GET READY FOR THE GAME...

- Georgia State made its second NCAA Tournament in the last four years in 2018 and returns four of five starters. GSU has finished in the top two of the final regular season conference standings four times in the last five years.
- The Panthers are 53-23 in Sun Belt Conference regular season games since rejoining the league in 2013-14.
- Georgia State topped UT Arlington 74-61 to win the Sun Belt Conference title in New Orleans last season.
- Head coach Ron Hunter is 8-2 in games in Texas since taking over the Panthers in 2011-12.
- Georgia State's 9-4 start is tied for the fourth-best 13-game start in program history.
- Georgia State won nine non-conference games, tied for the most in program history.
- Georgia State faced five opponents who competed in the 2018 NCAA Tournament in the first 11 games of the season. GSU squared off against Montana, St. Bonaventure, Creighton, Alabama, and No. 24 Kansas State all away from home going 2-3.
- As of Dec. 31, Georgia State's four losses have come to teams with a combined 38-14 record.
- Last time out, Georgia State earned an impressive 117-69 win over Middle Georgia State as the Panthers knocked down a season-high 16 3-pointers. The 117 points scored are the fourth-most in program history.
- GSU has beaten two Power 5 opponents in one season for the second time in program history (Georgia and Alabama). In the 2000-01 season, GSU topped Georgia to open the season then defeated Wisconsin in the NCAA Tournament. Those wins are the only two P5 wins for Sun Belt schools this season.
- Georgia State's 21-point halftime comeback over Alabama (Dec. 4) is tied for the 12th-largest halftime comeback in NCAA history.
- Over the last 10 months, three Panthers have made at least eight 3-pointers in a game. Malik Benlevi knocked down eight against UGA last week, while Jeff Thomas did it against Mercer earlier this year. Last season, Devin Mitchell made 10 3-pointers at Little Rock.
- Since the start of the 2013-14 season, Georgia State has won more games (119) than any other NCAA Division I team in Georgia.
- Junior D'Marcus Simonds is averaging 18.0 points per game for his career which currently ranks No. 17 among all active NCAA players and is tops in the Sun Belt. He has made 512 career field goals which is No. 46 among all active players and the No. 2 junior in the country.
- Simonds was named the Sun Belt Preseason Player of the Year after earning AP All-America Honorable Mention last season. He earned Sun Belt Player of the Week honors on Nov. 12.
- Jeff Thomas has made 171 3-pointers in his career, sixth on GSU's all-time.
- GSU is one of just 13 programs in the country to feature two assistant coaches who have NCAA D1 head coach experience (McCallum - Ball State/Houston/Detroit and Williams - Tennessee State).
- Head coach Ron Hunter, Georgia State's all-time leader in wins, earned the 150th win of his career at GSU in the opening game of the Cayman Islands Classic against St. Bonaventure.
- Hunter has led the Panthers to four of the seven most successful seasons in program history, including a pair of 25-win seasons and 24 wins last year.

GOING FOR A THIRD

Since joining the Sun Belt five years ago, Georgia State has won two conference regular season titles, finished as a regular season runner-up twice, advanced to three conference tournament finals, and won two tournament titles in New Orleans.

Over the five-year stretch, the Panthers are 64-29 in Sun Belt Conference regular season games. The 64 wins are the most in the league during that time.

BRINGING MARCH MADNESS TO NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER

Georgia State faced five teams that played in the 2018 NCAA Tournament during the non-conference slate. It began on Nov. 9, at Montana as the Panthers lost a hard-fought game 81-74. The Panthers topped St. Bonaventure 75-65 and lost to Creighton 93-68 in the Cayman Islands Classic. Using a 21-point comeback and game winning buzzer beater, the Panthers topped Alabama (Dec. 4) 83-80. Despite leading with eight minutes to play, the Panthers fell to No. 24 Kansas State 71-59 on Dec. 15.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK...JUST CALL IT A VICTORY

Georgia State topped Alabama 83-80 on Dec. 4, on a game-winning 3-point buzzer beater from senior Malik Benlevi. However, it was how the Panthers earned the win that might be even more remarkable and why it led ESPN's SportsCenter. The Panthers trailed by 21 points at halftime and by 22 points with 18:57 to play in the second half. Here are a couple of notes from the NCAA record book:

- 21 point halftime deficit - t12th-largest comeback in NCAA history
- 22 point second half deficit - t32nd-largest comeback in NCAA history

SEC CHAMPS?

Georgia State went 2-0 against the SEC this fall earning a 91-67 win over Georgia to garner third place in the Cayman Islands Classic and an 83-80 win at Alabama. Ironically those two programs played for a national championship in football last season and an SEC title in early December.

POWER 5 WINS

Georgia State has garnered a pair of wins over Power 5 programs for just the second time in the same season in program history. With wins over Georgia and Alabama, it guaranteed no-less than two wins over P5 programs before postseason play. The only other time in program history Georgia State defeated two Power 5 programs in the same year was 2000-01 when the Panthers topped Georgia to open the season and then defeated Wisconsin in the NCAA Tournament.

LAST TIME OUT

Georgia State scored a season-high 117 points defeating Middle Georgia State 117-69 at the GSU Sports Arena in its final game before Sun Belt Conference play. With the victory, the Panthers tied a school record with nine wins before conference play, a mark they've reached three times before, including last season.

In a dominant, record-setting performance, the Panthers made a season-high 16 3-pointers, shooting 47.1 percent (16-for-34). The team's 117 points was the fourth-most in school history and the 48-point win was the second-highest margin of victory in school history. The 69 points scored in the second half tied for the third-most in program history.

Devin Mitchell led six players in double-figures for Georgia State (9-4), scoring 21 points with a season-high seven 3-pointers.

Nelson Phillips scored a career-high 20 points off the bench, shooting 7-for-8 from the field and 5-for-6 from the free-throw line. Malik Benlevi and Damon Wilson contributed 16 points a piece, while D'Marcus Simonds scored 13 and Jeff Thomas added 11. It marked the second time this season that six Panthers have scored in double figures in the same game.

WHAT A NOVEMBER!

Georgia State won five games in November, tying a school record for the most wins in the month. Only in November 2017 and November 2014 have the Panthers won five games in November. Both of those seasons ended with appearances in the NCAA Tournament.



BEST 13-GAME STARTS

Georgia State's 9-4 start through 13 games isn't the best 13-game start in program history, but it is right near the top. Here are the best 13-game starts in program history.

PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Junior D'Marcus Simonds was named the Sun Belt Preseason Player of the Year after earning the league's top award to finish the 2017-18 season. In the last five years, Georgia State has earned the league's top postseason award three times as Simonds joined R.J. Hunter (2013-14 and 2014-15) as the only Panthers to garner the recognition.

#WE-RUN-THIS-STATE

If it wasn't enough that Georgia State has more wins (119) than any other NCAA Division I program in the state of Georgia since the start of the 2013-14 (see page 4 for details), the Panthers now have also beaten everyone in the state since that time.

Georgia State dominated Georgia 91-67 to earn third place in the Cayman Islands Classic earlier this season. The Panthers also have wins over Mercer and Kennesaw State (scrimmage) this season. Last year, the Panthers knocked off Georgia Tech in an exhibition game for hurricane relief.

Head coach Ron Hunter is now 20-6 against teams from the state of Georgia since taking over the Panthers for the 2011-12 season.

FROM WAY DOWNTOWN

Senior Devin Mitchell earned All-Sun Belt Preseason Second Team honors a year after earning All-Sun Belt Third Team honors. Mitchell finished last season with 98 3-pointers, second-most in school history and just two shy of R.J. Hunter's school record 100 treys. After missing the first seven games of the season due to injury, Mitchell is 21-of-45 in his first six games back from 3-point range.

MAJOR PRESEASON RECOGNITION

After earning Sun Belt Player of the Year and All-Sun Belt First Team honors last year, junior D'Marcus Simonds has picked up major honors throughout this preseason.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior D'Marcus Simonds continued to garner attention after just the first week of the season earning Sun Belt Player of the Week honors on Nov. 13.

In the first two games, Simonds averaged 25.5 points in a win over ETSU and tough loss at Montana. It marked the fourth time in his career that Simonds has won the weekly award.

SCORING SENSATION

After scoring 13 points against Middle Georgia State, junior D'Marcus Simonds moved into fifth-place on Georgia State's career scoring list with 1,387 points. He enters tonight just six points shy of Devonta White for No. 4 on the list. He needs 432 more points this season to break R.J. Hunter's school record of 1,819 career points. (For a full list, see page 5).

TONIGHT'S OPPONENT

Georgia State and UT Arlington will meet for the 14th time on Thursday with the Panthers winning two of three last season, including the Sun Belt Conference Tournament Championship Game in New Orleans. The Mavericks have won two-straight in Arlington.

HOME SWEET HOME

When coach Ron Hunter took over the Panthers, one of the first things he proclaimed was that the GSU Sports Arena would become one of the toughest places in the country. So far, he has been correct. The Panthers are 73-17 in the comfy confines of the Sports Arena since his arrival.

The Panthers have gone 63-10 at home the last five-plus seasons. During that span, Georgia State put together an 18-game winning streak which ranks second-longest in school history.

HALL OF FAME WORTHY

Head coach Ron Hunter was inducted into the Miami University Cradle of Coaches in October. Hunter starred for the program in the early 80's leading them to three NCAA tournaments in four years.

It was announced on Nov. 29, that he will be inducted into the IUPUI Hall of Fame Class of 2019 on Feb. 2, 2019 in Indianapolis. He led the Jaguars for 17 years and is still their all-time winningest coach.

HEAD OF THE CLASS

Ron Hunter became the all-time winningest coach at Georgia State in 2016-17 and now has 156 victories in seven-plus seasons. He has shattered every wins mark in school history with the exception of the single-season record of 29 wins held by Charles "Lefty" Driesell.

Hunter surpassed Bob Reinhart for the record on Dec. 10, 2016. Ironically, Reinhart, now a scout for the Miami Heat, was in the building when Hunter tied the record.

ELITE GROUP

When head coach Ron Hunter won his 108th game at GSU in 2016, he joined an elite group of coaches who are considered the all-time wins leader at multiple schools. Hunter coached IUPUI for 17 years and is still the all-time wins leader for the Jaguars. The list of coaches who lead at multiple schools includes:

SEEN WORLDWIDE

For the fourth-straight year, all Georgia State home games will air live on the ESPN family of networks which this season includes ESPN+. With the program's rise, nearly every game will be seen worldwide this year. Of the Panthers 31 scheduled games, 29 are currently scheduled to air live.

Among the highlights will be the game at Alabama (SEC Network+) and at Louisiana (ESPN2). The Cayman Islands Classic aired on Stadium, while the road game at Kansas State was on Fox Sports KC.

GOING BAREFOOT

Coach Ron Hunter will once again coach a game barefoot in support of Samaritan's Feet this season. This year it come on Jan. 24 against Texas State.

The Panthers are 7-0 when Hunter has gone without socks and shoes to raise awareness for the 300 million children around the world without shoes. This marked the 12th straight year Hunter has gone barefoot for a game dating back to his days at IUPUI.

As part of his work with Samaritan's Feet, Georgia State has traveled to South Africa (2012), Costa Rica (2014), Dominican Republic (2016) and Spain (2018) to take part in shoe distributions with the organization.

WHAT'S IN A COLOR

Georgia State has three different color jerseys this year, including a new gray alternate jersey color. Last year the Panthers were 15-3 wearing white, 9-6 in black and 0-2 in blue.

SINGLE GAME TOP MARKS

Georgia State has seen some impressive single-game performances already this-year. Two of the biggest came from Jeff Thomas and Malik Benlevi each knocking down eight 3-pointers in a game. Benlevi, who went 8-of-11 which also ranks percentage wise as one of best in program history, accomplished it in GSU's blow-out of Georgia.

HEAD COACH RON HUNTER

In seven seasons, Ron Hunter has changed the national perception of Georgia State; winning 147 games and advancing to the postseason five times. He is now responsible for five of the eight most successful seasons in program history.

His stint at GSU was highlighted in 2014-15 by winning 25 games for a second year in a row and advancing to the third round of the NCAA tournament following the shocking upset of No. 3-seed Baylor. He returned the Panthers to the Big Dance in 2017-18 for the second time in four years after winning the Sun Belt Conference tournament for a second time.

The 147 wins are the most in any seven-year stretch in program history. He became one of just seven coaches to be the all-time wins leader at multiple NCAA Division I schools in 2016-17.

With the team's success in 2013-14 and 2014-15, Georgia State entered elite status by winning 25 or more games in each of those two years, an accomplishment only reached by 20 programs in the entire country.

Hunter is also responsible for more than half of the school's post-season appearances.

Last year was highlighted by tying for the most non-conference wins in school history and another 20-plus win season that included a 10-game winning streak. The Panthers set records for 3-pointers made and 3-point field goal percentage.

Last season, Georgia State also had its fifth-straight winning season that included a fourth top-two finish in the Sun Belt in five years.

After winning the Sun Belt regular season title for the second straight season in 2014-15, the Panthers claimed the tournament title, just the third for the program to advance to the NCAA tournament. In the postgame celebration, Hunter tore his Achilles, a clip that went viral across the nation.

Coaching in the NCAA tournament from a stool, the Panthers trailed by 12 with 2:53 to play, before mounting a furious 13-0 run, capped by a 30-foot 3-pointer from son R.J. that sent Hunter off his stool and became one of the most watched clips of the tournament and a part of 'One Shining Moment.'

Although successful in his first two seasons at the helm, the Panthers started to pile up the wins during the 2013-14 season. Winning 25 games, second most in school history, Georgia State earned a Sun Belt regular season championship and an appearance in the Postseason NIT. During the season, the Panthers won a school-record 14-straight games, including a stretch of 22 of 23, as Hunter was named Sun Belt Coach of the Year and NABC Region 24 Coach of the Year.

During his first season (2011-12), Georgia State won 22 games, the fourth most in school history, advancing to the second round of the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

Hunter has won 418 games in 24 seasons, but the accomplishments made by the 2011-12 team will always be special for him. After being named head coach on March 21, 2011, he built a squad that finished in the top 20 in the nation in scoring defense, defensive shooting percentage, steals and blocked shots, as six seniors finished their careers triumphantly.

Following the record-setting season, Hunter was named Atlanta Tip-off Club Georgia Coach of the Year, while his players earned a record number of conference and national awards.

National notoriety is nothing new for Hunter. While at IUPUI, he was lauded for his humanitarian efforts, partnering with Samaritan's Feet, an organization that collects shoes for underprivileged children around the world.

Named Summit League Coach of the Year in 2003 and 2006, Hunter led IUPUI to the conference championship game five times from 2002-10, including the 2003 title game victory over top-seeded Valparaiso.

Hunter, 52, earned his bachelor's degree in education at Miami (Ohio) in 1986 and added a master's in 1987. Hunter and his wife, Amy, have two children, Jasmine (26) and R.J. (24). R.J. was a stand-out for the Panthers and was selected by the Boston Celtics with the 28th pick in the first round of the NBA Draft in 2015. He is currently with the Atlanta Hawks organization playing for their G-League affiliate.

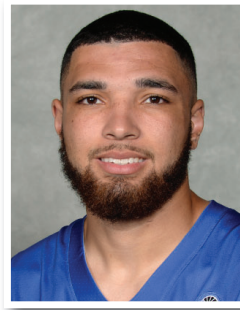

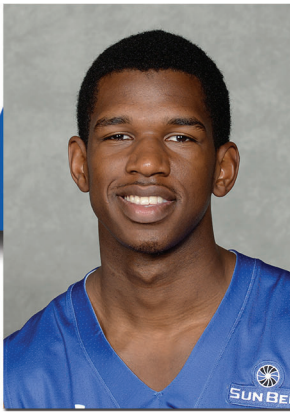

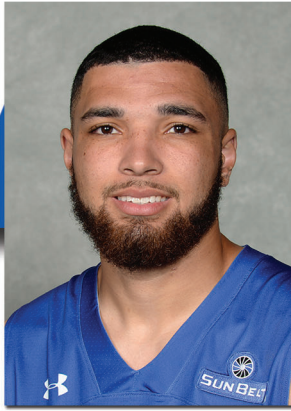

Georgia State opened the 2018-19 regular season defeating East Tennessee State 74-68 Tuesday night at GSU Sports Arena, capped off by a Damon Wilson 3-pointer and Jeff Thomas break-away dunk that turned a one point Panther lead with under a minute to play into a six-point victory.

Thomas led Georgia State (1-0) with a career-high 26 points, going 9-of-10 from the free throw line. Junior D'Marcus Simonds added 21 points and senior Malik Benlevi added a double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

Wilson finished with six points and a team-high 11 rebounds in his first game in a Georgia State uniform.

ETSU (0-1), which won 25 games a year ago, but saw 10 newcomers in the line-up tonight, was led by Isaiah Tisdale, who scored 19 points in the loss. Mladen Armus just missed a double-double with 11 points and nine rebounds.

"That was a really good win," head coach Ron Hunter said. "We beat an NCAA Tournament team tonight. I thought offensively we were not that sharp early on, but that is okay. As I have said all along, we don't need to be playing our best basketball now. We just need to keep getting better every day."

Both teams struggled from the field in the first half as the Panthers' slight advantage came from their ability to get to the free-throw line. Georgia State converted on 11 of its 16 attempts from the line in the first half, steadying them to a 32-29 halftime lead.

Simonds got the Panthers going in the second half, hitting on two straight from beyond the arc before a Buccaneers 7-0 run helped them to a four point lead with seven minutes left. But the Panthers responded, tying the game back up on a Benlevi layup before the home crowd erupted as Thomas hit a corner three to put Georgia State back in the lead with five minutes to go.

After a step-back three by Simonds put the Panthers up by six with two minutes to play, a dunk by Myles Armus (11 points, nine rebounds) and a three by Tisdale had the Buccaneers within one. It came after a Georgia State 14-2 run that gave GSU a 66-58 lead with 3:46 to play.

But in the final minute of the game, Wilson pulled down a huge rebound after a Simonds miss and hit a three from the right corner. Simonds blocked an attempt by Armus on the other end and found Thomas who iced it.

With the win, the Panthers are now 8-0 in regular season home openers under Ron Hunter and have won 11 straight openers at GSU Sports Arena. Georgia State has also won six-straight season openers dating back to a 2011-12 loss at Duke on opening night.

MONTANA 81, GEORGIA STATE 74

Dahlberg Arena • Missoula, Mont.

Despite 30 points from junior D'Marcus Simonds, Georgia State fell on the road at Montana 81-74 at Dahlberg Arena. The match-up featured two teams who advanced to the 2018 NCAA Tournament and are both favorited to win their respective leagues this season.

Simonds, who scored 20 points in the first half, finished 11-of-24 from the floor with three 3-pointers. Sophomore Kane Williams scored a career-high 17 points going 5-of-11 from the floor, grabbing six rebounds while dishing out five assists.

Georgia State (1-1) was held to just 38.9 percent from the floor and went just 12-of-24 from the free throw line. However GSU's defense held the Grizzlies to just 5-of-25 shooting from beyond the arc.

Montana (1-0) won its season opener as five players scored in double figures, led by 22 points from Jamar Akoh, while Michael Oguine garnered a double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds.

Georgia State had six players pick up at least four fouls including Simonds who fouled out with a few seconds to play. The Panthers were called for 31 fouls which led to Montana going 28-of-43 from the free throw line.

Simonds gave Georgia State an early 8-6 lead as he scored the first eight points for the Panthers. Montana responded with a 7-0 run to take a 13-8 with 13:48 to play in the first half before another basket by Simonds.

The Grizzlies pushed the lead to 20-11 with 10:33 to play in the first half and still led 28-20 with just over five minutes to play. The Panthers responded with a 13-5 run to end the half capped by a dunk by junior Chris Clerkley to send the game into the locker room tied 33-33.

Simonds finished the first half with 20 points as the Panthers held Montana to just 2-of-15 3-point shooting in the first 20 minutes. More remarkable was the tie score despite seniors Malik Benlevi and Jeff Thomas, along with redshirt-junior Damon Wilson being held scoreless.

Georgia State scored the first six points of the second half as Benlevi knocked down a 3-pointer and led by as many as seven, 44-37, before back-to-back 3-pointers by Timmy Falls cut the Panthers lead to 44-43 with 13:48 to play.

With a 3-pointer with 11:05 to play, Simonds moved into 13th on GSU's all-time scoring list and gave GSU a 51-49 lead.

The two teams would battle back and forth before Montana started to pull away and led 67-60 with 3:51 to play. Another 3-pointer by Benlevi with 48 seconds to play cut Montana's lead to just 74-71, but unfortunately that is as close as the Panthers could get.

GEORGIA STATE 62, MERCER 60

GSU Sports Arena • Atlanta, Ga.

Jeff Thomas set career-highs with 30 points and eight 3-pointers as Georgia State held on for a 62-60 win over in-state rival Mercer on Tuesday at GSU Sports Arena.

Georgia State (2-1) led by as many as 19 points in the second half, but Mercer fought back, cutting the lead to two with under a minute to play. After a missed free-throw by Damon Wilson, Djordje Dimitrijevic missed a 3-pointer that could have won the game for Mercer (1-2) in the closing seconds. D'Marcus Simonds secured the rebound and the win for the Panthers.

Thomas finished the game 11-of-17 from the floor and 8-of-13 from 3-point range along with five assists. The eight 3-pointers are tied for the sixth-most in a single game in program history.

Simonds, fresh off earning Sun Belt Player of the Week honors for the fourth time in his career, added 16 points. With this performance, he moved into 12th place in program history in career-points scored, passing Thomas Terrell, who was recently inducted into the GSU Athletics Hall of Fame.

"I've seen a lot of different things in my career, but I don't know if I have ever had a team shooting 35 3-pointers," head coach Ron Hunter said. "We made a bunch early, but then it slowed as Mercer changed up their defense and we didn't respond the way I would like. With that said, that is a very good team and at the end of the season this will prove to be a very good win."

Georgia State got out to an early lead behind a 17-4 run led by Thomas and Simonds, who combined for 29 of Georgia State's 40 first-half points.

Despite a 15-point halftime deficit, Mercer kept the game close in the second half thanks to a 16-2 run of its own, cutting the Georgia State lead to five with just under five minutes to play. Kane Williams quickly hit a 3-pointer to put the Panthers back up by eight, but a three by Ross Cummings and a couple free-throws by Dimitrijevic cut the lead back to four.

Thomas hit a step-back jumper to put the Panthers back up by six, but Mercer answered right back with two free-throws by Ethan Stair and a layup by Dimitrijevic, cutting the lead to two before the missed Williams free throw and the miss by Dimitrijevic in the closing seconds.

Although Mercer still leads the all-time series 45-37, the Panthers have won 17 of the last 20 meetings dating back to 1996.

Mercer was led by Ethan Stair who just missed a double-double with 12 points and nine rebounds. The Bears were held to just 7-of-26 shooting from 3-point range while the Panthers finished 15-of-35 from behind the arc.

Junior D'Marcus Simonds scored a team-high 25 points and freshman Nelson Phillips just missed his first career double-double to give Georgia State a 75-65 win over St. Bonaventure on the first day of the Cayman Islands Classic.

Georgia State (3-1) won its second straight game and advances in the winner's bracket to face Creighton on Tuesday night at 7:30 p.m.

Simonds finished 11-of-20 from the floor and grabbed seven rebounds to go along with three assists, two blocked shots and two steals. He moved into a tie for ninth place with Nate Williams on Georgia State's all-time scoring list with 1,122 points.

Leading by four, Phillips went on a 5-0 run by himself and a free throw later by Benlevi gave the Panthers with 33-23 lead with just under two minutes to play.

The Bonnies hit a pair of 3-pointers in the final minute to cut into Georgia State's lead, but the Panthers still went into the locker room with a 37-32 lead. The Panthers forced 11 turnovers in the first half, while also blocking four shots.

After St. Bonaventure cut Georgia State's lead to just three points, the Panthers responded with a 9-0 run to lead 49-37 with 14:37 to play in the second half.

Senior Malik Benlevi would score eight straight points for Georgia State and the Panthers would push the lead to as many as 15, 55-40 with 12:53 remaining.

The Bonnies cut the lead to 63-55 with 7:00 to play before GSU pushed it back into double figures for the rest of the game.

Benlevi finished with 13 points, while Kane Williams added six points, six assists and four steals.

Kyle Lofton added 13 points for St. Bonaventure which ended the game with four players in double figures. finished 15-of-35 from behind the arc.

All five scorers finished in double figures and Georgia State dominated Georgia 91-67 to earn third place in the Cayman Islands Classic on Wednesday night at John Gray Gym.

Malik Benlevi led the Panthers with 24 points, going 8-of-11 from 3-point range as the Panthers topped the Bulldogs for the third time in the last four tries dating back to 2000.

Georgia State (4-2) shot 55.7 percent from the floor and 56.0 percent from 3-point range to earn the Panthers largest-margin of victory ever over a Power 5 school. GSU also handed Georgia (3-3) its worst non-conference loss since a 76-42 defeat to Illinois in 2008.

Junior D'Marcus Simonds added 17 points, eight assists and six rebounds to earn All-Tournament honors, while redshirt-junior Damon Wilson also poured in 17 points.

Trailing 14-11 early, Georgia State used a 12-0 run to take a 23-14 lead with 11:59 to play, forcing Georgia to call timeout.

Georgia State pushed the lead to 33-18 on a 3-pointer by senior Jeff Thomas with 10:13 to play in the first half and led 40-22 with 8:27 remaining making 14 of 15 shots at one point.

Another Benlevi 3-pointer gave GSU a 51-30 lead with just over two minutes to play in the opening 20 minutes, as the Panthers went into the locker room with a 51-32 lead.

The Panthers shot 54.3 percent in the opening half, including 8-of-16 from 3-point range. Georgia turned the ball over 15 times which led to 17 GSU points.

The second half was no different. Wilson came out red-hot scoring the first 10 points of the second half for Georgia State, including a pair of 3-pointers. Another 3-pointer by Benlevi gave Georgia State a 30 point lead, 72-42, with 13:01 to play.

The Panthers shot 57.7 percent in the second half, going 6-of-9 from 3-point range. Georgia State finished the game shooting 55.7 percent and connected on 14-of-25 from beyond the arc.

Benlevi's eight 3-pointers tied for the seventh-most in a single game in program history, while the 72.7 percent mark from beyond the arc is the fourth-best mark in a single-game.

Thomas added 12 points for Georgia State on four 3-pointers, while sophomore Kane Williams, coming off a career-high 20 points last night, finished with 14 points.

Senior Malik Benlevi scored a career-high for a second-straight game to lead the Panthers to an 80-76 win on the road at Tulane on Wednesday afternoon.

Benlevi finished with 25 points, knocking down five 3-pointers to go along with five rebounds, four blocked shots and four steals. A week ago to the day, the Savannah, Ga., native scored 24 points on eight 3-pointers against in-state foe Georgia in the Cayman Islands.

Georgia State (5-2) also got 21 points from D'Marcus Simonds and 16 points from redshirt-junior Damon Wilson. Simonds finished 7-of-14 from the floor and dished out five assists, while Wilson was 5-of-8 with four boards in just 24 minutes.

Tulane (2-4) trailed by as many as 17 in the second half before cutting Georgia State's lead to just four with just under two minutes to play. The Green Wave were led by Kevin Zhang who scored 23 points, while Caleb Daniels finished with 17.

The Panthers are off to a 5-2 start for the fourth time in the last five years and are currently 3-1 on a six-game stretch away from home.

Simonds moved into sixth place on Georgia State's all-time scoring list with 1,281 points, moving ahead of James Andrews.

Tulane took an early 11-5 lead just over four minutes into the game as the Panthers adjusted to the early start time.

Georgia State started to take control with back-to-back 3-pointers by Simonds and Benlevi that gave the Panthers a 24-17 lead with 10:53 to play in the first half. It was part of a stretch where four straight made field goals for the Panthers came from 3-point range.

Leading by two, Georgia State used another 6-0 run capped by a Nelson Phillips 3-pointer to lead 32-24 with 5:51 to play. Phillips came off the bench to score seven points and grab four rebounds in 17 minutes.

Another Benlevi 3-pointer pushed the lead to 13, 44-31 at the half, as the Panthers went 8-of-17 from beyond the arc in the first 20 minutes.

Despite a size advantage, Tulane was outrebounded by the Panthers 19-11 in the first half.

Georgia State pushed the lead to 17 points before Tulane used a 9-0 run to trail by just eight, 50-42, with 14:09 to play. The Panthers immediately responded with 3-pointers by Benlevi and Simonds to go back up 58-44 with 11:55 remaining.

The Green Wave continued to chip into Georgia State's lead and got as close as four points multiple times over the final two minutes, but could not get any closer as the Panthers knocked down their free throws.

GSU improved to 8-3 in New Orleans since the start of the 2013-14 season and 14-5 in the state of Louisiana since that time.

GEORGIA STATE 83, ALABAMA 80

Coleman Coliseum • Tuscaloosa, Ala.

Senior Malik Benlevi's buzzer-beater 3-pointer helped Georgia State overcome a 21-point halftime deficit to top Alabama on Tuesday night 83-80 at Coleman Coliseum.

Georgia State (6-3) trailed 55-33 with 18:57 to play before mounting an epic comeback that included holding Alabama (5-3) without a field goal for more than nine minutes of the second half.

A lay-up by junior D'Marcus Simonds with 43 seconds to play gave the Panthers their first lead of the game, 80-78. Dazon Ingram tied the game on the other end before Benlevi came down to hit the game winner as time expired.

Benlevi finished with 16 points and eight rebounds, while Simonds finished with 23 points and five rebounds, going a perfect 6-of-6 from the free throw line.

The win gave Georgia State its second win in the same season over a Power 5 opponent for just the second time in program history. The Panthers knocked off Georgia 91-67 in the Cayman Islands Classic two weeks ago.

Senior Jeff Thomas added 14 points and seven rebounds, while sophomore Kane Williams chipped in with 12 points, five assists, and four rebounds.

Senior Devin Mitchell, who played his first season at Alabama before transferring to Georgia State, finished with three points in his second game back from an injury that kept him out the first seven games of the year.

Alabama was led by Kira Lewis, Jr., who scored 19 points, making 5-of-10 from 3-point range. Dazon Ingram came off the bench to score 17 points and grab eight rebounds.

Holding an early 10-9 lead, Alabama used an 8-0 run to build an 18-9 lead with 12:22 to play in the first half.

Trailing by 10, a Benlevi 3-pointer and dunk by Nelson Phillips cut the Crimson Tide lead to 27-22 with just under eight minutes to play.

Using a 17-2 run, Alabama pushed its lead to 50-29 with just under four minutes to play and went into the locker room leading 52-31. The Crimson Tide shot 59.4 percent in the first 20 minutes, while holding Panthers to 40.6 percent from the floor.

The comeback started with a 10-0 run capped by two Simonds' free throws to cut the deficit to 61-49 with 11:51 to play.

A 14-2 run late in the game got the Panthers to within three, 69-66, with 5:28 to play before the teams traded baskets. On senior Jordan Tyson's two free throws with 4:04 remaining, the Panthers trailed just 75-71.

Trailing by five, Simonds made lay-ups on back-to-back possessions and was fouled on the second to tie the game with 1:35 to play, setting up a crazy final 90 seconds.

GEORGIA STATE 95, CHATTANOOGA 88

D'Marcus Simonds scored a game-high 24 points and Devin Mitchell added season highs with 17 points and 32 minutes as Georgia State topped Chattanooga 95-88 Wednesday at the GSU Sports Arena.

Simonds finished 8-of-11 from the floor with six rebounds and five assists, while Mitchell was 5-of-10 from 3-point range as the Panthers shot 57.7 percent from the floor and 10-of-23 from 3-point range.

Suiting up for just the third time after missing the team's first seven games of the season due to injury, Mitchell came off the bench early in the first half and looked to be in midseason form, making good on four of his first five shots, with three of them coming from behind the arc.

Georgia State (7-3) returned home following a six-game stretch away from the GSU Sports Arena to remain perfect at home (3-0) and has now won four of its last five contests overall.

Chattanooga (5-6) saw its three-game winning streak snapped despite five players in double figures led by David Jean-Baptiste who scored 19 points and dished out six assists.

"I thought we moved the ball extremely well tonight and offensively played well," head coach Ron Hunter said. "However, defensively I thought we were a step slow. Credit to Chattanooga as they came in and played tough for 40 minutes."

Kane Williams scored 17 and Malik Benlevi added 14 for the Panthers in the win.

Chattanooga took a slim early lead behind strong play from Jean-Baptiste, but Georgia State stole the momentum and the lead on a Mitchell three-pointer midway through the first half and never let up, leading for the final three-quarters of the game.

Trailing 20-18, Georgia State used a 10-0 run which included a pair of Mitchell 3-pointers to build a 28-20 lead with 7:26 to play and went into the locker room leading 47-38.

The Panthers pushed the lead to as many as 16 with just over a minute to play before calling on the reserves.

Despite being outrebounded 36-33, Georgia State outscored Chattanooga 38-24 in the paint while forcing 14 turnovers which led to 16 points.

Georgia State played in front of its home crowd at GSU Sports Arena for the first time since Nov. 13. The Panthers finished its recent road trip 4-2, capped off by an incredible 21-point second half comeback against Alabama, the program's second win over a Power 5 program this year.

After Georgia State took the lead with just under 10 minutes to play, No. 24/25 Kansas State finished the game on a 21-6 run to top Georgia State 71-59 at Bramlage Coliseum.

Georgia State (7-4) took a 53-50 lead on a jumper by freshman Nelson Phillips with 9:51 to play, but Kansas State (7-2) held the Panthers to just six points the rest of the game to remain extend its home court winning streak to 27-straight non-conference games.

Phillips, who was celebrating his 20th birthday, finished with 11 points on 5-of-7 shooting in just 14 minutes off the bench. Senior Jeff Thomas led the Panthers with 13 points, including three 3-pointers, while Sun Belt Conference leading scorer D'Marcus Simonds was held to 10 points.

The Wildcats, which advanced to the Elite 8 of the NCAA Tournament last season, finished with four players in double figures led by All-Big 12 Second Team member Barry Brown who scored 21 points, going 8-of-10 from the floor and 4-of-5 from 3-point range.

Kansas State used an early 8-0 run to take an 8-2 run at the first media timeout, but the Panthers immediately responded on a jumper by Devin Mitchell, the Panthers led 11-9 with 13:35 to play.

Brown scored the first eight points of the game for the Wildcats, but picked up two quick fouls and ended the first half playing just six minutes.

Tied 15-15, Kansas State used a 10-0 run that included back-to-back 3-pointers to take a 25-15 lead with 8:41 remaining in the first half.

However on a steal and fast break lay-up by Phillips, GSU trailed 31-27 with 3:07 to play, causing K-State to call a timeout.

Thomas' 3-pointer with just seconds to play in the half sent the Panthers into the locker room trailing just 35-32, despite Georgia State shooting just 4-of-16 from beyond the arc in the opening half. The Panthers finished the game shooting an uncharacteristic 8-of-31 from 3-point range.

GSU scored the first five points of the second half to take a 37-35 lead just over a minute into the half before the Wildcats responded with a 10-0 run to take a 48-39 lead with 15:28 to play.

The Panthers responded again and tied the game 48-48 on a 3-pointer from Mitchell before taking a 51-50 lead on a trey from Phillips.

With Georgia State leading 53-50, Kansas State started its final run by using a 12-0 stretch to lead 62-53 with just over five minutes to play.

Georgia State dominated both ends of the floor, forcing 22 turnovers while hitting 14 3-pointers, en route to an 86-71 victory over UNCW Wednesday at the GSU Sports Arena.

Devin Mitchell led five different players in double-digits for Georgia State (8-4) with a season-high 23 points. Mitchell shot 8-for-14, with 6-for-10 coming from long range. Junior D'Marcus Simonds had 14 points, with nine rebounds and seven assists. Jeff Thomas added 14 points, Kane Williams had 13 on a perfect 5-for-5 shooting, and Malik Benlevi scored 11.

UNCW (4-8) was led by Jaylen Fornes with 20 points and Jeantal Cylla with 18. However the 22 turnovers by UNCW led to 31 Georgia State points.

"Really proud of our effort all around tonight," head coach Ron Hunter said. "We did really well on the offensive end to find out rhythm after a tough night at Kansas State on Saturday and I thought we kept our defensive pressure up all night. It's a great win heading into the holiday break."

Georgia State came out firing in the first half, riding a 22-3 run to a 51-33 halftime lead. The Panthers shot 10-for-18 from behind-the-arc in the first half while forcing 16 UNCW turnovers. Mitchell scored 17 of his game-high 23 points in the half to lead the Panthers.

Georgia State kept pace in the second half leading 70-45 with 9:45 to play before UNCW cut the lead to 11 with six minutes remaining. Benlevi and Thomas hit back-to-back 3-pointers to put the Panthers back up by 17 as Georgia State pulled away for the win.

Thomas' two 3-pointers tonight moved him into fifth in school history with 168 3-pointers made, passing Leonard Mendez.

Georgia State finished the game shooting 55.4 percent from the floor and 14-of-27 from 3-point range, while also shooting over 70 percent from the free throw line for the fourth consecutive game.

The Panthers topped the Seahawks for the sixth time in the last seven games and now lead the all-time series 11-9.

Georgia State has now made double-digit 3-pointers in five of its first 12 games.

Georgia State scored a season-high 117 points defeating Middle Georgia State 117-69 Saturday at GSU Sports Arena in its final game before Sun Belt Conference play begins next week. With the victory, the Panthers tied a school record with nine wins before conference play, a mark they've reached three times before, including last season.

In a dominant, record-setting performance, the Panthers made a season-high 16 3-pointers, shooting 47.1 percent (16-for-34). The team's 117 points was the fourth-most in school history and the 48-point win was the second-highest margin of victory in school history. The 69 points scored in the second half tied for the third-most in program history.

Devin Mitchell led six players in double-figures for Georgia State (9-4), scoring 21 points with a season-high seven 3-pointers. Since returning from injury, Mitchell has knocked down 21 3-pointers in the last five games.

Freshman Nelson Phillips scored a career-high 20 points off the bench, shooting 7-for-8 from the field and 5-for-6 from the free-throw line. Senior Malik Benlevi and redshirt-junior Damon Wilson contributed 16 points a piece, while junior D'Marcus Simonds scored 13 and Jeff Thomas added 11. It marked the second time this season that six Panthers have scored in double figures in the same game.

Tyrone Young scored 11 points for Middle Georgia State (7-4), the only player the Panthers allowed to score in double-figures. The Knights were held to 34.3 percent shooting and turned the ball over 21 times which led to 32 GSU points.

Middle Georgia State kept things close in the first half, leading by as many as five with 11 minutes left, but Phillips came off the bench and sparked the Panthers, scoring 10 points on 4-for-5 from the field in the half, as a 13-2 run helped the Panthers jump in front, taking a 48-37 lead into halftime.

Georgia State started the second half on a 10-0 run and never looked back, outscoring Middle Georgia State 69-32 in the half. Mitchell caught fire for the Panthers, scoring 18 of his 21 points in the second half, finishing 7-for-13 from deep.

Simonds moved into fifth on Georgia State's all-time scoring list, passing Chavelo Holmes. He now has 1,387 points, just six shy of Devonta White for fourth.
