SALT LAKE CITY—Alex Smith directed six touchdown drives and Utah mauled Texas A&M, 41-21, on Sept. 2 in Rice-Eccles Stadium. Performing before an ESPN national television audience and a standing room only crowd of 45,419, Smith passed for three touchdowns and ran for two scores. The junior completed 21 of 29 passes for a career-high 359 yards and also rushed for 13 times for 76 yards. On the fourth play of the game, Smith hit Steve Savoy for a 78-yard touchdown pass. His other TD throws were to John Madsen and Jerome Wright. Paris Warren led all receivers with seven catches for a career-best 116 yards, while Savoy had five catches for 108 yards. Playing in his first game in two years, senior running back Marty Johnson led all rushers with 77 yards. Despite losing its two best strong safeties (Eric Weddle and Kawika Casco) to knee injuries early in the first quarter, the defense never allowed Texas A&M to get untracked. The Aggies finished with 437 total yards, but nearly 40-percent of those (169 yards) came in the fourth quarter when Utah substituted liberally. In his first start, senior linebacker Tommy Hackenbruck led the defense with 10 tackles.

Safety Eric Weddle led the defense with 11 tackles, a sack and a pass breakup and senior linebacker Tommy Hackenbruck had a monster game in his final Ute outing.
