SSU vs UT-Chattanooga

Savannah State University will face off against UT-Chattanooga for the first time in school history and the first time this season. Today's game is the fifth road game for the Tigers this season. UT-Chattanooga comes into the game with a 1-3 record and is led by Omar Wattad who is averaging 14.0 points and 3.3 rebounds.

SSU Last Time Out

Savannah State led Butler at halftime but could not hold on to their lead in the second period as Butler defeated the Tigers 57-42 in Hinkle Fieldhouse in front of 5,080 fans. The contest, which is a part of the Hoosier Invitational, saw SSU score the first four points of the game as Rashad Hassan made back to back layups. Blackmon led SSU (1-4) with 13 points while Hassan contributed 10 points and 10 rebounds. Andrew Smith led four Butler players in double figures with 11 points.

NO FROSH, NO SENIORS

This year's squad has no seniors and no freshmen. The team has seven sophomores and eight juniors.

BENCH TAKING OVER

In its season opener against Georgetown, SSU's top scorers came from off the bench. Deric Rudolph led the team in scoring with 12 points and Rashad Hassan was second with 11 points. Hassan started the last four games, and is leading SSU in scoring. Rudolph is currently fourth.

FREQUENT FLYERS

Although the Tigers will travel by bus to most games, they will once again travel by air to at least four destinations (District of Columbia, Indiana, Wisconsin and Arkansas).

BLOCK PARTY

Sophomore Jyles Smith blocked 73 shots last year, the most in school history. At the end of the season, Smith ranked 22nd in the nation. This season, he leads the team with six blocks.

THEY'RE BACK

Juniors Arnold Louis and Rashad Hassan are back on the active roster after being red-shirted last season. As sophomores, Louis averaged 8.9 points and 8 rebounds a game while Hassan averaged 11 points and 5.5 rebounds a game.

500 CLUB

Preston Blackmon and Rashad Hassan have both scored over 500 points in their two years at SSU. Blackmon has 579 total points while Hassan has 577 career points.

COACHING STABILITY

In his seventh season at the helm, head coach Horace Broadnax has become the longest tenured coach for a SSU basketball team since Russell Ellington coached the team from 1976-1984 (9 years).

HOME OPENING WINS UNDER BROADNAX —In the Horace Broadnax era at Savannah State University, the men's basketball program has enjoyed a home opening win each season. Broadnax became the head men's basketball coach in 2005, SSU has had a home opening victory each year since. In Coach Broadnax's inaugural season, in 2005, SSU defeated Wilberforce 63-59. That snapped a 30-game losing streak for the Tigers. In 2006, the Tigers had its home opening win over Clark-Atlanta University. SSU finished that season with a 12-17 record; its best mark since entering Division I. In 2007-08, SSU opened with a 88-44 home win over Carver College. In 2008-09 the Tigers defeated Brewton Parker, 83-45 and in 2009-10, SSU defeated Webber International, 65-51. Last year, the Tigers defeated Brewton Parker 61-33 in its home opener.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

SSU gave up 60.3 points a game last season which ranked them 14th in the nation. So far, the Tigers are giving up 73.2 points per game this season.

DISHING IT OUT

Preston Blackmon enters the season with 256 career assists. He ended last season ranked 40th in the nation. With 18 this season, he now has 274 assists.

TIGERS IN THE MEAC

Savannah State University is now an official member of the Mid-Eastern Athletic conference. The 2011-12 season marks the first time the Tigers will be able to play for a conference championship since leaving the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) in 1998.

SSU PLAYING DIVISION I

Savannah State University made the decision to move from Division II to Division I in 1998, while opting to leave the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference and become Independent of conference affiliation. SSU played their first season as a Division I institution in 2002 when the NCAA granted full membership. The Tigers are currently playing as a Division I Independent institution.

Head Coach Horace Broadnax



Horace Broadnax was named the head coach for the Savannah State University men's basketball team on April 11, 2005.

In six seasons SSU's men's basketball team has showed tremendous improvement during the Broadnax era. As the Institution's 11th head coach, he inherited a team that had a 0-28 record prior to his arrival in 2005.

By 2008, Broadnax guided the Tigers to its first winning season in over 20 years with a 15-14 record.

SSU finished the 2007 season with a 12-18 record earning the distinction of the most wins in Division I school history at that time. In 2008, the team set another Division I record for most wins finishing the season 13-18. The 13-win season was the most wins for any SSU team in 12 years. During the 2007 and 2008 seasons the Tigers have enjoyed back-to-back home wins over Conference USA member Southern Mississippi. Broadnax has not only helped to change the attitude of the team, but is also changing opposing teams perceptions as well.

Broadnax made a name for himself during his college career by helping lead Georgetown University to the 1984 NCAA Men's National Championship Title and as National Championship runner-ups in 1985. Horace's Georgetown team was an incredible 115-25 over his four-year career, including 30 plus wins seasons in 1984 and 1985. After receiving his Finance degree from Georgetown in 1986, Horace continued on in his studies, obtaining his Juris Doctorate from Florida State University in 1991.

Broadnax came to SSU after practicing law for three years. Prior, he was the head men's basketball coach at Bethune-Cookman College in Daytona Beach, Fla., from 1997 until 2002. The Plant City, Fla., native is credited with reviving the men's basketball program at Bethune-Cookman College.

During his second year as head coach at Bethune-Cookman, Broadnax was voted the men's Coach of the Year in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) after turning around a team that finished 1-26 in his first year as coach to a fifth-place finish with a 10-9 conference record. Broadnax earned the title again after the men's team earned its first number one ranking in the MEAC during the 1999-2000 regular season. Broadnax stepped down in 2002 for family reasons.

Prior to joining Bethune-Cookman College, Broadnax was the head men's basketball coach at Valencia Community College in Orlando, Fla., for two years, where he recorded the school's first 20-win season in 1996-97. He also worked as the video coordinator for the men's basketball team at the University of Florida and held assistant basketball coaching positions at Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M University in Tallahassee, Fla.

Broadnax received his bachelor's degree in finance at Georgetown University in 1986. At Georgetown, he was a point guard for the legendary coach John Thompson and helped the Hoyas win the 1984 NCAA title. Broadnax received his law degree from Florida State College of Law in Tallahassee, Fla., in 1991, and became a member of the Florida Bar in 1993. He has been a law partner at the Orlando, Fla., firm of Morgan, Colling & Gilbert since 1998, and has worked as an attorney-at-law in the Law Office of Joseph Williams in Plant City, Fla.

He is married to Tammy Broadnax and the couple has two sons, Horace Kaleb (10) and Randall Trent (8).

The Tigers are coming off a 12-18 season and enter the 2011-12 season as a new member of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.

SSU, which has no seniors or freshmen on the roster, returns four starters to a team that finished the year on a five game winning streak and winning 10 of their final 11 games.

Jovonni Shuler, who signed a pro contract to play in Iceland, averaged 18.1 points, 5.1 rebounds and led the team in steals was a senior.

Key returners include Preston Blackmon (12.5 points, 4.1 assists), Joshua Montgomery (10.3 points, 5.5 rebounds), Cedric Smith (5.6 points, 2.5 rebounds) and Jyles Smith (4.5 points, 7.2 rebounds, 73 blocks).

The Tigers will also welcome back 6-7 post players Rashad Hassan and Arnold Louis who were red-shirted last season. Hassan averaged 11 points and 5.5 rebounds during the 2009-10 season while Louis averaged 8.9 points and 8 rebounds.

The 6-8 Jyles Smith along with Hassan and Louis will be expected to anchor the low post.

The addition of juco guards Deric Rudolph and Patrick Hendley will help ease the transition of being MEAC neophytes. Rudolph (5-11, 175) averaged 19.8 points, 4.2 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game last year at Gadsden State Community College, was Player of the Year in the Alabama Junior College Conference and led the nation in junior colleges with three-point field goals made. Hendley (6-4, 190) averaged 14.4 points, 4.6 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game last season at Florida State College in Jacksonville, Fla . Hendley was named First Team All Mid Florida Conference.

Other players looking to contribute will be forwards Chris Spears (6-7, 220) and Keith Edwards (6-5, 210) and guards Darnel Jones (6-1, 175), Stephen Wilson (6-1, 160), Angelo Davis (6-1, 165) and Richard Conner (6-4, 205).

Head coach Horace Broadnax will open the season at his alma mater as SSU takes on Georgetown on November 11 followed by a Nov. 14 road game at North Florida.

The Tigers host Jacksonville on Nov. 16 before going on a six-game road trip which includes Indiana and Butler.

Savannah State will play host to in-state foe Georgia Tech on December 10 and Mount Saint Mary's on Dec. 22.

Other home opponents include Coastal Georgia, Coppin State, Morgan State, South Carolina State, Stetson, Howard, Trinity Baptist, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, Florida A&M, Bethune-Cookman, North Carolina Central and North Carolina A&T.
