This Time Out

The Owls vs. the SoCon: Friday evening's match-up against the Mocs will be the Owls only contest against a Southern Conference opponent this season. The Black and Gold are 0-6 all-time against current Southern Conference opponents.

Trying to Make History, and Avoid It: The Owls will be trying to avoid starting out a season 0-3 for the first time since the 1992-93 campaign, when they played in the NAIA, meaning they have never lost their first three contests of the season as an NCAA program, Division I or II. A win against the Mocs would be their first in four tries, with two of their three previous meetings coming in Chattanooga.

McKenzie Arena Isn't So Bad, Though: Despite their lack of success against the Mocs, however, the Owls have won at McKenzie Arena. They defeated Alabama State, 78-72, on Dec. 30, 2006, in the Dr. Pepper Classic, which was hosted by Chattanooga.

Tough Beginnings: The 0-2 starts that the Owls and Mocs endured to their seasons came against some premier opponents. While the Owls made trips to top-15 outfit Wisconsin and the SEC's Auburn, the Mocs sauntered out to the Hoosier State to take on Indiana and 2011 national runner-up Butler.

**Owls leading scorer and Atlantic Sun Conference Preseason Player of the Year Markeith Cummings did not play on Monday evening after being suspended indefinitely for conduct detrimental to the team. It was the first time in Cummings' career that he did not appear in a game.

***Three Owls scored in double figures to help fill the offensive void created by Cummings. Aaron Anderson scored 13 points to go along with 13 rebounds for his fourth career double-double, while Spencer Dixon added 11 points and Nick Turner scored a career-high 10.

****Senior Romain Henry made his first career start on Monday.

*****Freshman Delbert Love had a game-high in steals for the second game contest, swiping three.

-The Owls and Mocs last met a year ago on Thursday, Nov. 17, 2011, at the KSU Convocation Center. Kennesaw State led, 42-38, at halftime before Chattanooga pulled out a, 73-69, win.

-The Black and Gold were just two days removed from their thrilling, 80-63, win over Georgia Tech.

-Markeith Cummings led all scorers with 29 points, doing most of his scoring from the foul line, where he was 15-18.

-Aaron Anderson notched a game-high 11 rebounds, his second double-digit rebounding effort in three games with the Owls to that point.

-The Owls led by as many as seven in the second half, but a 16-4 run by the Mocs put them ahead, 52-47, with 11:12 to go in the contest.

-The game was tied, 69-69, with 1:41 but the Mocs would score the final four points in the game to seal it.

-Spencer Dixon added 17 points for the Owls, while LaDaris Green had 12

-The Mocs were led by Deantre Jefferson, who had 18 points. Omar Wattad was held to just 5 points on 2-for-7 shooting

-Six Mocs on the 2011-12 roster scored in last year's game, while seven current Owls scored.

Don't Count on Your Neighbors: Though Georgia and Tennessee are neighboring states, the Owls and Mocs have done anything but relied on each other's territory for talent. The Mocs have seven players on their roster from Tennessee, but none from Georgia, while the Owls have six Peach Staters and nobody from their neighbor up north in Tennessee.

Gotta Love It: Freshman Delbert Love has made a major impact on the floor in his first two games with the Owls despite having only scored a total of five points. Having started both games, he has a total of seven steal, including four at Wisconsin on Saturday and three at Auburn on Monday, to lead all players in each contest.

No Better Time to Start: Owls senior Romain Henry made his first career start on Monday for the Owls in his second season with the squad. Henry made the most of it, notching career-highs in points (5), rebounds (3) and minutes (25).

Turner Channels His Lineage: Owls sophomore Nick Turner notched a career-high at Auburn on Monday night with 10 points, which was fitting, since his father, Greg, played at Auburn for three seasons.

Double-Double Trouble: Owls junior Aaron Anderson recorded the fourth double-double of his career on Monday night at Auburn, matching his 13 points with 13 rebounds, to lead his team in both categories.

Looking for Win Number One: Owls head coach Lewis Preston is looking for his first career-win as a head coach. He spent 13 years as an assistant coach, working on staffs at Penn State, Florida, Notre Dame and Coastal Carolina before coming to Kennesaw this past April.

Very Rocky Top: Since joining the NCAA Division I ranks, the Owls are just 1-17 when playing in the state of Tennessee, and have dropped their last 13 contests. Their lone win came at the McKenzie Center on Dec. 30, 2006, when they defeated Alabama State at the Dr. Pepper Classic, hosted by Chattanooga.

Milestone Watch

-Markeith Cummings scored 18 points on Saturday at Wisconsin to surpass **Terrence Hill** (2002-04) for eighth place on the Owls all-time scoring list. His 1,159 career points is 524 less than the 1,683 recorded by the Owls all-time scoring king, **Herman Smith** (1986-1990). Cummings trails **Ronell Wooten** (2004-08) by 220 points for the most points scored by an Owl in the Division I era.

-Spencer Dixon needs 79 points to become the 14th player in Owls history to reach the 1,000-point mark.

-LaDaris Green needs eight blocks to become the all-time leading shot blocker in Owls history. His 106 swats trail just the 114 recorded by **Georgy Joseph** (2002-05).

-Spencer Dixon (132 steals) needs two steals to match **Golden Ingle** (2001-07) for eighth place on the program's all-time list. He is 11 assists away (284) from moving into a tie for seventh on the all-time list with **Tony Williams** (1989-93).

2011-12 Schedule Notes:

-When the Owls opened up their season on Saturday at Wisconsin, they made program history by playing their first-ever regular season game against a team who had advanced to the previous year's Sweet 16 since they moved up to the Division I level in the fall of 2005. In 2004, when they were still a Division II program, the Owls played the previous year's national runner-up, Georgia Tech, in an exhibition game.

-The schedule is also the first for the Owls at the Division I level that pits them against three teams who played in the previous year's NCAA Tournament (Wisconsin, Missouri, Belmont).

-This year's Atlantic Sun Conference schedule has been trimmed to 18 games, after former conference member Campbell departed for the Big South, leaving the A-Sun with 10 teams. The league's schedule had been 20 games in each of the previous three seasons.

-The Owls play against teams from a total of 10 different Division I conferences this season. Their game at Saint Mary's on Dec. 19 will mark their first against a team from the West Coast Conference.

2011-12 Roster Notes:

-The Owls return nine letter-winners from the 2010-11 squad. That number matches the most returnees to their squad at the Division I level. They also had nine returning letter-winners on the 2009-10 team.

-Freshman guard **Delbert Love** (Cleveland, Ohio) was the lone signee for Lewis Preston and the Owls in the 2011-12 class.

-The 2011-12 roster features three Owls who earned weekly honors from the A-Sun this past season. Senior guard **Spencer Dixon** (11/16) and junior **Markeith Cummings** (2/8) both garnered A-Sun Player of the Week awards, while junior **Aaron Anderson** (11/16) was named the A-Sun Newcomer of the Week.

-Returning juniors Cummings and **LaDaris Green** led the A-Sun in scoring and rebounding, respectively, last season, at 18.3 ppg and 8.5 rpg. The duo became the first teammates in the conference to lead the league in those categories since 1995-96.

-The Black and Gold added a pair of players to their squad via October walk-on tryouts in senior guard **Brandon Sewell** and freshman guard **Sam Glover**.

On Tuesday, April 26, 2011, the Kennesaw State University Department of Athletics named Lewis Preston as the fourth head men's basketball coach in program history. Preston is one of the up-and-coming coaches in college basketball, and has developed a strong recruiter and developer of post players during his 13 years in collegiate coaching.

Preston comes to Kennesaw from Penn State, where he spent three years on the coaching staff under Ed DeChellis. During his tenure in Happy Valley, Preston helped guide the Nittany Lions to levels of success the program had not seen in years, making their first NCAA Tournament appearance this past March for the first time since 2001 and winning the NIT Tournament during his first season on staff in 2008-09.

Prior to his time at Penn State, Preston spent two years as an assistant coach on Billy Donovan's staff at Florida and before that spent six years under Mike Brey at Notre Dame. Florida won the second of its back-to-back national championships in Preston's first year on the Gators' staff, where he was an integral part of Florida's recruiting, scouting, game preparation and on-court teaching.

"Throughout his career as an assistant coach, he truly embraced the idea of the student-athlete, from both an athletic and an academic perspective. From a compliance standpoint, he has an excellent reputation everywhere he's been. We're very pleased that he has decided to take on this opportunity and become a part of the Kennesaw State family."

Nov. 14: Auburn 68, Owls 55

AUBURN, Ala. – Aaron Anderson posted 13 points and 13 rebounds as one of three Kennesaw State Owls in double figures, but they would fall on Monday evening to the Auburn Tigers, 68-55, in front of a crowd of 4,760 at Auburn Arena.

Despite being without Marketh Cummings, the Atlantic Sun Conference Preseason Player of the Year, the Owls (0-2) kept the Tigers (2-0) within their grasp for most of the evening, trailing by single digits for a good portion of the second half. Down, 53-41, with 8:24 to play, Owls sophomore Nick Turner, who had a career-high 10 points on the evening, would drain a deep three from the right wing to make it a nine point game.

Coming out of a media timeout less than two minutes later and the margin still nine, senior Spencer Dixon, inbounding the ball from underneath the Owls own basket, would whip a pass across half court to a sprinting Anderson, who finished with an emphatic dunk to make it a, 53-46, contest with 6:36 remaining.

That would be as close as the Owls would come down the stretch, however. Back-to-back three point baskets over the next 1:28 from the Tigers Chris Denson and Frankie Sullivan, who led all scorers on Monday night with 22 points, gave the home team a 13-point cushion with 4:43 left in the contest, and the Black and Gold wouldn't come closer than 12 points the rest of the way.

"I thought we did a very good job of putting pressure on Auburn throughout the game, we had some chances to really make the game close towards the end," Owls head coach Lewis Preston said. "Overall, we need to hand it to them, they shot extremely well from the field the entire evening."

A Romain Henry three-pointer with 3:36 left in the opening 20 minutes pulled the Owls to within 25-20, but that would be the last field the Owls would connect on until a Turner three with 16:39 left in the game. During that span, the Owls would miss eight consecutive field goal attempts, while the Tigers would make five out of their seven attempts from the floor, allowing them to embark on a 16-1 run that put them up, 41-21, with 16:29 to go. The deficit would prove to be too much for the Owls to completely overcome, despite their valiant effort.

One of several bright spots for the Owls on the night was their ability to contain the Tigers' top two offensive threats in senior Kenny Gabriel and junior Rob Chubb, for much of the evening. Gabriel, the Tigers leading returnee from last season, was held to just nine points, while Chubb, who scored 13 points, was limited to four points on 1-for-6 shooting in the second half, a big reason the Owls were able to stay in the contest.

Nov. 12: Wisconsin 85, Owls 31

MADISON, Wis. - The Kennesaw State Owls dropped an, 85-31, decision to the No. 14-ranked Wisconsin Badgers to open up the 2011-12 season at the Kohl Center on Saturday afternoon. Markeith Cummings scored 18 points to lead all scorers, while five Badgers scored in double figures.

The Owls (0-1) fell behind early in head coach Lewis Preston's debut, due to both their shooting struggles from the floor and Wisconsin's effectiveness from long range. While the Black and Gold missed seven consecutive shots after Spencer Dixon made a three-point basket on the team's first attempt of the game, the Badgers (1-0) raced out to a 16-3 lead over the next 7:44. Cummings would make a turnaround layup to end the drought with 11:21 left in the half, the by then the Owls were already trailing by double digits.

Leading by 11, Wisconsin would immediately begin to put the game out reach, embarking on a 23-1 run over the next 11:07 to take a commanding, 39-6 lead, a run in which the Badgers went 7-for-11 from the floor, including 3-for-6 from three-point range. Wisconsin would go on to shoot a scorching 15-for-25 from long distance for the game, and would shoot 58.8 percent from the field overall.

"I'm going to focus on what we need to do offensively to get ourselves better and on course for our game at Auburn on Monday night." Preston remarked after the game "Our urgency and our defensive intensity wasn't where it needed to be, and that's something that we work on with our players every day. We're going to learn from this and get better from this, and hopefully use it to prepare for Monday night."

After a first half in which he was just 1-for-8 from the floor, Cummings would begin to resemble the dominant offensive force that led coaches around the Atlantic Sun Conference to name him the A-Sun Preseason Player of the Year. He would miss his first two attempts from the field during the second half, but would then reel off nine consecutive points for the Owls, including an emphatic, driving dunk along the right baseline. His 18 points on the afternoon moved him into eighth place on the Owls all-time scoring list, surpassing Terrence Hill, who was with the program from 2002 through 2004.

Josh Gasser and Ben Brust would lead the way for Wisconsin with 14 points apiece. Senior Jordan Taylor, an Associated Press Preseason All-American, scored 11 for the Badgers.

Cummings led the way for the Black and Gold with six rebounds. Senior Spencer Dixon added seven points for the Owls, who faced just their second-ever Big Ten opponent on Saturday in the Badgers.

Nov. 2: Owls 70, W. Georgia 68 (exhibition)

KENNESAW, Ga. – Three players scored in double figures on Wednesday night as the Kennesaw State Owls were able to withstand a late rally to defeat the West Georgia Wolves, 70-68, in an exhibition game at the KSU Convocation Center in front of a crowd of 1,476.

“For these guys, and for us as a staff, it’s great to come out here tonight and get a win over a team that will be very good in West Georgia,” Preston remarked after a game. “I learned a lot about the character of our guys tonight, and we have a lot to work on, but it’s nights like these that provide us with teachable moments that will serve us well as continue to grow as a team.”

Playing their first game under new head coach Lewis Preston, the Owls were tested late after leading for most of the contest, going into the locker room at halftime up, 38-29, and leading, 58-47, with 10:34 remaining. They were out front, 60-51, with 6:55 left, when they went cold from the field, missing their next six shot attempts over the next 5:37 while the Wolves found their stride offensively to make it a tight game.

Still leading, 62-60 with 3:14 left in the contest, the Owls would surrender the lead for the first time in the game when a layup by Gavin Field, who had 18 points on the evening, made it a 62-62 contest. A series of empty by both sides would keep the score that way for the next minute in change before the Wolves pulled ahead for the first time in the evening on a free throw by Marcus Cowan to make it 63-62 with 1:34 left in the contest. Freshman Delbert Love, who had 10 points in his collegiate debut on Wednesday evening, would immediately end the drought for the Black and Gold, draining a three-point basket from the right elbow to give the Owls a, 65-63 lead with 1:18 remaining.

West Georgia would tie it up one more time on a Thomas Higginbotham layup to make it 65-65 with 1:04 to go, and would force the Owls to win the game at the line, as they did not register another field goal attempt in the game.

Markeith Cummings, who scored 19 points to lead the Black and Gold on Wednesday, would be fouled while driving to the hoop and calmly knocked down a pair of free throws to give the Owls the lead back. It was Spencer Dixon who would make three straight from there, and their clutch baskets from the charity stripe was enough to fend off a late three by Field that made it a, 69-68, contest with three seconds to go. The late effort was part of a second half that saw the Owls go 10-for-12 from the line.

It didn’t look like it would be such a fight to the finish for the Owls, who quickly jumped out to a 7-0 during the first 2:15 of the contest and rode the hot hand of Nick Turner, who was a perfect 3-for-3 from three-point range in the first half and Love, who had seven of his 10 points on the evening during the first 20 minutes, to stay on top throughout the early stages of the game.

Romain Henry added 10 points for the Owls, while Cummings and Anderson led the way on the glass with eight rebounds apiece.

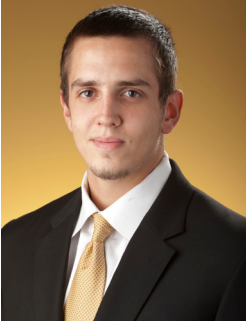
