The First Pitch: Things to Know

- The fourth Big 12 Conference series of the season is on deck for the Utah baseball team and it brings the Utes to West Virginia for a three-game set with the Mountaineers. The series will be played from April 4-6 inside Wagener Field at Kendrick Family Ballpark in Morgantown, West Virginia.
- West Virginia is ranked in three of the five major college baseball polls this week. The Mountaineers were slotted No. 11 in the Perfect Game poll, No. 23 by the NCBWA and No. 25 in the USA Today Coaches Poll.
- The series this weekend will mark the first time that Utah has played in the Eastern Time Zone since 2019. In April of that season, the Utes took two of three games played on the campus of East Carolina, dropping the opener to the host Pirates before rattling off neutral-site wins over Western Carolina and Wright State.
- In the available history of the Utah baseball program, this is the first time the team has faced a program from The Mountain State (either West Virginia or Marshall).
- Utah is looking to snap out of a four-game losing streak and was most recently in action with a weekend series against Arizona State. Austen Roellig went 7-for-12 and all of Core Jackson's four hits went for extra bases, but the ASU bats were too hot for Utah to keep up with at Smith's Ballpark.
- Both Friday's opener and Sunday's series finale last weekend were tied after six innings, before ASU pulled away late in both contests. Utah had opportunities in the middle game on Saturday, but left 12 men on base and was plagued by four errors.
- Now members of the Big 12 Conference, the league is Utah's fifth affiliation since resuming varsity baseball in 1948. Previously, the Utes have played in the Skyline Conference (1948-62), WAC (1963-99), Mountain West (2000-2011) and Pac-12 Conference (2012-24). Since joining the WAC, Utah has won five conference championships, most recently in 2016 as a member of the Pac-12.
- Shortstop and senior Core Jackson continues to lead the Utah offense with a .406 batting average, 10 doubles, six home runs, 24 RBI and 31 runs scored—all team bests. In addition, infielder Austen Roellig (.336), outfielder Kaden Carpenter (.324) and infielder Tyler Quinn (.308) are each hitting over .300 with at least 19 RBI and 11 extra-base hits.
- Both Jackson and right-handed pitcher Colter McAnelly were included on the midseason position rankings released by D1Baseball.com. Jackson was listed as the No. 13 shortstop in the country and McAnelly checked in as the No. 32-ranked starting pitcher.

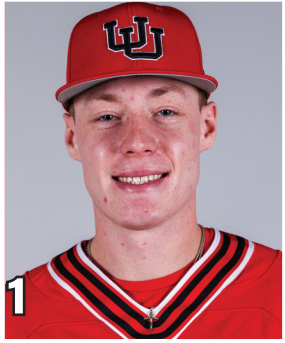

This Week in Utah Baseball History

April 3, 2016 – Utah completes its first Pac-12 Conference sweep since joining the league with a 4-2 win at home over Arizona. The Utes had to come from behind in all three games at Smith’s Ballpark and sealed the sweep when DaShawn Keirse, Jr. smacked a two-run double in the eighth inning of game three. In the series opener two days earlier, Jayson Rose pitched a seven-inning start with 10 strikeouts. Utah went on to win the Pac-12 Championship.

Midseason Mentions

A pair of Utah Utes were included on the midseason position rankings released by D1Baseball.com, including Core Jackson (No. 13 shortstop) and Colter McAnelly (No. 32 starting pitcher). McAnelly was the top-ranked starting pitcher from the Big 12 Conference on the list while Jackson had the second-best spot among shortstops in the league.

- Jackson returned for his senior season at Utah after putting on an All-Pac-12 campaign during 2024. His success as a junior has carried forward into the Big 12, leading the Utes in most major offensive categories including batting average (.406), OBP (.471), slugging percentage (.689), runs batted in (24), runs scored (43), home runs (6) and total bases (73) while tying for a team-best with 10 doubles.
- Conference-wide, Jackson checks in among the leaders in batting average (5th), hits (T-2nd, 43) and total bases (5th). The native of Wyoming, Ontario, he has a .977 fielding percentage which was tied for the best among the top-13 players on D1Baseball.com's list.
- McAnelly took on the Friday night starter role heading into the 2025 season and has been stellar with three Big 12 Pitcher of the Week recognitions. Hailing from Cheyenne, Wyoming, he has made seven starts with a 2-1 record and 2.72 earned run average; his ERA clocks in at third-best in the Big 12. He leads the league in innings pitched (46.1) and WHIP (0.99), while also ranking near the top of the conference in strikeouts (2nd; 51), opposing batting average (4th; .204) and walks per nine innings (5th; 2.33).
- Helped by a 12-strikeout outing against Oklahoma State—which tied the Utah program record—McAnelly has notched 25 K's in conference play, the most of any arm in the Big 12 to date.

Rollin' with Roellig

LSU transfer and California native Austen Roellig joined the Utes as a redshirt freshman and has made an immediate impact—starting all 26 games including 22 at third base.

- One of the most consistent bats in the lineup recently, Roellig ran up a 12-game hitting streak that came to an end in the Kansas State series finale on March 16. The streak is a longest by a Utah player this season.
- After finishing the first week of the season with a .188 batting average, he has climbed nearly 150 points since then to .336 with nine doubles, one triple, a home run and 19 RBIs. In Utah's 10 games since beginning Big 12 Conference play he is hitting .405 with five doubles, a homer, 12 RBI and three walks.

- His first collegiate home run came in the K-State series opener (March 14).
- Roellig has gone error-free on 50 chances this season (32 ast, 18 PO) including 38 chances at the hot corner.
- Well-versed on the left side of the infield, Roellig was ranked by Perfect Game as the No. 11 shortstop in the high school Class of 2023, No. 37 overall player in California and No. 51 shortstop nationally. He was a .357 career hitter at Etiwanda High School, helping the Eagles win a CIF Division II Championship in 2022.

Tough Out

Two players from Utah rank among the top-six in the Big 12 as the toughest to strike out. The pair includes Santino Panaro (5th; 10.8 K/AB) and Tyler Quinn (6th; 9.7 K/AB). Santino Panaro (6th; 10.9 K/AB) and Austen Roellig (9th; 9.5 K/AB). Arizona State (2) is the only other team in the league to have multiple players in the top-seven.

- Now in his second season at Utah, Quinn has raised his batting average nearly 100 points from a year ago, going from .218 in 2024 to .308 entering the West Virginia series. He has struck out just 11 times this season and is tied for second on the team with six multi-RBI games.
- Panaro has missed only one game this season for Utah, earning 25 starts in center field with a .291 batting average to rank sixth on the team. He has six doubles, two triples and a homer two his name, while his range has earned Panaro 80 putouts—some well-earned—plus an outfield assist. At UNLV in 2022, he was the Mountain West's toughest player to strike out, averaging 9.5 at bats per K.
- Panaro leads the team and ranks second in the big 12 with six sacrifice bunts.

The C-Mac Attack

Right-handed pitcher Colter McAnelly has won Big 12 Conference Pitcher of the Week three times this season. He was named the league's Pitcher of the Week each of the first two weeks--sharing the honor once—before winning it again on March 24.

- McAnelly brings a 2.72 ERA into the weekend, ranking top-three in the Big 12. He has a 2-2 record, including an eight-inning outing on March 21 in a combined shutout win over Oklahoma State. The sophomore tied the Utah program record with 12 strikeouts in that game, holding the Cowboys to five hits and three walks.
- His 0.99 WHP leads the Big 12 Conference sits 52nd in college baseball.

- In six of his seven outings he has tossed at least six innings—four of the seven have also featured seven-plus strikeouts.
- He received a no-decision at Kansas State (March 14) but left in line for the win after seven innings.
- On Feb. 21 at San Diego State, he went seven innings with 10 strikeouts. His first seven outs were recorded via 'K', and the leadoff batter never reached against McAnelly. It took until the seventh inning before he walked anyone or allowed a runner to reach third base. Lucas Boesen came on in the eighth inning for McAnelly and finished the combined shutout.
- He was on the receiving end of a tough-luck loss at San Jose State (March 7), dealing eight innings of two-run ball with eight strikeouts.

Baseball, at its Core

Shortstop Core Jackson is back for his senior season at Utah after putting on an All-Conference campaign in '24. He was named the Brooks Wallace Award Player of the Week on March 4, given to the nation's top shortstop of the past week. One of the Pac-12's top defensive shortstops a year ago, Jackson is looking to carry that prowess into the Big 12.

- Jackson has enjoyed a hot bat to start 2025, tabbing the top-five in the Big 12 with a .406 average while his 43 hits are the second-most in the conference. He also sits fifth in the league with 73 total bases.
- He slashed .565 / .630 / .870 the week of Feb. 24 to help Utah to a 4-1 record and earn Brooks Wallace weekly honors. Six of his 13 hits in that stretch were for extra bases, including five doubles. He scored 10 runs and drove in 10 more as well, while going error-free on 26 defensive chances.
- He has hit safely in 19 of Utah's last 21 games (Feb. 22-present). It includes a 6-for-14 weekend against Oklahoma State with two homers. Jackson's three doubles in the Feb. 28 win at California Baptist are tied for the most this season by a Big 12 player.
- He reached base in five of six plate appearances during the March 2 game at UC Riverside, contributing four of Utah's 21 hits. The team hits total remains in the top-five for a Big 12 program to date this season.
- As a junior, Jackson started 52 games at shortstop, slashing .363 / .463 / .516 with 15 doubles, three triples, four home runs, 41 RBI, 30 walks and 51 runs scored. His .363 batting average was a team-best while he stole 17 bases, ranking second both on the team and in the Pac-12.

- He also was among the league leaders in batting average (4th), OBP (3rd) and hits (4th; 78). One of the league's top defensive shortstops, he led the Pac-12 in assists (163) and had a hand in 38 double plays, the fifth-most across the conference.

- During league play, he ranked second with a .398 batting average. D1Baseball.com listed Jackson as the No. 11-ranked shortstop in the country on its 2024 late season rankings.

- In 2023 at South Mountain Community College, Jackson appeared in 53 games, hitting .321 with 16 doubles, three triples, four homers and 33 RBI.

- He also spent 2022 in the Big Ten at Nebraska, hitting .210 in 44 games with six doubles, two triples, a home run and 21 RBI.

D1Baseball Names Five Utes as Top Preseason Big 12 Prospects

Every preseason, D1Baseball.com ranks the top prospects throughout each Division I conference. This year, five Utes were recognized on the site's ranking of top Big 12 prospects.

- For the 2025 MLB Draft, D1Baseball.com included right-handed pitcher Merit Jones (No. 16), shortstop Core Jackson (No. 18) and outfielder Kaden Carpenter (No. 44) among the league's top prospects. Sophomore right-hander Colter McAnelly was slotted in the top-25 for the 2026 draft, while fellow right-hander and freshman Dillon Fine was tabbed No. 15 on the list of impact freshmen in the Big 12.

- Jones has held down the Saturday spot in the weekend rotation this season, including an eight-inning start on March 8 in which he helped Utah even up its series at San Jose State. It was a career-long outing for the junior as he racked up six strikeouts and walked just two Spartans on the day.

- One of six Utes batting .300 or better, Jackson (.419) has started the last 24 games at shortstop, contributing 24 RBI and 31 runs scored. He leads the team with nine stolen bases, and leads all returners from the 2024 team with 17 swipes that season. Jackson's 10 doubles are tied with Kaden Carpenter for the team lead.

- Carpenter has started all 26 games in right field, hitting .324 so far on the season. He scored a key insurance run in extra innings during the Feb. 14 season opener as Utah came away with a 3-1 victory over Pepperdine. Then in the win over Seattle (Feb. 22), Carpenter's two-run single in the eighth inning tied the score at three—before Matt

Flaharty had a walk-off single in the ninth. His first homer of the season came at Kansas State on March 16.

- McAnelly has won Big 12 Pitcher of the Week three times this season. He tied the program record with 12 strikeouts in his start against Oklahoma State, going eight shutout innings for the win on March 21.
- Coming to the Utes from Caldwell, Idaho, Fine has made seven appearances (two starts) with 11 innings pitched to date.

This is the Place

Utah added considerable talent heading into the 2025 campaign, both from the transfer portal and the high school ranks. All told, 22 players are embarking on their first season as Utah Utes.

- On the bump, the Utes added experience in LHP Mateus Conaway (Whitman College) and RHP Brady Joyner (Willamette). A two-way player, Conaway was a two-time All-Northwest Conference pick; he was a .277 career hitter while also recording a 6-1 season on the mound in 2023. Joyner reset the Willamette program record for career saves (25) and tied the single-season record with 10 in 2023.
- A variety of position players joined the program through the transfer portal, including OF and 2022 Mountain West Freshman of the Year Santino Panaro (UNLV), two-way player Demetri Diamant (Georgia Tech) and INF Austen Roellig (LSU).
- Catchers Cal Kilgore and Derek Smith both have come to the Utes from the junior college ranks, though each have one season of Division I baseball under their belts. Kilgore was part of the NM State team that won the WAC in 2022, while Smith spent 2023 at Oklahoma State. Outfielder Jake Long hit .353 last year at Santa Ana College, after posting an All-CIF career at La Serna HS.
- Freshman RHP Dillon Fine was ranked as D1Baseball.com's No. 15 Big 12 Impact Freshman. He was a decorated two-way player at Homedale HS in Idaho, helping the Trojans win three district championships and one state runner-up finish. The 2024 Idaho 3A Player of the Year went 12-0 with a blistering 0.37 ERA and 126 strikeouts—his third straight season with 100-plus punchouts on the bump.

"If You Build it, They Will Come"

Construction is underway for Charlie Monfort Field at America First Ballpark, slated to become the new on-

campus home of the Utah Baseball program. Pending construction schedules, the field surface is expected to be available for team practice only sometime in Spring 2025. The facility is anticipated to be ready for game competition in the 2026 season.

- The new ballpark will be located at the site of the Utes' former practice field on Guardsman Way. Plans call for a 1,200-seat ballpark with fan amenities including concessions, restrooms, ticket office and merchandise sales, as well as facilities for the Utah baseball program, including locker rooms, coaches' offices, medical space, equipment storage and indoor batting/pitching cages. The total project is expected to cost \$35 million, with the majority of the funding privately raised.
- Currently, the Utes play their home games at Smith's Ballpark in Downtown Salt Lake City, which has served as the team's primary home venue since the 1996 season. Baseball in some fashion (collegiate and/or professional) has been played at the corner of 13th South and West Temple since 1928 with the opening of Community Park, which was renamed Derks Field in 1940. Derks Field closed in 1993 to make way for the current Smith's Ballpark to open in 1994.
- After reinstating baseball as a varsity sport in 1948, Utah played its first home game on April 21 of that year at Derks Field. A capacity crowd watched the Utes take down in-state foe Utah State by a 4-2 score.
- While the Utes have used Smith's Ballpark their primary home venue for four decades, the program did play a small selection of midweek games at its former on-campus field as recently as 2008.

Opening Day Loading...

Three Utah baseball alumni were on Opening Day rosters throughout MLB, including left-handed pitcher Tanner Banks (PHI), infielder Oliver Dunn (MIL) and outfielder DaShawn Keirse Jr. (MIN).

- A Beehive State native out of Riverton, Utah, Banks spent the 2013-14 seasons with the Utes. He picked up four wins in 27 appearances at Utah, contributing both as a starter and out of the bullpen. Banks was drafted by the Chicago White Sox in the 18th round of the 2014 MLB Draft and made his big league debut in 2022. He was dealt to Philadelphia at the 2024 trade deadline, combining for 132 career appearances (five starts), a 5-7 record, 3.82 ERA and three saves.
- Dunn was at the U from 2017-19 and played in 155 games with 153 starts. A .312 career hitter, the homegrown product out of Salt Lake City was a Collegiate

Baseball Third-Team All-American, ABCA All-Region and two-time All-Pac-12 selection. He was selected by the New York Yankees in the 11th round of the 2019 MLB Draft. As a rookie with the Brewers (spread across 2024-25) he has played in 44 games with a .206 batting average, two doubles, two triples, one homer and seven RBIs.

- Selected by Minnesota in the fourth round of the 2018 MLB Draft, Keirseyy capped his Utah career as an ABCA All-Region selection. He was named All-Pac-12 First-Team and All-Defensive Team each of his three seasons at Utah (2016-18). He tallied 154 career games played with 148 career starts, finishing with a .334 average, 42 doubles, 11 triples eight homers and 83 RBIs. He climbed his way through the Twins minor league system from 2019-24 before making his MLB debut on Sept. 5, 2024. He has appeared in 10 big league games with the Twins.

Building Blocks

The Utes won 33 games during the 2024 season, the most in the Power Conference era of the program and tying the second-most all time. In addition, the 2024 team became the fastest to reach 30 wins, hitting that milestone on May 5 with a win over Oregon in the 45th game of the season. Previously, the 1997 club had taken 47 games to reach 30 wins.

Names Called

Three members of the Utah Baseball program were selected in the 2024 MLB Draft. It included outfielder Kai Roberts (7th round – SD), southpaw closer Micah Ashman (11th round – DET) and right-hander Merit Jones (20th round – MIN). The three picks were the most for Utah in a single MLB Draft since 2017.

- Jones, picked as a draft-eligible sophomore, elected to return to Utah for his junior season. He has made 38 career appearances (33 starts). As a sophomore in 2024, Jones made 13 starts and finished 3-5 with 68.1 innings of work. He struck out 68 batters along the way. Though primarily used in the rotation, his first collegiate save came in the Pac-12 Tournament when the Utes knocked off Oregon during pool play.
- Jones has also performed strongly in the classroom, as the health and kinesiology major was named CSC

Academic All-District in 2024.

- One of the most improved players in recent program history, Roberts raised his batting average nearly 100 points (.266 to .356) his senior year and bumped his slugging percentage from .393 to .562, to go with career-highs of 83 hits, 21 doubles, seven home runs and 58 RBI. The ABCA All-Region honoree became the top base-stealer in Utah history, finishing with 66 career swipes and 33 his final season—both program records.
- In his three seasons, Ashman earned two Pac-12 All-Conference selections and set the program record with 20 career saves. He had a 4-8 career record and 3.36 ERA, and closed out 11 games in 2024—the second-most by a Ute all-time for a single season. It also ranked second in the Pac-12 and sixth nationally.

One of the most respected coaching figures in college baseball, Utah skipper Gary Henderson was named the ninth head coach in modern program history on June 9, 2021. Henderson, the NCBWA 2018 National Coach of the Year, previously served as the Utes' associate head coach in 2020 and '21.

A seasoned veteran in the coaching world, Henderson owns 37 prior years of experience, highlighted by stops at Florida, Oregon State, Kentucky and Mississippi State prior to coming to Utah. His 13 seasons as a head coach rank third-most of all skippers in the Big 12 entering 2025.

Well-known for his ability to produce Major League talent on the mound, Henderson has worked with 17 pitchers that have reached the big leagues since 2012. He also spent Summer 2015 as the pitching coach for the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team; 10 arms from that club have since reached the big leagues.

The 2024 Utes made strides with one of the program's top seasons in history. Utah's 9-1 start was the best since 1980 as the team went on to win 33 games—tying the second-most victories all-time. Henderson's club entered the national polls with a top-25 ranking from D1Baseball.com, the first time that the Utes had been ranked in any of the five current major college baseball polls.

It was a much-improved season in virtually every facet. On the mound, Utah native Bryson Van Sickle was named ABCA All-Region and Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year, the latter making Van Sickle the first in program history to win Pitcher of the Year. He headlined four All-Conference First Team honors, tying the most in the Utes' Power Conference era. Fellow southpaw and All-Conference honoree Micah Ashman broke the Utah career saves record, serving as a lockdown closer for a pitching staff that lowered its ERA by more than two runs from 2023.

Offensively, Utah set Power Conference era program records in batting average, runs scored, hits, total bases, slugging percentage, OBP and stolen bases. The Utes' seven runs per game was the highest since 2006 and marked the third straight season that the team's scoring average increased from the prior year. Four Utes hit over .300, including Kai Roberts—who reset both the single-season and career stolen base program records.

Roberts (San Diego), Ashman (Detroit) and draft-eligible sophomore Merit Jones (Minnesota) were all selected in the 2024 MLB Draft--the most in a single season at Utah since 2017. Jones elected to return to Utah for his junior season.

Following the 2023 season, three Utah arms signed professional contracts as Cam Day signed with the Los Angeles Dodgers organization, McCleve with the Tampa Bay Rays and Blake Whiting landed with the Milwaukee Brewers.

As Utah's associate head coach in 2020 and '21, Henderson worked under longtime Utes skipper Bill Kinneberg, who retired in May 2021 after 18 years leading the program.

Henderson arrived at Utah following two seasons at Mississippi State. After serving as the Bulldogs' pitching coach in 2017, he became the interim head

coach for the Bulldogs midway through 2018 and led the program to the College World Series in thrilling fashion.

The success he had as interim coach at Mississippi State came as no surprise, as he had been one of the most successful coaches in the University of Kentucky's baseball history from 2004-08 as an assistant and 2009-16 as the head coach. The Wildcats won at least 30 games in five-straight seasons for the first time in school history. He was voted SEC Coach of the Year by his peers after the school's record-breaking 2012 season.

Henderson reached 200 wins faster than any head coach in Kentucky history. In his tenure with the Wildcats, 72 players were picked in the MLB Draft or signed as free agents.

Prior to Kentucky, Henderson spent five seasons as pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at Oregon State. Before Oregon State, Henderson served as pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at Florida from 1995-98. In that time, he helped the Gators to the SEC Championship and the College World Series in both 1996 and 1998.
