LAST TIME OUT

FOUR SCORE IN DOUBLE FIGURES TO LEAD LADY MOCS TO 84-54 WIN OVER BELMONT

The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga women's basketball team got a balanced effort Wednesday night to nab an 84-54 win over Belmont at the Curb Event Center in non-conference action. Junior Taylor Hall, playing just 20 minutes, led all scorers as UTC Head Coach Wes Moore got more players into the game. She went 5-of-8 from the floor and missed her fourth 3-point attempt after making each of her first three. She was 3-of-4 from the free throw line as well and grabbed five rebounds. Junior Faith Dupree added 12 points and three assists while freshman Tatianna Jackson also had 12 going 4-of-5 from the floor, 2-for-3 from the 3-point line and had four steals. Junior Ashlen Dewart was the fourth Chattanooga player in double figures with 10 points and was 4-for-6 from the charity stripe. Senior Kayla Christopher and junior Destiny Bramblett each tossed in eight points in the win. Christopher, along with Dupree, dished out three assists each while senior Kylie Lambert and sophomore Ka'Vonne Towns led the Lady Mocs with six rebounds each. Chattanooga jumped out to a quick 5-0 lead behind a jumper from Hall and a 3-pointer from Hall less than two minutes into the contest. UTC grew its led to double figures just over halfway through the first half to 28-17 at the 9:10 mark and never trailed throughout the game. Belmont's Alyssa Visbeen hit a 3-pointer to pull the Bruins within one, but that was as close as it would get the rest of the game as Chattanooga pushed its lead to 16 in the first half on a jumper from Dewart. In the second half, the two team started out trading shots with the Lady Mocs taking a 52-37 lead at the 13:42 mark. A 7-0 run by UTC put Chattanooga up 59-37. Jackson hit a free throw and grabbed a steal that led to a layup stretching the Lady Mocs' lead to 62-39 with 9:55 to play. Belmont cut the lead to 17, 62-45, on six straight free throws from Visbeen, but UTC responded with another 7-0 run, fueled by five made free throws to go up 69-45 with 5:54 to play. The Lady Mocs largest lead came with 40 seconds remaining, 84-52, on a layup from junior Meghan Downes. The Lady Mocs were 29-of-60 from the field (48.3%) and was 7-of-15 (46.7%) from beyond the arc. UTC was 19-of-26 from the free throw line and outbounded Belmont 39-31. Chattanooga dished out 14 assists, had 12 steals and 12 turnovers. Belmont (1-2) shot just 32 percent (16-of-50) from the floor and was 5-of-18 (27.8%) from the 3-point line while getting a near-perfect performance at the free throw line making 17-of-18.

two time all-conference performer. Last year she averaged 12.2 points per game and was second in the A-Sun with 8.9 rebounds per game. She leads the Lady Bucs with 26.0 points per game and pulled down three rebounds at High Point. Brianna McQueen scored 18 points in the opener and had a team-high six rebounds. Serena Clark is third on the team with 11 points and five rebounds. The Lady Bucs scored 76 points in the opener and had 39 rebounds. ETSU added five newcomers to the squad to go along with nine returning letterwinners.

LADY MOCS RECEIVE VOTES IN AP TOP 25

After winning the season opener against No. 20 Tennessee, the Lady Mocs received 10 votes in the AP Top 25.

LADY MOCS FIFTH IN THE MID-MAJOR POLL

The Lady Mocs received 57 votes in the Mid-Major poll on Nov. 13 and ranked 25th. Delaware, with a 1-2 overall record, received 30 first place votes for the top spot with Middle Tennessee picking up one. SoCon foes Appalachian State, with a season opening win, is ranked 14th and Davidson received votes as well.

HALL NAMED SOCON PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Taylor Hall was selected the Southern Conference Player of the Week after leading the Lady Mocs to an 80-71 win over No. 20 Tennessee in the season opener. She tied her career-high with 24 points and hit career-bests in assists, steals and blocked shots. She pulled down nine rebounds and ranks among the league's Top Five in 10 categories with top rankings in scoring (24), assist-turnover ratio (999.0) and blocked shots (3.0).

HALL NAMED COLLEGE SPORTS MADNESS SOCON & MID-MAJOR PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior Taylor Hall tied her career-high in scoring with 24 points to lead the Lady Mocs to an 80-71 win over No. 20 Tennessee in the season opener at the Roundhouse. She had nine rebounds and posted career-highs in assists (5) and steals (4) while tying her career-best in blocked shots with three while committing no turnovers. Hall was 9-of-12 from the field and 3-of-5 from beyond the arc while making 3-of-5 from the free throw line.

ALL-VOLUNTEER STATE LINEUP

With the addition of Alex Black (Memphis) and Faith Dupree (Knoxville) to the Lady Mocs starting lineup, that makes an all-Tennessee starting five. The duo join Kayla Christopher (Oliver Springs), Kylie Lambert (Etowah) and Taylor Hall (New Tazewell). Alicia Payne (Memphis) is the only other Tennessee resident on the roster.

DUPREE MAKES FIRST START AGAINST UTK

Junior Faith Dupree grew up in the shadow of the Lady Vols and signed to play for Summitt out of high school. After a year-and-a-half, she transferred down the road and has faced her

former team twice. Last season in Knoxville, she led the Lady Mocs with 17 points off the bench and this season made her first collegiate start, matching up against the Lady Vols. She played 24 minutes scoring six points and grabbing three rebounds.

A CLOSER LOOK AT THE NEWCOMERS

Freshman Tatianna Jackson (Atlanta, Ga.) and Alicia Payne (Memphis, Tenn.). Tatianna Jackson, a four-star rated player from The Lovett School and led her team to the state finals her senior year. She was a three-time all-state performer and scored 1,812 career points ... Alicia Payne, a three-star rated player, led her team in assists for two seasons and was a two-time all-region selection for White Station.

A SEASON ON THE ROAD

The Lady Mocs will play 16 games on the road this season including 10 Southern Conference contests, a Thanksgiving tournament at St. Mary's in San Francisco, Calif., and four non-conference games. UTC's first road game was a 30-point win at Belmont. In December, the Lady Mocs will travel to the state of Alabama to take on Alabama and Auburn and then face off against UAB just after the New Year.

HOME COURT WIN STREAK CLIMBS

The Lady Mocs posted a perfect 13-0 record at the Roundhouse last season and picked up with a win over Tennessee to run the current home-court win streak to 14 games.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL IN MCKENZIE

The Lady Mocs played their first game in the UTC Arena on Dec. 3, 1983 and posted a 74-66 win over Tennessee Tech. Over the next 15 years, the Lady Mocs continued to call Maclellan Gym home and played just a handful of games in the Roundhouse. However, with the arrival of Wes Moore in 1998, the women made the move to the arena playing half of the 1998-99 schedule in the larger building. By Moore's second season, all but two of Chattanooga's home games have been played at the McKenzie Arena. Those two games were both played in the 2004-05 year. UTC has now topped the 200 mark for games played in the Roundhouse since that first year and have a 179-43 record spanning three coaches and 28 years. UTC went 13-0 at home last year.

HOT HISTORY AT HOME

The Lady Mocs went undefeated at the Roundhouse last year posting a 13-0 record. According to RPI Ratings.com, the Lady Mocs have posted a 115-22 (.8394) record in the McKenzie Arena since the 2001-02 season, Moore's fourth year, through last season. That ranks ninth among all Division I women's teams with Tennessee holding the top mark with a 341-20 mark (.9446).

CHATTANOOGA PICKED THIRD IN POLLS

LADY MOCS PLAY 39TH SEASON

2012-13 marks the 39th season of varsity women's basketball at Chattanooga. Through 38 years UTC's record is 707-404. In 1974, Grace Keith was named the head coach of the Mocettes. Over two years, she posted a record of 21-23. Sharon Cable Fanning, a former player, followed and changed the nickname to Lady Mocs. In 11 years she led UTC to four SoCon titles and the 1984 NWIT finals. Craig Parrot led Chattanooga for 11 season and took the Lady Mocs to their first NCAA tournament. During his tenure UTC won one SoCon title, two tournament crowns and went to the NCAA two times. Wes Moore returns for his 15th season. He led UTC to 11 consecutive crowns, 12 20-win seasons in 13 years, including 11 straight, and 12 postseason appearances including eight trips to the NCAA tournament.

CHATTANOOGA LADY MOCS ON THE AIR WITH LARRY WARD

For the 12th straight year, Larry Ward, "The Voice of the Lady Mocs" will broadcast each and every Chattanooga women's basketball game. This season, the Mocs Sports Network will air most games on the UTC flagship station ESPN Radio 105.1 The Zone. When the men's and women's times conflict, they will broadcast on WPLZ 95.3 FM. DOWNES LEADS UTC IN WIN OVER ETSU

JOHNSON CITY, Tenn. --- The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga women's basketball team went 10-for-12 from the free throw line in the final three minutes to hold off a surging East Tennessee State for an 88-80 win over the Lady Bucs at the MSHA Athletic Center Thursday night. Chattanooga improves to 8-3 overall (3-0 SoCon) and East Tennessee State falls to 1-11 overall. Sophomore Meghan Downes had a career-high 19 points to lead five Chattanooga players in double figures. She drained a career-best four 3-pointers on six attempts. Senior Whitney Hood put up 17 points making 9-of-9 from the free throw line. Juniors Kayla Christopher and Kylie Lambert each had 13 points in the contest. Christopher was 8-for-8 from the charity stripe, sinking four in the final 52 seconds. Sophomore Alex Black was the fifth UTC player in double figures with 10 points and five rebounds. Sophomore Taylor Hall went 4-for-6 from the free throw line in the final three minutes for eight points and a game-high 11 rebounds. After leading by as much as eight in the first half, the Lady Mocs carried a 33-31 advantage into the locker room at the intermission. In the second half, Chattanooga stretched that lead out to as much as 14 points midway through the latter stanza. UTC never trailed in the second half, but ETSU did knot the game up 72-72 with 2:57 to play. With 4:48 to play in the game, the Lady Mocs led 71-63 with a pair of free throws from Hood. ETSU would answer on an 8-1 run to tie it up on a layup from Gwen Washington who had a team-leading

18 points. Hood put in a layup to put UTC back on top and the Lady Mocs would not trail again. Christopher followed it with a 3-pointer and then the two teams traded baskets. Christopher hit another pair of free throws with 52 seconds to play and led 81-74. Twice the Lady Bucs would get to within five, but that would be all they could manage as Chattanooga held on for the eight point victory. Destiny Mitchell had 14 points and eight rebounds for East Tennessee State while Maria Bond had 12 points and two blocked shots. East Tennessee State edged the Lady Mocs on the boards 40-39. In the second half, the Lady Mocs were 17-of-26 (65.4%) from the floor and was 5-for-9 (55.6%) from beyond the arc while hitting 16-of-19 from the free throw line. Chattanooga was 25-of-33 from the free throw line for the game and hit seven 3-pointers.
