NEVADA BEGINS TWO-STRAIGHT ON THE ROAD SATURDAY AT UTAH STATE

Nevada (2-7, 2-3 MW) plays the first of two road games in as many weeks Saturday as it visits Utah State. Saturday's contest against the Aggies is set for a 12 p.m. PT kick and will be streamed on the Mountain West Network (www.themw.com/watch), and locally in Northern Nevada on NSN, with Dave Fox (play-by-play), Alema Harrington (analyst), and Frank Dolce (reporter) on the call.

The Wolf Pack Radio Network will call the game on KOZZ 105.7 FM in Northern Nevada, and online at www.thevarsitynetwork.com and on the Varsity Network app. John Ramey (play-by-play) and Mike Edwards (analyst) will be in the booth, with the 60-minute pregame show to begin at 11 a.m. PT.

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INTERVIEW POLICY

All interview arrangements must be made through the Nevada Communications office. Please check with the athletic communications office for any changes to the weekly schedule, including practice times.

Coach Ken Wilson will be available on a weekly basis at a press conference on Mondays at 2 p.m., located in Presidents 4 inside Lawlor Events Center.

Generally, the Nevada Communications office will live-stream the Monday press conference via the Mountain West Network (www.themw.com/watch) and archives will be available shortly after the conclusion of the press conference.

Requests for student-athletes for the post-practice interviews during the week must be submitted no later than 3 p.m. on Sundays to the Nevada Communications office.

Post-practice interviews take place at Wolf Pack Park Tuesdays (Offense) and Wednesdays (Defense).

CREDENTIALS

All requests for media access at Mackay Stadium, and seating in the Mackay Stadium press box, must be made by 5 p.m. two days before gameday. Please submit to Aaron Juarez (aaronjuarez@unr.edu). Those receiving accommodation will be notified later that evening.

Ken Wilson's weekly radio show with John Ramey is live on Thursdays from 12:30-1:30 p.m. at Brew Brothers, located inside the Eldorado Casino Hotel & Casino, during the season. It is available in Northern Nevada on KHIT 94.5, 1450 AM, and the Varsity Network app.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

In general, no coaches or student-athletes are available to media on the field or en route to the locker room, with the exception of the live, originating television broadcast if pre-arranged. Nevada's locker room is closed to the media.

Interview requests should be submitted to Aaron Juarez of the Nevada Communications office no later than the five-minute mark of the fourth quarter. Assistant coaches are not available after games. Generally, the Nevada Communications office will live-stream postgame press conferences following home games via the Mountain West Network and archives will be available shortly after the conclusion of the press conference.

Postgame press conferences for home contests will take place in the Cashell Fieldhouse weight room, with head coach Ken Wilson and selected players. Postgame pressers for road contests will be subject to the current protocols of the game location. Please submit interview requests to Aaron Juarez via text (208-982-0040) no later than the five-minute mark of the fourth quarter.

MEDIA WORK AREA

The Paul R. Stuart Press Box in Mackay Stadium has wireless, ethernet and phone lines available during the game and after the conclusion of each game.

PARKING

Media parking permits for gameday are available via the Nevada Communications Office are generally for level two of the West Stadium Parking Complex. Local television satellite trucks have designated parking near the main (southwest) entrance to the stadium. These trucks must be in place at least two hours before game time and cannot leave while crowds are present outside the stadium.

CLEAR BAG POLICY

The University of Nevada, in an effort to provide a safer environment for the public and to expedite entry into the athletic venues, has implemented a new policy limiting the size and type of bag allowed for all events.

Approved Bags:

- Clear plastic, vinyl, or PVC tote bags that do not exceed 12" x 6" x 12"
- One-gallon clear plastic storage bags
- Small Clutch Purses 4.5" X 6.5" or smaller

Exceptions: An exception will be made for medically necessary items and diaper bags after proper inspection. These bags will be tagged to inform venue security that the bag has been cleared by the gate inspection member and to limit any disturbance to the patron once inside the stadium. Accredited media may bring bags for working purposes into the facility but must enter at the press box elevator or gate 2 on the west side of the stadium and make bags available for search.

In Wilson's first campaign at the Wolf Pack helm, Nevada's defense made an impressive impact, ranking in the FBS top half nationally in multiple statistical categories. Putting a strong emphasis on takeaways, the Wolf Pack made 19 in 2023, with 11 interceptions and eight fumble recoveries, the latter ranking second among all Mountain West teams. Takeaways played a major role in the Wolf Pack's first two contests of the season, as Nevada made five in the season-opening win at New Mexico State, and four more in the following week's 38-14 victory over Texas State.

The Pack defense also ranked in the national top 50 in red-zone defense (47th) and tackles-for-loss (43rd, 6.3 per game).

Seven members of the Wolf Pack earned All-Mountain West honors in 2022, headlined by safety Bentley Sanders being named to the First Team. Of the seven honorees, four came from the defensive side, including defensive tackle Dom Peterson's second-team nod.

Two members of the Wolf Pack defense were recognized nationally in 2022, with Sanders claiming a spot on the Associated Press Midseason All-America Team, and redshirt freshman linebacker Drue Watts being named to the College Football News (CFN) All-America Third Team.

Wilson possesses over three decades of coaching experience, including 19 previous years on the Nevada staff (1989-98, 2004-12), which included five seasons as associate head coach (2008-12) and four as defensive coordinator (1996-98, 2007).

Wilson also coached the defensive line, linebackers, and safeties, during his time at Nevada. During his coaching tenures, the Wolf Pack reached a bowl game 11 times, including each of his last eight seasons, and captured two Western Athletic Conference titles (2005, 2010), five Big West Conference championships (1992, 1994-97), and two Big Sky Conference titles (1990-91) with Wilson on staff.

Wilson spent six seasons working with Ault from 1989-92 and 1994-95. He was also an assistant coach for Jeff Horton in 1993 and Jeff Tisdell from 1996-98, spending those final three seasons as defensive coordinator. As the nation's youngest Division I (now FBS) defensive coordinator, he directed Nevada's 1996 defense to the top of the conference in every defensive category and was part of the Las Vegas Bowl victory over Ball State.

He spent four years (1999-2003) in the Nevada administration, serving as Assistant Athletics Director, Sports Services, under then-athletic director Chris Ault. He oversaw football, men's basketball, baseball, track and tennis while coordinating grant-in-aid for all student-athletes in Nevada's 19-sport athletic program.

Wilson returned to the Mackay Stadium sidelines in 2004 when Ault returned to the football program's helm.

In 2009, Wilson coached the Wolf Pack linebackers and oversaw the development of a youthful group that included second-team All-WAC selection James-Michael Johnson, who went on to be taken by the Cleveland Browns in the fourth round of the 2012 NFL Draft. In 2008, he coached a pair of future NFL linebackers in Jushua Mauga (New York Jets & Kansas City Chiefs) and Jerome Johnson (St. Louis Rams).

In his final season at Nevada in 2012, Wilson helped senior Albert Rosette successfully move back to middle linebacker after playing defensive end the year prior. Rosette went on to lead the Mountain West Conference – Nevada's first year in the league – with 135 tackles, good for the third-most in program single-season history and earned first-team All-Mountain West Conference recognition.

The Wilson family's ties to Nevada run deep. Wilson and his wife, Heather, have a son, Tyler, who was a long snapper for the Wolf Pack from 2012-14, a daughter-in-law, Makenzie, and a daughter, Baylie.

Wilson served as co-defensive coordinator and inside linebackers coach from 2019-21 at Oregon. Over his coaching career, Wilson has been a part of 18 teams that have advanced to a bowl game, including 15 of the last 16 years.

Oregon's Pac-12 championship in 2020, its second in a row, was the 11th conference title Wilson has been a part of during his coaching career.

Wilson added co-defensive coordinator to his duties after helping Oregon to back-to-back Pac-12 Conference titles in his first two years on staff.

In 2020, Wilson helped the Ducks to a conference title with the defensive putting together a dominant performance in the Pac-12 Championship game, holding No. 13 USC to just 38 rushing yards on 28 carries (1.4 yards per carry) in a 31-24 win. Wilson's linebackers – Mase Funa, Noah Sewell, and Isaac Slade-Matautia – played a huge part in the win combining 17 tackles and a tackle for loss.

In Wilson's first season at Oregon, the Ducks' defense led Oregon to a Pac-12 Conference title, a win in the Rose Bowl, and a 12-2 overall record while ranking among the nation's elite units.

SERIES HISTORY

Nevada leads the all-time series against Utah State, 19-7. The Wolf Pack is 9-5 against the Aggies in Logan, and Saturday's meeting will be the Pack's first trip to Logan since 2019. Nevada and Utah State have only played each other four times as members of the Mountain West--the bulk of the matchups came when the teams were in the Big Sky and WAC.

ABOUT UTAH STATE

Utah State (4-5, 2-3 MW) came off of a bye week to defeat San Diego State, 32-24, in double overtime to stop a small skid of two games. The Aggie offense averages 34.9 points per game, while on defense Ike Larsen has picked off four passes and was named Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week Monday.

LAST TIME OUT

Nevada had its modest two-game winning streak snapped Saturday, as the Wolf Pack dropped a 27-14 home decision to Hawai'i.

Running back Sean Dollars returned to action and promptly scored a pair of rushing touchdowns, highlighting his 55-yard day. Wide receiver Dalevon Campbell also made big plays, hauling in four passes for 88 yards.

Defensively, the Pack got a pair of sacks, with defensive lineman James Hansen racking up two tackles-for-loss. Nevada's secondary helped hold Hawai'i's passing offense to just 203 yards, with Caine Savage and KK Meier each breaking up a pair of passes.

BACK ON THE ROAD

The Wolf Pack hits the road for the first time in three weeks, and for just the second time in six weeks, with the upcoming trip to Utah State.

After its Sept. 30 Mountain West opener at Fresno State, the Pack has had a bye (Oct. 6) and three home dates (Oct. 14, Oct. 28, Nov. 4) with just one trip, that coming Oct. 21 to San Diego State. Nevada will wrap up its road slate with two trips in a row, traveling to Colorado State (Nov. 18) following this weekend's trip to Utah State.

SOME RARITY IN THE TRIP TO LOGAN

Nevada's upcoming trip to Utah State marks not only a rare visit, of late, but also a rare matchup with the Aggies. As members of the Big Sky, then the WAC, the two programs faced off annually from 1992-99, and again from 2005-11. Since Utah State joined the Mountain West in 2013, a move which reunited the two schools (Nevada joined in 2012), the teams have played just four times heading into Saturday's meeting. The trip is also just Nevada's third to Logan (2015, 2019, 2023) since joining the Mountain West.

WOLF PACK DEFENSE OFF TO GOOD STARTS

Nevada's defense has rebounded well to start games over the past month. After giving up opening-drive touchdowns in five of the first six games, the Wolf Pack defense has held each of its last three opponents (San Diego State, New Mexico, Hawai'i) scoreless not just on the opening drive, but in the opening quarter.

ANOTHER SCORE OFF A TAKEAWAY

Yet another area of improvement for the Wolf Pack has been in turning takeaways into points. After turning a season-high three interceptions into 17 points in Oct. 28's 34-24 victory over New Mexico, Nevada went 1-for-1 in converting a takeaway into points Saturday against Hawai'i.

After Aedan Seiuli recovered a muffed punt, the Wolf Pack offense capitalized on the short field, needing just two plays and 11 seconds to go 29 yards for a touchdown. With that score, Nevada has now converted each of its last four takeways into points (three TD, one FG).

Prior this run, Nevada had converted just one of its previous nine takeaways into points (one touchdown, five punts, one missed FG, two half-ending kneeldowns).

JOHNSON PUTTING TOGETHER A CAREER YEAR

Sixth-year safety Emany Johnson has emerged as one of the Wolf Pack defense's key leaders this season, and is in the middle of a career year. The Richmond, Calif., native leads the Nevada defense in tackles (72) and interceptions (two), along with having 2.0 tackles-for-loss and a forced fumble.

Johnson led the Pack with eight tackles Saturday against Hawai'i. He is currently on a solid six-game run, racking up 54 tackles (47 solo) with two picks and a TFL. In that stretch, he has three double digit-tackle games (10 against Kansas on Sept. 16, career-high 12 against UNLV on Oct. 14, 10 against New Mexico on Oct. 28), and one two-INT game (Sept. 30 at Fresno State).

CAMPBELL GOING UP FOR THE LONG BALL

Wide receiver Dalevon Campbell has established himself as one of the Mountain West's deep threats this season, averaging 21.9 yards over his 19 receptions.

Saturday, Campbell racked up 88 yards on just four catches, and now has five receptions of at least 40 yards, and seven of at least 30, this season.

DOLLARS CASHES IN

Running back Sean Dollars returned to action Saturday after missing Nevada's Oct. 28 win over New Mexico. Dollars made an impactful return, rushing for 55 yards and twice powering into the end zone, bringing his team-leading touchdown total to five.

WATTS BLOWIN' THINGS UP

Linebacker and team captain Drue Watts has been the heartbeat of the Nevada defense the past two seasons, and was a factor once again in Oct. 28's win over New Mexico. He made a tackle-for-loss among his three tackles, and helped the Wolf Pack hold New Mexico to just 83 yards rushing.

On the year, Watts leads the country with four fumble recoveries, and is fourth on the Pack with 39 tackles. He also has a team co-leading 3.0 tackles-for-loss and two passes broken up.

TALTON NEVADA'S ALL-TIME LEADING FIELD-GOAL KICKER

Fifth-year kicker Brandon Talton entered his final season intent on reminding many around the Mountain West of his status as one of the top kickers on the West Coast. Talton, named to two preseason watch lists this summer (Lou Groza Award, Comeback Player of the Year Award), is the Mountain West's all-time leader in field goals made (78).

Talton, named to the Lou Groza Award watch list for the fifth time this past July, hit from 39 yards in his first attempt Oct. 21 at San Diego State, bringing his career total to 73 and passing Marty Zendejas (1984-87) atop Nevada's all-time list.

Talton also ranks second in scoring with 372 points. He is one of just eight players, including four kickers, in Nevada history to have 300 career points.

MATEIALONA CREATING CHAOS IN THE BACKFIELD

Another Nevada linebacker creating chaos for opposing teams is Tongiaki Mateialona, who forced his second fumble of the season and made five solo tackles Sept. 16 against Kansas.

Mateialona, tied for third on the team in tackles-for-loss (2.0) and second with 46 tackles so far in 2023, opened his campaign with an impressive performance at No. 6/6 USC. The team's second-leading returning tackler from a season ago (53 tackles, 3.5 TFL, 2.0 sacks in 2022), Mateialona shared the Pack lead with six tackles in Los Angeles, including a strip-sack of Caleb Williams.

BELL ON PACE FOR CAREER YEAR

Wide receiver/kick returner Jamaal Bell is well on his way to a career year receiving in 2023. Bell caught eight balls in each of the first two contests, with his 16 receptions going for 188 yards and a score. On the year, he is at a career-best 29 catches for 252 yards and a touchdown.

The 2022 season was previously Bell's best in both categories, as he hauled in 28 passes for 279 yards. His 2023 campaign got off to a big start Sept. 2 at No. 6/6 USC, when he posted career highs of eight catches and 121 yards with a 77-yard touchdown reception.

LOCAL FLAIR TO THE PACK ROSTER

Among the numerous values head coach Ken Wilson promotes in the Nevada Football program is its local connections. To that end, the Wolf Pack roster features 16 players from Northern Nevada high schools. See the table on page six of the game notes for the entire list of players, by school.

END OF A SOLID SHUTOUT STREAK

Nevada held New Mexico scoreless in the first half Oct. 28, marking six-straight quarters of keeping its opponent off the scoreboard. It was not until the Lobos kicked a 47-yard field goal to open the second-half scoring (with 11:21 left in the third quarter) that Nevada's run came to an end at an impressive 97:16 of game time.

That run was Nevada's longest shutout period since going 136:45 without yielding a point over three games in 2011.

ONE GAME, TWO CAREER RECORDS SET

Two Nevada career records were set in the Wolf Pack's 6-0 win at San Diego State Oct. 21

Kicker Brandon Talton, already the Mountain West's career field goals leader, became Nevada's all-time leader with his 39-yarder in the first quarter. The kick was the 73rd of his career, passing Marty Zendejas (1984-87) on the Wolf Pack's career ledger. Talton's career total is now 78 through Oct. 28.

With his 14-yard return on the second half's opening kickoff, senior Jamaal Bell became Nevada's career leader with his 71st kick return. That moved him out of a three-way tie atop the list with Mike Ball (2009-11) and Kendall Brock (2011-14). Bell is now at 72 kick returns through Oct. 28.

TALTON NABS EIGHTH-CAREER MW WEEKLY HONOR

Kicker Brandon Talton was named Mountain West Special Team Player of the Week Monday, marking the eighth such honor of his decorated career.

The Vacaville, Calif., native was a perfect 4-for-4 on field-goal attempts, connecting from 34, 47, 52, and 22 yards out, while being perfect on his two PAT attempts. The 52-yarder in the third quarter, which got the Pack's lead back to three scores at 27-10, marked the sixth field goal of at least 50 yards of his career.

It marked the fourth time in his career that Talton had made four field goals in a game. Talton, already both Nevada's and the Mountain West's all-time leader in field goals made, extended his career total to 78 with the performance.

His 14 points brought his career scoring total to 370, moving him alone into second place on Nevada's career list and into third on the Mountain West's. On the Nevada all-time list, Talton needs just 16 more points to eclipse the mark of 385 held by Marty Zendejas (1984-87), while on the Mountain West list, only TCU's Ross Evans (407 points, 2008-11) and San Diego State's Donnel Pumphrey (402 points, 2013-16) remain to be pursued.

G Joel Bitonio (Nevada, 2009-13) - Cleveland Browns

Bitonio will begin his 10th NFL season, all with the Cleveland Browns, this week. Bitonio has made five-straight Pro Bowls, and been named to the AP All-Pro First Team each of the past two seasons.

WR Elijah Cooks (Nevada, 2017-21) - Jacksonville Jaguars

Cooks signed with Jacksonville as a free agent following the 2023 NFL Draft, and made the team's 53-man roster following a strong camp. During his Nevada career (2017-21), he had season bests of 76 catches, 926 receiving yards, and ;

G Austin Corbett (Nevada, 2013-17) - Carolina Panthers

Corbett will begin his sixth NFL season, and second with Carolina, in 2023. However, he will miss at least the first four games of the season while on the Panthers' PUP (physically unable to perform) list, after tearing his ACL in the 2022 finale.

WR Romeo Doubs (Nevada, 2018-21) - Green Bay Packers

Romeo Doubs enters year two with the Green Bay Packers, after a solid 2022 rookie season in which he caught 42 passes for 425 yards and three touchdowns over 13 games.

LB Daiyan Henley (Nevada, 2017-21) - Los Angeles Chargers

Henley played at Nevada from 2017-21, being named to the All-Mountain West Second Team in 2021, before finishing his collegiate career at Washington State in 2022. Henley was drafted in the third round of the 2023 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Chargers, and made the team out of camp.

LB Nephi Sewell (Nevada, 2017-18) - New Orleans Saints

Sewell, the brother of current Nevada graduate assistant Gabe Sewell, played two seasons (2017-18) for the Pack, making 53 tackles while starting all 11 games in 2018. After transferring to Utah, where he finished his collegiate career, Sewell signed as a free agent with the New Orleans Saints, appearing in four games in 2022.

TE Cole Turner (Nevada, 2018-21) - Washington Commanders

Turner is back for his second season with Washington in 2023. Last year, Turner appeared in 10 games, making two catches for 23 yards.

PROGRAM HISTORY

Nevada is in its 116th season of collegiate football. The Wolf Pack sports an all-time record of 577-519-33. Since joining the FBS in 1992, Nevada is 201-183 overall and 131-101 in conference play. Nevada has posted winning seasons in 12 out of its past 15 campaigns.

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Caleb Williams threw for 319 yards and hit Taj Washington with two of his five touchdown passes, leading No. 6 Southern California to a 66-14 victory over Nevada on Saturday night.

Williams passed for 258 yards and four TDs on just 15 completions while USC built a 35-7 halftime lead. He finished 18 of 24 while also rushing for 42 yards and adding another array of remarkable escapes and pinpoint completions to his collection.

Stanley Ta'ufou'ou returned a fumble 23 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter for the Trojans. South Carolina transfer Mar-Shawn Lloyd had 76 yards rushing and 59 yards receiving, while touted freshmen Quinten Joyner and Duce Robinson scored their first career touchdowns in the fourth quarter.

Brendon Lewis passed for 182 yards for the Wolf Pack (0-1), who scored on their opening drive before giving up 45 consecutive points. Freshman AJ Bianco threw a 77-yard touchdown pass to Jamaal Bell on his first career pass attempt during the fourth quarter for Nevada, which went 2-10 in coach Ken Wilson's debut last sea-

son after four straight winning campaigns under Jay Norvell.

Williams was in control from the opening drive, during which he improvised a stunning 30-yard completion to Dorian Singer while on a dead sprint to the sideline. Two plays later, he threw a perfect 22-yard TD fade to Branch, the freshman phenomenon who scored two touchdowns in the opener.

Nevada answered with a 73-yard catch by Spencer Curtis leading to a TD run by Sean Dollars two plays later. But Lloyd made a 24-yard TD run later in the quarter, and Williams ran 46 yards on a draw with the first snap of the second quarter before putting the Trojans up 28-7 with a 15-yard TD pass to Jackson.

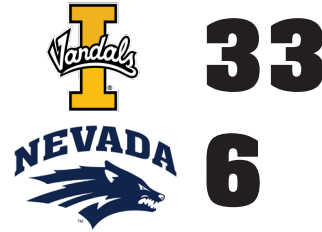

IOWA CITY, Iowa (AP) — Kaleb Johnson rushed for 103 yards and two touchdowns, and Iowa endured a night of lightning delays for a 27-0 win over Nevada on Saturday night.

The game, which was delayed three times for 3 hours, 56 minutes, started at 6:40 p.m. CDT, and ended at 1:39 a.m.

Johnson, a true freshman, had a 40-yard touchdown run in the first quarter for Iowa's first points of the game, then added a 55-yarder in the fourth quarter for the Hawkeyes' final score.

Iowa (2-1) had scored just 14 points in its first two games, but matched that in the first quarter. Johnson had his run, then quarterback Spencer Petras threw a 21-yard touchdown pass to Arland Bruce IV on the Hawkeyes' next possession.

The Hawkeyes, ranked 131st in total offense through the first two games after gaining just 316 yards, had 337 yards against the Wolf Pack (2-2), who came in ranked 95th in total defense giving up 404.3 yards per game.

Iowa's other points came on two field goals by Drew Stevens — a 43-yarder in the second quarter and a 33-yarder in the third. Petras completed 14 of 26 passes for 175 yards.

The game, which was played in a steady rain, was finally affected by lightning in the second half.

The first delay lasted 1 hour, 19 minutes. The delay was called at 8:37 p.m. with 10:02 left in the third quarter.

The two teams returned and after a 12-minute warm-up session play started again. Nine minutes later, another lightning delay was called. This one lasted 1 hour, 50 minutes.

Nevada quarterback Shane Illingworth threw an incompletion on third-and-22 on the first play after that delay. The Wolf Pack wouldn't get off their next play, as lightning lit up the sky and referee David Siegle announced there would be another delay.

The stadium was evacuated for all three delays.

The Hawkeyes' offense showed some life after struggles to start the season. It helped that Petras got back wide receivers Keagan Johnson and Nico Ragaini, who missed the first two games after beginning fall camp at the top of the depth chart at their respective positions. Running back Gavin Williams, also expected to be a starter, missed the first two games of the season, but he returned to rush for 57 yards on 16 carries.

Nevada, which came into the game ranked 105th in total offense nationally, couldn't move the ball against the Hawkeyes, who were ranked sixth in total defense. The Wolf Pack, who had 151 yards in the game, head into Mountain West Conference play next Friday against Air Force.

FRESNO, Calif. (AP) -- Mikey Keene connected with Jaelen Gill on two touchdown passes, Malik Sherod had 12 carries for 123 yards and a score and No. 25 Fresno State beat Nevada 27-9 on Saturday night for its 14th straight victory.

Fresno State (5-0, 1-0 Mountain West) is off to its best start since opening 10-0 in 2013. The 14-game winning streak is the second-longest active run in the nation (Georgia, 22 in a row) and the second-longest in program history. The Bulldogs won 17 in a row in 1988-89.

Keene was 26 of 34 for 269 yards with two interceptions. He connected with Gill on a 65-yard touchdown to open the scoring midway through the first quarter and Sherod ripped off a 72-yard touchdown run with 4:15 to go in the second to make it 14-0 at halftime. Dylan Lynch kicked field goals of 48 and 40 yards in the third quarter and Gill scored on a 12-yard reception early in the fourth to make it 27-0.

Fresno State's Carlton Johnston intercepted a pass at the Bulldogs 2 and, on the next play from scrimmage, Elijah Gilliam was stopped in the end zone to give Nevada (0-5, 0-1) a safety.

Backup quarterback AJ Bianco led an eight-play, 90-yard drive, capped

by his 19-yard touchdown pass to Spencer Curtis that made it 27-9 with 11 seconds to go. Bianco was 9 of 14 for 97 yards. Starter Brendon Lewis completed 10 of 21 for 70 yards with two interceptions.
