2011-2012 MEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

HEAD COACH CHRIS HOLTSMANN

Gardner-Webb head coach **Chris Holtmann** has quickly established himself as the right choice to lead the Runnin' Bulldogs, entering his second season at the helm. A strong tactician and recruiter, his tremendous leadership and enthusiasm has injected energy and toughness into a tradition-rich program. Last season, Holtmann directed the Runnin' Bulldogs to a strong 6-4 start against a tough early season schedule – including a 78-70 win at Atlantic 10 member Charlotte in the season opener. Gardner-Webb finished with an 11-21 overall mark, but advanced to the league's post-season tournament for the first time since 2008-2009. The record is somewhat deceiving, however, as the Runnin' Bulldogs were highly competitive – losing eight games by three points or less, including five of those in Big South Conference play. A testament to his efforts working with a young team of Runnin' Bulldogs, Holtmann was third in balloting for the Big South Conference Coach of the Year following the 2010-2011 season. Holtmann, 40, returned to Gardner-Webb after spending two seasons as the lead assistant at Ohio University. In that role, he was instrumental in helping the Bobcats win the 2010 Mid-American Conference Tournament in March and to an upset of No. 3 seed Georgetown in the opening round of the 2010 NCAA Tournament. That win was the first in the NCAA Tournament for Ohio since 1983. Holtmann is the fifth head coach in the 40-year senior college history of Gardner-Webb men's basketball. He replaces Rick Scruggs, who spent 15 seasons at the helm. The time to take over a program of his own arrived after years of hard work for Holtmann. He has served for 12 seasons as a coach in the college ranks, developing a strong reputation as an excellent tactician – particularly on the defensive end of the floor – and a relentless recruiter. During his last 10 seasons on the bench, Holtmann has been a part of five conference championships. During Holtmann's time at Ohio, he was a key figure in securing the top recruiting classes in the Mid-American Conference in each of his seasons with the school according to ESPN.com, including 2010 MAC Freshman of the Year D.J. Cooper. In 2009-2010, Ohio led the Mid-American Conference in scoring offense (74.7 ppg) and also led the league in assist/turnover ratio and defensive rebounding – two statistical categories Holtmann places extreme importance in. Holtmann is no stranger to Gardner-Webb basketball. He spent five seasons as an assistant at GWU from 2003-2008, and was the program's Associate Head Coach in four of those seasons, proving to be a major asset in some of the program's most notable basketball moments. Under Holtmann's guidance, the Runnin' Bulldogs experienced a strong defensive surge, leading the Atlantic Sun Conference in three-point field goal defense in 2007-08 and ranking second in overall field goal defense in 2007-08 and 2004-05. During his time on the bench in Boiling Springs, Gardner-Webb pulled off memorable upsets of East Carolina (2004, 2005), Minnesota (2005) and No. 20 Kentucky (2007), and captured the Atlantic Sun Conference's regular season crown in 2004-05. GWU also advanced to the league's title game that season, going 18-12 against a difficult regular season schedule. Holtmann's recruiting efforts helped produce some of the most notable talent for Gardner-Webb in the Division I era, including a pair of recruiting classes ranked in the national top-100 by Hoop Scoop. The most recent of those top-100 classes included 2008 All-American and Atlantic Sun Conference Player of the Year Thomas Sanders. During Sanders' senior season, the Sugarland, Texas, native averaged 18.0 points, 10.8 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game, finishing third nationally with 20 double-doubles on the season. Sanders was the first GWU player to average a season double-double since Stan Easterling in 1998. Holtmann also recruited 2009 ESPN the Magazine Academic All-America guard Aaron Linn and 2008 Atlantic Sun Conference Freshman of the Year Nate Blank to Boiling Springs. Tim Jennings, another dynamic guard recruited by Holtmann, was the Atlantic Sun Conference Defensive Player of the Year in both 2004-05 and 2005-06 and is playing professionally in South America. Jennings was a key cog in teams that combined to win 35 games in two seasons (2004-2006). He earned a degree in psychology from Taylor in 1994 and a Master's in athletic administration from Ball State in 2000. He and his wife, the former Lori Bedi, have one daughter, Nora Jane, born May 19, 2010.

Gardner-Webb was 1-1 last season vs. the Southern Conference, beating Western Carolina and falling at Elon ... GWU is 0-1 this season vs. the MEAC after losing, 73-68, at South Carolina State on Nov. 19.

JUMP SHOTS

- Gardner-Webb has played 1,200 games as a senior college in men's basketball, winning 710 (59.2 %).
- In its 91-61 romp over Division II Lees-McRae, Gardner-Webb's top four guards – Jason Dawson, Max Landis, Laron Buggs and Tyler Strange – combined for 21 assists and just one turnover.
- The duo of Dawson and Landis each scored eight of Gardner-Webb's first 16 points in the team's loss at Indiana. They finished with 32 of the team's 49 points by game's end (65.3 percent).
- The Runnin' Bulldogs will play seven of their first eight games on the road this season.
- Gardner-Webb will battle three team's from BCS conferences this season: Clemson (ACC), Indiana (Big Ten) and Wake Forest (ACC). GWU will also face off with two-time NCAA runner up Butler on November 23.
- The Runnin' Bulldogs have outrebounded four of its first six opponents in 2011-2012, with only the ACC's Clemson and the Big Ten's Indiana beating the 'Dogs on the glass so far.
- Chris Holtmann has recruited three conference Freshman of the Year performers in his time on the sidelines: Nate Blank (GWU, 2008), Steven Coleman (Ohio, 2009) and D.J. Cooper (Ohio, 2010).
- The Big South Conference has four wins as a league over BCS/Big 6 conference foes so far in 2011-2012.
- The 2012 Advance Auto Parts Big South Conference Tournament begins on Monday, February 27, with seeds 8-11 playing a pair of first-round game at the higher seed. The quarterfinals begin on Wednesday, February 29 on the regular season champion's home court.

LET'S GO HOME SOON

Gardner-Webb will play its sixth and seventh games, respectively, away from home this weekend – the second season in a row that GWU has played at least seven road or neutral court games in its first 10 outings. The Runnin' Bulldogs head home for four-straight starting December 1 vs. Big South favorite UNC Asheville (5:30 pm tipoff).

MAD MAX

Freshman guard **Max Landis** (6-1, 175) has been on fire of late, shooting 58.1 percent overall (18-of-31) in the past three games to average a team-best 16.7 points per game. Landis hit his first five shots at Butler (11/23), scoring all 14 of his points in the first half to lift Gardner-Webb to a 50-35 edge at the break.

TRANSFERS IN TOW

Guards **Jason Dawson** (Wofford) and **Tashan Newsome** (Mississippi Valley State) will be available to play this season as four-year transfers, the first transfers to join the GWU program since the 'Dogs moved to NCAA Division I prior to the 2000-2001 season. Gardner-Webb also has guard **Jarvis Davis** (UCF) as a transfer, but Davis will have to sit out this season in accordance with NCAA transfer rules. Both Dawson and Newsome served their season of residency in 2010-2011.

PRESEASON PROJECTIONS VARY

Gardner-Webb was tabbed 10th out of 11 teams in the Big South's preseason poll, which is comprised of votes by the league's head coaches and two media members from each program's coverage area. The Runnin' Bulldogs were more highly thought of by Street & Smith's/The Sporting News, earning a preseason ranking of sixth by that respected publication. The Runnin' Bulldogs finished eighth last season and fell at top-seeded Coastal Carolina in the Advance Auto Parts Big South Conference Tournament quarterfinals on March 1.

ALL-STATERS

One source of optimism this season ad beyond for Gardner-Webb is its freshman class, which is headlined North Carolina Class 3A State Player of the Year **Donta Harper** (Winterville, N.C. / South Central HS) and Indiana All-State guard **Max Landis** (Indianapolis, Ind. / Perry Meridian HS). Harper (6-6, 180) led his Falcons to the state finals in 2011, and earned East MVP honors after scoring 23 points and grabbing 14 rebounds in a close loss. Harper was selected to play in the Jordan Brand Classic Regional Game in Charlotte last spring, after averaging 16.8 points, 8.4 rebounds and 3.5 assists per game as a senior. Landis (6-1, 175) was one of the best guards in the Hoosier State for two seasons, earning a spot on the prestigious Indianapolis Star Super Team as a junior and senior. Landis played in the same conference as current Kentucky freshman **Marquis Teague**, and outscored the McDonald's All-American in a matchup midway through last season. Landis averaged 24.2 points and 4.2 assists per game as a senior, narrowly missing a spot on the famed Indiana All-Star team – but earning All-State honors from the state's head coaches.

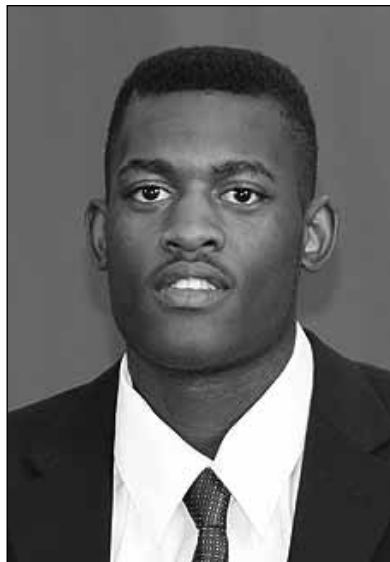

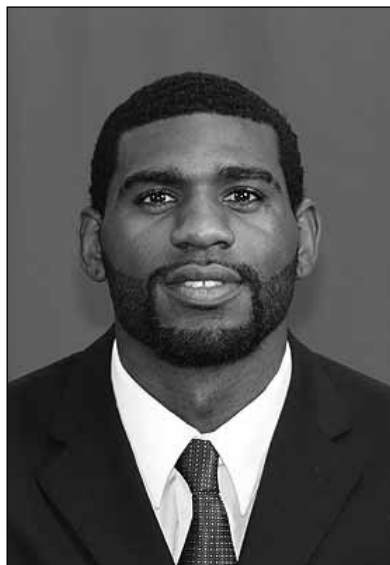

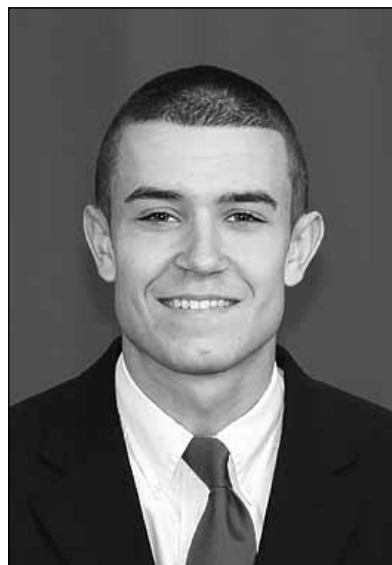
