The Mocs could not hold on to a 14-0 first-half lead and fell to Carson-Newman 29-17 in the season opener. UTC quarterback Antonio Miller scored on two rushing touchdowns in the second quarter, the second coming at 11:27 of the second period, to give UTC a 14-0 cushion. The Eagles kicked a field goal right before halftime, then scored 19 consecutive points to produce their first win over a higher division team since the 2003. Carson-Newman outrushed the Mocs 202 yards to 54. The Eagles compiled 428 total yards while UTC picked up 209. After a scoreless first quarter, Miller capitalized on a 36-yard pass to receiver Blue Cooper and got UTC on the scoreboard with an impressive 10-yard touchdown run on the first play of the second quarter. Craig Camay's extra point gave UTC a 7-0 lead. Charles Profit's fumble recovery at the Eagle 31-yard line led to Miller's second scoring run, a two-yarder just over three minutes later. The half ended with Carson-Newman traveling 63 yards on 11 plays to kick a 25-yard field goal by Aubrey Ingham with 27 seconds remaining. The Eagles held UTC to just 41 yards in the second half. Miller was intercepted by Eric Rice in the third quarter and injured his patella making a touchdown-saving tackle. Carson-Newman cut the margin to 14-3 four plays later with a 23-yard Ingham field goal at 10:59 in the third period. An Alex Good 40-yard pass play to Otis Miller set up Buck Wakefield's six-yard touchdown run at 8:16, but a two-point conversion try failed, leaving UTC with a 14-12 edge. Carson-Newman took its first lead with 35 seconds left in the third on a 21-yard Ingham field goal and pushed the margin to 22-14 on a Good-to-Mo Whitten nine-yard scoring pass with 9:50 to play. Backup quarterbacks Cody Romans and Tony Pastore guided UTC for 10 plays and into field goal range on the next possession, and Craig Camay converted his first career field goal attempt, a 46-yarder, at 6:31. The Eagles put the game out of reach on the ensuing series with an eight-yard Good touchdown run with 2:42 to play. Good led all rushers with 56 yards on eight carries. Wakefield chipped in with 48 yards on 13 rushes. Good and starter Alex Rouse each completed 6-of-10 pass attempts. Rouse threw for 121 yards and Good added 105 through the air. Miller was the Eagles' top pass catcher with five for 99 yards. Miller was UTC's leading ground gainer with 30 yards on six totes. Erroll Wynn picked up 27 yards on 12 carries. Miller completed 12-of-19 passes for 123 yards and one interception. Pastore went 4-for-11 for 32 yards, while Romans was 0-for-7. Cooper set career highs with seven catches for 83 yards. Matthew Angeloni hauled in three for 36 yards. UTC safety Chris Camacho registered his second career double-digit tackle game with a game-high 11 hits. Safety Jeff Phillips and linebacker Steven Smigelsky added eight apiece. Senior linebacker Chris Johnson left the game in the first quarter with a dislocated shoulder.

Jacksonville State scored 23 points off five UTC turnovers. The Mocs seemed in control at the start of the third quarter, leading 16-6. UTC took the second-half kickoff and drove to the JSU five-yard line. On a third-and-goal play, a deflected Tony Pastore pass was intercepted by Drew Robinson, thwarting a possible UTC scoring drive. Robinson took the ball to the UTC 37-yard line, and kicker Gavin Hallford capitalized on the turnover, kicking the third of his four field goals at 8:10 of the third quarter to trim JSU's deficit to 16-9. JSU tied the score at 16-16 two series later. Pastore was sacked by Brent Davenport and fumbled the ball at the UTC five-yard line. Marquise Elston scooped up the ball and scored, and Hallford's extra point tied the game with 2:41 left in the third quarter. UTC's final lead came four minutes into the final period. Kicker Craig Camay tied a school single-game record with his fourth field goal. His 28-yarder gave UTC its last lead, 19-16. JSU put the game away in the fourth quarter. Quarterback Cedric Johnson hit Derrick Harris on a 28-yard touchdown pass to push JSU ahead for good, 23-19 with 7:30 to play. Pastore was intercepted on consecutive UTC series following JSU's touchdown. Hallford tied his own school record with his fourth field goal with 3:17 remaining. Robinson intercepted another pass, this one he returned 45 yards for a score and the final margin, 33-19. UTC scored 16 unanswered points in the second quarter to take a 16-6 halftime lead. Camay booted field goals of 39, 22 and 36 yards, the third coming at the halftime horn. Receiver Clint Woods scored UTC's first TD, taking a short pass from Pastore and racing 63 yards down the left side of the field for a 10-6 lead at 4:29 of the second quarter. The touchdown was the first career passing score for Pastore and the first career receiving TD for Woods. Playing in place of injured senior quarterback Antonio Miller, Pastore was making his first collegiate start. JSU jumped out to a 6-0 lead with two field goals in the first quarter. Hallford connected from 29 and 33 yards for the only scoring in the opening period. UTC back Erroll Wynn led all runners with 89 yards on a career-best 29 carries. Bryan Fitzgerald chipped in with 43 yards on nine rushes. Pastore threw for 171 yards, completing 10-of-19 pass attempts with one TD and four interceptions. Blue Cooper had 80 receiving yards on five catches. Johnson totaled 159 passing yards, completing 12-of-17 attempts with a touchdown and an interception. Senior safety Jeff Phillips picked off Johnson from a deflected pass in the second quarter. Daniel Jackson was JSU's top runner with 50 yards on 15 carries. Maurice Dupree caught three balls for 36 yards, and Eric Johns had three catches for 19 yards. Despite a torn labrum, UTC linebacker Chris Johnson tied his career high with 11 tackles to lead all defenders. Sophomore Joseph Thornton collected eight stops, four of which were behind the line.

Receiver Thomas Hinton caught a 25-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Antonio Miller on the Mocs' second play from scrimmage in overtime. On Georgia Southern's overtime possession, quarterback Jayson Foster's pass on fourth-down-and-nine sailed over the intended receiver's head, ending the game. UTC edged GSU 27-26 last year in Chattanooga on a last-second field goal. This win marked the first time UTC has notched back-to-back wins over GSU. UTC took a 38-31 lead with 3:32 to play when back Erroll Wynn took a Statue-of-Liberty play around right end for a 19-yard touchdown. It was Wynn's second score of the game, and he finished with 125 yards on 27 carries. GSU ran the ensuing kickoff 32 yards to the UTC 42-yard line. Foster converted a third-and-eight play with a 16-yard run, and back Mike Hamilton scored from three yards away with 1:17 to play. The extra point kick would eventually cause the game to go into overtime. UTC owned a 17-14 halftime lead on the strength of 17 consecutive points. GSU scored on its opening possession of the game. Foster raced through the left side of the defense for a 36-yard touchdown, putting GSU on the scoreboard, 7-0 at 10:43 of the opening quarter. UTC answered and tied the score six minutes later. Miller and Blue Cooper connected on a 38-yard pass play to get the Mocs to the GSU 16-yard line. Six plays later, Erroll Wynn scored his first touchdown of the season, ramming it in from two yards out. UTC capitalized on an Edward Sawyer interception of a Foster pass deep in GSU territory as Miller hit Matthew Angeloni on a 20-yard touchdown pass with 57 seconds remaining in the first quarter. Kicker Craig Camay booted a 25-yard field goal at 9:00 of the second quarter to push the UTC advantage to 17-7. Mike Hamilton's three-yard touchdown run 6:07 before halftime provided the three-point halftime margin. GSU grabbed a 28-17 lead on its first two second-half possessions. Foster, who ran for 210 yards, his third 200-yard rushing game in as many outings, scored on a 60-yard jaunt at 12:57 and from 14 yards out at 10:11. UTC answered with back-to-back TDs. Miller found Blue Cooper in the end zone for a five-yard score at 6:23 of the third quarter, and safety Jeff Phillips scooped up a Foster fumble and raced 63 yards with 1:38 left in the period for a 31-28 edge. Foster accounted for 330 total yards of offense, including 120 on 17-of-20 passing. UTC only committed two penalties and did not turn the ball over. Tory Cooper rushed for 84 yards and four touchdowns for The Citadel, and quarterback Duran Lawson threw for 221 yards and ran for 108. The Bulldogs took control of the game early, scoring the first 14 points of the game. Cooper capped off a 51-yard drive, going four yards up the middle at 9:06 for his first touchdown on the game's opening possession. After The Citadel blocked a UTC punt, it took advantage of good field position on UTC's 34-yard line. Cooper found the end zone again from one yard out with 39 seconds to play in the first quarter, for a 14-0 lead. UTC's offense struck just before the half when quarterback Antonio Miller connected with tight end Joseph Pitman on a 21-yard touchdown pass to trim the deficit to 14-7 with 2:32 to play in the first half. The Citadel responded quickly, capitalizing off of a UTC turnover at the Mocs' three-yard line when Miller was sacked and fumbled. One play later Cooper registered his third TD from three yards out to make it 21-7 with 49 seconds left in the first half. The Arkansas running back tandem of Darren McFadden and Felix Jones combined to rush for 263 yards in Little Rock, Ark. McFadden, who needed 153 yards to become the school's all-time leading rusher, was held to a season low by the Mocs, 122 yards on 25 carries. Jones ended up with the better total with 141 yards on 13 carries while scoring two touchdowns. UTC back Bryan Fitzgerald beat McFadden's total by one yard. The second-string tailback earned his first career 100-yard game with 123 yards on 14 rushes. He scored on an exciting 65-yard touchdown run right up the middle of the Arkansas defense. Fitzgerald's scoring run came at 1:49 of the third quarter and sliced Arkansas' lead to 24-15. UTC went for the two-point conversion, but the pass play failed. Arkansas added a one-yard Jones touchdown run with 13:43 to play and a 32-yard Alex Tejada field goal at the 10:39 mark of the fourth quarter for the final margin. UTC enjoyed a short-lived lead in the first quarter. Arkansas snapped the ball over the quarterback's head on the first play of the game and fell on it in the end zone for a safety and a 2-0 UTC lead. It was the second safety for UTC in as many weeks. McFadden gave Arkansas the lead on a two-yard touchdown run with 8:43 left in the first quarter. Fullback Peyton Hillis hauled in a 24-yard pass from Casey Dick to push the margin to 14-2 at 1:40 of the opening period. UTC cut the deficit to 14-9 at 7:28 of the second quarter as quarterback Antonio Miller hit fullback Brent Hayes with a three-yard touchdown pass. It was Miller's sixth TD toss in the last three games. Arkansas tacked on a 47-yard Tejada field goal right before the half, and it owned a 17-9 halftime lead. Miller finished the game completing 4-of-22 pass attempts for 11 yards. He threw one interception while also gaining 32 yards on five rushes. Back Erroll Wynn picked up 32 yards on 19 carries. McFadden and Jones ran for over 100 yards in the same game for the eighth time. Quarterback Casie Dick was 12-for-22 passing for 116 yards and one touchdown. UTC linebacker Joseph Thornton picked off a Dick pass. UTC safety Chris Camacho set a career high with 18 tackles on the night. Linebacker Chris Johnson added 14, and Steven Mills compiled seven.

UTC quarterback Antonio Miller ran for a touchdown, threw a touchdown pass and caught a touchdown pass to lead the Mocs. Miller caught a 35-yard touchdown pass from receiver Blue Cooper, scored on a one-yard run in the first quarter and connected with wideout Clint Woods on a 59-yard pass play in the third. UTC tailback Bryan Fitzgerald rushed for a career-high 174-yards, his second straight 100-yard game, and Cooper completed both his pass attempts for touchdowns. UTC shut out the Cats in the first half, 25-0, marking the first time since October 25, 2003, that UTC had accomplished that feat. UTC took control of the game early, scoring on its first four drives to take a 23-0 lead at the 10:58 mark of the second quarter. Following a 41-yard field goal by Craig Camay, linebacker Joseph Thornton set up UTC's next scoring drive with his first of two interceptions of the night, stepping in front of an Adam Hearn's pass. Following a play for loss at the WCU 33-yard line, Cooper took the ball on a trick play and found Miller on a flea-flicker for a 35-yard TD pass to go up 10-0 with 6:25 left in the first quarter. Fitzgerald went 79 yards on the second play from scrimmage down to the WCU one-yard line. Miller ran it in on the next play to extend UTC's lead to 16-0 after a failed extra point. With 10:58 to play in the first half, Cooper struck again as he capped off a 75-yard drive with a 10-yard touchdown pass to tight end Joseph Pittman on a fake field goal for a 23-0 score. Safety Chris Camacho closed out the first half scoring, forcing a safety at the 6:35 mark and a 25-0 lead. It was UTC's third straight game registering a safety. The Cats got on the board at the start of the second half as safety Angelo Brown recovered a blocked punt and returned it 27 yards for a TD and a 25-7 score. UTC wasted little time regaining its 25-point advantage as Miller connected with Woods twice on the next possession, including a 59-yard catch and run at 10:49 of the third quarter for a 32-7 lead. WCU answered back as Hearn found wideout Eddie Cohen for a 39-yard touchdown pass with 8:43 left in the third quarter. WCU added a four-yard TD run by tailback Willie Harper with 1:00 left in the third to close to within 32-21. UTC's defense, which registered eight sacks on the day, stopped any comeback hopes the Cats had in the fourth quarter. Thornton picked off his second pass at the WCU 43-yard line and returned it 42 yards to the one. Erroll Wynn provided the final margin with a TD run on the next play with 8:35 left. Miller completed 9-of-16 passes for 124 yards. Woods led UTC's receivers with four catches for 90 yards and a touchdown. Hearn finished with 265 yards passing and one touchdown, connecting on 17-of-40 attempts. Cohen led all receivers with 109 yards on six catches, his third straight game with at least 100 yards receiving. Camacho, the league's leading tackler, led the Mocs with 11 hits. Two of linebacker Chris Johnson's four tackles were quarterback sacks, while the defense kept the Cats to just 12 rushing yards.

Furman quarterback Renaldo Gray completed 14-of-23 passes for 146 yards and two touchdowns and wideout Patrick Sprague caught five balls for 75 yards and a score. After an 18-yard field goal by UTC's Spencer Nolen put the Mocs ahead 22-20 with 5:15 to play, Furman capitalized on a squib kick on the ensuing kickoff, taking the ball to the UTC 48-yard line. Six plays later and facing third-and-10, Gray found Sprague for a key 12-yard reception to the UTC 25-yard line. Three plays later, Gray took a 16-yard quarterback keeper to the three-yard line, setting up a one-yard plunge by fullback Jerome Felton which put Furman on top, 26-22 with 1:25 to go. A successful two-point conversion pushed the margin to 28-22. UTC had a last series for a comeback attempt. On the first play, Antonio Miller's pass attempt was deflected and intercepted on the sideline by Furman cornerback Austin Holmes. In the first half, Furman opened the scoring as senior kicker Scott Beckler converted on a 29-yard field goal at the 9:28 mark before UTC knotted the score at 3-3 on a 43-yard field goal by Nolen with 6:32 to play in the first. An interception by cornerback Brandon Golder on Furman's next series set up UTC at the Furman 42-yard line. It took only four plays before Miller, on fourth-and-one, found wideout Blue Cooper for an 18-yard touchdown. A failed extra point had UTC with a 9-3 lead with 4:31 to play in the first quarter. Gray led Furman on a nine-play, 65-yard drive that culminated with a six-yard TD pass to tight end Larry Hedden with 14:53 to go in the first half. Back on top 10-9, Furman's defense forced a UTC punt on the ensuing drive but could do nothing on the offensive side. Jordan Hazard fielded the ensuing punt at the 12-yard line and ran it back 88 yards for the longest punt return in school history and put UTC back on top, 16-10. Patrick Sprague accounted for 61 of Furman's 80 yards on the next drive, including a key 39-yard catch that took the ball into UTC territory and the go-ahead 13-yard touchdown grab. That score put Furman ahead 17-16 with 1:34 remaining in the first half and would take the two teams into the half. UTC opened the second half with a 34-yard, go-ahead field goal by Nolen at the 9:39 mark, making the score 19-17. In the fourth quarter Beckler nailed an 18-yard field goal for a 20-19 lead with 9:50 to play. Gray led Furman with 146 passing yards while Mike Brown led the ground game with 70 yards on nine carries. He was joined by Felton with 53 yards on 16 carries and one touchdown. Sprague led all receivers with his 75 yards on five catches. Miller finished with 207 yards on 17-of-32 passing with one interception. Tailback Bryan Fitzgerald ran for a team-high 62 yards on 13 carries. Hazard paced the receiving corps with four grabs for 29 yards and Cooper finished with two catches for a team-high 38 yards. Safety Chris Camacho led all tacklers with a game-high 18 tackles, 16 of which were solo, and added a forced fumble and a pass breakup. His total of 18 matches his career best. Linebacker Chris Johnson added 11 tackles while defensive back Ronnie Jackson finished with six tackles and three pass breakups.

Elon scored 35 points in the first half and made it stand up. Quarterback Scott Riddle threw for his seventh consecutive 300-yard game, throwing for 359 yards while completing 36-of-51 passes with three touchdowns and one interception. Elon scored on all but its first possession in the first half and led 35-21 at the break. Riddle threw three touchdown passes and ran for another. UTC took a 7-0 lead on Blue Cooper's 21-yard touchdown catch from Antonio Miller and Spencer Nolen's extra-point kick. Elon drove 52 yards in eight plays, and running back Dontay Taylor tied the score with a five-yard run. Riddle threw his first TD pass on the first play of the second quarter. From there, Marell Booker capped off the six-play, 75-yard drive when he busted a touchdown run with 53 seconds remaining for what proved to be the game-winning score. UTC's final drive to try to tie or go ahead began at its own 16-yard line with 47 seconds to play. Quarterback Antonio Miller directed the offense to the WKU 29-yard line with eight seconds left. The first pass attempt fell out of receiver Clint Woods' hands at the goal line. The final pass to the left corner was incomplete, ending the comeback attempt. WKU got on the scoreboard first when Wolke connected with Jake Gaebler for a 51-yard TD strike with 9:43 to play in the first quarter, putting WKU up 7-0. That lead would hold up until the 12:43 mark of the second quarter when Miller polished off an 82-yard drive with a three-yard touchdown run, tying the score at 7-7. Miller completed 16-of-28 passes for 163 yards with two interceptions. He also ran five times for 16 yards. Capitalizing on a career-long 57-yard run by Erroll Wynn, UTC utilized Bryan Fitzgerald on back-to-back runs, with the second culminating in a five-yard touchdown run to give UTC a 14-7 lead with 2:44 left in the first half. Wynn tied his career high with 131 yards on the ground on 19 carries. Fitzgerald finished with 81 yards to put UTC ahead 21-14 with 46 seconds left in the quarter. The score would stay that way until WKU running back Stephen Willis went 11 yards off left tackle to tie the score at 21-21 with 7:47 to play. Two unsuccessful UTC drives and one WKU series that ended abruptly with a second interception by Skrine set up WKU's last-minute heroics. Gaebler and Quinn's touchdown grabs were the only receiving scores for WKU. Linebacker Andre Lewis led the WKU defense with nine total tackles and two pass breakups. Bo Smith and Chris Bullard accounted for both WKU interceptions. Woods led all receivers with nine catches for 74 yards. UTC's top pass catcher, Blue Cooper, sat out the game because of an injury. On the defensive side, safety Chris Camacho and linebacker Aaron Adams led the attack with nine tackles each. Lineman Nick Rivers added a fumble recovery, and linebacker Steven Mills and defensive lineman Neil Brown each recorded a sack.

Wofford quarterback Josh Collier posted 250 total yards of offense, including a career-high 191 yards rushing. The Terriers piled up 444 total yards of offense, 349 coming on the ground, and took advantage of six UTC turnovers to take control of the game early. After a 36-yard UTC field goal to open the game, Wofford used a grinding offensive attack to score 28 points. Trailing by three, Wofford struck quickly on its first possession as Collier broke free for a career-long 62-yard touchdown run and a 7-3 lead with 10:10 to play in the first quarter. With 11:35 to go in the first half, Collier connected with tight end Fenn Allen for an 18-yard touchdown to extend the score to 14-3. Defensive play marked the rest of the first half as neither team was able to find the end zone. The third quarter was far different as Wofford opened the half with a 15-play, 74-yard drive that ate 8:17 off the clock and resulted in another Collier TD to push the Terriers' lead to 21-3. An interception on UTC's next possession by defensive back Dan Tavani gave Wofford excellent field position for its next drive. That drive culminated in a two-yard touchdown run for tailback Michael Hobbs to make the score 28-3 with 2:10 to go in the quarter. UTC's Antonio Miller answered with a 14-yard touchdown pass to tight end Joseph Pitman to close out the third quarter and make the score 28-10. Sean Lees took the ensuing kickoff 79 yards for a touchdown to put the score at 35-10 with 14:50 to play. A James Mitchell interception at 8:04 set up Wofford's final scoring drive as running back Adrian Young went in from two yards and a 42-10 lead. UTC once again struck at the end of the quarter, this time with quarterback Tony Pastore completing a 31-yard touchdown pass to wideout Kelvon Yancey with no time on the clock to reach the final score of 42-16. The point-after kick was not attempted. Collier led all rushers with 191 yards and two scores and completed five-of-six passes for 59 yards and one touchdown. Wideout Tripp Smith had three catches for 24 yards. Safety Chris Camacho led all tacklers with a game-high 18 tackles, including 15 solo, while linebackers Chris Johnson and Joseph Thornton each finished with 10 tackles. Thornton added a fumble recovery and Johnson had a forced fumble. Defensive backs Jeff Phillips and Brandon Golder accounted for three turnovers, with Phillips nabbing a pick and a fumble recovery and Golder an interception. Offensively, Miller completed 10-of-20 passes for 150 yards and one touchdown while tailback Bryan Fitzgerald topped the century mark with 116 yards rushing. Back Erroll Wynn added 62 yards.

Armanti Edwards ran for four touchdowns to lead No. 6 Appalachian State. Edwards, a quarterback, scored on runs of 7, 28, 40 and 2 yards as the Mountaineers held off a valiant Chattanooga effort. UTC got to within 21-17 right before halftime but could not scratch the scoreboard in the second half. ASU, which tied Wofford for the SoCon title, made it look like it would be a run-a-way in the first quarter. Edwards had 129 rushing yards in the opening period with three of his TDs. He cashed in on ASU's first possession, reaching the end zone on a seven-yard run at 8:26. He found the end zone 2:22 later, extending the lead to 14-0 on a 28-yard run. His 41-yard sprint with 26 seconds left in the first pushed ASU's margin to 21-7. UTC got on the scoreboard at 1:39 of the first quarter. Quarterback Antonio Miller hit tight end Joseph Pitman on a three-yard scoring pass. It was Pitman's fourth touchdown catch of the season on just eight receptions. UTC controlled the second quarter, forcing three ASU punts and keeping them off the scoreboard. Spencer Nolen booted a 36-yard field goal at 7:05 of the second quarter, and Clint Woods hauled in a Miller three-yard scoring pass with 17 seconds to play in the half to get to within 21-17. Miller threw two touchdown passes to end his career with 22 and rank No. 8 on the school's career touchdown pass list. Miller was 15-for-32 passing for 136 yards and two interceptions. Running backs Bryan Fitzgerald and Erroll Wynn each surpassed 100 yards in the first half. Fitzgerald gained 116 yards while Wynn was at 101 at the break. UTC had an opportunity to tack on 10 more points to the first-half total. Nolen missed a 34-yard field goal at 4:01 of the second quarter, and a fourth-and-one pass play from the ASU two-yard line fell incomplete. ASU kicker Julian Rauch was wide right on a 52-yard field goal try at the half to leave the lead at 21-17. ASU held UTC to 98 yards in the second half. After a scoreless third quarter, Edwards' fourth TD run was a two-yarder at the 13:52 mark of the fourth quarter to push the margin to 27-17. Rauch added a 23-yard field goal with 8:54 remaining, and Justin Woazeah ran back a Woods' fumble 32 yards for a score with 36 seconds left for the final margin. UTC outgained ASU for the game, 398 yards to 364. Fitzgerald led UTC's backs with 134 yards on 16 carries, and Wynn finished with 115 yards on 20 carries. Woods was Miller's favorite target, catching six balls for 58 yards. Edwards totaled 157 rushing yards on 25 runs. He was 8-of-15 passing for 59 yards. Kevin Richardson became ASU's all-time leading rusher and surpassed 1,000 yards on the season with 103 yards on 23 carries. Safety Chris Camacho, the SoCon's leading tackler, led the Mocs with 12 stops. Joseph Thornton added a fumble recovery to his nine tackles, and Chris Johnson made nine hits as well.

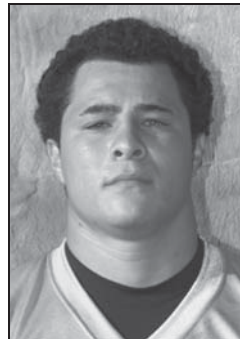
