/// KICKOFF COVERAGE ///

• Utah State (1-5, 0-2 MW) continues Mountain West play this week as it hosts New Mexico (2-4, 1-1 MW) on Saturday, Oct. 19, at 2 p.m. (MT). The game will be televised on truTV (Xfinity Ch. 44, DISH Ch. 242, DirecTV Ch. 246) with Ari Wolfe (play-by-play), Darius Walker (analyst) and Bridget Howard (reporter) on the call.

• Interim head coach **Nate Dreiling**, who was elevated from defensive coordinator on July 2, is the youngest head coach at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level as he is 33 years old. Dreiling is one of only two interim head coaches in the nation along with Fresno State's Tim Skipper.

• Utah State is 52-36 (.591) all-time in Mountain West play, including a 28-17 (.622) home record. USU has the third-best record against MW opponents since it joined the league in 2013. Boise State (75-17) has the best record, while San Diego State (62-28) has the second-best record. Overall, USU is 50-24 (.676) in its last 74 home games.

• Utah State is second in the Mountain West and 19th in the nation in total offense (463.8 yards per game) and second in the MW and 14th in the nation in passing offense (302.8 ypg). USU is also fifth in the MW and tied for 36th in the nation in yards per rush (5.1).

• Senior WR **Jalen Royals** is second in the Mountain West and eighth in the nation in receiving (107.7 yards per game), second in the MW and ninth in the nation in receptions (7.3 pg), third in the MW and 18th in the nation in all-purpose yards (127.5 ypg), and third in the MW and 22nd in the nation in receiving touchdowns with five (0.80 pg).

• For his career, senior WR **Jalen Royals** has caught 115 passes for 1,726 yards and 20 touchdowns and ranks fifth all-time in school history in touchdown receptions, 17th all-time in receiving yards and 20th all-time in receptions. He also has seven-career 100-yard receiving games, which is tied for the ninth-most in school history.

• Utah State set a pair of school records in its game against UNLV last weekend as it marked the first time in school history that it had two players with 10-plus receptions and two players with 150-plus receiving yards in the same game as senior WR **Jalen Royals** had 10 catches for 155 yards and one touchdown and junior WR **Jack Hestera** had 10 catches for 152 yards and one touchdown. The last time USU had a pair of 100-receivers in the same game was against Fresno State in 2023 with **Royals** and **Terrell Vaughn**.

- Nate Dreiling (Dry-ling) is in his first season at Utah State. Originally hired as the defensive coordinator and defensive ends coach, Dreiling was elevated to interim head coach on July 2.
- Overall, Dreiling is entering his fifth year as a defensive coordinator and 10th year as a collegiate coach. At his previous five institutions, he has coached in four bowl games and been part of one conference championship team.
- Dreiling came to Utah State after spending the past two seasons as the defensive coordinator at New Mexico State as he helped lead the Aggies to a 17-11 record and consecutive bowl games, along with playing in the Conference USA championship game in its first year in the league in 2023.
- During the 2023 season, New Mexico State posted a 10-5 record, including a 7-1 mark in Conference USA. It was just the second time in program history that a NMSU team won 10 or more games. During the season, the Aggies' defense was one of the best units in the nation as it allowed 22.8 points per game to lead its conference and rank 44th at the FBS level. The Aggies also ranked second in the conference and 48th in the nation in rushing defense at 143.7 yards per game.
- New Mexico State's defense also excelled in the red zone under Dreiling as the Aggies ranked first in the conference and fifth in the nation in 2023, allowing opponents to score 72.6 percent of the time.
- Under Dreiling, four New Mexico State defenders earned all-Conference USA honors, including defensive tackle Sterling Webb, who was named to the first team and linebacker Keyshaun Elliott, who was named to the second team.
- In his first season at New Mexico State in 2022, Dreiling inherited a defense that ranked 127th in total defense among FBS schools. The '22 Aggies were the most improved defensive unit in college football that year, climbing 98 spots to 29th in the nation with an average of 336.3 yards allowed per game. NMSU also ranked 16th in the nation in passing defense as it allowed 186.8 yards per game.
- Three Aggie defenders earned postseason honors at the end of the 2022 campaign in linebacker Chris Ojoh (first team), cornerback Syrus Dumas (first team) and safety Bryce Jackson (second team).
- Prior to New Mexico State, Dreiling spent the 2021 season as the defensive run game coordinator and inside linebackers coach for FCS program Southeast Missouri State. The Redhawks collected a top-10 victory to cap off their season with a 31-14 home triumph against eighth-ranked UT Martin to finish 4-2 in Ohio Valley Conference action. With Dreiling on the sidelines, Southeast Missouri State held UT Martin to just 14 points, which was its lowest offensive output in over a year.
- Dreiling went to Southeast Missouri State after a one-and-a-half-year stint on head coach Mario Cristobal's staff at Oregon. With Dreiling on staff, the Ducks were able to rope in the nation's sixth-best recruiting class for 2021. As a defensive analyst for Cristobal, Dreiling helped Oregon capture the 2020 Pac-12 title before it took part in the Fiesta Bowl.
- Returning to the program that he helped lead as a player, Dreiling's first full-time coaching stop came at NCAA Division II Pittsburg State in Pittsburg, Kan. For three seasons, Dreiling served on the Gorillas' coaching staff as a safeties coach (2017) and then as the program's defensive coordinator (2018-19).
- In his first season at Pittsburg State, he helped the Gorillas force a total of 25 turnovers, while ranking second in the nation in fourth-down conversion percentage (.200) and 19th in fumble recoveries.
- In the two seasons after Dreiling was elevated to the Gorillas' defensive coordinator, 17 players garnered all-conference honors, including safety Morgan Selenaea, who earned honorable mention All-America honors in 2018. All told, Dreiling's defensive schemes allowed Pittsburg State to rank among the top two in its conference in 11 different statistical categories in 2018 and 2019.
- His first coaching gig came in the Jayhawk State, too, as he signed on with Kansas as a graduate assistant for two seasons (2015-16). Helping oversee the Jayhawks' linebackers (2015) and defensive line (2016), Dreiling assisted in the development of three all-Big 12 performers, including Dorance Armstrong, who was a fourth-round NFL Draft pick by the Dallas Cowboys in 2018.
- One of the best NCAA Division II football players in the nation on either side of the ball, Dreiling terrorized opposing offenses through his four-year career (2010-13) at Pittsburg State. A four-time All-American, Dreiling led the Gorillas to the NCAA Division II National Championship in 2011, a year in which he was named the NCAA Division II National Defensive Player of the Year by the Don Hansen Football Committee.
- The 2011 Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association (MIAA) Defensive Player of the Year amassed a trio of all-MIAA awards and was named a CoSIDA Academic All-American in 2013. His 491 career tackles top both the Pittsburg State and MIAA all-time charts.
- Dreiling's success on the field caught the eye of numerous NFL teams following his collegiate career. The linebacker signed an undrafted free agent deal with the Green Bay Packers ahead of the 2014 season and spent time on the Kansas City Chiefs' practice squad that same year. He wrapped up his playing career by signing on with the Omaha Mammoths of the now-defunct Fall Experimental Football League (FXFL) for the remainder of 2014.
- Dreiling and his wife, Alexa, have a two daughters, Baylor and Baisley, and a son, Baker.

- New Mexico senior S **Dominic Tatum** spent four years at Utah State (2019-22). Overall, he appeared in 27 games with nine starts and had 69 career tackles, to go along with six pass breakups.
- Utah State has 37 players in its program from the Beehive State, while New Mexico has 24 players on its roster from the Land of Enchantment.
- Utah State is 49-21 (.700) all-time against Division I teams from the state of New Mexico with a 32-8 record against New Mexico State and a 17-13 record versus New Mexico.
- Utah State is 23-20 (.545) in games played during the month of October over the last 12 seasons, which includes a 13-9 (.591) home record.
- Utah State is 11-6 (.647) all-time in known games played on Oct. 19.

/// THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT ///

SCOUTING NEW MEXICO

• New Mexico is 2-4 on the season and 1-1 in Mountain West play following its 52-37 Mountain West home win against Air Force last weekend. The Lobos are led by sophomore QB Devon Dampier, who is 124-of-212 (.585) passing for 1,488 yards (248.0 ypg) with seven touchdowns and six interceptions. Dampier also leads the team in rushing with 382 yards on 51 carries (7.5 ypc/63.7 ypg) and eight touchdowns. Junior WR Luke Wysong has caught a team-best 40 passes for 507 yards (12.7 ypr/84.5 ypg) and one touchdown. Defensively, junior S Christian Ellis has a team-best 47 tackles, which includes 1.5 tackles for loss, while junior S Noah Avinger has 45 tackles, which includes 1.0 tackles for loss. As a team, New Mexico is averaging 35.3 points and 456.7 yards of total offense per game (208.7 rushing, 248.0 passing), and allowing 42.7 points and 498.3 yards of total offense (256.3 rushing, 242.0 passing). New Mexico returns eight starters (O-2, D-6) and 32 lettermen (O-11, D-18, S-3) from last year's team that went 4-8 overall and 2-6 in MW play to finish tied for 10th. Bronco Mendenhall is 137-85 in his 18th season as a collegiate head coach, including a 2-4 record in his first season at New Mexico. Mendenhall is 7-2 all-time against Utah State.

AGGIES AND LOBOS SERIES HISTORY

• Utah State holds a 17-13 advantage all-time in the series against New Mexico, which includes a 9-4 home record. USU has won each of the last seven games played between the two teams and 10 of the last 13 overall. The first game played in the series was in Albuquerque on Dec. 1, 1951, with UNM winning 17-13. USU won last year's meeting in Albuquerque in double overtime, 44-41, and won the last meeting in Logan, 27-10, on Nov. 5, 2022. Overall, USU is 9-2 against the Lobos since joining the Mountain West in 2013.

UTAH STATE vs. NEW MEXICO SERIES 11TH-MOST PLAYED IN SCHOOL HISTORY

- Utah State and New Mexico will be meeting for the 31st time this weekend in what is the 11th-most played series in school history.
- Utah State and New Mexico have spent 23 years as league foes as both schools were members of the Skyline Conference from 1951 to 1961, along with its current membership in the Mountain West. The Lobos have been members of the MW since its inception in 1999, while USU joined the league prior to the 2013 season.

/// SERIES NOTABLES BETWEEN UTAH STATE AND NEW MEXICO ///

- Utah State has won each of the last seven games in the series, including six by double digits, and has outscored New Mexico 270-142 (38.6-20.3) in those games.
- Utah State has held New Mexico to less than 30 points in 10 of its last 11 meetings and in 26 games in series history. USU has scored at least 35 points in five of the last six meetings.
- Utah State has held New Mexico to 10 or fewer points nine times in series history, including in two of the last three games, and is 9-0 in those contests.
- Utah State has held New Mexico to less than 400 yards of offense in six of the last seven games and in 11 of the last 15 meetings overall.
- Despite six of the last seven games being decided by double-digits, all USU wins, 12 of the 30 games (.400) in the series have been decided by one score.
- Twelve of Utah State's last 15 wins in the series have been by double digits, while five of New Mexico's last seven wins have been by single digits.
- New Mexico has controlled the time of possession in 12 of the last 15 meetings.
- New Mexico has rushed for more yards in 10 of the previous 15 meetings, while Utah State has passed for more yards in 12 of the last 15 meetings.
- The team with the most rushing yards has won 10 of the last 15 meetings, with the only exception being Utah State's wins in 2002, 2017, 2019, 2022 and 2023.
- The team with fewer turnovers has won 11 of the last 15 meetings, and there have been fewer than three turnovers by both teams in 10 of the last 15 meetings.
- Utah State has only committed one turnover in the last three games and has won the turnover battle in five of the last seven games, all of which have been USU wins.
- In the last 15 meetings, Utah State is 8-2 when scoring first and 7-2 when leading at the half, while New Mexico is 3-2 when scoring first and 2-3 when leading at the half.
- The team that scores first has won 10 of the last 12 games in the series, while the team that leads at the half has won nine of the last 12 games.
- New Mexico has had four 100-yard receivers and six 100-yard rushers in the past 15 meetings, but no 300-yard passers, while Utah State has had six 100-yard rushers and four 100-yard receivers in the last 15 meetings, to go along with four 300-yard passers.
- In 30 previous meetings with New Mexico, Utah State has had 11 100-yard rushers, four 100-yard receivers and four 300-yard passers.
- There have been four shutouts in series history, three by Utah State's defense and one by New Mexico's defense.

- Utah State is 180-198-8 (.477) all-time against current members of the Mountain West with a 40-28-4 record vs. Wyoming, a 38-39-2 record vs. Colorado State, a 20-21-1 record vs. San José State, an 18-9 record vs. UNLV, a 17-13 record vs. New Mexico, a 13-19-1 record vs. Fresno State, a 12-6 record vs. Hawai'i, an 8-19 record vs. Nevada, a 5-24 record vs. Boise State, a 5-7 record vs. Air Force, and a 4-13 record vs. San Diego State.
- Utah State is 52-36 (.591) all-time in Mountain West play, including a 28-17 (.622) record in home games and a 24-19 (.558) record in road games.
- Utah State (52-36) has the third-best record against Mountain West opponents since it joined the league in 2013. Boise State (75-17) has the best record and San Diego State (62-28) has the second-best record.

/// FROM THE RECORD BOOKS ///

Here is a look at some of the top Utah State team and individual statistical performances against New Mexico over the years.

- Utah State set a then-school record with 704 yards of total offense against New Mexico in 2018. That total is now the second-most in school history.
- Utah State's 516 passing yards against New Mexico in 2018 are the second-most in school history.
- Utah State's 39-36 loss at New Mexico in 1998 is its only triple-overtime game in school history and the Aggies have never played in an overtime game that went longer than three periods. In fact, USU has played just 14 overtime games in school history and three have been against New Mexico as the Aggies posted a 45-44 overtime home win against UNM in 2002, along with its 44-41 double overtime road win in 2023.
- New Mexico is Utah State's only opponent that it has played multiple overtime games against.
- Utah State's eight forced turnovers vs. New Mexico in 1961 is tied for the most in school history, along with the eight turnovers it forced against Boise State in 2015, Idaho in 1971 and 1969, and San Diego State in 1968. USU's seven recovered fumbles against UNM in 1961 is a school record.
- Utah State allowed just two first downs against New Mexico in 1953, which is tied for the school record, also doing so against Idaho in 1961.
- Utah State's 470 rushing yards against New Mexico in 1960 are the second-most in school history, while its 337 rushing yards against UNM in 2013 rank as the 26th-most.
- Utah State allowed New Mexico zero passing yards and no completions in 1954, both of which are tied for single-game school records.
- Jordan Love's 448 passing yards against New Mexico in 2018 are the sixth-most in school history.
- Jose Fuentes' 80-yard pass to Kevin Curtis against New Mexico in 2002 is tied for the 18th-longest pass play in school history, while Travis Cox's 79-yard pass to Barry Tolli against UNM in 2003 is tied for the 25th-longest pass play in school history.
- Brad Bohn set a then-school record for points scored by a kicker with 18 against New Mexico in 1998, a record that was broken by Dominik Eberle. Bohn also tied the then-school record for field goals made in that game against the Lobos as he was 5-of-5 on field goals (37, 23, 23, 41, 33) and 3-for-3 on extra points. That record was also broken by Eberle.

ALBUQUERQUE, New Mexico - Graduate junior QB **Levi Williams** accounted for 351 yards of total offense and five touchdowns in Utah State's dramatic 44-41 double-overtime win at New Mexico at University Stadium on Friday, Nov. 24, 2023.

For Williams, it was his first start in two years with Utah State.

With the win, Utah State (6-6, 4-4 Mountain West) became bowl eligible for the third-consecutive season under head coach **Blake Anderson**.

Williams' final touchdown of the night proved to be the game-winner. After initially fumbling the snap, he scooped up the ball, rolled to his left and ran into the end zone from 13 yards out to end the game.

Williams was 16-of-27 passing for 198 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for 153 yards and three more scores on 25 carries. All of his stats are career highs during his two years at Utah State, while his 25 rushes are a collegiate career high.

Both of Williams' touchdown passes were thrown in the first quarter to junior WR **Jalen Royals**. Royals first score came on a 13-yard pass to finish off a 10-play, 75-yard drive for the Aggies to start the game. Royals also hauled in a 57-yard pass on USU's second series.

Royals finished the game with seven receptions for 89 yards and became just the 13th player in school history to post 1,000 receiving yards in a season. Royals also tied the school record for receiving touchdowns in a season with 14, a mark that was set by **Tracy Jenkins** in 1990.

Utah State finished the game with 500 yards of total offense (302 rushing, 198 passing).

The Lobos (4-8, 2-6 MW) were led by Jacory Croskey-Merritt, who rushed for 233 yards and one touchdown on 31 carries. Quarterback Dylan Hopkins was 12-of-31 passing for 125 yards as New Mexico finished with 539 total yards, including 337 on the ground.

Williams accounted for both of Utah State's touchdowns in the extra sessions. Following his 6-yard touchdown run that gave the Aggies a 38-31 lead, the Lobos answered with a Devon Dampier 4-yard touchdown run to tie things up.

Utah State's defense then forced New Mexico to settle for a 19-yard field goal by Luke Drzewiecki to give the Lobos a 41-38 lead, setting up Williams' game-winning heroics.

The Aggies led 31-21 with 5:30 to go in the fourth quarter following a 17-yard touchdown run by junior RB **Rahsul Faison**, who finished with 106 yards rushing on 18 carries.

However, the Lobos scored the final 10 points of regulation on a 2-yard touchdown run by Dampier and a 22-yard field goal by Drzewiecki with four seconds remaining on the clock.

New Mexico began the game-tying drive on its own 9-yard line with just 2:09 left in the fourth quarter. The Lobos benefitted from three pass interference penalties on the Aggies, including two on third down.

Graduate senior ILB **MJTafisi Jr.** led the Aggies with 11 tackles, including 1.0 tackle for loss. It was his eighth-straight double-digit tackle outing, which is the longest streak by an Aggie since 1999.

Sophomore **Sike Larsen** also had 11 tackles, including 1.0 tackle for loss, and one pass breakup. Senior DT **Hale Motu'apuaka** had three tackles, including a career-high-tying 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.0 sacks.

One of the biggest plays of the game came courtesy of Motu'apuaka. With New Mexico on the doorstep of scoring a touchdown in the second overtime, Motu'apuaka stopped Croskey-Merritt for a 1-yard loss on third-and-goal from the 1, setting up Drzewiecki's go-ahead 19-yard field goal.

Graduate senior PK Connor Coles (59) had a career-high-tying 15 points as he scored his first-career touchdown on a 6-yard run on a fake field goal. He was also 2-of-3 on field goals and 3-for-3 on extra points in Utah State's 27-10 Mountain West home win against New Mexico.

LOGAN, Utah - Utah State successfully orchestrated both a fake punt and fake field, the latter resulting in the go-ahead touchdown in the third quarter, as the Aggies scored the final 20 points in a 27-10 Mountain West win against New Mexico on Saturday, Nov. 5, 2022, on Merlin Olsen Field at Maverik Stadium.

New Mexico (2-7, 0-5 MW) was leading Utah State (4-5, 3-2 MW) 10-7 with 10:51 remaining in the third quarter when graduate senior PK **Connor Coles** lined up for a 23-yard field goal attempt. Once junior P/H **Stephen Kotsanlee** fielded the ball from sophomore LS **Jacob Garcia**, he wasted little time flipping the pigskin to Coles, who ran untouched into the end zone from six yards out, putting the Aggies on top 14-10.

Not only did Coles score his first-career touchdown on the cold and rainy day, but he also booted a pair of field goals from 49 and 27 yards out, respectively, and made good on all three of his extra points as he tied his career-high with 15 points scored.

Kotsanlee also converted a first down on a fake punt as he rushed for 10 yards on a fourth-and-3 play from USU's own 41-yard line in the second quarter.

Utah State finished the game converting all four of its fourth down attempts, which is a season high. USU was just 3-of-17 on third down, while New Mexico was 6-of-16.

Kotsanlee punted six times on the day for an average of 44.5 yards, including a long of 58. He also had one punt downed inside the 20-yard line.

Utah State's defense also found the end zone as graduate senior S **Hunter Reynolds** returned a fumble 55 yards for a touchdown, giving the hosts a 27-10 lead with 3:00 left in the game.

Reynolds finished with a game-high 10 tackles as the Aggies limited the Lobos to just 258 yards of total offense – a season low for a USU opponent, which included just 42 passing yards. It was Reynolds second double-digit tackle outing of the season and the third of his career, and his second-career fumble recovery.

Junior CB **Jamie Nance** recovered his second fumble in as many games on a muffed punt in the third quarter that led to Coles' 49-yard field goal to extend USU's lead to 17-10.

The Aggies' lone offensive touchdown came on their opening possession courtesy of a 38-yard pass from junior QB **Cooper Legas** to junior WR **Terrell Vaughn**, making it 7-0.

Legas was 13-of-27 passing for 149 yards and the one touchdown as Utah State totaled 280 yards of total offense. Vaughn finished with five catches for a career-high 83 yards, while freshman RB **Robert Briggs** led the Aggies' ground game with 82 yards rushing on a season-high 19 carries. Graduate senior WR **Brian Cobbs** added four receptions for 31 yards.

Freshman ILB **Max Alford** had a career-high eight tackles, including a career-best 1.5 tackles for loss, while redshirt freshman S **Ike Larsen** also recorded a career-high eight stops.

Graduate junior DE **Daniel Grzesiak** tied his career-high with six tackles, which included 1.0 sacks, while junior DT **Poukasi Vakauta** tied his career-high with three stops. Redshirt junior S **Dominik Tatum** added a season-high six tackles.

Utah State finished the game with 3.0 sacks and 6.0 tackles for loss, while New Mexico had 4.0 sacks and 8.0 tackles for loss.

Graduate QB Spencer Petras (7) was 41-of-59 passing for 461 yards with three touchdowns and three interceptions in Utah State's 50-34 Mountain West home loss to UNLV.

LOGAN, Utah - Graduate QB **Spencer Petras** set school and career records with 41 completions and 59 attempts, and set a new career-high with 461 passing yards, but the Rebel rushing attack was too much to overcome as Utah State lost to UNLV 50-34 on its Homecoming night at Maverik Stadium on Friday, Oct. 11, 2024.

Utah State also set two school records in the game as this was the first time ever that it had two players with 10-plus catches and 150-plus receiving yards in the same game.

Petras, who finished the game with a career-high-tying three touchdowns and three interceptions, tied the FBS single game record for completions this year, while his 461 passing yards are the second-most at the FBS level this season and the fifth-most in school history.

The Aggies outgained the Rebels, 584-546, and accrued 32 first downs to UNLV's 25. However, four USU turnovers led to 20 points for the Rebels. UNLV had zero turnovers.

UNLV went 75 yards in four plays on the opening drive of the game, culminating in a five-yard rushing touchdown. After the Utah State defense forced a stop on UNLV's next possession, the Rebels turned to the air on their next chance with the ball, resulting in an 18-yard touchdown pass to go up 14-0. The Aggie offense answered with an 11-play, 79-yard drive as senior RB **Rahsul Faison** capped the series with a 20-yard touchdown run.

UNLV broke the game open in the second quarter, outscoring the Aggies 27-0 as USU turned the ball over twice in the quarter and failed on a fourth-down conversion as the Rebels took advantage to build a 41-7 halftime lead.

Utah State took the opening drive of the second half 66 yards in eight plays and scored on a 24-yard touchdown pass from Petras to junior WR **Jack Hestera**. UNLV responded on their next possession with a 29-yard touchdown run, which was the final time the Rebels found the end zone in the contest. Hestera finished the game with a career-high 10 receptions for a career-best 152 yards and one touchdown.

Utah State continued humming offensively on the next drive with Petras throwing a 13-yard scoring strike to senior WR **Jalen Royals**. With the touchdown, Royals moved to fifth all-time in school history with 20 career touchdown receptions. He had a career-high-tying 10 receptions for 155 yards in the game.

The Aggies continued to eat into the deficit into the fourth quarter as Petras orchestrated another touchdown drive, this time going 67 yards in eight plays as he found graduate TE **Broc Lane** for the six-yard touchdown to make the score 47-28. After forcing another stop, USU quickly moved deep within Rebel territory and looked to cut the lead further before a tipped pass led to an interception, which led to a 36-yard UNLV field goal.

Utah State's final touchdown of the game came on a three-yard run from freshman RB **Herschel Turner Jr.** to bring the game back within two possessions at 50-34. Utah State's two-point conversion was unsuccessful, however, as was the ensuing onside kick, allowing UNLV to kneel out the final seconds.

Faison led USU with 83 yards on 15 carries and one touchdown.

Defensively, USU recorded a season-high four sacks, with senior DE **Cian Slone** leading the way with a career-high 2.0 sacks. USU also tied its season-high with 8.0 tackles for loss.

UTAH STATE SETS PAIR OF SCHOOL RECORD IN UNLV GAME

• Utah State set a pair of school record in its game against UNLV last weekend as it marked the first time ever that it had two players with 10-plus receptions in the same game, and it marked the first time two players had 150-plus receiving yards in the same game as senior WR **Jalen Royals** had 10 catches for 155 yards and one touchdown and junior WR **Jack Hestera** had 10 catches for 152 yards and one touchdown. It was also the first time USU had a pair of 100-yard receivers in the same game since doing so against Fresno State in 2023.

UTAH STATE'S OFFENSE HAS BIG DAY AGAINST UNLV

• Utah State's offense continued its stellar play as of late as it produced 584 yards of total offense in its 50-34 Mountain West loss to UNLV last weekend. Those 584 yards are the second-most by Utah State this season, which included a season-high 461 passing yards, which are the sixth-most in a single-game in school history.

UTAH STATE'S OFFENSE IN ITS LAST THREE GAMES

• Utah State's offense has played well during its last three games at Temple, at No. 21 Boise State and against UNLV. In those three games, USU is averaging 31.0 points and 520.7 yards of offense with 375.3 passing yards and 145.3 rushing yards. USU is also averaging 26.3 first downs during its last three games and is converting 47.1 percent of its third downs (24-51).

UTAH STATE HAS SCORED 30-PLUS POINTS IN 10 OF ITS LAST 16 GAMES

• Following its 50-34 Mountain West home loss to UNLV last weekend, Utah State has now scored 30 or more points in 10 of its last 16 games. USU has also had at least 500 yards of total offense in seven of its last 14 outings after producing 646 yards against Robert Morris, 507 yards against Boise State and 584 yards last weekend against UNLV.

UTAH STATE'S DEFENSE RECORDS SEASON-HIGHS IN UNLV GAME

• Utah State's defense recorded a season-high 4.0 sacks and a season-high-tying 8.0 tackles for loss this past weekend against UNLV. In fact, those 4.0 sacks were the most in a game for USU since posting 5.0 sacks against Georgia State in the 2023 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

UTAH STATE'S OFFENSE ACCOMPLISHES RARE FEAT AT NO. 21 BOISE STATE

• Utah State's offense accomplished a rare feat in its game at No. 21 Boise State two weekends ago as it had a 300-yard passer in graduate QB **Spencer Petras** (372 yards), a 200-yard receiver in senior WR **Jalen Royals** (211 yards) and a 100-yard rusher in senior RB **Rahsul Faison** (109 yards). Overall, it is just the sixth time in school history that USU has accomplished the feat and the first time since 2001 at South Florida with **Jose Fuentes** (333 passing yards), **Kevin Curtis** (221 receiving yards) and **Emmett White** (108 rushing yards). Ironically, that trio also accomplished the feat the prior week against Weber State in 2001. Additionally, USU also had a 300-yard passer, 200-yard receiver and 100-yard rusher against Idaho in 2000, against Sam Houston State in 1998 and against Pacific in 1995.

TWO AGGIES PLAYING THEIR SEVENTH SEASON OF COLLEGE FOOTBALL

• Utah State has two players that are in their seventh season of college football in graduate senior OL **Wyatt Bowles** and graduate senior QB **Spencer Petras**. Bowles has spent all seven years at USU, while Petras spent his first six seasons at Iowa.

• There are 34 players at the FBS level playing in their seventh season and seven reside in the Mountain West. The other five are Zach Beagle (LB) and Spencer Lovell (OL) from Nevada, Elijah Robinson (DL) and Logan Taylor (LB) from Hawai'i, and Jarvis Ware (DB) from UNLV.

UTAH STATE MILESTONES THAT EQUAL SUCCESS

• Utah State has won 47 of its last 62 games when it has a 100-yard rusher, including an 0-3 record this year, 54 of its last 64 contests when rushing at least 40 times in a game, and 73 of its last 82 games when scoring at least 30 points, including a 1-2 record last year.

UTAH STATE HAS 17 COME-FROM-BEHIND WINS IN LAST FOUR YEARS

• Utah State has posted 17 come-from-behind wins in the last three years, including its 36-14 win against Robert Morris in the season opener as it trailed 14-10 at halftime. Last year, USU posted double-digit comeback wins against both Colorado State and UConn as it trailed 17-0 in both of those games, which are tied for the fourth-largest comebacks in school history. In fact, nine of USU's comebacks in the last four years have been when trailing by double digits.

UTAH STATE 11-2 IN THE LAST FOUR YEARS IN ONE-SCORE GAMES

• Utah State is 11-2 in one-score games over the last four years, including a 3-2 record last season, following its 44-41 double-overtime win at New Mexico in its regular season finale. USU also posted a 32-24 double-overtime win at San Diego State, a 34-33 win at UConn, and lost to James Madison 45-38 and to Fresno State 37-32 last year.

UTAH STATE HAS WON 21 STRAIGHT GAMES WITH FOURTH-QUARTER LEAD

• Utah State has now won 21 straight games when it takes a lead into the fourth quarter following its 36-14 win against Robert Morris last weekend.

/// 2024 UTAH STATE OFFENSIVE NOTABLES ///

PETRAS SETS SCHOOL AND CAREER RECORDS IN UNLV GAME

• Graduate QB **Spencer Petras** set school and career records in completions and attempts as he was 41-of-59 passing for a career-best 461 yards with a career-high-tying three touchdowns and three interceptions in Utah State's 50-34 Mountain West home loss to UNLV last weekend. The previous school record for completions was 34 set by **Gym Kimball** against UNLV in 1984, while the previous school record for attempts was 57 by **Anthony Calvillo** against BYU in 1993.

• Additionally, Petras' 461 passing yards are the fifth-most in a single game in school history and the most by an Aggie since **Jordan Love** threw for 491 yards against San José State in 2018.

PETRAS' PERFORMANCE AGAINST UNLV AMONG THE BEST IN THE NATION

• Graduate QB **Spencer Petras** had one of the best days in college football by a quarterback this year in his last outing against UNLV as he was 41-of-59 passing for 461 yards with three touchdowns and three interceptions, all of which are career highs. His 41 completions are tied for the most in the nation this season along with Oregon's Dillon Gabriel, while his 59 attempts are the second-most behind Syracuse's Kyle McCord who attempted 63 passes against UNLV. Furthermore, Petras' 461 passing yards are the second-most in the nation this season behind North Carolina's Jacolby Criswell who had 475 passing yards against James Madison. Petras also carried the ball seven times for 10 yards against UNLV and finished the game with 471 yards of total offense, which is the 10th-most in the nation this year.

PETRAS PLAYING WELL IN HIS LAST THREE GAMES

• Graduate QB **Spencer Petras** has played very well during his last three games after missing the previous two-and-one-half games with an injury suffered in the second quarter of the season opener against Robert Morris.

• Against UNLV, Petras was 41-of-59 passing for 461 yards with three touchdowns and three interceptions, all of which are career highs.

• Against Boise State, Petras was 27-of-41 passing for a then-career-high 372 yards and a career-high-tying three touchdowns. His 27 completions were also a career high and it was his first-career 300-yard passing game. He had touchdown passes of 59, 75 and six yards, and that 75-yard completion is a career-long.

• Against Temple, Petras was 26-of-44 passing for a then-career-high 293 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. His 26 completions also tied his career high.

• In his last three games, Petras is 94-of-144 (.653) passing for 1,126 yards (375.3 yard per game) with eight touchdowns and four interceptions.

• Petras now has 13-career 200-yard passing games, including two 300-yard games, and has thrown multiple touchdown passes in nine games, including three touchdowns in four games.

• His game against Temple on Sept. 21, 2024, was the first time he played a full game since the 2022 season at Iowa.

ROYALS POSTS THIRD STRAIGHT 100-YARD RECEIVING GAME

• Senior WR **Jalen Royals** has now posted three-straight 100-yard receiving games for the second time in his career and has seven-career 100-yard receiving games, which is tied for the ninth-most in school history. In his last game against UNLV, he had a career-high-tying 10 receptions for 155 yards and one touchdown. He also had nine receptions for a career-high 211 yards and two touchdowns two weekends ago at No. 21 Boise State. And had a career-high 10 receptions for 112 yards and one touchdown at Temple in his previous game.

• In his last three games, Royals has 29 receptions for 478 yards (159.3 ypg) and four touchdowns.

• Royals has nine touchdown receptions of 50-plus yards in his career and has a touchdown catch in 12 of his last 15 games. Last year, he led the nation with seven touchdown receptions of 50-plus yards.

ROYALS HAD CAREER GAME AGAINST BOISE STATE

• Senior WR **Jalen Royals** had a career game against No. 21 Boise State two weekends ago as he had nine receptions, one shy of his career high, for a career-best 211 yards and two touchdowns for his first-career 200-yard game. In fact, Royals had eight receptions for 200 yards and two touchdowns in the first half against the Broncos. His touchdown receptions were from 59 and 75 yards and that 75-yard reception is a career long. Royals finished the game with a career-high 283 all-purpose yards as he added four kickoff returns for 72 yards.

• Those 211 receiving yards are tied for the 11th-most in a single game in school history along with **Bob Wicks** (1971 vs. Idaho) and are the 10th-most in the nation this season. It is also the most receiving yards by an Aggie since **Deven Thompkins** had 215 receiving yards at New Mexico State in 2021.

ROYALS HONORED BY SENIOR BOWL AND EAST-WEST SHRINE BOWL

• Senior WR **Jalen Royals** was named the Breakout Offensive Player of the Week by the East-West Shrine Bowl and the Offensive Player of the Week by the Reese's Senior Bowl as he caught nine passes for a career-high 211 yards and two touchdowns at No. 21 Boise State two weekends ago.





ROYALS IN THE RECORD BOOK

• Senior WR **Jalen Royals** is the 23rd player in school history to post 100 career receptions and the 40th to have 1,000 career receiving yards.

• For his career, Royals has now caught 115 passes for 1,726 yards and 20 touchdowns. He ranks fifth all-time in school history in touchdown catches, 17th all-time in receiving yards, 20th all-time in receptions and tied for ninth all-time in 100-yard receiving games with seven.

• Last season, Royals had 71 receptions for 1,080 yards and a school-record 15 touchdowns and he is just the 13th player in school history to record 1,000 receiving yards in a season. Overall, his 1,080 receiving yards are the 10th-most in a single season in school history, while his 71 receptions are tied for the 10th most and his 15 total touchdowns are tied for the eighth-most.



FAISON IN THE RECORD BOOKS

• Senior RB **Rahsul Faison** has carried the ball 226 times for 1,323 yards (5.9 yards per carry) during his two-year Utah State career and he currently ranks 22nd all-time in school history in rushing yards. Overall, Faison is the 34th running back in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a career.

• Faison is averaging 5.9 yards per attempt in his career, which is tied with **Gerold Bright** (2016-19) and **Robert Turbin** (2007-09, 2011) for the ninth-best yards per attempt average in school history.

FAISON JUST MISSES FOURTH-STRAIGHT 100-YARD RUSHING GAME

• Senior RB **Rahsul Faison** just missed posting his fourth-straight 100-yard rushing game in his last outing against UNLV as he gained 83 yards on 15 carries and one touchdown. Faison gained 65 yards on 10 carries in the first half, but carried the ball just five times for 18 yards in the second half due to injury.

• Faison has now rushed for a touchdown in each of his last three games and is the first Aggie to accomplish that feat since **Calvin Tyler Jr.** in 2022. Overall, he now has three rushing touchdowns this year and eight in his career.

• In his previous game at No. 21 Boise State, Faison posted his third-straight 100-yard game as he ran for 109 yards on 26 carries and one touchdown. He is just the second running back this year to rush for 100 yards against BSU and his 109 yards on the ground are the most by a Bronco opponent this season.

• Against Temple, Faison rushed for 148 yards on a career-high 27 carries and one touchdown. Those 27 carries are the most by an Aggie since **Calvin Tyler Jr.** carried the ball 30 times against San José State in 2022.

• In his previous game against No. 12 Utah, Faison carried the ball 19 times for 115 yards. He was just the second player in Utah's last 16 games to rush for 100 yards against the Utes and his 115 yards were the most since Penn State's Nicholas Singleton rushed for 120 yards against Utah in the 2023 Rose Bowl.

• Faison, who is the first Aggie to rush for 100 yards in three-straight games since **Kerwynn Williams** in 2012, has five 100-yard rushing games in his career.

• Faison had a pair of 100-yard games last year as he rushed for a career-high 181 yards on a then-career-best 22 carries against Nevada and had 106 yards on 18 carries at New Mexico.

OTHER OFFENSIVE NOTABLES AGAINST UNLV

• Graduate senior TE **Broc Lane** tied his career high with five receptions for 45 yards and one touchdown. His six-yard touchdown catch in the fourth quarter was his second this year and the fourth of his career. Freshman RB **Herschel Turner Jr.** scored on a three-yard run in the fourth quarter for his second rushing touchdown of the season. Turner had a season-high nine carries in the game for 20 yards. He also had a season-high three receptions for a season-best 18 yards. Sophomore TE **Will Monney** had a career-high two receptions for 26 yards.

UTAH STATE RETURNS EXPERIENCED OFFENSIVE LINE IN 2024

• Utah State has a veteran and experienced offensive line this season as it returns four starters from last year in graduate senior **Wyatt Bowles** (12 GP/8 GS), senior **Falepule Alo** (10 GP/8 GS), senior **Cole Motes** (10 GP/10 GS) and junior **Aloali'i Maui** (13 GP/9 GS). USU also returns two more experienced players that saw significant playing time in 2023 in sophomore **Teague Andersen** (12 GP/7 GS) and sophomore **Tavo Motu'apuaka** (7 GP/7 GS).

• Overall, Utah State has 10 players on its roster that has in-game experience at the Division I level, including eight players that played at USU last season. Those eight Utah State players that have previous experience in the program include **Bowles** (46 GP/14 GS), **Alo** (38 GP/21 GS), **Motes** (37 GP/28 GS), **Maui** (19 GP/15 GS), **Andersen** (18 GP/13 GS), junior **Elia Migao** (19 GP), sophomore **Bryce Radford** (19 GP/1 GS) and **Motu'apuaka** (7 GP/7 GS).

• Heading into the 2024 campaign, those offensive linemen had 68 starts, which were the second-most in the Mountain West behind Fresno State and the 22nd-most in the nation. Furthermore, they entered the season having played in 195 games, which was the most in the Mountain West and the 17th-most in the nation.

• In addition to the eight players mentioned above, Utah State added a pair of four-year transfers to the offensive line in junior **Trey Andersen** (Eagle Mountain, Utah/Lehi HS/Pittsburgh) and sophomore **George Maile** (West Valley City, Utah/Bingham HS/Baylor). Andersen spent three seasons at Pittsburgh (2021-23) and played in 21 games, while Maile spent two seasons at Baylor (2022-23), appearing in 13 games.

UTAH STATE'S OFFENSIVE LINE PLAYED WELL AT BOISE STATE

• One of the main reasons why Utah State's offense has played well is because of the recent play of its offensive line. At Boise State two weekends ago, USU's offensive line allowed just one sack, which was on the first play of the game. BSU entered that game leading the nation with 20 sacks. The offensive line has also paved the way for senior RB **Rahsul Faison** to become the first Aggie back since 2012 to post three-straight 100-yard rushing games.

• Junior S **Ike Larsen** posted his third double-digit tackle game of the season and the eighth of his career against UNLV as he tied his career-high with 11 tackles, while also tying his career-high with two pass breakups. Earlier in the year, Larsen tied his career high with 11 tackles and had a career-high-tying two pass breakups at No. 13 USC and had 10 tackles at No. 21 Boise State.

• In the season opener against Robert Morris, Larsen intercepted his ninth-career pass and is now just one interception shy of entering the top 10 all-time in school history.

SLONE HAS CAREER GAME AGAINST UNLV

• Senior DE **Cian Slone** had a career game in his last outing against UNLV as he tied his career high with six tackles and added a career-best 2.0 sacks. He now has 5.0 sacks and 9.5 tackles for loss in his career, including 3.0 sacks this season.

FALATEA HAS CAREER GAME AGAINST UNLV

• Junior DE **Lawrence Falatea** had a career game in his last outing against UNLV as he had a career-high six tackles, which included a career-high-tying 1.0 sacks, to give him 2.0 sacks on the season, and 3.0 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss in his career.

OTHER DEFENSIVE NOTABLES IN UNLV GAME

• Redshirt senior S **Omari Okeke** had a career-high seven tackles. Graduate ILB **Jon Ross Maye** had 1.0 tackles for loss to give him 3.0 tackles for loss on the season and 36.0 in his career. Sophomore ILB **Bronson Olevao Jr.** had 1.0 sacks, the first of his career, to give him 1.0 sacks and 3.0 tackles for loss in his career. Graduate CB **Jaiden Francois** had 0.5 tackles for loss to give him 1.5 tackles for loss on the season and 5.0 in his career. Redshirt freshman DT **Siolaa Lolohea** had 1.0 tackles for loss, the first of his career. Graduate ILB **Jadon Pearson** had 0.5 tackles for loss, the first of his career. Junior DT **Isaiah Bruce** had 0.5 tackles for loss, the first of his career. Senior S **Jordan Vincent** had one pass breakup, his first this year, to give him 17 pass breakups in his career.

VINCENT HAS DOUBLE-DIGIT TACKLE STREAK STOPPED AT FOUR GAMES

• Senior S **Jordan Vincent** posted double-digit tackles in each of his first four games with the Aggies as he had 10 tackles against Robert Morris, 11 tackles at No. 13 USC, 11 tackles against No. 12 Utah and 11 tackles at Temple. Overall, Vincent has eight career double-digit tackle games. Vincent also had his first interception of the season and the fourth of his career against the Utes.

• Vincent was the first Aggie ever to post double-digit tackles in his first four games with the program. He was also the first player to begin a season with four-straight double-digit outings since **Bobby Wagner** had double-digit tackles in his first five games of the 2011 campaign.

GRAHAM FORCING TURNOVERS IN FIRST YEAR WITH UTAH STATE

• Redshirt junior CB **DJ Graham II**, a transfer from Oklahoma, intercepted his first pass of the season and the third of his career two weekends ago at No. 21 Boise State. Graham has also forced two fumbles on the year for the Aggies.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS WITH KOTSANLEE

• Senior P **Stephen Kotsanlee** has punted 208 times in his career for an average of 42.6 yards per punt (8,704 yards), which is the fourth-best average in school history. For his career, he has 43 punts of at least 50 yards and 73 punts that have been downed inside the 20-yard line.

• Kotsanlee averaged 43.4 yards per punt in 2023, which is tied for the sixth-best single-season average in school history. Had a career-long 69-yard punt against Idaho State (9/9/23), which is tied for the 16th-longest punt in school history

• Kotsanlee punted 67 times for an average of 43.4 yards in 2022, which is the sixth-best average in school history. He punted 53 times for an average of 42.5 yards in 2021, which is the 10th-best single-season average in school history.

• As a freshman in 2020, Kotsanlee earned honorable mention all-Mountain West honors as he punted 37 times for an average of 40.7 yards.

NIMROD NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

• Graduate senior PK **Elliott Nimrod** was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week following his performance against Robert Morris in the season opener. Against the Colonials, Nimrod made a career-high three field goals (36, 50, 42) on a career-high three attempts and his 50-yard field goal was a career long. He was also 3-of-4 on extra points as he finished the game with 12 points. Nimrod also kicked off eight times and all eight of his kickoffs were touchbacks, which is a career high.

• Nimrod is 3-of-7 on the season and 14-of-21 in his career on field goals, including 0-of-1 from 20-29 yards, 7-of-10 from 30-39 yards, 3-of-5 from 40-49 yards and 1-of-2 from 50+ yards.

• Utah State finished the 2023 season tied for first in the Mountain West and 10th in the nation with three blocked kicks.

• Last season, Utah State blocked its third kick of the year against Boise State on a punt in the third quarter. USU also blocked an extra point with 40 seconds remaining to preserve a 34-33 win at UConn. And, USU blocked a punt at No. 25 Iowa. USU has blocked 10 kicks (7 punts, 2 extra points, 1 field goal) in the last three-plus seasons, which included four blocks (3 punts, 1 extra point) during the 2022 campaign. The school record for blocked kicks in a season is six set in 2012.

Senior WR Jalen Royals (1) had nine receptions for a career-high 211 yards and two touchdowns (59, 75) in Utah State's 62-30 Mountain West loss at No 21 Boise State.

BOISE, Idaho - Career performances from graduate QB **Spencer Petras** and senior WR **Jalen Royals** were not enough as Utah State fell to No. 21 Boise State 62-30 in both team's Mountain West opener at Albertsons Stadium on Saturday, Oct. 5, 2024.

The duo of Petras and Royals connected nine times on the evening for a combined 211 yards and two touchdowns, including a 75-yarder midway through the second quarter, the longest passing play of Petras' career and the longest reception of Royals' career.

Petras finished the night with a career-best 372 passing yards on 27-of-41, while throwing three touchdowns with no interceptions. His 27 completions are also a career high. Royals' 211 receiving yards are not only a career-high, but it is his first-career 200-yard receiving game. In fact, those 211 receiving yards are tied for the 11th-most in a single-game in school history.

Senior RB **Rahsul Faison** finished the night with 109 yards on 26 carries for his third-straight 100-yard rushing game of the season. In fact, Faison is the first Aggie since 2012 to post three-straight 100-yard rushing games.

Utah State also accomplished a rare feat of having a 300-yard passer, 200-yard receiver and 100-yard rusher in the same game for just the sixth time in school history and for the first time since 2001.

Despite compiling 507 yards of total offense, including 372 through the air and 135 on the ground, and scoring the most points since the team's season opener against Robert Morris, Utah State was unable to keep pace with the high-powered Bronco offense.

Boise State scored on its first play from scrimmage, a 63-yard touchdown run by Ashton Jeanty. After countering with a 36-yard field goal from redshirt freshman PK **Tanner Cragun**, the first of his career, BSU struck again with 4:08 left in the first quarter to make it 14-3.

The Aggies pulled back within a score just 30 seconds into the second quarter when Petras hit Royals on a 59-yard connection to make it 14-10.

However, three-straight Bronco touchdowns including two more by Jeanty, blew the game open at 35-10. With 5:29 left in the second quarter, a two-play, 35-second drive resulted in a 75-yard touchdown pass from Petras to Royals, but Boise State was able to tack on two more touchdowns before the half to make it 49-17 at the break.

In the third quarter, the Aggie defense limited Boise State to just six points on a pair of field goals and USU's offense was able to stack back-to-back touchdowns. A six-yard pass by Petras found junior WR **Otto Tia** in the end zone for the first touchdown of his career to cap a 10-play, 77-yard drive. Then, an interception by redshirt junior CB **DJ Graham II** in the closing seconds of the third quarter set up another touchdown drive for Utah State, this time a six-play, 43-yard drive resulting in an eight-yard touchdown run by Faison to cut the lead to 55-30. The final touchdown of the night belonged to Boise State, scoring with 11:08 remaining in the fourth.

Seven different Aggies had receptions in the game, including six catches for 59 yards by graduate WR **Kyrese White** and a career-best 40 yards on a career-high five receptions by sophomore WR **Grant Page**.

Defensively, Utah State allowed 599 yards, including 303 through the air and 296 on the ground. Twenty-three different players recorded at least one tackle for USU, led by 10 stops from junior **S Ike Larsen**, who also recorded one tackle for a loss.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. - Graduate QB **Spencer Petras** was 26-of-44 passing for a career-high 293 yards with two touchdowns in Utah State's 45-29 loss at Temple on Saturday, Sept. 21, 2024, at Lincoln Financial Field.

The Aggies were in complete control of the contest midway through the second quarter, as the defense registered a trio of 3-and-outs on Temple's first four drives while the Utah State offense found its rhythm en route to 300 yards in the first half.

Freshman RB **Herschel Turner** recorded his first career touchdown on a 4-yard run early in the second quarter for the first points of the game. Turner finished the game with 32 rushing yards on six carries.

On USU's next drive, Petras found senior WR **Jalen Royals** for a 26-yard score to put the Aggies up 14-0. Royals finished the day with a career-high 10 receptions for 112 yards, which is his fifth-career 100-yard receiving game.

After Utah State generated its two-possession lead, the Temple offense awoke as Antonio Jones scored on a 32-yard rush before Antwain Littleton II tied the game on a 17-yard touchdown catch from Evan Simon.

On the Aggies' final drive of the first half, senior RB **Rahsul Faison** restored USU's lead with a 20-yard scamper, part of a season-high 148 yards on a career-high 27 attempts. The Owls did not relent, however, as Maddux Trujillo hit a 64-yard field goal as time expired to trim Utah State's halftime lead to 21-17.

USU began the second half much like the first, forcing a three-and-out and quickly marched deep into Temple territory on offense. A sack from the Owls then led to a missed field goal from graduate PK **Elliott Nimrod**. Three plays later, Temple's Simon found Dante Wright for a 91-yard touchdown to give Temple the lead for good as Simon threw another two touchdowns to begin the fourth quarter and put the home side up, 38-21.

The Aggies attempted a comeback on the ensuing possession, taking only four plays to go 75 yards as Petras found junior WR **Jack Hestera** for a 28-yard touchdown. Petras then found graduate WR **Kyrese White** for the 2-point conversion to bring USU within nine points. The following onside kick attempt was recovered by Temple, however, leading to a one-yard touchdown keeper from Simon to fully ice the game. White finished the game with a career-high eight receptions for 96 yards.

Petras, who tied his career high with 26 completions, had one interception on the day.

Senior S **Jordan Vincent** recorded double-digit tackles for the fourth consecutive games, ending with 11 stops. Senior DT **Miguel Jackson** recorded USU's lone sack of the contest, while graduate DE **Blaine Spires**, graduate CB **Jaiden Francois** and graduate S **Torren Union** also had 1.0 tackles for loss apiece.

Junior CB **DJ Graham II** forced one fumble, USU's second forced fumble of the season, which was recovered by the Owls. Junior CB **Avante Dickerson** and junior S **Simeon Harris** each had one pass breakup for the Aggies.

Utah State outgained Temple, 479-451, and had 26 first downs to the Owls' 20. The Aggies went 6-for-15 on third down, and 1-for-2 on fourth down, while the Owls converted 10-of-16 third down attempts. The Aggies also went 2-for-4 in the red zone while Temple registered four scores on four red zone attempts.

Junior DE **Lawrence Falatea** made his first-career start, while Graham made his first start as an Aggie.

LOGAN, Utah - Utah State football raced out to a 14-3 lead but could not hold off No. 12 Utah as the Utes claimed a 38-21 victory on Saturday, Sept. 14, 2024, at Maverik Stadium in the Battle of the Brothers.

In the first contest in the rivalry since 2015, and the first in Logan since USU claimed a 27-20 overtime victory in 2012, Utah State looked to replicate history in the early going. After a Utah field goal opened the scoring, the Aggies jumped in front via a 20-yard touchdown pass from junior QB **Bryson Barnes** to graduate senior TE **Broc Lane**, capping a 4-play, 77-yard drive. USU again took only four plays to hit paydirt on its next drive with junior WR **Jack Hestera** hauling in the 14-yard touchdown catch from Barnes to go up 14-3.

The Utes responded on the ensuing possession, trimming USU's lead to four points with a 11-yard TD pass from Isaac Wilson to Money Parks. USU's next possession ventured into Utah territory as the Aggies took eight plays to go 50 yards. The field goal attempt, however, was blocked. The Utes engineered another scoring drive ending in an 11-yard pass from Wilson, this time to Caleb Lohner, to give the visitors a 17-14 lead heading into halftime.

A pair of half-sacks from senior DT **Miguel Jackson** and junior DE **Gabe Peterson** thwarted Utah's opening drive of the third quarter, forcing the second field goal of the day from Cole Becker.

After an Aggie punt on its next possession, Utah scored a 3-yard touchdown run by Micah Bernard, pushing the lead to 28-14 following a two-point conversion.

Utah State converted two fourth-downs on its next drive, including a 31-yard pass from Barnes to graduate senior WR **Colby Bowman** on a 4th-and-1 near midfield. After senior RB **Rahsul Faison** converted a 4th-and-5 with a 17-yard run that was initially ruled a touchdown, Barnes scored on a 1-yard run to cap the 9-play, 63-yard drive and bring USU back within a single possession.

The Aggie defense then delivered on the second play of Utah's next drive as a tipped ball fell into the arms of senior S **Jordan Vincent**. Vincent, who tied for the team lead alongside graduate senior ILB **Clyde Washington** with 11 tackles, returned the interception 15 yards to set USU up at the Utes' 27-yard line. The Aggies' drive stalled, however, and graduate senior PK **Elliott Nimrod**'s field goal missed wide left to keep the deficit at 28-21.

On the very next play, Utah's Bernard broke a 64-yard rush to enter the red zone. After USU's defense forced a fourth down attempt, Wilson found Carsen Ryan for the two-yard score to re-establish a two-score lead for the Utes. Becker then added his third field goal of the game to extend the lead to its final margin.

Barnes ended the game with a season-high 223 yards on 16-of-31 passing with two touchdowns and two interceptions against his former team. He also rushed for 36 yards on 11 attempts and a score.

Junior WR **Otto Tia** posted a career-high five catches and for a career-best 78 yards, while senior WR **Jalen Royals** had four catches for 44 yards before exiting with an injury.

On the ground, Faison led the way with his third career 100-yard game, ending with 115 yards on 19 carries.

As a team, the Aggies set a new season-high with eight tackles for loss as 10 players recorded a TFL on the day.

Utah State finished the game with 385 yards of total offense (245 passing, 140 rushing) as compared to 460 total yards for Utah (239 passing, 221 rushing). The Utes also had a 37:18 to 22:42 advantage in time of possession.

LOS ANGELES, Calif. - On the road against the 13th-ranked team in the nation, Utah State was unable to keep pace as USC showcased its prowess on both sides of the ball, resulting in a 48-0 defeat on Saturday, Sept. 7, 2024, at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. It was the first time USU had been shutout since losing at No. 1 Alabama back in 2022, 55-0.

USC finished the game with 544 yards of total offense (295 passing, 249 rushing) as compared to just 190 total yards for the Aggies (103 passing, 87 rushing). USU was also just 2-of-11 on third down as compared to 6-of-10 for the Trojans.

After stiffening in the red zone and forcing a field goal on USC's opening drive of the game, the Aggies began marching down the field on their first possession as it moved into Trojan territory after a 17-yard rush from senior RB **Rahsul Faison** before the drive stalled.

Despite graduate P **Stephen Kotsanlee** pinning USC at the 12-yard line, the Trojans took eight plays to go 88 yards for the score to go up, 10-0.

The Aggies made several attempts to stage a comeback in the opening half, including a forced fumble in the red zone from redshirt junior CB **DJ Graham II**, which was then recovered by graduate ILB **Clyde Washington**. However, USU was unable to overcome an interception on a tipped pass and a failed fourth-down conversion as USC opened up a 27-0 halftime lead.

The Aggies advanced into USC territory on the opening drive of the third quarter and faced a 4th-and-12 from the Trojan 43-yard line. A well-timed blitz from USC doomed the fourth-down attempt, and the ensuing touchdown drive from USC further cemented the Trojans' control of the contest.

Freshman RB **Herschel Turner Jr.** reeled off a pair of 15- and 19-yard runs on USU's final drive of the game to move deep into Trojan territory, but a 52-yard field goal attempt from graduate PK **Elliott Nimrod** fell just short of putting the Aggies on the board.

Junior QB **Bryson Barnes** ended the game with 103 yards on 18-for-27 passing with one interception. Faison led the way on the ground for the Aggies with 54 yards on nine attempts, including a long rush of 20 yards, while Turner finished second on the team with 38 yards on a season-best eight carries.

Five different Aggies recorded two or more receptions as senior WR **Jalen Royals** posted a team-high 47 yards on six catches. Graduate TE **Broc Lane** added three catches for 27 yards, while Faison tied his career high with three receptions out of the backfield. Graduate WR **Colby Bowman** and fellow graduate WR **Kyrese White** each chipped in with two catches for seven and 15 yards, respectively.

Defensively, senior S **Jordan Vincent** again reached double-digit tackles with 11. Junior

S Ike Larsen also had 11 tackles, which tied his career high, while adding a career-high-tying two pass breakups. Larsen also intercepted a pass in the second quarter and returned it into USC territory, but the play was called back due to an off-sides on the Aggies.

Redshirt junior ILB **Jadon Pearson** added a career-high seven tackles, while sophomore S **Malik McConico** had a career-high five tackles in his first career start.

Junior CB **Avante Dickerson** and redshirt junior ILB **John Miller** added one pass breakup each. Dickerson also added a tackle for loss, along with Washington.

LOGAN, Utah - Utah State amassed 646 yards of total offense and shutout Robert Morris in the second half en route to a 36-14 season-opening home win at Maverik on Saturday, Aug. 31, 2024.

Trailing 14-10 at the break, Utah State scored 26 unanswered points in the final 30 minutes as it had 376 yards in the second half.

Utah State began the game with back-to-back interceptions on offense before graduate senior WR **Kyrese White** broke loose for a 57-yard touchdown to start the scoring late in the first quarter. Following an RMU answer on the ensuing drive, the Aggies moved back into the red zone to set up a 36-yard field goal from graduate senior PK **Elliott Nimrod** to retake the lead.

Utah State's next drive stalled, however, after graduate senior QB **Spencer Petras** exited with an injury. Petras ended the game with 145 yards on 10-of-15 passing with one touchdown and two interceptions. Following Petras' exit, the Colonials captured the momentum with a touchdown late in the second quarter to claim a 14-10 halftime lead.

Coming out of intermission, Utah State asserted itself over the final 30 minutes, holding Robert Morris scoreless and to only 115 yards of total offense. White again led the Aggies, this time taking a swing pass 53 yards for the score to give USU the lead for good. Nimrod connected on another field goal, a career-long 50-yarder, to push the lead to 20-14.

On the next possession with RMU driving to begin the fourth quarter, junior S **Ike Larsen** made his presence known, picking off the third-down pass to deliver the ball back to the Aggie offense. It was Larsen's second possession-switching play of the night after recording a fourth-down stop in the first half.

On the second play of USU's ensuing drive, junior QB **Bryson Barnes** took off up the middle, breaking loose for a career-long 63-yard touchdown scamper to firmly put the Aggies in the driver's seat.

Utah State continued to take control, forcing a three-and-out to immediately regain possession. Junior RB **Robert Briggs Jr.** then broke through the defense for a 55-yard run before being forced out. Briggs also suffered a leg injury on the play and had to be carted off the field. USU's momentum persisted, however, as Barnes connected with senior WR **Jalen Royals** for a 21-yard strike to push the advantage to 33-14. Nimrod connected on a 42-yard field goal on Utah State's final drive to account for the final tally.

The Aggie attack was equally effective through the air as on the ground as the offense totaled 343 passing yards alongside 303 rushing yards. Barnes finished with a line of 11-for-21 passing for 198 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. He also tied for the team lead in rushing alongside Briggs as the pair each finished with 88 yards on five and nine attempts, respectively. Senior RB **Rahsul Faison** added 12 carries for 78 yards, while freshman **Herschel Turner Jr.** made his collegiate debut and gained 44 yards on four rushes. White led the Aggies in receiving with 131 yards on three catches, while Royals posted a team-high five catches for 77 yards.

A pair of newcomers led the Aggie defense as graduate senior ILB **Jon Ross Maye** and senior S **Jordan Vincent** each finished with 10 tackles. The Aggies also received a pair of sacks from senior DE **Cian Slone** and graduate senior DE **Blaine Spires**.
