OVERVIEW OF THE MOCS IN 2010

The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga men's and women's tennis teams are gearing up for another exciting Spring season of Mocs Tennis. Both teams are returning a solid corps of players and competed in a tough fall schedule to get ready for their challenging schedules in 2010.

The men's squad is coming off a competitive fall slate that included stops at the UNC Greensboro Fall Invitational in Greensboro, N.C., the UTC Steve Baras Fall Classic in Chattanooga and the Crimson Tide Fall Championships at Alabama.

Head coach Carlos Garcia, who is in his ninth year of guiding the men's tennis program, has one of the youngest teams in his career. The roster does not include any seniors and just four juniors. A pair of sophomore and six freshmen will fight for time on the courts in 2010.

The Mocs return four starters to the line-up, including juniors Rick van de Bovenkamp (Netherlands), Tyler Pullen (Mount Juliet, Tenn.), Gordon Ruddell (Knoxville, Tenn.) and sophomore Sam Parfitt (Norwich, England). Sophomore Alexandru Butnaruciu (Moldova, Chisinau) is also back from last year's team.

Newcomers include junior-transfer Matt Harris from Tennessee-Martin and freshmen Stephan Crofford (Franklin, Tenn.), William Disterdick (Hixson, Tenn.), Ryan Pool (Victoria, Australia), Chris Smith (Johnson City, Tenn.), Jackson Tresnan (Apopka, Fla.) and Roberto Vieira (Bedfordview, South Africa).

Crofford, Smith and van de Bovenkamp all

led the Mocs with 5-4 records during fall action. Disterdick and Pool teamed up to post three doubles wins to lead UTC in the fall.

Smith's best showing of the fall came at the Crimson Tide tournament where he won the Consolation Draw of the Stallings bracket. Rudell advanced to the consolation finals of the D1 draw in the Baras tournament, before falling in straight sets, while Crofford won the A3 consolation bracket at UNC Greensboro.

In addition to the always challenging Southern Conference schedule, the men's squad has a tough non-conference slate as well. UTC opens the season on the road against Vanderbilt and No. 5 Tennessee. They also face Austin Peay, Murray State and Jacksonville State on the road. Their non-conference home schedule includes Lipscomb, UAB, Belmont, Mercer, Lee and Tennessee Wesleyan.

The Lady Mocs are coming off a strong fall season where they competed in the Middle Tennessee Fall Classic, the UTC Steve Baras Fall Classic and the Belmont Quad Invitational.

Head coach Jeff Clark is entering the third season of his second tour of duty with the Lady Mocs. He also guided the team from 1999-01. Clark has a pair of seniors on his roster to go with two juniors, four sophomores and two freshmen.



Bossy (Koekelare, Belgium), Emily Hangstefer (Signal Mountain, Tenn.), Shaina Singh (Vancouver, B.C.) and Brianna Wishing (Murfreesboro, Tenn.). Seniors back are Beata Knizat (Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ontario) and Kate Ksiezopolski (Toronto, Ontario), along with junior Grace Robinette (Chattanooga, Tenn.). Newcomers include freshmen Jenna Nurik (Roswell, Ga.) and Jennifer Taylor (Signal Mountain, Tenn.).

The Lady Mocs were led by two talented freshmen in Taylor and Nurik during the fall season. Both freshmen posted seven singles wins during the fall action. Hangstefer and Singh also posted seven singles wins in the fall. As a team, Chattanooga posted a .667 winning percentage in singles play. Hangstefer and Nurik posted an 8-1 mark as a doubles tandem.

The women will again take on a tough Southern Conference schedule, but also face a daunting non-conference run. UTC opens the season at No. 10 Georgia Tech and also travel to Austin Peay, Middle Tennessee, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech. Their home non-conference opponents include Lipscomb, Mercer, Tennessee-Martin, UAB, Lee, and Tennessee Wesleyan.

The Mocs return five starters to the line-up including, junior Annie Green (Atlanta, Ga.) and sophomores Charlotte

One of the most respected and successful coaches in the Southeast region, Carlos Garcia is in his ninth year at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. During his career, Garcia has coached both the men's and women's teams at UTC, guided a conference Player of the Year winner, earned regional coaching honors from the ITA, worked with the U.S. Davis Cup Squad and had his team earn Academic All-American honors.

Garcia has produced five winning seasons during his tenure at UTC and has the Mocs geared for much improvement on the court in 2010. He has coached seven individuals and five doubles team to All-Southern Conference recognition and has the talent on the squad this year to add to that list.

Garcia spent his first two seasons at UTC coaching both the men's and women's teams. He has focused his efforts solely on the men's program for the past six-plus seasons and has had impressive results on and off the court.

He led the Mocs to the championship match of the Southern Conference Tournament for two consecutive years, in 2005 and 2006. The Mocs had four-consecutive winning seasons from 2005-08, finishing fourth in the very competitive SoCon each year.

In 2006 and 2007, Garcia directed the men's team to 17 impressive wins and identical 5-4 record in the SoCon. During that time, UTC produced two second team All-SoCon doubles tandems in Josh Bales-Mark Fynn and Badr Bouabdellah-Artyom Vlasenko. In singles play, Bouabdellah had an outstanding dual-match season, registering a 24-2 record and a perfect 9-0 mark in SoCon matches.

In 2005, the Mocs earned an 18-11 overall record. Garcia also coached two second team All-SoCon performers in No. 1 singles player Arturo Navarro and No. 4 singles player Vlasenko.

Under Garcia's guidance, Jason Ontog and Cynthia Oulevay were both named First-Team All-SoCon in 2002. Oulevay went undefeated in league competition, while Ontog lost just once in 10 matches. Ontog and doubles partner Tim Kutschera were listed First-Team All-SoCon.

Fabian Bechara and Charlotte Goude were Second-Team All-SoCon selections in 2003 as were the doubles teams of Ontog and Thomas Knizat and Oulevay and Catherine Allen. Ontog, the 2001 SoCon Men's Player of the Year and No. 1 singles champion, received the Buddy Hartsell-Don Bunch Sportsmanship Award two times and achieved an Intercollegiate Tennis Association ranking as high as No. 67.

Peter Sauska was a first-team All-SoCon selection in 2009 and teamed with Pavel Vostrikov to earn

second team All-SoCon doubles honors.

In the classroom, the 2001-02 men's team earned Academic All-America honors, while James Dickerson and John Hangstefer were named ITA Scholar-Athletes. Razvan Axente (2007), Badr Bouabdellah (2006-07), Gordon Rudell (2009) and Pavel Vostrikov (2009) have also been recognized as ITA Scholar-Athletes under Garcia's tutelage.

Garcia's collegiate coaching career began in 1994 when he served as a men's assistant at his alma mater, the University of Tennessee, until 1999. In 1999, Garcia moved on to the University of North Carolina to become the men's assistant coach. The Tar Heels finished the season ranked 20th in the nation, and Garcia was named Regional Assistant Coach of the Year by the ITA in 1999 and 2000.

Garcia took his coaching talents to a new level when he left North Carolina in 2000 to become the personal coach to Davis Cup standout and former NCAA singles champion Chris Woodruff for two seasons. He also coached Woodruff, a former Tennessee player, to his second ATP singles title at the ATP Hall of Fame Championships in Newport, R.I. Woodruff also had a quarterfinal showing at the 2000 Australian Open under Garcia's guidance.

Prior to accepting the job at UTC, Garcia was the teaching professional at Cedar Bluff Racquet Club in Knoxville, Tenn. Garcia is a 1987 honors graduate of Tennessee with a bachelor's degree in General Business. While a member of the Volunteers' tennis team, he earned three tennis letters and was a member of the 1986 Southeastern Conference Championship squad.

A competitive player himself, Garcia and teammate Mark Harrison won the USTA National 35s Grass Court Doubles Championship in 2002 and USTA Indoor 35s National Doubles Championship in 2005 with partner Jeff Wright. Garcia and Harrison were runners up at the 2005 National Clay Court Doubles Championships. Garcia finished fifth in August of 2006 in the USTA National 40s Grass Court Championships, while he and doubles partner Eric Burke took fourth place in the doubles event. He also won the 2006 USTA National Doubles Indoor Championships with Mark Harrison.

Garcia finished the 2009 season ranked No. 3 in the nation in the USTA 45's age division. He is also a potential candidate to represent the United States on the Dubler Cup team in the ITF World Championships held in Mexico City in 2010.

Born Aug. 3, 1964, Garcia served for three years on the NCAA Southeast Regional Selection Committee.

When the head women's coaching position became vacant in the fall of 2007, Chattanooga Athletics Director Rick Hart turned to a familiar face and proven winner: Jeff Clark. A native Chattanooga and a former UTC head coach, Clark returned to the university on December 17, 2007 to lead the women's tennis program. Hart said, "Jeff Clark has great experience as a teacher of tennis and a leader of young people. His teams have demonstrated what we are looking for athletically and academically, and he has always held sportsmanship on the court in high esteem."

Clark's success is showing on the court in his first two-plus years back at UTC. Last season, two Mocs earned spots on the Southern Conference All-Freshman team while Grace Robinette earned the Sportsmanship Award. The Lady Mocs also earned ITC All-Academic Team recognition.

Clark served as head coach for both the men's and women's tennis teams at UTC from 1998-2001. During that time his men captured the 2000 Southern Conference tournament title, earning the university's only NCAA Division I tennis tournament bid. That same year he guided his women's squad to the SoCon Tournament finals. In the spring of 1999, his first season as head coach, the men's squad reached the conference tournament final. Clark has over 100 combined wins as head coach of the men's and women's teams at UTC.

Among his other accomplishments at UTC, he coached four singles players and four doubles teams to All-SoCon honors. One of those players, Jason Ontog, was a two-time All-SoCon selection and the 2001 conference Player of the Year. Clark's women's team maintained the highest grade point average among all UTC athletics teams from 1999 to 2001, and the 2001 squad was honored as an ITA All-Academic Team.

Prior to his head coaching stint at UTC, Clark was a Mocs assistant under former head coach Jim Thompson. Clark joined Thompson's staff in 1997 and their coaching partnership proved to be an immediate success, leading the UTC men to the Southern Conference tournament title and the women to the tournament finals.

Clark has enjoyed success throughout his

collegiate coaching career. From 2002 to 2006 Clark served as the men's assistant coach at the University of Mississippi, one of the top programs in all of college tennis. Working with legendary coach Billy Chadwick, he helped coach the Rebels to four consecutive top-ten national team rankings, back-to-back SEC team titles, four SEC West titles, one Final Four appearance, and numerous All-American singles and doubles honors. One of his Ole Miss players, Catalin Gard, achieved the number one singles ranking in college tennis during the 2004-05 season. In 2006 Clark was named ITA Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year and thus nominated for ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year.

In addition to his college coaching, Clark has mentored and developed many junior tennis players. He has worked with the tennis programs at The McCallie School from 1995-1997 and, more recently, from 2006-2007, coaching alongside Eric Voges, one of the top junior coaches in the Southeast. In 2001, Clark created a unique tennis program at the Bethlehem Community Center, a school and sports facility for inner-city youth in Chattanooga.

Clark is a 1995 graduate of Vanderbilt University, where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in English. While a member of the Commodore tennis team, Clark led Vanderbilt to its first-ever NCAA Regional as the team captain his senior year. He played number four singles and number one doubles that season. After college Clark competed professionally, participating in ITF satellites and money tournaments in Europe and competing for his club team in Germany, TC Philippsburg, where he played in 1997 and 1998.

During his first stint coaching at UTC from 1997 to 2001, he earned his master's degree in English Literature from the university. Clark, 37, is married to the former Laura Brown of Signal Mountain, Tenn. The couple has three children: Peter, Caroline and Henry. They reside in Chattanooga.

Sauska was a first team All-Southern Conference singles player for the Mocs last season. He also earned second team All-SoCon honors in 2009.

Sauska transferred to UTC after spending his freshman season at the College of Santa Fe in Santa Fe, New Mexico. He posted a 44-19 career mark in dual match action during his three seasons at UTC. Sauska was also one of the top doubles players for the Mocs over the last three years.

A native of Budapest, Hungary, Sauska was one of the top Hungarian junior singles and doubles players prior to his collegiate career.

Currently, Robinette is a private tennis instructor and entrepreneur. He is the owner of Wake Clothing. His sister, Grace, is a junior at UTC and also a member of the women's tennis team.

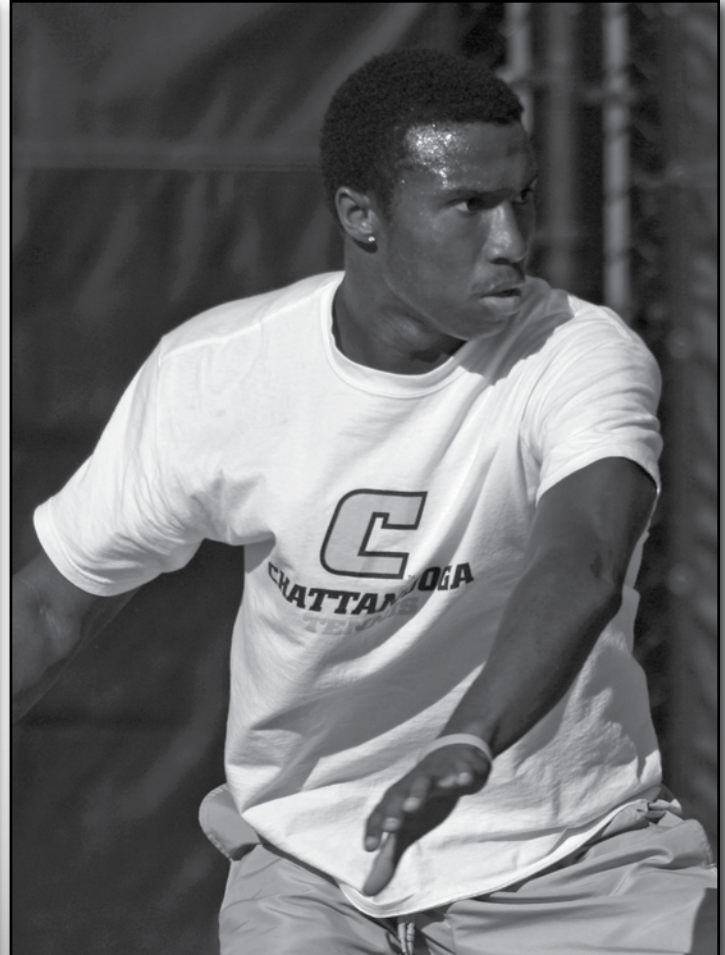

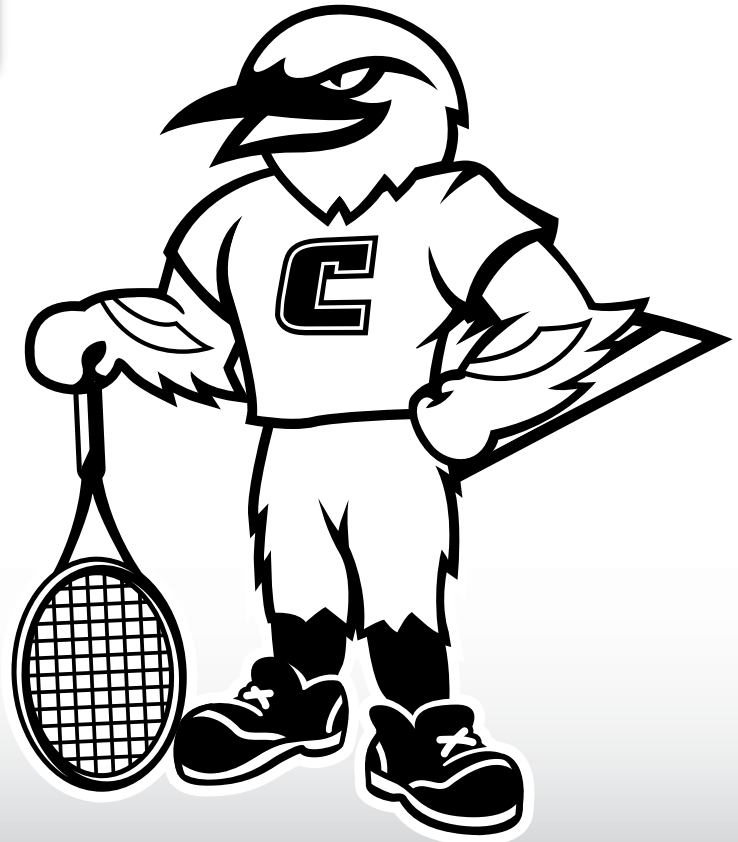

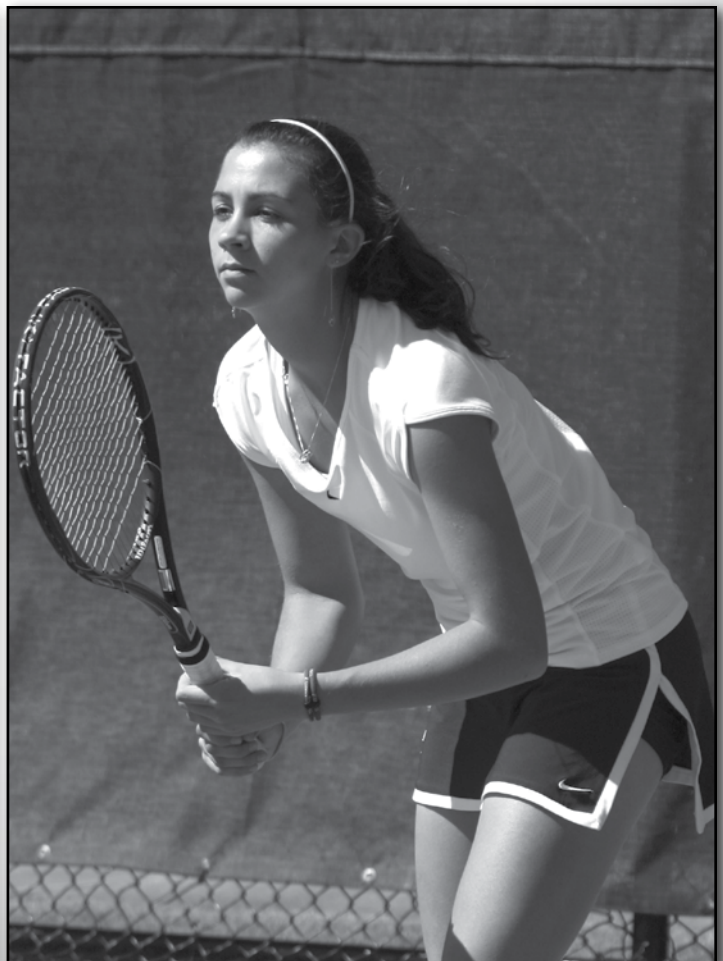
