Mark Guhne

Head Coach • Second Season
Chattanooga (1984)



Mark Guhne wasted no time putting his stamp on the Chattanooga golf program. In his first season at the helm, the Mocs posted their highest finish in the Southern Conference Championships in 20 years. The Mocs also broke into the Golfweek Top 100 for the first time in school history, finishing the season at #89.

Guhne (pronounced JUNE) was honored by his peers after the season by being named the Southern Conference Coach of the Year.

Guhne has taken recruiting to a new level, as two Mocs were also named All Conference, including freshman Jonathan Hodge.

Guhne insists that his players play in elite events in the summer, and this off-season saw UTC players compete in the English and British Amateurs (Ben Rickett), the final 16 of the U.S. Amateur (Hodge), the Southern Amateur (Bryce Ledford and Hodge), as well as the Nationwide Tour's Chattanooga Classic (Ledford).

Guhne was named Head Men's Golf Coach on March 1, 2005 after spending the three previous seasons as the assistant to Reed Sanderlin.

A PGA professional, Guhne has earned his Class A status. He has served as the vice president of the Chattanooga District Golf Association and has coordinated many junior tournaments for the CDGA for several years. He competes in PGA Section and Chapter events and a limited number of mini-tour events each year. In 2006 he was an alternate at the PGA Tour stop in Memphis.

In 2003 and 2004, he was selected to represent Tennessee in the Tennessee vs. Georgia PGA Cup Matches.

Guhne and his wife, Kelly, are both UTC graduates, earning their bachelor's degrees in 1984.

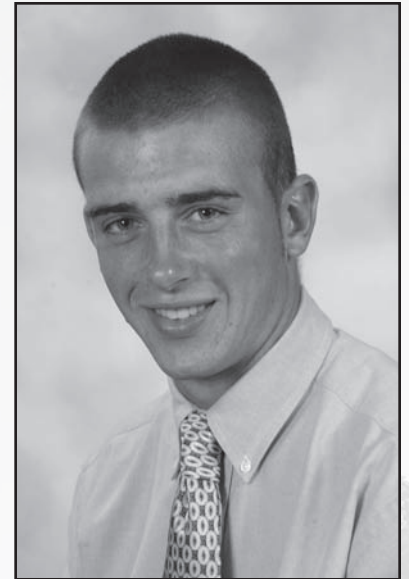

Scenic City Invitational

OOLTEWAH, Tenn. -- Charlotte battled winds and a persistent rain to post the field's best final-round score and claim the team title of the inaugural Scenic City Invitational held at the prestigious Honors Course. The 49er's 12-over par 300 vaulted Charlotte past Middle Tennessee who held the lead after 36 holes.

Alabama-Birmingham's Garrett Osborn won the individual title with a 54-hole total of 217, 1-over par. Osborn was three strokes behind Callum Macaulay of Ole Miss who held the overnight lead at 4-under par.

Chattanooga carded the field's third-best final round score and finished seventh. Senior Bryce Ledford battled deteriorating conditions on the back 9 to card a 75 and finish tied for 10th at 9-over par (225).

A combination of a challenging course setup and less than ideal weather combined for a field average score of 79.5 strokes.

Reed Sanderlin

Golf Coach Emeritus
Memphis State (1960)

Reed Sanderlin has been a fixture with the Chattanooga golf program since he took over the program in 1977. As the head coach, he led the Mocs to the Southern Conference Tournament Championship in 1987, runner-up finishes in 1978 and 1989 and third-place finishes in 1984 and 1993.

Sanderlin retired following the 2005 season. He was hired by the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga in 1969 to teach English. He spent two years of his tenure serving as the Executive Assistant to Chancellor William Masterson but returned to the English Department in 1973.

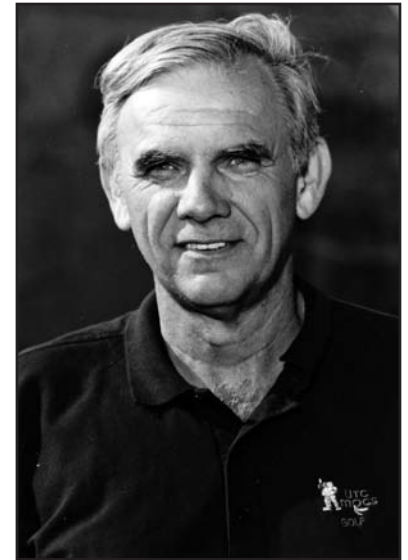
Sanderlin was an avid golfer but did not play collegiately. Wes Brown recommended that Sanderlin oversee the golf program, and he became the head coach in 1977.

He guided UTC's first Southern Conference medalist, Donnie Green, in 1978 and has also coached four SoCon runners-up, Lee Gerdes and Chris Schmidt in 1987; Brian Millican in 1989 and James Van De Griff in 1997. Sanderlin was voted the SoCon Coach of the Year in 1987.

Sanderlin is a native of Memphis, Tenn., where he graduated from Humes High School, the same high school attended by the late Elvis Presley, who was two years ahead of Sanderlin.
