while senior guard Darrion Pellum added 11 points.

Utah Valley (6-8) dropped its third straight game on Dec. 22, falling 65-52 at Montana, despite 12 points from sophomore center Ben Aird and 10 rebounds from senior forward Geddes Robinson.

Tennessee Chattanooga (4-8) picked up its second win in three games on Dec. 21, defeating Hiwassee 95-41. Senior guard Ricky Taylor led the Mocs with 21 points, while red-shirt-junior guard Dontay Hampton and freshman forward Jared Bryant each added 14 points - and Bryant added a team-high seven rebounds.

Longwood (4-8) dropped its second straight game on Dec. 23, losing 87-61 to Seton Hall. Senior center Antwan Carter led the Lancers with 20 points and nine rebounds, while senior forward Jan van der Kooij added 19 points.

### THE SERIES IN-DEPTH

Since moving to Div. I in 1995, the Pirates have not faced either Tennessee Chattanooga or Utah Valley. The Pirates are 2-1 against Longwood, having won the last two meetings - including a 95-81 defeat in Hampton, Va. on March 1, 2010.

### PIRATES AGAINST THE GREAT WEST

The Pirates are 2-0 all-time against teams from the Great West, having won both of their match-ups against Chicago State. Hampton has never faced Houston Baptist, NJIT, Texas-Pan American or Utah Valley.

### PIRATES ON THE ROAD

The Pirates went 8-5 on the road last season, winning three of their last four regular-season road games in 2010-11 - including the last two at Delaware State (71-64) and at Howard (83-72). The Pirates dropped their 2011-12 road opener on Nov. 17, falling 72-51 at Richmond before losing 66-52 at Rutgers on Nov. 20 and 54-53 to Fordham on Dec. 5, 74-72 to American on Dec. 7, 74-65 at Liberty on Dec. 17 and 64-54 to Robert Morris on Dec. 20. For his career as a head coach, Ed Joyner is 14-20 on the road - 0-6 this season.

### PIRATES ON NEUTRAL COURTS

The Pirates are 2-1 on neutral courts so far this season, having split a pair of games in Cancun, Mexico on Nov. 22-23 (beating SIU-Edwardsville 68-64 and falling 78-71 to Sacred Heart) and defeating arch-rival Howard 71-53 in the Big Apple Classic at Madison Square Garden on Dec. 4. For his career as a head coach, Ed Joyner is 12-5 on neutral courts.

Guards Darrion Pellum and Kwame Morgan lit up opponents in 2010-11, both in the MEAC and in non-conference play, and the conference took notice. Pellum was named First Team All-MEAC after finishing second in the MEAC in scoring with an average of 17.5 points a game, and in steals with 1.7 per contest. Pellum scored in double figures 29 times last season.

Morgan, who was named Second Team All-MEAC, led the MEAC and was eighth in the NCAA in 3-pointers made with 100 and hit 36.6 percent of his 3-pointers - eighth-best in the MEAC. Morgan scored in double figures 26 times last season and made five 3-pointers or more in five games. He also hit game-winning 3-pointers on Dec. 22 against Liberty and Jan. 1 against Colorado State.

## TOURNAMENT HONORS FOR THE PIRATES

On top of receiving All-MEAC honors, guards Darrion Pellum and Kwame Morgan were recognized for their respective performances in the MEAC Tournament. Pellum was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player after averaging 17.7 points, 5.3 rebounds and 2.3 steals in those three games - including 23 points in the quarterfinals against Maryland Eastern Shore and five steals against Norfolk State in the semifinals. Morgan was named to the All-Tournament Team after averaging 18.7 points and 4.6 rebounds per game in the tournament. He poured in 30 points in the semifinals against Norfolk State, going 9-for-20 from the field, 4-for-9 from 3-point range and 8-for-8 from the free throw line. Head coach Edward "Buck" Joyner Jr. was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Coach.

## PIRATES IN THE NCAA RANKINGS

Forward Danny Agbelese and guard Kwame Morgan were among the NCAA's best in specific categories last season, giving the Pirates a presence among the elite of Div. I. Agbelese, who had 101 blocks last season, averaged 3.1 per contest - which was the eighth-best average in the NCAA. Morgan made 100 3-pointers last season - the eighth-most in the NCAA - while his average of 3.0 treys per contest was good enough for 14th in the nation.

## LIVING ON DEFENSE

The Pirates were a defensive presence last season, and it showed in the NCAA statistical rankings. Hampton finished 2010-11 fourth in the country in field goal percentage defense, only giving up 38.4 percent of shots to opponents. The Pirates were also 10th in the nation in blocked shots, averaging 5.6 per contest as a team.

Hampton only allowed 31.7 percent of all 3-pointers to be made, the 36th-best 3-point field goal percentage defense in the nation, and the Pirates were 43rd among all Div. I teams in scoring defense, only giving up 62.7 points per contest.

## ABOUT THE 2011-12 PIRATES

Coming off a year in which they went 24-9 overall and won the MEAC Tournament crown, the Pirates were picked to finish second in the MEAC this season, behind Morgan State. On top of that, top returning scorer Darrion Pellum, a senior guard, was named Preseason First Team All-MEAC.

Pellum led the Pirates and was second in the MEAC in scoring last season, pouring in 17.5 points per game as he scored in double figures 29 times in the 32 games he played. He was a First-Team All-MEAC selection last season, and he was also named the MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Player after averaging 17.7 points and 5.3 rebounds in three games.

In all, Hampton returns its top two scorers from last season, though senior guard Kwame Morgan (Who averaged 16.1 points per game last season) might miss the season with a knee injury. Senior forward Danny Agbelese is the team's top re-

turning rebounder, having pulled down 6.0 boards a contest last season.

Agbelese is also the team's top shot blocker from last season; Agbelese finished the 2010-11 season eighth in the nation with 3.1 blocks per game. Agbelese recorded at least one block in 29 of the 33 games the Pirates played last season, and his 101 total blocks are the fourth-most in a single season in program history.

The Pirates, in their third season under head coach Edward "Buck" Joyner, also welcome newcomers Jasper Williams (a 6-foot-2 guard transferring from Tennessee-Chattanooga) and sophomore center David Bruce (from Harcum Community College). Joyner will also have at his disposal forward Orin O'Bryant and center Emmanuel Okoroba, both of whom redshirted last season for the Pirates.

### LAST TIME OUT FOR THE PIRATES

MOON TOWNSHIP, Pa. (Dec. 20, 2011) -- The woes of the Hampton University men's basketball team continued Tuesday night, as the Pirates fell 64-54 to Robert Morris at the Sewall Center.

Hampton (4-8) lost its fourth game in a row, and its sixth straight road game, as the Pirates woes continued against Robert Morris (9-3). Despite shooting 40 percent (20-for-50) from the floor, a tough second half hurt the Pirates.

Robert Morris (9-3) shot about the same, making 19 of 49 shots (38 percent) on the night.

Hampton opened with a 5-3 lead, thanks to sophomore forward David Bruce (Linden, N.J.), who scored all five points for the Pirates. Robert Morris would answer with a 9-0 run, before senior guard Darrion Pellum (Hampton, Va.) made a jumper in the lane to make the score 12-7 at the 13:09 mark.

The Pirates would spark a run of their own, when junior guard Aaron Austin (Newport News, Va.) drained a deep 3-pointer to kick off a 15-7 run that pulled Hampton within two points, 24-22, with 5:19 left in the first half.

Hampton would go on to score six more points to end the half down 31-28.

The Pirates struggled shooting the ball in the second half, making just eight field goals. Despite the poor shooting, Hampton pulled within two points early in the second half, 36-34, following a 3-pointer from senior guard Mike Tuitt (Bronx, N.Y.).

Hampton got as close as within four points on two different occasions, with the final one coming at the 10:00 mark in the second half when Bruce made a layup. Robert Morris would turn that into a 12-point lead after going on a 10-2 run to make the score 57-45.

Hampton couldn't get any closer, as the Colonials went up by as many as 14 points before the Pirates got back within 10 points for the final margin of the game.

The Pirates were led by Bruce, who recorded his third double-double of the season with a team-high 16 points and a game-high 13 rebounds. Pellum also scored in double figures for Hampton with 11.

Robert Morris was guided by Velton Jones, who led three other Colonials in double figures with a game-high 18 points. Also scoring in double figures for Robert Morris were Lucky Jones with 16, Mike McFadden with 11 and Coron Williams, who finished with 10.

### LAST TIME OUT FOR THE MOCS

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. (Dec. 21, 2011) - Ricky Taylor's 21 points paced the Chattanooga Mocs (4-8) to a 95-41 victory over visiting Hiwassee (4-11) in McKenzie Arena. Taylor's 21 puts him 10 points shy of 1,000 for his career.

He got help from junior Dontay Hampton and Jared Bryant, who each scored 14 points. Hampton's came mostly from three-point range hitting four-for-five beyond the arc. Bryant, making his first collegiate start, grabbed a game-high seven rebounds.

The Tigers were led by Brandon Carpenter and Ty Johnson with seven points apiece. Johnson added five rebounds and five steals.

Chattanooga took control of the game after Cody Carson's jumper got the Tigers within seven of the Mocs, 16-9, at 13:42. UTC held Hiwassee without a basket for the next 11:31.

Taylor keyed a 27-0 Mocs run with 16 points over that time span. At one point, he scored 13 straight during the run. The run led UTC to a 45-15 lead at the break.

The closest Hiwassee came was 24 points, 50-26, on a Carpenter layup at 15:56. Nearly three minutes later, with the score 58-29, Chattanooga pulled away via a 16-1 run capped by a Lance Stokes (Orlando, Fla.) layup and free throw at 7:28, to make it 74-30.

### LAST TIME OUT FOR THE WOLVERINES

MISSOULA, Mont. (Dec. 22, 2011) -- Utah Valley battled host Montana to a 28-28 tie at the break, but a big, second-half run propelled the Grizzlies to victory, 65-52. Ben Aird scored a team-high 12 points in UVU's final pre-Christmas game.

"I was pleased with the way we competed, particularly in our comeback in the first half," said UVU head coach Dick Hunsaker. "We started the second half strong, but we need to be more consistent with our effort offensively and defensively in our ability to concentrate and make every possession of value."

UVU (6-8) fell behind 24-13 in the early going after a Montana (7-5) layup with 8:04 remaining in the half, but the Wolverines took over the remainder of the frame. Highlighted by the play of Isiah Williams and Alfonzo Hubbard, UVU closed out the half on a 15-4 run. The duo hit back-to-back threes to trigger the run, cutting the deficit to 24-19 with 6:02 left, and forcing a Montana timeout.

Minutes later, with the half drawing to a close, Williams intercepted a Montana outlet pass in the Wolverine zone and then drilled a deep three despite being fouled just 0.9 before the halftime buzzer. Williams would miss the free throw, but the steal and three shifted momentum to the Wolverines heading into the break.

Riding the momentum of Williams' buzzer beater, UVU scored seven of the first eight points of the second half to jump ahead 35-29 just two minutes into the second half. But Montana got a bucket from Mathias Ward, followed by back-to-back treys from Selvig and another from Jamar to recapture the lead at 40-35 with 16:18 to play.

That sequence for the Grizzlies sparked what would become a huge, 27-5 run, jumping the lead out to 56-40 just past the six-minute mark. Montana would hit two more threes during the rally, and closed out the second half shooting

60% from the field.

## LAST TIME OUT FOR THE LANCERS

FARMVILLE, Va. (Dec. 23, 2011) -- Longwood University dropped an 87-61 men's basketball decision to visiting Seton Hall University of the BIG EAST Conference Friday night at Willett Hall in Farmville. The Lancers (4-8) took an early 17-6 lead just 4:47 into the contest before the talented Pirates (11-1) responded and led 45-33 at halftime en route to their eighth-straight win.

LU was led by senior Antwan Carter with 20 points and nine rebounds, and classmate Jan van der Kooij with a season-high 19 points and seven rebounds. SHU was led by Jordan Theodore with a career-high and game-high 26 points, and Fuquan Edwin with 20 points to tie his career-high.

Longwood made six of its first eight shots, including five three-point field goals -- three by van der Kooij, to take an early 17-6 lead at 15:13. A stunned Seton Hall team, however, settled down and scored 10 unanswered points to close to within 17-16 at 10:56 as Edwin scored five quick points.

The Lancers added yet another three-pointer as sophomore David Robinson connected at 10:41 for a 20-16 lead before the Pirates scored five-straight points to take their first lead at 21-20 with 9:25 on the first-half clock. LU was still within 28-26 at 6:50 on van der Kooij's fourth three-pointer of the half, but SHU closed the period with a 17-7 run to lead 45-33 at the intermission.

van der Kooij had 15 points at the break, and Carter had 12 points despite earning his third foul just 5:41 into the game; ironically, Carter collected Longwood's first three team fouls of the contest, and the flow of the game definitely turned at that point in the game.

Theodore and Edwin each had 13 points at halftime for the visitors.

## STREAKS

The Pirates have won nine of their last 18 games dating back to last season, despite suffering their fourth straight loss at Robert Morris on Dec. 20. Chattanooga has won two of its last three after a 95-41 win over Hiwassee on Dec. 21, while Utah Valley has lost three straight after losing 65-52 at Montana on Dec. 22. Longwood's 87-61 loss to Seton Hall on Dec. 23 was its second straight defeat.

## SCOUTING CHATTANOOGA

Chattanooga went 16-16 last season, finishing in a tie for first in the SoCon with a 12-6 conference mark. The Mocs, under eighth-year head coach John Shulman, return four starters and seven letterwinners from last year's squad, and were picked to win the North Division in the SoCon this year.

Senior guard Ricky Taylor leads the Mocs in scoring so far this season, pouring in 12.8 points per game, while senior

forward Omar Wattad is second with an average of 11.9 points a contest. Redshirt-junior forward Drazen Zlovacic is the team's top rebounder, pulling down 6.5 boards a night to go with 9.8 points per game.

Chattanooga is averaging 71.4 points per game on offense, while giving up 65.8 points a night.

## SCOUTING UTAH VALLEY

The Wolverines went 19-11 last season, winning the Great West conference title in the process with an 11-1 mark in league play. Utah Valley, under the direction of 10th-year head coach Dick Hunsaker, returns four starters and nine letterwinners from last year's squad, and the Wolverines were picked to repeat as Great West champions.

Senior guard Isiah Williams is Utah Valley's leading scorer, pouring in 14.5 points per game, while senior forward Geddes Robinson is second in scoring with 10.9 points per contest and the team's top rebounder with 10.1 boards a contest.

The Wolverines score 66.1 points a game, while giving up 65.3 points a night.

## SCOUTING LONGWOOD

The Lancers went 12-19 last season competing as a Div. I independent. Longwood, under ninth-year head coach Mike Gillian, returns four starters and 10 letterwinners this season, and the Lancers will again compete as an independent.

Senior center Antwan Carter leads three Lancers in double figures in scoring, averaging 17.1 points a game to go along with a team-high 9.0 rebounds a night. Senior guard Jeremiah Bowman is second in scoring with 13.3 points per contest, while sophomore guard Tristan Carey is averaging 11.8 points per game.

The Lancers are scoring 74.3 points a game, while giving up 84.3 points per contest.

## PIRATES IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

Since moving up to NCAA Division I competition in 1995, the Pirates have four previous trips to the NCAA Tournament - most recently last season, when Hampton fell 87-45 in the second round to top-seeded Duke.

Prior to last season, the Pirates were last in the NCAA Tournament in 2006, when the Pirates fell 71-49 to Monmouth in the opening round game in Dayton, Ohio.

Hampton's most famous trip to the NCAA Div. I Men's Basketball Tournament is also its first; in 2001, the MEAC champion Pirates, coached by Steve Merfeld, upended No. 2 seed Iowa State 58-57 in Boise, Idaho on a 4-footer from Tarvis Williams with 6.9 seconds left to play. Williams led the Pirates (25-6) with 16 points and 13 rebounds that afternoon, while Marseilles Brown added 14 points and LaSean Howard poured in 10 points.

Williams' bucket not only gave Hampton a win for the ages - and marked just the fourth time in tournament history a No. 15 seed had defeated a No. 2 seed - but it also provided one of the tournament's most vivid images: Merfeld, lifted into the air by David Johnson, fists and feet raised into the air.

The Pirates would fall in the second round that year to Georgetown 76-57.

Hampton also made the NCAA Tournament in 2002, falling 78-67 as a No. 15 seed to No. 2 Connecticut in the first round of the East Regional.

### SEASON THREE FOR JOYNER

Edward Joyner Jr. is entering his third year as head coach of the Hampton University men's basketball program, looking to build on the success to which he helped lead the program in 2010-11.

Joyner led the Pirates to the 2011 MEAC Tournament championship in his second season, guiding Hampton to a 24-9 record - marking the first time the Pirates won 20 games since the 2001-02 season. The Pirates were the No. 2 seed in the MEAC Tournament, defeating Morgan State 60-55 in the championship game to win the tournament and win the automatic NCAA bid for the first time since 2006.

Hampton earned a No. 16 seed, facing top-seeded Duke in the second round.

Joyner saw two of his athletes earn All-MEAC honors, as junior guard Darrion Pellum was named First Team All-MEAC after finishing the season second in the conference in scoring and junior guard Kwame Morgan was named Second Team All-MEAC after a breakout season. Pellum, the MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Player, was also named VaSID Second Team All-State, BASN HBCU Second Team All-American and NABC All-District 15, while Morgan was named a Lou Henson All-American and NABC All-District 15.

The Pirates overcame offseason tragedy and went 14-18 in 2009-10, Joyner's first season as head coach, finishing tied for fifth in the MEAC with an 8-8 record. He led the Pirates to the MEAC Tournament semifinals, beating archrival Norfolk State in the quarterfinals 73-70. Despite struggling to find consistency for much of the season, Hampton won six straight games to close out the regular season and open the MEAC Tournament, before falling to top seed Morgan State 74-67 in the semifinals.

Senior guard Vincent Simpson earned Second Team All-MEAC honors for the second straight year under Joyner, leading the team with 14.1 points per game. Both Simpson and senior forward Michael Freeman eclipsed the 1,000 career point mark in 2009-10.

As an assistant coach, he helped develop such players as Simpson, first team all-conference guard Rashad West, the MEAC's leading scorer in 2006, and Michael Freeman, the 2006 MEAC Rookie of the Year. As academic coordinator, Joyner guided the men's basketball program to the highest team GPA in 10 years.

### SEASON EIGHT FOR SHULMAN

John Shulman took over as the 17th Head Men's Basketball Coach in the rich history of the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga basketball program on April 23, 2004. He wasted little time building upon that tradition.

In four of his seven seasons (2005, 2008, 2009 & 2011), Chattanooga has won the Southern Conference North Division title. Two of those years (2005, 2009) saw the Mocs capture the SoCon Tournament Championship and advance to the NCAA Tournament immersed in all that is "March Madness".

Only one other SoCon program (Davidson) boasts as many division titles during Shulman's tenure with four as well. The Mocs' three in the last four years are the most in the league in that time.

His teams have won 15 or more games every season as head coach. He is the only coach in school history to do that in a career spanning more than two seasons.

Shulman's intensity and passion for the game are evident whether on the sideline, in practice or even in his office where you seldom find him without game film on his television or computer monitor. He is a high-energy coach and person.

His commitment to the student-athlete is also easy to see. In February 2010, the City of Chattanooga and Hamilton County governments honored him with Distinguished Citizen Awards presented by the mayors of each government in a ceremony at the city's Criminal Justice Building. He and the Mocs were applauded by the government officials for the team's sterling example on and off the court.

Shulman's tactical skills are evident in his record in close games or with a lead. In his seven seasons, his squads are a remarkable 109-5 (.879) when leading with five minutes to play. His Mocs are 47-22 (.681) when the score is within five points, regardless of who is leading.

### SEASON 10 FOR HUNSAKER

During his successful 30-year coaching career, Dick Hunsaker's players have demonstrated desire, determination and discipline while on the basketball court. These characteristics have led to successful collegiate basketball teams and players competing at the next level.

A telling example of Hunsaker's success was the 2001 University of Utah basketball team. After only one game, the Utes head coach, Rick Majerus, took a leave of absence from coaching. Utah administrators turned to Hunsaker to take over the team. He led the team to an 18-12 record, winning the Mountain West Conference and garnering local and national attention.

Hunsaker was named Mountain West Coach of the Year and Los Angeles Times National Coach of the Year.

Hunsaker has brought attention and success to Utah Valley in transitional years when some teams struggle. In fact, Utah Valley finished with a 22-7 record in the 2006-07 season, the best record by a Division I Independent since Notre Dame's 1985-86 year.

During the following off-season, Hunsaker was rewarded for his success with a five-year contract renewal. Hunsaker's efforts have not gone unnoticed as he earned Street & Smith Independent Coach of the Year three straight years. In 2007, Hunsaker was named the Independent Coach of the Year as voted upon by the Independent head coaches and sports information directors. Hunsaker was also tabbed as the Independent Coach of the Year by Collegeinsider.com.

In the Wolverines first two seasons with a full Division I schedule they compiled back-to-back 16 win seasons. Such success is not common for teams competing in their first season of Division I basketball. In fact, in the last 25 years, only three out of 74 teams making their initial jump to Division I play have won over 16 games.

### SEASON NINE FOR GILLIAN

## 2011-12 HAMPTON PIRATES BASKETBALL

Mike Gillian is in his ninth year at Longwood University during 2011-12, having been named the school's seventh men's basketball head coach on May 2, 2003. He has built an NCAA Division I program from the ground up since his arrival, including the four-year Reclassification from Division II (2003-07). Coach Gillian's eight-year overall record at Longwood is 75-168, including an overall homecourt record of 56-44 in Willett Hall where the program is an impressive 53-24 over the past six years. The Lancers were 12-19 overall during 2010-11 to equal their second-best record during Gillian's tenure.

Longwood finished 2010-11 with a final record of 12-19 as well after the Lancers completed 2008-09 with a record of 17-14, their best record under Gillian and highest win total since beginning Division I scheduling in 2004-05, and the most wins for the program overall since 2000-01. Longwood had an impressive home record of 13-2, their best since 1993-94, and the +8 turnaround tied for 18th-best in Division I. For his efforts, ColleagueInsider.com named Gillian the 2009 Independents Coach of the Year. The 17 wins also tie for the ninth-most in the 33-year history of the program.

Longwood posted back-to-back identical 9-22 records during both 2006-07 and 2007-08, following a 10-win season during 2005-06 (10-20) that tied as the seventh-best turnaround season in Division I (+9.5) that year. Since receiving Division I certification for 2007-08, the program is 50-74 overall with an outstanding home record of 39-14. The Lancers have played a total of 143 games outside of Farmville during the last eight seasons, including 122 true road games (13-109) and 21 neutral-site games (6-15).

Longwood is competing for the fourth-straight year with its full allotment of 13 scholarship student-athletes after playing with 12 during 2007-08 following two years (2005-06, 2006-07) with 11 scholarships. The Lancers finished 1-30 during 2004-05, their first year competing against a full Division I schedule with nine scholarships. Longwood was 5-22 during 2003-04, the first year under Coach Gillian as well as year one of the transition to Division I with just seven scholarships.

Prior to his arrival at Longwood, Coach Gillian had been an assistant coach at George Mason University under head coach Jim Larranaga from 1997-2003. He had also worked under Larranaga for one season at Bowling Green State (Ohio) University (1996-97) before moving with him to George Mason. Gillian played a role in the recruitment of several members of the Mason team that shocked the world of college basketball during the 2005-06 season while advancing to the Final Four in Indianapolis.

### PELLUM POURING IT ON

Junior guard Darrion Pellum earned First Team All-MEAC honors in 2010-11 for a reason; he finished the season second in the MEAC in scoring with 17.5 points per contest, scoring in double figures 29 times in the 32 games he played. Pellum scored a career-high 34 points against Dominican on Dec. 29, while pouring in 33 points at High Point on Nov.

28 behind a career-high 19 free throws. Pellum scored at least 20 points nine times last season, and he was named the Most Outstanding Player of the MEAC Tournament after averaging 17.7 points and 5.3 rebounds in those three contests. Though he only scored nine points against Duke in the second round of the NCAA Tournament, Pellum became the 26th player in program history to eclipse the 1,000-point mark for his career. Pellum - who was a Preseason First Team All-MEAC selection - has 1,215 career points and has scored at least 20 points in six of Hampton's 12 games so far this season - including a season-high 28 against Sacred Heart on Nov. 22.

### BRUCE CRASHING THE BOARDS

So far this season for the Pirates, sophomore center David Bruce has already pulled down double-digit rebounds twice. The transfer from Harcum Community College pulled down 12 rebounds in his Hampton debut against William & Mary on Nov. 12, before adding another 10 rebounds at Richmond on Nov. 17, a career-high 13 boards against Savannah State and 11 rebounds at Fordham. Bruce recorded his third double-double of the season on Dec. 20 at Robert Morris with 16 points and a career-high-tying 13 rebounds. His 8.9 rebounds per game so far this season are the best on the team, and he is second on the team in scoring with 11.9 points per contest.

### WILLIAMS LIGHTS-OUT FROM DOWNTOWN

Jasper Williams, a guard transferring from Tennessee-Chattanooga, has made himself right at home behind the 3-point line already for the Pirates. He leads the team in 3-point field goal percentage, making 22 of his 64 shots from distance so far this season (34.4 percent). Williams went 3-for-5 from behind the arc in a 68-64 win over SIU-Edwardsville, as well as against Howard on Sunday, and he hit 3-for-6 from distance Nov. 20 at Rutgers. Williams is third on the team in scoring, averaging 7.8 points a game.

### A BLOCK PARTY FOR AGBELESE

Senior forward Danny Agbelese, a transfer from Collins Community College, has already made his presence felt for the Pirates on the inside - to the tune of averaging a team- and MEAC-high 3.1 blocks per game last season, the eighth-best average in all of Div. I. Agbelese had 101 blocks in 33 games last season, the fourth-most in program history behind Marvin Childs (110 blocks, 1990-91), including a career-high seven at High Point. Agbelese had a streak of 26 straight games with at least one block - a streak that was snapped at Delaware State on Feb. 26; he had four blocks each against Winthrop, Boston University, George Washington and Howard. Agbelese recorded six blocks in back-to-back games at the Hilltop Classic against Dominican and San Francisco. He also had five blocked shots, all in the first half, against Norfolk State on Jan. 15, and he added six blocks at North Carolina A&T. He tied his career high against Bethune-Cookman on Feb. 19 with seven blocked shots. Agbelese also pulled down 6.0 rebounds a contest in 2010-11 - the second-best average on the team.

Agbelese recorded his first three blocks of the season at

Rutgers on Nov. 20, before adding two more against Sacred Heart and blocking a shot against SIU-Edwardsville. He also had three blocks against High Point, and Agbelese has recorded a block in 10 straight games, including three against Howard, averaging 1.5 blocks per contest so far this season.

## THE BOOK ON HAMPTON - 2011-12 SEASON OUTLOOK

The Hampton University men's basketball program, led by head coach Edward "Buck" Joyner Jr., came into the 2010-11 season focused solely on basketball, and the results were instantaneous; a 7-1 start to the season eventually morphed into a 24-9 overall record, an 11-5 conference mark and the No. 2 seed in the MEAC Tournament.

Not only did the Pirates win 20 games for the first time since 2001-02, they made their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2006. Whereas the 2009-10 season marked by tragedy and loss, the 2010-11 season for the Pirates was one of tremendous growth and pride.

Joyner, coming into his third year with the program, will look to continue that trend, thanks to a bevy of returning players and a batch of newcomers promising to take the program to bigger and better things.

## 2010-11: YEAR IN REVIEW

The Pirates opened the 2010-11 season in the Dick's Sporting Goods NIT Season Tip-Off, falling in their season opener on the road against Wake Forest 63-56. But Hampton bounced back with a seven-game winning streak - a span that included NIT wins over Winthrop, Boston University and George Washington, while the Pirates also defeated Howard in the Big Apple Classic for their first MEAC win of the season.

A 55-53 loss to Delaware followed, but Hampton won three straight - including a 62-59 win over Liberty on Dec. 22, thanks to a 3-pointer from junior guard Kwame Morgan with one second left on the clock. Morgan struck again against Colorado State in the Hilltop Classic in San Francisco, Calif. on Jan. 1, hitting a 3-pointer with 0.8 seconds left to give the Pirates a 77-75 win.

From there, Hampton opened the bulk of MEAC play winning eight of its first 10 games, including a 68-56 road win over MEAC regular-season champion Bethune-Cookman on Jan. 22; in fact, the Pirates did not lose back-to-back games last season until Feb. 14-21, when they dropped three straight against Bethune-Cookman, Florida A&M and Delaware State.

But Hampton bounced back with an 83-72 win at Howard to close out the regular season, before running through Maryland Eastern Shore and Norfolk State to reach the championship game of the MEAC Tournament. The Pirates faced three-time defending MEAC champion Morgan State in the title game, winning a defensive struggle 60-55 to claim their first MEAC Tournament crown and NCAA Tournament berth since 2006.

The Pirates earned a No. 16 seed in the NCAA Tournament, squaring off against top-seeded Duke in the first round.

Junior guard Darrion Pellum, on top of being named MEAC Tournament MVP, was named First Team All-MEAC after finishing the season second in the MEAC in scoring. Morgan, who had a breakout season for the Pirates (16.1 ppg, 100 3-pointers made), was a Second Team All-MEAC selection and a Lou Henson Mid-Major All-American.

Junior forward Danny Agbelese, who transferred to Hampton from Collins Community College, finished the season eighth in the nation in blocked shots per game (3.2), and his 101 blocks were the fourth-most in program history for a single season.

## THE COMING YEAR

The Pirates return three starters and 10 letterwinners from last year's squad, including the top two scorers in junior guards Darrion Pellum (Hampton, Va.) and Kwame Morgan (Largo, Md.). Joyner will also bring back interior presence Danny Agbelese (Lanham, Md.), who proved proficient in shot-blocking in 2010-11.

Pellum will look to continue the level of play that saw him rank second in the conference in scoring last season at 17.5 points per contest; in 32 games in 2010-11, Pellum scored in double figures 29 times. He poured in a career-high 34 points against Dominican (Calif.) on Dec. 29, after scoring a game-high 33 points at High Point on Nov. 28. He averaged 17.7 points per game in the MEAC Tournament.

Morgan will look to continue the development he showed last season, when he led in the MEAC in 3-point shooting and became the team's second leading scorer. Morgan's proficiency from behind the arc directly contributed to Pirate victories last season, as he hit game-winning 3-pointers against Liberty and Colorado State.

Agbelese only averaged 4.0 points a game last season, but between his 6.0 rebounds a night and 3.2 blocks per game, he made his presence felt - particularly in the MEAC, where size came at a premium for most teams.

Also returning for the Pirates this season will be reserve guard Mike Tuitt (Bronx, N.Y.) - 4.1 points, 1.9 assists per game - and guard Christopher Tolson (Laurel, Md.), who averaged 4.3 points in 26 games last season. Senior center Milade Lola-Charles (Laurel, Md.) will also return to give the Pirates some depth in the frontcourt.

Junior guard/forward Wesley Dunning (Laurel, Md.) will come into 2011-12 looking to build off his impressive 2010-11 campaign. Dunning averaged 2.1 points and 2.6 rebounds per contest last season, averaging 10.3 minutes per game. He set career highs in points (six, against Coppin State and Delaware State), rebounds (seven, against San Francisco, Bethune-Cookman and Maryland Eastern Shore) and blocked shots (five against Maryland Eastern Shore in

the MEAC quarterfinals) last season.

Junior forwards Koron Reed (Philadelphia, Pa.) and Bakari Taylor (Bowie, Md.) also return for the Pirates this season, as does sophomore guard Travis McClenny (Chesapeake, Va.).

## **NEWCOMERS**

Joyner welcomes four newcomers to the squad this season - six, if you count forward Orin O'Bryant (Redding, Pa.) and Emmanuel Okoroba (Garland, Texas, who both redshirted last season - including two transfers: junior guard Jasper Williams (Washington, D.C.) and sophomore center David Bruce (Linden, N.J.).

Williams comes to Hampton after two seasons at Tennessee Chattanooga, where he averaged 2.2 points a game as a freshman and 2.3 points per game as a sophomore, while Bruce transfers over from Harcum Community College.

Joyner will also welcome in freshman guard Dwight Meikle (Jonesboro, Ga.) and junior guard Aaron Austin (Newport News, Va.), who attended Indian Hills Community College and Radford University before coming to Hampton.

## **SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN**

The Pirates will kick things off this season at home, taking on William & Mary at the HU Convocation Center on Nov. 11, before competing in the 2011 Triple Crown Cancun Challenge. Play will begin on the road on Nov. 17, as the Pirates take on Richmond, before they head to Piscataway, N.J. on Nov. 20 to take on Rutgers.

Hampton will then face Sacred Heart on Nov. 23 and either Lipscomb or SIU-Edwardsville on Nov. 24 in Cancun, Mexico.

Home games against High Point (Nov. 29) and Savannah State (Dec. 1) will follow, before the Pirates compete in the Big Apple Classic in Madison Square Garden on Dec. 3 against Howard. Hampton will then hit the road to take on Fordham (Dec. 5), American (Dec. 7), Liberty (Dec. 17) and Robert Morris (Dec. 20), before heading to Chattanooga, Tenn. on Dec. 29-30 for the 2011 Dr. Pepper Classic.

A home game against Howard on Jan. 7 kicks off the bulk of conference play, before the Pirates hit the road for games against James Madison, Coppin State and Morgan State. Four straight home games follow, before Hampton hits the road again on Feb. 6 and Feb. 11 to square off against Delaware State and Norfolk State.

After a home game against Maryland Eastern Shore on Feb. 15, the Pirates will participate in the ESPN Bracket Busters, with a game on either Feb. 17 or Feb. 18. The Pirates will then host Delaware State on Feb. 20 before hitting the road to take on Florida A&M and Bethune-Cookman.

The Pirates' regular season finale will be at home, March 1 against North Carolina Central.

## HEAD COACH EDWARD "BUCK" JOYNER, JR.



Edward Joyner Jr. is entering his third year as head coach of the Hampton University men's basketball program, looking to build on the success to which he helped lead the program in 2010-11.

Joyner led the Pirates to the 2011 MEAC Tournament championship in his second season, guiding Hampton to a 24-9 record - marking the first time the Pirates won 20 games since the 2001-02 season. The Pirates were the No. 2 seed in the MEAC Tournament, defeating Morgan State 60-55 in the championship game to win the tournament and win the automatic NCAA bid for the first time since 2006.

Hampton earned a No. 16 seed, facing top-seeded Duke in the second round.

Joyner saw two of his athletes earn All-MEAC honors, as junior guard Darrion Pellum was named First Team All-MEAC after finishing the season second in the conference in scoring and junior guard Kwame Morgan was named Second Team All-MEAC after a breakout season. Pellum, the MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Player, was also named VaSID Second Team All-State, BASN HBCU Second Team All-American and NABC All-District 15, while Morgan was named a Lou Henson All-American and NABC All-District 15.

Joyner was also named BASN HBCU Coach of the Year for his efforts.

The Pirates overcame offseason tragedy and went 14-18 in 2009-10, Joyner's first season as head coach, finishing tied for fifth in the MEAC with an 8-8 record. He led the Pirates to the MEAC Tournament semifinals, beating archrival Norfolk State in the quarterfinals 73-70. Despite struggling to find consistency for much of the season, Hampton won six straight games to close out the regular season and open the MEAC Tournament, before falling to top seed Morgan State 74-67 in the semifinals.

Senior guard Vincent Simpson earned Second Team All-MEAC honors for the second straight year under Joyner, leading the team with 14.1 points per game. Both Simpson and senior forward Michael Freeman eclipsed the 1,000 career point mark in 2009-10.

As an assistant coach, he helped develop such players as Simpson, first team all-conference guard Rashad West, the MEAC's leading scorer in 2006, and Michael Freeman, the

2006 MEAC Rookie of the Year. As academic coordinator, Joyner guided the men's basketball program to the highest team GPA in 10 years.

Joyner came to Hampton after 11 years as the assistant head coach at Johnson C. Smith University in Charlotte, N.C. He also served as head women's basketball coach in the last five years of his tenure at Johnson C. Smith. Joyner also served as assistant to the Dean of Students over judiciary affairs.

During his tenure with the men's basketball program at Johnson C. Smith, Joyner was instrumental in developing 13 first team all-conference performers and seven All-Americans - five of whom are currently playing professional basketball. The Golden Bulls made seven appearances in the NCAA Division II Tournament, reaching the Elite Eight in 2001 after capturing the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) championship.

Joyner helped the Johnson C. Smith women reach the CIAA title game in three of his five seasons, making one NCAA Tournament appearance. In all, Joyner coaches six all-conference players.

Joyner played his collegiate ball at Johnson C. Smith, earning letters all four seasons he played. He helped guide the Golden Bulls to three division titles, two trips to the CIAA championship game and three appearances in the NCAA Division II Tournament. Joyner was named Defensive Player of the Year twice, and he finished his career among the top-ten assist leaders in Johnson C. Smith history.

Joyner is also the owner and co-coordinator of Scholars Inc., a non-profit organization in Charlotte that helps underprivileged children. Scholars Inc. provides summer camps for at-risk youths, group homes and an academic and sports unit that has helped at least 25 students receive college scholarships for athletics and academics.

A native of Winston-Salem N.C., Joyner is the son of Edward Joyner Sr., former head basketball coach at St. Paul's College, and the nephew of Steve Joyner, the head basketball coach and athletic director at Johnson C. Smith. He is married to the former Aerian Miller and they have two children: E.J. (6) and Andrew (4).
