THE GAME

The 13th-ranked Utah football team heads back to the road for a 5 p.m. MT kickoff at Baylor in Waco, Texas. The Utes (7-2, 4-2 Big 12) and Bears (5-4, 3-3 Big 12) will meet for the third time in history and for the third consecutive season.

THE NUMBERS

- Utah's margin of victory is among the best in the FBS this season. The Utes average margin in wins tops the country (36.4 ppg), while Utah's +255 total margin trails just No. 2 Indiana (+324), No. 8 Texas Tech (+299) and No. 1 Ohio State (+262).
- Last time out Utah held Cincinnati quarterback Brendan Sorsby to just 11-of-33 passing for 221 yards with an interception. It was the lowest completion percentage (33.3%) by a ranked opponent against Utah since holding Arizona State to 22.2% in 2019 and the sixth time this season the Utes held an opposing QB to 50.0% or worse.
- The Utes rank in the Top 10 of the FBS in both scoring offense and scoring defense through Week 11, standing seventh in scoring offense (39.6 ppg) and eighth in scoring defense (14.2 ppg).
- Utah is 11th nationally and second in the conference in total offense at 477.2 yards per game, while the Utes are allowing just 301.1 yards per game defensively, to rank 16th nationally and second in the conference.

UTAH FOOTBALL: NEED TO KNOWS

- Utah's offensive line has paved the way to yards and points throughout the season. The Utes rank third in the FBS and lead the Big 12 in rushing offense (267.1 ypg) and are seventh in the nation in sacks allowed (0.78 spg). Utah is fouth in the country in 3rd down conversion rate at 53.3%.
- The Utes' defense has been especially stout defending the pass and currently ranks sixth in the country in passing yards allowed at 156.8 yards per game. Utah is third in the NCAA in team passing efficiency defense (99.32) and 14th in team sacks (2.78 spg).
- John Henry Daley has been among the top pass rushers in the country all season, currently ranking fifth in the NCAA in both sacks (1.06 spg) and tackles for loss (1.56 tpg). Daley's 9.5 total sacks are just 2.0 sacks off the nation's lead.

HEAD COACH KYLE WHITTINGHAM

Kyle Whittingham, the second-longest tenured head coach at the same school in the FBS, is in his 21st season at the helm and 32nd overall season at Utah in 2025 as the Utes' all-time wins leader. Now guiding Utah into its second season in the Big 12 Conference, Whittingham has the most career victories at the FBS level of all active Big 12 coaches (174), ranking third among all active FBS head coaches and third among head coaches at the same school.

- Including 11 seasons as a Ute assistant coach, he has contributed to more victories (259) than any coach in program history.
- He has coached in 388 games at Utah, including in 262 as the head coach.
- · His 174 career wins passed like Armstrong (141-55-15 in 211 games from 1925-49) for the all-time wins number at Utah.
- Utah has finished with a winning record in 17 of his 20 years as head coach, including a run of 10 straight seasons from 2014-23.
- The Utes have seven, 10-win seasons under Whittingham (2008, 2009, 2010, 2015, 2019, 2021, 2022).
- Legendary for his postseason success, his 11 bowl wins (11-6) are tied for the most among active coaches with his record including a 2-2 mark in New Year's Six bowls.
- He has wins over Pittsburgh in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl (co-head coach) and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl.

Whether at the Power Conference or mid-major level, Whittingham's success in conference play has been significant as the Utes have gone 106-70 in conference games under Whittingham.

- Utah won back-to-back Pac-12 titles in 2021 and 2022, also winning at least a share of the Pac-12 South four times (2015 shared, '18, '19, '21). The Utes also won the Mountain West in 2008.
- He is a two-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year (2019, 2021) and was Mountain West Coach of the Year in 2008.
- He has won three National Coach of the Year awards two in 2008 and one in 2019. He was the AFCA Coach of the Year and Bear Bryant Award winner in 2008, and the Dodd Trophy Coach of the Year in 2019.
- In 2019 he also won AFCA Regional Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the AFCA Coach of the Year and Bear Bryant Award.

THE UTAH MAN

Head coach Kyle Whittingham is in his 21st year at the helm as the longest-tenured coach in the Big 12 and the second-longest tenured coach at the same school in the NCAA FBS. He is 174-88 overall at Utah, becoming the all-time wins leader at Utah in 2021. He passed Ike Armstrong (141-55-15 in 211 games) with Utah's historic win over No. 3 Oregon on Nov. 20, 2021 in Rice-Eccles Stadium. He has coached in 388 games at Utah (11 seasons as an assistant) and 262 as the head coach.

- He has contributed to more victories than any coach in program history (259), including his 11 seasons as an assistant coach (1994-2004).
- Whittingham leads active Big 12 head coaches in career victories at the FBS level (174), while ranking third among all active FBS head coaches and third among head coaches at the same school.
- Whittingham has coached the Utes to three conference titles (2008, MWC; 2021, Pac-12; 2022, Pac-12). The Utes also won at least a share of the Pac-12 South four times (2015 shared, 2018, 2019, 2021).
- He has won three National Coach of the Year recognitions: AFCA Coach of the Year and Bear Bryant Award winner in 2008, and the Dodd Trophy Coach of the Year in 2019.
- Whittingham has been named conference coach of the year three times in his career (2008, MWC; 2019, Pac-12; 2021, Pac-12).
- He has had 35 players make All-America teams, including 17 that have made major All-America teams (those determining NCAA's consensus team) with 10 earning consensus or unanimous.

THE LEADERS

Utah team captains and the leadership council are voted on by the team during fall camp. The Utes picked two offensive and two defensive captains, along with a 12-person leadership council.

- Lander Barton (LB), Logan Fano (DE), Spencer Fano (OL) and Jaren Kump (OL) were voted as captains.
- Utah's leadership council includes Barton, L. Fano, S. Fano, Kump, Devon Dampier (QB), Levani Damuni (LB), Tao Johnson (S), Caleb Lomu (OL), Michael Mokofisi (OL), Nate Ritchie (S), Smith Snowden (CB) and Aliki Vimahi (DT).

U WERE, U ARE, UTAH

The notion of family has long been a hallmark of the Utah Football program, and the makeup of the coaching staff embodies that. Four members of the Utes' full-time coaching staff are alums of the program.

- Utah's four alums on the coaching staff include Luther Elliss (DT), Lewis Powell (DE), Morgan Scalley (DC/S) and Sharrieff Shah (STC/CB).
- In some capacity, head coach Kyle Whittingham directly tutored three of the four alums now on his staff (Elliss, Powell, Scalley).
- Morgan Scalley (18), Sharrieff Shah (14), Jim Harding (12), Lewis Powell (11) and Freddie Whittingham (10) all have been on the coaching staff for nine-plus seasons.

Utah is 124-42 (.747) in Rice-Eccles Stadium (1998-present) and is 96-31 in RES during the Kyle Whittingham era.

- Utah has five undefeated home seasons under Whittingham (2022, 6-0; 2021, 6-0; 2019, 7-0; 2009, 6-0; 2008, 6-0) with the Utes winning 33 of their last 40 home games, which included a streak of 18 in a row from Dec. 5, 2020 Oct. 14, 2023.
- It was the second-longest streak in the Whittingham era with the longest streak taking place Sept. 15, 2007 – Oct. 23, 2010 (21 games).
- Utah has sold out Rice-Eccles Stadium in 94 consecutive games, dating back to the 2010 season opener.

THE MOMENT OF LOUDNESS

In 2021, the Utah Football program started a tradition to honor the legacy of Aaron Lowe and Ty Jordan with The Moment of Loudness, which takes place during the third quarter break of each home game. It is a tradition that has now turned into a way of life for the Utah family. To live the way that they did - to smile, to be infectiously optimistic, and to be 22-percent better every day.

TEAM NOTES

NEW CONFERENCE, NEW CHALLENGE

Utah enters its second season in the Big 12 Conference in 2025. The Utes have also been a part of the Rocky Mountain Conference (1910-1937), the Big Seven (1938-1947), the Skyline (1948-1961), the Western Athletic Conference (1962-1998), the Mountain West (1999-2010) and the Pac-12 (2011-2023).

- Utah is 451-269-19 all-time in conference games (.623), including its first win in the Big 12 against Oklahoma State (Sept. 21, 2024, W, 22-19).
- Utah is 37-19 in conference games since 2019.
- The Utes brought 28 conference championships with them to the Big 12.

SLC TO THE NFL

• The Utes have had six NFL first round draft picks with 12 others going in the second round since 2000.

WINNING PROGRAM

- Since 2003, Utah has piled up nine 10-win seasons; 10-2 in 2003, 12-0 in 2004, 13-0 in 2008, 10-3 in 2009, 10-3 in 2010, 10-3 in 2015, 11-3 in 2019 and 10-4 in both 2021 and 2022.
- The Utes have 10 finishes in the AP Top 25 poll since 2003: No. 21 in 2003, No. 4 in 2004, No. 2 in 2008, No. 18 in 2009, No. 21 in 2014, No. 17 in 2015, No. 23 in 2016, No. 16 in 2019, No. 12 in 2021 and No. 7 in 2022. Utah was also ranked No. 23 in the final 2010 Coaches Poll.

BOWL ROLL

- Utah has made 19 bowl appearances since 2000 with a 13-6 record, and is bowl-eligible for 2025. The Utes made nine straight bowls from 2003-11 and 10 consecutive from 2014-23.
- The Utes have punched four appearances to what is now the College Football Playoff New Year's Six, defeating Pittsburgh in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl, also reaching the 2022 and '23 Rose Bowl.
- Utah won nine consecutive bowl games from 1999-2009 to tie for the second-longest bowl win streak in NCAA history.
- In the Mountain West Conference at the time, five of Utah's hine consecutive bowl wins were against Power Conference teams: Alabama, California, Georgia Tech, Pittsburgh and USC.
- Utah is 17-9 all-time in bowl games.

ACADEMIC ALL-STARS

- Eleven Utes have earned Academic All-America awards since 2000. First Team recognition was earned by Morgan Scalley (2003-04), Alex Smith (2004), Louie Sakoda (2008) and Britain Covey (2020).
- Sakoda earned an NCAA Top VIII citation in 2008.
- The program's graduation success rate has exceeded 90 percent in each of the last seven years, including a score of 96
 percent in 2024.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

OBLOCK EXPERIENCE

Utah boasts one of the most experienced offensive lines in the country in 2025, led by Outland Trophy candidates and potential NFL first round draft picks at tackle in Spencer Fano and Caleb Lomu.

- Utah has been named the Big 12 Offensive Line of the Week three times so far this season, following the wins over UCLA, No. 21 Arizona State and Colorado.
- Utah is 65-of-122 on third down, the fourth-best conversion percentage in the nation (53.28%), and has scored on 37 of 41 red zone trips thanks to the stellar play in the trenches.
- Utah is averaging 2671 rushing yards per game behind the big guys up front, the third-best mark in the nation and the best among non-service academies.
- Utah gained more than 490 yards of total offense in each of its first three games, the first time since 2005 that a Utah squad has done so in three consecutive outings; the Utes have gained 480-plus yards in seven of nine games and 400-plus in eight of nine, including the last five.
- OBLOCK allowed just three sacks in the first six games of the season, which tied for the fourthbest mark in the nation; the Utes allowed just seven sacks all year.
- The Utes return all five starters from 2024 along the interior with center Jaren Kump and guards
 Michael Mokofisi and Tanoa Togiai also back.
- Entering the campaign, Utah had a combined 234 games played and 115 games started among the group, with every game and every snap played as Utes. None of the five transferred to Utah.
- The 234 games played on the offensive line ranked ninth in the country, trailing just Virginia (334), UTSA (288), Florida State (265), Illinois (259), Oregon (253), Clemson (249), Auburn (236) and Texas A&M (235).
- Fano was named a Preseason First Team All-American by both the Associated Press and Walter Camp. The junior was also selected to the Preseason All-Big 12 Conference team and made both the Lombardi Award and Polynesian Player of the Year Watchlists.
- Lomu was also named to the Polynesian Player of the Year Watchlist, while Kump is on the Rimington Trophy Watchlist.

NEW ARM IN TOWN

Utah's offense has a new look with quarterback Devon Dampier at the helm, and it did not take long for QB1 to make an impact as a Utah Ute.

- Dampier has accounted for 20 total touchdowns in eight games (15 passing, five rushing).
- He is one of nine FBS quarterbacks with 1,550-plus passing yards and 500-plus rushing yards and the only such QB in the Big 12.
- His 66.4% completion rate entering Week 12 leads the Big 12 and ranks 35th nationally among qualified QBs; he has improved his completion percentage from 57.9% last year at New Mexico.
- Dampier went off in the season opener at UCLA, completing 21-of-25 passes to eight different receivers for 206 yards and 2 touchdowns while rushing for 87 yards and a score on 16 carries.
- His 84.0% completion rate in Week 1 was the fifth highest among FBS QBs and tied for the fourth-best in Utah single-game history.
- He became the first Utah signal caller since 2023 to lead the team in passing and rushing yards; he has now done so in three of eight outings (last vs. No. 21 Arizona State).
- Dampier followed up his historic debut by connecting on 17-of-23 passes for 192 yards and three TDs through the air against Cal Poly and 27-of-41 passes for 230 yards and two scores to go with 86 yards on 13 carries.
- He had a stellar performance on the road at West Virginia, connecting on 21-of-26 passes for 237 yards and a career-high four touchdowns while rushing for 33 yards and another score.
- SPID4 matched his career high with three rushing TDs and set a new season high with 120
 rushing yards on 10 carries in a dominant performance against No. 21 ASU.
- Dampier threw for 213 yards and two TDs while adding 78 rushing yards in Utah's 45-14 win over No. 17 Cincinnati.
- Dampier, who was named the Big 12's Preseason Newcomer of the Year, entered the season
 with a streak of four straight games with at least 150 passing yards and 100 rushing yards, the
 longest stretch by any FBS player since Louisville's Lamar Jackson in 2017 (7).

OFF AND RUNNING

Behind the offensive line and with Dampier running the offense, Utah's rushing attack has blossomed into one of the most dominant units in nation. Utah is averaging 267.1 yards per game on the ground, the best mark in the Big 12 and the third-best in the nation.

- The Utes have scored 27 touchdowns on the ground, tied for the sixth-most nationally and the most in the Big 12.
- The Utes' 27 touchdowns in the first nine games of the season are the most during the Kyle Whittingham era during that span.
- Utah has scored 19 rushing touchdowns at home this season, the seventh most in the nation.
- Utah's six rushing touchdowns against Arizona State were the fifth-most in a single game in program history and the most against a team ranked in the AP Top 25.
- In five of nine outings so far in 2025, Utah has rushed for more yards than its opponent has gained total yards, most recently against Colorado.
- Utah's 2,404 rushing yards are the most through the first nine games of a season since at least 1995, while its 6.1 yards just trails the 6.2 yards per carry by the 2021 team.
- The Utes have rushed for 225-plus yards in eight of nine games, eclipsing the 300-yard mark twice and the 400-yard mark once.
- Two players are averaging more than 50.0 yards rushing per game (Wayshawn Parker 67.4,
 Devon Dampier 65.0) with Daniel Bray (49.2) and NaQuari Rogers (38.3) just shy of that mark.
- Eight Utes Dampier, Rogers, Parker, Bray, Byrd Ficklin, Nate Johnson, Hunter Andrews and Smith Snowden - have found the back of the end zone through the first nine games.

BY THE NUMBERS

- 422 Utah's 422 rushing yards against Colorado were the seventh-most in a game in program history and the second-most during the Whittingham era.
- 39 Utah is averaging 39.6 points per game entering Week 12, scoring at least 30 points in seven of nine outings.
- 47 The Utes' 47 offensive touchdowns rank second in the Big 12 and tied for seventh nationally.
- 477 Utah's 477.2 yards of total offense are the second most per game in the Big 12 and 11th nationally.
- 53 Utah has been among the nation's most efficient teams on third down, as the Utes' 53.28% conversion rate is the fourth-best in the FBS and leads the Big 12. Utah is one of two Big 12 teams with a conversion rate over 50%, alongside TCU.
- 90 Utah has scored on 90.2% of its red zone possessions (37-of-41), one of 30 teams with a
 conversion rate of 90% or higher with 30-plus red zone drives and one of three such teams in
 the Big 12. 32 of those scores have been TDs.

TOP-25 TILT GOES THE WAY OF THE UTES

Donning black jerseys and hand-painted helmets, Utah handed No. 17 Cincinnati its first loss in Big 12 Conference play this season with a 45-14 walloping on a day that started with ESPN's "College GameDay" taking place on President's Circle.

- Utah dominated time of possession, holding the ball for 40:02.
- Utah rushed for 267 yards and three touchdowns on the night while converting on 7-of-15 third downs and both fourth down tries.
- Dampier completed 16-of-31 passes for 213 yards and two touchdowns while rushing 14 times for 78 yards.
- Ryan Davis tallied eight receptions, all from Dampier, for a season-high 132 yards and a score.
- Wayshawn Parker rushed 17 times for 104 yards and a touchdown.
- Parker and Davis are the first Utah duo to rush for 100-plus yards and tally 100-plus receiving yards in the same game since 2023.
- Utah has eclipsed 200 rushing yards in eight games this season, doing so for the first time since 2019.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

STAMPEDING OFFENSE DOWNS COLORADO

The Utes dominated Colorado behind a suffocating rushing attack, leading to a 53-7 rout of the Buffaloes. Utah outgained Colorado, 587-140, behind a record-setting performance in the first career start by freshman Byrd Ficklin.

- The Utes rushed for 422 yards, the seventh-most in a single game in program history and the second-most under Kyle Whittingham.
- Ficklin threw for 140 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for 151 yards and a score, becoming
 just the third Utah QB to both pass and rush for 100-plus yards in a game.
- His 151 rushing yards are the most by a Utah guarterback since at least 1996.
- Wayshawn Parker added a season-high 145 yards and a touchdown, marking the first time since 2021 that Utah had multiple 100-yard rushers in a single game.
- Ficklin (63), Parker (58) and Nate Johnson (56) all logged touchdown runs of 50-plus yards.
- Ficklin's 63-yard score was the longest by the Utes this season and the longest by a Utah QB since the 2008 campaign.

GROUND GAME DOWNS SUN DEVILS

The Utes notched their largest margin of victory against a ranked team since 2015 with a 42-10 rout of No. 21 Arizona State on a rain-soaked, storm-delayed game at Rice-Eccles Stadium.

- The Utes rushed for six touchdowns as a team for just the fifth time in program history. The last was in the game at Stanford during the 2021 season.
- The Utes put up 276 rushing yards; it was more than ASU had in total offense (259) and marked the third time this season that the team rushed for 250+ yards.
- Dampier rushed 10 times for 120 yards and three touchdowns, with his three scores tying a career-high and the most by a Utah player since Ja'Quinden Jackson in 2022.
- He also became the first Utah quarterback since Travis Wilson in 2015 to rush and pass for 100-plus yards in the same game.
- Dampier averaged 12 yards per carry, ranking sixth for a single-game in Utah's recorded history (min. 8 carries). Among quarterbacks, he trails only Darnell Arceneaux who averaged 14.38 yards per carry in a game against UTEP during the 1998 season.

COUNTRY ROADS

Utah secured its first Big 12 Conference win in 2025 with a dominant 48-14 victory on the road at West Virginia.

- Utah scored points on eight of its nine possessions in Morgantown (six touchdowns, two field goals) and did not punt once.
- Utah's 48 points were the most in a conference game since a 55-3 win over ASU in 2023.
- Dampier and Byrd Ficklin combined to complete 25-of-30 passes for 290 yards and five TDs.
- Ryan Davis brought in all seven of his targets for a season-best 107 yards.
- Utah scored double-digit points in all four quarters.

WRANGLED THE COWBOYS

After a slow start in the first half, Utah found its footing on the road at Wyoming, scoring four second-half touchdowns to improve to 3-0 on the season.

- Utah put up 541 yards of total offense and averaged 6.3 yards per play, including a season-high 311 yards on the ground.
- Devon Dampier completed 27-of-41 passes for 230 yards and two touchdowns while leading the team in rushing with 86 yards on 13 carries.
- Dampier connected with Ryan Davis 10 times for 91 yards while finding JJ Buchanan and Larry Simmons for touchdowns.
- Wayshawn Parker (10 carries, 80 yards), Hunter Andrews (6 carries, 62 yards, 1 touchdown) and NaQuari Rogers (13 carries, 60 yards, 1 touchdown) all eclipsed 60 rushing yards.
- Andrews also caught five passes for 44 yards. His rushes, rushing yards, receptions and receiving yards all marked new career-highs.

HOME COOKIN'

The Utes shined in front of their home crowd against Cal Poly, winning their 17th-straight home opener with fans in attendance.

- Utah as a team combined for 518 total yards of offense (245 pass, 273 rush). The passing and
 rushing numbers for the team were each more than Cal Poly had in total offense (223).
- Dampier had four completions of 15-plus yards, with a season-long 52-yard strike going to Wayshawn Parker for a touchdown. All told, Dampier's chunk completions totaled 120 yards.
- The Utes scored 40-plus points for the second game in a row, the first time since doing so in back-to-back outings during the 2022 campaign.
- It also marked the first time since 2014 that Utah has put up 40 or more points on the scoreboard in each of the first two games of the season.
- The win was Utah's 33rd consecutive home victory against a non-conference opponent. Utah
 last lost a non-conference game in front of its home crowd in 2006 and is 44-3 in such games
 since the turn of the century.

FIRST GAME, NO JITTERS

Utah came out of the gates firing on all cylinders to start the 2025 season, beating UCLA 43-10 to improve to 1-0.

- The Utes have now scored 40-plus points in back-to-back season openers; 43 points was the
 most scored by the Utes against an FBS opponent in Week 1 since Utah beat Texas A&M, 41-21, in
 2004.
- Utah's offense put up 492 total yards to open the season (286 rushing, 206 passing). It was the
 most yards gained by a Utah offense since 2023, when Utah gained 513 yards against Arizona
 State.
- The Utes' 30 first downs were the most since Utah picked up 33 against Colorado in 2022.
- Utah's 82.35% conversion rate on third downs (14-for-17) is the third-highest among FBS teams entering Week 2. Utah had not posted a better third-down conversion percentage since going 13-of-16 on third-down tries against San Diego State in 2008.
- Utah scored a touchdown on all six of its red zone trips in Week 1.
- The Utes dominated time of possession, controlling the football for 37:28. That included a 20play, 80-yard touchdown drive in the third guarter that wiped 9:44 off the clock.

DEFENSE TO OFFENSE

A trio of Utah defenders - LB Lander Barton, CB Smith Snowden and S Jackson Bennee - have made an impact on both sides of the ball early in 2025. All three etched their names in the box score both offensively and defensively in Utah's season-opening win and continued to contribute through the non-conference schedule.

- Snowden led all Utah receivers with six catches for 51 yards and rushed three times for 15 yards and a touchdown against UCLA. He entered the season with zero career catches and ranks third on the team with 13 receptions entering Week 8.
- Barton's first career catch was a 14-yard touchdown strike from Dampier in the second quarter at UCLA, while he also led the Utes with seven tackles on the night. He has caught one pass in each outing so far.
- According to StatsPerform, the last time an FBS team had two defensive players score offensive touchdowns in the same game was when UCLA did so in 2015.
- The last time a Utah defensive player scored an offensive touchdown was in 2023 when Sione Vaki did so against California, at USC and at Washington.
- Bennee hauled in one pass for 17 yards while making five tackles at the Rose Bowl.
- DT Semi Taulanga tallied two catches, including a 10-yard grab on his first collegiate touch, against BYU after lining up at fullback.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

OFFENSIVE INFUSION

Utah's revamped offense in 2025 is led by new offensive coordinator Jason Beck, who brought both a spread offense and his quarterback from a year ago with him to Salt Lake City in Dampier.

- Beck led the 2024 Lobo offense to one of their best seasons in school history. UNM eclipsed the 500-yard mark four times and set a school record in yards per game average at more than 484.
- UNM ranked second in the Mountain West and No. 5 in FBS in rushing offense (253.6) while leading the league and ranking fourth in the country in first downs offense (298).
- Prior to his time in Albuquerque, Beck spent two seasons at Syracuse (2022-23), serving as
 quarterbacks coach both years while also getting promoted to offensive coordinator in 2023.
 In 2023 he coached an offense with 1,000-yard rusher LeQuint Allen and a school single-game
 record of 677 yards in a season opener.

- Beck's 2025 offense at Utah has even more continuity from 2024 at New Mexico. The Utes also added wide receivers coach Micah Simon and offensive analyst Koy Detmer Jr., who were both a part of Beck's offensive staff in Albuquerque.
- Dampier became the first UNM quarterback to ever earn All-Mountain West First Team honors in 2024. He led the conference in total offense by piling up 3,934 yards, including 2,768 passing yards, the league's second highest total.
- He was just the fifth QB since 2016 with at least 2,500 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a season, joining Lamar Jackson, Kyler Murray, Jalen Hurts and Jayden Daniels.
- A true dual threat at the quarterback position, Dampier rushed for 1,166 yards which ranked third in the MWC. He finished second in the league with 19 touchdowns and averaged a conference-best 7.52 yards per carry.
- Dampier was the first Lobo QB to ever eclipse 1,000 yards rushing and he rushed for 100 yards in a game six times in 2024.
- One of Dampier's favorite targets from UNM also joined the Utes in wide receiver Ryan Davis
 who caught 54 passes for 747 yards (both second on the team) and a team-high tying three
 touchdowns in 2024. Davis opened the season with three catches for 22 yards.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

A UTAH MAN IS HE

Defensive coordinator Morgan Scalley, a Salt Lake City native and former All-American safety at the U, is in his 18th season on the Utah coaching staff and 10th as defensive coordinator.

- Athletics Director Mark Harlan announced on July 1, 2024 that Scalley has formally been designated as Utah's head coach in waiting.
- In addition to his coordinator duties, Scalley has coached the safeties since he first joined
 the staff in 2008. He was also the team's recruiting coordinator from 2009-15 and special teams
 coordinator in '15 as well.
- Scalley has coached 13 All-Americans (four consensus or unanimous), 20 first team All-Conference selections and five freshmen All-Americans. He has also seen 33 of his proteges reach the NFL, including Devin Lloyd—the highest-drafted linebacker in school history (Round 1, 27th overall in 2022).
- As a player, Scalley came to the Utes out of nearby Highland High School—less than four miles
 from Rice-Eccles Stadium—where Scalley won "Mr. Football" as the state's high school version of the
 Heisman Trophy. He arrived on campus in 2001 and captained the squad as a senior in 2004, earning
 All-America and Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year on the BCS Buster team that won that
 Fiesta Bowl.
- He has been part of four games known today as part of the "New Year's Six": he had three tackles in Utah's Fiesta Bowl win over Pittsburgh (2004), the Sugar Bowl win over Alabama (2008) capped his first season as safeties coach, and he was on the sidelines for both of the Utes' Rose Bowl appearances.
- Both of Scalley's parents are alumni of the U, including his father, Ford "Bud" Scalley, who lettered as a halfback from 1960-62. His father's marquee moment, perhaps, came in November 1960 when he scored a late touchdown—the only one of the game—to beat a nationally-ranked and previously-undefeated Utah State team, 6-0. It came just a week after Bud Scalley was placed on a full scholarship.

R.S.N.B. - RELENTLESS, SMART, NASTY, BALLHAWKS

The long-standing culture of the Utah defense came with the Utes into the Big 12, with R.S.N.B. continuing as the identity of the group: relentless, smart, nasty, ballhawks. The 2025 Utah defense is made up of an experienced cast of returning veterans, along with newcomers ready when called upon—each bringing the physicality that Utah is renowned for.

- In Scalley's 10 seasons as DC, the Utes have averaged 326.6 total yards allowed per game; it leads the Big 12 and ranks ninth among Power Conference programs dating back to 2016. His defense has held opponents under 250 yards in 32 games and under 200 yards 18 times.
- Utah is 31-1 under Scalley when allowing 250 or less yards (won 16 straight) and 18-0 when holding an opponent to 200 or under.
- The Utes return from the bye week with a defense that ranks 16th in the country at 301.1 yards per game—it trails only Texas Tech (269.7) for the Big 12 lead. The Utes and Texas Tech are the only teams in the Big 12 to rank top-20 nationally both in total offense and total defense.
- Under Scalley, Utah is 19-0 against Power Conference teams when allowing 250 or fewer total yards of offense. Most recently, the Utes allowed 140 yards against Colorado (in contrast; the Utah offense racked up 587 yards (422 rushing, 165 passing).
- In Week 4 at West Virginia, the Mountaineers entered the game averaging 408 yards of total offense and ultimately netted 346; WVU also entered the game averaging 203 passing yards per game before the Utes surrendered just 85 yards throughout the air.
- On Oct. 18, Utah held BYU to 368 yards—a full 80 less than the Cougars' average coming into the rivalry matchup.

POINT TAKEN

- Utah's defense has been among the stingiest in the country when it comes to allowing points.
 Opponents have generally struggled to score against the Utes, netting just 14.2 points per game. It puts Utah eighth.
- Texas Tech (34) is the only team this season to rack up more than 24 points against the Utes.
- Utah is the only Big 12 team this season to hold three AP-ranked teams to 24 or fewer points. It
 includes No. 15 BYU (24), No. 17 Cincinnati (14) and No. 21 Arizona State (10). Nine total schools in FBS
 have accomplished the feat at least three times with Alabama and Auburn each doing it four times.
- Despite finishing last season with a 5-7 record, Utah had the second-best scoring defense in the Big 12, allowing 20.7 points per game. Dating back to the start of 2023, Utah has held 24 of its last 34 opponents to 23 points or less, with a shutout included in that span.
- Utah has finished each season since 2017 with a top-three scoring defense in its conference.

KEEPING THE BUFFALOES AT BAY

The Utah defense clicked on all cylinders in the Week 9 win over Colorado, putting on a lock-down effort all night as the Utes improved to 5-2 on the season. CU finished the night with 140 total yards, and sat at -18 total yards at halftime (-41 rushing, 23 passing).

- The 140 opposing total yards of offense were the fewest allowed by Utah since Nov. 4, 2023 against Arizona State (83).
- Colorado's 38 rushing yards on the night were the fewest allowed by Utah since the 2023 regular season finale (coincidentally, also against CU).
- For the evening, the Utah defense racked up 13 tackles for loss, the most since 2023 and tying for 10th most in a game in program history. The Utes' seven sacks were the most for the team since 2023 as well.

QUIET QUARTERS

Utah's success has in part been helped by strong defensive starts to halves. Combined through nine games, the team has allowed just 20 points in the first quarter and 24 points in the third quarter.

- Texas Tech (Week 4) is the only team to score a touchdown against Utah on a game-opening drive, while just three squads have put up points against the Utes on a second-half opening drive.
- For each of the first three quarters, Utah ranks in the top-three in the Big 12 in total yards allowed this season.

CLEAR SKIES AHEAD

Scalley's defense has a history of causing havoc for opposing passing attacks, and the Utes again rank again this season as one of the toughest teams to throw against. Through nine games, opposing quarterbacks are throwing for 156.8 yards per game, putting the Utes atop the Big 12 and sixth across the country. Utah's 99.32 passing efficiency defense also places second in the league and third nationwide.

- Texas Tech and Cincinnati are the only Utah opponents so far this season to pass for more than 170 yards. Other than Utah, every Big 12 team has surrendered at least four passing attacks of 170-plus yards (the league average is 6.1).
- Stats Perform has counted 15 passing plays of 20-plus yards allowed by Utah this season; it is the fewest in the Big 12 and tied for fourth-fewest in the nation.
- Utah is tied for eighth in the conference with eight interceptions and places fourth in the league for interception return yards (154).
- Since the start of 2024, only four teams have passed for 250-plus yards against Utah. It makes the Utes one of 10 schools in the Power Conferences to allow four or fewer 250-yard passing games dating in that time.
- The Utes finished last year fourth in the Power Conferences for pass efficiency defense (112.20) and fifth in the Big 12 for passing yards allowed per game (200.3).

SACK LAKE CITY

The moniker "Sack Lake City" has often been used over the years to describe the physicality and grit of the Utah defensive line. As the Utes turn the page to the home stretch, defensive end John Henry Daley has made a compelling case to become the next mayor of Sack Lake City.

- Daley, a BYU transfer, is tied for sixth in FBS with 9.5 sacks and sits in a share of eighth with 14.0 TFL. Only David Bailey of Texas Tech has a higher total in the Big 12 for both statistics.
- He is the only Utah player in Kyle Whittingham's time as head coach (since 2005) to record at least an assisted sack in each of the first eight games of a season.
- Daley contributed a strip-sack in back-to-back games against Wyoming and Texas Tech,
 becoming the first Utah player since 2017 (Bradlee Anae) to accomplish that back-to-back feat.
- As a team, Utah ranks top-15 in FBS with 2.78 sacks per game. A testament to owning both sides of the trenches, Utah is the only Big 12 program to rank top-20 in the country both in most defensive sacks (14th; 2.78 per game) and fewest sacks allowed (7th; 0.78 per game).

Most Sack Yards - Utah Single-Season History

RUSH HOUR SHUTDOWN

Rushing defense has long been a point of pride for Utah under Morgan Scalley; in his nine prior seasons as coordinator, Utah led the Pac-12 five times (2016, '18, '19, '20 and '21). It includes ranking third in the nation in 2019 when Scalley was a Broyles Award finalist.

- This season, Utah has held UCLA (84), Cal Poly (65) and Colorado (38) each under 100 rushing yards.
- Utah's performance against UCLA was the fifth time in the last six season openers that the Utes kept their opponent under 100 yards on the ground. It's a span that also includes lid-lifters against USC (93 yards in 2020) and Florida (13 yards in 2023).
- Since Scalley took on coordinator duties in 2016, the Utes have averaged 112.7 rushing yards allowed per game, ranking third among Power Conference teams. Utah's 121 rushing touchdowns allowed since 2016 place the team sixth for the fewest allowed by a Power Conference defense.

TWO-WAY STREET

Three members of the Utah defense have also contributed on offense; the trio includes linebacker Lander Barton, safety Jackson Bennee and cornerback Smith Snowden.

- Bennee is tied for the team lead with 43 tackles, which includes back-to-back games with a a career-best eight stops (ASU, BYU). His three interceptions this season put him in a tie for fourth in the Big 12, while Bennee's 103 interception return yards lead the league and place him eighth in the country.
- He is the only Power Conference player this season to have multiple interceptions on defense and multiple receptions on offense. Against Cal Poly, he added three PBU and a pick-six, before following that with another interception at Wyoming.
- Snowden has started all nine games on defense, as well as on offense against UCLA and Cal Poly. He logged one tackle at UCLA—but perhaps made his biggest impact lining up at wide receiver. He scored Utah's second touchdown of the game on an eight-yard rush, while also catching all six of his targets for 51 yards. To date, he has eight rushes for 40 yards (1TD) and 13 catches for 57 yards.
- Barton posted a team-leading seven tackles in the UCLA contest, while reeling in a 14-yard touchdown pass from Devon Dampier during the second quarter.
- Prior to the UCLA game, the last time a Utah defensive player scored an offensive touchdown
 was in 2023 when Sione Vaki accomplished the feat vs. California, at USC and at Washington.
 According to StatsPerform, the last time an FBS team had two defensive players score offensive
 touchdowns in the same game was when UCLA did so in 2015.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

NO THIRD CHANCES

Utah has built a reputation over the years as one of the toughest teams in the nation to convert against in third-down situations. The Utes enter Week 12 with a 31.5% opponent conversion rate, second in the Big 12 Conference and 15th across FBS.

- Partly a byproduct of having a stingy third-down defense, Utah has won the time of possession battle in 14 of its 21 games since the start of 2024. The Utes rank second in the Big 12 in TOP per game (32:32) after finishing last year second in the Big 12 in TOP.
- The Utes have held the ball in excess of 35 minutes in three games this season: the season opener at UCLA (37:28), in Week 3 at Wyoming (35:30) and in Week 10 vs. Cincinnati (40:02). The Cincinnati total was the team's highest possession time since Week 4 at Oklahoma State last season (42:26).
- In Week 9 against Colorado, the Utes shut down the Buffaloes on nine of their final 10 third-down conversion attempts, which included a safety. Overall for the game, Colorado was 3-for-16 on third down.
- The Utes' Week 8 performance on third down saw the team hold BYU without a successful conversion on its first seven tries and just three of 12 all night.
- In the season opener, UCLA was able to convert just two third-down opportunities out of 11 tries. The Bruins were 2-for-7 on conversion attempts in the first half and came up empty on four opportunities during the second half. In total, Utah limited the Bruins to 14 first downs on the night.
- In their inaugural Big 12 season of 2024, the Utes posted a 27.4% opponent conversion rate—leading the Power Conferences. That feat came after Utah finished atop the Pac-12 for third-down defense both in 2022 and '23.
- The Utes had a top-three (or better) third-down defense in the Pac-12 each year from 2018-23 and led the league four times in that span.

Jackson Bennee's 46-yard interception return touchdown vs. Cal Poly extended Utah's nation-leading streak to 22 consecutive seasons with a pick-six (and Bennee nearly added another the following week at Wyoming). The streak dates back to 2004, when current defensive coordinator Morgan Scalley was a senior and played safety on the Utes' Fiesta Bowl-winning team.

- This run of annual pick-sixes is the longest known streak in FBS history, surpassing Arizona State (20 seasons from 2000-19) for the longest.
- During the 21-season span since 2004, Utah has totaled 49 interception return touchdowns, the most in FBS.
- Jonathan Fanene and Steve Fifita scored Utah's pick-sixes in 2004 to begin the streak.

The Utah defense has sent 12 players to the NFL over the last four seasons, breaking down to five draft selections and seven more Pro Utes reaching the league as undrafted free agents. At least one defensive player from Utah was selected in the top four rounds of each NFL Draft from 2022 through '24.

- Rookie DE-turned-LB Connor O'Toole (Seattle) and LB Karene Reid (Denver) each made their clubs' respective rosters this year after signing as undrafted free agents. Fellow rookies in DT Junior Tafuna (Houston) and CB Zemaiah Vaughn (Minnesota) each are on their respective practice squads.
- Safeties Cole Bishop and Sione Vaki are in their second season after being selected in the 2024
 NFL Draft. Bishop was picked by Buffalo in the second round while Vaki is with Detroit as a running back after playing both ways at Utah.
- In 2022, Devin Lloyd become the highest-drafted linebacker in school history when he was taken in Round 1 (No. 27 overall) by Jacksonville. A consensus all-America selection in 2021, Lloyd was a Butkus Award finalist in both of his final two seasons at Utah. Lloyd is tied for the NFL lead with four interceptions.
- Cornerback Jaylon Johnson, who was with the Utes from 2017-19 as an all-American and two-time all-conference pick, is now in his sixth season with the Chicago Bears and is a two-time Pro Rowl selection.

NEW FACES, SAME PRODUCTION

The Utes and Special Teams Coordinator Sharrieff Shah have a new-look group in 2025 following the departure of kicker Cole Becker, punter Jack Bouwmeester and long snapper JT Greep. The Utes brrought in freshman Dillon Curtis and sophomore transfer Robert Petrich to join sophomore Joey Cheek as placekickers, while Orion Phillips comes to Utah after one season at Missouri and will look to continue the Utes' strong lineage of punters. After appearing in one game a season ago, junior Logan Castor will look to man the long snapping duties.

- Curtis leads the team in scoring with 72 points and his 45 made PATs are the most in the Big 12.
- The Murray native was a perfect 9-for-9 on PATs against Cal Poly, which tied for the third-most in a single game in program history and the most since 2022.
- Curtis connected on three field goals, including a 53-yarder, and six PATs for a career-high 15 points against Colorado.
- Curtis made an immediate impression in his first collegiate game, connecting from 54 yards on his first field goal try, the longest in program history by a freshman.
- He also became the first Utah kicker with multiple 50-plusyard field goals in a season since Matt Gay in 2018 when he connected from 53 against Colorado.
- The freshman has 46 touchbacks on 60 kickoffs through nine games this season, the third-most in the conference
- Phillips is averaging 42.5 yards per punt through nine games.
- He has pinned opponents inside the 20-yard line 10 times on 24 total punts.
- Five of his 20 punts have been 50-plus yards, including a season-long 67-yarder against Colorado.
- Phillips has allowed just one return for positive yardage on his punts, a two-yard return at BYU.
- Logan Castor has provided the Utes with 82 total snaps this season after providing two in his three prior collegiate seasons.
- He snapped for Curtis' nine PATs and Phillips' three punts against Cal Poly.
- Against Cincinnati, Mana Carvalho took a punt back 75 yards for his first collegiate touchdown, Utah's first punt return TD since Britain Covey in 2021.
- Carvalho logged five punt returns for 60 yards against Colorado.
- Carvalho does not currently qualify for the national or conference leaderboard, but his average of 15.4 yards per runback would lead the Big 12 and put him seventh nationally.
- Rayshawn Glover rattled off a 51-yard punt return against Cal Poly, the longest return of his career.
- Smith Snowden started returning kicks in the BYU game last year, fielding three for 81 yards against the Cougars. He served as the primary return man for the final three games, and finished the season with the team lead in return yards (187).
 Snowden resumed his handling of this responsibility in 2025.
- Snowden tied for 14th nationally and ranked third in the Big 12 in kick return yards during the last four weeks of the season.

THE STANDARD IS THE STANDARD

Special teams have long been a focal point within the Utah program. From national award winners to record-setting performances, the Utes' prowess in the third phase of the game has been a defining trait of the Kyle Whittingham era.

- No school has won the Ray Guy Award, given annually to the nation's mobest collegiate punter, more than Utah. Utah is the only program to win the award three times, while Baylor, Georgia Tech and Louisiana Tech have each had two winners.
- Two Utes have taken home the award Tom Hackett won in both 2014 and 2015 and Mitch Wishnowsky followed him by lifting the trophy in 2016. Hackett is one of only three punters to claim the accolade multiple times.
- Utah is one of only two programs, alongside lowa, to have produced both a Lou Groza and Ray Guy Award winner after Matt Gay was selected as the nation's best kicker in 2017.

- First Utah kicker with multiple 50-yard field goals in a season since Matt Gay in 2018.
- Nailed his first collegiate field goal try from 54 yards in Utah's season opening win at UCLA, the longest in program history for a freshman.
- Connected on a 53-yard attempt against Colorado, his second 50-plus-yard field goal in his career.
- Logged a career-high 15 points (3 FG, 6 PAT) against CU.
- His nine PATs against Cal Poly tied for the third-most in a game in program history.
- Leads the Big 12 with 45 extra points.
- Tops the squad and ranks eighth in the conference with 72 points.
- Has recorded 46 touchbacks on 60 kickoffs.
- Rated a six-star kicker and a five-star punter by Chris Sailer Kicking out of Murray HS.
- Invited to the 2025 Navy All-American Bowl.
- Two-time all-region and all-state first-team selection.
- Two-time Region Special Teams MVP.
- Holds the Utah state records for longest field goal (63) and most field goals made in a season (21).
- Set another state record with six field goals in a game against Payson in 2024.
- Was 39-of-39 on PATs and 21-of-27 on field goals as a senior, knocking in a career-long 63-yarder in 2024.
- Averaged 59.1 yards per kickoff his senior season.
