All-Time Series: First Meeting

THE OPENING TIP (S)

⇒ On Thursday at New Mexico, UTA erased a 10-point deficit with five minutes remaining, tied the game with 5.3 seconds left on a Makaih Williams 3-pointer but the Lobos' Donovan Dent hit a buzzer-beating layup to give UNM an 82-80 win. UTA committed four technical fouls in the contest, leading directly to a 4-4 effort from the free throw line for the Lobos (two technical were offset by UNM techs). Despite the result, the performance propelled the Mavs 21 spots in the KenPom ranking from 209 to 188.

⇒ Shemar Wilson recorded a career-high-tying 29 points to go along with 11 rebounds against New Mexico for his first double-double of the year. Entering games on Saturday, Wilson is 2nd in the nation with 6.3 offensive rebounds per game. The 6-9 forward has collected six (Oral Roberts), six (UT Tyler) and seven (New Mexico) offensive rebounds already this season. The Avondale, Ariz., native finished last year 9th nationally with 3.6 offensive boards per contest.

⇒ Also entering games on Saturday, DaJuan Gordon is tied with 10 others for the national lead with three double-doubles. The New Mexico State transfer is one of only two UTA players in program history to begin his tenure with the Mavs by posting three-straight double-doubles with the other being Damon Johnson in 1994 (Nov. 26-Dec. 2). No player has ever had four-consecutive double-doubles to begin a UTA career; the last time a UTA player at any point of a career had four-straight double-doubles was Kevin Hervey in 2017 (Dec. 9-21).

⇒ Individually, Gordon ranks 3rd nationally with 13 rebounds per game, while Wilson is 9th at 11.7. As a team, UTA is 10th in both rebounds per game (49.3) and offensive (17.3).

1) UTA has had at least two players in all three games this year record double-figure rebounds. Prior to this season, the last time that occurred in any game was on Dec. 16, 2021, at Oral Roberts.

2) The Mavs shot 46% from the field and finished +9 in the rebounding column (45-36) at New Mexico, representing their only non-conference loss since 2010 when shooting at least 46% and posting at least +9 on the glass.

3) After missing the New Mexico game with an ankle injury, Freds Pauls Bagatskis is doubtful for the Arizona contest.

4) Both Wilson (29 points, 11 rebounds) and Gordon (13 points, 14 rebounds) recorded double-doubles at New Mexico to become the first UTA players since Nov. 28, 2020, to accomplish the feat.

5) UTA lost a road non-conference game on Thursday when scoring 80+ points for the first time since a 90-81 setback to Creighton on Dec. 18, 2017.

ABOUT #3 ARIZONA



⇒ This is the first meeting between UTA and Arizona.
 ⇒ With an Associated Press ranking of #3, Arizona will be the seventh all-time top-3 AP-ranked opponent for UTA. The last was #1 Kentucky on Nov. 25, 2014. UTA's only win over a nationally ranked foe came at #12 Saint Mary's on Dec. 8, 2016, by a 65-51 margin.

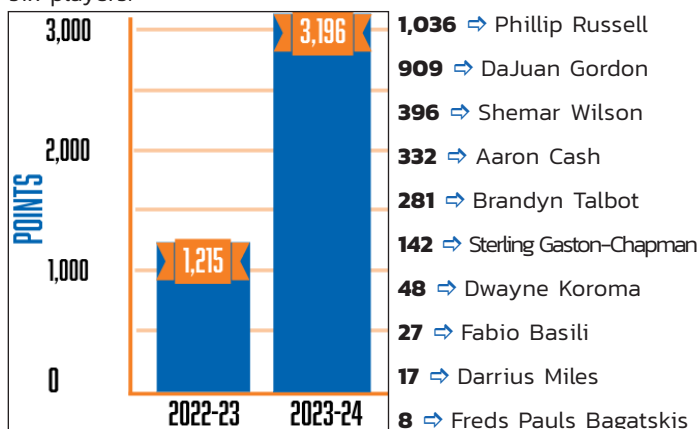
⇒ Arizona – picked to win the Pac-12 Conference in its final year before departing for the Big 12 – is off to a 4-0 start this year following a 100-68 win at home over Belmont on Friday night. The Wildcats had a preseason AP ranking of #12, but catapulted nine spots after going into Cameron Indoor Stadium last week and beating then-#2 Duke, 78-73.

⇒ Both Oumar Ballo and Caleb Love are on the Naismith Trophy National Player of the Year Preseason Watch List. The up-tempo Wildcats average 99.3 points per game, with six double-figure scorers: Keshad Johnson (14), Kylan Boswell (13.5), Love (13), Motiejus Krivas (12.5), Ball (11.8) and Pelle Larsson (11). In three home games, Arizona is averaging 106.3 points, and the Wildcats are also tied with Gonzaga for the national lead in rebound margin (+23.5).

⇒ The Wildcats went into the NCAA Tournament last year as a No. 2 seed, but were stunned by No. 15 seed Princeton. However, Arizona had a brilliant season until that point, posting 28 wins, winning the Pac-12 Tournament and being ranked in the top 20 of the national polls all season.

A WHOLE LOTTA EXPERIENCE

Including returners Shemar Wilson, Aaron Cash and Brandyn Talbot, UTA has 10 players on this year's roster who have previous Division-I playing experience. Those 10 had combined to score 3,196 D-I points entering the season. As a team last year, UTA began the season with only 1,215 D-I points across six players.



While the Mavs lost 10 of their 13 scholarship players from last year, the three returners were responsible for 31% of UTA's points and 33% of rebounds, but just 19% of assists and steals.

A KEY PIECE SITTING OUT: PHILLIP RUSSELL

- Ranked 11th in the country in free throws made (173) and 26th in total assists (174) last year.
- Tied SEMO's D-I single-game scoring record not once, but twice, with a pair of 37-point outbursts.
- As a freshman, he scored 35 points, grabbed 10 rebounds and had five steals in a game, making him only the second D-I freshman in the previous 25 years to reach 35+ points, 10+ rebounds and 5+ steals in a game. The other belongs to three-time NBA All-Star and 1st Overall NBA Draft Pick Ben Simmons when he was at LSU in 2015.

Unfortunately for UTA, the Mavs will not have one of those key new pieces as Phillip Russell will sit this year out as a result of being a two-time Division-I transfer. The NCAA has publicly cracked down significantly this year across all sports in denying nearly all two-time D-I transfers immediate eligibility, and UTA's appeal of the decision was denied.

Russell began his career as a walk-on with Saint Louis in 2020-21, playing in eight games off the bench before transferring to Southeast Missouri where spent the past two seasons. In those two years he scored 1,019 points, including an 18.1 per-game average last year in leading SEMO to the NCAA Tournament and its first Ohio Valley Conference Championship in 23 years.

He led the OVC in total points (615) and assists (174) in 2022-23, becoming only the third OVC player in the last 25 years to pace the conference in points and assists in the same season. The other two were Murray State's Ja Morant (2018-19) and Cameron Payne (2014-15). Morant was the 2020 NBA Rookie of the Year and is a two-time NBA All-Star, while Payne was the 14th overall pick in the 2015 NBA Draft and currently plays for the Milwaukee Bucks.

Russell also scored the 5th-most 'clutch' points of any player in the nation last year, tallying 79 in the last five minutes of regulation or overtime.

Seven of those 79 came in the most clutch scenario possible as he scored all of SEMO's final seven points in an 89-82 overtime victory in the OVC Tournament Final against Tennessee Tech to clinch the Redhawks' NCAA Tournament berth.

HEAD-COACHING DEBUT WIN



⇒ In his head-coaching debut, **KT Turner** earned his first win on Nov. 6 as UTA overcame an 11-point 2nd-half deficit to claim a 75-71 win over an Oral Roberts team which won 30 games and played in the NCAA Tournament a season ago.

⇒ UTA's 75 points were its most in a season opener against a Division-I opponent since notching 85 against Loyola Marymount in 2017. **Last year, UTA didn't reach 75 points in any game versus a D-I foe until Jan. 19, and only had four occurrences all year – three of which came in the last six contests.**

⇒ UTA shot just 34.8% versus ORU, and that was its worst in a win since 33.3% at Bradley on Dec. 16, 2016. Since 2010, there have now only been four games that UTA has won when shooting below 35%. **Additionally, it was the only game in the last 13 years that the Mavs won, scored at least 70 points and shot less than 35%.**

UTA's 75-71 win over Oral Roberts on Nov. 6 in Turner's head-coaching debut also gave the Mavs 800 all-time D-I victories. UTA's inaugural NCAA campaign took place in 1959-60.

UTA knocked down 17 3-pointers on Nov. 11 against UT Tyler to tie a single-game program record that had only been reached once before on Dec. 8, 2015, against Bradley.

GETTING AFTER IT ON THE GLASS

⇒ The Mavs had three players secure double-figure rebounds versus Oral Roberts: Shemar Wilson (14), DaJuan Gordon (14) and Dwayne Koroma (11). **That marked just the second time since 1990 that UTA had three players with 10+ boards in a game (2016 vs. Arkansas State).** There have only been two games in program history – both against non-DI opponents – in which four UTA players grabbed double-figure rebounds.

⇒ In total, UTA pulled down 22 offensive rebounds as part of a commanding 55-34 rebounding edge over the Golden Eagles. The 22 offensive rebounds were the most against a Division-I foe since matching that total at Texas on Dec. 1, 2015; the last time a UTA team had more offensive boards was Feb. 26, 2011, with 23 versus Northwestern State.

GORDON WAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

DaJuan Gordon was named the **Western Athletic Conference Player of the Week on Monday** after posting a pair of double-doubles in his UTA debut week, averaging 19 points, 12.5 rebounds, 3 steals and 2 assists. He is UTA's first conference Player of the Week recipient since David Azore claimed the honor on Feb. 15, 2022. Additionally, in now 2+ years in the WAC (2012-13, 2022-present), Gordon is the first Mav to garner a Player of the Week recognition as a member of the league.

MILESTONE REBOUND MARK

During his 14-rebound performance against Oral Roberts, DaJuan Gordon eclipsed 500 rebounds for his career. He entered the game needing just seven boards to reach the milestone mark, and now with 25 caroms in the past two games he boasts 532 career rebounds across stops at Kansas State, Missouri, New Mexico State and UTA.

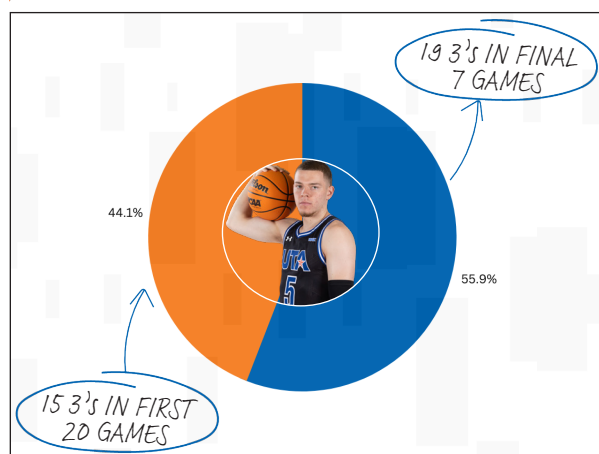
CHALLENGING NON-CONFERENCE SLATE

UTA's non-conference schedule consists of 11 games, nine of which are against Division-I opponents. Of those nine, six played in the postseason (NCAA Tournament or NIT) last year, six were ranked in the top 65 of the final NET (two in the top 10) and four won at least 28 games (two with at least 30).

UTA and Abilene Christian are the only WAC members this season who have three games scheduled with Power-5 opponents (ACU: Oklahoma State, NC State, Arkansas).

3-POINT MOMENTUM



Over the final seven games last season, Brandyn Talbot made 19 3-pointers. In his first 20 games of the year versus Division-I competition, he knocked down 15 (38 total on the year when including four 3s versus non-D-I foes).

Additionally, after shooting 23.5% from 3-point range against non-conference D-I opponents, he went 41.2% in WAC play.

Three of Talbot's four highest-scoring games of the year came during the final seven contests: 15 points in the WAC Tournament against Grand Canyon, 15 opposite Utah Tech and 12 versus Southern Utah (Feb. 23).

AGE IS JUST A NUMBER

UTA has not one, but two, of the oldest players in Division-I men's basketball this season in Aaron Cash (24; turns 25 in December) and Akili Vining (24; turns 25 in April). Cash is the 7th oldest, while Vining is the 18th oldest. UTA and BYU are the only schools in the nation with two of the 20 oldest players:

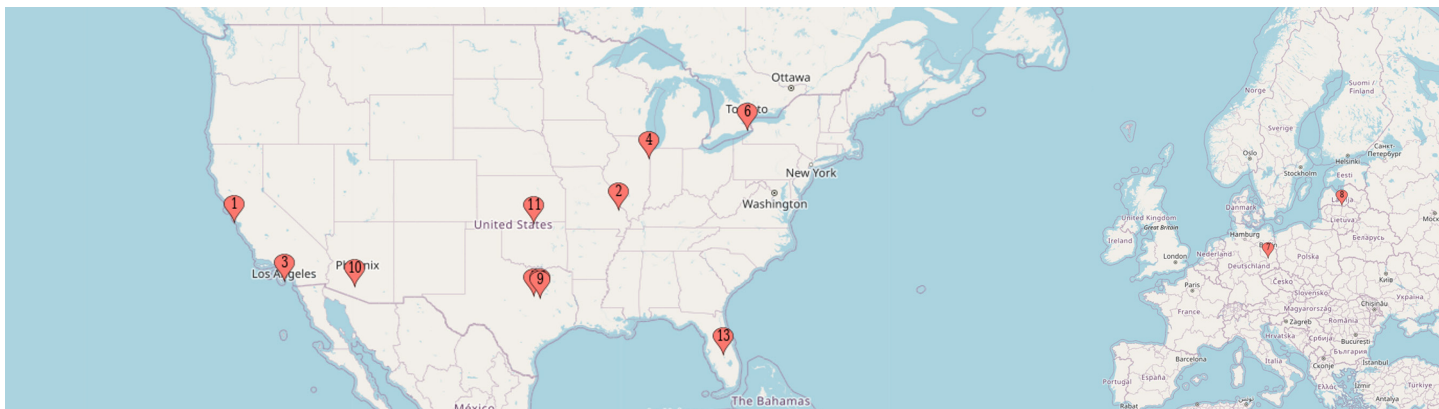

From 2015-16 to the start of this season, UTA boasts the 4th-best average annual NET/RPI ranking of all WAC members at #159. With a final ranking of #40 in 2016-17, UTA is responsible for the best single-year NET/RPI by any current WAC school over the past eight seasons. Additionally – in that same timeframe – UTA, is the only WAC institution without a single season NET/RPI above #250.

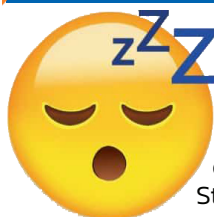

RARE OFFENSIVE GLASS PERFORMANCE

Against North Texas last season on Dec. 6, Shemar Wilson grabbed eight rebounds, and all of them were offensive. Over the last seven seasons – since the start of the 2016-17 campaign – Wilson is one of just seven players in the nation to secure at least eight offensive rebounds and zero defensive boards in a game.

While UTA was picked to finish 8th by WAC coaches in the league's preseason poll, the highly respected Field of 68 Almanac has the Mavs ranked 4th in its preseason poll behind only, in order, Grand Canyon, Stephen F. Austin and Seattle U.



Additionally, in the Field of 68 Almanac, an anonymous WAC coaches poll predicts UTA as the 'Sleeper Team' in the league.

2023 FIBA U20 EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIP



This past summer, Freds Pauls Bagatskis represented Latvia at the 2023 FIBA U20 European Championship, Division B, in Skopje, North Macedonia.

He averaged a team-high 17.3 points in only 22 minutes per game across seven contests (3-4 team record), shot 44.3% from 3-point range and made a tournament-high 27 triples.

Bagatskis scored 41 points on 10-14 from 3-point range in just 19 minutes of action in a 99-57 win against Albania on July 12. **The 41 points were the 2nd-most all-time in any Latvian national team game, and the 10 3s represented the all-time Latvian single-game record.**

Versus Finland on July 8, he scored 29 points on the strength of 8-13 from 3. At the time, those eight triples were the 2nd most in Latvian history.

SEEDING SYSTEM IS BACK

Once again this season, the WAC résumé-seeding system will determine how the eight teams at the WAC Tournament will be seeded (denoted by WAC Points in the table at the top of the page; higher point total = a better seed).

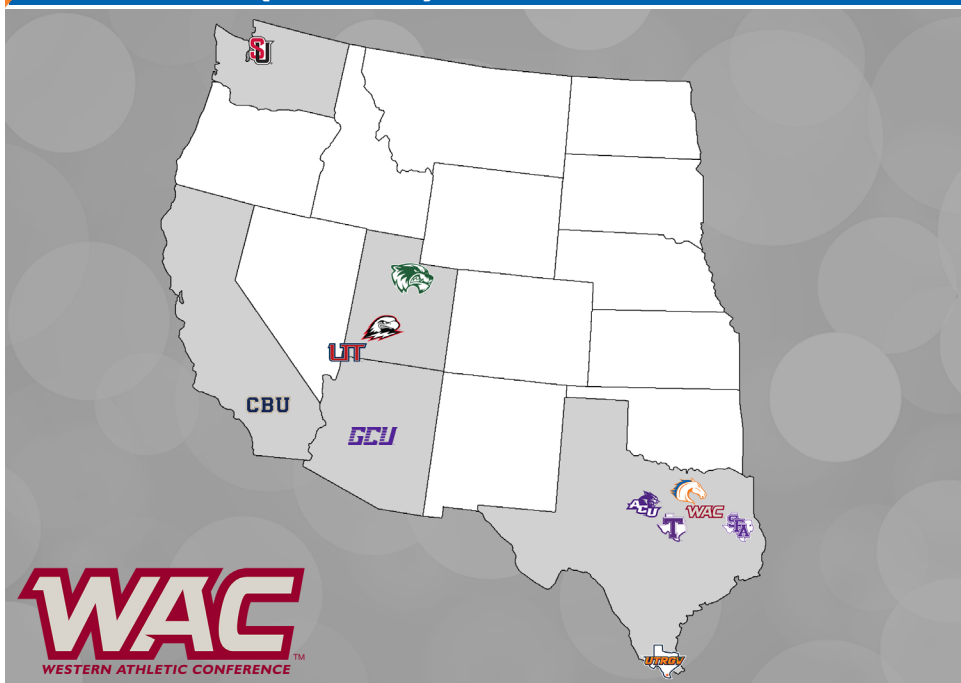
The WAC has sent at least two teams to the NCAA Tournament in 28 of the past 47 seasons. In an effort to continue enhancing its at-large prospects and protecting top seeds in March, the résumé-seeding system was introduced for the first time in 2022-23.

An algorithm will rate performance against all Division-I teams faced in the regular season, not just conference play. That will rank teams for the conference postseason tournament. Using this résumé-seeding system, teams will receive more credit for scheduling and playing stronger opponents than weaker ones. This should help the WAC have higher NET rankings, a key-criteria used by the NCAA basketball selection committees.

WAC Commissioner Brian Thornton and WAC Associate Commissioner of Basketball Drew Speraw worked with Ken Pomeroy of kenpom.com to put together the formula.

The seeding will be updated daily, and the first edition this year is scheduled to be unveiled in early December.

MAVS IN THE PROS



UTA's all-time leading rebounder (921) and 2nd-leading scorer (1,783), Kevin Hervey became the first, and to this day only, Maverick to play in an NBA game when he appeared for the Oklahoma City Thunder on Dec. 26, 2019, versus the Memphis Grizzlies.

He played in 10 games with OKC in 2019-20, including three in the COVID Bubble in Orlando, scoring an NBA career-best eight points against the Phoenix Suns on Aug. 10. An Arlington native, Hervey was drafted by the Thunder with the 57th pick in the 2nd Round in 2018. He was the 4th all-time UTA player selected in the draft and the first since the NBA reduced the number of rounds to just two in 1989. Paul Renfro

became UTA's first-ever draft pick when he was taken in the 9th round (181st overall) by the Utah Jazz in 1980. Two Mavericks were selected in 1982 – both by the Dallas Mavericks. Ralph McPherson was selected in the 9th round (188th) and Albert Culton picked in the 10th round (209th).

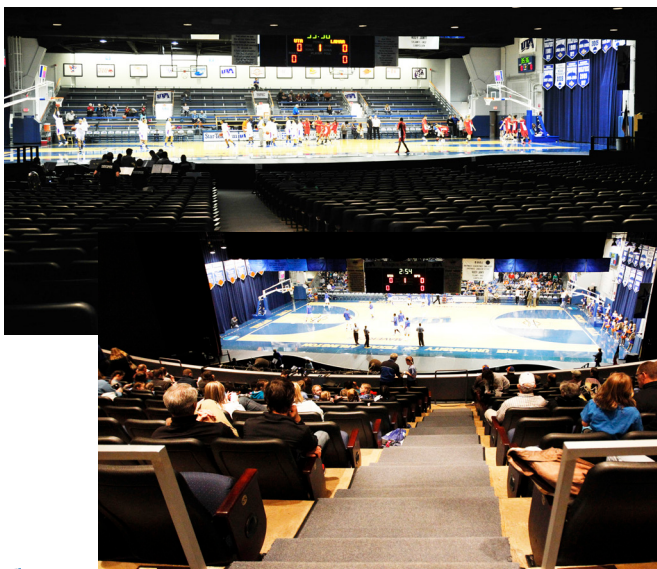


ABOUT THE CPC

The Mavericks have called the beautiful College Park Center home since the 7,000 all chair-back seat multi-purpose arena opened in 2012. The \$78 million project broke ground on March 5, 2010, and opened less than two years later. The arena is part of a 20-acre section of campus known as the College Park District, which includes a residence hall, student apartments, a 4.62 acre park, restaurants and three parking garages. The arena features 4,055 lower bowl seats, in addition to a 2,800-square-foot hospitality suite. A distinctive feature is a center hung 4-sided Daktronics LED scoreboard with an additional end zone LED display, ribbon displays and scorer's table. The lower concourse contains sports medicine facilities, two full-sized practice courts, a 2,500-sq-ft weight room, a press center, an academic support study center and coaches' office suites. In addition to UTA basketball and volleyball games, the facility hosts a variety of concerts, speaking engagements and other events. **The WNBA's Dallas Wings also call College Park Center home during their season.**



TEXAS HALL -- THE HOME BEFORE COLLEGE PARK CENTER



Prior to the College Park Center, the Mavs called Texas Hall home – which was one of most unique venues in all of college athletics. Opened on Oct. 18, 1965 – with the first-ever performer being Louis Armstrong – the initial basketball game was contested on Dec. 1 that same year against East Texas State.

The on-campus proscenium theater, which is still in use today, put the Mavs and their opponent on an elevated stage with 600 bench seats on the back of the stage and the remainder of the 4,200 capacity in theater-style seating on the other side of the court separated into a lower level and balcony section.

In 1997, Sports Illustrated named Texas Hall as "The Best Place In America To Watch College Basketball." For the final 12 years in which games were played in Texas Hall, they were contested on the floor which was used at the 1999 Men's Final Four at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Fla. **UTA accumulated a 351-222 (.613) all-time record on "The Stage" from 1965-2012.**

Mavericks

The 'Mavericks' nickname originated from one of the most influential people in Texas history: **Samuel Augustus Maverick**, a lawyer, politician, land baron and signer of the Texas Declaration of Independence. **His name was the source of the term "maverick,"** which was derived from fellow ranchers who started to refer to Maverick as "independently minded" after he refused to brand his cattle. Unbranded cattle not part of the herd became labeled as "Mavericks."

Maverick was one of the largest landholders in Texas in the 1800s, owning 340,000 acres which promoted the Washington Daily Globe in 1854 to call him "the largest landholder in the world, and by far the wealthiest citizen in Texas." He was the Mayor of San Antonio from 1839-40, and **UTA utilized the "Sam Maverick" mascot (pictured above) beginning in 1983 for 2+ decades.**



KT TURNER: UTA'S 10TH FULL-TIME HEAD COACH

A HOMECOMING OF SORTS

After playing his freshman and sophomore seasons (1997-99) at Hutchinson Community College, **Turner transferred to UTA following the 1999 fall semester and was eligible to compete for the Mavs at the conclusion of the 2000 fall semester.** However, in advance of the 2000-01 season, Turner dislocated his ankle which forced him to miss the entire year and he never suited up in a UTA uniform. He eventually transferred to Oklahoma City University for his senior campaign in 2001-02.

WHY THE NAME KT?

Turner's first name is Kenneth, but when he was playing in high school the local newspaper continuously referred to him as KT. As much as he tried to get away from it, 'it stuck with me forever' as Turner has stated. When he became a coach in the mid-2000s, he tried to re-birth the Kenneth name by referring to himself as 'Ken' Turner – including putting it on his voicemail. However, Tim Duryea – Turner's assistant coach while playing at Hutchinson, and current Boise State assistant – called and told him to keep the KT name, and the rest is history.

KT Turner was named the 10th full-time head coach in program history on Mar. 17, 2023. Turner, 45, was an assistant coach with Kentucky last year – hired by John Calipari to keep the Wildcats' Texas recruiting flowing – and that came on the heels of one season each as an associate head coach at Oklahoma and Texas.

Prior to his time in Austin, Turner spent seven years on the SMU sidelines from 2013-20, the last four of which were in an associate head coaching role. In 2012-13, Turner was an assistant coach for Wichita State, helping the Shockers post a 30-9 record and reach the Final Four – the first for the program since 1965.

Last year with UK, Turner helped guide the Wildcats to a record 60th NCAA Tournament appearance and another 20-win campaign.

OKLAHOMA & TEXAS

Turner was part of an Oklahoma program in 2021-22 under the guidance of first-year head coach Porter Moser that won 19 games and advanced to the NIT Second Round.

During his one year with Texas in 2020-21, the Longhorns amassed a 19-8 overall record, won the Big 12 Championship and earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Turner was instrumental in the development of Kai Jones, who was named the Big 12 Sixth Man of the Year.

Turner also oversaw the Longhorns' defense, which led the Big 12 in field-goal percentage defense (40.8), 3-point percentage defense (31.7), rebounds (38.4) and defensive rebounding (27.6). Additionally, he served as the acting head coach for several games during the COVID-impacted campaign.

SMU

With SMU from 2013-20, the Mustangs accumulated a 160-71 record, won a pair of American Athletic Conference regular-season titles and two AAC Tournament championships. He also helped guide the Mustangs to two NCAA Tournament appearances (2015, 2017), the NIT Final (2014) and a national ranking in the Associated Press Top 25 in four of seven seasons, climbing as high as #8 in 2015-16. Turner spent three seasons under the tutelage of Basketball Hall of Fame Coach Larry Brown before working for Tim Jankovich during his final four years.

Three times a Mustang player earned AAC Player of the Year with Turner on staff (Nic Moore in 2014-15 and 2015-16, and Semi Ojeleye in 2016-17). SMU players garnered 15 all-AAC selections, which were the most by any school in the league during that time. Turner also helped coach three NBA Draft selections in Ojeleye, Sterling Brown and Shake Milton – the brother of former UTA Lady Mav Terryn Milton, who helped lead them to the 2022 NCAA Tournament.

WICHITA STATE

During Wichita State's Final Four in 2013, the No. 9-seeded Shockers defeated Pittsburgh in the First Round and No. 1 seed Gonzaga in the Second Round to reach the Sweet 16. Once there, the Shockers knocked off upstart La Salle and No. 2 seed Ohio State to advance to the semifinals.

PLAYING CAREER

In his first two years at Hutchinson Community College (1997-99), Turner earned all-conference honors while playing under Jankovich. Turner culminated his career at Oklahoma City for his senior campaign in 2001-02, helping the Stars claim the Sooner Athletic Conference regular-season and tournament titles and advance to the NAIA quarterfinals. After earning his degree in criminal justice from Oklahoma City in 2003, Turner had a brief playing career in Italy before getting into coaching.

PERSONAL

A Cincinnati native who grew up in Manhattan, Kan., and graduated from Manhattan High School, Turner and his wife, Cassaundra, have three children: Kelis (pronounced: kuh-LEASE), Kenny and Kendra.

Turner's late father, Ken, coached at Oklahoma State, Kansas State, Cincinnati, Mississippi, South Alabama and Ohio State, in addition to stops at both the junior college and NAIA levels.
