Dr. Pepper Classic

Longwood is participating in its second tournament this season with this appearance in the Dr. Pepper Classic December 29-30 hosted by the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. The Lancers also played in the exempt, four-game Chicago Invitational Challenge November 18-26. LU will play host Chattanooga on the first day (12.29), and either Hampton or Utah Valley on day two (12.30).

Looking At The Last Game

Longwood took an early 17-6 lead just 4:47 into the contest before talented Seton Hall (11-1) responded well and led 45-33 at halftime en route to its eighth-straight win, 87-61. Antwan Carter led the Lancers with 20 points and nine rebounds, and Jan van der Kooij contributed a season-high 19 points along with seven rebounds. LU shot 43% (23-54) from the field, including 41% (9-22) on three-point field goals, and 55% (6-11) at the free throw line. The Pirates were led by Jordan Theodore with a career-high and game-high 26 points, and Fuquan Edwin with 20 points to tie his career-high. SHU shot 57% (36-63) from the field, including 36% (8-22) on three-pointers, and 50% (7-14) at the line. The game was televised live on FOX College Sports (FCS Atlantic) and produced by the SPORTSfever Television Network from Marietta, Pennsylvania, and drew a supportive and much-appreciated local crowd of 773 just two days before Christmas.

Looking At Longwood

Longwood is 4-8 overall, including an uncharacteristic 3-3 at home while 0-4 on the road and 1-1 in neutral-site contests. Senior center Antwan Carter (17.1 points, 9.0 rebounds), senior guard Jeremiah Bowman (13.3 points, 5.6 assists), and sophomore transfer guard Tristan Carey (11.8 points) continue to lead the Lancers this season. They have been joined in the lineup by senior guard Martiz Washington (9.0 points, 25 3FGs) and senior forward Jan van der Kooij (7.3 points). LU averages 74.3 points while shooting 44% from the field, including 37% on three-point field goals (9.0), and 63% at the line -- allowing opponents 84.3 points. The Lancers are now 35-12 (.745) at home in Willett Hall during the past three-plus seasons.

Head Coach Mike Gillian

Mike Gillian (North Adams State '86) was named the seventh head coach for men's basketball at Longwood on May 2, 2003. The Ayer, Massachusetts native is 79-176 overall with the Lancers, including 4-8 this season, along with a career-best record of 17-14 during 2008-09 when Gillian earned 2009 Independent Coach of the Year honors from ColleagueInsider.com. He previously had been an assistant coach for current Miami (Fla.) head coach Jim Larranaga while at George Mason for six years (1997-2003) following a year with Coach Larranaga at Bowling Green State (1996-97).

Looking At Chattanooga

Chattanooga is coached by John Shulman who is in his eighth year with the program, compiling a record of 125-114, including 4-8 this season following a 95-41 home win past Hiwassee (12.21). Senior guard Ricky Taylor (12.8 points, 25 3FGs) and senior forward Omar Wattad (11.9 points, 31 3FGs) have led the Mocs, joined in the lineup by redshirt-junior forward Drazen Ziovaric (9.7 points, 6.5 rebounds), redshirt-senior guard Keegan Bell (7.6 points, 6.9 assists), and redshirt-junior guard Dontay Hampton (6.4 points). Chattanooga averages 71.4 points while shooting 42% from the field, including 38% on three-point field goals (9.1), and 67% at the line -- allowing opponents 65.8 points.

Looking At Hampton

Hampton is coached by Edward Joyner, Jr. who is in his third year with the program, compiling a record of 32-45, including 4-8 this season following a 64-54 road loss at Robert Morris (12.20). Senior guard Darrion Pellum (17.6 points, 26 3FGs) and sophomore center David Bruce (11.9 points, 8.9 rebounds) have led the Pirates, joined in the lineup by junior guard Jasper Williams (7.8 points, 22 3FGs), senior guard Mike Tuitt (7.1 points, 4.7 assists), and senior forward Orin O'Bryant (2.3 points). Hampton averages 62.3 points while shooting 40% from the field, including 30% on three-point field goals (5.9), and 64% at the line -- allowing opponents 65.5 points.

Looking At Utah Valley

Utah Valley is coached by Dick Hunsaker who is in his 10th year with the program, compiling a record of 173-105, including 6-8 this season following a 65-52 road loss at Montana (12.22). Senior guard Isiah Williams (14.5 points, 33 3FGs) and senior forward Geddes Robinson (10.9 points, 10.1 rebounds) have led the Wolverines, joined in the lineup by sophomore center Ben Aird (8.7 points, 6.4 rebounds), sophomore guard Holton Hunsaker (7.2 points, 2.4 assists), and senior forward Keith Thompson (6.6 points). Utah Valley averages 66.1 points while shooting 42% from the field, including 28% on three-point field goals (4.8), and 66% at the line -- allowing opponents 65.3 points.

Series History

Longwood and Chattanooga are meeting for the second time in the sport as Chattanooga took a 74-70 win in Texas during the 2009 South Padre Island Invitational (11.28.09). Longwood and Hampton would be meeting for the fourth time in the sport as Hampton leads the series at 2-1, including a most recent 95-81 home win in Hampton (3.1.10). Longwood and Utah Valley would be meeting for the sixth time in the sport as Utah Valley leads the series at 5-0, including a most recent 80-52 home win in Utah (1.15.07).

Veteran Southpaw Leading The Way

Antwan Carter, the fourth-year team member and left-handed post player, continues to lead Longwood with his averages of 17.1 points and 9.0 rebounds while shooting 55% (85-155) from the field, including 44% (10-23) on three-point field goals, and 63% (25-40) at the free throw line – adding 18 assists, 11 blocks, and eight steals. He is the team leader in points (205), scoring average, field goals, field goal attempts, field goal percentage, rebounds (108), rebound average, offensive rebounds (39-3.3), defensive rebounds (69-5.8), blocks, minutes (412-34.3), and dunks (1). Carter has 12 consecutive double-figure scoring games this season, 23-straight to last season, and four double-doubles (31 for his career). **He may just be the best college basketball player that folks outside of Farmville and the Commonwealth of Virginia have never heard of** as only one returning Division I men’s basketball player (Iona’s 6-7 Mike Glover-18.4 points, 10.1 rebounds) averaged more points and rebounds last season than Antwan’s 18.2 points and 9.5 rebounds.

Climbing The Record Book

Antwan Carter continues to climb the career record book at Longwood, ranking fifth in scoring (1,490), second in rebounds (831), fourth in field goals (621), sixth in field goal percentage (.551, 621-1127) and in field goal attempts (1127), and seventh in blocks (72). He will soon become only the second player in the program’s history with at least 1,500 career points and 800 career rebounds, joining former Division II All-American and 17-year NBA veteran Jerome Kersey ‘84 (1,756p - 1,162r).

All-Tournament Team Honors

Antwan Carter was named to the Chicago Invitational Challenge All-Tournament Team for his four-game efforts during the exempt event played November 18-26. Carter averaged 16.3 points and 5.8 rebounds while shooting 56% (29-52) from the field with two three-pointers, and 71 % (5-7) at the free throw line along with seven assists, five blocks, and two steals against Brigham Young (11.18), Nevada (11.22), Prairie View A&M (11.25), and UMKC (11.26).

On A Dime

Jeremiah Bowman, a second-year team member, has been impressive this season with averages of 13.3 points and 5.6 assists while shooting 49% (56-114) from the field, including 33% (5-15) on three-point field goals, and 69% (43-62) at the free throw line, adding 20 steals. He has dished out 53 assists in his last eight games (6.6), including two games of 10 or more and another of nine. Twice this season, he has played all 40 minutes, including against Canisius (11.15) while posting a career-high 27 points (11-15 FG, 1-2 3FG, 4-6 FT), and at Nevada (11.22) while posting his first career double-double with 12 points and a career-high 11 assists. Bowman is the team leader in free throws, free throw attempts, assists (67), and steals. He has nine double-figure scoring games and two double-doubles.

This Guy Knows How To Make A Debut

First-year team member Tristan Carey led Longwood in scoring with 17 points off the bench against Navy (11.11) in his first game for the Lancers, adding seven rebounds, two assists, two steals, and two blocks. He followed that with 19 points, six rebounds, two steals, two blocks, and one assist at Nevada (11.22) while making his first start for Longwood. Carey did it once again with 19 points, 10 rebounds, eight assists, and two steals against South Carolina State (12.2) while making his first start at home for the Lancers. He is averaging 11.8 points, 4.9 rebounds, and 3.1 assists while adding 22 three-pointers, 14 steals, and eight blocks through his first 12 games with the program. Carey scored a team season-best and career-high 30 points against VMI (12.12), and followed with 20 points at Vanderbilt (12.19). He is 21-39 (54%) from the field in his last three games, including 14-24 (58%) from three-point territory, adding 12 assists (4.0). Carey is the team leader in three-point attempts (65).

The X Factor

Tristan Carey is a transfer student-athlete from La Salle University of the Atlantic 10 Conference. He started one of 17 games at La Salle two years ago and averaged 2.4 points and 1.3 rebounds. He was the 2009 Virginia Group A and Virginia High School Coaches Association (VHSCA) Group A, Division I Player of the Year at Colonial Beach, averaging 29.5 points, and his season total of 884 points tied for the third-highest season total in Virginia High School League history behind Moses Malone and Allen Iverson. A prolific scorer in high school, Carey posted a school-record 2,481 career points at Colonial Beach. He has four cousins with notable sports careers: Jermon Bushrod currently plays for the New Orleans Saints, and Torrey Smith plays for the Baltimore Ravens, while Joe Posey played basketball at James Madison, and Chris Johnson played basketball at LSU.

Beyond The Arc

Martiz Washington, another fourth-year team member, continues to add to his school record with 215 career three-point field goals, earning this record distinction with his four three-pointers against Canisius (11.15). Last year, he had established a new season record for three-point field goals (85). Washington also ranks first in career three-point field goal attempts (571), and seventh in three-point field goal percentage (.377, 215-571). He is averaging 9.0 points, including a team-leading 25 three-pointers, with five double-figure scoring games. Washington leads the team in three-pointers and three-point attempts (65).

Not To Be Forgotten

Jan van der Kooij (7.3 points, 4.8 rebounds) is yet another fourth-year team member and scored a season-high 19 points against Seton Hall (12.23). A southpaw from The Netherlands, he moved into the starting lineup a year ago after starting just one of 32 games totaling 145 minutes during his first two years. van der Kooij started 20 of 21 games before an injury last year, averaging career highs of 7.3 points, 4.9 rebounds, and 1.1 assists while playing 524 minutes. He posted a career-high 20 points, a season-high 10 rebounds, and a career-high five assists along with six double-figure scoring games before missing the final 10 games with the injury.

Sophomores Now & Getting Better

Second-year team members David Robinson (guard), Mark Parker (guard-forward), and Jeff Havenstein (forward) each saw plenty of action a year ago as true freshmen; they're seeing even more time this season. Robinson (39-43 career FTs, .907) has played in every game, averaging 15.2 minutes and 5.8 points with a career-high 13 points against Virginia Interment (11.13). He leads the team in free throw percentage (.813, 13-16). Parker (38-69 career 3FGs, .551) has played in 11 games, averaging 10.1 minutes and 4.4 points with a season-high 10 points at Nevada (11.22). He leads the team in three-point percentage (.520, 13-25). Havenstein (18-24 career FTs, .750) has played in every game as well, averaging 13.8 minutes and 2.5 rebounds with a career-high eight rebounds against UMKC (11.26). He has a sister (Holly, 21) who plays basketball at Colgate, and a twin brother (Robby, 19) who plays football at Wisconsin.

Through December 18, Longwood ranked 11th nationally in fewest turnovers per game (11.1), 12th in assist|turnover ratio (1.49), 20th in three-point field goals (8.9), 22nd in assists (16.5), 56th in scoring (76.0), and 82nd in turnover margin (+2.3). Individually, Jeremiah Bowman was ranked 30th in assist|turnover ratio (2.67), 38th in assists (5.6), and 93rd in field goal percentage (51.5). Antwan Carter was ranked 45th in field goal percentage (55.7) and 49th in rebounds (8.9). Martiz Washington ranked 49th in three-point field goal percentage (41.7) and 80th in three-point field goals (2.5). Tristan Carey was ranked 82nd in assist|turnover ratio (2.07). In the Division I Sagarin Ratings Index through December 25, Longwood was rated 323 among 345 programs; Utah Valley was at 238, Chattanooga was at 277, and Hampton was at 296.

2011-12 Mileage Totals

Longwood will travel to 12 states for 16 true road games and three neutral-site games on the schedule, including first-time visits to the states of New Hampshire, Tennessee, and Washington. The Lancers will travel approximately 19,772 miles this season, including 11,997 miles on airplanes, and 7,775 miles on chartered buses. Thus, Longwood will travel the equivalent of 7.39 trips across the United States from East Coast to West Coast as it's approximately 2,675 miles from Washington, D.C. to Los Angeles. Unfortunately, such frequent travel and high mileage is nothing new to the Lancers' Division I Independent program that traveled a high of approximately 21,222 miles during 2004-05, the school's first year of competition against a full Division I schedule.

It Adds Up ... To An Unkind Road

Prior to this season, Longwood had traveled to 29 different states and Washington, D.C., and including this season, the Lancers have now played 132 games (17-115, .129) away from Farmville during the last seven-plus years of Division I scheduling (2004-05). This is an average of 18.3 non-home games per year, and includes totals of 112 true road games and 20 neutral-site games. Unfortunately, the results in these contests have not been kind to the road-weary program ... Longwood is 11-101 (.098) in the true road games while 6-14 (.300) in the neutral-site games. This year, the Lancers are currently 0-4 on the road and 1-1 in neutral-site contests.

Home Sweet Home

Longwood sports an impressive home record of 56-27 (.675) at Willett Hall over the past six-plus seasons, including 35-12 (.745) during the past three-plus years. The Lancers were 10-4 at home last year after a 9-3 home record during 2009-10 that followed an outstanding 13-2 home effort during 2008-09. Longwood was 7-5 in 2007-08, 6-6 in 2006-07, and 8-4 in 2005-06, and the program is 260-136 (.657) all-time through 31-plus seasons in Willett Hall. The Lancers averaged a school-record attendance of 1,185 over the 14 home games played during 2010-11, including a record crowd for James Madison (1,963) that was the first-ever Live TV contest at the facility, and the average was a school-record 1,322 during the 11 games with students on campus. Through six home games this season, Longwood is 3-3 while averaging 1,046 in attendance, including a season-high 1,779 for the opener against Navy (11.11).

Combatant In Willett Hall

Longwood has won at least two home games during each of the past six seasons that maybe some did not expect. These home court wins since 2005-06 include seven past in-state schools: Liberty (3), James Madison (2), Norfolk State (1), and William and Mary (1). The wins in order are Liberty (88-75, 11.30.05), James Madison (77-73, 2.18.06), American (81-79 OT, 12.30.06), Liberty (76-70, 2.15.07), Norfolk State (80-67, 11.13.07), Stetson (78-76, 12.29.07), Liberty (79-68, 2.22.08), Gardner-Webb (85-84, 11.18.08), James Madison (79-76, 12.3.08), George Washington (80-78, 1.3.09), Campbell (88-80, 12.22.09), High Point (70-66, 2.2.10), Columbia (95-76, 11.20.10), William and Mary (83-81, 12.29.10), and Campbell (72-62, 1.25.11). VMI (110-89, 12.12) has been added to the list this season.

The Three-Point Stat

Longwood has made at least one three-point field goal in 281 consecutive games, dating back to a road game at Division II Lenoir-Rhyne (11.26.02), including a school-record 20 three-pointers made at home recently against VMI (12.12). The Lancers ranked 20th nationally in three-point field goals per game this year (through games of December 18), including six games with at least 10 three-pointers: VMI (20, 12.12), South Carolina State (12, 12.2), Canisius (11, 11.15), at Nevada (11, 11.22), at Vanderbilt (10, 12.19), and Virginia Intermont (10, 11.13). The streak, however, was in jeopardy against UMKC (11.26) during the Chicago Invitational Challenge at the Sears Centre Arena in Hoffman Estates, Illinois as the Lancers made just one three-pointer with 9:18 remaining in the game (Mark Parker).

LONGWOOD BASKETBALL | 2011-12

Against the Commonwealth

Longwood has played 12 of the other 13 Commonwealth of Virginia Division I member institutions since 2004-05. These include Hampton (1-2), James Madison (2-4), Liberty (3-3), Norfolk State (2-1), Old Dominion (0-2), Radford (0-1), Richmond (0-3), Virginia (0-6), Virginia Tech (0-2), VCU (0-3), VMI (1-3), and the College of William and Mary (1-3). The Lancers are 29-51 all-time against these state schools, including 10-33 since 2004-05 when LU began playing a Division I schedule for the first time. This year's schedule still includes a game against Norfolk State with a possible game against Hampton at the Dr. Pepper Classic December 30 in Chattanooga, Tennessee. The only DI member in Virginia that has not been on the Longwood schedule is George Mason, though the Lancers have scrimmaged against the Patriots on two occasions, including just prior to the start of the 2005-06 season when George Mason made its remarkable run to the Final Four.

Playing Nationally-Ranked Opponents

Longwood has played six nationally-ranked teams since its first full Division I schedule in 2004-05. They include games at #1 Illinois (L 105-79, 2004-05), #6 Wake Forest (L 88-47, 2004-05), #17 Cincinnati (L 95-69, 2004-05) in Las Vegas, #4 Villanova (L 90-77, 2005-06) in Atlantic City, #8 Indiana (L 100-49, 2007-08), and #7 Kansas (L 113-75, 2010-11). The Lancers have also competed against such historic and storied programs as Kentucky, Maryland, Marquette, Providence, San Francisco, Vanderbilt, and Virginia; and other nationally prominent programs as Boston College, Brigham Young, Colorado, Florida, George Washington, Kansas State, Louisiana Tech, Navy, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, Northern Iowa, Oklahoma, Seton Hall, Southern California, Valparaiso, Virginia Tech, and West Virginia.

First-Time Opponents

Longwood will play 11 first-time opponents this season, including Canisius (L 83-87, 11.15), Brigham Young (L 60-92, 11.18), Nevada (L 78-80, 11.22), Prairie View A&M (W 70-67, 11.25), Vanderbilt (L 71-99, 12.19), Army (1.3.12), Brown (1.11.12), Dartmouth (1.14.12), Eastern Kentucky (1.22.12), Seattle (2.11.12), and Gonzaga (2.27.12). The first-time foes represent the following conferences: Southeastern (SEC), West Coast, Western Athletic (WAC), Ohio Valley (OVC), Metro Atlantic Athletic (MAAC), Ivy League, Patriot League, and the Southwestern Athletic (SWAC).

First-Ever Live TV Home Game

Longwood hosted its first-ever Live TV game last season (2010-11) against James Madison (12.1.10) as SPORTSfever Television Network from Marietta, Pennsylvania produced the home game for national coverage on FOX College Sports (FCS Atlantic). It was the first-ever telecast of a Longwood intercollegiate sports event on campus from Willett Hall. FCS Atlantic is available nationwide via most digital cable providers as well as the DIRECTV® satellite network. Jon Schaeffer (play-by-play), Manager of Media Relations & Broadcasting for the Philadelphia Phillies' Triple-A Affiliate Lehigh Valley IronPigs, and a former Longwood radio play-by-play announcer along with former Bucknell (1975-94) and William and Mary (1994-2000) head coach Charlie Woollum (color analyst) served as the game's announcers. The highly-anticipated contest was played before a hugely supportive and raucous record-crowd of 1,963. Unfortunately, JMU rallied from a 41-36 halftime deficit to the Lancers to win 88-78.

Five TV Appearances This Season

Longwood will play a program-high five games on television this season, including two home games in Willett Hall -- against Canisius (11.15) and Seton Hall (12.23) -- that were carried by the FOX College Sports Network with national coverage, nonetheless, on FCS Atlantic and Mid-Atlantic Sports Network (MASN). Produced by SPORTSfever Television Network, Jon Schaeffer and Charlie Woollum served as the games' announcers. The other three televised games included at Brigham Young (L 60-92, 11.18) on BYUtv and at Virginia (L 53-86, 12.3) on FOX Sports South, along with a late-season game at Gonzaga (2.27.12) to be televised on ROOT Sports.

Previous TV Appearances

Longwood has played four national TV games: at #8 Indiana during 2007-08 (The Big Ten Network, 11.18.07), along with the home games against James Madison (12.1.10), Canisius (11.15), and Seton Hall (12.23). The Lancers have played on regional TV 10 times since 2004: vs. #17 Cincinnati in Las Vegas during 2004-05 (FOX Sports Ohio), at Nebraska to open 2005-06 (FOX Sports Midwest), at Kentucky during 2008-09 (FOX Sports Net South), at Florida during 2008-09 (SUN Sports), at South Carolina during 2009-10 (FOX Sports South), at Maryland during 2009-10 (Comcast SportsNet Plus), at #7 Kansas during 2010-11 (ESPN Full Court), at Colorado during 2010-11 (FSN Rocky Mountain), and this season at BYU (BYUtv) and at Virginia (FOX Sports South). Additionally, the Lancers have been on local cable TV at VCU (2005-06, 2007-08), Liberty (2005-06, 2006-07, 2007-08), IPFW (2005-06), Utah Valley (2004-05, 2006-07), and CSU Bakersfield (2009-10).

Chicago Invitational Challenge

Longwood participated in the exempt, four-game Chicago Invitational Challenge Nov. 18-26. The first two games of the tournament for the Lancers took place on the road at Brigham Young (L 92-60, 11.18) and Nevada (L 80-78, 11.22) before the opportunity to play two neutral-site games at the Sears Centre Arena in Hoffman Estates, Illinois against Prairie View A&M (W 70-67, 11.25) and UMKC (L 93-53, 11.26). Wisconsin and Bradley were also in the eight-team field, the second LU appearance in the Chicago Invitational (2007). Unfortunately, Longwood was 0-4 in the event that season with road losses at #8 Indiana (100-49) and Kent State (80-62) before the two neutral-site losses to UNC Wilmington (80-65) and Southeast Missouri State (82-78) at the Sears Centre Arena. Wisconsin won the championship over BYU, while UMKC took the Upper Division title.

Team Captains

Longwood head coach Mike Gillian named his four senior team members as captains this season. Jeremiah Bowman, Antwan Carter, Jan van der Kooij, and Martiz Washington are each serving in this team leadership role for the first time.

Spanning The Globe

Longwood team members were born in six different states, the District of Columbia, and two European countries. The list includes Virginia (Stephen Shockley, Tristan Carey), Florida (Antwan Carter), Maryland (Jeff Havenstein, David Robinson), New Jersey (Anthony Taylor), New York (Jeylani Dublin), North Carolina (Mark Parker), and Washington, D.C. (Jeremiah Bowman), along with Germany (Martiz Washington) and The Netherlands (Jan van der Kooij).

Longwood Signs Three During Early Period

Longwood signed three individuals to its 2012 recruiting class during the recent National Letter of Intent early signing period, November 9-16. Those who will join the Lancers for 2012-13 include Frank Holloway of Alexandria, Virginia via Garrett College in Maryland; Kirk Staine of Baldwin, New York via Baldwin High School; and Lucas Woodhouse of Greenlawn, New York via Harborfields High School. Holloway, a 6-6 forward, averaged 13.8 points and 8.4 rebounds while shooting 57% from the field and 72% at the free throw line last season. Staine, also a 6-6 forward, averaged 2.4 points, 3.2 rebounds, and 1.0 blocks a year ago. Woodhouse, a 6-1 point guard, averaged 10.0 points and 11.0 assists while leading his high school team to the New York Class A State Championship game as a junior. He was a first team Newsday All-Long Island selection last year.

Did You Know ...

Longwood has produced professional athletes in seven different sports, and three former Lancers enjoyed more than a decade of success at the highest levels: Tina Barrett '88 (LPGA, 1989-2007), Jerome Kersey '84 (NBA, 1984-2001), and Michael Tucker '93 (MLB, 1995-2006). Kersey won an NBA Championship in San Antonio (1999), while Tucker is the school's first and only Olympic Athlete (1992). Ironically, both Kersey and Tucker graduated from the same rural Virginia High School (Bluestone HS in Clarksville). Additionally, Barrett (2007) and Kersey (2009) have each delivered Commencement addresses in recent years at Longwood, and all three were inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame on November 27, 2005 as members of the inaugural Class of 2005. Actor Ransford Doherty '97 has appeared in such TV shows as Bones, The Closer, The Office, Las Vegas, Joan of Arcadia, Jonas, Malcolm in the Middle, NYPD Blue, ER, JAG, and MTV's Undressed; while his movie credits include Something Like A Business, The Orphan, Hostage, Among Thieves, and Silent Warnings.



It's Elwood

Elwood is in its first year serving as the official mascot for Longwood University during 2011-12. A well-received strong and muscular-appearing 'Horse' character plays on the Lancer Logo while connecting to a part of the school's culture and history as well. A Longwood Spirit Initiatives Committee was formed last March (2011) with a presidential charge to establish a new mascot. Longwood President Patrick Finnegan had appointed Director of Athletics Troy Austin to chair a committee of faculty, staff, students, and alumni to work on finding a new mascot. Elwood is a costumed individual celebrating the Longwood school spirit. There is no intention to change the school's athletics nickname and/or logo.

Roster Change

Durann Neil, a fifth-year team member, made the decision to end his time with the program. He had started four of five games earlier this season, averaging 5.8 points and 2.6 assists. Neil will remain at Longwood as he is expected to graduate in May 2012 with a Bachelor of Science degree in criminology and criminal justice, including a minor in political science.

HEAD COACH MIKE GILLIAN

Mike Gillian is in his ninth year at Longwood University during 2011-12, having been named the school's seventh men's basketball head coach on May 2, 2003. He has built an NCAA Division I program from the ground up since his arrival, including the four-year Reclassification from Division II (2003-07). Prior to 2011-12, Coach Gillian's eight-year overall record at Longwood was 75-168, including an overall home court record of 56-44 in Willett Hall where the program is an impressive 53-24 over the past six years. The Lancers were 12-19 overall during 2010-11 to equal their second-best record during Gillian's tenure.

Longwood finished 2009-10 with a final record of 12-19 as well, after the Lancers completed 2008-09 with a record of 17-14, their best record under Gillian and highest win total since beginning Division I scheduling in 2004-05, and the most wins for the program overall since 2000-01. Longwood had an impressive home record of 13-2, their best since 1993-94, and the +8 turnaround tied for 18th-best in Division I. For his efforts, CollegeInsider.com named Gillian the 2009 Independents Coach of the Year. The 17 wins also tie for the ninth-most in the 35-year history of the program.

Longwood posted back-to-back identical 9-22 records during both 2006-07 and 2007-08, following a 10-win season during 2005-06 (10-20) that tied as the seventh-best turnaround season in Division I (+9.5) that year. Since receiving Division I certification for 2007-08, the program is 50-74 overall with an outstanding home record of 39-14. The Lancers have played a total of 143 games outside of Farmville during the last eight seasons, including 122 true road games (13-109) and 21 neutral-site games (6-15).

Longwood is competing for the fourth-straight year with its full allotment of 13 scholarship student-athletes after playing with 12 during 2007-08 following two years (2005-06, 2006-07) with 11 scholarships. The Lancers finished 1-30 during 2004-05, their first year competing against a full Division I schedule with nine scholarships. Longwood was 5-22 during 2003-04, the first year under Coach Gillian as well as year one of the transition to Division I with just seven scholarships.

"Over the course of the last eight seasons we have taken the Longwood Basketball Program through the stages of gaining respectability and being noticed to becoming competitive and being taken seriously, to having successes and raising our profile. The team we are going to put on the floor this season is an experienced, veteran group that has all the qualities that are necessary to go beyond all of that and do something special. They are a group of players and coaches who understand what it takes to go above and beyond expectations and what it really means to be representing a fabulous institution like Longwood while doing so.

"We are really excited about the schedule as it turned out this year. Once again the goals in scheduling were accomplished; playing a few of the best teams in all of college basketball, playing in incredible and historic venues, continuing to play other schools here in the state of Virginia, and most importantly, having a great slate of home games for our fans to come out and watch here at Longwood. The 2011-12 season is here ... and we are ready!"

Prior to his arrival at Longwood, Coach Gillian had been an assistant coach at George Mason University under head coach Jim Larranaga from 1997-2003. He had also worked under Larranaga for one season at Bowling Green State (Ohio) University (1996-97) before moving with him to George Mason. Gillian played a role in the recruitment of several members of the Mason team that shocked the world of college basketball during the 2005-06 season while advancing to the Final Four in Indianapolis.

During Gillian's six seasons as an assistant coach at Mason, the Patriots went 100-74 overall with a 66-34 Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) record, winning two CAA Tournament championships (1999, 2001) and two CAA regular season titles (1999, 2000). He counts George Evans, currently playing overseas, among the many standout players he helped coach at GMU. George Mason also earned two NCAA Tournament appearances (1999, 2001) and made one National Invitation Tournament (NIT) appearance (2002). The Patriots were 57-18 overall at home in the Patriot Center, posting a 41-8 CAA home court record.

At Bowling Green, the Falcons finished 22-10 while winning the 1997 Mid-American Conference (MAC) regular season title (13-5) and earning an NIT appearance. MAC Player of the Year Antonio Daniels, currently a member of the NBA's Washington Wizards, led that BGSU team.

Prior to joining Larranaga at BGSU, Gillian was an assistant coach at Division II American International (Mass.) from 1989-95. During that six-year stint working for current Indiana Pacers assistant coach Jimmy Powell, the Yellow Jackets went 117-58 overall with a 75-33 Northeast-10 Conference (NE-10) record, winning both the NE-10 regular season and tournament championships in 1994 (26-6). American International also advanced to the second round of the Division II Tournament that year.

Gillian has been a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) since 1989. He was a YES Clinic speaker at the Division I Men's Final Four from 1998-2000, and again in 2007 in Atlanta, and has extensive public speaking experience through his involvement with numerous booster, local business and civic organizations, and charity events. Since arriving at Longwood, Gillian has appeared on ESPN2's Cold Pizza, become a weekly in-season guest on Richmond Sports Radio 910 (The Final Round With Wes McElroy, The Mike Maniscalco Show), served as the same station's NCAA Tournament Analyst, co-hosted his own in-season Mike Gillian Show on Farmville's Kickin' Country 92.9, served as that station's NCAA Tournament Analyst, co-hosted a monthly morning sports talk radio show on Farmville's WFLO AM 870, and has been interviewed by numerous sportswriters, radio personalities, as well as Internet writers and bloggers.

Gillian was a four-year letterman as an undergraduate at Division III North Adams State (now the Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts), and served as a team captain during his final two years. He received a Bachelor of Science degree in business administration from North Adams, and earned a Master of Business Administration degree from American International.
