Whitt 100 Watch

- > Utah head coach **Kyle Whittingham** is one win away from career victory No. 100. He is 99-46 in his 12th season at the helm.
- > There are 23 active FBS head coaches with 100 career victories.
- > **Whittingham**, in his 23rd season overall at Utah, has participated in more wins (184) than any football coach—head or assistant—in school history.
- > Nine of his 99 career wins as a head coach have come in bowl games and **Whittingham** has the best bowl win percentage (.900) in NCAA history. He is 9-1 in bowl games and 2-0 in BCS bowls (predecessor to the College Football Playoff games). See sidebar on page 2 for more on **Whittingham**.

Five Facts

- > In its second week in the top 25 this season, Utah is No. 18 in both the AP and Coaches' polls. The Utes jumped six spots in the AP rankings and five places in the Coaches' poll from a week ago. See pages 16-18 for Utah's history in the national rankings.
- > Utah is off to a 4-0 start for the second-straight season and the fourth time in **Whittingham's** head coaching career. Utah finished 13-0 in 2008, won its first eight games in 2010 and won its first six games last year.
- > Utah's 31-27 win over USC last week marks the second year in a row the Utes have won their Pac-12 opener. Utah beat Oregon in its first conference game last year. The Utes are now 2-4 in Pac-12 openers.
- > Utah is playing in Berkeley for the first time since joining the Pac-12 six years ago. Utah's game against the Bears in 2011 was played in San Francisco's AT&T Park, where Cal played its home games while Memorial Stadium was being renovated. The two teams played in Salt Lake City in 2012 and 2015 and did not meet in 2013 and 2014. See page 2 for complete series notes.
- > The Utah-Cal series is tied at five wins apiece. Utah is 1-4 in road games against California.

Utah-California Series (5-5)

Series Snapshot. Utah has won two straight and four of the last five games to even the series with California at 5-5. The last time they met in the Bay Area was in 2011 at AT&T Park, home of the San Francisco Giants and where Cal played its home games that season. The Bears won that game 34-10. The home team typically wins this match-up with Cal holding a 4-1 edge in home games and Utah leading 3-1 in Rice-Eccles Stadium.

California quarterback Jared Goff would become the No. 1 overall NFL Draft pick a few months later, but on this day Utah had his number, intercepting him five times and handing No. 23 Cal its first loss of the season, 30-24. Dominique Hatfield picked off two passes and Marcus Williams, Justin Thomas and Gionni Paul also had interceptions for the No. 5 Utes. With Cal on the Ute 21-yard line and 31 seconds remaining in the game, Goff's pass fourth-and-five pass was batted down by Boobie Hobbs. Devontae Booker reached 2,000 career rushing yards with a season-high 222 yards along with two touchdowns and Andy Phillips made three field goals.

In the Huddle

First-year Ute sophomore punter **Mitch Wishnowsky** ranks No. 1 nationally in punt average (52.1) ... True freshman **Zach Moss** is averaging 92.5 yards since becoming the starter two games ago. He has played three games total and is averaging a team-high 81.0 rushing yards per game ... Senior receiver **Tim Patrick** has back-to-back 100-yard receiving games (121 vs. San Jose State, 100 vs. USC) ... Senior cornerback **Dominique Hatfield** saw his first action last week after coming back from an injury and had five tackles and a pass breakup ... Eight true freshmen have played: **Moss, Bradlee Anae, Julian Blackmon, Terrell Burgess, Leki Fotu, Tyler Huntley, Demari Simpkins** and **Donavan Thompson**.

Two-Minute Drill

Utah has passed for more yards than its opponent in all four games ... Utah is 1-0 on the road a win at San Jose State on Sept. 17... In last year's win over Cal, Utah intercepted Bear QB Jared Goff five times, including three picks by current Utes **Dominique Hatfield** (2), **Marcus Williams** and **Justin Thomas**. See box on page 2 for a recap of the 2015 game ... The Utes have sold out 41-straight games in Rice-Eccles Stadium since the 2010 season opener. Of those sellouts, 38 have been standing room-only crowds.

Award Count

Utes have won two Pac-12 and two national weekly honors so far this season. Punter **Mitch Wishnowsky** was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week and the Ray Guy Punter of the Week following Utah's win over Southern Utah on Sept. 1. Linebacker **Sunia Tauteoli** was honored as the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week and the FWAA/Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week for his performance against BYU on Sept. 10.

Last Game

With just over five minutes remaining, Utah stunned USC by marching 93 yards in a drive that featured two fourth-down conversions, to snatch a 31-27 come from behind win over the Trojans. **Zach Moss'** 5-yard run on fourth down gave Utah a first down on the USC 18-yard line and **Troy Williams** fired the game-winning touchdown pass to **Tim Patrick** on the next play with 16 seconds remaining. Williams, who completed 21-of-34 passes for 270 yards and two touchdowns without an interception, rallied Utah back from a 24-10 third-quarter deficit. Patrick caught six passes for 100 yards, including four catches for 49 yards and a touchdown on the final drive. Offensive lineman **Isaac Asiata** started the comeback when he fell on a fumble in the end zone in the third quarter to cut USC's lead to 24-17. **Sunia Tauteoli** had a career-high 11 tackles and one of Utah's three forced fumbles—all recovered by the Utes.

Utah's All-Time Record

Utah's all-time football record is 656-449-31. The Utes are 399-186-16 at home (81-29 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 236-246-12 in road games and 21-17-3 in games played at neutral sites.

Utah vs. the Pac-12

Utah is 20-25 in league games as a conference member and 97-145-6 all-time against Pac-12 schools. The series breakdown follows: Arizona (1-4/20-19-2), Arizona State (1-4/7-20), California (2-1/5-5), Colorado (4-1/28-31-3), Oregon (1-2/9-20), Oregon State (3-2/8-11-1), Stanford (2-0/4-3), UCLA (2-3/3-11), USC (2-4/5-10), Washington (1-2/1-8), Washington State (2-2/7-7).

Whittingham File

Twelfth-year head coach **Kyle Whittingham**—the 2008 National Coach of the Year—has participated in more Utah victories than any football coach in school history. As an assistant and head coach, Whittingham has played a role in 184 victories in 22 seasons at Utah. More than half of those have come as the head coach (99-46). Whittingham's 90-percent bowl winning percentage (9-1 record) ranks first all-time in the NCAA. His postseason victories include a 2-0 mark in BCS bowls games as the co-coach of Utah's 2005 Fiesta Bowl win over Pittsburgh and the head coach for Utah's 2009 Sugar Bowl win over Alabama. Quarterback Notebook

- > Junior transfer **Troy Williams** has started every game. He is 4-0 this season and 4-1 in NCAA career starts (0-1 at Washington in 2014)
- > Williams has completed 75-of-120 pass attempts (62.5%) for 993 yards and six touchdowns (4 INT).
- > Williams has three 200-plus yard passing games this season and in his career: 272 vs. Southern Utah, 270 vs. USC and 257 vs. San Jose State
- > Williams is the only Pac-12 quarterback this season with six completions of 40 yards or longer (57, 54, 52, 49, 45 and 40 yards).
- > **Williams** ranks fifth in the Pac-12 in touchdown passes (6), yards per completion (13.24) and yards per attempt (8.28).
- > Williams threw for 270 yards and two touchdowns (0 INT) while also getting his first career rushing TD in Utah's comeback win over USC last week. He completed 15-of-22 passes (68.1%) on the last three drives, all resulting in touchdowns.
- > Williams began his career at Washington, where he played in five games with one start (loss vs. Arizona State in 2014).
- > Williams has an NCAA career completion percentage of 62.8 (98-of-156), passing for 1,169 yards and six touchdowns (6 interceptions). > True freshman **Tyler Huntley** has appeared in two games (Southern Utah, San Jose State).
- > **Huntley** has completed 4-of-6 passes for 24 yards.
- > **Huntley** quarterbacked the last two drives of the game at San Jose State, completing 1-of-2 passes. He played in the final series of the season opener against SUU, leading Utah to three first downs before time expired.

Running Back Notebook

- > True freshman **Zack Moss** (47 rushes), sophomore **Armand Shyne** (34 rushes) and junior **Troy McCormick** (31 rushes) are sharing the load at running back.
- > **Moss** has team highs of 243 net rushing yards and 47 carries, despite not playing in the season opener against Southern Utah.
- > **Moss** leads Utah and ranks sixth in the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game (81.0) He averages 5.2 yard-per-carry—second on the team.
- > As the starter in the last two games, **Moss** averaged 92.5 rushing yards. He led Utah in rushing against both San Jose State (95 yards) and USC (90 yards).
- > McCormick ranks second on the team in net rushing yards (180) and third in carries (31). He averages a team-best 5.8 yards per rush and has two touchdowns.
- > McCormick also has seven receptions for 80 yards (11.4 average).
- > McCormick is second on the team with 274 all-purpose yards.
- > **Shyne** is second on the team in rushes (34) and third in net yards (173). He is averaging 5.1 yards per carry and 57.7 yards per game (he did not play against BYU).
- > **Shyne** had a career-high 92 rushing yards on 12 carries (7.7 ypc) at San Jose State.

Receiver Notebook

- > Six receivers have started in a game this fall: **Tim Patrick** (4), **Raelon Singleton** (3), **Kyle Fulks** (2), **Tyrone Smith** (2), **Cory Butler-Byrd** (1) and **Siaosi Wilson** (1).
- > **Patrick** leads Utah in receptions (20), receiving yards (385), yards per catch (19.2), yards per game (96.2) and touchdown catches (5).
- > **Patrick** is tied for second in the Pac-12 in touchdown receptions (tied for No. 5 in the nation) and is also second in receiving yards and receiving yards per game. He is fourth in yards per catch.
- > **Patrick** has three 100-yard receiving games this season and in his career: 121 vs. San Jose State, 105 vs. Southern Utah and 100 vs. USC.
- > **Patrick** leads Utah with three receptions of 40 yards or longer: 57 vs. Southern Utah, 54 vs. San Jose State and 40 vs. USC.
- > **Patrick** leads the team and ranks 12th in the Pac-12 with 385 all-purpose yards.
- > **Patrick** is first in the league and sixth in the nation in second-half receiving yards with 240 yards on 12 catches (20.00 ypc).
- > **Singleton** is second on the team in receiving yards (140) and third in yards per catch (17.5).
- > **Butler-Byrd** has played in the last two games and is second on the team in catches (9) and receiving yards per game (57.5). He is third on the team in receiving yards (115).
- > **Smith** (5 catches, 91 yards) started the first two games, but has been sidelined the last two weeks.

Tight End Notebook

- > Senior **Evan Moeai** leads Utah's tight ends with eight catches for 78 yards (9.8 average). He is tied for third on the team in receptions.
- > **Harrison Handley** (2 starts, 3 catches for 49 yards) has the longest reception by a Ute tight end this season—28 yards against USC.
- > Other tight ends who have played are **Wallace Gonzalez** (1 reception, 11 yards) and **Ken Hampel**.

- > **Dielman**, a 2015 second-team All-Pac-12 selection as a junior tackle last season, has played in 31 games in his career with 30 starts. He is in his first season at center.
- > **Dielman** has played 294 snaps (second on the team) without giving up a sack.
- > **Dielman** is second on the team with three cuts.
- > Four-year starting guard **Asiata** has played in 36 games in his career with 34 starts.

- > Sophomore **Mitch Wishnowsky** leads the nation in punt average (52.1). He has 17 punts for 885 yards, including six downed inside the 20-yard line.
- > **Wishnowsky** leads the Pac-12 with 10 punts of 50+ yards and has the longest punt in the league this season (66 yards). His five punts of 50+ yards against Southern Utah is the second-most 50-yard punts in a game in school history.

Standing Ovation

Utah has sold out 41 consecutive games in Rice-Eccles Stadium, dating back to the 2010 season opener. Of the sellouts, 38 were played before standing-room only crowds, including all seven home games last year when the team set the school's single-season attendance record (46,533). Utah has enjoyed a 98-percent renewal rate by its season ticket holders for seven straight years.

Scoreboard Among Facility Upgrades

A high-tech massive video board rising 137 feet above the plaza behind the south stands of Rice-Eccles Stadium was installed in the summer. The overall LED display size of the board currently ranks among the largest in the country at 122 feet wide by 64 feet tall. The high-definition display has a 16:9 aspect ratio, allowing video to be shown fully without being cropped or stretched. Another feature of the \$13.5 million project (funded by the Department of Athletics and Auxiliary Services) is a distributed sound system that uses a series of speakers mounted around the top of the stadium and directs the sound downward, rather than outward, to improve the quality of the sound for those inside the stadium and reduce noise for the surrounding community. The Spence Eccles Football Complex was also upgraded over the summer with the addition of a new artificial turf practice field. The new FieldTurf practice field is adjacent to the current natural grass field behind the Spence and Cleone Football Center and the turf field inside the Spence Eccles Field House.

FanUp!

The University of Utah implemented a FanUp campaign in August of 2016 to encourage good sportsmanship from Ute fans and their athletic teams. The 20-person committee that formulated the sportsmanship initiative was represented by the Board of Trustees, administrators, faculty, staff, students, student-athletes, alumni and fans.
