STORY LINES

- Georgia Southern opens conference play tonight against Chattanooga and look to earn their first win over the Mocs in the last nine meetings.
- Senior **Willie Powers III** (Gainesville, Fla.) became the 38th member of the 1,000 point club at Georgia Southern with 13 points in the loss to Valparaiso.
- Sophomore **Eric Ferguson** (Statesboro, Ga.) scored his third career double-double in the season opener against Valpo, posting 20 points with 13 rebounds in the loss. He ranks among the league leaders in scoring with 16.0 points per game.
- Senior **Ben Drayton III** (St. Marys, Ga.) leads all active Southern Conference players with 1,182 career points.
- Sophomore **Jelani Hewitt** (Miramar, Fla.) scored 18 points against the Demon Deacons while draining five three-pointers on the night.
- Georgia Southern has the chance to become the sixth school in Southern Conference history to hold both the league's Football and Men's Basketball championships in the same season. Appalachian State did the trick in 1999-2000 while Wofford held both titles last season. Davidson earned both crowns in 1969-70. In the golden era of SoCon sports, Duke completed the sweep three times in the 1940's and West Virginia "turned two" five times.

NOW WELCOME TO THE FLOOR, THE CHATTANOOGA MOCS

Georgia Southern faces Chattanooga in the first of two meetings this season to open league play in 2011-12. The Eagles are 15-31 all-time against the Mocs and look to end a run of nine games without a victory. Georgia Southern won two against in 2008 and 2009 against UTC, but had the wins taken away by NCAA sanctions. Georgia Southern's last win over the Mocs came on February 4th, 2006 at UTC, 93-71. GSU's last home win over UTC was on 1-17-05, 107-84.

EAGLES LOOKING FOR WIN IN SOCON OPENER

Georgia Southern is 7-10 all-time in Southern Conference openers and haven't won a league opener since the 2005-06 season when GSU downed The Citadel, 83-65 in Charleston. The last SoCon Opener victory at home was on January 7th, 2003 with a 71-64 win over Furman.

A TALE OF EXTREMES AGAINST SOUTH FLORIDA

Georgia Southern's loss to South Florida on Thanksgiving Week was a statistically odd contest. Both teams were uncharacteristic in their field goal shooting percentages. The Eagles were averaging .500 from the field entering the game, and managed just a 36% night. The Bulls entered the contest shooting 43.7% and was lights-out, shooting 61% overall and 65% in the first half. It was the first game this season that USF shot over 50% in a game.

JELANI'S BIG NIGHT FROM BEYOND THE ARC

Jelani Hewitt got hot from beyond the arc in front of a national television audience against Wake Forest, scoring 18 points on five three-pointers. The sophomore from Miramar, Fla. was four-of-six in the second half from downtown.

HOT SHOOTING EAGLES

The Eagle offense has improved on its numbers from last season, shooting .500 overall in the seasons' first three games after posting a .449 percentage last season. Georgia Southern shot .491 in the first two games against Valparaiso and Wake Forest before raising their game for a .515 average in the win over Webber International. Last season's team shot better than .491 just seven times in all of 2010-11. Now through five games, the Eagles are .460 overall this season from the field.

PRESEASON POLL

Georgia Southern garnered a certain amount of respect from the Southern Conference Coaches and Media in the league's preseason polls. The coaches picked the Eagles third in the south division behind Davidson and College of Charleston. The third place selection placed the Eagles above Furman and two-time defending league champion Wofford which lost seven seniors from last year's squad. The league's media voted Georgia Southern fifth in the south division, but the Eagles received one first place vote.

MORE BLOCKS THAN TURNOVERS

Georgia Southern accomplished a rare feat against The Citadel last season by posting eight blocks and making seven turnovers in the game. The last time Georgia Southern accomplished the feat was 97 games prior, when the Eagles beat Wofford 77-66 and had four blocks and three turnovers in the game on Feb. 14, 2008.

BEN POSTS BIG NIGHT

Junior Ben Drayton posted Georgia Southern's biggest individual night of the 2010-11 season at Wofford (2-16) with 31 points off 11-of-16 shooting from the field (1-for-1 from downtown) and a solid 8-for-9 effort from the free throw line.

.500 IS THE KEY

Georgia Southern was 5-3 in 2010-11 when shooting .500 or better from the field. On the other hand, the Eagles are 1-14 when their opponent shoots over .500 from the field. In the Eagles' final preseason game, Georgia Southern shot .523 from the field to take a 97-56 win.

STEALING THE SPOTLIGHT

Three Eagles ranked in the top eight of the SoCon steals-per-game chart propelled Georgia Southern to No. 16 in the final national rankings as well as a second-place SoCon ranking (8.8). Jelani Hewitt (1.9) finished the season ranked second in the SoCon followed by Ben Drayton III (1.9). Eric Ferguson ranks eighth in the SoCon with 1.5 steals per game.

DRAYTON'S FIRST DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Junior guard Ben Drayton III reached a career milestone against Davidson last season as he posted his first career double-double. He scored 16 points and added a season-high 10 assists. It came just two games after he missed a triple-double against Furman by one point, one assist and one rebound.

DOUBLE-DOUBLES

Eric Ferguson snapped a 17-game streak of games without a double-double when he posted 20 points and 13 rebounds in the season opener against Valparaiso.

When Charlton Young stepped off the Hanner court as a player for the LAST time in 1993, there was no doubt in his mind that he would be back SOMEDAY.

Now at the helm of his beloved alma mater's basketball program and ready to author its future, C.Y. promises that games in historic Hanner Fieldhouse will never be the same again.

With his recognizable smile and surprising tears at the announcement of his hiring in April of 2009 as the head men's basketball coach at "THE" Georgia Southern University, Young returned to his alma mater and to Statesboro. He returned to guide the men's basketball program, he returned to lead young men, and he returned to elevate his team.

Many years along the way, even if he was not watching Georgia Southern games, he was watching for Georgia Southern - checking the ticker for scores and catching what he could of game films. His heart was never far from Eagle basketball.

Of course, to stage the return, Young first had to leave, and gain the coaching experience that only comes from being on the sidelines. Over 15 years of coaching, scouting reports, practices, the day in and out of collegiate basketball, with just a few trips through airports thrown in for good measure, Young

had the opportunity to learn from different coaches. From the lowest rung of the coaching ranks, Young worked, and worked, and worked, and watched, and listened. Every bit of information he could glean he would add to his collective knowledge - about coaching, about coaches, about players, about people.

His coaches and mentors helped contribute to the person, the player, and the coach he is today. His education on the court, however, started well before then. When his father, Anthony, put a basketball in his crib, it wasn't too much longer before he was in the backyard or at the park every day. Thousands of games, millions of crossover dribbles, calloused hands, scrapes, every one was a heralded badge of the playground player, and between the lines, Young found his sanctuary. Pickup games on the courts of Miami or at "The Pines," are just as much a part of his basketball DNA as his years coaching student-athletes.

Just as easily as he can reel off some of the best players he's ever seen, he can tell you where EXACTLY he was when he shot a certain basket. He can tell you the score, half the play-by-play, the attendance and whoever else might have had a great game that night. He can tell you about the low moments too, I-o-n-g road trips, conference battles on back-to-back days, or



a rare miscue, when he dribbled the ball off his foot, a turnover that ended that season's dream of an undefeated record in the league.

As a person, as a point guard, as a coach, he has always felt responsible. This trait, complimenting so many others, has made him into one of the - if not the - top recruiter in the nation. Young has been responsible for assembling some of the most talented student-athletes for each of his former schools, including the signing of the nation's top prospect last year.

Young, who had been an assistant coach at Georgia Tech for the previous four seasons, became the 12th head coach of the University's basketball team and the third alum to guide the program. J.E Rowe (1970-1974) coached Georgia Southern through four seasons and Doug Durham served as coach for the 1994-1995 year.

"I am constantly amazed at how his energy and enthusiasm for his alma mater have reinvigorated the interest in Georgia Southern basketball," said Director of Athletics Sam Baker. "His passion and his commitment to every aspect of both the program and the University are nothing short of inspiring."

If Young's playing career at Georgia Southern is an indication of his coaching career, there are plenty of inspiring moments to come. Young, who wore number 12 for the Eagles from 1989 to 1993, started 97 straight games at point guard. During that three-year span, he averaged 14.8 points and 4.9 assists per contest. In his junior and senior seasons, Young posted an assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.94 to 1. Named the Trans American Athletic Conference Most Valuable Player for his performances in three Eagle victories in the 1992 tournament, Young capped the championship victory over Georgia State with 20 points and eight assists, leading the Eagles to the NCAA Tournament.

A three-time All-Conference selection at point guard in two different leagues (Trans America Athletic:



1990-91, 1991-92; Southern: 1992-93), Young earned All-Tournament Team honors in both the TAAC and So-

Con and still stands in the 'Top 10' in numerous Georgia Southern statistical categories. His three-point percentage of 40.9 percent ranks number one on the Eagles career list, boosted by top-10 rankings for single-season performances in his junior and senior campaigns. Young owned the top spot in career assists (570) until Dwayne Foreman (588) succeeded him after the 2007-2008 season. His career total of 162 steals ranks fourth all-time on the Eagles career chart and his single-game record of eight (8) 3-point field goals lasted for more than a dozen years, eclipsed only on by Elton Nesbitt in the 2004-05 season.

"Charlton was a wonderful player who had a special love for the game and for people," said former Eagle head coach Frank Kerns, who recruited and coached C.Y. "Those loves, his boundless enthusiasm and outstanding resumé will make him a great head coach."

A Miami native, Young was a star player for Carol City High School in Miami and helped lead his squad to 66 wins against only seven losses during his final two seasons. A member of Carol City's Florida state championship title team as a junior, Young earned numerous awards and honors, including a nomination to the prestigious McDonald's All-America team.

Following his Georgia Southern career, Young played professional basketball in Tours, France, for the 1993-94 season and returned to campus to finish his degree. After graduation, Young served as the administrative assistant for the Auburn men's team from 1994-1996 then was promoted to assistant coach for the 1996-1997 season. He spent two years at Jacksonville as an assistant coach for Hugh Durham before joining Rudy Keeling's staff at Northeastern (1999-2000). Young signed on for a four-year stay at Auburn under Cliff Ellis then moved to a position as associate head coach at Tennessee-Chattanooga for the Mocs' 20-win season and 2005 NCAA Tournament appearance.

During his first coaching stop at Auburn, Young met Carolyn Jones, a two-time women's basketball All-America selection who led the Tigers to two Final Four appearances and went on to help the United States National Team capture bronze at the 1992 Barcelona Olympics. The couple married on August 8, 1998, and they are the proud parents four children: daughters Ariel and Audia and sons Isaiah and Nehemiah.

Young, who graduated from the University in 1994 with a bachelor of science degree in communication arts, was recognized as a Basketball Legend by the Southern Conference during the league's 75th anniversary celebration year in 1995. In September 2008, Young was honored by his alma mater when he was inducted to the Georgia Southern University Athletics Hall of Fame.

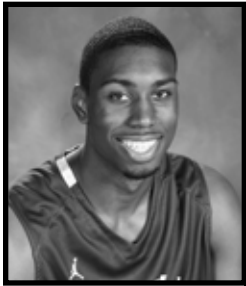

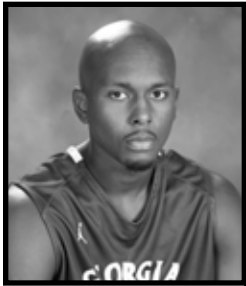
