The 2020 Utah Baseball Team

Utah baseball is set to begin its 2020 season and Bill Kinneberg's 17th season as head coach of the Utes on Friday, February 14 against UC Davis.

The Utes return six starters and welcome one of the best recruiting classes in program history to the team to add depth on the pitching staff as well as the rest of the field. They will go a long way in replacing two key starters in the field from last season in Oliver Dunn and Erick Migueles.

Both played in all 49 games in 2019 and led the team in almost every offensive statistical category, but after fall practice, there are several guys that could step up at the plate this season.

"We feel like we have an overall better offense," Kinneberg said. "Briley feels like he's going to be our Oliver Dunn leading off or hitting second and be the catalyst like Oliver was. That's what I see in Briley. I really think our lineup can be much better from 1-9 than it has been over the past two years."

Knight got better and better his freshman season and had a huge summer in the West Coast League playing for the Corvallis Knights being named MVP of the league after leading the league in on-base percentage (.460), slugging percentage (.621), total bases (113) and extra base hits (29). He finished second in the league in hitting .357 and RBI with 42 while knocking eight homers.

"Briley has established himself as one of the better players on our team," Kinneberg said. "He'll be playing center field hopefully almost every day and at the top of the lineup either first or second for us."

With Knight holding the center field spot down, the two corner outfield spots are still up in the air. Sophomore Tyler Thompson and redshirt sophomore Isaac Devaeux hold the early edge after fall practice.

Shea Kramer is another player that could see some time in the outfield. Seeing the majority of his time at first base in 2019, Kramer can play first, third or

either corner outfield spot making him the ultimate utility player.

Kramer hit .279 after playing in 44 games with 40 starts in 2019 and had 22 RBI.

Along with Kramer being able to play multiple positions, the infield has Matt Richardson and Chase Fernlund that can also do that giving them tons of options on who can play where.

Richardson has been a two-year starter at short stop and will look to hold down that position once again. He hit .250 with 17 RBI after starting 40 games and seeing action in 42 of them. Freshman Kayler Yates, from St. George, Utah, is pushing the junior right now for a starting spot. Richardson can slide over and play second as well.

Fernlund is competing for a starting spot at second base. He's very versatile as he played every position in the infield last season. Fernlund also had some success at the plate hitting .286 after appearing in 25 games. The rising senior slugged .391 and finished with nine RBI.

"Chase has a chance to play second or third this year," Kinneberg said. "We're going to try and hold him at second and have a consistent infield and consistent up the middle, but we'll see how that goes. We do have some versatility this year that we haven't in the past."

Rykker Tom started at third in 46 games last season and was one of the better players at the plate for the Utes in 2019 after he hit .279 with 17 RBI.

On the mound, the pitchers and catchers both have more depth coming into the season with players returning from injury as well as a highly ranked freshman class. The pitchers also have welcomed a new coach in Gary Henderson.

"The key to any pitching is consistent strikes with two or three pitches,"



Kinneberg said. "That's something Gary has worked on really hard in the fall and so far this spring. We've seen some great improvement out of some guys and am really anxious to see us in St. George to see what their progress has been in three months."

Part of the pitching staff improving is welcoming back Kyle Robeniol and Justin Kelly from injuries. Robeniol was the Friday night starter until injuring his knee against Oregon State. The left hander started seven games in 2019 and held a 4.91 ERA.

As the injuries piled up in 2019, it thrust Dustyn Schramm, David Watson and Zac McCleve into starting roles as well as the primary closer out of the bullpen just as freshmen. Schramm ended up starting in eight games with 16 appearances and he held a 5.10 ERA. Watson got three starts last season with two of them coming in the final two weekends earning wins in both of those games. McCleve was one of the most consistent pitchers last season. In 30 appearances, he held a 5.72 ERA and five saves.

While closing last season strong, Watson also had a good summer on the Corvallis Knights. He struck out 45 batters in 47 innings while holding a 4.02 ERA. Watson went 5-1 over the summer.

At catcher, Utah returns starter Zack Moeller for his redshirt senior season. He started in 45 games last season and hit .264 on the year. His OPS was third on the team at .786. He also slugged .408 with 31 RBI.

The other two players that will get some time at catcher are Jayden Kiernan and Christopher Rowan, Jr.

The Utes still have a tough road in Pac-12 play and were picked to finish 10th in the league. Arizona State returns star first baseman Spencer Torkelson and have been picked to finish in first in the league.

After playing 16 straight games on the road to start the season, Utah will open up at home against Utah Valley on March 17 and then host Nevada that following weekend. Other big home series are UCLA, Oregon State, Washington, Stanford and Arizona.

The 2016 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, Bill Kinneberg enters his 17th season at the helm of the Utah baseball team and his 25th year as a head coach at the collegiate level.

Kinneberg guided Utah to its first Pac-12 Championship in 2016 with a 19-11 league record, becoming the first Utah men's team to win a Pac-12 title since the Utes joined the league in 2011-12.

After winning the Pac-12 title, it was the second time Kinneberg has led Utah to the NCAA Tournament (2009, 2016).

In 2009, the Utes reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1960, as the Utes won their first Mountain West Conference Tournament. Utah won two games at NCAA's, defeating Gonzaga and Georgia Southern in the Fullerton Regional. In 2016, Utah defeated host Ole Miss in the first game of the NCAA Regional.

In the latest season, the bright spot for Utah was Oliver Dunn. He was drafted by the New York Yankees in the 11th round after hitting .366 starting in all 49 games. Dunn also was named a Collegiate Baseball Third Team All-American as well as making the All-Pac-12 Team.

Kinneberg earned his 600th win as a head coach against No. 12 Arizona State.

In 2017, Utah had four players selected in the MLB draft, tying for the most players that the Utes have had drafted in a season.

Several other players have earned national honors under Kinneberg along with Dunn. C.J. Cron was a two-time first-team All-American in 2010 and 2011, a Golden Spikes Award semifinalist, the two-time District Player of the Year and a two-time MWC Player of the Year. Ryan Khoury earned first-team All-America honors in 2006, and was also District Player of the Year and MWC Player of the Year. In 2017, Dallas Carroll was a third-team ABCA All-American.

Kinneberg has had 11 players drafted in the first 10 rounds out of Utah, including the Utes' first-ever first-round selection in 2011, when Cron was the 17th overall pick. Cron, Stephen Fife (third round, 2008) and Tyler Wagner (fourth round, 2012) have all reached the majors. Cron spent the 2018 season with Tampa Bay after four years with the Los Angeles Angels (2014-17). Wagner was promoted to the majors with the Milwaukee Brewers in 2015 and earned his first major league win with the Arizona Diamondbacks in 2016. Fife pitched in 18 games for the Los Angeles Dodgers from 2012-14. Most recently, DaShawn Keirse, Jr., became Kinneberg's fourth draft pick in the first four rounds out of Utah, selected by the Minnesota Twins in 2018.

Kinneberg's teams have rewritten the record books. Cron shattered the career batting average mark during his three seasons. Now assistant coach Jay Brossman holds records for hits, doubles and total bases. Corey Shimada ranks first in the record books for triples, stolen bases (tie), runs scored and walks while Kody Davis also tied the career stolen bases mark (52). On the mound, Wagner has a school-record 17 career saves while Jayson Rose set school records for both career (256) and single-season (106, 2016) strikeouts as well as wins (19, tie).

In 24 seasons as a head coach at the NCAA Division I level, Kinneberg has a record of 604-678-1. He earned his 400th career victory in the 2009 NCAA tournament with a win over Gonzaga. His 500th career win came against Nevada on April 25, 2014, and this past year earned his 600th against No. 12 Arizona State.

Kinneberg has coached collegiate baseball for 35 years. His teams established school records for victories in a season at UTEP in 1985 and Wyoming in 1990.

Kinneberg is in his second stint as head coach for the Utes. He previously served a year as head coach in 1996 before returning to the program for the 2005 season. Kinneberg has won 359 games at Utah.

Kinneberg also has experience with USA Baseball. In 2010 he served as the head coach of the US National Team that won a silver medal at the FISU World University Championships in Japan. Kinneberg has done several stints with USA Baseball. He served as the pitching coach in 2007 and 1999. The 2007 pitching staff turned in a 25-12 mark in international competition, and finished with a scant 1.93 earned-run average. Kinneberg also spent several years as director of the organization's athlete development program.

Prior to joining the Utah staff, Kinneberg worked in the Chicago White Sox organization as a minor league pitching coach.

From 1996 through 2001, Kinneberg was the associate head coach at Arizona. The Wildcats were 124-102 and advanced to an NCAA Regional during Kinneberg's tenure. He served an assistant baseball coach at Arizona State from 1992 through 1994. During the 1993 and 1994 seasons, Kinneberg helped lead the Sun Devils to back-to-back appearances in the College World Series.

Kinneberg was the head baseball coach at Wyoming from 1986 through 1992. In 1990, he earned WAC Coach of the Year honors after recording a school-record 37 wins. Kinneberg coached 16 All-WAC players while in Laramie.

Kinneberg served as head coach at UTEP in 1985. Prior to that, he was an assistant at UTEP for four seasons.

In addition to his duties with USA Baseball, Kinneberg worked with the Italian Olympic team in 1984, serving as pitching coach.

Kinneberg is a 1980 graduate of Arizona. He played two years with the Wildcats, going 7-4 on the mound with seven saves, including an appearance in the 1979 College World Series. Kinneberg earned a master's degree from UTEP in 1982.

Kinneberg and his wife Janet reside in Sandy, Utah. They have two children, Joe (19) and David (17).

Utah head baseball coach Bill Kinneberg announced today the hire of Gary Henderson as the program's associate head coach.

A seasoned veteran and one of the top pitching minds in the country, Henderson has 30 years of coaching experience at the University of Florida, Oregon State, University of Kentucky and Mississippi State.

"The ability to attract Gary is huge for our program and our pitching staff," Kinneberg said. "He brings a wealth of knowledge and experience and we are really excited to bring him on board."

After serving as the pitching coach at Mississippi State from 2016-17, Henderson became the interim head coach for the Bulldogs for the 2018 season and led the program to the College World Series in thrilling fashion.

The success he had as interim coach at Mississippi State came as no surprise, as he had been one of the most successful coaches in the University of Kentucky's baseball history from 2003-2008 as an assistant and 2009-2016 as the head coach. The Wildcats won at least 30 games in five-straight seasons for the first time in school history. The team set the program record for wins on three separate occasions and rose to No. 1 in the nation for three weeks in 2012 for the first time in school history. He was voted SEC Coach of the Year by his peers after the school's record 2012 season. In 2006, the program won its first and only SEC Championship in baseball under the guidance of Henderson and John Cohen.

Henderson reached 200 wins faster than any head coach in Kentucky history. In his tenure with the Wildcats, 72 players were picked in the MLB Draft or signed as free agents.

Well known for his ability to produce Major League talent on the mound, eight of Henderson's pitching protégés have reached the Majors since 2012, which is tops in the SEC.

"I'm really excited to be joining Coach Kinneberg and the Utah Baseball program," Henderson said. "I've known Bill for more than 35 years and have tremendous respect for him and what he's been able to accomplish at Utah. I'm really looking forward to being a part of Utes baseball."

Prior to Kentucky, Henderson spent five seasons as pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at Oregon State. The Beavers notched the school's first College World Series titles in 2006 and 2007, riding the arms of several players recruited by Henderson. The most notable was CWS MVP Kevin Gunderson, who pitched a brilliant postseason in leading the Beavers to the title.

At Oregon State, Henderson coached eight Beaver pitchers who were drafted by major league teams, five of whom were selected in the top eight rounds. With the help of Henderson's recruiting efforts, the Beavers improved from 19 wins in 1999 to 31 in both the 2001 and 2002 seasons, finishing 31-24 and 31-23, respectively. In his time with the Beavers, two of Henderson's recruiting classes were ranked among the top 30 nationally. Meanwhile, his pitching staff led the Pac-10 Conference in complete games in both the 2000 and 2001 seasons.

Before Oregon State, Henderson served as pitching coach and recruiting coordinator for the high-octane Florida Gators from 1995-98. In that time, he helped the Gators to the SEC Championship and the College World Series in both 1996 and 1998. Collegiate Baseball awarded national rankings to all four of Henderson's recruiting classes at Florida, including a No. 4 spot in 1996. The 1996 season also saw Collegiate Baseball tab Henderson as the National Assistant Coach of the Year.

In his playing days, Henderson pitched one year at Linfield College before transferring to San Diego State. He compiled a 19-5 career record at the two schools, earning his first career win in a road matchup at Southern California.

Henderson earned a bachelor's degree in English from San Diego State and a master's degree in sports psychology from SDSU.

Henderson and his wife, Vicki, have two sons, Alex and Ty.





JAY BROSSMAN

Former four-time all-conference Utah infielder Jay Brossman is in his eighth season on the baseball staff. He is in his third year as a full-time assistant coach with the Utes, serving as hitting coach and running the offense.

Under Brossman, Dallas Carroll (2017) and DaShawn Keirse, Jr., (2018) were both selected in the MLB Draft. Carroll earned All-America honors from the ABCA in 2017 and was a two-time All-Pac-12 player while Keirse was a three-time All-Pac-12 and All-Defensive Team selection (2016-18) for the Utes. Both were among the top hitters in the league during their time at Utah.

Utah had one of its best offensive seasons in 2017. Utah's .287 batting average in 2017 was its highest since the Utes joined the Pac-12 in 2012. The Utes also had Pac-12 era highs in slugging percentage (.399), on-base percentage (.375), RBI (280), hits (514) and runs scored (311). Utah ranked fourth in the league in batting average, third in on-base percentage and fourth in runs scored and RBI that season.

Brossman worked two seasons (2015-16) as the volunteer assistant coach for the Utes, overseeing the infield defense and assisting with hitting. Utah won its first Pac-12 Championship in 2016 and the Utes finished second in the Pac-12 with 52 double plays.

Brossman previously spent two years as the Director of Operations and also served a year as a student-assistant coach (2012). During his time at Utah he has worked as camp director, assisted

with the preseason banquet and helped promote alumni relations.

Brossman hit .359 over his four-year Utah career from 2004-07. He set school records for hits (307), doubles (69), and total bases (482). Brossman was selected in the 36th round of the 2007 MLB draft and spent five years in the Los Angeles Angels minor league system. He was a Pioneer League All-Star in 2007. Brossman went as high as Double-A Arkansas in his career before voluntarily retiring due to injuries.

Brossman earned a bachelor's degree in exercise science from Utah in 2012. He and his wife Jenny have a four-year-old son, Colten, and two-year-old son Caleb.

Parker Guinn is in his third season as a volunteer assistant coach at Utah. Guinn joins the Utes from Washington, where he was a student manager in 2017.

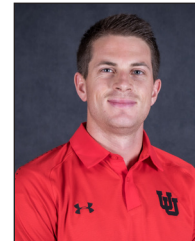

"I never anticipated doing this 16 straight years and have the type of people we've had come in," Kinneberg said. "Every year I think I'm not going to do it again, but it has to happen."

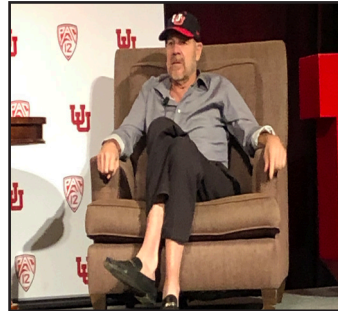

This year, the Utes are bringing in another big name as three-time National League Manager of the Year Dusty Baker will be the speaker.



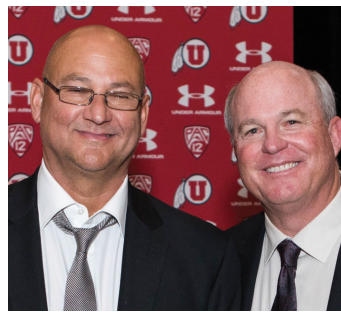

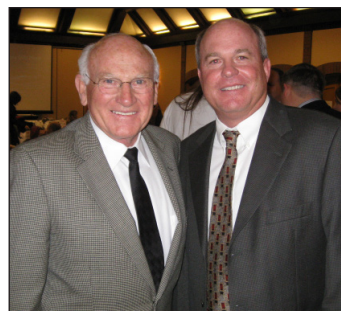

Utah baseball plays in perhaps one of the most beautiful settings in the nation. Smith's Ballpark, nestled in downtown Salt Lake City, offers sprawling views of the 11,000-foot peaks of the Wasatch Mountain Range.

Smith's Ballpark features seating that curves towards the playing field to enhance sight lines for every seat. The suite level is one of the closest upper decks in the nation, offering fans the amenities of comfort without sacrificing proximity to the field of play. The outfield is asymmetrical (345 feet down the left-field foul line, 386 to the left-center alley, 420 feet to center field, 373 feet to the right-center alley and 315 feet down the right field line). Right field has a short home run porch, and the bullpens are on the field, directly in front of the fans.

Smith's Ballpark also serves as the home of the Salt Lake Bees, the Triple-A farm club of the Los Angeles Angels.

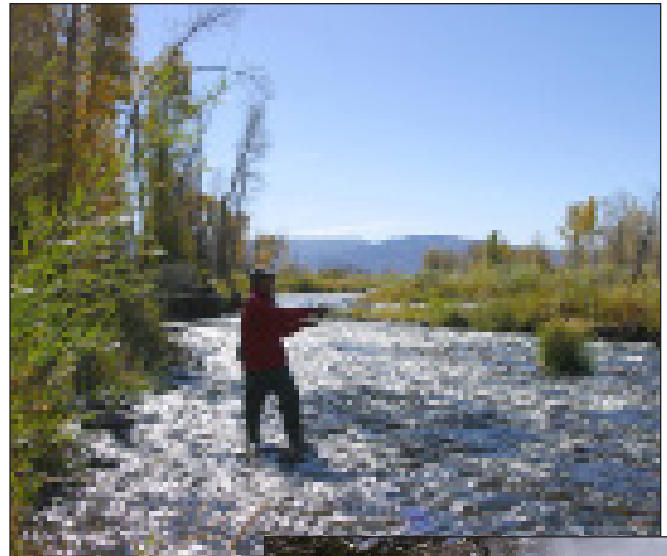
Nestled between the Wasatch and Oquirrh Mountain ranges and the Great Salt Lake, the city is located in one of the most picturesque places on earth. The lowest point within city boundaries is 4,210 feet near the Great Salt Lake, and the highest is Grandview Peak at 9,410 feet. The Great Salt Lake (48 miles wide and 90 miles long) is the world's second largest saltwater lake and the largest lake in the western United States.

The city is the cultural, financial, educational, technological, commercial and communications hub of the Intermountain West. Utah was named the most technologically advanced state in the 2008 Digital States Survey and rated as one of the top 10 most socially networked cities in America. Salt Lake is also home to world-renowned medical and technology industries.

Cultural and ethnic activities flourish in Salt Lake City and its vibrant downtown features dining, shopping, music and ethnic festivals, art galleries, professional symphony, opera, theater and dance.

The annual Sundance Film Festival, which is the largest independent film festival in the U.S., attracts movie stars, celebrities and thousands of film buffs to the area every year. According to *P3/Production Update Magazine*, Utah is one of the "10 Best States in the Nation for Film."

Professional sports franchises in Salt Lake City include the Utah Jazz (NBA), Real Salt Lake (Major League Soccer), Salt Lake Bees (AAA baseball), Utah Blaze (Arena Football) and Utah Grizzlies (East Coast Hockey League).

THE UNIVERSITY OF UTAH

Ranked among the top 100 universities in the world, the University of Utah is renowned for its research expertise, academic performance and athletic prowess. The U., which has earned a top-tier ranking from the Academic Ranking of World Universities for eight consecutive years, became a member of the Pac-12 Conference on July 1, 2011.

Founded in 1850, the University of Utah encompasses 1,500 acres in the foothills of the towering Wasatch Mountains. Located just minutes from downtown Salt Lake City and world-class ski resorts, its campus combines an eclectic mix of teaching and research facilities in a park-like setting of trees, fountains, flowering malls and pedestrian walkways with incomparable views of the Salt Lake valley.

Home to a student population of over 30,000, the U. offers some 100 undergraduate and 90 graduate majors. Many of the U.'s programs are nationally ranked, including law, pharmacy, architecture, business, engineering and dance. Students come from all 50 states and many foreign countries.



Utah ranks among the top public research universities in the nation, with particular distinction in medicine, genetics and engineering. In 2009-10, the University received a record-setting \$451 million in external funding for research. University of Utah geneticist Mario R. Capecchi, one of many acclaimed faculty members, received the 2007 Nobel Prize in Physiology/Medicine for his work on gene targeting.

In each of the past two years, the University has led the nation in the number of spin-off companies started with University-developed research or technology. The U. has launched 125 new startups over the past six years. The U. was honored at the 2012 Utah Genius Awards for most U.S. patents of any company (49), and faculty member Stephen Jacobsen of the Department of Mechanical Engineering won the lifetime achievement award.

In 2010, University of Utah Health Care was ranked No. 1 in quality in the nation among academic medical centers. The Eccles Institute of Human Genetics is one of several innovative medical programs at the U. Others include the Huntsman Cancer Institute, the Moran Eye Center and the Brain Institute. The U.'s David Eccles School of Business has joined the U.S. News & World Report list of the top 10 most-popular business schools in the nation.

The U. is also noted for its work in technology and computer sciences. The University's School of Computing was founded in 1965, and began a pioneering legacy in computer graphics and visualization that continues today.

A lively residential living experience is provided in the beautiful Heritage Commons, which served as the Athletes Village for the 2002 Olympic Winter Games. Utah students enjoy unparalleled recreational activities, from skiing and snowboarding at any of nine world-class resorts in nearby canyons, to backpacking, mountain biking, fly fishing and river running.

The U.'s location in the largest city in the Intermountain West, with a metro population of over one million, allows for an urban experience in a spectacular natural setting. The U. is home to the state's natural history and fine arts museums, and well as the Pioneer Theatre Company.

Utah ranks among the top 25 public research universities in the nation, with particular distinction in medicine, genetics and engineering.



The University of Utah residence halls are located in a magnificent mountain setting. Heritage Commons, a living-learning community of 2,500 students, opened in 2000. It served as the Athletes Village during the 2002 Olympic Winter Games. The residential complex is the heart of campus activity and has a vibrant, energetic atmosphere.

Situated in historic Fort Douglas on 70 acres of land, the 912,000-square foot residential complex boasts picturesque views of Salt Lake City and the surrounding mountain ranges. Heritage Commons consists of 21 buildings—20 residential and one for dining and support services. Eight of the buildings are apartment style, with 235 one-, two- and three-bedroom apartments.

Each residence hall has an advanced telecommunications system (voice, video and data), Internet and cable TV connections, HBO in every room, a large community lounge, study rooms, indoor bike storage and a kitchenette on every floor. Other amenities include game and exercise rooms and computer labs.

The Chase N. Peterson Heritage Center houses a dining facility that seats 600, a convenience store, computer and technology labs, fitness and game rooms, multipurpose rooms, a mail center and more. The student village also contains a University Bookstore branch, University Copy Center and the University Guest House—an on-campus hotel.
