Season Outlook

The Utah ski team heads into the 2018 season with a strong mix of returners and newcomers who look to help the Utes retain their place among the top teams in NCAA skiing.

One of the biggest changes is at the top as Fredrik Landstedt takes over as Director of Skiing. Landstedt brings 26 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Utes. He spent the past 21 seasons at New Mexico, including 11 years as head coach, and helped New Mexico win the 2004 NCAA Championship. He also coached seven student-athletes to individual NCAA Championships.

Utah also has new head Nordic and alpine coaches. Two-time NCAA champion Miles Havlick returns to his alma mater to coach the Nordic team. Havlick was a seven-time All-American during his four-year Utah career (2010-13). The alpiners will be led by JJ Johnson, who joins the Utes from coaching the men's development team with the U.S. Ski Team.

The RMISA season begins on Jan. 12 in Steamboat Springs at the Colorado Invitational. Utah also competes in Montana (Jan. 18-19), New Mexico (Feb. 1-2) and Alaska (Feb. 17-18 and Feb. 20-22 for the RMISA Championships) for the regular season. The NCAA Championships will be held in Stowe, Vt., Mar. 6-9. The Utes do not have a home meet this season.

Nordic

The women's team returns all three skiers who competed at the NCAA Championships last season, including All-Americans Guro Jordheim and Mariah Bredal. Jordheim, who finished fourth at NCAA's in both the 5-km classic and 15-km freestyle last season, was the 2018 RMISA women's Nordic Athlete of the Year and RMISA women's Nordic MVP. She led the league with seven race wins and 10 podium finishes last season. In her third season at Utah, Jordheim is a four-time All-American. Bredal earned All-America honors in her first season last year with a seventh-place finish in the 5-km classic at NCAA's. She had eight top-10 finishes in 2018.

Leah Lange also competed in her first NCAA Championships last season. Her best finish came in the 5-km classic at the RMISA Championships, placing second for her first career podium finish. Lange had four top-10 finishes last year. Karianne Moe returns for her second season at Utah after recording five top-15 finishes last year.

Julia Richter joins the Utes after spending last season with the German National Team. She placed 24th in the sprint at the 2018 U23 World Ski Championships.

On the men's side, Bjørn Riksaasen had eight top-10 finishes and competed at NCAA's last year. His season-best finish was fourth twice, in the 10-km classic at the RMISA Championship and the 10-km classic at the Utah Invite. Logan Diekmann had five top-10 finishes last year, including a season-best sixth-place finish in the sprint freestyle at U.S. Nationals. Jacob Engström has three career top-10 finishes, with a career-best seventh place finish in the sprint freestyle at the Seawolf Invite in 2017.

Three newcomers join the men's team, including two from Norway. Maximilian Bie had a best finish of 36th in the 15-km classic at the 2017 Norwegian National Championships. Ola Jordheim joins sister Guro on the Utes. He finished 31st in the 50-km freestyle at the 2018 Norwegian National Championships. American Noel Keeffe, who hails from Steamboat Springs, was the 2018 junior national champion in the U20 freestyle sprints, finished second in the 10-km classic and was on the team that finished third in the 3x3.3-km relay at the U.S. Junior National Championships.

Alpine

In men's alpine, Mark Engel rejoins the Utes after spending the past four seasons with the U.S. Ski Team, including competing in the 2018 Olympics. He was the 2014 NCAA giant slalom champion in his only year at Utah. Engel is currently ranked 31st in the world in the FIS points in the slalom. Huston Philp earned All-America honors last year in the giant slalom. He had five top-10 finishes in his first season at Utah. Linus Walch competed at the NCAA Championships last season and finished 12th in the giant slalom. He had four top-10 finishes last year. Dominic Demschar returns to the Utes after taking a year off to compete in the Olympics. He is a two-time first-team All-RMISA skier and has three career podium finishes with a win in 2015.

Martin Grasic has two top-10 finishes and 16 top-15 finishes over three seasons at Utah. Ty Sprock is in his third season at Utah and has one career podium finish (third place in the giant slalom at the 2016 Utah Invitational). Fredrik Maurstad did not compete last season due to injury. He competed at the NCAA Championships at Colby-Sawyer College in 2017.

In addition to the return of Engel and Demschar, the Utes add three newcomers to the men's team. Addison Dvoracek transfers to Utah from Montana State. He earned All-America honors in the giant slalom in 2017 and has two career wins. Argentinian Tomas Birkner de Miguel competed in the 2017 and 2015 FIS World Championships with a best finish of 35th in the slalom in 2015. He has made several World Cup starts. Joachim Bakken Lien was the 2018 Norwegian junior national giant slalom champion. He finished 10th in the giant slalom at the 2018 Norwegian National Championships.

For the women, Roni Remme returns to Utah after taking 2018 away to compete in the Olympics. A three-time All-American, she has two career wins and six career podium finishes. Remme is ranked 28th in the latest slalom FIS points and has several strong finishes in World Cup this season. Julie Mohagen won the 2016 NCAA slalom title and is a two-time All-American over three seasons with the Utes. She has four career wins and 10 career podium finishes.

Kristine Aasberg transfers to Utah from Denver. She won three races and finished on the podium four times in 2018.

Three skiers are new to collegiate racing. Erin Engeset regularly finished in the top 10 at the Norwegian National Championships with best finishes of fourth in the slalom in 2017 and in the giant slalom in 2018. Australian Katie Parker, who attends the Sugar Bowl Academy, finished sixth in the Super G at the 2018 U.S. National Junior Championships. Katie Vesterstein, who attends Rowmark Ski Academy, finished 12th in alpine combined and 19th in the Super G at the 2018 U.S. National Championships.

Fredrik Landstedt

Director of Skiing
1st Season

Veteran college ski coach Fredrik Landstedt has been hired as the Director of Skiing at the University of Utah. Landstedt brings 26 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Utes.

Landstedt has spent the past 21 seasons coaching at New Mexico, including 11 years as head coach (2008-18) after working 10 seasons as head Nordic coach.

The Lobos finished in the top four at the NCAA Championships nine times during Landstedt's tenure, including winning the 2004 NCAA Championship, the first team title in New Mexico history. UNM finished second in 2006 as well as third in 2009, 2010 and 2014.

Landstedt has coached seven student-athletes to individual NCAA Championships. Kristina Strandberg (2000, 15-km classic), Jimmy Vika (2013, 10-km freestyle), Eva Severus (2014, 15-km freestyle) and Emilie Cdervaem (2015, 15-km classic) each won Nordic titles for the Lobos. Malin Hemmingsson (2009-10, slalom) was a two-time NCAA Champion in women's alpine while Joonas Rasanen (2013, slalom) and Mateja Robnik (2015, giant slalom) also won championships.

Under Landstedt, 34 Nordic skiers have earned 80 All-America honors at UNM with skiers finishing on the podium 19 times in NCAA Championship races. Strandberg and Polina Ermoshina were both seven-time All-Americans for the Lobos. Ermoshina had two runner-up finishes in women's classic. In alpine with Landstedt as overall head coach, 19 skiers have combined for 45 All-America honors since 2008.

Landstedt's athletes have also excelled in the classroom, with student-athletes named to the CoSIDA Academic All-America At-Large teams 10 times, including making the first team seven times. The at-large teams, which are comprised of student-athletes from 14 women's and 12 men's sports, are generally regarded as one of the most difficult teams to earn a spot on.

Landstedt has been the Secretary-Rules Editor on the NCAA Men's and Women's Skiing Committee since 2006. He served as the president of the Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Ski Association from 2000-06.

Landstedt was also the head Nordic ski coach at Colorado for three years (1995-97). Colorado won the 1995 NCAA title and finished third in 1997. His student-athletes earned 20 All-America honors in his three seasons, including six first team honors.

Landstedt has also coached with the U.S. Ski Team at Junior and U-23 World Championships events.

Landstedt coached the West Valley High School ski team in Fairbanks, Alaska, to two state titles in three seasons (1991-1994). While in Alaska, he won the Tour of Anchorage 50-km ski race twice (1993-94).

Landstedt graduated from New Mexico with a bachelor's degree in economics in 1991 and an associate's degree in accounting/bookkeeping in 1990. He competed at New Mexico from 1987-89. Landstedt finished fourth in men's cross country in 1987 to earn first-team All-America honors and also helped New Mexico finish third in the men's cross country relay. Landstedt began his collegiate coaching career as a Nordic assistant coach at New Mexico while finishing his degree from 1990-91.

As a competitor, Landstedt was a top national skier and placed in the top 10 at the U.S. National Championships eight times from 1991-93. Originally from Sollefteå, Sweden, he took three medals in the Swedish Junior Championships and finished in the top 20 in several national competitions as a senior racer.

Landstedt and his wife, Brenda, have three sons, Gabriel, Adrian and Andreas, and a daughter, Zara.



Miles Havlick

Head Nordic Coach
1st Season

Two-time NCAA champion skier Miles Havlick returns to his alma mater for his first season as head Nordic coach.

Havlick claimed the 2013 20-km freestyle and the 2012 20-km classical titles with the Utes. He was a seven-time All-American during his four-year career (2010-13). Havlick won seven races as a senior in 2013 and 13 total during his career, and finished third or better in 28 career races. He was a three-time *Ski Racing Magazine* Nordic Collegiate Skier of the Year and the two-time RMISA Men's Nordic MVP.

Havlick earned the 2013 Tom Hansen Conference Medal, awarded annually by the Pac-12 to each member institution's outstanding senior male and female student-athlete based on the exhibition of the greatest combination of performance and achievement in scholarship, athletics and leadership.

Following his Utah career, Havlick raced professionally with the Sun Valley Ski Education Foundation Gold Team. He finished in the top 10 several times at the U.S. National Championships and competed regularly on the U.S. Super Tour and Alpen Cup. Havlick won a World Loppet 42-km freestyle marathon in Australia in August, 2017.

Havlick recently coached with the Birkebeiner Nordic Ski Club and Victorian Junior cross country ski team in Australia in 2017. He worked as an assistant coach and wax technician for the Australian Junior National Team at the World Junior Championships in January, 2018 and was a wax technician for the Australian National Team in China in March, 2018.

Havlick has also periodically volunteered with the Utah ski team, recently as an assistant coach at the 2018 NCAA Championships.

A native of Boulder, Colo., Havlick earned his degree from Utah in exercise physiology in 2013. He earned his master's degree from Norwegian University of Science and Technology in exercise physiology in 2018. Havlick's thesis involved research surrounding the application and adaptations of altitude training in world-class cross country skiers, completed in cooperation with the Norwegian Olympic Training Centers.





JJ Johnson

Head Alpine Coach
1st season

JJ Johnson is in his first season as Utah head alpine coach, joining the Utes from the U.S. Ski Team.

Johnson has coached with the U.S. Ski Team since 2014, beginning as an assistant coach with the men's development team (2014-16) before spending two years as head development coach (2016-18). He helped six athletes finish on the podium at the FIS Junior World Ski Championships with Sam Morse (2017) and Erick Arvidsson (2016) both winning world downhill titles. His athletes have been successful advancing within the U.S. Ski Team and joining NCAA ski programs. Johnson was promoted to the Europa Cup team shortly before joining the Utes. He first joined the U.S. Ski Team in 2013 as the Western Region Youth Coordinator.

Johnson began his coaching career with the Park City Ski Team as an assistant coach from 2010-12, coaching with its FIS and U14 skiers. He did private coaching from 2012-13.

Johnson was a member of the U.S. Ski Team from 1997-99 and 2004-07. He spent three seasons competing on the World Cup circuit (2004-07) with his best finish 24th in the downhill at Val Gardena/Groeden in 2004. Johnson was a member of the 2005 World Championship team, finishing 21st in the downhill. He regularly finished in the top 10 at the National Championships, including a third-place finish in the downhill in 2006. Johnson was the 1996 Ski Racing U.S. Junior Alpine Skier of the Year. He competed in ski cross from 2008-10.

Johnson, who is originally from Park City, lives in Wanship, Utah with his wife, Jana.



Jeremy Elliot

Assistant Alpine Coach
4th Season

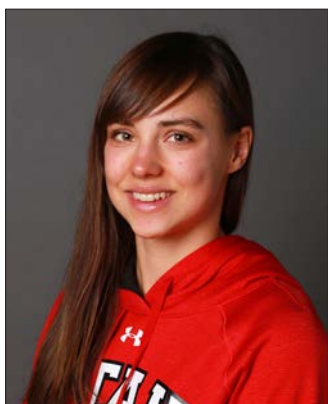
Former Utah All-American Jeremy Elliot is in his fourth season as assistant alpine coach.

Elliot has helped coach two skiers to NCAA titles, Julie Mohagen in the slalom (2016) and Endre Bjertness in the giant slalom (2016). He has helped Utah alpine skiers earn 14 All-America honors over the past three seasons. Utah won the NCAA Championship in 2017.

Elliot skied two years at Utah (2011, 2013) and earned All-America honors in the giant slalom with a second-place finish at the NCAA Championships in 2013. He had two wins with eight career podium finishes for the Utes. As a senior, Elliot earned the David Allen Novelle Outstanding Skier Award, given to the top men's alpine skier at Utah. He had to overcome three major injuries throughout his skiing career, including a knee injury that sidelined him in 2012.

After leaving Utah, Elliot raced on the Nor-Am Cup series in 2014 for Team Geronimo. He spent 2015 as an assistant coach at Westminster College.

Elliot graduated from Utah in 2014 with a bachelor of arts in communication. He was a CoSIDA Academic All-District selection in 2013 and a member of the National Collegiate All-Academic Ski Team.



Sabine Krautgasser

Student Assistant Alpine Coach
1st Season

Sabine Krautgasser is serving as a student assistant after medically retiring from skiing. She skied two seasons at Utah (2017-18) with two career top-10 finishes and four career top-15 finishes. Krautgasser was an alternate for the 2017 NCAA Championships and was unable to compete in 2018 due to injury. From San Candido, Italy, she is majoring in kinesiology.

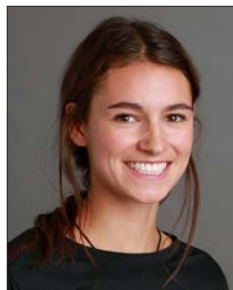

Utah Records At A Glance

- Utah has 11 NCAA Championships, which ranks third all-time behind Denver (24) and Colorado (19). The Utes also won an AIAW title in 1978, bringing their total to 12.
- Utah's 75 individual national championships ranks third all-time.
- Marvin Melville won three individual titles in 1959 – downhill, slalom and Alpine. The three titles in one year ties for the most in NCAA history.
- Four Utes combined to win five individual titles in 1995, the NCAA record for most individual championships by one school in a season. Harvard Solbakken (10-km freestyle), Heidi Selnes (5-km freestyle and 15-km classical) Thomas Weman (20-km classical), and Christl Hager (giant slalom) all won titles for Utah that season.
- Christl Hager is the only three-time repeat champion in Utah history, which also ties the national record. She won the giant slalom in 1994, 1995 and 1997.



Mark Engel won the NCAA giant slalom title in 2014 before moving on to the U.S. Ski Team. He returns to the Utes for the 2019 season.

Spence Eccles Ski Team Building



The University of Utah ski team opened Spence Eccles Ski Team Building in April, 2017, a state-of-the-art facility that is the first of its kind in NCAA skiing.

Construction began on the two-story, 5,931 square-foot building in June, 2016.

The ground floor enters into a lobby holding the Alf Engen Sportsmanship Award bowl, a ski-themed chandelier and a commemorative donor plaque. A film study room and lounge for the student-athletes also holds an office, as well as plaques commemorating Olympians and All-Americans. Men's and women's custom locker rooms for dry gear storage open into Nordic and alpine team rooms with tuning tables and ski and boot storage for each team.

On the second level, a large board room is available for team meetings and also serves as a trophy room, holding Utah's NCAA trophies along with a plaque commemorating Utah's individual national champions. The table features a three-dimensional map identifying the ski areas of the Wasatch mountains. A balcony with views of the mountains and the city is also available for gatherings.

The exterior of the building has parking areas for the ski team vehicles, as well as a canopy to keep the vehicles covered. Additional storage is available in the building's basement.

The building is located north of the McCarthy Family Track and Field, between the track and Dumke Family Softball Stadium.
