



HEAD COACH | 13TH YEAR



Kyle Whittingham, the 2008 National Coach of the Year, has participated in more Utah victories than any football coach in school history. Utah has won 189 games in Whittingham's 23 years on the staff, including a 104-50 record in 12 years as the head coach.

Among those head coaching wins is a remarkable 10-1 bowl record. Whittingham owns the best bowl win percentage in NCAA history (91%) and his 10 bowl wins ties him for second among active coaches (one behind Alabama's Nick Saban). Including ties, he is ranked in the top 10 in all-time bowl victories.

Overall, he has averaged nearly nine wins a season as Utah's head coach. The Utes have wins over every team in the Pac-12 Conference since joining the league in 2011 and Whittingham's impressive non-conference resume includes a winning record against current members of the other Power Five conferences: 4-0 vs. the Big Ten, 7-1 against the ACC, 1-0 vs. the SEC and 4-3 over the Big 12.

Whittingham came to Utah in 1994 as the defensive line coach and was promoted to defensive coordinator the following year. On December 8, 2004, he was named the school's 20th head coach. His first victory came three weeks later when he co-coached (with Urban Meyer) the 2005 Fiesta Bowl win over Pittsburgh. His first regular-season victory was against Arizona in the 2005 season opener.

In 2008, Whittingham engineered the best season in Utah football history when the Utes finished 13-0 and routed Alabama—a team that spent five weeks at No. 1—in the Sugar Bowl. Utah finished the season with a No. 2 AP ranking and Whittingham was recognized as the National Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and the Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards committee.

Utah was the country's only undefeated FBS team in 2008 and beat four top-25 teams—two that finished in the top 10. In addition to his national awards, Whittingham was named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.

His success has continued in the Pac-12 Conference where Utah has claimed one

South Division co-championship (2015) and has finished in the top three in the South three times (2011, 2015, 2016). The Utes have won all four of their bowl games since joining the Pac-12. Whittingham has been a semifinalist for the George Munger Coach of the Year Award for the past three seasons (2014-16).

His teams have recorded five AP top-25 finishes: No. 2 (2008), No. 17 (2015), No. 18 (2009), No. 21 (2014) and No. 23 (2016). In 2010, Utah finished No. 23 in the Coaches' poll. Utah has appeared in every College Football Playoff ranking since its inception in 2014—finishing No. 22 in 2014 and 2015 and No. 19 in 2016.

Whittingham has also achieved success against AP top-25 teams, logging 13 wins over ranked teams, including victories over No. 4 Alabama (2009), No. 5 Stanford (2013) and No. 8 UCLA (2014).

Whittingham's players have earned numerous individual honors as well. Eleven of his players have made major All-America teams in 13 seasons. First-team All-Americans were Luther Elliss (1994, consensus defensive lineman), Eric Weddle (2006, consensus defensive back), Louie Sakoda (2007, punter; 2008, unanimous consensus place kicker), Zane Beadles (2009, offensive line), Shaky Smithson (2010, punt returner), Star Lotulelei (2012, defensive tackle), Reggie Dunn (2012, kick returner), Nate Orchard (2014, defensive end), Kaelin Clay (2014, returner), Tom Hackett (2014, consensus punter; 2015, unanimous consensus punter) and Mitch Wishnowsky (2016, unanimous consensus punter). Whittingham has also coached three second-team All-Americans in Morgan Scalley (2004, defensive back), Caleb Schlauderaff (2010, offensive line) and Hunter Dimick (2016, defensive end).

Whittingham, who also coaches Utah's punters and kickers, has mentored the Ray Guy Award winner as the nation's best punter in the last three seasons (Hackett, 2014-15 and Wishnowsky, 2016). Orchard was another of his national award winners, receiving the 2014 Ted Hendricks Award as the country's top defensive end.

Whittingham's players have won 70 first-team all-conference awards, including 19 in Utah's first six seasons of Pac-12 play. Among them were three-time first-team honoree Hackett (2013-15) and two-time recipient Lotulelei (2011-12). Utes have also captured three Morris Awards, which honors the Pac-

12's best linemen as voted on by the starting linemen on all 12 teams. Utah winners were defensive tackle Lotulelei in 2011, defensive end Orchard in 2014 and offensive guard Isaac Asiata in 2016.

Prior to joining the Pac-12, Whittingham coached a Mountain West Conference MVP in five-straight years from 2004-08: Defensive Players of the Year Scalley (2004) and Weddle (2005 and 2006), Special Teams Player of the Year Sakoda (2006, 2007, 2008), and Offensive Player of the Year Brian Johnson (2008).

Utah has also excelled academically under Whittingham. Since he became head coach in 2005, his players have earned four Academic All-America citations and 218 academic all-conference awards.

Whittingham has sent a steady stream of players into the NFL. As an assistant or head coach, he has seen 63 of his players make NFL teams, including 36 draft picks (10 first or second-round selections) and 27 undrafted free agents. A school-record six Utes were drafted in 2010, which was tied for fourth in the nation that year.

Whittingham began his coaching career in 1985-86 as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Brigham Young. He spent one season as the defensive coordinator at the College of Eastern Utah in 1987, before a six-year stint at Idaho State from 1988-93.

A linebacker for BYU from 1978-81, Whittingham earned first-team all-WAC and WAC Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1981. He played in the first four Holiday Bowls and was named Defensive MVP of the 1981 game. In 2008, he was inducted into the Holiday Bowl Hall of Fame. After his senior season, Whittingham played in the Hula and Japan Bowls. He played professionally with the Denver Broncos (1982 training camp) and the U.S. Football League's (USFL) Denver Gold (1983) and New Orleans Breakers (1984). He played on the Los Angeles Rams' replacement squad in 1987.

Whittingham graduated from BYU in 1984 and added a master's degree from the school in 1987. Born Nov. 21, 1959, he was raised in Provo, Utah. He is married to the former Jamie Daniels. They have four children: Tyler, Melissa, Alex and Kylie, and one grandchild. Tyler played for the Utes from 2009-11 and Alex is preparing for his senior season at Utah.

Taylor was also a highly-successful high school coach for seven years. Among his prep protégés was 2016 Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year Jake Browning of Washington.

Justin Ena (pronounced eh-nuh) is in his third season coaching Utah's linebackers and his second as the co-special teams coordinator. He coached two All-Pac-12 linebackers in Gionni Paul (first team) and Jared Norris (second team) in 2015. Under his supervision, the special teams' coverage units helped Utah win the 2016 FBS football statistical title for net punting average. Ena is a former defensive coordinator for Weber State and Southern Utah.



LEWIS POWELL

Lewis Powell is in his second season with the defensive line after coaching the tight ends in 2015. Defensive end Hunter Dimick was named first-team All-Pac-12 and second-team All-American in his one season under Powell and four Ute DL earned honorable mention All-Pac-12 honors. Utah led the conference in sacks and tackles for loss in 2016 and ranked in the top 15 nationally. A former Utah graduate assistant, Powell coached the defensive line at Hawaii for three seasons (2012-14).

His other FBS stops were Western Michigan, Mississippi State and UTEP. He also coached at Clark-Atlanta, Tuskegee, Alabama State and Cornell.

Freddie Whittingham begins his second year coaching Utah's tight ends after four years as the team's director of player personnel from 2012-15. He also oversees Utah's walk-on program. As the director of player personnel, Whittingham managed all aspects of recruiting administration, directed camps and clinics and was Utah's NFL liaison. He is the younger brother of Utah head coach Kyle Whittingham.



KIEL MCDONALD

Running Backs
1st Year

Kiel (pronounced Kyle) McDonald was hired as Utah's running backs coach in January after five seasons in the same position at Eastern Washington, where he was also the co-special teams' coordinator. While at EWU from 2012-16, the Eagles made the FCS playoffs four times and advanced to the national semifinals in 2012, 2013 and 2016. After inheriting a run game that just averaged 79.0 yards in 2011, McDonald's rushers improved to 183.7 yards per game in his second season.

Utah had taken a 28-24 lead with 2:18 remaining on a 30-yard touchdown pass from Troy Williams to Evan Moeai before the Ducks responded with the game-winning touchdown on a pass that was initially ruled incomplete out of bounds. Joe Williams rushed for 149 yards to become the 13th player to rush for 1,000 yards in school history (1,088) and Hunter Dimick's two sacks gave him the school career sack record (29). Cody Barton led Utah with a career-high 20 total tackles in a game where the defense allowed 575 total yards.






Kavika Luafatasaga had a career-high 12 tackles, including two tackles for loss, in the Utes’ Foster Farms Bowl win over Indiana.
