2007 MEN'S USTCCCA DIVISION I OUTDOOR SOUTH CENTRAL COACH OF THE YEAR

19-TIME SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE HEAD COACH OF THE YEAR

UT Arlington Head Track and Field and Cross Country Coach John Sauerhage is firmly entrenched as one of the all-time most successful coaches in the Southland Conference as he enters his 16th year leading the Mavericks.

Since taking over the program in 1996, Sauerhage has led the Mavericks to 19 team championships and has won an unprecedented 19 SLC Coach of the Year honors.

Sauerhage continues that success today. Last year he helped three women – Jasmine Walls, Jerono Patrober and Shannon Reynolds – to all-conference honors. He also guided 11 UTA athletes – Cordero Gray, Antonia Hopkins, Megan Turner, Lionel Mungwari, Renan Palma, Aundrea Williams, Isiah Clements and Wade Hayes, in addition to Walls, Patrober and Reynolds – to NCAA Preliminaries appearances.

In 2009, Sauerhage guided Gray and Walls to All-American honors. Overall, he has coached 17 athletes to All-American honors.

Sauerhage has also coached on the international level. He served as the head coach of the El Salvadorian national team at the 2009 World University Games in Belgrade, Serbia.

Since Sauerhage took over the program, UTA athletes have performed on the highest levels of international competition. Four former athletes, including Jared Connaughton (for Canada in 2008), Takeshi Fujiwara (for El Salvador in 2004) and Elston Cawley (for the United States in 1996) competed in the Olympics. Sauerhage has

also coached five athletes who have earned trips to the IAAF World Championships.

In 2007, Sauerhage earned his biggest accolade, the United States Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) named him the Division I Outdoor Track and Field Men's South Central District Coach of the Year. He won the award after guiding the men's team to its first SLC outdoor team title in more than a decade with a one-point win over UTSA.



Sauerhage, a former UTA standout, returned to his alma mater in 1989 as an assistant coach for seven years as an assistant before taking the reins in Fall 1996.

As head coach, Sauerhage found success immediately, winning league championships in women's indoor, men's indoor and men's outdoor track in each of his first season and taking home Coach of the Year honors in each sport. For an encore, he led the Mavs to titles in men's indoor and outdoor and women's indoor track and cross country.

Finding an empty spot on Sauerhage's mantle today is no easy task, but it might soon become imperative. He thinks his 2011 teams have an excellent chance to build on 2010 seasons that saw the men finish fourth and the women finish second.

In Year Three, Sauerhage accomplished something that had never been accomplished in UTA history: He led the UTA women to the triple crown, winning the cross country, indoor and outdoor conference championships. Under Sauerhage's tutelage,

the Maverick women accomplished the feat a second time in 2001.

The women's indoor team claimed SLC titles in each of his first six seasons. He was named SLC Women's Indoor Track Coach of the Year each time in that stretch. He compiled 10 more conference titles from 1998-2001 – four in women's outdoor, four in men's indoor and two in men's outdoor.

Sauerhage coached the men's cross country team to a conference championship and the women's cross country team to three conference titles, including back-to-back titles in 2001-02. The Southland Conference has named him Cross Country Coach of the Year three times — once for men and twice for women's teams.

Since 1989, Sauerhage has coached 10 athletes to individual conference championships in cross country. UTA athletes have also won 73 SLC track titles in events ranging from the 800m to the 10000m, including nine in 1994. Dwight Robinson accomplished the feat in 2010.

Sauerhage's program has succeeded off the track as well. In 2010, the USTFCCCA honored the women's track programs as one of the top Di-

vision I academic units. Two athletes, Megan Turner and Brittany Culbertson, were recognized for their individual academic work.

Sauerhage began his collegiate career at Louisiana State University, where he placed sixth in the Southeastern Conference in the 1000-yard and mile distances before transferring to UTA. At Arlington High School, Sauerhage was a six-time state qualifier, won the Class 5A mile in 1979 and ran a 4:10.6 in the mile.

As a member of the UTA track and field team, Sauerhage won the SLC title in the mile and was a member of the school record-holding 6000-meter relay team. He ranks second in UTA history in the 1500m in both indoor and outdoor in the 1500m with times of 3:51.50 and 3:49.35, respectively.

Sauerhage graduated from UTA in 1986 with a bachelor's degree in physical education. He received a master's degree in education from Louisiana-Monroe in 1988, as a graduate assistant coach.

An avid fan of the St. Louis Cardinals and first baseman Albert Pujols, Sauerhage and his wife, Lisa, reside in Arlington.

BRANDON BERGER

ASSISTANT COACH // FIELD

5TH YEAR // UT ARLINGTON

Brandon Berger has coached Mavericks to Southland Conference championships five times during his first four years as the field events specialist on UT Arlington's coaching staff.

That run includes guiding Adolphus Jones to a dominant championship in the heptathlon at the 2010 Southland Conference Indoor Championships. Jones won the event in spectacular fashion, breaking the program and conference records in the process while finishing no worse than sixth in any event.

Jones also finished second in the open high jump by clearing 2.06 meters and placed fourth in the open long jump.

Under Berger's tutelage last season, Aundrea Williams won the 400m hurdles and Megan Turner and Renan Palma advanced to the NCAA Meet in the 400h and 110h, respectively.

Williams and Isiah Clements, who finished third in the high jump at the SLC Outdoor Championships, both advanced to the NCAA Championships as well.

In all, Berger led nine athletes – Williams, Clements, Turner, Andrea Guerra, Jennifer Brown, Renan Palma, Lionel Mungwari, Keaton Mata and Ivan Storic – to score at the SLC Outdoor Championships. Six athletes – Brown, Palma, Clements, Mungwari, Jones and Eld-hah Kaswataka – scored at the SLC Indoor Championships.

The accomplishments Berger racked up before last year have been plentiful as well. As a sophomore, Clements won the high jump at the 2009 SLC Outdoor Championship. Berger coached Clements to a season-best jump of 2.10 meters at the conference meet, helping him secure the top spot.

Berger led Andrew Duncan to five top-three finishes in jumps events – including at least one in each of the high jump, long jump and triple jump. Duncan scored in eight jumps events from 2008-09. He also won the 2008 outdoor high jump championship with a jump of 2.15 meters. In 2008, Berger also coached Quinchun Carey to win the long jump at the SLC Outdoor Championships.

Berger immediately found success as an assistant coach. He helped Jon McDowell win the SLC Outdoor Championships in the 110m hurdles. McDowell and Coby Morrison, who placed well in the conference meet in the 400m hurdles, qualified for the national meet that year. McDowell, under Berger's mentoring, earned All-American honors by placing in the national meet.

Berger's background certainly helped prepare himself for his coaching career by wearing many different hats during his collegiate career. While at UT Arlington (from 1996-99), Berger competed in the decathlon and hurdles.

During his career, Berger posted four top-10 finishes in the Southland Conference Outdoor Championships in the decathlon. He claimed fourth in the decathlon as a junior with 6,495 points and was fifth in the conference with 6,546 points as a sophomore in 1997. Berger's 6,546 points ranks fifth on the all-time decathlon list.

During the indoor seasons, Berger competed in the 55-meter hurdles. His personal-best time came at the SLC Indoor Championships in 1998 when he clocked a 7.81.

Berger is in his second stint as a coach with the track program. In 2000, he was a student assistant where he coached multi-event and field event athletes and also helped coordinate travel.

Berger served as assistant events manager at Maverick Stadium from 2001 to 2007. A graduate of UT Arlington with a bachelor of science degree in biology in 2000, Berger is married to Mishael Bertrand-Berger.





JORDAN DURHAM

ASSISTANT COACH // SPRINTS

2ND YEAR // ARIZONA STATE

Jordan Durham took no time in making her mark on the UT Arlington program.

In just one year, the Mavericks' sprints coach helped All-Americans Cordero Gray and Jasmine Walls reach new heights by recording personal bests. She also guided Shannon Reynolds to Southland Conference Freshman of the Year honors in both the indoor and outdoor seasons.

Durham coached Walls and Reynolds to finish first and second in the 100m and the 200m at the Southland Conference Outdoor Championships.

Antonia Hopkins won the 400m as well, giving the Mavericks a clean sweep of the sprints events. DeAndrea Smith also scored in the 400m by placing sixth, giving UTA six scorers in three women's sprints events.

Durham also worked with the short-distance relay teams, where the women placed second in the 4x100 and won the 4x400 at the SLC Outdoor Championships. She also guided the men's 4x100 relay team to a conference title.

On the men's side, Durham helped Gray set a personal-best time of 10.16 in the 100m at the SLC Outdoor Championships. Gray finished third in the 100m and the 200m. Lionel Mungwari also scored in the 100m and 200m as a freshman and Renan Palma, another freshman, scored in the 200m. Juan Lewis also scored at the conference meet as well, placing fourth in the 400m.

At the SLC Indoor Championships, Durham helped lead Walls to wins in the 60m and the 200m. Hopkins took second in the 200m and Reynolds scored in both events. Hopkins also won the 400m, leading four Mavs who scored in the event – Smith placed second, Megan Turner finished fifth and Brittany Culbertson placed sixth.

The 4x440-yard relay team also placed second at the indoor meet.

Durham's coaching led to success on the men's side as well. Gray placed second in the 60m and Juan Lewis scored in the 200m and the 400m.

In all, nine sprinters made appearances in the NCAA Preliminaries. Two – Gray and Walls – advanced to the NCAA Championships.

Durham became a full-time member of the coaching staff prior to the start of the 2010 season after serving as a graduate assistant at UT Arlington during the 2008-09 season. She assisted in the development of All-American sprinters Gray and Walls that year.

A three-time All-American at Arizona State, Durham was a member of the Sun Devils' 2007 indoor and outdoor and 2008 indoor national championship teams.

She participated in the relays and sprints for the Sun Devils and was a member of the team's 4x100m and 4x400m relay teams. In 2008 during the Pac 10 season, she finished third in the 400m final with a time of 53.64 and ran third leg on the school's winning 4x400m relay team.

Durham helped lead ASU's 4x400m relay to a third place finish at the

2008 NCAA Indoor meet and a fifth place finish at the 2008 Outdoor meet.

During the 2007 season she earned All-America honors in the 4x400m relay as the team ran 3:35.96 and place eighth at the NCAA Championships. That same squad won the Pac-10 title (3:33.14) and was second in the West Region.

She began her career at ASU in 2006 after spending her freshman season at TCU.

A 2004 graduate of Kennedale High School in Kennedale, Texas, Durham was selected as the team's MVP all four years of competition. She helped lead the track team to a state title as a senior. She also was also a two-time all-district volleyball selection and captained both teams as a senior.

She majored in psychology and sociology at Arizona State. She was born on August 28, 1986 in San Angelo, Texas.





GERALD RICHEY

ASSISTANT COACH // POLE VAULT

15TH YEAR // ABILENE CHRISTIAN

Entering his 15th year as assistant coach at UT Arlington, Gerald Richey continues his work with the pole vaulters. A graduate of Abilene Christian University, he has been on the sidelines of various track and field meets since 1958, including 27 years at Arlington High School from 1968-1995.

Last year, Richey helped guide Wade Hayes to a second-place finish in the Southland Conference Championship in the pole vault. That ended a stretch during which Hayes won five SLC titles in the pole vault in indoor and outdoor track.

Richey also helped pole vaulters Lauren Marks, Samantha Nash and Chris Machisak score in various SLC Championships over the past two years.

Over the course of 37 years, Richey has coached football, cross country and track. During that time, he coached three future All-Pro football players, two state champion cross country teams, two state runner-up cross country teams, a regional championship cross country team, 18 district champion cross country teams, seven district champion track teams and many individual state meet qualifiers and champions.

In October of 1999, the city of Arlington recognized Richey's accomplishments by naming the cross country course at Vandergriff Park in his honor.



JARID VAUGHAN

ASSISTANT COACH

1ST YEAR // UT ARLINGTON

Incoming sprinters won't have to think back too far to remember the successes of new assistant coach Jarid Vaughan.

The former UT Arlington standout finished his stellar career as a multiple-time point-scorer in the Southland Conference Championships. Vaughan won an individual championship at the 2009 SLC Outdoor Championships in the 200m. He also placed second in the 100m behind current UTA standout Cordero Gray.

Vaughan also finished second in the 100m at the Texas Relays in 2009 and had a chance to compete nationally before suffering a major injury at the end of the season.

Overall, Vaughan scored seven times in individual events and numerous times as a part of relay teams.

In 2010, Vaughan took his talents to the national level when he placed third in the 200m at the Canadian National Championships.

Earlier in his career, Vaughan was named to Team British Columbia for the Canadian Games.

A 2010 graduate, Vaughan majored in kinesiology.



CAROLINE ERLINGSON

DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS

1ST YEAR // UT ARLINGTON

Caroline Erlingson saw her collegiate career come to a close in 2010 but remains with the team this season as a graduate assistant. During her stellar career, Erlingson specialized in distance events and will do the same as a first-year coach.

It didn't take long for Erlingson to make an impact on the UT Arlington program. As a true freshman, she earned All-Southland Conference honors by finishing eighth at the Southland Conference Cross Country Championships.

Injuries slowed Erlingson's momentum, forcing her to take a medical redshirt in indoor and outdoor track in 2007.

She bounced back to finish 11th at the Southland Conference Cross Country Championships in 2008 and continue for a nice track career.

In the 2008 indoor track season, Erlingson placed in the mile run. She went on to score points four times. Her best finishes came at the 2009 Southland Conference Outdoor Championships, where she placed third in the 1500m, and the Southland Conference 2009 Indoor Championships, where she earned a third-place finish in the mile run.

Erlingson placed seventh at the Southland Conference Indoor Championships in the mile run during the indoor season as a senior, scoring two points for the Mavericks.

Off the track, Erlingson excelled in the classroom as a three-time Capital One/Southland Conference Commissioner's Spring Academic Honor Roll recipient.

Erlingson is a native of Angelholm, Sweden. She majored in Biochemistry at UT Arlington.



WADE HAYES

ASSISTANT COACH

1ST YEAR // UT ARLINGTON

A four-year standout while a member of the UT Arlington track and field team, Wade Hayes now embarks on the next chapter of his career.

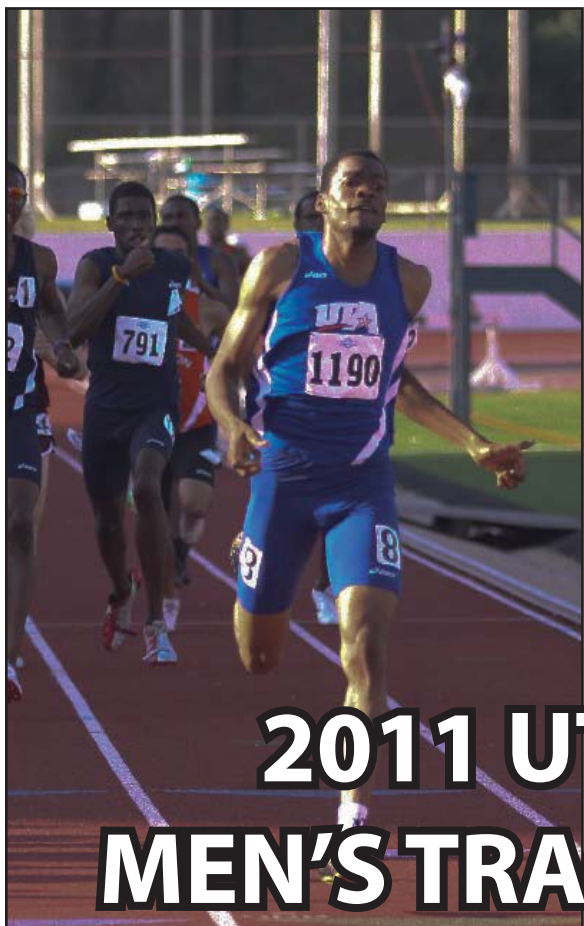
Hayes, now an assistant on John Sauerhage's staff, won five consecutive conference championships in pole vault.

He earned a first-place finish during the Southland Conference Indoor Championships last year and finished second in the Southland Conference Outdoor Championships in 2010.

He also finished third at the Southland Conference Outdoor Championships and the Southland Conference Indoor Championships in 2007.

2011 SEASON PREVIEW

John Sauerhage did not have to look far for inspiration for his men's track and field team entering his 16th year as head coach at UT Arlington.

An avid baseball fan, Sauerhage adopted the motto the Texas Rangers employed on their way to the 2010 World Series as his own.

"It's time," Sauerhage said. "This team dominated the conference in the '90s. We have gotten ourselves back the last three or four years to where our men's team is contending now for championships. It's time to get back to our rightful place on the top. We know it won't be easy. We know that UTSA is the defending champion, indoors and out, but we are ready to challenge them for the conference championship and we're looking forward to it.

"We're loaded on the men. It's just got to work," he added.

The Mavericks finished fourth in the Southland Conference Outdoor Championships last year. Still, the return of several key performers, in addition to numerous important newcomers, have Sauerhage and the rest of the team thinking the 2011 season will be special.

Sprinter Cordero Gray, middle-distance runner Dwight Robinson and high jumper Isiah Clements already have SLC indoor championships to their credit. Robinson won the indoor and outdoor titles in the 800m in 2010.

Freshmen Jeff Rodriguez and Romain Martin are expected to compete for individual titles in the pole vault and decathlon, respectively.

With the depth to also contend for conference relay championships, UTA is eyeing its first championship since 2007.

"On paper, this team has a chance to be one of the best we've ever had," Sauerhage said. "That's quite a statement because we've had some outstanding teams."

Sprints should be a strong point for the Mavericks this season.

Gray anchors the group and has qualified for the NCAA Regional meet each of the past two seasons, but slipped to third in the conference in the 100m and 200m last year after winning the events in 2009. Gray is now looking to regain the crown as the conference's premier sprinter while also setting his sights on new personal-best times in the 100m and the 200m. Sprints coach Jordan Durham thinks Gray can break the 10.0-barrier in the 100m.

"Because Cordero is so talented and because he has such a great work ethic, it would be a personal disappointment if he doesn't compete nationally," Durham said. "He ran 10.16 – the seventh-fastest time in the nation. With him, the sky is the limit. He wants to be on the USA team at the end of June. We want him to be in the top eight nationally after the conference meet, coming back with an all-American title."

Though Gray headlines the sprints, the team has plenty of talent. Lionel Mungwari made a splash as a true freshman, scoring in the 100m, 200m and long jump. He was also part of the 4x100 relay team that advanced to the NCAA Regionals.

"We feel like with a fall with him and a whole year of training, he has the potential to be a 25-foot long jumper and a 10.2-10.3 sprinter," Sauerhage said.

Meeting those marks would elevate Mungwari into the conference's elite status.

In the longer sprints, Juan Lewis and Andrew Pettis are capable of scoring in the SLC Championships. The key this year is turning potential into results.

Depending on where coaches think Pettis can score best in the conference meets, he could also be used in the 100m and 200m.

Clayton Vaughn and Joseph Williams join the program after strong high school careers. Vaughn is expected to immediately contribute in the 100m and 200m or could be an option in the 400m.

"He was one of those guys in high school that really didn't get many opportunities to run open races because relays are 20 points and open races are 10 points," Durham said. "He had an awesome junior year and pulled his hamstring in his senior year. Now he's back to looking awesome. As long as he stays mentally tough, I think he will be an immediate help. We're looking for Clayton to score at conference."

Williams should help as a member of the 4x400 relay team with a chance to compete individually.

With so much talent and depth, both relay teams have reasonable chances to compete for SLC championships. The 4x100 relay team, led by Gray, should be a favorite to again qualify for the national preliminary meet.

Any momentum the team can create in sprints should be maintained by the field events.

Clements, a two-time national qualifier in the high jump, highlights the group. He can also help on relay teams and was part of the 4x400 relay team that won the Southland Conference Indoor Championships in 2009.

Martin should also help in the high jump, giving the Mavericks two potential high-point scorers in the event. He will also compete – and is expected to score – in javelin. His main contribution will come in the multiple events, though. Martin scored 7,293 points in a U23 international competition over the summer.

"I see him being a national qualifier indoor and outdoor in the heptathlon and the decathlon as a freshman," field coach Brandon Berger said. "It's never set in stone, but he has potential to be a national qualifier right away."

Mungwari has already proven himself at the conference level after finishing fifth in the

long jump last season. He also helps in the triple jump.

Gabe Hilliard and Brandon Waller, a transfer from Midwestern State's football program, could also contribute in the jumps.

Ivan Storic and freshman Branko Petrovic should both compete at the top of the league in throws events. Storic specializes in the javelin and finished fourth in the Southland Conference Championships a year ago. Petrovic, a friend of Storic's from Belgrade, Serbia, is expected to immediately compete among the SLC elite in shot put. He could also compete in discus.

Another newcomer, Casey Keeter, should score in shot put and discus after transferring in from Tarleton State.

The plethora of potential point-scorers in throwing events gives UT Arlington a chance to make up ground it previously conceded.

"UTSA and SFA are going to argue that they have good throwers too, but that was an event that SFA would score multiple points in unchallenged," Sauerhage said. "UTSA was in the top throwers. Now we can go toe-to-toe with them for points in the throwing events as opposed to in the past when we basically watched them move past us in the standings in the events. That's very reassuring when you're putting together a team to try to win the league championship."

The Mavericks lose five-time SLC pole vault champion Wade Hayes, but insert redshirt freshman Jeff Rodriguez in his place. Rodriguez competed in several events as an unattached individual last year and outscored Hayes at times, including when he posted a personal-best 17-2 vault.

"I don't see why he can't be a national qualifier," Berger said. "Conference champ shouldn't be an issue for him. Both school records will probably be broken by him this year. He should be conference champion indoors and out."

Chris Machisak has proven himself as a point-scorer in the SLC meets and freshman Andrew Piatt could add more depth for the Mavs. With those two in addition to Rodriguez, UT Arlington could have three point-scorers in the pole vault.

In hurdles, Renan Palma gives UTA a major presence. Palma qualified for the national meet last year after finishing fourth in the SLC Outdoor Championships in the 110m hurdles.

Freshman Jonathan Todd should be among the first to get a shot in the 400m hurdles. Berger said he thinks Todd could contend as a point-scorer in the event.

If there is a question mark on the men's side, it comes in the distance events. How well this team fares in the SLC competitions might hinge on whether or not a distance runner steps up into a prominent position within the league.

"We've got a lot of numbers in distance," said Sauerhage, who works closest with the distance runners. "A lot of them are unproven but a lot of them have the potential to run faster times and maybe break into the point-scoring that way. It's all about trying to win the conference meet, indoor and out, and putting together a formula and what we do with these guys is part of the plan."

Robinson is one of the few known quantities.

After winning the 800m in both the SLC Indoor and SLC Outdoor Championships, the only question is can he stay healthy enough to repeat.

Senior Darren Rous gives the Mavs another potential competitor in the top three if he returns to the form he showed as a sophomore. Rous struggled last year but finished third in the SLC Outdoor Championships in the 800m two years ago.

Anthony Rene placed seventh in the SLC Outdoor Championships in the 800m last year and could give UTA another point-scorer in the event.

The longer distance events are up for grabs in terms of who will compete and in what event.

An infusion of newcomers, led by freshman Anthony Hilliman, should bolster the group. Veterans Zach Zura, Heinz Schwarzkopf, Eric Montou, Anthony Groom and Kevin Vasquez will also get opportunities to qualify for the conference meets.

Widener, coming off a strong cross country season, finished 10th in the 10000m last year. Sauerhage expects Widener to score points in the event this year as well as the 5000m.

"We've got depth on the men's side and we're just hoping we have some talent," Sauerhage said. "We know we have some talent on the men's side. When we've won the conference meet in the years past, we've scored a lot of points in the distance events. To win the meet without the distance points is difficult."

Sauerhage said he believes this is the time UT Arlington again climbs to the top of the Southland Conference.

With strong repeat performances and some key newcomers meeting expectations, the Mavericks could prove Sauerhage right.

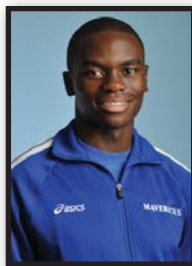

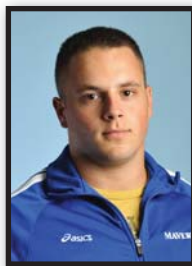

2011 UT ARLINGTON WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD TEAM

2011 SEASON PREVIEW

Over his 17 years coaching the UT Arlington women's program, UTA head coach John Sauerhage has prided himself on reloading rather than rebuilding.

That proving ground presents itself again in the 2011 season.

The Mavericks lost Jasmine Walls and Antonia Hopkins. That duo collectively won the 100m, 200m and 400m at the Southland Conference Outdoor Championships last season.

Winning the SLC title will be difficult considering all the talent the team must replace, but Sauerhage thinks his team can give defending champ Stephen F. Austin a strong push.

"We were runner-up last year in indoor and outdoor with the women," Sauerhage said. "We feel like that would be a mild disappointment if we repeated as runners-up. We've got to challenge SFA. It's time to break through."

The youth movement is in full force and, for UT Arlington, that's not a bad thing.

Shannon Reynolds returns after being named Indoor and Outdoor SLC Freshman of the Year. She qualified for the NCAA West Region Preliminaries in the 100m and the 200m last season after finishing third and second in the SLC Outdoor Championships a year ago. With Walls gone now, Reynolds is a favorite to win both events.

Even before Emily Koenig competes in her first collegiate track and field meet she is already a proven commodity. Koenig became the first runner in SLC history to win Freshman of the Year and Athlete of the Year in the same cross country season. She won the SLC meet, giving Sauerhage high expectations for his freshman in the 10000m and the 5000m in track this year.

"What she's been able to do as a freshman is just remarkable," Sauerhage said. "The best part is, the longer the race goes the better she gets."

Sprints coach Jordan Durham said she thinks Pam Vinson and Brianna Baldwin have the potential to give UT Arlington a repeat in the Freshman of the Year slot.

Vinson will compete in the 100m and the 200m. Baldwin should contend for the 400m title.

"Breonna ran a 55 outdoor, which is faster than any people we have returning in the 400m," Durham said. "We're looking for her to score high in the Southland Conference meet. We're looking for her to do very well and Pam to be there to be right there behind Shannon. I want her to score very well in the 60m and the 200m. I can't see any freshman coming in and doing anything better than that. There's a good possibility that Pam might be on the 4x400 because she's so strong. We can put her anywhere."

Brittany Culbertson and DeAndrea Smith give the Mavericks the potential for multiple point-scorers in virtually every sprinting event. Both athletes scored in the 400m at the SLC Outdoor Championships last year.

Dorrie Thompson is also back after sitting out last year. She is a versatile sprinter capable of helping in two or more of the events.

"We're very confident about our women's dominance in the sprints," Sauerhage said. "We have not taken a hit to graduation. We've reloaded

in sprints."

The sprint relay teams are loaded as well. The 4x400 relay team advanced to the first round of the NCAA Tournament last year and returns key components from the group, including Culbertson and Megan Turner.

Despite losing Walls, the 4x100 relay should be strong again as well. Reynolds, Vinson and Culbertson will headline the group that finished second last season and aims to claim the top spot at the 2011 Southland Conference Outdoor Championships.

Koenig certainly points the Mavs in the right direction in the distance events as well with real opportunities to win the 5000m as well as the 10000m.

Esther Abuto finished second in the 800m and should be a strong challenger for the conference title again in 2011.

Distance runners Amanda McMahon, Jennifer Carey and Perri Ford have all proven themselves capable of scoring points at the SLC Championships.

McMahon has scored in conference meets nine times in her career. She has competed in several events, but specializes in the 1500m and the mile.

Ford and Carey give the Mavericks two more point-scorers in the 800m. Carey could help in the 1500m as well.

Marissa Paz and Lindsey Putman provide more depth in the distance events.

The biggest difference between this year and last could come on the field side of the meets. Field coach Brandon Berger has more to work with this season thanks to some key additions. He also brings back some talented, proven athletes, led by Turner.

As a junior last year, Turner finished third in the SLC Outdoor Championships in the 400m hurdles, qualifying for the NCAA West Regional Preliminaries in the process.

She is the program-record holder in the 600m hurdles. Sauerhage said she might also get a look in the 100m hurdles if nobody else seizes the spot.

A new addition, however, should come in and make an immediate impact. Destinee Nixon transferred into UT Arlington having spent the last three years at Abilene Christian University.

Nixon, a senior, is a five-time All-American. She struggled with injuries

in the last two seasons but is healthy now and said she should return to the level of competition that allowed her to score in five events in the LoneStar Conference Championships as a freshman.

Nixon specializes in short hurdles, an area in which the the Mavericks need help. She can also run the 400m hurdles and triple jump, giving UT Arlington an opportunity to score in all three events. Nixon has also helped in sprints and on sprint relay teams.

Sydney Johnson and Brookeana Witt will also compete in the hurdles events.

Throws have proven problematic for UT Arlington recently. Freshman Samantha Little gives the team its best chance to score points.

“Samantha Little is a freshman and she will be a project,” Berger said. “I think with a little work she could help us out in the discus. Shot put may take a little bit more time but with some adjustments she should be able to help us out in both throws.”

Brookeana Witt and Raquel Kilgore are expected to compete in the heptathlon. The Mavs are hopeful one of them can score points in the event.

Pole vaulters Samantha Nash and Lauren Marks have both scored in SLC meets. If they become more consistent, the Mavs could have two point-scorers in the event.

The biggest hope on the field events comes from the jumps.

UTA added Marniqua Johnson and Courtney Blacknall. Both are expected to compete to score points in the high jump.

“They should both be top-five and might be top-three,” Berger said. “We could go from zero points to double-digit points in that.”

Johnson is expected to compete in the long jump and the triple jump in addition to the high jump as well.

Jennifer Brown and Eld-hah Kaswatuka have scored in the triple jump in the past and could do so again this season.

Sauerhage’s team has enjoyed off-the-track success as well.

In 2010, UT Arlington women’s track program was one of 151 institutions to be named to the USTFCCA Division I All-Academic Track and Field teams.

More than 20 student-athletes on the women’s team registered a GPA above 3.0 while the team combined for a 3.16 overall GPA through the winter 2010 term.

Individually, Turner and Culbertson were also recognized by the USTFCCA. Both were selected to the 2010 USTFCCA All-Academic Track and Field Team.

Turner finished the season with a 3.42 GPA in finance while Culbertson wrapped up her junior year with a 3.88 GPA in kinesiology.

In order to receive the distinction, an institution must have a cumulative team GPA of 3.0 or better.

Now the team hopes to duplicate its classroom success while taking the next step in the conference.

Sauerhage is confident his team will not fall back in terms of overall talent level. Whether his team can continue to compete at the same level, however, will depend on how quickly some of the fresh faces can adapt to collegiate competition.

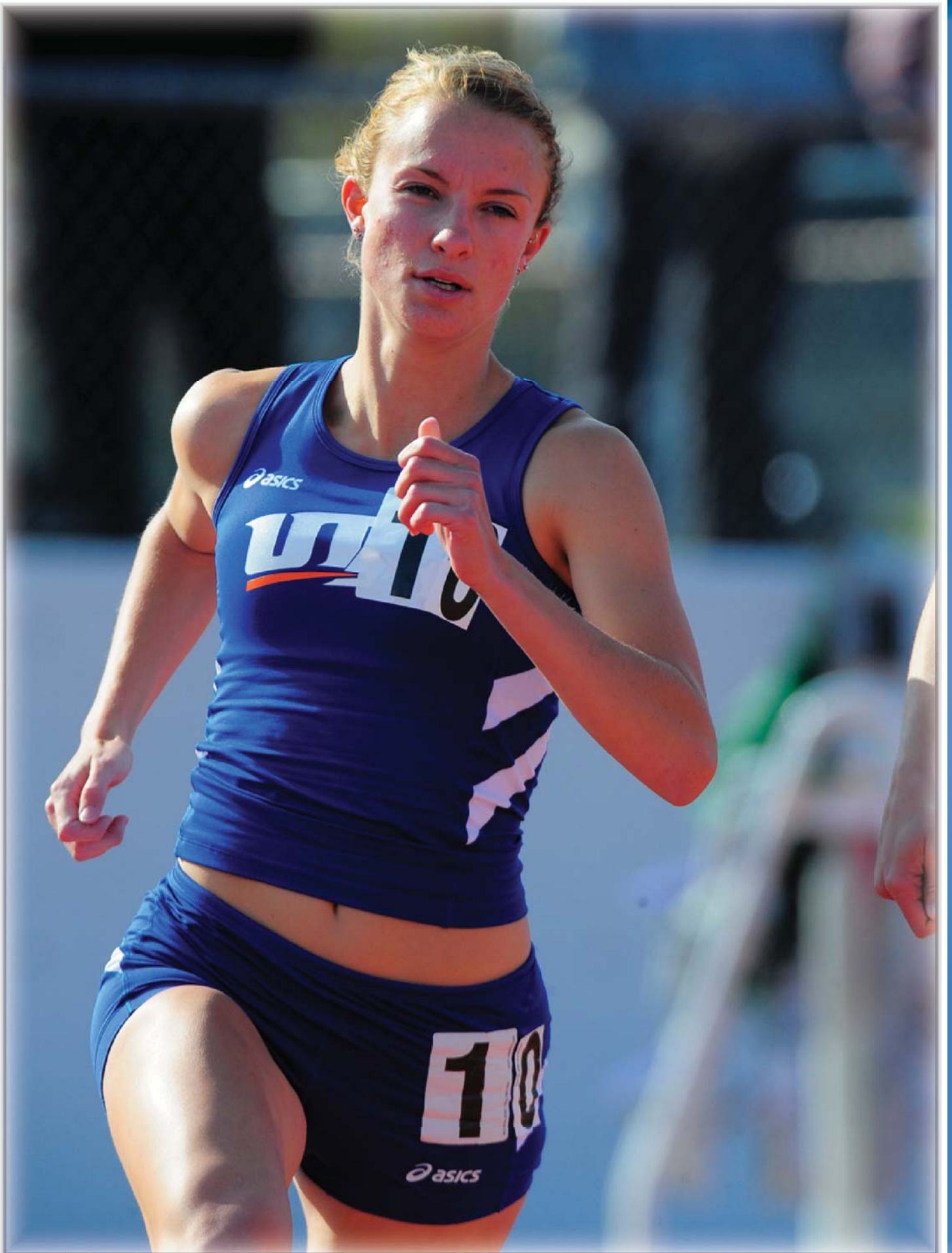

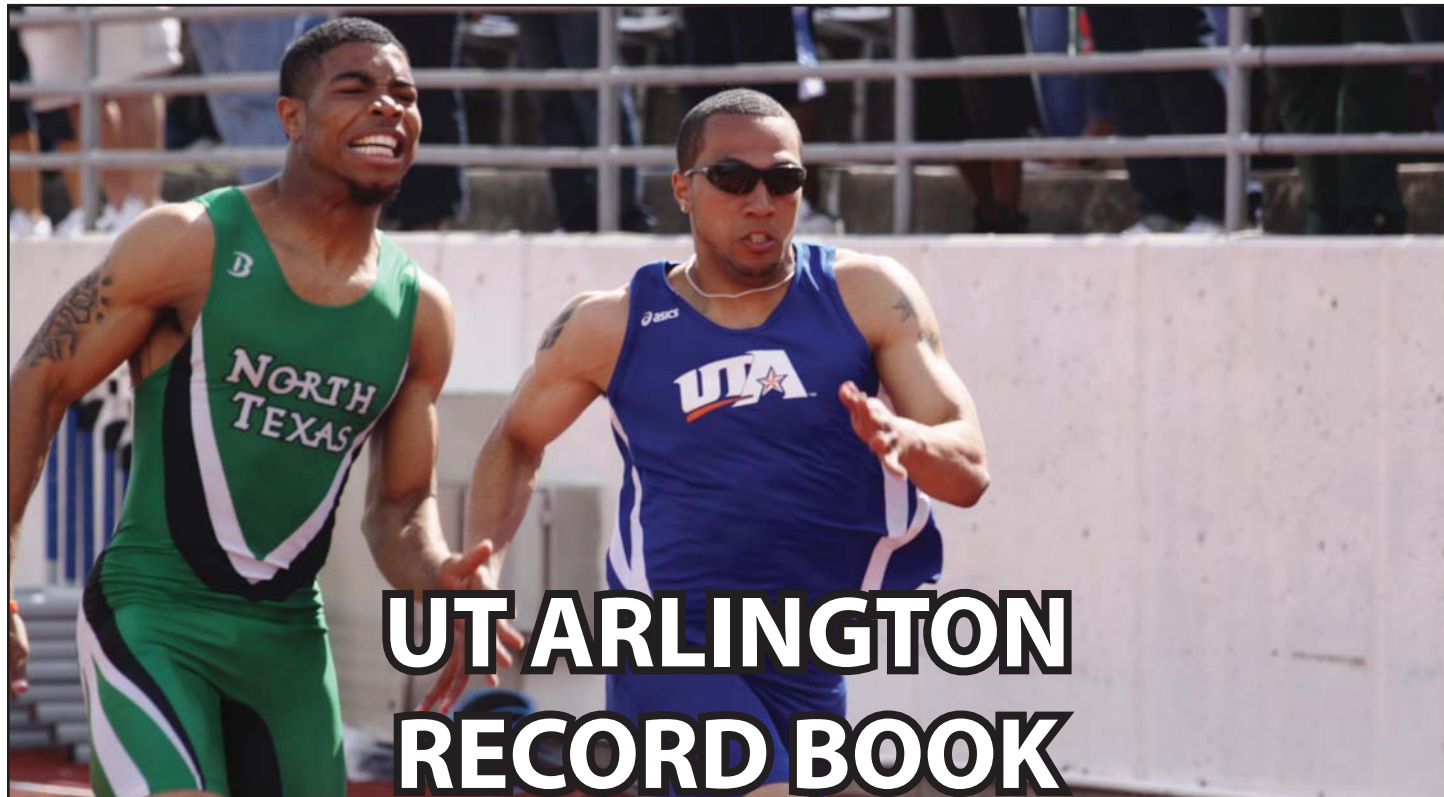

UTA ATHLETE JARED CONNAUGHTON HELPS HIS NATIVE CANADA TO FINALS OF 4X100 RELAY AT BEIJING OLYMPICS

At the 2008 Beijing Olympics, former UTA standout Jared Connaughton helped his native Canada reach the finals of the 4x100 relay. He helped his team finish second in their preliminary heat and the team finished sixth in the finals with a time of 38.66 which was a season best. Connaughton also made the semifinals of the 200 meters. No stranger to international competition, Connaughton also competed at the 2007 World Championships in Japan.

Connaughton was an 11-time all-Southland Conference performer from 2005-07 and holds the school indoor record with a time of 6.68 in the 60-meter dash. He was named the SLC Athlete of the Year and the Outstanding Track Performer during the 2006 outdoor season.

Connaughton closed out his UTA career by capturing the SLC Outdoor 200-meter championship with a time of 20.76 and leading the team to its first outdoor conference championship since 1997. He also teamed with Byron Majors, Coby Morrison and Adam Newton on the 4x100-meter relay team that advanced to the NCAA Championships with a time of 39.65, the third fastest in school history.

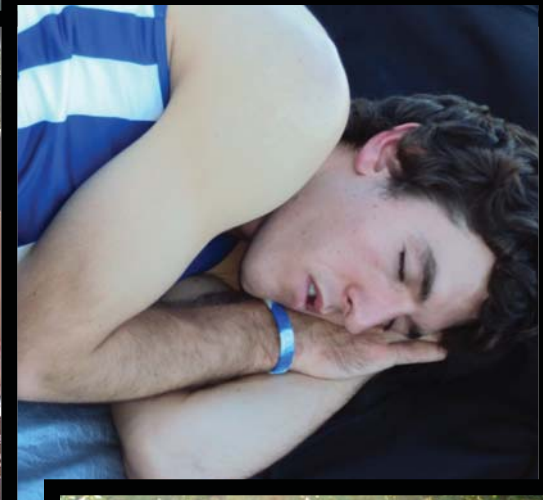
The renovations included an overhaul of the old facilities. The locker rooms are now fully carpeted with all of the walls now repainted.

Maverick Stadium underwent a facelift in the summer of 2009 with the installation of FieldTurf.

UT Arlington selected FieldTurf for installation at Maverick Stadium, the home of the school's men's and women's track teams, and one of the most utilized track-and-field facilities in the Southwest. The announcement was made by Maverick Stadium Manager Tom Kloza and FieldTurf CEO Joe Fields.

The installation will commence this July and will be in place for the Mavericks' 2009 fall track season. FieldTurf will be replacing the facility's previous ten-year old artificial turf.

"With all of the track-and-field events hosted by Maverick Stadium, not just through the Texas Arlington men's and women's track teams, but also at the high school and track club levels, this installation will provide great exposure for our outstanding product. We know that Tom Kloza and the folks at UTA did their due diligence in selecting FieldTurf, and it is our aim to provide

them with the finest state-of-the-art track surface available."

Maverick Stadium opened in 1980 and has a seating capacity of 12,000. It is not only the home of UTA men's and women's track, but it is also one of the busiest high school sports facilities in the Southwest. In addition to hosting a steady stream of high school football and soccer, Maverick is considered one of the finest track-and-field facilities in the region. The stadium is the home to numerous track-and-field competitions and camps.

More than 50 top NCAA universities currently play their home football games on FieldTurf, including Texas, Texas Tech, Nebraska, Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, Illinois, West Virginia, Washington, Oregon, Missouri, Syracuse and Louisville. Twenty-one of the NFL's 32 teams presently utilize FieldTurf in their stadiums and/or practice facilities. In addition, MLB's Tampa Bay Rays, Minnesota Twins and Toronto Blue Jays have FieldTurf at their respective stadiums.

With more than 3,000 installations in almost 50 countries, FieldTurf Tarkett is the largest entity in the sports surfacing industry and provides unparalleled leasing capabilities, engineering and manufacturing resources. Fiber

Infill
The washed silica sand does not break down from use or heavy traffic. The cryogenic rubber is recycled rubber, broken down and created, creating smooth-surfaced spherical particles. As compared to 3 pounds of ambient rubber found in most other artificial turf, each square foot of FieldTurf contains 7 pounds of silica sand plus 3 pounds of cryogenic rubber. A base layer of silica sand is followed by up to 21 individual layers of mixed silica sand and cryogenic rubber and then topped with a final layer of specially graded cryogenic rubber which stays on the top of the infill system.

Backing

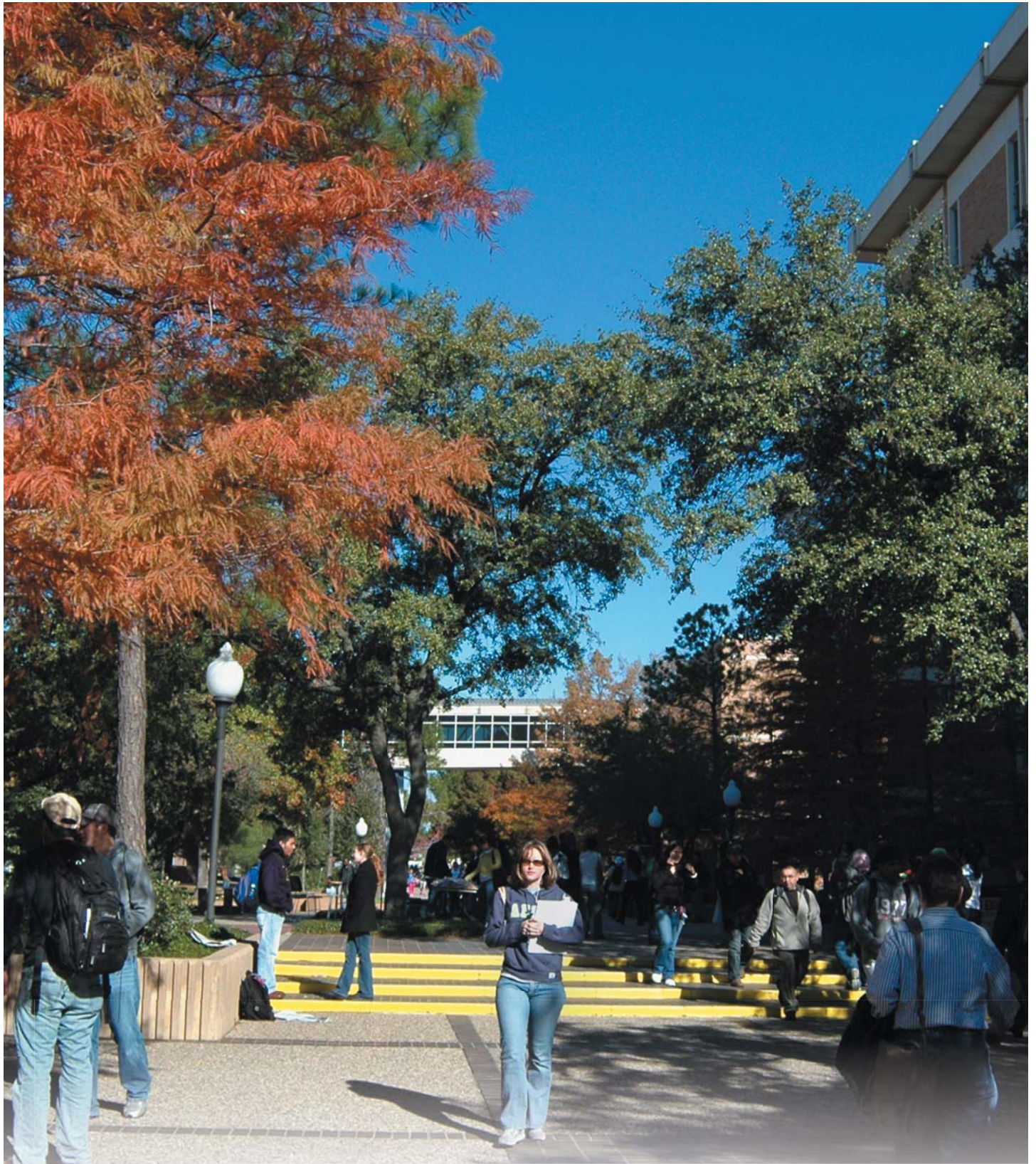

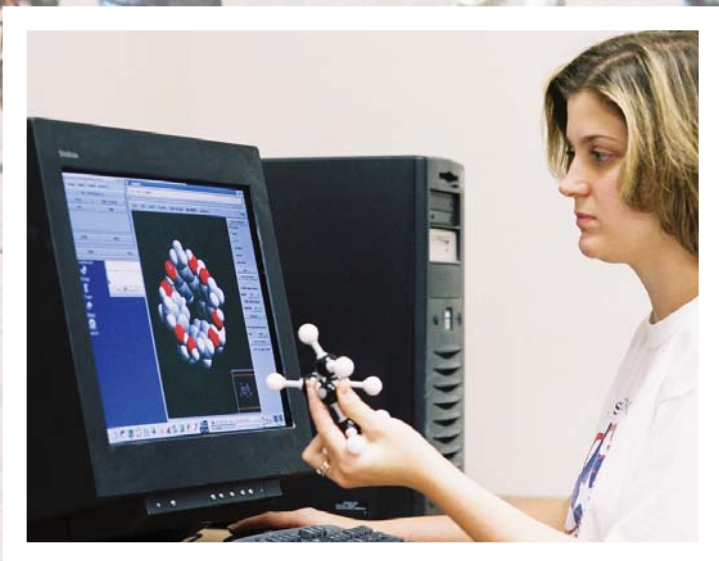

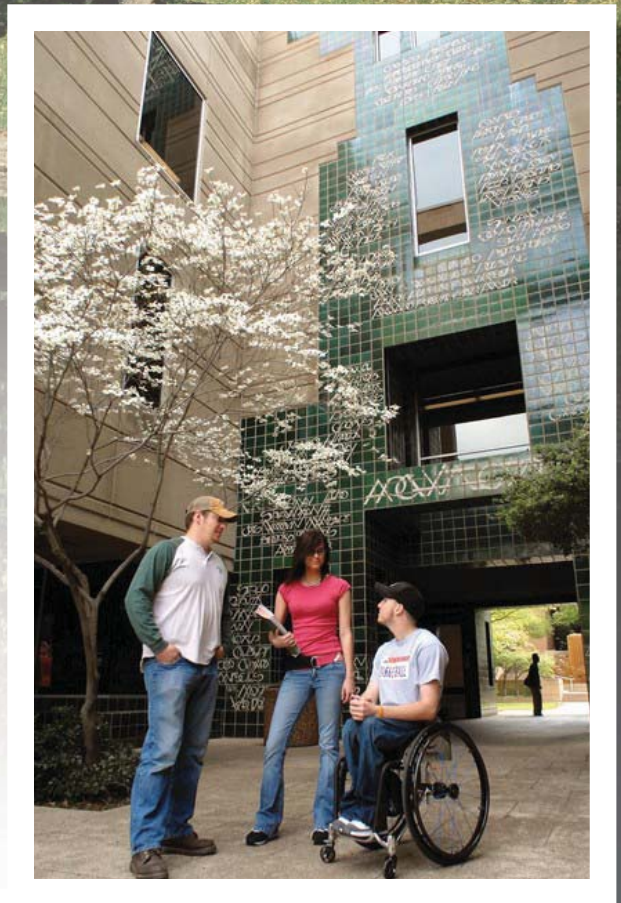
CAMPUS FACILITIES





The University encompasses 420 acres and includes more than 100 buildings, some dating from 1919. In the past six years, the construction or renovation of more than a dozen buildings has added 1.2 million square feet to the physical plant.

- Construction began in 2008 on the \$150 million Engineering Research Complex, which will forge innovative partnerships between engineering and science. Other projects include the Civil Engineering Laboratory Building, which opened in August 2008, and an expansion of the Engineering Lab Building.
- The School of Nursing's Smart Hospital provides 13,000 square feet of space for student nurses to use cutting-edge learning technology. The facility features more than 30 full-body patient simulators in a 23-bed simulated hospital environment.

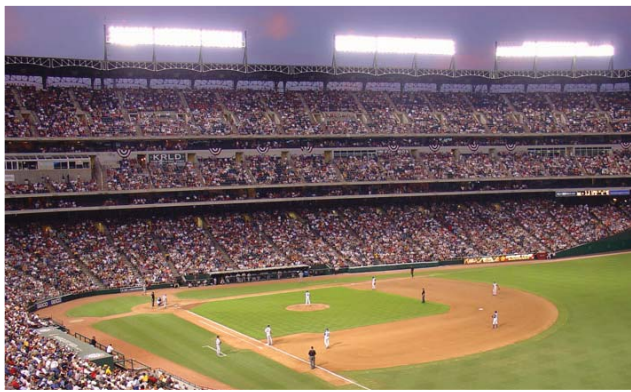
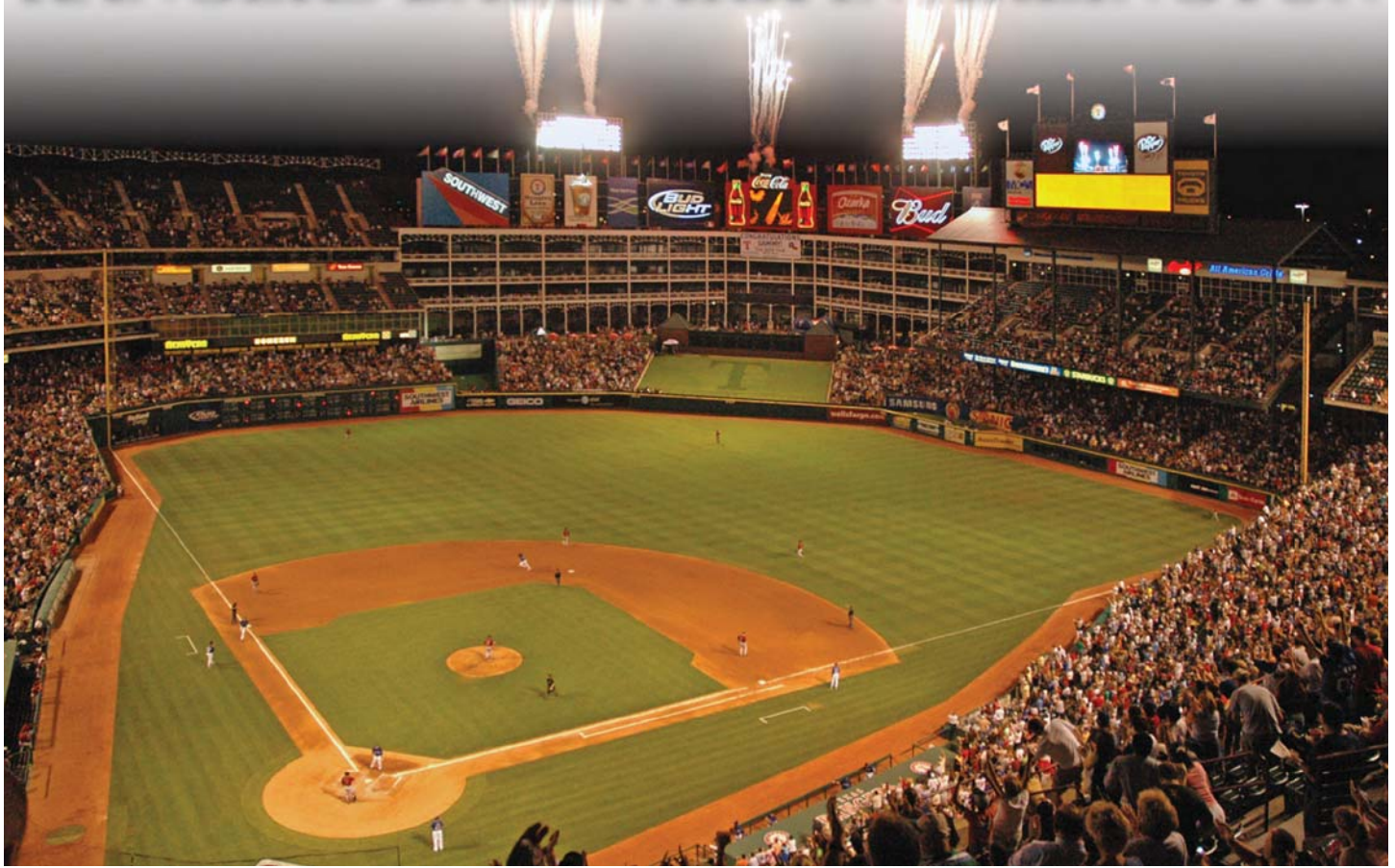
- America's team completed its first year at Cowboys Stadium, just 2.5 miles from UT Arlington's campus.

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

James D. Spaniolo



Hailed as the ideal person to lead The University of Texas at Arlington into a new era of prominence, James D. Spaniolo was appointed the University's seventh president in November 2003 by

The University of Texas System Board of Regents.

He took office in February 2004 and immediately began building an administrative team and reaching out to stakeholders to map a course for UT Arlington's future as a major national research university. Among his major accomplishments are growing the size and prestige of both the student body and the faculty, implementing the campus master plan (including the new Special Events Center, set to open in late 2011), and taking research activity at UT Arlington to record heights.

President Spaniolo's experience in higher education, law, philanthropy, politics and journalism make him uniquely qualified to lead a comprehensive teaching, research and public service institution like UT Arlington. With an enrollment of more than 29,000 students, UT Arlington is the second-largest of the 15 institutions in The UT System and offers 90 baccalaureate, 74 master's and 34 doctoral degrees. And with a continued focus on technology transfer and economic development, UT Arlington is solidifying its status as a leading research university in the Dallas-Fort Worth area, the state and the nation.

Before coming to UT Arlington, President Spaniolo was dean of Michigan State University's College of Communication Arts and Sciences. As dean from 1996 to 2003, he oversaw an enrollment increase of more than 1,000 students and helped establish the James H. and Mary B. Quello Center for Telecommunication Management and Law by raising more than \$3.5 million. He forged a partnership with a newspaper corporation in Mexico and strengthened alumni outreach. He was also a professor in the School of Jour-

nalism and taught courses on the First Amendment and communications law. Before his tenure at Michigan State, he was vice president and chief program officer of the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation, the largest media-related private foundation in the United States with more than \$1.5 billion in assets. In seven years with the Knight Foundation, he directed a program that included major grants and initiatives to support journalism and a free press in the United States and worldwide. He also served as a member of the foundation's Journalism Advisory Committee from 1997 to 2003.

Before joining the Knight Foundation, President Spaniolo was a newspaper executive and lawyer with Knight-Ridder for more than a decade. He was vice president of human resources and assistant to the publisher at the Detroit Free-Press and general executive and general counsel at The Miami Herald.

He began his legal career with the Miami law firm of Paul & Thomson, which represented The Herald, and later served as associate general counsel of the American Newspaper Publishers Association, where he established the organization's legal department. He is a member of the Florida Bar and has been admitted to practice before the U.S. Supreme Court, the 5th and 11th U.S. Circuit Courts of Appeals and the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida.

He graduated with high honors from Michigan State University in 1968 with a B.A. degree in political science. As a senior, he was editor-in-chief of the student daily, the State News. Following service in the U.S. Army Reserve, he became an assistant to Michigan State President Clifton R. Wharton Jr. from 1970 to 1972. He earned a law degree from the University of Michigan Law School in 1975 and a master's degree in public administration from the University of Michigan Institute of Public Policy Studies (now the Gerald R. Ford School of Public Policy).

President Spaniolo has a son, Jamie, who lives in Washington D.C., and a daughter, Sarah, who lives in Los Angeles.

The fifth Director of Intercollegiate Athletics at UT Arlington since 1953, Pete Carlon is in his 15th year as the department's director after serving twice in an interim role.

Carlon has been with the university 30 years

(since 1981), when he came to UT Arlington from Stephen F. Austin to become the head athletics trainer. He served as assistant or associate athletics director from 1984 until he was named director of athletics in May of 1996.

During Carlon's first tenure as interim athletics director in 1991-92, UT Arlington won five team conference titles and was ranked by the Women's Sports Foundation as the second best Division I program in the nation in terms of commitment to gender equity.

During the 1996-97 year, in Carlon's first year as the permanent athletics director, the Mavericks claimed both the men's and women's Southland Conference All-Sports trophies, a first in the history of the UT Arlington athletics program. In 1998-99, UT Arlington again claimed both the men's and women's All-Sports Championship and won the SLC Commissioner's Cup in the award's second year of existence. The Commissioner's Cup recognizes the conference's best overall athletics program. In all, UT Arlington has won three Commissioner's Cups and has finished among the top three schools in the race for the Cup each year since programs began competing for the award. During Carlon's tenure, the UT Arlington women's teams have captured five SLC All-Sports trophies and the men's teams have won six all-sports awards. In all, the Mavericks have won 51 team conference championships during Carlon's tenure as athletics director.

Following the 2009-10 academic year, Carlon was named the Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics. Twenty-nine athletic directors were recognized with four geographic regions separated into seven categories.

In 1997-98, Carlon teamed with then-University President Dr. Robert Witt to join forces with student and faculty leaders to spearhead the campaign for a referendum on a Student Intercollegiate Athletics Fee. This student athletics fee won overwhelming support

from the student body and was enacted by the state legislature and then Gov. George W. Bush in 1999. The fee was the first of its kind in the state of Texas, and serves as a model for other institutions.

Carlon has placed a special emphasis on maintaining an environment of academic excellence for UT Arlington student-athletes. Numerous academic support services and programs have been implemented to assist each student-athlete in their academic endeavors. UT Arlington athletics is involved with the NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills program, which provides Maverick student-athletes opportunities for life enriching leadership experiences, community service and life skills training.

During his 12-year tenure as head athletics trainer, Carlon served as president of the Southwest Athletic Trainers Association in 1987-88, was a member of the Southwest Athletic Trainers Association (SWATA) Executive Board, and served two terms on the national board of directors for the National Athletic Trainers Association. Carlon received one of the highest honors presented by the organization when he was named recipient of the NATA Most Distinguished Athletic Trainer Award in 1997. In 1989, Carlon was presented the Frank Medina Award for service to athletics training and mankind, and has twice (1988 and 1996) earned the Eddie Wojecki Award for service to SWATA.

He was inducted into the SWATA Hall of Fame in 1999 and the NATA Hall of Fame in 2005 - the organization's highest honor.

Carlon served a two-year term as president of the Southland Conference and chair of its executive committee. He previously served on the executive committee in two-year stints as vice president/chair of the compliance committee and secretary/treasurer and chair of the finance committee.

Carlon has also served on several committees, including Southland Conference Honors and Awards, Compliance, Strategic Planning, Championships, Officiating and Marketing and Television.

Nationally, Carlon has been recently appointed for a four-year term on the Division I Academics Cabinet, after spending the last year as a member of the NCAA Division I Academics, Eligibility and Compliance Cabinet, the Transfer Issues Ad Hoc Subcommittee and chairing the Division I Financial Aid Subcommittee.

Carlon completed a four-year term (1998-2002) on the NCAA Committee on Competitive Safeguards and Medical Aspects of Sports as well as the Subcommittee for Drug Education and Testing. He also is an active participant in the NCAA Athletics Certification process, having served on NCAA Peer Review Teams evaluating 10 other Division I institutions. He served as the president of the I-AAA Athletic Directors Association in 2005-06.

Carlon spearheaded a facilities upgrade with the first phase of Clay Gould Ballpark renovation completed. Other facilities that have receive enhancement since 2002 include: the UT Arlington Tennis Center, Allan Saxe Softball Field and the track surface at Maverick Stadium.

Most recently, Carlon has been heavily involved in the design and fund raising for UT Arlington's \$78 million Special Events Center which is currently under construction and is expected to be completed in the spring of 2012.

Carlon earned a bachelor's degree from Iowa State University in 1975 and his master's degree from Northwest Missouri State University in 1976. He began his professional career at Arlington James Bowie High School in 1976 as a health teacher and athletics trainer, and was the school's Teacher of the Year in 1978.

Carlon and his wife, Beth, who is an elementary school administrator in Irving ISD, are both natives of Gowrie, Iowa.



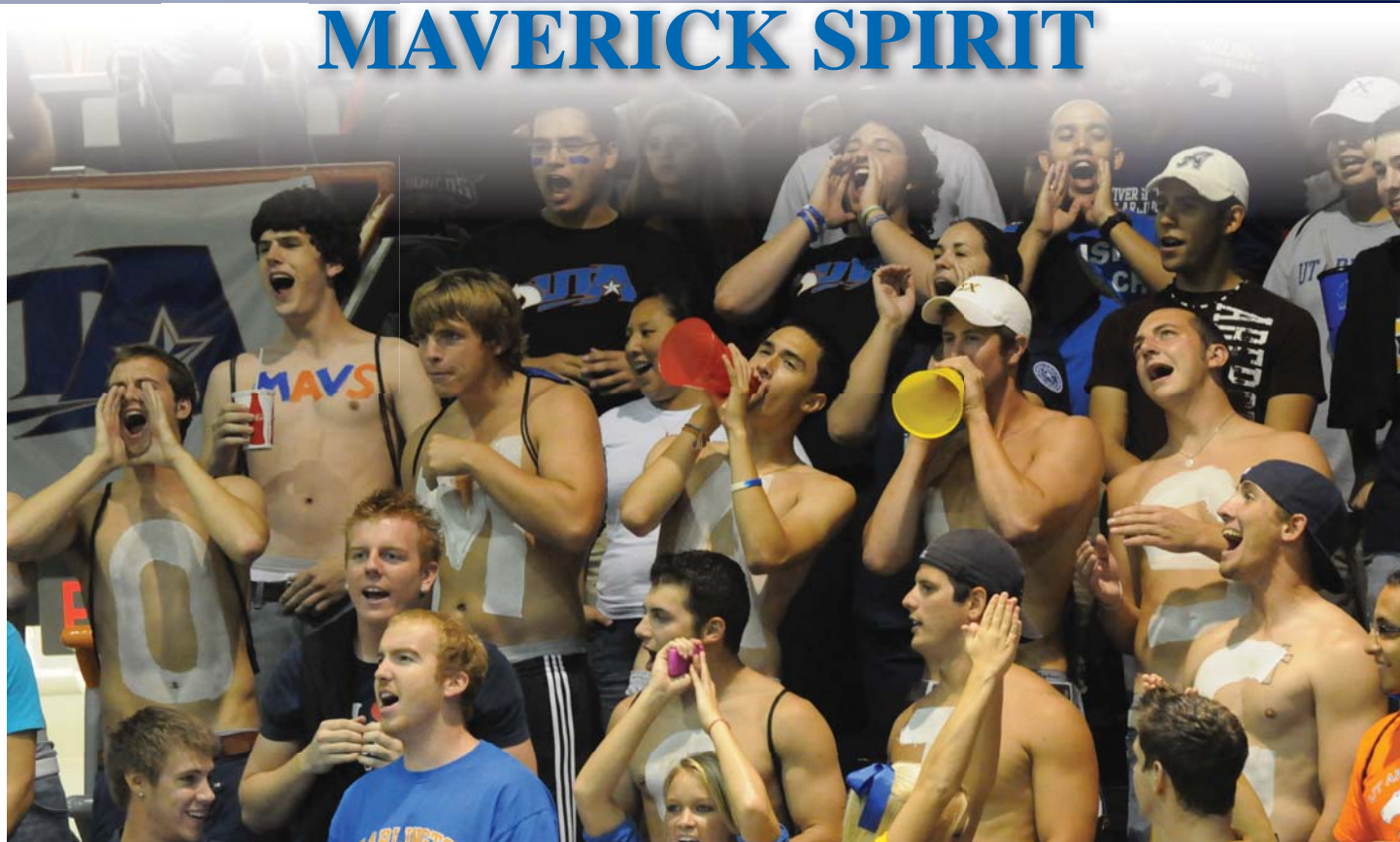

HOW A GRUBBWORM BECAME A MAVERICK

Hornets, Junior Aggies, Blue Riders and Rebels among long list of mascot names

An aardvark as UTA's mascot? It could've happened. The story begins more than 80 years ago.

From 1917, when it joined the Texas A&M System, to 1921, the school's athletic teams answered to Grubbers or the school's name, Grubbs Vocational College) and Shorthorns (after the campus newspaper, The Shorthorn).

Grubbers just wasn't destined to last, and many didn't like Shorthorns because that's what freshman teams at the school's hated rival, The University of Texas at Austin, were called.

A Shorthorn editorial Nov. 12, 1921, liked Hornets the idea of the 'Horn' and the 'Sting' too."

So Hornets it was—but not for long. When the school changed to North Texas Agricultural College in 1923, the yearbook that appeared in the spring was called the Junior Aggie. This set in motion a gradual shift over the years from Hornets to Junior Aggies.

In 1949, when the school became Arling-

ton State College, the nickname was officially changed to Blue Riders. According to an Aug. 25, 1949, article in the Tarrant County Citizen, "It was felt that the name would be appropriate with the school colors (blue and white), and would allow artists an opportunity to sketch attractive designs for team uniforms."

Except Blue Riders never caught on, either. In 1951, President E.H. Hereford called a meeting of as many sophomores as he could find and asked them to suggest yet another mascot.

Rebels subsequently won a student vote, and the fight song Dixie and mascot Johnny Red became intricate parts of the theme and continued as ASC became a four-year school in 1959. The theme was never seriously questioned until spring 1965 when some argued that Rebels depicted a symbol of slavery. Others maintained that it represented Southern heritage.

Several votes for name changes were held over the next six years, including one in 1968 (one year after the school became The Univer-

sity of Texas at Arlington) when Aardvarks was the top vote-getter behind Rebels. In February 1970, with Rebels not being one of the choices, Texans won out over Mavericks and Apollos, but Mavericks prevailed in a runoff.

The battle still wasn't over as students forced a referendum a month later, and the Old South theme prevailed again. UTA President Frank Harrison pleaded with students to make a change.

In May 1971, one more vote was held. Again, students could vote for any name they chose, as long as it wasn't Rebels. Mavericks won over Toros, Rangers and Hawks.

The first Maverick mascot was a horned horse. In later years it was patterned, sort of, after Sam Maverick, a wealthy Texas landowner who participated in many momentous events in the state's early history, among them the defense of the Alamo. He died in 1870.

Maverick accumulated a fabled empire and inspired the term "maverick" to denote an unbranded calf or an independent person.

STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING



Through a year round individualized training program, players undergo a rigorous conditioning regimen. Not only do these efforts improve the quality of the athlete's performance, but this program greatly reduces the potential for injury, reduces the extent of many injuries and expedites recovery in case there is an injury.

At UT Arlington this is a year round endeavor, in-season and off season. Many of our student athletes choose to spend their summers in Arlington in order to extend their opportunity to train for a championship. We take tremendous pride in a facility and staff second to none in the nation. Every program is

uniquely matched to the athlete and the sport. The strength staff works very closely with the sport coaches to create a spirit of shared goals, consistent expectations and staying abreast of the most current technology and sport science.

The strength staff at the University of Texas-Arlington is devoted to the scoreboard results of every team at the University, but, more importantly, we are devoted and committed to the personal success of every student-athlete on and off the field!

"Our staff is committed to developing each athlete's innate ability to the fullest. This includes: strength, power, speed, endurance, flexibility and resolve. We employ the latest techniques, equipment and motivation, as well as traditional principals, to ensure that our student-athletes are trained specifically and individually to be champions in their sport."

SPORTS MEDICINE



A commitment to total care exists in every facet of UT Arlington's approach to its student-athletes. UT Arlington Athletics Training facility contains modern equipment to ensure that a student-athlete is treated with care. Combined with the University health center, the student-athlete at UT Arlington is provided a team of physicians and care specialists.

The Maverick health care team focuses on prevention, treatment and rehabilitation. Equipment, training, medical and strength and conditioning staffs are jointly committed to health care and prevention.

"It has always been our philosophy to take a proactive approach to health care rather than just tending to our student-athletes after an injury," said Roy Rudewick, head athletics trainer.

Rudewick, a 1989 graduate of UT Arlington enters his fourth year with the Mavericks after more than a decade of service within the Arlington Independent School District. He will oversee all teams and will serve as the primary trainer for the men's basketball program.

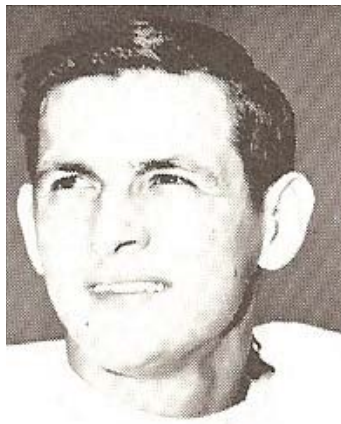

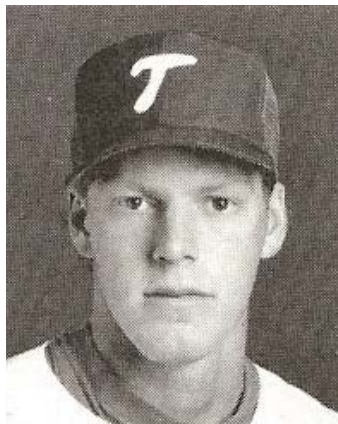
RAYLA ALLISON

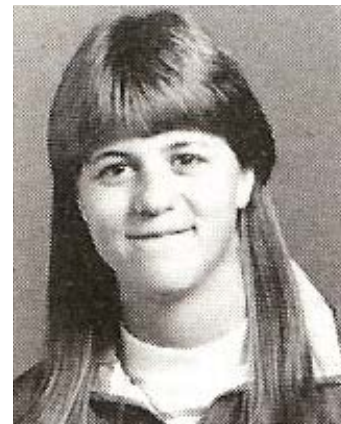
MIKE BARNES

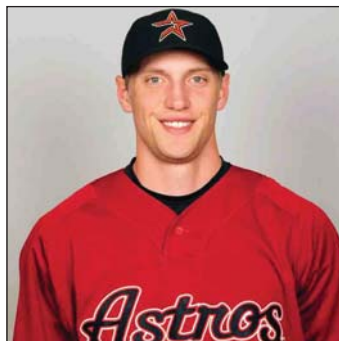

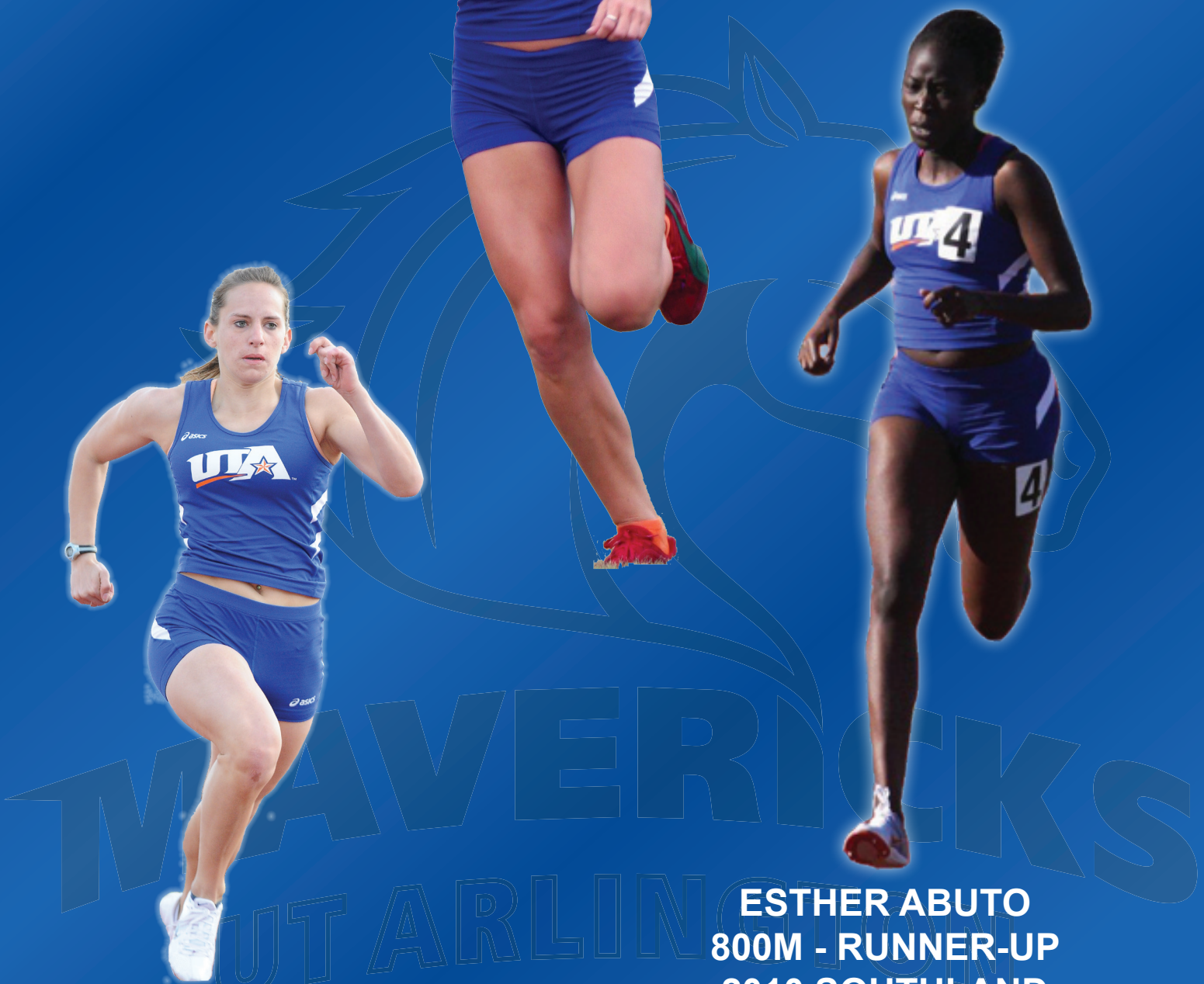
