# 2016 UTAH SOCCER WEEK 3 MATCH NOTES



### The Deseret Duel Rivalry Series

Monday's matchup between Utah and BYU will mark the first contest of the 2016-17 Deseret First Duel rivalry series. This is the 10th year of the rivalry series that includes each sport where Utah and BYU compete head-to-head during regular-season play.

The Deseret First Duel uses a system that awards points to the winner of each competition. A team trophy will be awarded to the individual winner in each sport. Points won by the individual sports will count toward each school's overall total. A granite traveling trophy is awarded to the overall series champion each year.

BYU won last season's competition, snapping a three-year run for the Utes (2013-15). The school that wins the head-to-head competition in each sport is also awarded \$1,000 by Deseret First Credit Union for its student-athlete scholarship fund. The university that wins the most sports at the end of the season will receive an additional \$5,000 from Deseret First for its athletic scholarship fund.

### Weekend Sweep

Utah Soccer has won three of its first four games for the second time in three years after sweeping last weekend's contests vs. San Diego (3-0) and at Utah State (3-0).

The Utes lead the Pac-12 with 10 goals and that total through four contests is the highest mark since they scored 12 in 2009 and started 4-0-0.

They also pace the conference with 12 assists and 30 corner-kick opportunities. Defensively, they are atop the Pac-12 with three shutouts between two goalkeepers, sophomore July Mathias and freshman Carly Nelson.

### Skolmoski Named Pac-12 Player of Week

Utah's Hailey Skolmoski was named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week on Aug. 30. The sophomore netted twice in the Ute wins over San Diego and then once more in the victory at Utah State this past weekend.

This is the first weekly honor for Skolmoski and she becomes Utah's first Offensive Player of the Week in program history. This is also Utah's 10th Pac-12 weekly honor since joining the conference.

Skolmoski has scored four goals in four contests to pace the Pac-12. That total also marks the most by a Ute player since the 2013 season.

### Jacobsen's Offensive Jump

Eden Jacobsen played every game as a freshman, starting seven in the midfield, but failed to register a single point for the Utes. This season, she is blossoming and sits third in the Pac-12 with two goals and five points.

Jacobsen starred at Woods Cross High School, 15 minutes from campus, and her father, Eric, was an all-conference selection and captain of the football team during his time at Utah. Her uncle Chad also suited up for the Utes.

### Facilitating Feet

Fourteen players in the Pac-12 have multiple assists this season and Utah has four of them, more than any other team. Katie Rogers and Taylor Slattery, the two Utes with the most career assists on the current roster, are joined by Cabria Turang and newcomer Alea Gwerder.

Rogers, a three-time Pac-12 All-Academic selection, moved into a more defensive midfield role last season and started all but one contest for the Utes. Slattery had a double-digit point output as a freshman and gained a starting spot last season, with 13 contests up front.

Turang has already graduated with a degree in Human Development and Family Studies with a minor in Disability Studies and Gwerder led Washington Premier to a U18 Rainier Challenge championship. Gwerder's emergence at the back, along with the play of two other freshmen, Tavia Leachman and Natalee Wells has helped this team transformation.

Leachman, a center back, led powerhouse Long Beach Poly to three-consecutive Moore League titles and has played all but five minutes this season. Wells was ranked as the no. 5 recruit in the state of Utah by MaxPreps and has moved back from a midfield role at the start of the season to serve as Leachman's partner in the middle.

Gwerder has been complemented on the other side by junior Janie Kearn who started last season primarily in the midfield. A former First Team All-State selection, she helped lead East HS to a pair of regional championships.

### How I Spent My Summer

Utah Soccer traveled to Germany for three matches during a 10-day stretch in mid-May.

"It was an amazing trip because we got to go to a different country and experience things as a team," senior Katie Rogers stated. "We already had tight unit off the field and that translated to our play this spring. This experience only improved our team's chemistry."

The Utes traveled to a number of cities including Frankfurt, Munich and Augsburg while also making a jaunt

into the Alps. Utah played matches against SC Opel 06 Rußselsheim, MTV Dießen and FC Stadd.

"This trip was an incredible opportunity for our players and staff," head coach Rich Manning said. "We played quality teams and watched some top-level matches that involved the best European soccer has to offer."

The group took in a Bundesliga match between FC Augsburg and Hamburger SV, visited a TSV Hoffenheim practice at its training ground and took a tour of the Allianz Arena, home of German champion Bayern Munich.

### How I Spent My Summer (Part 2)

Utah Soccer newcomer Holly Daugirda spent her summer in New Zealand where she suited up for the U.S. Under-19 Women's National Team.

After training camp in Chula Vista, California, Daugirda and the U19's traveled to New Zealand for three matches in 12 days. Daugirda started for the U19's at right back in a 2-1 win over the New Zealand National Team and a 4-4 draw against the New Zealand U20's. The Salt Lake City native is attempting to earn a spot on the U.S. U20 squad, which will take part in the World Cup this November in Papua New Guinea.

The U-19's also traveled to Spain in March and picked up a pair of 1-0 wins over Norway and England while playing out a goalless draw with Denmark. Daugirda started in defense for both victories and entered as a substitute in the draw.

The reigning NSCAA and Gatorade Player of the year for the state of Utah, Daugirda led Skyline High School to an 18-1-1 record and the Class 4A state championship in 2015. The Deseret News Class 4A MVP and a three-time First Team All-State selection, Daugirda concluded her prep soccer career with 76 goals.

### Talent in Utah's New Class

The Utes brought in 11 newcomers this season and all of them were successful in high school and at the club level. In addition to those already mentioned, the Utes boast Haylee Cacciagne, the Deseret News' Ms. Soccer 2015, Ireland Dunn, the 2015 Deseret News 5A Most Valuable Player and Carly Nelson, a two-time First Team All-State goalkeeper.

Ella Ballstaedt scored 40 goals during her high school career, Kristin Fairbairn spent three years with the BC Provincial Team at the National training center, Isabel Jones was a two-time Deseret News All-State performer, and Natalie Kump was First Team All-Area, All-League, All-State, League MVP and Offensive Player of the Year at Elko HS in Nevada.

### Series History

Despite winning this contest the last two times at Ute Field, Utah is 7-20-1 all-time against the Cougars and 4-8-0 in Salt Lake City.

Utah has won the last two meetings here by 1-0 scores. Katie Taylor converted a penalty to seal a 1-0 win in 2014 and Jill Robison netted the winner for the Utes in 2012.

Entering the weekend, Utah is 18-36-7 in its history against teams from the West Coast Conference.

### Pac-12 Postseason Recognition

Utah Soccer had two players honored by the Pac-12 Conference to close the 2015 season and freshman sensation Paola van der Veen was one of them.

Van der Veen became the fifth Ute to be named to the All-Freshman Team. She joined Avery Jenkins (2011), Lindsey Luke (2012), Katie Rogers (2013) and Mariah Elmer (2014). In her first season playing collegiate soccer, Van der Veen paced Utah with five assists and finished second on the team in scoring. A veteran of the Dutch youth national teams, Van der Veen suited up for ADO den Haag prior to her arrival in Salt Lake City.

### Manning Makes History

With a victory over Oregon State last year, Rich Manning earned his 150th career win at Utah. During his tenure, Manning has established Utah soccer as an elite program in the west.

Manning has coached the Utes to an NCAA Tournament berth in six of his years at the helm. Prior to joining the Pac-12, Manning directed Utah to three Mountain West Conference regular-season championships (2003, '05, '06) and a pair of league tournament titles (2003, '04).

### Utah Success in the Classroom

Ten members of the Utah soccer team earned Pac-12 Conference academic honors in 2015. Katie Rogers was honored for a third-straight year while Taylor Slattery and Cabria Turang earned awards for a second-straight season. Listed below are the returning award winners.

Since joining the Pac-12 in 2011, Utah women's soccer has had 57 players earn academic honors from the conference, including 10 student-athletes last season. In order to earn All-Academic status, student-athletes must have a minimum of a 3.0 GPA and either be a starter or significant contributor.

Rich Manning is entering his 15th season as the Utah head women's soccer coach. During his tenure, Manning has established Utah Women's Soccer as an elite program in the west. He has coached the Utes to an NCAA Tournament berth in six of his years at the helm. Prior to joining the Pac-12, Manning directed Utah to three Mountain West Conference regular-season championships (2003, '05, '06) and a pair of league tournament titles (2003, '04).

Manning has mentored professional and international players at Utah. He has overseen the tutelage of All-American Adele Letro as well as 20 NSCAA All-Region players. During his tenure, Manning has coached 46 all-conference selections, 23 of which have been named to the first team. He has also coached three conference offensive players of the year, two defensive players of the year and three freshmen of the year.

In the classroom, Utah posted a 3.41 team GPA, third among all Pac-12 teams. and was awarded a NSCAA Team Academic Award. Since the award was instituted in 1996, Utah has been named 16 times, including the last six seasons.

Ten members of the Utah soccer team earned Pac-12 Conference academic honors. Two student-athletes, Janie Kearn and Megan Trabert, earned spots on the second team and eight received honorable mention from the conference.

Since joining the Pac-12 in 2011, Utah women's soccer has had 57 players earn academic honors from the conference. Manning has also coached five NSCAA Scholar All-Americans and 15 All-Region honorees.

It was a special 2013 for the Utes who notched their best finish since joining the Pac-12, placing third, and earning their sixth NCAA Tournament bid in the process. The Utes also went undefeated at home in 11 matches at Ute Field.

Defender Jenny Hutton, goalkeeper Linsey Luke and midfielder Katie Taylor were recognized nationally for their success on the field as they were named All-Pacific Region by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. Hutton was also named a NSCAA Academic All-American, the first for the Utes since 2006.

Utah had four players receive postseason honors from the Pac-12 as Hutton and Luke were each named second team all-conference, junior Ashton Hall was an honorable mention selection and midfielder Katie Rigby was named to the all-freshman team.

Named Utah's head coach in January of 2002, Manning has led the Utes to a 153-103-34 (.586) overall record, averaging 11 wins per year. Utah is also 61-42-12 against conference foes under Manning's direction, posting a league win percentage of .582

Manning captured his 100th career win as a head coach during the 2009 season, all of which have come at Utah, with a 2-0 victory over Princeton at Ute Field on Sept. 9. Earlier that year, before injuries took a severe toll on the team, the Utes climbed to their first national ranking since 2006 after shutting out No. 19 Santa Clara, 1-0, reaching as high as No. 21 in the national polls.

In 2008, Manning and the Utes took on a challenging schedule with one of his most youthful teams, featuring only two senior starters. After a slow beginning, Manning coached his team to an 11-9-2 record, winning six of their last seven regular-season games to finish second in the conference. The second seed in the MWC Tournament, Utah reached the finals after defeating

TCU in the semis, avenging their regular-season loss in Fort Worth.

In 2006, Utah tied a school record for victories, finishing 16-5-1 giving Manning his third MWC Coach of the Year Award. Additionally, Adele Letro became Utah's first player ever to be named an All-American. The Utes were the first MWC team ever to record seven league victories, winning the 2006 conference title with a perfect 7-0-0 mark. Utah did not allow a goal in conference play, setting school and MWC records. 2006 also marked the third time in four years that the Utes hosted opening-weekend games in the NCAA Tournament. Utah finished that season ranked in the top 25 in each of the major polls.

Manning kicked off his Utah tenure in historic fashion, directing the Utes to their first-ever win over a top-25 team with a 2-0 shutout of No. 3 Portland at Ute Field on Sept. 1, 2002. The following week, Utah vaulted into the national rankings for the first time. Utah finished 13-4-3 overall and 4-1-1 to place second in the MWC that year, as Manning earned MWC Coach of the Year in his inaugural season.

The Utes advanced to their first-ever NCAA Tournament in 2002, defeating arch rival BYU 3-2 in overtime in the first round. Manning and the Utes set the tone as a program that would be tough to score against, ranking 29th in the NCAA in goals against average (0.29).

The program continued to flourish in 2003 when Utah tied its single-season wins mark with a 16-2-2 record as Manning was recognized as the NSCAA West Region Coach of the Year. The Utes finished the season in the Top 25 rankings for the first time, coming in at No. 24 in the final NSCAA poll. Utah's defense ranked second in the NCAA in goals against average (0.436) and fifth in shutout percentage (0.65).

The Utes were unbeaten at home that year and also captured their first-ever outright league title with a 6-0 record. The Utes hosted the MWC Tournament for the first time, defeating BYU 2-0 in the championship game. Utah then hosted NCAA first and second round games at Ute Field--another program first.

In 2004, Utah went 13-6-3, won the MWC Tournament and earned another NCAA Tournament berth. The Utes recorded one of their most impressive road victories, winning at No. 7 UCLA.

A 14-7-1 record in 2005 saw the Utes claim the MWC regular-season title with a 6-0-1 mark as Manning earned MWC Coach of the Year honors once again. The U. began the season with six consecutive wins for the best start in school history and were once again one of the top defensive teams in the nation, ranking 24th in goals against average (.707).

Manning has worked with Region IV Olympic Development Program teams over the past six years. He has coached the Region IV U-18 and U-16 girls' teams, which annually draw the top players from 13 western states.

Before assuming the top position at Utah, Manning was on the women's coaching staff for four years at Santa Clara (1998-2001). He was an assistant coach for three years before being promoted to associate head coach. Manning helped direct the Broncos to four NCAA Tournament appearances, three NCAA College Cups (national semifinals) and the 2001 NCAA Championship. During his tenure, Santa Clara went 84-11-2 and won three West Coast Conference championships. Nine players Manning recruited and coached at Santa Clara made the U.S. National Team. Manning also coached two National Players of the Year, Mandy Clemens (1999) and Aly Wagner (2001).

Prior to joining the Santa Clara staff, Manning worked with numerous youth programs in Southern California. From 1994-97, he was head coach at Los Alamitos High School, where he produced two CIF championships and sent eight players to NCAA Division I programs. Manning took 1996 CIF Coach of the Year honors and was named the 1997 Orange County Coach of the Year.

Along with his success at Los Alamitos, Manning helped develop the S.C. Blues soccer club in San Juan Capistrano, Calif., into one of the nation's top girls' youth programs.

Manning played at Santa Clara from 1982-1986 under former U.S. National Team coaches Steve Sampson and Ralph Perez. As a senior, Manning was captain of the Broncos. He earned All-Far West accolades as a junior. Manning, 45, graduated from Santa Clara cum laude with a B.S. in mathematics in 1986, followed by a master's in education from Azusa Pacific in 1996.
