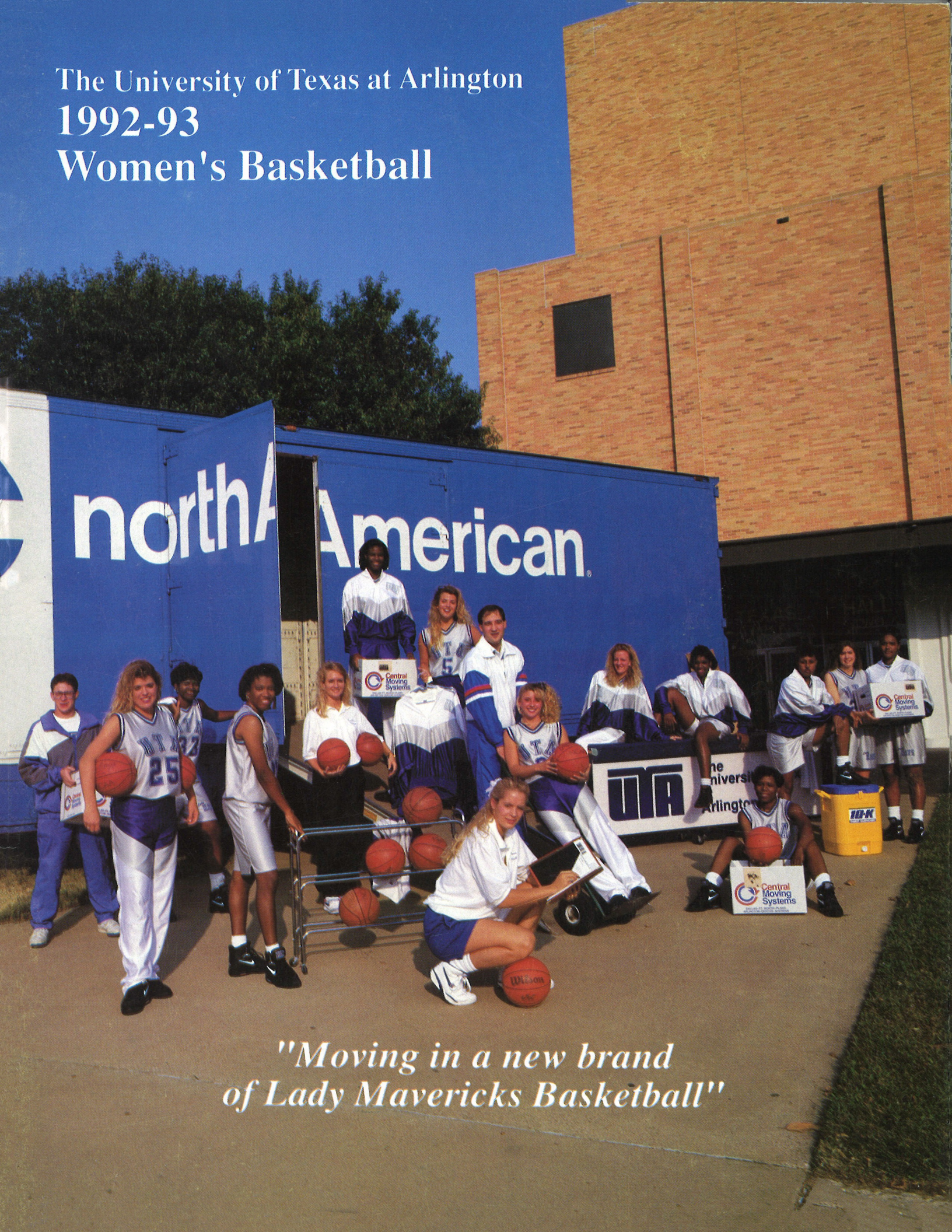
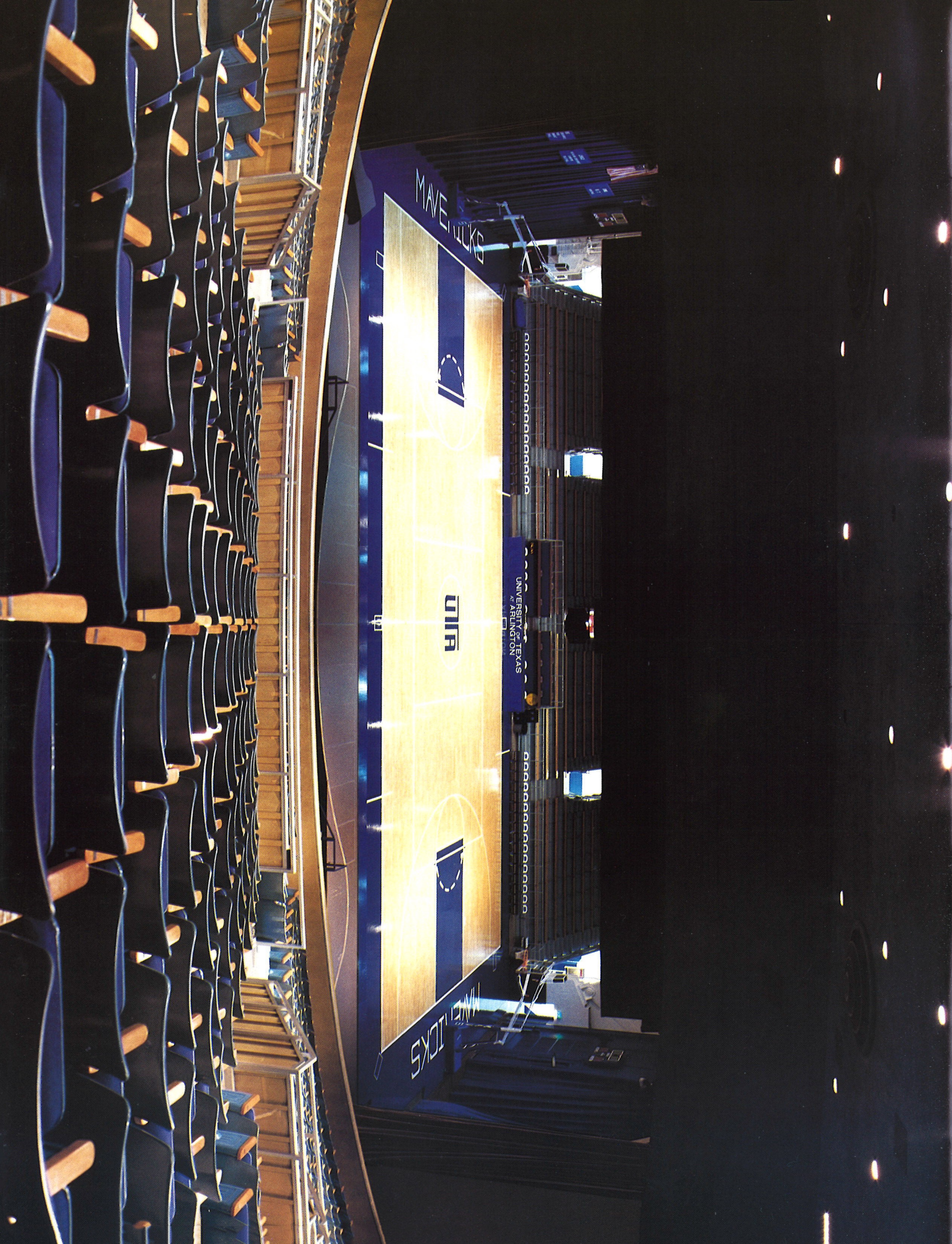

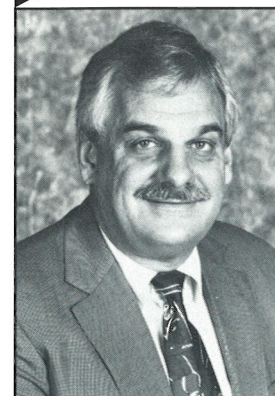

## UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT DR. RYAN C. AMACHER



Dr. Ryan C. Amacher became the fourth president in the history of The University of Texas at Arlington in July.

He takes the helm of the fifth largest university in Texas as it continues to expand its role as a major, comprehensive teaching, research and public service institution.

Appointed by the board of regents of the world-renowned University of Texas system, Amacher, 46, is the chief administrative officer for the U.T. Arlington campus community of some 4,000 faculty and staff and more than 25,000 students.

He received his bachelor of arts degree in economics in

1967 from Ripon College in Wisconsin and his Ph. D. in economics from the University of Virginia in 1971.

He is the former dean of the College of Commerce and Industry at Clemson University and a former senior international economist for the U.S. Treasury, Amacher has also served as chairman of the department of economics at Arizona State University, a professor of economics at the University of Oklahoma and an economist for General Electric's TEMPO Center for Advanced Studies.

He has authored or edited 10 books, including two text on micro- and macro-economics.

Amacher views intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the university experience. "Athletics is a very important rallying point for students and can be an image-enhancer," Amacher says.

Amacher and his wife, Susan, are avid snow skiers and also raise horses at their home in Arlington.

## ATHLETIC DIRECTOR B.J. SKELTON

B.J. Skelton, former vice provost and dean of admissions and registration at Clemson University, was named director of athletics at The University of Texas at Arlington on Oct. 27, 1992 and assumed his duties at UTA in January of 1993.

"B.J. Skelton has significant experience in not only NCAA matters but also has been a part of some very successful fund-raising programs and high-level intercollegiate athletics," said UTA President Ryan Amacher.

Dr. Skelton has worked with the NCAA since 1982 and is currently secretary-treasurer of its board. He was also Clemson's NCAA faculty representative.

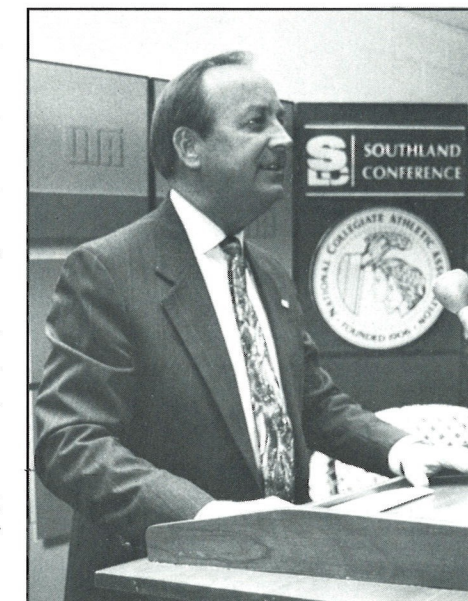
He has served on numerous NCAA committees, including Minority Opportunities in Intercollegiate Athletics and the Revenue Distribution Committee.

Skelton earned his bachelor and master of science degrees at Clemson and his Ph.D. from Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

Prior to joining the UTA staff, he was responsible for the admissions, registrar and financial aid offices and the student data base at Clemson.

He has also been appointed by South Carolina Gov. Dick Riley to the committee on financial excellence in public education that developed the South Carolina Education Improvement Act of 1984. In addition, he was a member of South Carolina Gov. James Edwards' committee for equitable financing of public education.

His community service experiences in South Carolina include terms as president of the South Carolina School Boards Association and chairman of the board of trustees of Pickens County schools.



# HEAD COACH MIKE DEAN

Mike Dean enters his first year as head coach of the Lady Mavericks after helping lead Arkansas State University to a 25-7 record and a third place finish in the National Women's Invitational Tournament during the 1991-92 season.

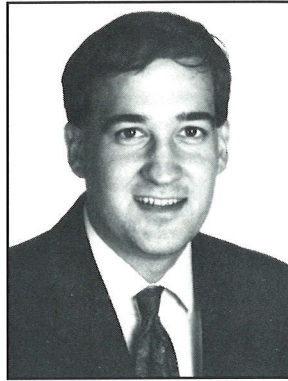
Dean, who becomes the sixth head coach in the 20-year history of the UTA women's basketball team, has served as the lone assistant coach and primary recruiter at Arkansas State since 1988. While at ASU, Dean played a key role in the development of a program that has seen the Indians' program improve from a 14-13 record in his first year, to a 19-9 mark in 1990-91, to last year's school record 25 wins, while maintaining strong academic integrity. Arkansas State also finished second to Western Kentucky University in last year's Sunbelt Conference Post-Season Tournament.

Dean began his career in coaching in 1984 as a student assistant coach at his alma mater, Ouachita Baptist University. In 1986, shortly after earning his Bachelor's degree, Dean became a graduate assistant coach for the men's team at Arkansas Tech University. A year later he was named head basketball coach at Parkin (Ark.) High School before moving back to the collegiate ranks at Arkansas State.

"It is my pleasure to welcome a coach who joins with the UTA philosophy of being able to attract quality students to a program that has seen tremendous improvement over the past three years," said Interim Athletic Director Pete Carlon after announcing Dean's appointment on June 24. "Mike gives us an enthusiastic leader who has proven experience on the NCAA Division I level."

Dean takes over a program that is coming off its winningest season in a decade. Last year, the Lady Mavericks posted an 18-11 overall record and collected their first ever win in a Southland Conference Tournament.

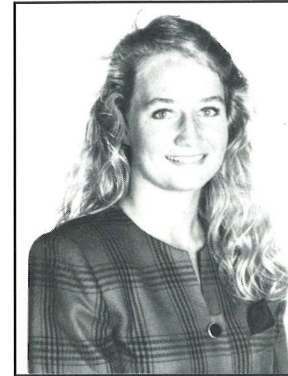

# ASSISTANT COACH HOLLY DAVIS

First-year assistant coach Holly Davis will get her first taste of coaching on the collegiate level after an extremely successful playing career at Arkansas State University. Davis, a guard, led ASU to a third place finish in the 1992 National Women's Invitational Tournament.

The native of Imboden, Ark., Davis transferred to ASU from Arkansas Tech. University where she led the Golden Suns to the Final Four of the NAIA National Tournament in both her freshman and sophomore seasons.

Last year, at Arkansas State, she led the Lady Indians to a 25-7 record, a second place finish in the Sun Belt Conference Post-Season Tournament and a bronze medal at the NWIT.

A former All-Stater from Sloan-Hendrix High School, Davis capped her prep career by leading SHHS to a 33-3 record and a second place finish in the Arkansas State Tournament. Individually, she was selected the tournament's most valuable player and tabbed to the All-Star team. A two-sport athlete, Davis also earned All-State recognition in track.

Davis completed her Bachelor of Science degree in physical education at Arkansas State in December of 1991.

# GRADUATE ASSISTANT COACH CHRISTI ENSZ

A two-year letter-winner, Christi Ensz trades in her basketball shoes for a spot on the UTA sidelines as Head Coach Mike Dean's graduate assistant coach.

Ensz is a native of Inman, Kansas. Prior to transferring to UTA, she played two years at Barton County Community College for Coach Jerry McCarty. While attending BCCC, Ensz played both volleyball and basketball. Her Barton County basketball squad finished fourth in the 1990 Junior College National Tournament. Ensz earned numerous basketball honors at BCCC including first team all-conference recognition and honorable mention on the nationals all-tourney team. In volleyball, she was awarded all-conference and all-region honors. Her 1988 volleyball squad finished fifth in the nation. In 1989, the team finished second.

As a senior at UTA, Ensz played in all 29 games, starting 24. Her 10.6 points per game was third on the team and included a career-high 22 point performance against Cincinnati. She also scored 19 points against Nevada-Reno and 18 against Oklahoma.

The 5-9 guard was second on the team in three-point percentage, hitting 40 percent. Ensz was second on the Lady Mavs squad in rebounding, pulling down 6.9 per game. She snagged a career-high 12 rebounds against Northwestern State and also posted 11 against Southwest Texas State, Southern Methodist, Cincinnati and Vanderbilt. She ended her UTA career ranked 20th on the all-time scoring list with 478 points.

Ensz was lethal from the free throw line, nailing 96 of 124 attempts for a team-high 77.4 percent. She finished fourth in Southland Conference free throw shooting percentage.

Ensz is completing work on her exercise and sport studies degree at UTA.

The exercise and sport studies major hopes to work as an athletic trainer in a 5A school district in the near future. She is the daughter of Pete and Christine Gonzalez.



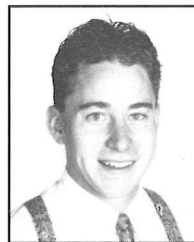
### Trainer - Brandon Lawshe

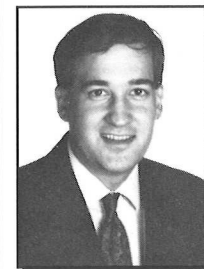
The 1989 graduate of Lake Country Christian High School in Ft. Worth participated in basketball, track, tennis and volleyball. He received the LCC spirit award twice.

Lawshe is a Ft. Worth native. He is the son of Gayland and Susan Lawshe.

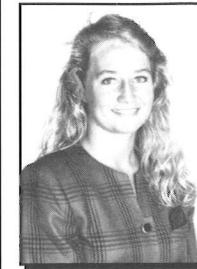

A new wave of Lady Mavericks basketball will roll into Texas Hall for the 1992-93 season as first year Head Coach Mike Dean welcomes eight new faces to The University of Texas at Arlington. Last year's squad posted their winningest season in a decade, recording an 18-11 overall mark and a fourth place finish in the Southland Conference. The Movin Mavs also notched their first ever SLC conference tournament victory.

According to Dean, Maverick fans can expect to see a lot of changes this season, including a very controlled, press-free offense. "I expect that 99 percent of the time we are on the floor, we will play a half-court, man-to-man system," says Dean. "We won't press unless it's absolutely necessary."

The Lady Mavs will look to senior Lisa Walker (Garland/Lakeview Centennial) and junior Kim Pruitt (Bloomington/Bloomington) for leadership. Walker was the team's second leading scorer last season, averaging 13.2 per game. She was also the team's second most accurate shooter from the field, nailing 46.6% of her 298 attempts. On the boards, Walker was good for 6.4 rebounds per contest. Pruitt tossed in seven points per game and was fourth in assists (38) and blocks (10). The 5-9 guard currently ranks 14th on the Mavs Top 20 All-Time Leading Scorers List.

Key returning seniors Tamara Zackery (Weleetka, Okla./Weleetka) and Dawn McGary (Omaha, Neb./Benson) will also play important roles. Zackery scored 4.7 points per game and dished out 30 assists, while McGary was good for 3.3 points per game and 17 assists. According to Dean, the duo's ability to get the ball inside to Walker and Pruitt will play a major role in the success of the team's offense.

"Don't expect every player to score 15 points per game," says Dean. "I'm very big on roles. The bottom line is that we must get our shooters open. Lisa and Kim both have the potential to score 18 points per night, and we will expect that from them."

The Lady Mavs will field a relatively small team during the 1992-93 campaign as only three players break the six-foot barrier. Dean, along with first-year assistant

coaches Holly Davis and Christi Ensz expect big contributions from the new talent.

Dean feels that quickness is more important than size in a basketball player. Because of the Lady Mavs new half-court system, taller opponents will be forced to come out from under the basket to guard UTA shooters. According to Dean, this will create more fouls.

The 1991-92 Mavs set UT-Arlington season records for most free throws made (524) and attempted (779). Despite that, the Lady Mavs coaching staff wants more shots taken from the line this season and more accurate shooting. The squad sank 67.3% of their shots from the charity stripe last year.

"Little things become big things," says Dean. "Free throw shooting fits that category. We will spend a lot of practice time at the line."

# SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE

The Southland Conference is comprised of six Texas and four Louisiana universities, all competing at the NCAA Division I level.

Weaving itself into the very fabric of Texas and Louisiana, the Southland Conference's 1991 expansion from eight to ten universities finds league institutions surrounding the major metropolitan cities of Dallas/Ft. Worth, Shreveport, Austin, Houston, San Antonio and New Orleans. While surrounding these major media and professional sports markets, however, nearly every Southland Conference university is nestled within its own smaller, more intimate community.

In 29 years Southland Conference institutions have sent numerous student-athletes on to professional athletic careers, while presenting millions with undergraduate and graduate degrees to help guide their careers in a variety of distinguished professions.

Most notably in the professional sports, McNeese State sent Joe Dumars to the National Basketball Association, North Texas shipped Mean Joe Greene to the National Football League and Northeast Louisiana placed Chuck Finley with Major League Baseball.

In the coaching ranks, Stephen F. Austin State graduate Bum Phillips coached the Houston Oilers and New Orleans Saints before taking on Oiler color analysis duties. Another SFA grad, Nacogdoches native Don Gaston is president of the Boston Celtics.

Northwestern State's Mark Duper and Bobby Hebert, Nicholls State's Mark Carrier, Texas-Arlington's Tim McKyer, McNeese State's Leonard Smith, Southwest Texas' Ricky Sanders and Northeast Louisiana's Bubby Brister have all made a major impact in the NFL.

In the NBA, Northeast Louisiana's Calvin Natt and Texas-San Antonio's Derrick Gervin both started their careers with the New Jersey Nets. Natt played for Portland and Denver before landing with the Indiana Pacers. Gervin completed an outstanding rookie year with the Nets before sitting out on injured reserve. Southland Conference institutions have propelled numerous students on to distinguished media careers. The most noted include news anchorman Dan Rather, a graduate of Sam Houston State and ESPN sportscaster Tim Brando, who attended Northeast Louisiana. *The Wall Street Journal's* London bureau is home to Ken Wells, who earned his undergraduate degree at Nicholls State.

Politically, Lyndon B. Johnson was a Southwest Texas State graduate, while several SLC schools boast alumni in the U.S. Congress and Senate, as well as high ranking officials in the U.S. Armed Forces.

Northwestern State counts two prominent graduates in the entertainment field. Playwright Robert Harling won national acclaim for the 1989 hit *Steel Magnolias*, filmed in his hometown of Natchitoches. Among the entertainment writers who visited the town during filming was noted critic Rex Reed, also a Natchitoches native and a product of Northwestern State.

The conference promotes academic achievement through the recognition of an outstanding male and female athlete from each university, culminating in the naming of one male and one female Southland Conference Scholar Athlete of the Year. Also established to honor outstanding work in the classroom, the league sponsors two postgraduate scholarships. While earning their valuable college degrees, Southland Conference student-athletes also earned accolades on the athletics fields and courts.

Seeds for the creation of the conference were planted by administrators representing five institutions when they gathered for the first time in 1963. Those institutions were Abilene Christian College, Arkansas State College, Lamar State College of Technology, Trinity University and Arlington State College.

Since those early years, the league has changed dramatically with some 16 institutions having been part of what is now the Southland Conference.

# ARLINGTON, TEXAS

One of the fastest growing cities in the nation, Arlington's population has risen to 250,000. Coinciding with industrial and retail growth, the population has increased twenty-fold since 1950 and more than tripled since 1960. It is now the eighth largest city in Texas and ranks 70th among cities across the nation.

Six Flags Over Texas, located on the northeast side of the city, is the number one tourist attraction in the state. The multimillion dollar, 150-acre family amusement park draws more than two million visitors annually to Arlington. Guests of the park are treated to over 100 sophisticated rides, shows and other attractions.

Major league baseball came to Arlington in 1972 when the Texas Rangers were formed. Top industry in the city is the General Motors plant, which opened in 1954. The city also has its own water supply as work was completed on Lake Arlington in 1957. One of the newest attractions in Arlington is Wet 'n' Wild, a water amusement park.

The city was officially registered in 1877, receiving its name in honor of the Virginia hometown of Confederate hero Robert E. Lee. In the early 1890's, Arlington became a tourist attraction, extolling the virtues of mineral water as a huge well was built in the center of town - now the intersection of Main and Center streets.

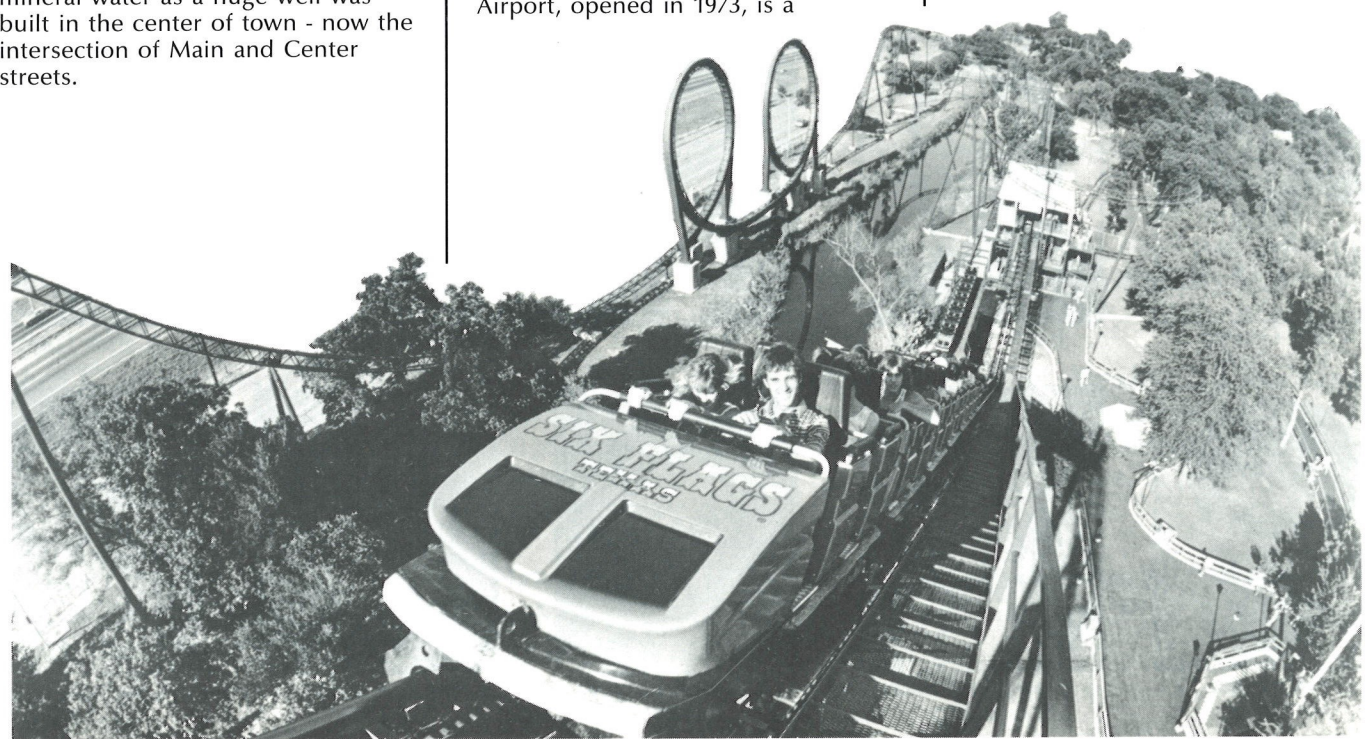

Major league professional sports abounds in the Dallas-Fort Worth area which surrounds Arlington. They include Dallas Cowboys football, Dallas Mavericks basketball and Dallas Sidekicks soccer.

The Dallas-Fort Worth Regional Airport, opened in 1973, is a

15-minute drive from Arlington. The 180,000-acre tract is the largest airport in the nation and the fifth busiest. Two local newspapers service the city in addition to one Fort Worth and two Dallas newspapers.

The Activities Building offers complete weight rooms, gymnastic areas, racquetball courts and Saunas. The University Center facilities include a bowling alley, a billiards area and a 500-seat theater which presents concerts, student performances and films.
