THE GAME

The No. 9/10 University of Utah football program will hit the road after a two-game home stand, taking on the Washington Huskies on Saturday, Nov. 2. The game will kick off at 2 p.m. MT in Seattle on FOX. Search UTAHvsUW on social media for conversation.

UTES ON THE ROAD

Utah is currently 247-254-12 (.493) all-time when playing on the road, holding a 1-8 record against the Huskies when playing in Seattle. Utah is 2-1 on the road this season.

UTAH vs. THE PAC-12

Utah is 38-40 against Pac-12 teams as a conference member and 114-158-6 all-time against Pac-12 schools.

NUMBERS TALK

- With a win, the Utes will beat Washington for the first time since 2015 when the Utes won in Seattle 34-23.
- With a win, senior Tyler Huntley will have 20 career wins, joining three other Utah quarterbacks that have achieved the feat.
- Utah has had five or more players attempt at least one rush in every game this season, including a season high ID players against NIU.
- The Utes have held seven of their eight opponents to under 100 yards rushing and have outscored their opponents 103-32 in the second half this season.
- Head coach Kyle Whittingham has coached in 314 games for Utah as an assistant and a head coach with 212 career victories.

QUICK HITS

- Utah enters this week ranked No. 9 in the AP poll and 10th in the Coaches poll. It is the Utes'
 highest rank since earning the No. 3 position on Oct. 18, 2015 with it also being the highest
 Coaches poll since the same week in 2015 (No. 7).
- The Utes have started the season with a record of 7-1 or better for the third time in the
 past five seasons. It is the sixth time in the Kyle Whittingham era as a head coach (8-0 in
 2008, 2010: 7-1 in 2009, 2015, 2016, 2019).
- The Utes have held four opponents this season to fewer than 10 points (0 by Cal and Idaho State, 7 by Oregon State, 3 by Arizona State), the most in a season by Utah since holding four opponents to single-digits in 2007. The Utes have held an opponent to single digits 25 times under Whittingham.
- The 23 combined points allowed in the past four games (13 by WSU, 7 by OSU, 3 by ASU, 0 by Cal) are the fewest allowed by the Utes in a four-game span since 1981 (23: 0, 0, 10 and 13 by Portland State, Northwestern, UTEP and Colorado State).
- Utah's shutout against California was its first against a Pac-12 school since joining the
 conference. The Utes have shut out its opponents in eight halves of football this season.
 Utah has two shutouts this season (Cal, Idaho State), the first time the Utes have had two
 shutouts in a season since 2003 (BYU, Southern Miss).
- Utah scored on two 90-yard drives against California. The Utes' 99-yard touchdown drive
 was the first 99-yard scoring drive since Oct. 12, 2013 against Stanford. It is also the first
 game with two touchdown drives of 90 or more yards since 2011 against Arizona.
- In the last two games, Zack Moss has broken three school records (career rushing yards, 3,379; career rushing touchdowns, 33; career 100-yard rushing games, 15).
- The Utes have sold out 62-straight games in Rice-Eccles Stadium since the 2010 season opener, including 58 standing room only crowds. The school record for season attendance average is 46,533 (2015) and Utah has averaged more than 46,000 fans per game in four of the past five seasons.

- Kyle Whittingham, the longest-tenured coach in the Pac-12 Conference and the third-longest tenured head coach at the same school in the NCAA FBS, in his 15th
 season at the helm at Utah, where he boasts a 127-62 record. Including 11 seasons as a Ute assistant coach, he has contributed to more victories (212) than any coach in
 program history.
- His many accomplishments include National Coach of the Year recognition in 2008—when Utah was declared the national champion by an NCAA major selector while finishing
 No. 2 in the Associated Press poll—and the 2018 Pac-12 South Division title.
- Legendary for his postseason success, Whittingham boasts the second-best bowl win percentage in NCAA history (84%). His 11 bowl wins (11-2) ties him for second among
 active coaches and ranks in the top-10 all-time (including ties). His glossy bowl record includes a 2-0 mark in College Football Playoff New Year's Six bowls, with wins over
 Pittsburgh in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl as co-head coach and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl.
- The Utes appeared in every weekly CFP ranking for the first three years of the system (2014-16) and have made the sixth-most appearances of any school with 24 total. Utah has finished in the CFP top-25 four seasons: No. 22 in 2014 and 2015, No. 19 in 2016 and No. 17 in 2018. The Utes have made the final AP top-25 five times and the final Coaches' poll six times under Whittingham. Their AP top-25 finishes were No. 2 (2008), No. 18 (2009), No. 21 (2014), No. 17 (2015) and No. 23 (2016). Utah was No. 23 in the final 2010 Coaches' poll.
- Individually, Whittingham has had 15 players make major All-America teams (those determining the NCAA's consensus team). They are Luther Elliss (1994, consensus defensive lineman), Eric Weddle (2006, consensus defensive back), Louie Sakoda (2007, punter; 2008, unanimous consensus place kicker), Zane Beadles (2009, offensive line), Shaky Smithson (2010, punt returner), Star Lotulelei (2012, defensive tackle), Reggie Dunn (2012, kick returner), Nate Orchard (2014, defensive end), Kaelin Clay (2014, returner), Tom Hackett (2014, consensus punter; 2015, unanimous consensus punter), Mitch Wishnowsky (2016, unanimous consensus punter) and Matt Gay (2017, consensus kicker).

UTES IN THE RANKINGS

- Utah is tied for fourth in FBS with three defensive touchdowns, and tied for second in FBS with three interception return touchdowns (2 INT returns at BYU, 1 at Oregon State).
- Utah leads FBS in rushing defense (56.4) with opponents averaging just 2.5 yards per carry. The Utes also rank fourth in the FBS in scoring defense (10.3), third in total defense (231.0) and are 19th in red zone defense (.750). The Utes lead the Pac-12 in rushing defense, scoring defense and total defense.
- Utah is sixth in FBS in pass efficiency defense (103.66) and 11th in FBS in passing yards allowed (174.6).
- Utah is tied for second in FBS in first downs defense (101).
- Utah is third in FBS in third-down conversion percentage defense (0.263) and second in the Pac-12 in fourth-down conversion percentage defense (0.444).
- Utah's nine interceptions is tied for 15th in FBS and second in the Pac-12. Utah's 226 interception return yards ranks second in FBS and leads the league.
- Utah leads the Pac-12 (22nd FBS) in rushing offense (219.4).
- Utah ranks fourth in FBS in quarterback completion percentage (.724) and seventh in FBS in pass efficiency (175.61).
 Utah was the final Power 5 school to throw an interception, which came against Arizona State, and has only thrown one interception this year.
- Utah ranks tied for sixth in FBS and leads the Pac-12 in fewest sacks allowed (0.88 per game).
- Utah ranks second in FBS in time of possession (35.16).
- Utah is second in the Pac-12 in passing yards per completion (13.91)
- Utah is second in the Pac-12 in punt return defense (5.00).
- Utah leads the Pac-12 and ranks sixth nationally in weeks ranked in the College Football Playoff Poll, entering 2019 with 24 weeks, trailing only Alabama (31), Clemson (31), Ohio State (31), Oklahoma (29) and LSU (27).
- Utah is one of just five college football programs whose 2018 attendance represented 100% or higher than capacity of its stadium, claiming the fourth-highest capacity percentage of 101.1%. Nebraska (104.2%), Oklahoma (103.9%) and Michigan (102.9%) were the only schools ahead of Utah, while Georgia (100.0%) rounded out the top five. All four of Utah's home games this year have been standing room only with seven schools this year reporting over 100% attendance.

TEAM NOTES

- Utah has won nine in a row at home and 11 of its last 12, its longest home winning streak since winning 21 in a row (second-longest in school history) from 9/15/07 to 10/23/10.
- Cal's 83 yards of total offense on Oct. 26 is the fifth fewest by an opponent in school history and the fewest since allowing 59 to Weber State in a 41-10 win on Aug. 30, 2018.
- Utah only allowed Cal to produce 43 total plays on offense which is the third fewest in program history and the fewest by an opponent since a school record 24 against UTEP in 1965
- Cal only ran four plays in Utah territory, all on its first possession, and advanced no further than the Utah 4l. No Cal possession moved past its own 37-yard line after its second possession.
- Utah has held three straight Pac-12 schools to single digit scoring for the first time since joining the league and the first time overall since 2007.

- According to Elias Sports Bureau, Utah is the first team to shut out its opponent in the first half of three consecutive Pac-12 games within one season since 1991 (Washington).
- Utah has allowed just one touchdown and ID total points in the past 14 quarters of play.
- Utah's opponents have converted just 14.3 percent of third-down opportunities in the last four games combined (9-for-49).
- Utah's defense has allowed just 30 second half points through the first eight games (3.8 per game), and just 10 in the past four games (2.5).
- Opponents have had 41 total possessions in the second half and scored on just five (4 TDs, 1 FG). Of the remaining 36 possessions, 22 have been punts (11 three-and-outs), six have been interceptions, three turnovers on downs, two were the clock running out of the end of the game, two were fumbles and one was a missed field goal.
- Opponents have held the ball for just an average of 4.63 plays per possession against Utah in the second half this season.
- Utah is outscoring opponents 103-32 in the second half (30 defensive points allowed, plus two points on a safety at USC).
- The Utes have had three freshmen start on the offensive line this season in Braeden Daniels (LG), Johnny Maea (RG) and Simi Moala (RT). In total, Utah has had 21 freshmen see action this year on offense, defense and on special teams (Donte Banton, Micah Bernard, JaTravis Broughton, Daniels, Luke Felix-Fualalo, Hayden Furey, Cameron Gardner, Semisi Lauaki, Ben Lennon, Aaron Lowe, Maea, Paul Maile, Malone Mataele, Moala, Terrell Perriman, Fua Pututau, Drew Rawls, Jadon Redding, Alphonso Taylor, Jordan Wilmore, Thomas Yassmin).
- Players changing numbers include Micah Bernard (#34), Bronson Boyd (#8), JaTravis Broughton (#31), Devin Brumfield (#6), Vonte Davis (#22), Nygel King (#16), Malone Mataele (#15) and Simi Moala (#69). Position changes include Jayden Clemons going from quarterback to defensive back and Falcon Kaumatule moving from defensive end to offensive line.

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

- As a unit, the Utes are ranked fourth in the FBS and first in the Pac-12 in completion percentage (.724) while also ranking seventh in the FBS and first in the league in team passing efficiency (175.61).
- Utah is one of just six teams in the FBS that have allowed one interception or less (one of two in the Pac-12). The Utes also rank sixth in the FBS and first in the Pac-12 in sacks allowed this year (.88 per game).

SENIOR TYLER HUNTLEY

- Senior all-conference candidate Tyler Huntley has played in 31 career games with 27 starts, holding a 19-8 record as the starter. His 19 wins is fourth all-time at Utah.
- He is 122-of-167 passing (1 INT, 10 TD) for 1,778 yards through eight games. He also has 49 carries for 229 yards (3 TD).
- Through eight games, he ranks fifth in the FBS and first in the Pac-12 in completion percentage (.731). He has a 66-percent completion rate in his career at Utah, which ranks third all-time at Utah.
- He also ranks sixth in the FBS and first in the Pac-12 in pass efficiency (181.0). He had attempted 149 straight passes without an interception prior to his turnover against Arizona State. Utah is tied for second in the FBS and first in the Pac-12 in passes had intercepted (1).
- He is ranked fourth in the FBS and first in the Pac-12 this season in yards per pass attempts (10.65) and is fifth in ESPN's total QBR (87.9).
- With his 122 completions this season, Huntley now has 476 in his career, moving him into fifth all-time, passing Larry Egger (469, 1985-86). He is 95 away from tying for fourth all-time with Mike McCoy (571, 1992-94).
- Has 17 career 200-yard passing games, including five in the 300-yard range with his career high of 341 yards coming against San Jose State in 2017 and then again against USC in 2018. He ranks fifth in program history in 200-yard passing games and is tied for seventh in career 300-yard passing games with Mike Richmond (1988-90). The school record for career 200-yard passing games in 23 (Scott Mitchell, 1987-89).
- With his 214 passing yards against California, Huntley became just the fifth player in program history to pass for over 6,000 career yards. He has 1,778 this season and 6,037 in his career, ranking fifth all-time at Utah.
- He also became just the fifth player in program history to accumulate over 7,000 yards of total offense in a career. He ranks fifth all-time with 7,112 yards, passing Alex Smith (6,275, 2002-04). He needs 448 yards to move into fourth all-time (7,559 - Mike McCoy, 1992-94).
- Broke the 1,000 career rushing mark this season with his 229 yards. He has 49 carries and three rushing touchdowns this season, giving him 334 career carries for 1,085 vards (14 TD).
- He is one of just three players in Utah history to have over 1,000 yards rushing and 5,000 passing yards in a career (5,823 passing, 1,085 rushing). He joins Alex Smith (2002-04; 5,203 passing, 1,083 rushing) and Travis Wilson (2012-15; 7,403 passing, 1,225 rushing). Huntley needs 141 rushing yards to own the school record for career rushing yards by a quarterback, currently held by Wilson (1,225).
- Of Huntley's 10 touchdown passes this season, seven have been for 20 yards or longer (40 vs. Cal; 21, 30 at Oregon State; 52 vs. Washington State; 82, 60, 23 vs. Idaho State). He has 17 career touchdown passes for 20+ yards, including his career-long 82-yarder vs. Idaho State this season.

- Finished Utah's win against Washington State 21-of-30 passing (D INT, 2 TD) for a season high 334 yards. He added six carries for 31 yards and two rushing touchdowns.
- His two rushing touchdowns against Washington State marks the fourth time in his career he has had multiple rushing touchdowns in a game (2019: 2 vs. Washington State; 2018: 2 vs. Washington State; 2017: 2 vs. North Dakota, 2 vs. West Virginia).
- He had 282 yards on 15-of-19 passing with three touchdowns against Idaho State. He has 10 games in his career with over 250 passing vards.
- His 82-yard touchdown pass to Bryan Thompson in the first quarter against Idaho State was the 10th-longest pass in school history and the fourth-longest in the Pac-12 this year. It is the longest Utah pass since 2009 and the last pass of at least 80 yards since 2013.
- Was 14-of-19 passing (O INT, 1 TD) for 214 yards against Northern Illinois, also rushing for 38 yards on three carries and a touchdown.
- Six of his 14 completions against Northern Illinois were for 20-plus yards, including two third down conversions and a fourth down conversion that all led to touchdowns.
- 81-percent completion percentage in week one against BYU is the fourth time that Huntley has completed over 80 percent of his passes (13-of-16 at BYU, 2019; 17-of-21 at Stanford, 2018: 8-of-9 at Arizona, 2017: 1-of-1 vs. Indiana, 2016).

SOPHOMORE JASON SHELLEY

- Sophomore Jason Shelley is sitting as the co-No. 2 on the depth chart after playing in nine games last season, getting the starting nod in the last five for the injured Huntley. He has played in 15 career games, including in five this year.
- He is 5-of-9 passing for 34 yards (O INT, 1 TD) and has 16 rushes for 36 vards (1 TD).
- Went 4-of-5 passing for 28 yards and a touchdown, adding eight rushes for 28 yards (1 TD) against California.
- His one-yard rushing touchdown was his first of the season and fourth of his career with his one-yard passing touchdown also being his first of the year and sixth of his career, both occurring in the second quarter. The last time he rushed and threw for a touchdown in the same game was against BYU last season.
- He had three rushes for 21 yards (7.0 ypc) against Washington State.
- Shelley went 3-2 as the starter in 2018, finishing the season 98-of-168 passing for 1,162 yards (5 TD). He also racked up 63 carries for 192 yards and three touchdowns.

 Shelley had two 200-yard and one 300-yard passing games with his career-best 302 yards coming against Northwestern in the Holiday Bowl.

JUNIOR DREW LISK

- Junior Drew Lisk, who was awarded a scholarship in the summer of 2018, has seen action in seven career games.
 He is listed as the co-No. 2 on the depth chart.
- He has played in four games this season and is 7-of-9 passing for 52 yards. He went 6-of-6 passing for 38 yards against Idaho State.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

- The Utah running back group has seen five different running backs earn carries with the Utes ranking 22nd in the FBS and first in the Pac-12 in rushing offense (219.4).
- Utah has scored 32 offensive touchdowns this season with 21 coming from the running game. Nine different players have scored at least one rushing touchdown this season with the Utes ranking first in the Pac-12 and tying for 15th in the FBS in total rushing touchdowns this season (21).

SENIOR ZACK MOSS

- Senior All-Pac-12 and All-America candidate Zack Moss returns to the field as one of four players in Utah history with two 1,000-yard seasons (1,173 in 2017 and 1,096 in 2018). He has played in 39 career games with 31 starts, missing Utah's game against Washington State with an injury.
- He has 110 carries for 728 yards (6.6 ypc, 104.0 ypg) and 10 touchdowns through seven games. He also has eight catches for 174 yards.
- He is ranked 15th in the FBS and second in the Pac-12 in rush yards per carry, averaging 6.6. He also ranks 11th in the FBS and first in the league in rushing touchdowns (10) and is 21st in the FBS and second in the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game (104.0).
- Moss has scored at least one touchdown in 14 of the last 19 games he has appeared in.
- Through eight games this season, Moss has set three school records so far in career rushing yards (3,379), career rushing touchdowns (33) and career 100-yard rushing games (15).
- Moss set the record for career rushing yards in Utah's
 win over Arizona State, rushing for 99 yards to push him
 past Eddie Johnson who had 3,219 rushing yards from
 1984-88. Johnson's record came on 564 career carries
 while Moss broke the record on his 565th carry. Johnson
 also played in 48 career games with Moss breaking the
 record in his 38th career game.
- His 3,379 career rushing yards ranks sixth among active FBS players and first in the Pac-12.
- Scored two rushing touchdowns in Utah's game against California, giving him the school record for career rushing touchdowns (33), passing Del Rodgers who had 31 from 1978-81. His 31 career touchdowns lead all active Pac-12 players and ninth in the FBS.
- With his 115 rushing yards against Cal, Moss set the school record for career 100-yard rushing games with 15, passing Devontae Booker (2014-15) and John White (2011-12) who both had 14 in their careers.
- He has four 100-yard rushing games (187 at BYU, 121 at Oregon State, 115 vs. California, 106 vs. Idaho State).

- In the last two games, Moss has had 42 carries (25 vs. Arizona State, 17 vs. California), moving him from fifth to second all-time in career carries (587). The school record is 648 carries by Tony Lindsay from 1977-80.
- Moss has scored two or more rushing touchdowns in four games this season, including in the last three (2 vs. NIU, 2 at Oregon State, 2 vs. Arizona State, 2 vs. California) and nine times in his career. His career high is three against UCLA in 2018 (26 carries, 211 yards).
- He leads the team in all-purpose yards with 902 (728 rush, 174 rec). He has five 100-yard all-purpose games this season (one 200-yard game vs. Cal) and 16 in his career. He ranks 25th in the FBS and second in the Pac-12 this season in all-purpose yards per game (128.86).
- Moss has 3,850 career all-purpose yards (3,379 rush, 471 rec), ranking third all-time in program history. He needs 225 yards to move into second (4,074, Eddie Johnson, 1984-88).
- He led the Utes against BYU with 29 carries for 187 yards and a touchdown. It was his first game since Nov. 3, 2018 after he missed the final five games with an injury.
- Moss became the first Utah player to have a 100-yard rushing game against BYU since John White in 2011 (174 vards).
- After missing Utah's game against Washington State,
 Zack Moss returned to rush for 121 yards in the first two quarters against Oregon State, finishing with five rushes and two touchdowns. He averaged 24.2 yards per carry.
- His 91-yard rushing touchdown against Oregon State was the longest rushing play in the FBS in week six and ranks as the fourth-longest of the season.
- The 91-yard rushing score ranks as the third-longest in school history and just the third time in program history that a player has had a rush for 90 yards or longer. The long rush also set a Reser Stadium record for longest rush by an opposing player.
- Moss had back-to-back weeks with career highs in receiving yards, finishing with 78 yards against Arizona State and then 89 vs. California. His 69-yard catch against Cal is the second-longest catch by a starting Pac-12 running back this season (Eno Benjamin, 72-yard catch vs. Sacramento State).
- Racked up 204 all-purpose yards against Cal with 115 rushing yards (17 carries, 2 TD) and 89 receiving yards (3 catches)
- Recorded 177 all-purpose yards against Arizona State, rushing for 99 yards (25 carries, 2 TD) while notching 78 receiving yards on three catches (26.0 ypc).
- Moss rushed for 106 yards in less than a half of football on 10 carries against Idaho State, averaging 10.6 yards per carry while scoring his fourth rushing touchdown of the season.
- Moss averaged 10.6 yards per carry against Idaho State, the 11th time in his career that he has averaged 6+ yards per carry in games he had 10 or more attempts (10.6 vs. Idaho State; 9.4 vs. Weber State, 2018; 8.1 at UCLA, 2018; 8.0 at Stanford, 2018; 7.9 at San Jose State, 2016; 7.5 vs. Colorado, 2017; 7.5 vs. West Virginia, 2017; 7.1 at Arizona State, 2018; 7.0 at USC, 2017; 6.6 vs. UCLA, 2017; 6.4 at BYU, 2019).

JUNIOR DEVONTA'E HENRY-COLE

- Junior Devonta'e Henry-Cole returned in the spring from a season-ending injury in 2018 and is listed as No. 2 on the depth chart. He has played in 20 games as a Ute, including in seven this season.
- He has 31 carries for 157 yards (5.1 ypc) and a touchdown this season, adding two catches for 19 yards and a receiving score as well.
- Tied his career-high in rushing yards against Washington State, carrying the ball a career-best 15 times for 79 yards (5.3 ypc). He added an II-yard touchdown catch, his first career-receiving touchdown.
- He had four carries for 31 yards and a touchdown against USC. His 17-yard rushing touchdown against the Trojans was his first since 2017. He has three career rushing touchdowns (4 total career touchdowns).
- Rushed for 279 yards on 55 carries as a sophomore in 2017, scoring two touchdowns. He had a career high 79 yards on nine carries against Colorado (8.8 ypc) in 2017.

SOPHOMORE DEVIN BRUMFIELD

- Sophomore Devin Brumfield has played in all eight games and is second among running backs on the team in yards (200) and carries (45). He is averaging 4.4 yards per carry and has scored one touchdown. He also has six catches for 35 yards.
- He rushed for a career-high 63 yards on 10 carries (6.3 ypc) with a career-long 30-yard rush against USC.
 He also had six carries for 24 yards against Washington State.
- Scored his first career touchdown as a Ute against Oregon State, running in a one-yard rush to give Utah a 42-0 lead in the third quarter. He finished the game with 10 carries for 37 yards.

FRESHMAN JORDAN WILMORE

- True freshman Jordan Wilmore is a four-star recruit out of Los Angeles, Calif. He rushed for 6,745 yards and 77 rushing touchdowns, putting up 15 career 200-yard and 32 career 100-yard rushing games during his time at Lawndale HS. He has played in all eight games this season.
- He is third on the team among running backs in carries (41) with 167 yards and one rushing touchdown. He is averaging 4.1 yards per carry.
- Rushed for a career high 12 carries for 59 yards against Oregon State, averaging 4.9 yards per rush. He punched in his first career touchdown as a Ute on a seven-yard rush in the third quarter to give Utes a 49-0 lead.
- Rushed for 38 yards on seven carries against Idaho State that included a season long 23-yard rush.

OTHER CONTRIBUTORS

 TJ Green has seen action in seven games with 17 carries for 52 yards. He had a season high nine carries for 38 yards, including a season long 17-yard rush against Oregon State.

WIDE RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

SOPHOMORE BRYAN THOMPSON

 Sophomore Bryan Thompson is coming off a redshirt season and has played in 24 career games with seven starts.

- He leads the Utes in receiving yards (371) on 14 receptions, and is tied for the lead in receiving touchdowns (3).
 He is averaging 26.5 yards per catch, which leads the team.
- He has two 100-yard receiving games this year (111 vs. Washington State, 105 vs. Idaho State).
- Of his 14 receptions this season, 10 have been for 15 or more yards, including six that have been for more than 20 yards.
- Caught a career high four catches against Washington State for a personal best III yards.
- Recorded 105 yards against Idaho State with both of his catches resulting in touchdowns. His 82-yard touchdown reception is the fourth-longest catch in the Pac-12 this year and the 10th longest in school history.
- His 82-yard touchdown against Idaho State was also his first career touchdown as a Ute.
- He led Utah in receiving yards against Northern Illinois, recording a career-best 66 yards on two catches.
- He had a 40-yard touchdown reception against Cal, his third touchdown of the year. Of Utah's four longest receiving touchdowns this season, two have been scored by Thompson.
- He played in 12 games with one start in 2017, notching five receptions for 77 yards (15.4 ypc).

SOPHOMORE JAYLEN DIXON

- Dixon has played in 19 career games with seven starts, showing his breakaway speed in 2018 by finishing second on the team in receptions (32) and yards (589).
- He has 13 catches for 168 yards (12.9 ypc) and one touchdown, adding 12 rushes for 73 yards (6.1 ypc) with two rushing touchdowns. He is currently tied for third on the team in scoring (18 points).
- He had a season high four receptions for 46 yards against Northern Illinois, scoring on a 14-yard reception.
- Dixon scored his first career rushing touchdown against BYU, running in for two yards to give Utah a 16-6 lead for the only score of the third quarter.
- Scored his second rushing touchdown and third touchdown overall of the season against Arizona State, diving across the pylon for a 10-yard rushing score to give Utah a 7-0 lead in the second quarter.

SENIOR DEMARI SIMPKINS

- Simpkins has played in all 48 games since becoming a Ute, starting 32. He has caught at least one pass in 42 career games.
- He leads the team in receptions (18) and is third on the team in yards (221), averaging 12.3 yards per catch.
 He also has seven rushes for 35 yards and a rushing touchdown.
- Had a season high 97 receiving yards against Oregon State on four receptions (24.3 ypc).
- Scored his first career rushing touchdown against Northern Illinois, walking into the end zone for 13 yards.
- Simpkins led the Utes in receptions against BYU, grabbing four catches for 35 yards.
- Simpkins had 26 catches for 297 yards and two touchdowns last season. He had a career-long 68-yard catch for a touchdown against Arizona in 2018.

JUNIOR SAMSON NACUA

- Samson Nacua, a walk-on who earned a scholarship in 2016, was Utah's third-leading receiver as a sophomore last season. He had 31 receptions for 362 yards and a team-high five receiving touchdowns.
- He has played in all eight games and has 10 catches for 147 yards (14.7 ypc) and ranks second on the team with two receiving touchdowns.
- He has a 57-yard and 30-yard receiving touchdowns.
- Had a career high 90 yards on five receptions against Washington State, catching a 52-yard touchdown. His 52-yard touchdown catch is his second 50-plus yard touchdown reception of his career, also recording a 57-yard score against Stanford in 2018.
- Three catches for 46 yards and a 30-yard touchdown catch at Oregon State, giving him eight career receiving touchdowns which ranks first on the team.

JUNIOR BRITAIN COVEY

- Covey was Utah's leading receiver as a freshman in 2015 (519 yards) and as a sophomore in 2018 (637 yards). He is a two-time All-Pac-12 returner (first-team in 2018) and was a Freshman All-American in 2015. He played in the first four games this season, but has been held out the last four while still returning to full strength from knee surgery last year.
- He has 10 catches for 77 yards (7.7 ypc) along with three rushes for 22 yards. He also has 220 all-purpose yards (22 rush, 77 rcv, 69 PR, 52 KR).
- Had a season-high four receptions against Idaho State for 42 yards. Covey has either led or tied for the team lead in receptions in 15 of his 29 career games.
- Covey had five 100-yard all-purpose games last season and eight in his career.
- Covey has two 100-yard receiving games in his career, both for a career-high 129 yards (vs. NIU in 2018 and vs. USC in 2015).

OTHER CONTRIBUTORS

- Sophomore Solomon Enis played in all 14 games as a true freshman in 2018. He has played in all eight games this season with eight catches for 109 yards (13.6 ypc). He had a career high 62 yards on three catches against Washington State, including a career-long 41-yard reception.
- Derrick Vickers has played in all eight games. He has 225 all-purpose yards this year (48 rush, 150 rec, 27 KR). He had three catches for 38 yards and four rushes for 26 yards against USC, also scoring his first touchdown on a seven-yard rush against Washington State.

TIGHT END NOTEBOOK

 Utah returns two sophomore tight ends who split starts last season in Cole Fotheringham and Brant Kuithe. Fotheringham has played in 22 games with 17 starts while Kuithe has seen action in 22 games as well, earning the starting nod seven times.

SOPHOMORE BRANT KUITHE

- Brant Kuithe is second on the team in receptions (16) and is second on the team in receiving yards (266). He is averaging 16.6 yards per catch and is tied for second on the team in receiving touchdowns (2).
- He is leading all Pac-12 tight ends and ranks fifth among FBS tight ends in yards per reception (16.6) this season, also ranking fourth in the league among all players.
- Through eight games, Kuithe has already passed his total receiving yards from a year ago. He had 227 yards in 2018.
- Seven of his 16 receptions this season have been for 20 yards or longer.
- He finished second on the team with a career high 80 yards against Idaho State that included a career long 60-yard touchdown catch in the second quarter. It is the longest reception by a tight end since a 79-yard completion by Alex Smith to Ben Moa against UNLV on Oct. 25, 2003.
- Finished with two catches for 44 yards (22.0 ypc), scoring on a 21-yard receiving touchdown to open scoring against Oregon State in the first quarter.
- He scored his third touchdown of the year with a one-yard reception against Cal. It is the first time since 2015 that a Utah tight end has had three touchdowns in a season (Harrison Handley had four scores in 2015).
- Three of his four career touchdowns have been for 20 yards or longer (29 yd TD vs. Weber State, 2018; 60 yd TD vs. Idaho State, 2019; 21 yd TD at Oregon State).
- Kuithe led the tight ends in 2018 with 227 yards on 20 catches (1 TD), averaging 11.4 yards per catch.

SOPHOMORE COLE FOTHERINGHAM

- Cole Fotheringham has started all eight games this season with eight catches for 73 yards (9.1 ypc) and a touchdown.
- Had a season-high 23 yards twice (23 at USC, 23 vs. California), also scoring his third career receiving score against the Trojans.
- He had 17 catches for 190 yards (2 TD) in 2018 with a career-high 76 yards on five catches coming against Oregon.

SENIOR HUNTER THEDFORD

 Senior Hunter Thedford, a graduate transfer from Southern Methodist University, played in 23 career games with three starts at SMU. He has played in all eight games this season, starting against Arizona State. He has two catches for 12 yards, including a season-long 11-yard reception against Washington State

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

- The Utes return three starters to the offensive line in Darrin Paulo, Orlando Umana and Nick Ford.
- Utah had attempted 165 passes without an interception until the third quarter against Arizona State. The Utes are tied for second in the FBS and first in the Pac-12 in passes had intercepted (1).
- Utah has averaged 219.4 yards rushing per game, ranking 22nd in the FBS and first in the Pac-12. The Utes have rushed for over 200 yards in five of its eight games, including a season-high 262 yards against BYU.
- The Utes have only allowed seven sacks this season (0.88 per game), tying for sixth in the FBS and first in the Pac-12. Utah had gone through 229 plays before allowing a sack against USC.
- Twenty-four of Utah's 32 offensive touchdowns have been on drives for 60 yards or longer.
- Utah has put together 21 drives of 70 yards or longer, with all but two resulting in touchdowns this season.
- The Utes had two drives for 90 or more yards against California, with a season-long drive of 99 yards (seven plays, 3:45) that resulted in a touchdown. It was the first time since 2011 that Utah has had two 90-yard scoring drives in one game (vs. Arizona, Nov. 5).
- The Utes rank second in FBS and first in the Pac-12 in time of possession (35:16). The Utes have 16 drives this season that have lasted over five minutes.
- Utah is averaging 6.82 yards per play on total offense which ranks second in the Pac-12 and 14th in the FBS.
- Of the 10 players on the roster who have had at least five carries, five are averaging over five yards per carry.

SENIOR DARRIN PAULO

 After 26 career starts at right tackle, He has moved to the left side for the 2019 season. He has played in 47 games, including 35 on the offensive line and 33 starts (eight this season at left tackle).

JUNIOR ORLANDO UMANA

 Umana is Utah's returning starting center after playing in all 14 games on the offensive line in 2018. He has played in 33 career games with 19 career starts, including six this season at center after missing two with injury.

SOPHOMORE NICK FORD

 Ford has started in all eight games this season, starting at right tackle against BYU and right guard in the last seven. He has played in 19 career games with 15 career starts.

FRESHMAN BRAEDEN DANIELS

 Freshman Braeden Daniels has started all eight games this season at left guard after redshirting in 2018. He played in two games last season.

REDSHIRT FRESHMAN SIMI MOALA

 Freshman Simi Moala has played in all eight games, starting the last seven at right tackle. He originally signed with Oregon State before leaving on an LDS church mission.

SENIOR PAUL TOALA

 Toala has played in 26 career games for the Utes, including 16 on the offensive line. He started against NIU and Idaho State at center

OTHER CONTRIBUTORS

 Freshman Johnny Maea started at right guard against BYU and has played in five games this season.

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

 The defensive line is unquestionably Utah's strongest position group on the field, as Utah leads FBS in rushing defense (56.4).
 Utah has held seven of its eight opponents under 100 yards rushing this year.

SENIOR BRADLEE ANAE

- 2018 first-team All-Pac-12 end Bradlee Anae is tied for 14th in FBS (second Pac-12) with 7.0 sacks (0.88 sacks per game). He had a season-high three sacks twice, against Northern Illinois and Arizona State.
- Anae is fourth in the Pac-12 and leads Utah with 8.0 tackles for loss (1.00 per game).
- Anae has 17 total tackles on the season with a season-high five tackles vs. USC. He also has a pass breakup (Arizona State).
- Anae has 32 career starts (41 games). He had a career-high eight tackles (2.5 sacks, 3.0 TFL) against Colorado in 2017.

- Fotu has 18 tackles with a season-high four tackles against BYU and Arizona State. He forced a fumble against USC and had pass breakups against Oregon State and Arizona State.
- Fotu has played in 39 games with 22 starts at Utah. He had a career-high five tackles against Arizona State last season.

- 2018 second-team All-Pac-12 selection John Penisini has played in 34 games with 16 starts. He has 21 tackles with 4.0 tackles for loss (1.0 sack).

- Penisini has 63 career tackles with 12.0 TFL (4.0 sacks). He had a career-high seven tackles against Northern Illinois last season.

SOPHOMORE MIKA TAFUA

- Sophomore Mika Tafua splits the role at left end with junior Maxs Tupai. The two are listed as co-starters on the depth chart with Tafua starting seven games this year.
- Tafua is tied for eighth in FBS (2nd Pac-12) with two fumble recoveries, which came against USC and BYU.

- The Ute Walk begins two-and-a-half hours before kickoff at the corner of Guardsman Way and 500 South. Fans are invited to cheer on the Utes as they make their walk into Rice-Eccles Stadium, sponsored by doTERRA.
- The cannon will blast at a new time, 45 minutes before kickoff, alerting fans to begin their transition into the stadium.
- Smoking sections located around the perimeter of the stadium on game days will no longer be present as part of the University's Tobacco Free efforts.
