# WOFFORD (1-7, 0-6) vs. CHATTANOOGA (5-3, 4-1)

### THE CHATTANOOGA GAME

Wofford will play the final home game of the season on Saturday afternoon at Gibbs Stadium against Chattanooga ... The Terriers are 1-7 on the season and 0-6 in Southern Conference play after a 24-22 road win at Elon, a 31-10 loss at home to #24 Kennesaw State, a 31-23 road loss to #22 VMI, a 27-21 loss on the road to #13 East Tennessee State, a 42-20 home loss to Furman, a 27-24 loss to Samford, a 45-14 loss at Mercer and a 41-21 loss to Western Carolina... Wofford has lost ten-straight Southern Conference games for the first time in school history ... The last time the Terriers were 1-7 to begin a season was in 1987 in which they were 1-10 at the end of the year ... Chattanooga is 5-3 on the season and 4-1 in league play, with SoCon wins over Western Carolina, ETSU, Samford and Furman, along with a loss at VMI ... They are ranked 46th in the nation in total offense and 15th in total defense ... Wofford and Chattanooga have played 27 times, with the Terriers holding a 15-12 lead in the series that began in 1927 ... Chattanooga picked up a 24-13 home win during the 2020-21 spring season which ended a four-game win streak by the Terriers ... The Mocs are receiving votes in the Stats Perform and are ranked #25 in the FCS Coaches polls.

### TERRIER TOP NOTES

Here are the top notes of interest heading into the Chattanooga game:

- The Terriers have seen 27 players earn first career starts this fall and only eight players have started ten or more career games.
- Wofford is ranked 85th in the nation in total offense and 104th in total defense through the first eight games.
- The rushing offense was ranked fifth overall at 232.8 yards per game in the spring. Wofford has been ranked in the top ten in rushing offense for 22 straight seasons but are 16th so far in 2021 at 210.4 yards per game.
- The Terriers are being outscored in all four quarters. In the second half the Terriers are being outscored 109 to 63.
- In the SoCon Preseason poll, the Terriers were selected to finish eighth, the lowest since 1999.
- Wofford has the fourth toughest schedule in the country as of the latest NCAA report on October 24.
- Four players were recognized by the coaches on Preseason All-SoCon team. First team honors went to DL Micheal Mason and OL Zak Kurz. OL AI Hogan and RB Nathan Walker picked up second team honors.

# THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT ...

## CHATTANOOGA'S LAST GAME

Chattanooga controlled the ball for nearly 40 minutes and held Furman to just 157 yards of total offense to secure its third-straight Southern Conference victory, 13-3, on a rainy Homecoming Saturday afternoon inside Finley Stadium. Chattanooga improved to 5-3 overall and 4-1 in conference play. Furman falls to 4-4 overall and 2-3 in SoCon action.

Chattanooga controlled the clock for much of the game and amassed a 39:48 time of possession total. The offense put together 418 yards of total offense led by 245 yards on the ground and 173 through the air. UTC's defense limited Furman to just 157 yards of offense which includes a lowly 47 yard passing total.

Tyrell Price (110) and Ailym Ford (108, TD) each eclipsed 100 yards rushing while Ford surpassed 2,000 career rushing yards. Quarterback Cole Copeland went 13-of-20 for 146 yards and an interception in addition to 24 yards on the ground.

Reginald Henderson had four catches for a game-high 55 yards. Eight different Mocs caught at least one pass during the victory. The Chattanooga defense shined again in another dominant effort which saw 4.0 sacks, 7.0 TFLs, three pass breakups and one takeaway (INT). Jay Person led the team with eight total tackles, six solo, and racked up 2.0 sacks for a loss of seven yards. Lawson secured his fifth interception of the season and recorded five total tackles, second-most for UTC.

## LAST MEETING

#11 WOFFORD 13, CHATTANOOGA 24  
SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 27, 2021

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. — On Saturday afternoon, the Wofford College football team was defeated 24-13 by Chattanooga at Finley Stadium. The Mocs held the Terrier offense to under 200 yards and took advantage of several short-field situations to earn the victory.

Wofford is 1-1 overall and Chattanooga is 1-1 on the season. The Terriers were led by Ryan Lovelace with 82 rushing yards and Irvin Mulligan with 40 rushing yards. Drayton Arnold was 15-of-25 passing for 223 yards and a touchdown for the Mocs.

The Terriers had the ball first and had four first downs before Jimmy Weirick scored from two yards out giving Wofford a 7-0 lead with 10:29 on the clock. Chattanooga then had three first downs to move down the field. Faced with fourth-and-two from the two-yard line, a pass to Jay Gibson in the endzone made it a 7-7 game with 3:04 left in the first quarter. On the next drive by Wofford, a holding call pushed the Terriers back and they had to punt. The Mocs gained one first down before punting back to Wofford.

Wofford was able to put together four first downs before the drive stalled and Walker Gliarmis hit a 36-yard field goal to give the Terriers a 10-7 lead at the 5:23 mark of the second quarter. The had two first downs and then punted, but the return was muffed and the Mocs recovered at the two-yard line. They scored two plays later on a one-yard run by Tyrell Price for a 14-10 lead with 55 seconds remaining in the first half. Wofford ran three plays before the end of the half.

To open the second half, the Mocs had three first downs and then converted a fourth-and-four to move into the red-zone. A sack by Tanner Barnes brought up another fourth down and a 40-yard field goal was missed wide left after taking 8:32 off the clock in the quarter. Ryan Lovelace had a 38-yard run to begin the next drive by the Terriers. First downs by Irvin Mulligan and Ryan Lovelace moved the ball inside the 15-yard line and the Terriers faced fourth-and-four at the seven-yard line. Walker Gliarmis made a 24-yard field goal to cut the lead to 14-13 with 2:15 left in the third quarter.

The Mocs used two big pass plays to move inside the 15-yard line. On the first play of the fourth quarter, Gino Appleberry scored a five-yard touchdown for a 21-13 lead at the 14:55 mark. After a miscue on the kickoff return, the Terriers began the ensuing drive on the four-yard line. A three-and-out gave the Mocs the ball at the 48-yard line after a punt. They took advantage of the short field and added a 25-yard field goal to make it a 24-13 game with 11:18 left on the clock.

A roughing the passer call gave the Terriers a first down, but Jimmy Weirick was sacked on the next play. On third down, an interception by Jerrell Lawson gave the Mocs the ball back at the 34-yard line. After one first down, the punter fumbled the snap and the Terriers took over at the 26-yard line. On the first play with the ball back, the Mocs were called for pass interference. The Terriers had fourth-and-seven and the pass was incomplete in the endzone with 3:04 left in the game.

## ABOUT WOFFORD

At quarterback, Peyton Derrick has started five games, with Jimmy Weirick starting one and Bryce Corrison with two starts ... Weirick is 21-of-38 passing for 234 yards along with two rushing touchdowns, while Derrick is 33-of-65 with three passing touchdowns and 139 rushing yards ... Bryce Corrison has started twice with 129 rushing yards and 18-of-41 passing for 179 yards ... Irvin Mulligan is the leading rusher with 714 yards on 101 carries and eight touchdowns ... Jamari Broussard has 227 rushing yards on 54 carries with a touchdown, with Nathan Walker and Ryan Ingram adding rushing touchdowns ... The top receiver is Alec Holt with 16 catches for 290 yards and three touchdowns ... Jim Welsh has added 14 receptions for 123 yards and R.J. Khayo has 14 catches for 158 yards ... The offensive line has seen nine players start, with none starting the same position for all eight games ... They rank 10th in the nation in fewest sacks allowed with nine ... Linebackers Joe Beckett (58) is the team leader in tackles and he has 4.0 tackles for loss ... Micheal Mason has four tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks, while Chuck Smith has added two sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss ... Isaiah Wadsworth and Amir Annoor have the two interceptions for the team ... Walker Gliarmis handles the placekicking duties and is 6-of-10 on field goals with a long of 48 yards ... Atkins Roberts has kicked off 34 times for a 54.6 average and has a 38.8 average on his 41 punts.

## SENIOR'S LAST LAP

The Chattanooga game marks the final regular season home contest for 23 Wofford seniors. The group includes seven fifth year seniors: Donovan Anderson, Joe Beckett, John Beckley, Brandon Brown, Chad Gardner, Zak Kurz and Jim Welsh. The fifth-year players won the 2017, 2018 and 2019 Southern Conference Championships, along with NCAA FCS Playoff appearances in 2017, 2018 and 2019. There are also 16 true seniors, who were part of the 2018 and 2019 SoCon Championship teams and two playoff appearances. They are: Elijah Ball, Tanner Barnes, Jamari Broussard, Cagan Campbell, Paxton Cottrell, Anthony Craig, Peyton Derrick, James Garnett, Quashon Greenlee, T.J. Neal, Jaxen Rogers, Rett Russell, Colin Springer, Nathan Walker, Walker Gliarmis and Coltin Hallman.

## A FLASHBACK TO 2009

The 2021 season has been compared to the 2009 season in which the Terriers also dealt with adversity and injuries. The 2009 season ended with a 3-8 overall record and a 2-6 mark in the SoCon, with two games against FBS opponents (Wisconsin and South Florida). Only 12 players started all 11 games and 23 players had first career starts. A total of 36 players started games that season. So far in 2021, 27 players have made first career starts and 49 players have started games. Only four players - Irvin Mulligan, Joe Beckett, Donovan Anderson and Harrison Morgan - have started all eight games at the same position. In addition, Zak Kurz and Cecil Fisher have started all eight games on the offensive line, but not in the same position.

## REBUILDING THE ROSTER

After playing the spring season with only 79 players on the roster, and dressing less than 60 for the final game against The Citadel, the Terriers have rebuilt the roster. There are 43 newcomers to go with the 68 returners for 111 total players - the most since there were 112 on the roster in 2015.

## COACHING CHANGES

The Terriers saw one big coaching staff change for the fall season. Offensive coordinator Wade Lang announced his retirement on June 30, 2021 after 33 seasons on the coaching staff and 31 seasons as the offensive coordinator. Wofford hired Tyler Carlton in July and he will share the offensive coordinator duties with Dane Romero.

## WOFFORD'S LAST GAME

On Saturday afternoon, Wofford was defeated 41-21 by Western Carolina University. The Catamounts scored the first ten points and then turned a pair of Terriers turnovers in the first half into 14 points on the way to a 34-7 lead at the break. After Western Carolina scored first in the second half, Wofford scored twice for the final margin.

Wofford is 1-7 overall and 0-6 in the Southern Conference. Western Carolina is 2-6 overall and 2-3 in league play. The Terriers were led by Irvin Mulligan with 101 rushing yards and a touchdown. Raphael Williams led the Catamounts with 16 catches for 177 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Wofford had 344 total yards, with 309 rushing yards. Western Carolina had 459 total yards, with 327 of those passing yards. Western Carolina had a 21 to 20 advantage in first downs. Wofford was 5-of-12 on third down and 0-for-1 on fourth down. Western Carolina was 5-of-14 on third down and was 1-of-1 on fourth down. Wofford was called for three penalties to four for Western Carolina. The Terriers had a 33:37 to 26:23 time of possession advantage.

## WOFFORD-MERCER GAME NOTES

The Terriers lead the series against Western Carolina by 28-15. The victory by the Catamounts ended a streak of four straight wins by the Terriers. The 41 points scored by Western Carolina were the most since scoring 44 in 2007 ... The fourth quarter touchdown catch by Wyatt Bartkowiak was the first of his career and it also was the first career touchdown pass by Kyle Pinnix. David Legette scored his first career touchdown in the fourth quarter as well ... Irvin Mulligan had his fifth 100+ rushing game of the season with 101 rushing yards ... Tahir Annoor, John Beckley and Micheal Mason led the team with five tackles each ... Game captains were Bryce Corrison and Irvin Mulligan ... Attendance at Gibbs Stadium was 3,230.

## HOW OPPONENTS ARE DOING

The seven opponents that Wofford has faced this season are a combined 39-25 on the season. Three of the teams were ranked on game day against the Terriers, as Kennesaw State (7-1) was #24, VMI (6-2) was #22 and East Tennessee State (7-1) was #13. It marked the first time Wofford has faced three straight ranked opponents since the 2017 season. Elon (4-4), Mercer (6-2) and Furman (4-4) also have records above .500 this season, with Samford (3-5) and Western Carolina (2-6) the only opponents below .500. Overall, Wofford has the fourth toughest schedule in the country as of the latest NCAA report on October 24.

## PRESEASON SOUTHERN CONFERENCE POLL

In the 2021 Southern Conference Preseason Poll, the conference's nine head coaches picked Wofford to finish eighth with 21 points. This marked the lowest preseason selection for the Terriers since 1999. The Southern Conference Sports Media Association selected Wofford seventh with 108 points. Both polls picked Chattanooga to finish first.

Wofford had been to the playoffs in four straight years, but that streak ended in 2020-21. North Dakota State has the longest active playoff appearance streak at 12 games, followed by South Dakota State (10) and James Madison (8). Weber State reached five games while Wofford and San Diego saw their streaks end at four games.

### THE 2020 SEASON

Wofford was 1-4 overall in the five Southern Conference games played during the spring season ... The Terriers opened with a 31-14 win over Mercer on February 20 before falling 24-13 at Chattanooga on February 27 ... The game scheduled for March 6 against East Tennessee State was postponed ... The Terriers fell 37-31 at Samford on March 13 and lost 36-31 to VMI on March 27 ... After a 28-24 home loss to The Citadel, the Terriers opted out of the final two games (Western Carolina and Furman) ... Following the season, DL Micheal Mason and DB Tahir Annoor were named All-Southern Conference and FB Nathan Walked earned All-America recognition.

At quarterback, Jimmy Weirick started all five spring games, with Peyton Derrick seeing time in four games ... Weirick was 40-of-70 passing for 553 yards and three touchdowns, while Derrick was 12-of-21 with a passing touchdown and two rushing touchdowns ... Irvin Mulligan was the leading rusher with 342 yards on 51 carries, while Nathan Walker had 45 carries for 219 yards ... The top receiver was KeiAndre Sanders with nine catches for 108 yards ... Tight end Landon Parker had 155 yards on eight catches and two touchdowns ... The offensive line replaced all five starters from the 2019 and only allowed seven sacks (1.4 per game) to rank 20th in the nation ... Linebackers Joe Beckett (35), Brandon Brown (33) and John Beckley (30) were the top tacklers ... Beckley recorded two sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss, while Micheal Mason had 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack ... Darron Paschal and Miles Richardson had the two interceptions for the team ... Dawson Henis and Walker Gliarmis handled the placekicking duties, with Atkins Roberts kicking off 21 times and Landon Parker leading the SoCon with a 45.0 yards per punt average.

### SPRING ALL-SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

On the 2020-21 All-Southern Conference teams, Wofford players honored include defensive lineman Micheal Mason (first team coaches and media), defensive back Tahir Annoor (second team coaches) and running back Irvin Mulligan (All-Freshman team).

### SPRING ALL-AMERICANS

Wofford fullback Nathan Walker was named a Stats Perform FCS Second Team All-American and a Phil Steele Second Team All-American. Walker, a junior from Cross, South Carolina, played in all five games this spring with three starts. He was third on the team with 45 carries for 219 yards and led the team with three rushing touchdowns. Micheal Mason earned a spot on the HERO Sports Sophomore All-America Team. The native of Florence, S.C., had 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack during his five starts on the defensive line.

### THE 2021 RETURNERS

Wofford looks to return 18 starters for the 2021 season. On offense, quarterback Jimmy Weirick,

running back Nathan Walker, offensive linemen Zak Kurz, Al Hogan, Chad Gardner and Quashon Greenlee return. On defense, the nine returners are defensive linemen James Garnett and Michael Mason, linebackers John Beckley, Joe Beckett, Brandon Brown and Rett Russell, and defensive backs Donovan Anderson, Miles Richardson and Tahir Annoor. On special teams, kicker Walker Gliarmis, punter Landon Parker and long snapper Colin Springer will return. An additional eleven players who started at least one game also return.

### 2021 INCOMING CLASS

The Terriers welcomed a huge incoming class of 43 players in the fall of 2021, which includes seven transfers. There are 21 players on defense, 20 players on offense and two specialists.

### NEW NUMBERS

Several players have switched numbers for the 2021 season, including CB Tahir Annoor (2), CB Jahem Hazel (3), LB John Boyles (4), S Isaiah Walker (9), LB Logan Barnes (15), DL Tanner Barnes (18), S Santana Curtis (21), RB David Legette (22), DL Cameron Woolery (55) and DL Chuck Smith (97).

### DOUBLE NUMBERS

The Terriers have sixteen sets of double numbers to note this season with the large roster. WR Devin Mathews and LB T.J. Neal are #0; CB Tahir Annoor and QB Jacob Kimbrell are #2; QB Trey Baker and LB John Boyles are #4; QB Jimmy Weirick and DB Miles Richardson are #5; DB Okachi Emmanwori and WR R.J. Khayo are #6; QB Bryce Corrison and LB Zy Abercrombie are #8; WR Alec Holt and CB Isaiah Wadsworth are #11; QB Peyton Derrick and CB Tahir Annoor are #13; LB Tanner Barnes and WR Garrett Vernon are #18; RB Nathan Walker and S Santana Curtis are #21; K/P Ezra King and CB John Harrington are #25; K/P Atkins Roberts and S Jaxen Rogers are #35; DL Seth Foster and OL Jeremy Michaux are #54; OL Chad Gardner and DL Cameron Woolery are #55; OL Jason Swann and LB James Wells are #56; OL Marc Magno and LB Nate Nardone are #58.

### A ZERO ON THE ROSTER

While the NCAA began allowing the number "0" to be worn in the fall of 2020, no Terrier wore that number last season. This season, both linebacker TJ Neal and wide receiver Devin Mathews become the first Terriers to wear "0."

### COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Garrison Moore was named to the 2020-21 Academic All-District Football Team, selected by CoSIDA, which recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom. Moore, from Columbia, South Carolina, started two of the five games played this spring. He had five catches, including a 26-yard touchdown reception against The Citadel. For his career, Moore played in 41 games with three starts. He had 11 catches for 186 yards and two touchdowns. A chemistry major with a 3.87 grade point average, Moore was inducted into Phi Beta Kappa this spring. He received his Bachelor of Science in May summa cum laude and will begin medical school in the fall of 2021. This marks the 51st straight season that at least one Wofford football player has earned CoSIDA All-District honors.

### 2020-21 FIRST CAREER STARTS

In the season opener against Mercer, ten players made first career starts: OL Zak Kurz, OL Elliott Campbell, OL Al Hogan, OL Chad Gardner, OL Quashon Greenlee, QB Jimmy Weirick, WR Alec Holt, LB Rett Russell, DB Donovan Anderson, and DB Tahir Annoor. T.J. Neal added a first start against Chattanooga. At Samford, LB Harrison Morgan and DL James Garnett added first career starts. Nick Russo had his first career start against VMI. Against The Citadel, WR RJ Khayo, DB Isaiah Walker and OL Jeremy Michaux made their first starts, giving Wofford 17 players with first starts in the season.

### 2021 FIRST CAREER STARTS

In the season opener at Elon, seven players made their first career starts. OL Anthony Garcia, OL Cecil Fisher, QB Peyton Derrick, RB Irvin Mulligan, RB Jamari Broussard, DT C.J. Tillman and LB T.J. Neal. Against Kennesaw State, TE Dillon Droze, DB Okachi Emmanworri and DL Romello Gray started their first career games. At VMI, LB Camden Gray, S John Michael DiRoberto, DL Brandon Maina, DB Isaiah Wadsworth and DL Anthonie Lattany. LB James Well, DL Chuck Smith, DL Cameron Woolery, OL Briggs Kearse and TE Wyatt Bartkowiak made their first career starts at ETSU. Against Furman in a six offensive lineman and two tight end formation, TE Forrest Alvarez and OL Jysiah Cromer made their first career starts. OL Hunter Gfell started at center against Samford and QB Bryce Corrison and WR Devin Mathews started at Mercer. Against Western Carolina, DB Amir Annoor and LB Marcus Gatling started giving Wofford 27 players with first career starts so far this season.

### VETERAN CAREER GAMES PLAYED/STARTS

John Beckley leads the team with 33 career starts, followed by Joe Beckett (25), Brandon Brown (17) and Nathan Walker (16).

### 2020-21 DEEP THOUGHTS...

By quarter, the Terriers outscored opponents in the first and second quarters, but were outscored in the third and fourth ... The biggest margin was the second quarter at +20 and the biggest deficit is -25 in the fourth quarter ... Wofford was 17-of-18 in the red zone (94.4%) and scored touchdowns on 12 of those trips ... Opponents were 18-of-22 (81.8%) with 15 touchdowns and three field goals ... Of the 24 scoring drives, nine were for 10 or more plays, 12 covered 70 yards or more and eight took over five minutes off the clock ... Irvin Mulligan had 19 of his 51 carries go for a first down or touchdown, while Nathan Walker had 13 of his 45 carries become first downs or touchdowns ... Wofford had 52 receptions, with 29 of those first downs or touchdowns ... The Terriers had an average start of the 28.3 yard line, while opponents had a 31.6 yard line average start ... On opening drives in a game, Wofford had three touchdowns, one punt and one turnover on downs for a 60% scoring rate. On second half drives, the Terriers had two touchdowns, two punts and a field goal for a 60% scoring rate.

### 2021 DEEP THOUGHTS...

By quarter, the Terriers are being outscored in all four quarters ... The biggest deficit is -43 in the second quarter ... Wofford is 16-of-20 in the red zone (80.0%) and scored touchdowns on 11 of those trips with five field goals ... Opponents are 25-of-28 (89.3%) with 17 touchdowns and eight field goals ... Of the 25 scoring drives, four were for 10 or more plays, twelve covered 70 yards or more and four took over five minutes off the clock ... Wofford also has six drives that took three plays or less ... Irvin Mulligan has had 25 of his 101 carries go for a first down or touchdown... Wofford has 74 receptions, with 46 of those first downs or touchdowns ... The Terriers had an average start of the 31.3 yard line, while opponents had a 28.0 yard line average start ... On opening drives in a game, Wofford has two touchdowns and six punts. On second half drives, the Terriers have five punts, a touchdown, a field goal and interception.

### PARKER CAN CATCH... AND PUNT

Landon Parker was one of only two players in the FCS last season that was a position player and a specialist, joining UT Marting quarterback and punter Dresser Winn. Parker was ranked fifth in the country in punting at 44.9 yards per punt, which was first in the SoCon. He was also the team's leading receiver with eight catches for 155 yards and two touchdowns. Against VMI (3/27) his 75-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter was the seventh-longest in school history and his 68-yard punt was the sixth longest in school history and the longest since 2001.

### PLAYER INTEREST NOTES

DL Elijah Ball's brother played at Alabama from 2012-16 ... WR Landon Parker's brother punted at Duke and his father punted for the Denver Broncos ... QB Peyton Derrick's dad played at Wofford from 1978-82 and his brother, Dakota, played at Furman from 2007-12 ... DL Jacob Drag's father played on the defensive line at Clemson (1984-89) ... LS Forrest Alvarez parents both graduated from Wofford and his brother, Carew, also played football for the Terriers ... CB Tahir Annoor's brother, Aaquil, played at Furman and his younger brother Amir is a freshman at Wofford in 2021 ... LB Jack Scroggs' younger brother, Griffin, has committed to play on the offensive line at Georgia ... DB Okachi Emmanwori's younger brother, Nick, has committed to play at South Carolina ... WR Will Daniel's father played football at N.C. State and worked as an assistant coach at several high schools and colleges, including Bishop England and Charleston Southern ... OL Griffin Reid's brother played football at The Citadel ... LS Cameron Hicks brother played football at Samford.

### SPECIAL TEAMS POSITIVES

One area that has provided a bright spot for the Terriers this season has been special teams play. Walker Gliarmis is 18-of-18 on extra points and 6-of-10 on field goals with a long of 48 yards. Atkins Roberts has punted 41 times with a 38.8 average and ten inside the 20, with only seven punts being returned. Roberts is also averaging 55.0 yards per kickoff. In the return game, Wofford is 61st in the nation with a 19.41 kickoff return average as Cagan Campbell and Garrett Vernon both have returns over 30 yards, with Campbell ranked 30th in the nation with a 23.0 average. R.J. Khayo has an 11.1 punt return average and the team is ranked 19th in the nation in that category.

### WOFFORD 100-YARD RUSHERS

Wofford had a 100-yard rusher in four of 13 games in 2017 with Blake Morgan, Andre Stoddard (2) and Joe Newman reaching the mark. In 2018, Wofford had six 100+ rushing performances. Joe Newman had the first 100+ game of 2019 against Gardner-Webb, with Newman (104), Jacquez Allen (105) and Irvin Mulligan (106) reaching the mark against Western Carolina. Blake Morgan

added 147 yards against Furman. After no 100+ rushing games in the 2021 spring season, Irvin Mulligan (114) reached the mark in the season opener at Elon, added 134 yards at VMI, 126 against Furman and 135 against Mercer.

### OPPONENT 100-YARD RUSHERS

A big part of the defense is not allowing an opponent to have a 100+ yard rusher. In the past 92 games, there have been just 15 rushers with 100 or more yards. The Terriers went 17 games without allowing a 100+ rusher (last 2 games in 2013, 11 games in 2014, first four games in 2015). They then went an additional 19 games without a 100+ rusher. Wofford didn't allow a 100+ rusher in 2017. Twice in 2018 there were 100+ yard rushers against the Terriers and there were five in 2019, along with one in 2020-21 and four in the fall of 2021.

### REACHING 1,000 CAREER YARDS

Nathan Walker reached the mark 1,000 career rushing yard mark with 13 yards against Kennesaw State in 2019 for 1,007 yards and now has 1,406 in his career. Irvin Mulligan broke the mark on October 16, 2021 against Samford with 1,184 career rushing yards.

### AVOIDING THE YELLOW FLAG

Wofford has been penalized 32 times this season (fourth fewest in the nation) and are tied for third in the nation in fewest penalties per game at 4.00. Wofford is also second in the fewest penalty yards per game at 32.38. Three of the top 10 teams with the lowest number of penalties are members of the SoCon (Mercer, Wofford, and Furman).

### DEFENSE BY COMMITTEE

The Terrier defense is a true team effort with contributions from numerous players last season. Overall, six players recorded 20 or more tackles. Seven players had at least a share of a tackle for loss, while three recorded sacks. In the five games, there were four different players with a share of being the leading tackler. So far in 2021, six players have led the team in tackles and 15 different players have a tackle for loss.

## RUSHING LEGACY

Wofford has finished among the top ten schools in the nation in rushing in each of the past 22 years. The Terriers' wingbone offense puts a premium on ball control and keeping the opponent's offense on the boundary. Eight times the Terriers have been second in the nation in rushing yards per game, while in 2010 and 2011 they finished first.

## GOING OVERTIME

Wofford picked up a 35-34 win in overtime against Chattanooga in 2019. The Terriers lost the first two overtime games played, then won the next two. In 2012, a 24-17 double overtime loss at Samford was followed by a win over Chattanooga. There was a win over Mercer in 2015 and losses to The Citadel and Youngstown State (double overtime) in 2016. The Terriers had overtime wins against Western Carolina and Chattanooga in 2017. Wofford is now 7-5 all-time in overtime games.

## WOFFORD VS. NON-CONFERENCE FCS OPPONENTS

Since 2000, Wofford is 27-5 in non-conference regular season FCS games ... Wofford's loss to Coastal Carolina in 2006 snapped a streak of 10 straight regular season non-conference wins against FCS opponents ... ner-Webb in 2014, along with a loss to SC State in 2019 and a loss to Kennesaw State in 2021.

### **TERRIERS AGAINST FBS TEAMS**

The 2019 season marked the 22nd time in the last 23 seasons the Terriers have played against a member of the FBS (NCAA Division I-A). Overall, Wofford is 1-22 in those games. In 2011, Wofford had a lead at Clemson in the third quarter. At South Carolina in 2012, the game was tied at 7-7 at the start of the fourth quarter. Wofford was down five points to Georgia Tech in 2014 with ten minutes to go in the game. In 2017, Wofford trailed South Carolina 14-10 in the third quarter. Wyoming scored with 17 seconds left in the game in 2018. Wofford was scheduled to play South Carolina in 2020 but the game was canceled. North Carolina is on the slate in 2021 and Virginia Tech in 2022 before a game at Pitt in 2023. South Carolina returns to the schedule in 2024 and 2026, while Clemson is scheduled again in 2027.

### **TERRIERS AT HOME**

Wofford has won 79 of its last 106 games played in Gibbs Stadium, including going 5-0 in 2014 and 2018 ... Since Gibbs Stadium opened on Oct. 5, 1996, Wofford has posted a record of 100-41 (.715) ... The Terriers have won 60 of 92 home SoCon games at Gibbs Stadium.

### **TERRIERS IN THE NFL**

One Terrier was on an NFL roster at the beginning of training camp in 2021. Defensive lineman **Miles Brown '19** signed as a rookie free agent with the Arizona Cardinals and was on the 53-man roster on opening weekend and played before moving to the practice squad. He returned to the active roster in November. Overall he played in four games with four tackles. He spent the majority of the 2020 season with the Tennessee Titans on the practice squad and signed with Detroit in the summer of 2021. He was signed to the practice squad with the Lions, but waived on September 2.

### **MR. RICHARDSON**

Jerry Richardson came to Wofford in the mid-1950s as an unheralded pass receiver from Fayetteville, N.C. By the time he left to begin his pro career with the Baltimore Colts, the passing combination of Charlie Bradshaw to Jerry Richardson had received nationwide fame. Richardson was an Associated Press Little All-America selection in 1957 and '58. He still holds Wofford's single-game record with 241 receiving yards vs. Newberry in 1956 and is the record holder for touchdown receptions in a season (9 in 1958) and in a career (21). As a senior at Wofford, he scored 72 points on nine touchdowns, 12 extra points and two field goals. Drafted by the defending world champion Colts, Richardson played two seasons in the NFL, earning Colt Rookie of the Year honors in 1959 and finishing third in the balloting for top NFL rookie. He was the founder of the Carolina Panthers. In 2015, Wofford announced the construction of two new facilities on campus donated by Richardson. The Rosalind S. Richardson Center for the Arts opened in the spring of 2017 and is the home to academic programs in theatre arts, visual arts and art history. The Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium is a 123,000-square-foot facility opened in September of 2017 and includes a 3,400-seat basketball arena and a 400-seat volleyball competition venue. Jerome Johnson Richardson Hall, a residence hall for approximately 150 students with athletic facilities for baseball, softball and golf, will open in the fall of 2020. On February 24, 2021, Wofford announced a \$150 million gift to the endowment from Richardson, putting his contributions to his alma mater at over \$262 million since his graduation.

### **CAROLINA PANTHER TRAINING CAMP**

The Carolina Panthers have held summer training camp at Wofford since their inaugural season in 1995. The camp provides Wofford tremendous national exposure and visibility. In 2019 the camp drew almost 70,000 visitors to campus. After missing camp in 2020, the Panthers were back for the 2021 season and are expected to return in 2022 until moving into their new facility in Rock Hill in 2023.



### **ACADEMIC SUCCESS**

Wofford's football program has ranked among the top 10 percent of FCS teams in the Academic Performance Review (APR) in eight of the last eleven seasons to earn public recognition. In 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019, Wofford had the highest APR in the SoCon. The APR program was halted in 2020 due to COVID. The Terriers lead the SoCon with 162 Academic All-Southern Conference selections since the program started in 2003.

Among all NCAA Division I (FBS and FCS) football teams, Wofford's APR score of 983 is 41st in the nation. The Terriers are ahead of schools such as Harvard (981), Georgia Tech (980), Samford (980), Baylor (879), Rice (977), and Wake Forest (979).

Wofford has had at least one player named CoSIDA/Capital One First Team All-District in each of the last 21 seasons. In 2020-21 Garrison Moore was named Academic All-District. In addition, safety James Zotto was named an Academic All-American in 2014.

### **SOCON SUCCESS**

Wofford has finished among the top four teams in the Southern Conference race in 15 of the last 17 years, winning seven SoCon Championships. In the last 17+ years, the Terriers have won 83 of 132 SoCon games played. Over that time, Wofford is the winningest program in the Southern Conference with a .628 win percentage.

# JOSH CONKLIN

Head Coach • Fourth Season  
Dakota State '03

Josh Conklin is entering his fourth season as head coach of the Wofford College football team. In his first two seasons at the helm, the Terriers won back-to-back Southern Conference Championship and reached the NCAA FCS Playoffs.

Wofford announced on January 2, 2018, the hiring of Josh Conklin as head football coach. Conklin, who spent the previous three seasons as the defensive coordinator at the University of Pittsburgh, was an assistant coach at Wofford from 2007-09 working with the secondary. Conklin has additional experience at Florida International, Tennessee, The Citadel and South Dakota State University, serving as the defensive coordinator at Pitt, Florida International and The Citadel.

Last season presented numerous challenges for the Terriers as they navigated the COVID-19 pandemic. The team took the field in February for an abbreviated spring slate of conference-only games. Wofford won the opener and were 1-1 when the next game was canceled. Returning to the field with a revamped defensive front, the Terriers dropped the final three games with each decided by a touchdown or less. Following the season, Michael Mason and Tahir Annoor earned All-Southern Conference honors.

In 2019, the Terriers lost the first two games of the season before the next five straight. Following a loss to Clemson, Wofford had wins over Mercer, Furman and The Citadel to finish the conference slate with a 6-1 record to claim the outright Southern Conference title. With the automatic bid to the NCAA FCS Playoffs, the Terriers were defeated 28-21 by Kennesaw State in the first round.

A total of nine players earned All-Southern Conference honors. Quarterback Joe Newman was the Offensive Player of the Year and offensive lineman Blake Jeresaty received the Jacobs Blocking Trophy, along with multiple All-America honors. Conklin was named Coach of the Year by the media. The Terriers were ranked #17 by the FCS Coaches and #16 in the STATS FCS poll to end the season.

The 2018 season began with SoCon wins over The Citadel and VMI and the team was 6-2 heading into November. A win over Western Carolina on November 10 secured a 6-2 mark in league play, which was good for a share of the Southern Conference Championship. In the first round of the playoffs, Wofford defeated Elon 19-7 at Gibbs Stadium. In the second round, the season came to an end with a 13-10 loss to #4 seed Kennesaw State. The Terriers had eleven players earn All-Southern Conference honors following the season. In addition, Miles Brown, Justus Basinger and Andre Stoddard were recognized as All-Americans. Wofford ended the season ranked #12 by the FCS Coaches and #13 in the STATS FCS poll.

Conklin served as Pitt's defensive coordinator for three seasons. Under Conklin's watch, Pitt featured one of the most productive pass rushes in the country. The Panthers ranked sixth nationally in sacks in 2016, averaging 3.31 per contest. Pitt compiled 111 sacks during his three seasons.

In 2017, the Panthers ended the season with a 24-14 upset of undefeated and #2 ranked Miami. Pitt had four sacks in the game and held the Hurricanes to 45 rushing yards. Conklin's 2016 unit also boasted lofty national rankings in rush defense (16th, 119.6 yards per game) and

defensive touchdowns (eighth, four TDs). The Panthers had a 43-42 win over eventual national champion Clemson in Death Valley to highlight an 8-5 season that culminated in the trip to the Pinstripe Bowl. In his first season as defensive coordinator, Pitt posted an 8-5 record and earned a berth in the Military Bowl.

Conklin joined Pitt after building an impressive resume as FIU's defensive coordinator for two years (2013-14). In his final season, he was nominated for the prestigious Broyles Award after overseeing a unit that ranked first nationally in fumble recoveries (19), second in defensive touchdowns (six), fourth in turnovers gained (33), eighth in turnover margin (plus-11 overall; 0.92 margin per game) and 35th in total defense (363.8 yards per game).

Prior to FIU, Conklin was the safeties coach at the University of Tennessee (2012) and defensive coordinator and safeties coach at The Citadel (2010-11). While at The Citadel, Conklin coached cornerback Cortez Allen, a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers from 2011-15.

From 2007-09, Conklin coached the defensive backs at Wofford. He added special teams to his responsibilities in his final season working with the Terriers. In Conklin's initial two years, Wofford had 33 interceptions. The Terriers led the Southern Conference in 2007 with 20 interceptions and ranked second in 2008 with 13. Wofford advanced to the FCS Playoffs in each of those seasons. In 2007, the Terriers won the Southern Conference and led the league in scoring defense.

Conklin's coaching career was launched at South Dakota State, where he served as a graduate assistant in 2003 and 2004. He then was promoted to a full-time post with the Jackrabbits, coaching the secondary and special teams in 2005 and 2006.

Conklin is a 2003 graduate of Dakota State University. He was a starting linebacker and Academic All-American for the Trojans. A native of Gillette, Wyoming, Conklin was born June 19, 1979.

In addition to his bachelor's in physical education from DSU, Conklin also earned a master's in sport administration from South Dakota State. He and his wife, Molly, have He and his wife, Molly, have three children - sons Clark and Davis and daughter Millie.

## GAME ONE WOFFORD 24, ELON 22

ELON, N.C. — In the season opener, Wofford defeated Elon 24-22 at Rhodes Stadium as Wofford blocked the game-winning field goal attempt by the Phoenix with eight seconds remaining. The Terriers had a 21-10 lead at the half, but Elon scored the next 12 points for a lead. A field goal by Walker Gliarmis in the fourth quarter proved to give the Terriers the final margin.

Wofford opens the season at 1-0, while Elon is 0-1. The Terriers were led by Irvin Mulligan with 114 rushing yards, while Peyton Derrick was 10-of-18 passing for 155 yards. Elon quarterback Davis Cheek was 29-of-51 passing for 312 yards.

On the first play of the game Jamarri Broussard had a 26-yard run, but Wofford had to punt. The Phoenix had two passing first downs before punting. A deep pass by Wofford was intercepted by Elon at the seven-yard line. They kicked a 39-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead with 1:38 left in the first quarter. Wofford went three-and-out on their next possession, but so did the Phoenix on the ensuing drive. Irvin Mulligan took a hand-off 65-yards down the near sideline for a touchdown and a 7-3 lead at the 12:26 mark of the second quarter. After trading punts, a 20-yard touchdown pass gave Elon a 10-7 advantage with 7:16 left in the first half.

Peyton Derrick found Landon Parker for a 71-yard reception as he stepped out of bounds at the four-yard line. Ryan Ingram capped the drive with a two-yard touchdown run for a 14-10 lead with 6:24 on the clock. On the opening play of the next drive by Elon, Amir Annoor picked off a pass on the far sideline and Wofford took over at the 16-yard line. After a first down run, Nathan Walker took the ball in for a two-yard touchdown and a 21-10 lead for the Terriers with 5:36 left in the half. After trading punts, Elon got the ball back with 2:20 left. A pass into the end-zone was broken up as time expired, but a replay review took two seconds on the clock and the Phoenix made a 41-yard field goal. At the half, Wofford had a 21-13 lead.

On the opening drive of the second half, Elon went three-and-out and punted. The Phoenix picked off a pass by Peyton Derrick at midfield and returned it to the 17-yard line. Elon settled for a 23-yard field goal to cut the lead to 21-16 with 9:24 on the clock in the third quarter. Wofford then went three-and-out. The Phoenix quarterback fumbled on a force by Micheal Mason and John Beckley recovered it at the 25-yard line. After a first down, the 26-yard field goal attempt was wide right. Elon then added a 37-yard touchdown reception. The two-point try failed and the Elon lead was 22-21 with 2:31 left in the third quarter.

With the ball back, Wofford had a 26-yard field goal by Walker Gliarmis to give Wofford a 24-22 advantage with 10:15 left in the fourth quarter. After again trading punts, Elon had a fourth-and-two run up the middle stuffed by the Wofford defensive front for no gain. Wofford appeared to pick up a first down on a run by Peyton Derrick, but he fumbled short of the goal line and the ball was recovered in the endzone by the Phoenix in the endzone for a touchback with 1:04 remaining. Two first down passes moved the ball across midfield. After another first down, the Phoenix lined up for a 46-yard field goal that was short after being partially blocked by Miles Richardson with eight seconds remaining. The Terriers took a knee for the 24-22 victory.

## GAME TWO #24 KENNESAW STATE 31, WOFFORD 10

SPARTANBURG, S.C. — On Saturday evening, Wofford was defeated 31-10 by Kennesaw State at Gibbs Stadium. The Owls had a 10-0 lead at halftime and outscored the Terriers 21-10 in the second half.

Wofford opens the season at 1-1, while #24 Kennesaw State is 2-1. The Terriers were held to 67 rushing yards in the game, while Jimmy Weirick was 10-of-19 passing for 115 yards. The Owls had 339 rushing yards in the game, including 117 by Kyle Glover.

The Terriers had the ball to open the game and gained one first down before punting. Kennesaw State then had two first downs before facing a fourth-and-one. An offside penalty by the Terriers resulted in a first down, but after another first down Chuck Smith forced a fumble that was recovered by Elijah Ball at the 28-yard line. Wofford had one first down before punting. The Owls fumbled on third down, which was forced by Brandon Maina and after a replay review was recovered by Tahir Annoor. On the first play of the drive, Peyton Derrick was intercepted by Cole Loden at the 21-yard line. With the ball back, Kennesaw State went on a drive that consumed over twelve minutes and included converting two fourth-and-one plays. The Owls settled for a 23-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead at 5:11 in the second quarter. Wofford gained a pair of first downs before punting. The Owls took over at midfield and scored on a 14-yard touchdown pass to Caleb O'Neal for a 10-0 advantage with 47 seconds left in the half. Wofford had one first down before time expired.

In the second half, the Owls put together a drive with four first downs and it was capped by a 29-yard run by Kyle Glover for a 17-0 lead at the 10:40 mark of the third quarter. Wofford had a 69-yard kickoff return by Cagan Campbell and the Terriers began their drive on the 30-yard line. After a first down, an offensive pass interference call forced a field goal attempt and Walker Gliarmis made it from 48-yards to cut the lead to 17-3. The Owls then went three-and-out and punted for the first time in the game. Wofford gained one first down before punting the ball back to Kennesaw. They added a touchdown on a 33-yard pass to Ian Cousin for a 24-3 lead with 14:19 on the clock in the fourth quarter.

Wofford responded with a drive that was highlighted by a 56-yard pass from Jimmy Weirick to R.J. Khayo. Irvin Mulligan scored from one yard out to make it a 24-10 game with 10:26 left in the game. After the teams traded punts, the Owls used a 56-yard touchdown run to push the advantage to 31-10 at 6:42 in the fourth quarter. JOHNSON CITY, Tenn. — On Saturday afternoon, Wofford was defeated 27-21 by East Tennessee State University at Greene Stadium. The Bucs jumped scored the first ten points before the Terriers answered with a pair of touchdowns. ETSU had a 17-14 lead at the half. Wofford scored first in the third quarter for a 21-17 advantage, but the Bucs scored the next ten points. The Bears scored the first 14 points and the Terriers answered with 14 to tie the game. Mercer scored the 31 unanswered points for the final margin and held the Terriers to their lowest offensive production of the season.

Wofford is 1-6 overall and 0-5 in the Southern Conference. Mercer is 5-2 overall and 4-1 in league play. The Terriers were led by Irvin Mulligan with 46 rushing yards and Alec Holt with 39 receiving yards. Fred Payton was 19-of-28 passing for the Bears with three touchdowns, while Fred Davis ran for 91 yards and a touchdown.

The Terriers had the ball to open the game and went three-and-out and punted. On the first drive by the Bears, they had two first downs and then scored a touchdown on a 26-yard pass from Fred Davis to Ty James for a 7-0 lead at 12:10 in the first quarter. After the Bears gained two first downs, Michael Mason pressured the quarterback and Joe Beckett forced the fumble. Beckett recovered the ball and returned it 55-yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 14-14 with 12:33 on the clock. Mercer had one first down on the ensuing drive and punted. Wofford then went three-and-out and punted. The Bears took over at midfield and had three first downs to move to the ten-yard line. On a run by Fred Peyton, Harrison Morgan forced a fumble and recovered it at the seven-yard line with seven minutes left in the half. On the next play, Bryce Corriston fumbled and Isaac Dowlings recovered it in the endzone for a 21-14 lead with 6:50 on the clock. The Terriers had one first down before punting back to the Bears. They had a first down and then a 41-yard pass completion to move into the red zone. The drive stalled and Mercer had a 29-yard field goal to extend the lead to 24-14 with 1:31 remaining in the half. Wofford ran the clock out to end the half.

To begin the second half, the Bears had four first downs before throwing a nine-yard touchdown pass to Brandon Marshall for a 31-14 advantage with 9:12 on the clock. Wofford went three-and-out on their first possession of the half. Mercer had a first down before punting back to the Terriers. Wofford began their drive at the one-yard line and had two first downs before having to punt. With the ball back, the Bears had two big first down passes before a 24-yard touchdown pass from Fred Payton to Ty James to make it a 38-14 game with 12:24 left in the game. Wofford went three-and-out for the fifth time in the contest and the Bears had one first down before a 49-yard touchdown run by Al Wooten pushed the lead to 45-14 with 9:25 on the clock. The Terriers had one first down on their next drive before punting with six minutes remaining. Wofford's defense forced a three-and-out and took over at the 35-yard line with 3:38 left in the game. After another three-and-out and punt by the Terriers, Mercer gained one first down and ran out the clock.

SPARTANBURG, S.C. – On Saturday afternoon, Wofford was defeated 41-21 by Western Carolina University. The Catamounts scored the first ten points and then turned a pair of Terriers turnovers in the first half into 14 points on the way to a 34-7 lead at the break. After Western Carolina scored first in the second half, Wofford scored twice for the final margin.

Wofford is 1-7 overall and 0-6 in the Southern Conference. Western Carolina is 2-6 overall and 2-3 in league play. The Terriers were led by Irvin Mulligan with 101 rushing yards and a touchdown. Raphael Williams led the Catamounts with 16 catches for 177 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

The Catamounts had the ball first and had three first downs to move across midfield. Quarterback Rogan Wells broke several tackles on the way to a 32-yard touchdown run and a 7-0 lead with 12:41 on the clock. Wofford had two first downs before having to punt. With the ball back, Western Carolina had three first downs before the drive stalled and they kicked a 37-yard field goal for a 10-0 advantage with 3:56 left in the first quarter. Jamari Broussard picked up three rushing first downs for the Terriers to move inside the red zone. Irvin Mulligan scored from one yard out to make it a 10-7 score with 14:31 on the clock. The Catamounts wasted little time on their next drive, with Wells finding Calvin Jones for a 72-yard touchdown reception and a 17-7 lead at the 13:59 mark of the second quarter.

After Wofford went three-and-out and punted, Western Carolina kicked a 23-yard field goal at 7:55 in the second quarter for a 20-7 advantage. The Terriers then had one first down before punting back to the Catamounts. After a three-and-out by Western Carolina, Wofford had one first down before a fumble was recovered by the Catamounts at midfield. They converted a fourth-and-one with a run. A nine-yard touchdown pass to Raphael Williams gave Western Carolina a 27-7 lead with 2:11 left in the half. The Terriers had one first down before Bryce Corriston was intercepted and the Catamounts had the ball at the 48-yard line. A 28-yard touchdown pass to Raphael Williams pushed the lead to 34-7 with 23 seconds left on the clock. Wofford ran two plays before time expired in the half.

Western Carolina added a three-yard touchdown pass to Brayden Blackmon for a 41-7 lead at 8:28 in the third quarter. Wofford had a first down rush by Bryce Corriston before punting back to the Catamounts, who then went three-and-out. Again, Wofford had one first down before punting. Western Carolina had a punt blocked by Eli Purcell and took over at the 17-yard line. A 27-yard field goal attempt went wide left with 12:00 remaining in the game. After another punt by the Catamounts, Kyle Pinnix entered the game at quarterback for the Terriers. David Legette had two rushing first downs and then scored a 22-yard touchdown to make it a 41-14 game with 7:35 on the clock.
