Utah vs. Mount St. Mary's • April 6, 2019 Utes Begin Final Stretch of the Season

Utah Hosts Mount St. Mary's

The Utah lacrosse team hosts Mount St. Mary's on Saturday, April 6 at 12:00 p.m. MT.

Utah has four games remaining in the season with three of those games at home. The goal? Win April.

"That takes a lot of different meanings," Utah head coach Brian Holman said. "Let's do everything to the highest level. Lets win in the classroom. Lets win on the practice field. Lets win in the film room and then hopefully all that translates to winning games on the field. End of the season, four games, three at home. I'm fired up. I hope the kids are, and I think they are. One of my goals as a coach is to have our teams finish strong. Over these next 30 days, we want to take it to the next level. There is always something we can do better. I'm excited for the challenge. It doesn't mean we're going to win all these games, but what I hope we've learned from the season is that if we compete at our highest levels and desires, then we'll be able to compete. We'll take it one game at a time. All I want for this team is that at the end of the year, I hope we can look each other in the eye and say 'dang, we had fun, and we grew, and we got better.' And we're heading in that direction. We're going to have a good week."

Sophomore Josh Stout is tied for sixth in the NCAA with 31 goals and is averaging 2.82 goals per game. Sophomore goalkeeper Liam Donnelly is fourth in the NCAA in saves (139).

Mount St. Mary's is 6-5 overall and 3-0 in the Northeast Conference.

"This team coming in is very good," Holman said. "They are enjoying some success. They're feeling great and playing good lacrosse. Mount St. Mary's is similar to Fairfield. What did we learn from the Fairfield game? They are a team that is better than us, but have shown we can compete when we approach it with the right mentality."

Attack

> Sophomore Josh Stout is tied for sixth in the NCAA with 31 goals and is averaging 2.82 goals per game. He scored a hat trick in six games with a season-high seven goals with one assist for eight points against Mercer. Stout also has three assists for a team-high 34 total points. He leads Utah with 83 shots (52 on goal) and has 18 ground balls.

> Junior transfer Jimmy Perkins is second on the team with 14 goals and ranks third with 19 points and five assists. He has scored goals in four-straight games, including a season-high five goals against Duke. Perkins also has 11 ground balls and three caused turnovers.

> Perkins scored the first goal in Utah history against Vermont.
> Perkins was a second-team All-Northeast Conference at Robert Morris and holds the school single-season record with 30 assists.

> Junior James Sexton leads Utah with 11 assists, is second on the team with 23 points and is third with 12 goals. He has four multi-goal games (Furman, Bellarmine, Duke, Fairfield) with a season-high four assists against Mercer. Sexton also has 18 ground balls and four caused turnovers.

> Sexton was a two-time All-American at Onondaga Community College.

> Sophomore Jake Stout has six points, scoring two goals with four assists. He also has three ground balls. Stout had two assists against Air Force.

> The Stout brothers were both two-time MCLA All-Americans for the club program. Josh led Utah last season in scoring.

> Freshmen Jake Cantlon has seven goals on the year. He also has three assists for 10 points. Cantlon had two goals against both Hofstra and Fairfield. He has six ground balls and a caused turnover.

> Freshmen Quinault Mackey (1 goal vs. Duke, 1 GB, 1 CT) and Bo Powell (1 goal vs. UMass, 3 GB) have also seen action this year.

Midfield/LSM

> Sophomore Seth Neeleman leads Utah with 36 ground balls and ranks second on the team with 13 caused turnovers. He had a season-high seven ground balls against Mercer and a season-high four caused turnovers against Air Force. Neeleman leads Utah in face offs (41-133, .308 pct.).

> Neeleman earned All-America honors with the club team last season.

> Freshman Samuel Cambere leads Utah with 15 caused turnovers and ranks second on the team with 32 ground balls. He has five points (three goals, two assists) with goals coming against Hofstra, Bellarmine and Fairfield. Cambere has a season-high six ground balls and five caused turnovers against Mercer.

> Cambere recently came in at No. 22 on *Inside Lacrosse's* Early Season DI Freshman Rankings.

> Junior Aaron Fjeldsted is second on the team in assists (7) and fourth in points (15) and goals (8). He has two multi-goal games this season (3 vs. Mercer, 2 vs. Bellarmine) and three multi-assist games (2 vs. Furman, Duke and Fairfield). Fjeldsted has seven ground balls with a season-high four against Hofstra.

> Fjeldsted earned All-America honors with the club team last season.

> Senior Cam Redmond has four points, scoring his first career goal against Air Force with assists against Denver, Bellarmine and UMass. He has 11 ground balls.

> Redmond is the only player who spent more than two seasons with the club team.

> Freshman Brandon Wilson has five goals and nine total points (4 A) with six ground balls. He has a season-high two goals against Furman and two assists against Duke.

> Freshman Jonathan Rose has three ground balls and two caused turnovers.

> Freshman Reuben Santana has six ground balls, three caused turnovers and three shots.

> Freshman Chris Belcher has nine ground balls on the season and three caused turnovers. He had two ground balls and two caused turnovers against Fairfield.

> At long stick midfielder, Belcher earned All-America honors with the club program last season.

> Freshman Griffin Bonjean has two assists (Denver, Bellarmine), eight shots and one caused turnover.

> Freshman Carter McDaniels has three ground balls and four caused turnovers.

> Freshman Gabe Mein has two points (goal vs. Furman, assist vs. Bellarmine) and one ground ball.

> Freshman Jack Zarnick has an assist (vs. Duke) and two ground balls.

> Freshman Rylan Lemons has played in five games (1 GB).

> Freshman Liam Cavanaugh-Fernandez has played in four games and has five shots and a ground ball.

> Freshman Jeremy Sartin has an assist against Denver, a ground ball and a caused turnover in three total games.

> Others who have played include Steele Headen (1 CT), Reid Lanigan (1 A), Easton Cecil and Matthew Graziano.

Defense

> Senior Aidan Christian has 29 ground balls (tied for third on the team) and four caused turnovers. He had a season-high four ground balls against Mercer and Air Force.

> Christian is a transfer from Bellarmine who was an all-conference player for the club team last year.

> Junior Dan Tracy, who has three ground balls and two caused turnovers, is a transfer from UMass. He can also play in the midfield.

> Freshmen Nick Hapney has 15 ground balls and 10 caused turnovers (third on the team) this year. He has two points (goal vs. Bellarmine, assist vs. Duke).

> Freshman Kyle Kooda has played in five games and has two ground balls and two caused turnovers.

> Freshman Dominic Mata has 1 GB and 1 CT, both against Virginia. He has played in five total games.

Goalkeeper

> Sophomore goalkeeper Liam Donnelly is fourth in the NCAA in saves (139) and is averaging 12.64 saves per game with a .523 save percentage. He is allowing 12.71 goals per game. Donnelly has 29 ground balls (tied for third on the team).

> Donnelly has had double-digit saves in all but one game with a season-high 17 saves against Furman and UMass.

> Donnelly spent the past two seasons at Rutgers before transferring to Utah.

> Senior Daniel Costa has played in five games this season and recently had a season-high 30 minutes (playing the entire second half) against Virginia, making two saves. He has nine saves on the year with a season-high four saves against UMass.

> Costa was a second-team All-American for Utah's club squad last year after transferring from St. John's, where he ranked second in the Big East and 25th in the NCAA in saves per game (10.79) in 2017.

Face Off

> Sophomore Seth Neeleman and freshman Donny Stock take face offs for Utah.

> Neeleman is 41-of-133 (.308 pct).

> Stock is 30-of-98 (.306 pct). He has eight ground balls.

> Freshman Jacob Chang is 5-of-17 in face offs this season (three games), including 4-of-12 against Hofstra. He also played on the club team last year.

What is a Ute?

The Utes are an Indian tribe that originally settled Utah. Two of the more common definitions of Ute are "top of the mountains" and "people of the mountains." Other references have Ute defined as "land of the sun." The Utes refer to themselves as "Noochew," meaning "the People."

There are four Ute tribes: The Northern and White Mesa Tribes are based in Utah, while the Southern and Ute Mountain Tribes are in Colorado. The Northern Utes are most closely affiliated with the University of Utah and have a tribal membership of around 3,000. Many of them live on the Uintah and Ouray reservation. The Utes operate their own tribal government, oversee approximately 1.3 million acres of trust land and operate several businesses.

The University of Utah officially adopted the nickname "Utes" for its athletic teams in 1972. The school uses the nickname with permission of the Ute Tribal Council.

Awesome Assistants

> Utah's three assistant coaches - Adam Ghitelman, Marcus Holman and Will Manny - are all Major League Lacrosse all stars and were collegiate All-Americans. The trio will play in the newly-formed PLL in 2019 on the Archers.

> Virginia graduate Ghitelman was previously an assistant coach at Harvard (2012-15). He is a co-founder of the Give and Go Foundation, a non-profit organization that promotes international lacrosse growth and development. Ghitelman was named the 2017 Ambassador of the Year by the Casey Powell World Lacrosse Foundation.

> Holman recently helped Team USA win gold at the 2018 FIL World Championship in Israel. He led the Ohio Machine to the 2017 MLL Championship and was named Most Valuable Player. Holman was the 2013 ACC Player of the Year and a Tewaarton Trophy finalist at North Carolina.

> Manny was a nominee for the 2018 MLL Man of the Year Award and was named the 2018 All-Star Game MVP. He has made numerous appearances with Team USA. Manny was the 2012 CAA Player of the Year and a Tewaarton Trophy finalist at UMass.

News and Notes

> Captains are Aaron Fjeldsted, Seth Neeleman, Liam Donnelly and Jimmy Perkins.

> The Utes have 32 freshmen on the roster and 36 total underclassmen of a 43-man roster. Five players transferred from four year schools while 19 players played on last year's club team.

> Utah's student-athletes come from 16 different states and Canada (1). Eight players are from Utah, seven from Colorado and six from New York.

> Utah had a 3.392 team GPA during the fall, which ranked second of any men's sport at Utah. Ben Adams and Zack Johns both had 4.0 GPA's. The Utes had 17 players make the Dean's List (3.5 GPA and above) and 38 players make the Athletics Academic Honor Roll (3.0 GPA and up).

> The Utes are currently in the process of building a soccer/lacrosse stadium on campus, where the team will play in its second season in 2020.

> Ben Adams wants to go to medical school and be an orthopedic surgeon.

> Chris Belcher enjoys woodworking.

> Quinn Buczek is currently in treatment for Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL). His parents were both collegiate coaches. Father Jim coached lacrosse at North Carolina and Princeton and mother Mary coached volleyball at UNC, Wake Forest, Georgia and Florida.

> Bo Caldwell wants to earn a doctorate in nuclear engineering. He found lacrosse after trying different sports, including fencing.

> Easton Cecil's brother A.J. played football at Utah.

> Bryce Cheek plays trombone and classical guitar.

> Liam Donnelly likes to write songs and poetry. He played five varsity seasons in high school after being brought up as an eighth grader.

> Aaron Fjeldsted served an LDS mission in Toronto. He wants to get a master's in structural engineering and design buildings and bridges.

> Rylan Lemons plans to attend dentistry school.

> Quinault Mackey is part Native American. He wants to be an aerospace engineer.

> Dominic Mata volunteers with Special Olympics and Children's Hospital Colorado.

> Gabe Mein sleeps upside down in his bed the night before games.

> Seth Neeleman served an LDS mission in Brazil.
