FROM JIM'S DESK

Another year in UTA Athletic academic progress and competition is complete, and I am happy to share in this report our continued successes both on and off the playing field. Our goal each year is to assist our student athletes in accomplishing their academic, athletic, personal and professional goals, while meeting compliance standards and operating in a fiscally responsible manner. UTA continues to be a force to be reckoned with in only our third year of competition in the Sun Belt Conference.

We captured conference championships in Men's Tennis and Cross Country, and our Student-Athlete Advisory Committee dominated the Sun Belt Conference Community Service Initiative Challenge. The department took fourth place honors in the prestigious SBC Bubas Cup, which measures overall performance in all sports.

Volleyball accolades included Stacey Koch being named All-Sun Belt Conference Second Team and Cassidy Wheeler became just the ninth Maverick in program history to surpass 2,000 assists. Freshmen Marisah Ingram and Zhanelle Geathers combined for the second most in UTA history by a freshmen duo and the second most by any freshmen duo in the nation. This season, a record attendance for the volleyball program in the College Park Center of 2,108 against Texas State boosted the season average in the CPC to an all-time high.

Another chapter was launched this year in the long standing tradition of UTA Athletic commitment to excellence as we signed Allison Wade and Rachel Phillips as the program's first women's golfers. UTA will fully compete at the conference level in women's golf in the fall of 2017. Catherine Matranga was hired as the associate director of golf and will lead the team under the direction of second year head coach Stuart Deane. In addition, the Nancy Baker Memorial Women's Golf Scholarship was established to further the advancement of the women's golf program now, and in the future. Great strides have been made on the men's side of the golf program with the team finishing fifth at the conference championship. Zach Galliford tied for fourth at the Cabo Del Sol Intercollegiate and Tanner Gore and Josh Radcliff tied for fifth at the Jim West Intercollegiate and Herb Wimberly Tournaments respectfully.

Our basketball programs continue to excel under the direction of Scott Cross and Krista Gerlich. Both coaches hit milestone career victories as Coach Gerlich earned her 200th-career win and Coach Cross became the all-time victory leader for men's basketball with his 163rd win and he was named a finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award. The Lady Mavs finished 34th in the country in scoring defense and Rebekah VanDijk and Cierra Johnson each earned second-team All-Conference honors. For the first time in the men's basketball programs history, the Mavericks won a post season game and tied the program record for wins. Erick Neal was named to the All-Conference first team and the NABC district 24 second team. During the Maverick's season, they upset Ohio State and Memphis on the road.

With a 19-0 start, our softball program had its best start in history and coach Kristie Fox earned her 100th-career victory. Along the way, the Mavericks upset No. 5 ranked Louisiana for the first win over a ranked opponent since 2003. Darin Thomas picked up his 250th career win leading the Maverick baseball program and took wins over No. 5 TCU and No. 7 Oklahoma State.

The men's tennis program won their first Sun Belt championship and had an impressive 18 wins for the season, the best in program history and had back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2003 and 2004. Daniel Armengol was named to the All-Conference first team, and Armengol and Jhonathan Gonzalez were first team doubles. The Mavericks participated in the NCAA tournament for the fifth time in program history.

The women's tennis team had 17 wins for the season, tying them for second most in UTA tennis history. Agustina Serio highlighted the team's seven selections to All-Conference squads and Elizabeth Thoms ended her UTA career tied for third in program history with 74 career singles victories.

Along with winning another men's cross country title in the Sun Belt, Eric Ojeda won the Sun Belt Conference cross country individual title and Katelyn Hayward finished 19th at the NCAA South Central Regional. Four women's school records and three men's were set during the season and UTA won four events at the Sun Belt Indoor Championships. The men's indoor track teams placed second at the SBC meet, while the women's cross country team finished third.

We continue to recruit, develop and mentor staff members that are helping us achieve our business strategies. Our media rights holder, Learfield, continues to bring us new partnerships as our sponsorship revenue reached new heights this year. Licensing, web traffic, ticket sales and social media metrics are all trending upward as we continue to find new ways to enhance our offerings, story lines and products. Continued focus on growing Maverick Club membership and endowed scholarship awareness are areas of concentration as we move forward.

The loyalty of our fans, the commitment of our staff, the support of UTA President Dr. Vistasp Karbhari, and the hard work and determination of our student athletes provides UTA Athletics with a solid foundation to continue our pursuit of excellence.

UT Arlington concluded the 2015-16 academic year fourth in the final Sun Belt Conference's Vic Bubas Cup, earning another strong performance in the overall conference standings.

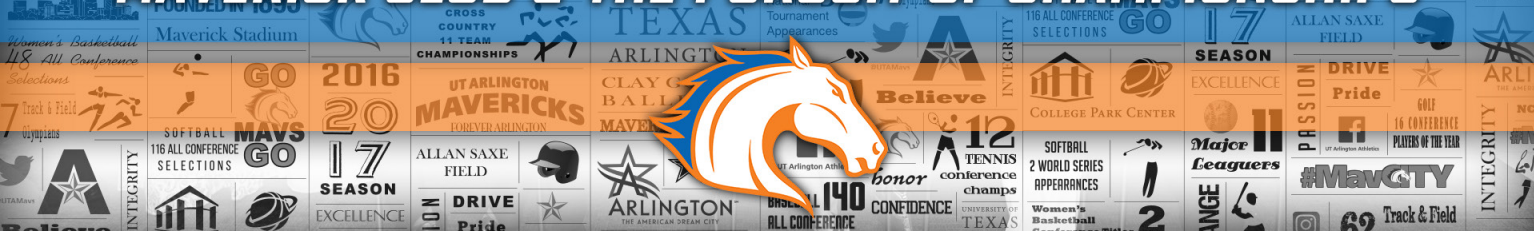
UTA finished with 97 points after claiming championships in cross country and men's tennis. The superb finish came despite not sponsoring four sports in which the Sun Belt universities awarded points to.

The finish comes on the heels of a third-place finale in 2014-15, just two points behind the eventual winner South Alabama and 0.5 behind Texas State with UTA featuring four fewer sports sponsored by the conference.

MAVERICK CLUB & THE PURSUIT OF CHAMPIONSHIPS



To see the **GROWTH** and **MOMENTUM** of UT Arlington Athletics, all one has to do is look at the Maverick Club. The 2015-2016 year set UTA records in the number of Maverick Club members and was the second best year in total dollars raised.

The Maverick Club saw an increase of **36%** in number of donors and a **16%** increase in total giving from 2014-2015 to 2015-2016. In addition, the Maverick Club hosted more than 20 events outside of sport competition to allow Maverick Club members to **MEET** and **INTERACT** with student-athletes, an increase of more than five events throughout the academic year. Donors also received a thank you phone call from student-athletes to emphasize **THE IMPACT THEIR GIFT** to Athletics makes.

Endowed Scholarship donors participated in an exclusive reception prior to the All Sports Banquet to meet with the student-athletes and their families, who were the recipients of an endowment. UT Arlington student-athletes showed their commitment to the Maverick Club, attaining 100% participation in the student-athlete giving campaign.

The Gilstrap Athletic Center was the most recent athletic facility to undergo renovations. Upgrades include a new lobby, complete with terrazzo tile with an inlay of the UT Arlington Athletics' logo, improvements to the student-athlete study hall and tutoring center, and the completion of a 3,000 square foot clubhouse for the Maverick golfers.

The clubhouse includes a team lounge, meeting space, coaches' offices, indoor putting green and a TrackMan swing analysis system.

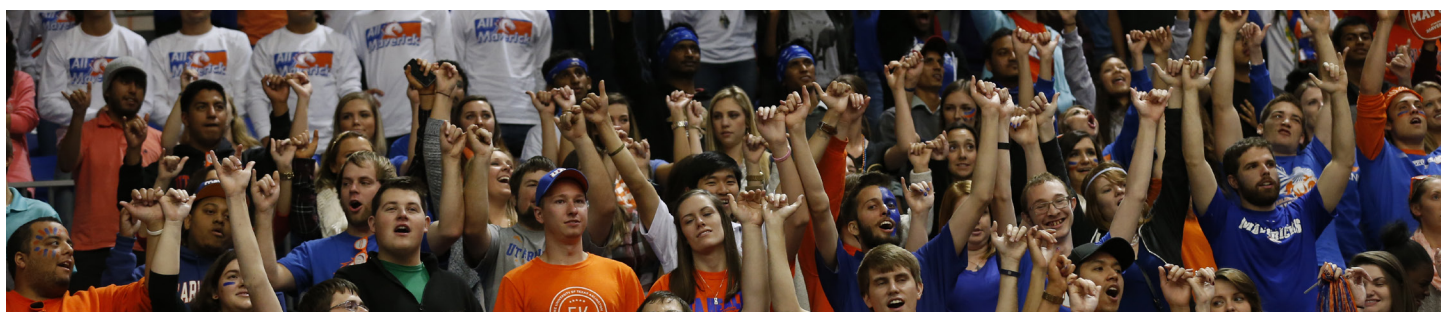

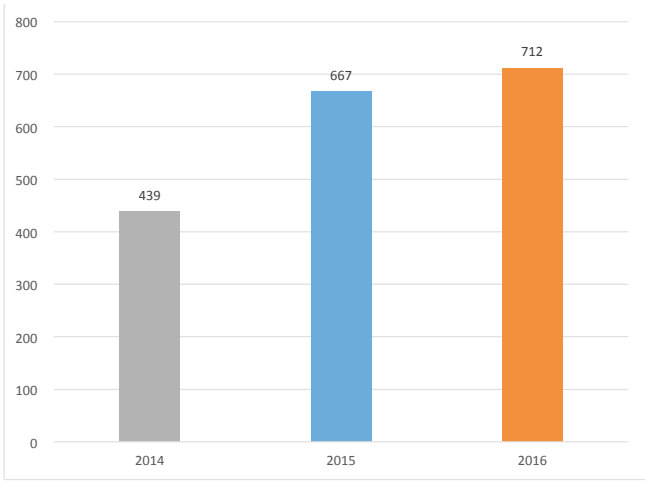

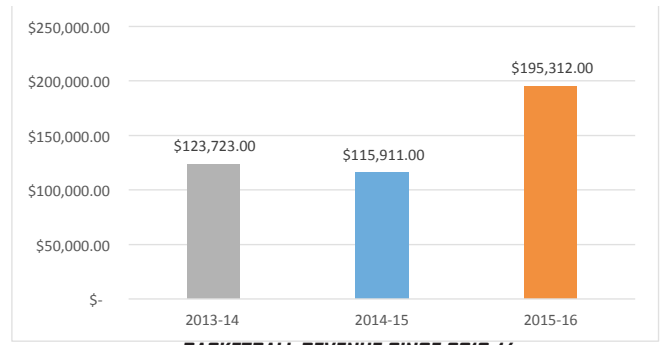

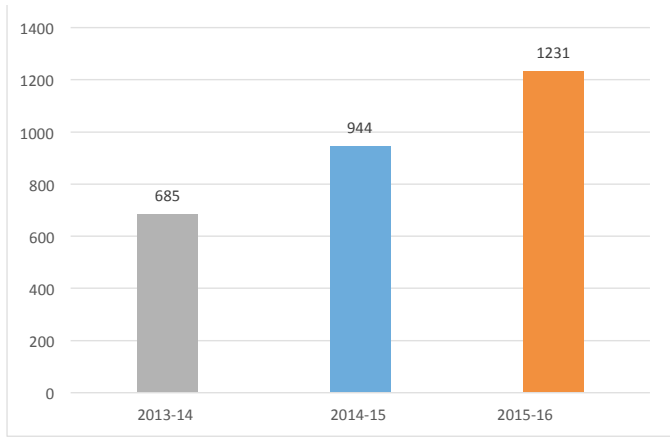




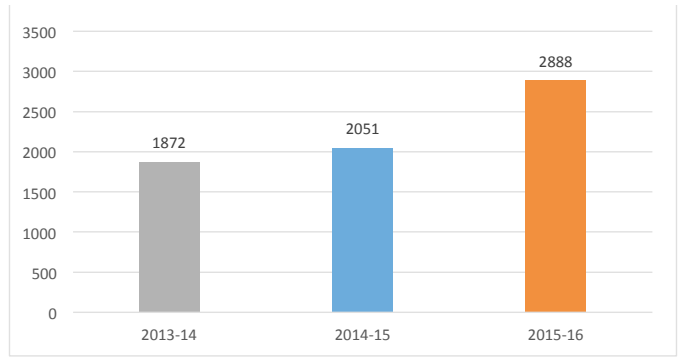
BASEBALL AVERAGE ATTENDANCE SINCE 2014



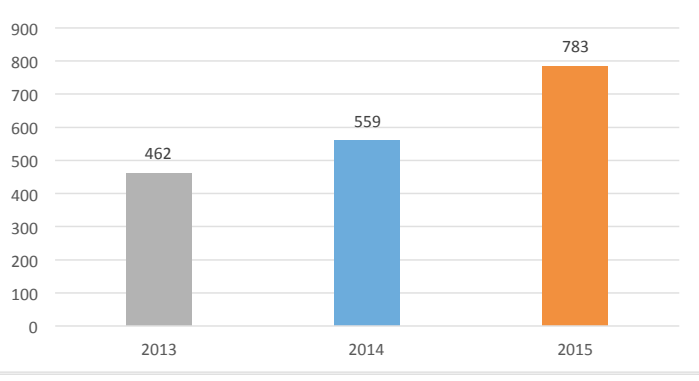
BASKETBALL REVENUE SINCE 2013-14



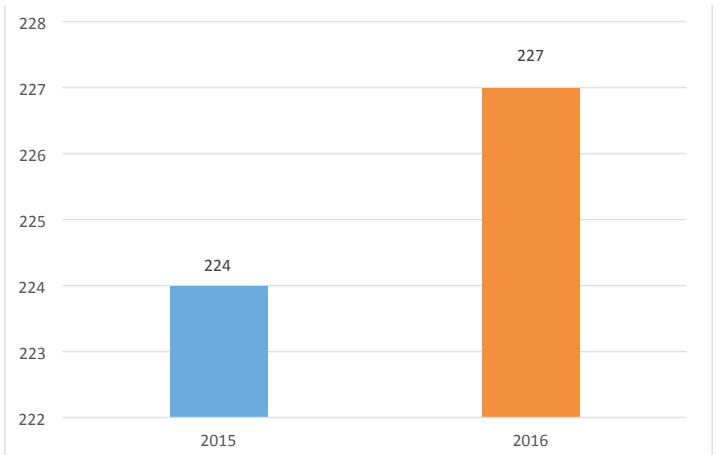
WOMEN'S BASKETBALL AVERAGE ATTENDANCE SINCE 2014
