member of the University of Oregon's coaching staff and brings 22 years of soccer coaching experience within the college ranks, as well as time with the United States' women's national team.

With the Ducks, Martins helped put together the highest-rated recruiting class in Oregon history in 2019, leading to one of the most successful seasons in UO history during the 2020 campaign. The class ranked No. 17 in the nation that year as freshman Ally Cook finished third in goals scored in 2019 before leading the team in goals scored a season ago. Martins also mentored a defense that set the Oregon goals-against-average as UO keeper Abby Steele broke the all-time career shutout record.

The Ducks were ranked as high as No. 14 in the country during Martins' tenure

and individual players went on to find success in the professional ranks. Jazmin Jackmon became the first Duck to be selected in the NWSL draft, going in the third round to the Houston Dash. Marissa Everett became the first UO alum to score in an NWSL game when she found the net while playing for the Portland Thorns. And, Marlo Sweatman became the first Duck to appear in the FIFA World Cup after she helped Jamaica qualify for the world tournament for the first time in that country's history.

Martins has been associated with the U.S. women's national team since 2013 and was an analyst and opposition scout during the women's 2019 FIFA World Cup Championship run. Martins was also a member of the women's national team staff during the 2018 U20 World Cup and the 2016 U17 World Cup. In 2018, the women advanced to the finals of the CONCACAF Championships, while capturing the CONCACAF Championship in 2016.

Prior to his current position at Oregon, Martins was a member of the UCLA women's soccer staff from 2011-13, helping the Bruins gather the top recruiting class in 2013. UCLA also had the No. 3 recruiting class in 2012. The Bruins enjoyed a wealth of success during Martins' tenure, capturing 15 or more victories each year and losing only one match at home over the course of the two years. With the Bruins, Martins coached a pair of No. 1 draft picks in women's professional soccer: Sydney

Leroux (2012/Atlanta Beat/WPS) and Zakiya Bywaters (2013/Chicago Red Stars/NWSL). Martins also coached four NSCAA All-Americans during his stay in Los Angeles.

Martins was instrumental in developing various clubs in the Los Angeles area, serving as the director of coaching and player development for Los Angeles Premier FC, a member of the WPSL, and the Los Angeles Rampage. Martins served as head coach of both teams during his time with the clubs and was named the WPSL Coach of the Year in 2010.

Martins' first head coaching position came at Los Angeles Mission College, guiding the Eagles from 2006-11. Martins began his collegiate coaching career at LAMC, serving as an assistant from 2001-04, before spending three years as an assistant at Cal Poly Pomona from 2004-06.

Martins cut his coaching teeth at his alma mater of Sylmar High School, becoming the head coach in 1998 and leading the program to a 101-54-22 record in seven seasons.

Martins was born in Portugal and moved to San Fernando, Calif., in 1993. He played soccer at Sylmar HS and LAMC. Martins earned a degree in kinesiology at Cal Poly Pomona in 2006 and holds a USSF A License and an NSCAA Director of Coaching diploma. He is fluent in Portuguese, Spanish, English and Creolo. Martins and his wife, Lorena, have three children: Isaiah, Emma and London.

2021. They followed that with a 10-5-1 overall record and a 5-2-1 C-USA mark in the 2021 campaign. Dalton's coaching career began with a stint as the volunteer assistant and goalkeeper coach at DePaul in 2019.

As a player, Dalton was a standout goalkeeper at Wisconsin from 2007-11. She was named the Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year in 2011 and earned All-Conference First Team and NSCAA All-Great Lakes Region Second Team honors. She was twice named the team's MVP, and currently ranks second in saves per game (4.707) and fifth in career shutouts (24) in the Badgers' record book.

Following her collegiate career, Dalton played professionally in Iceland's top division with UMF Selfoss in 2013, followed by a season with Kvarnsvedens IK in Sweden. She then returned to the states to play three years with the Chicago Red Stars, where she was a finalist for the CONCACAF Female Goalkeeper of the Year award during her debut season. In 2018, she signed with the North Carolina Courage, then played with Apollon LFC in Cyprus in 2018-19.

Michele Dalton

Assistant Coach • Wisconsin, 2011

First Season

Michelle Dalton is in her first year as an assistant coach with the Utah State soccer program after being hired in July of 2023.

Dalton joins the staff after spending the 2022 season as an assistant coach at Kentucky. With the Wildcats, Dalton assisted in student-athlete development while working specifically with the team's goalkeepers. Other primary responsibilities included administering program operations, aiding with fiscal management and video support, and serving as the camp coordinator.

Prior to her stint in Lexington, Dalton spent the 2020 and 2021 seasons as an assistant coach at Western Kentucky. While Dalton primarily focused on the training and development of the team's goalkeepers, the Hilltoppers' defense allowed just 13 goals in each of her two seasons, tied for the second fewest in program history. As a team, the Hilltoppers clinched their first-ever C-USA East Division title with a 4-0-2 conference record in Spring

Third Season

Carrillo-Bautista was an assistant coach under Martins with Lane United heading into the 2021 season, and helped with all aspects of the team, including training, scouting and day-to-day operations. Carrillo-Bautista was active at the club level in Eugene and was an assistant coach for the Eugene Timbers club program, coaching various age groups. He cultivated more coaching experience as a volunteer assistant at Bushnell University, an NAIA program in Eugene.

Martins and Carrillo-Bautista first met at the University of Oregon, where Carrillo-Bautista was serving as the team manager for the women's soccer program. There, Carrillo-Bautista



was able to take part in team film sessions and gained valuable insights on tactical analysis, as well as oppositional analysis. During his time there he was also able to learn the amount of preparation and attention to detail that goes into building a successful team environment.

As a player, Carrillo-Bautista was brought up through Timbers Academy in Portland, Ore., while also playing club with the Washington Timbers. Carrillo-Bautista was recruited by several Division II and Division III programs before he stepped away from playing to focus on a degree at Oregon, graduating with a dual major in Spanish and sports business.



ASHLEY CARDOZO

Assistant Coach • Utah State, 2021

First Season

Ashley Cardozo was promoted to assistant coach prior to the 2023 season after serving as the director of operations since March of the same year.

Cardozo was a member of the Aggie roster from 2017-21 and is the program's all-time leader in assists (32), shots on goal (121) and game-winning goals (13). Cardozo also owns the single-season record at USU for assists (11, 2021) and game-winning goals (5, 2017).

Cardozo earned a bevy of awards during her playing career, being named first-team all-Mountain West in 2017 and 2021, second-team all-MW in 2018 and 2019, first-team United Soccer Coaches all-Pacific Region in 2021 and second team all-Pacific Region in 2017. Cardozo graduated from USU in 2021 with a bachelor's degree in international business.

Following her Aggie career, Cardozo signed a professional contract with FC Nantes in France before joining the Utah State coaching staff.

The Aggies won their first Western Athletic Conference Tournament title in 2011. USU opened the tournament with a 1-0 shutout against Idaho, following suit with the same score against host Fresno State in the championship game. Molli Merrill, Natalie Norris, Kendra Pemberton and Jade Tarver were named to the all-tournament team, while Merrill was named tournament MVP. The Aggies continued the season, traveling to Auburn for the first NCAA Tournament appearance in program history. The Tigers topped Utah State, 2-1, to advance.



2012



Utah State won its second-straight WAC Tournament championship in 2012. The Aggies hosted the tournament, defeating Seattle, 2-1 in the opening match and topping Denver, 1-0, in the championship. Natalie Norris was named the 2012 tournament MVP. She was joined on the all-tournament team by Jennifer Flynn, Ashlyn Mulford, Taryn Rose and Jackie Tillotson. The first round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament was played in Provo, Utah, against the No. 2 BYU Cougars. After a weather delay pushed the game back a day, BYU defeated the Aggies, 2-1.







Following the inaugural 1996 season for Utah State soccer, freshman Brenna Hansen, a midfielder from Boise, Idaho, tragically died in a plane crash in Idaho during a January snow storm. The following year, Utah State soccer retired the number 8 to honor Brenna's memory. Hansen appeared in 13 of the Aggies' 18 matches during the 1996 season, making one start against Mesa State on Oct. 13.





Built in 2002, Chuck and Gloria Bell Field is the on-campus home field for Aggie soccer. The complex includes a two-level press box, sideline bleacher seating, as well as a grassy hill for seating along the south goal line. A new digital score and videoboard was added prior to the 2016 season. The Wasatch Front mountain range provides a beautiful backdrop for the soccer field, which is located just north of the Stan Laub Indoor Training Center and near Maverik Stadium, the Jim & Carol Laub Athletics Academics Complex and the ICON Sports Performance Center.




Completed in June of 2013, Utah State's \$6.5 million, 26,329-square-foot iFit Sports Performance Center features areas for weight training, cardiovascular workouts and speed and agility training, as well as offices for staff. Built on existing university property at the northwest corner of Maverik Stadium, the state-of-the-art multi-level facility alleviated overcrowding in the previous 5,800-square-foot strength and conditioning center and accommodates almost 400 student-athletes from 16 sports programs. The ICON Sports Performance Center is the largest such facility in the Mountain West and rivals any strength and conditioning complex in the country.






The three-story, 69,000-square-foot Jim and Carol Laub Athletics-Academics Complex is a state-of-the-art multi-purpose facility that meets all of the athletic and academic needs of Utah State's 16 sports programs and nearly 400-plus student-athletes. Within the facility, which was completed in the summer of 2008, is the 11,000-square-foot Dale Mildenberger Sports Medicine Complex and Dr. John Worley Sports Medicine Research Center, the Steve Mothersell Athletics Hall of Honor and the 7,000-square-foot J. Ken "Kenny" Seamons Equipment Room. Also located on the first floor are locker rooms for football, while the second floor features a 120-seat auditorium. The student-athlete academics center is located on the third floor, which includes numerous study hall and tutor areas, a computer lab and the Dr. Randall and Julianne Stockham Student-Athlete Academics Hall of Honor. The third floor also houses coaches' offices and meeting rooms for the track & field and cross country programs as well as the compliance offices.



ELIZABETH R. CANTWELL

Chicago, 1976
August, 2023 - Present (First Year)

Elizabeth (Betsy) R. Cantwell will become Utah State University's 17th president on Aug. 1, 2023. Before coming to USU, she was the senior vice president for research and innovation at the University of Arizona, where she was responsible for an \$825 million annual research portfolio; the 1,268-acre UA Tech Park,

one of the nation's premier university research parks; and a research and innovation enterprise that spanned 20 academic colleges with locations across Arizona, 12 university-level centers and institutes, and other major research-related affiliated organizations conducting classified and contractual work.

She also devoted time to student-athlete focused programs and projects, believing that athletics programs have power to help land-grant universities serve the public and raise awareness of the good these institutions do in communities.

Cantwell previously served as Arizona State University's vice president for research development and CEO of the ASU Research Enterprise. She led an organization of 150 and grew the overall research enterprise at ASU from \$435 million to \$680 million over three years, and in her CEO role, she grew the applied research entity from no contracts to \$15 million in annual awards.

Before her work in university research leadership, she served the U.S. national security mission as the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory's director for economic development and director for engineering mission strategy, and earlier as the deputy associate director for global security at the Oak Ridge National Laboratory, where she worked with the U.S. Departments of Energy and Defense, the National Nuclear Security Administration, the Defense Threat Reduction Agency, and NASA.

Cantwell is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania, Wharton School (MBA, 2003); the University of California, Berkeley (Ph.D., Mechanical Engineering, 1992); and the University of Chicago (BA, Human Behavior 1976).

AGGIES

From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the MW continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship. Now in its 23rd year, the MW has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics.

The Mountain West has marked several achievements during its first 22 years, most notably becoming the first to establish a sports television network dedicated solely to an intercollegiate athletic conference (The Mtn.). The Mountain West also was the first to experiment with the coaches' challenge in the college football instant replay system and was the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS conference to participate in four BCS bowl games, winning three. In the inaugural year of the new College Football Playoff system, Boise State earned the automatic slot into a New Year's Six bowl game as the highest-ranked champion from the Group of Five 5 conferences. The Broncos defeated then 10th-ranked Arizona 38-30 in the VIZIO Fiesta Bowl. In 2011-12, the Mountain West was among the first conferences to implement a league-wide state-of-the-art basketball instant replay system.

Changes in the NCAA governance structure set the table for another Conference first, when two members of the MW Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) were included in the June 2014 meeting of the Mountain West Board of Directors. New Mexico track and field athlete Kendall Spencer, the national chair of the 2014-15 NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, and Air Force Academy volleyball player Emma Dridge joined the BOD members in this historic meeting to advance the discussion on student-athlete involvement in the NCAA and MW governance structure. For the last seven academic years, MW student-athletes have participated in monthly membership calls and have joined MW administrators in the annual Joint Council Spring Meetings in Arizona.

The Mountain West is well-represented within the new NCAA gover-

nance structure, including individuals who were appointed to serve on committees tasked with managing the day-to-day business of Division I athletics. Kendall Spencer, the former chair of the DI Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and a UNM track & field athlete, was the first student-athlete in the history of the organization to serve on the Division I Board.

Additionally, the Mountain West was the only conference to have the same member institution with No. 1 overall picks in both the NFL and NBA drafts in the same year (Utah's Alex Smith and Andrew Bogut, respectively in 2005). With UNLV's Anthony Bennett claiming the No. 1 pick in the 2013 NBA Draft, the Mountain West is one of three conferences to have multiple No. 1 NBA draft selections since 2000. Also, with San Diego State's Stephen Strasburg earning the No. 1 pick in the 2009 MLB Draft, the Mountain West is one of three conferences to have the No. 1 selection in each of the NFL, NBA and MLB drafts since the MW was founded in 1999.

The Mountain West is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful terrain and landscapes in the nation can be found within Mountain West boundaries, including the majestic Rocky Mountain range, which borders five MW institutions (Air Force, Boise State, Colorado State, New Mexico and Utah State). The high plains of Wyoming (elevation 7,220 feet – the highest Division I campus in the nation) contrast with the desert cities of Las Vegas and Reno, home to UNLV and Nevada, respectively, while Fresno State, San Diego State and San José State add a West coast influence with their locations in Central, Southern and Northern California. The inclusion of the Hawai'i football program extends the Mountain West footprint to the beautiful islands in the Pacific Ocean, while the addition of the women's soccer program at Colorado College gives the MW an additional presence in the Rocky Mountains.
