THE SERIES: Mercer holds a slim 30-29 advantage in the non-conference series versus Chattanooga. These two teams first met in 1920-21 splitting a pair of games, with the Mocs winning the first battle (28-21) in Chattanooga and MU returning the favor on its home floor (26-15).

Most of the meetings between the schools took place in the 1920's through 1940's, with sporadic meetings up until the last meeting which took place on December 14, 1991. When last Mercer and Chattanooga met - nearly 10 years ago - it was the Bears who scored a 73-69 win in Macon.

Prior to that, the UTC won 10 of the last 13 meetings.

OPPONENT AT-A-GLANCE: The Southern Conference representative Mocs enter the game on a three-game losing streak (two of which have come in overtime). Chattanooga is 2-6 overall on the season.

Among the Mocs early-season setbacks are losses to Indiana and Butler to open 2011-12. UTC also lost at home to Mercer's A-Sun foe Kennesaw State by a 65-59 count.

UTC is coached by John Schuman (123-112), currently in his eighth season at the Mocs' helm.

Chattanooga is led in scoring by Ricky Taylor at 12.3 points per game and Omar Wattad, who checks in at 11.3 p.p.g.

The Mocs have been strong on the boards this season, paced by Drazen Zlovacic's 6.5 rebounds per game. Chris Early pulls down an average of 5.4 caroms per contest.

LAST TIME OUT: The Mocs are coming off of an overtime loss at the College of Charleston, 87-85, last Saturday. Five Chattanooga players hit in double figures in that game, led by 18 from Early. Keegan Bell had a double-double of 12 points and 10 rebounds.

MERCER BEAR FACTS

OFF TO A GOOD START - Mercer's 6-3 overall record to begin the 2011-12 season is its best start since the 2004-05 squad began the year with a 7-3 mark.

SOUTHERN COMFORT - The game versus Chattanooga will be Mercer's second-straight against a Southern Conference foe (coming off last Wednesday's OT win at Samford, 83-78).

TRYING FOR THE SOUTHERN SWEEP - The Bears will be looking for the sweep of the SoCon when they face Chattanooga. Mercer already has wins over SoCon members Furman and Samford (both on the road) in 2011-12.

LAST TIME OUT FOR MERCER - It had been more than eight full seasons since Mercer and Samford last tangled in men's basketball and the 104th edition of the rivalry was worth the wait as MU grabbed an 83-78 overtime win at the Pete Hanna Center. The contest featured 16 lead changes and six ties, with neither team leading by more than seven points in the game.

Langston Hall led all scorers with 18 points, hitting six-of-12 from the floor and five-of-six from the charity stripe. In all, four Bears tallied in double digits. Joining Hall in double figures were Justin Cecil, with 13 points, and Jakob Gollon with 12 points. Travis Smith, making his Mercer debut, responded with 10 points, four rebounds and three steals (nailing a trey for his first MU career points).

WORKING OVERTIME - The Bears' OT game at Samford was its first extended game since a 72-62 overtime win at home last February 10, 2011 at versus A-Sun foe Stetson. It also was MU's first road OT victory in its last three attempts, since Feb. 16, 2009 at Stetson (88-80).

NCAA STAT REPORT - The Mercer men's basketball team continued to well-represented in the second NCAA Division I statistical report released Monday, December 5. The Bears' team was 25th in field goal percentage defense at 37.0 percent (with opponents hitting just 162 of 438 attempts). Mercer was also 50th in defending the three-point shot, with foes hitting just 28.4 percent (48-169) from beyond the arc against the MU team.

Mercer was 35th as a team in free throw percentage at 74.3 percent (110-148) and ranked 54th in rebound margin, grabbing an average of 6.0 caroms per game.

Individually, redshirt sophomore Jakob Gollon is one reason for the Bears' high free throw rating as a team. Gollon stood at No. 14 in the nation, connecting on 93.1 percent (27-29) from the charity stripe.

Senior Justin Cecil was 39th in the nation for three-point field goal percentage at 45.5 percent.

Sophomore Daniel Coursey was 56th in the nation in blocked shots at 2.1 per game, which is atop the A-Sun, as well. Coursey leads the A-Sun in field goal percentage also, but barely missed the needed number of attempts necessary to qualify for the national stats.

GOOD AT REJECTION - Through the first 9 games this season, sophomore Daniel Coursey has amassed 18 blocked shots (including a season-high four swats versus both Lipscomb and Belmont in back-to-back games last weekend).

At his current rate of 2.0 blocks per game, Coursey would be on pace to challenge Wesley Dukes' 65 "swats" for the No. 2 spot on the season list for blocked shots. The top spot is 72 blocks by Scott Farley in 1995-96.

MAKING A POINT - Sophomore point guard Langston Hall made his 42nd-consecutive start as a Bear at Samford (12/7/11). That's every game of Hall's MU career without a missed start.

THE DEFENSE NEVER RESTS - Mercer is 4-0 when holding its opponents under 60 points in a game. In its three losses, the Bears' opponent scored more than 70 points.

AWWW SHOOT! - MU's loss at Belmont (12/3/11) was the first time this season that the Bears had out-shot an opponent from the field and still lost the contest.

THE LINE MATTERS - In all three of Mercer's losses in 2011-12, the Bears have shot less free throws than their opponents.

LOW PLACES - When the Bears held Sam Houston State to 38 points (60-38) in the first round of the CBE Classic Sub-Regional, it was the lowest opponent point total since December 11, 1976 when MU held Vanderbilt to 35 points (in a 35-33 loss to the Commodores).

JUSTIN TIME - Senior Justin Cecil not only led all scorers with 23 points in the win over Niagara (11/22/11), but also tallied his 200th career point as a Bear in the game. Cecil was named to the CBE's All-Tournament Team (Nov. 21-23) after averaging 13.7 points and 3.3 rebounds per game. Cecil shot nearly 52% from the field and hit 13-of-20 (65%) from beyond the arc. Cecil tied the CBE single game record with seven three's made vs. Niagara.

GETTING INTO THE ACT - Redshirt sophomore R.J. Miskimon tallied his first Mercer career points when he nailed a three-point basket in the Bears' win over Niagara (11/22/11).

HALL YES! - Sophomore point guard Langston Hall booked his 300th career point as a Bear in MU's loss to South Dakota State (11/23/11).

OVERCOMING THE ODDS - Redshirt sophomore Jakob Gollon - who received two medical redshirt years his first two seasons with MU after foot injuries - appeared in his 53rd game and made his 42nd-straight appearance versus Samford (12/7/11). Gollon scored his 200th career point in the win at Lipscomb (12/1/11).

THIS BOARDS FOR YOU! - Bud Thomas corralled his 100th career rebound in MU's win at Furman (11/17/11). Thomas added his 200th career point at Lipscomb (12/1/11)

CENTURY MARK - Junior reserve Chris Smith tallied his 100th career point for Mercer at Furman (11/17/11) and Justin Cecil grabbed his 10th career rebound as a Bear at Samford (12/7/11)

HOFFMAN'S 100 - The Bears loss at Mizzou (11/14/11) was MU head coach Bob Hoffman's 100th game courtside as MU's mentor.

"AYE" OPENERS! - The Bears are a perfect 4-0 in season-opening games during Bob Hoffman's tenure as head coach after Saturday's 66-57 win over Emory. MU has won five-consecutive lid-lifting games, overall. The last time MU dropped a season-opener was the tip-off of the 2006-07 campaign when it was defeated by then No. 9-ranked Wisconsin, 72-48.

GOOD FOR STARTERS - Daniel Coursey got the first start of his MU career versus Emory and played nearly half as many minutes (20) than he did all of last season (41). Coursey responded with 13 points, four rebounds, three blocks and was 5-of-7 from the field.

BREAKING THEM IN - A total of four Mercer players - T.J. Hallice, Darious Moten, Shaquille Harris and Jibri Bryan - made their debut as Bears in the season-opening win over Emory.

RE-STOCKING THE SHELVES - The Bears lost more than 67% of its scoring and 60% of its rebound totals off of its 2010-11 roster. The 2011-12 MU squad returns 22.0 p.p.g. and 11.6 r.p.g. from last season's totals.

YOUNG GUNS -The Mercer team fields one of its youngest rosters in recent memory, sporting just one senior and a total of 12 players who are either freshmen or sophomores in eligibility status. In all, MU welcomes back 11 letterwinners from 2010-11.

PLEASED TO MEET YOU - MU will be playing a total of five first-time opponents in 2011-12. All three teams in the CBE Classic sub-regionals in Macon (Nov. 21-23) - Sam Houston State (w. 60-38), Niagara (w. 74-55) and South Dakota State (l. 61-74) - had never played Mercer in men's basketball prior. Additionally, MU will have its inaugural meetings versus Seton Hall (Dec. 18) and Tulsa (Dec. 28) this season.

PRETTY GOOD AT IT - Mercer University is certainly no stranger to hosting top tournaments like the CBE Classic sub-regionals (Nov. 21-23, 2011). MU's campus has played host to the Atlantic Sun Conference basketball championships in both 2010 and 2011, and is also the host site for 2012 and 2013 tournaments, as well (the first time in A-Sun history that the men's championships have been at the same site for four-consecutive seasons!).

HOFFMAN MAKES HIS MARK - During his first three campaigns with the Bears, MU head coach Bob Hoffman has produced steadily-rising levels of success, as well as an exciting, fan-friendly brand of basketball. Entering 2011-12, his A-Sun record of 34-22 is the best league totals by an MU team for any three-year span since 2002-05 and is the first time in program history that Bears' teams have had three successive double-digit win totals in A-Sun play. It is also the first time since 1981 that MU teams have been .500 or better for three-consecutive seasons in the tough A-Sun slate of games.

A-SUN STAPLE - Mercer's men's basketball team is a charter member of the A-Sun Conference (formerly the Trans America Athletic Conference) and has qualified for all 27 A-Sun post-season tournaments in league history.

IN MEMORIAM - Richard Reid - who played basketball for the Bears from 1950-54 - died on October 29 after a lengthy battle with cancer. Reid ranks No. 14 on MU's all-time scoring chart with 1,246 points, averaging 11.4 points per game for his 109-game career. Reid is No. 8 in career field goals attempted with 1,240. Reid won more than 1,000 games in a career that spanned seven decades. Reid became known to many as the Tattnall Square girls coach (He spent 27 years total in that role), leading the Trojans to four GISA championships. He also won a boys state championship at Stratford in 1971 and a girls state title at Jones County in 1958. He won 13 other state championships in golf, tennis and slow-pitch softball. Reid is a member of the Mercer Sports Hall of Fame and the Macon Sports Hall of Fame.

MU lost another part of its history when Joe Dan Gold - who coached the Bears for one season in 1973-74 (16-8 record) - passed away this past summer.

BEARS ON THE AIR - Mercer University Athletics has once again renewed its contract with Clear Channel Broadcasting Inc. to serve as the flagship radio network for the University's men's basketball games in 2011-12. The broadcaster's FM station of Peach 96.5 (WPCH) will serve as the flagship station for all broadcasts this season.

Mercer's Atlantic Sun Conference games will be among the broadcasts, including the 2012 A-Sun Basketball Championships, to be played once again this year on the Mercer campus at the University Center.

Rick Cameron, the "Voice of the Bears", is in his seventh year calling the play-by-play for the Bears. Cameron, who is also Mercer's senior assistant vice president for marketing communications, returned to the broadcast booth in 2006 after originally doing radio play-by-play in the late 1970's. Cameron was the longtime public address announcer for both men's and women's basketball, as well.

"The Bob Hoffman Report" will also air each week during the season on Tuesday's at 8:05 a.m. on Fox Sports Radio 1670-AM in middle Georgia (sister station of The Peach) on The Morning Show with Charles Olson and Daniel Shirley.

NEXT UP FOR MU - Mercer will take a break for finals until its Sunday, December 18, game at Seton Hall (Noon ET tip-off). The game versus the Atlantic Coast Conference Pirates will begin a tough five-game road series in which the Bears also travel to Georgia (Dec. 20), Georgia Tech (Dec. 22), Tulsa (Dec. 28) and Navy (Dec. 30) to end calendar year 2011.

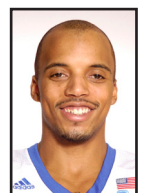

Upon his arrival at the helm of the Mercer University basketball program in 2008, Bob Hoffman made an immediate mark and has done so each season since. The new era in Mercer basketball officially began on March 27, 2008 when then athletics director Bobby Pope introduced Hoffman as the Bears' new head men's basketball coach.

A native of Oklahoma City, Okla., Hoffman has been successful at all levels and boasts a proven track record from high school through the professional ranks. His overall record as a head coach at the collegiate level is 448-220.

During his first three campaigns at the helm of the Bears, Hoffman has produced steadily-rising levels of success, as well as an exciting, fan-friendly brand of basketball. His A-Sun record of 34-22 is the best league totals for any three-year span since 2002-05 and is the first time in program history that Bears' teams have produced three successive double-digit win totals in A-Sun play. It is also the first time since 1981 that MU teams have been .500 or better for three-consecutive seasons in the tough A-Sun slate of games.

The 2010-11 Bears reached the Atlantic Sun Conference tournament for a third-consecutive year under Hoffman and produced much excitement along the way. The team went 15-18 overall - 11-9 in the A-Sun - and was the No. 5 seed in the conference's post-season tournament, despite losing two seniors (and scoring leaders) mid-season. MU advanced to the semifinals before being knocked out by eventual champion Belmont in what was arguably the best game of the entire tournament. Senior Brian Mills was named first team All-A-Sun, while point guard Langston Hall was named to the All-Freshman squad.

Hoffman's 2009-10 team produced many memorable Mercer moments, including advancing all the way to the title game of the Atlantic Sun Conference championships. MU garnered two All-A-Sun and two All-Region honors, while also having one of its own - senior Daniel Emerson - honored as the state of Georgia men's college basketball "Player of the Year" by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Naismith Awards banquet. Additionally, senior James Florence became the Bears' all-time leading scorer mid-way through the season. The team finished 16-17 overall and was 10-10 in the A-Sun.

He guided the 2008-09 Bears to a 17-15 overall record and 11-9 in Atlantic Sun Conference (A-Sun) play. It was the Bears' most wins since the 2002-03 season and their first winning mark in conference play since 2004-05.

Hoffman came to the Bears after serving as head coach of the Rio Grande Valley Vipers, a NBA Developmental League franchise, and guided the American Basketball Association's Arkansas Aeros to a 25-2 record in 2006-07. The Aeros led the league in scoring, averaging 133 points per game in Hoffman's up-tempo style of basketball.

"Bob Hoffman was the first person we interviewed for our coaching position and he remained on the radar throughout the process," Pope said. "In the end, we felt he was the right fit. We feel that his experience and success at all levels, including high school, NAIA, NCAA D-I and professional basketball, made him the ideal choice to lead our program to prominence."

Prior to coaching the Aeros, Hoffman served for two years as an assistant coach at the University of Oklahoma, where the Sooners recruited a class ranked in the top five nationally. Hoffman helped guide the Sooners to the first Big 12 championship in school history en route to a two-year record of 45-17 and back-to-back NCAA appearances in 2004-05 and 2005-06.

He brings a wealth of additional experience to the position, having served as head coach at the University of Texas Pan American from 1999-2004, compiling a 69-76 record at the NCAA Division I school. The highlight of Hoffman's stint with the Broncs was a 21-9 record during the 2001-02 season.

Hoffman guided UTPA to 12 wins in his first season, which was more than the previous three seasons combined, and posted the school's best record since the 1993-94 campaign. In 2001-2002, Texas Pan-Am had its first winning season since 1993-94, earned their first tournament victory since 1989-90, and recorded the most home wins in eight seasons. The Broncs were rated for the first time ever in the *CollegeInsider.com* Mid-Major poll and Hoffman earned National Independent Coach of the Year honors by *CollegeInsider.com*.

"I am very excited about the potential at Mercer," Hoffman said. "I was overwhelmed by the prospects we saw when we visited the campus. I could tell that the Mercer administration is committed to developing a highly successful men's basketball program."

Challenges are nothing new to him as he turned programs around at Southern Nazarene and Oklahoma Baptist.

As the head women's basketball coach at Southern Nazarene, Hoffman took a team that had never posted a winning season and won the 1989 NAIA National Championship in just his second season with the team. In three seasons at the helm of the Crimson Storm, he compiled an 88-16 record and was named Sooner Athletic Conference, District 9 and NAIA Coach of the Year.

Building on his success at Southern Nazarene, Hoffman took the reins of the men's program at his alma mater, Oklahoma Baptist, in 1990 and three seasons later guided the Bison to a 34-4 record and berth in the NAIA national championship game. Hoffman was named National Coach of the Year by *Basketball Times* and also earned Sooner Athletic Conference and District 9 Coach of the Year honors

for his efforts. He went on to a record of 243-78 and a winning percentage of .757 in nine seasons at OBU, earning six trips to the NAIA Tournament and making two trips to the championship contest.

He coached 10 All-Americans and 21 All-Conference selections during his tenure with the Bison. Hoffman was named Sooner Athletic Conference Coach of the Year four times. During his nine years at OBU, Hoffman's teams averaged more than 90 points per game and led the NAIA in field goal percentage seven times. His commitment to academics is just as strong, boasting a player graduation rate of 82 percent.

A standout guard and forward and a 1979 graduate of Oklahoma Baptist, Hoffman is one of just 30 players to score at least 1,000 points in his OBU career.

Hoffman has been married for 31 years to the former Kelli Lumry. The couple has a 15-year-old son, Grant.
