# CONFERENCE USA NOTES

Conference USA enters its third decade in 2015-16 as it continues to compete and promote the success of its student-athletes. The league has adapted to the ever-changing landscape of collegiate athletics over its first 20 seasons, but the commitment to excellence, integrity, leadership and its student athletes in competition, academics and community is unwavering.

Conference USA enjoys a far-reaching fan base with its 14 members: Charlotte, FIU, Florida Atlantic, Louisiana Tech, Marshall, Middle Tennessee, North Texas, Old Dominion, Rice, Southern Miss, UAB, UTEP, UTSA and WKU.

Debuting in 1995, Conference USA teams have combined for 88 bowl appearances in football, 102 NCAA Tournament appearances in basketball, including three Final Fours, 63 NCAA baseball appearances including six College World Series berths, 79 NCAA soccer tournament appearances including four trips to the College Cup, and 35 individual national champions in track and field and cross country.

Success is not limited to athletic achievement, however, as 197 Conference USA student-athletes have garnered Academic All-America honors, 691 have achieved academic all-district laurels and thousands of student-athletes have earned a college degree.

Conference USA sponsors competition in 19 sports – nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, tennis, and indoor and outdoor track and field) and 10 for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball).

The league promotes the scholar-athlete ideal, honoring outstanding academic achievement with numerous conference-sponsored awards, including the Commissioner's Honor Roll and the Commissioner's Academic Medal as well as sport-specific All-Academic teams.

C-USA annually awards postgraduate scholarships, along with the Sport Academic Awards, Scholar-Athletes of the Year and the Institutional Academic Excellence Award. Additionally, Conference USA presents a Spirit of Service Award three times each year, recognizing student-athletes who excel on the field, in the classroom and give back to the community through significant service efforts and participation.

## **SUCCESS ON THE PLAYING FIELD**

Conference USA performers have achieved great success in competition, placing the league among the top conferences in the nation.

- Eligible for the College Football Playoff
- Conference USA has 11 bowl affiliations through the 2019 season, securing a minimum of five berths annually. Conference USA has primary bowl tie-ins with the Arizona Bowl, Boca Raton Bowl, Gildan New Mexico Bowl, Hawaii Bowl, Miami Beach Bowl, Popeyes Bahamas Bowl, R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl, St. Petersburg Bowl and Xaxby's Heart of Dallas Bowl, along with secondary arrangements with the Independence Bowl and the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl.

In addition to the numerous NCAA Tournament berths, C-USA has sent four men's soccer teams to the NCAA College Cup, three softball teams to the Women's College World Series and three volleyball teams to the NCAA Sweet 16. The league has also had 35 national champions in NCAA track and field competition, one national champion in diving, and numerous NCAA individual and team competitors in cross country, golf, swimming, tennis, and track and field. Overall, Conference USA teams and individuals have made more than 1,900 NCAA appearances.

## **SUCCESS OFF THE FIELD**

C-USA institutions are among the nation's best in academic performance of student-athletes, bolstered by the fact that student-athletes at league schools have a higher graduation rate than the general student population. Among C-USA's 5,000 student-athletes, there are champions off the playing field as well. In 20 years, nearly 30,000 student-athletes have been named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll or received the Commissioner's Academic Medal, indicative of outstanding achievement in the classroom.

## **C-USA ON TV**

C-USA enjoys significant television exposure through partnerships with FOX Sports Media Group, CBS Sports Network, ESPN and American Sports Network (ASN). The multi-tiered selection process that is rooted in partnering with all four networks has substantially increased the number of national and regional appearances for football, men's and women's basketball, and all other conference sports.

C-USA membership include institutions within eight of the Top 40 media markets and four in the Top 25 according to Nielsen. C-USA home markets this year will include more than 13 million TV households, a 30 percent increase from two years ago.

## **C-USA DIGITAL NETWORK**

The C-USA Digital Network officially launched in August of 2011. Network programming includes live streaming of non-televised events, video on demand, a weekly C-USA studio show, podcasting, regular-season and championship event highlights, and conference-produced feature stories. In its first year, 1,164 events were streamed live and 8,126 videos were posted and available on the C-USA Digital Network, and those numbers have more than doubled. Monthly and yearly subscriptions provide fans access to events offered on all of the C-USA member institution's athletic websites as well as C-USA network programming.

## **C-USA IN THE COMMUNITY**

The conference's current footprint is concentrated with 14 members in 10 states and a combined area population of more than 30 million. With a commitment to community involvement, the conference developed several initiatives to maintain strong ties in C-USA cities, as well as with fans and alumni across the country. C-USA schools also place a priority on giving back to their communities through volunteer service with local and national organizations. Individually, student-athletes are recognized each season through the Spirit of Service award.

## **GOVERNANCE**

Conference USA has significant representation in the NCAA governance structure. The presidents of the member institutions serve as the league's Board of Directors.

## **A PROUD HISTORY**

Conference USA was formed in 1995 and quickly emerged as one of the nation's top conferences. The conference unveiled its name, logo and commissioner April 24, 1995, in Chicago. The league's charter members were Charlotte, Cincinnati, DePaul, Houston, Louisville, Marquette, Memphis, Saint Louis, Southern Miss, Tulane, UAB and USF. Eleven of the institutions began athletic participation in 1995, while Houston joined competition in the fall of 1996.

The league's headquarters were established in Chicago and, after nine years, relocated to the current office in Irving, Texas. Britton Banowsky was named Commissioner in October 2002, succeeding Mike Slive, the league's first commissioner.

C-USA added East Carolina (September, 1996) and the United States Military Academy (March, 1997) as football members. ECU began league competition in 1997; Army in 1998 and UAB began football play in 1999. The league brought in TCU and ECU (1999) for all sports and they began competition in 2001. USF started C-USA football in 2003. Marshall, Rice, SMU, Tulsa, UCF and UTEP became full-time Conference USA members for all sports in 2005.

In 2013, charter member Charlotte returned to C-USA and was joined by new members FIU, Florida Atlantic, Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee, North Texas, Old Dominion and UTSA. WKU joined the league on July 1, 2014.

# 2015 PRESEASON NOTES

## 20TH YEAR OF UTEP SOCCER

2015 marks the 20th season for UTEP soccer, and the Miners have made plenty of progress since first launching the program in 1996. That year, the team adopted the motto "Success is a journey, not a destination," and finished 4-12-2. The program continued to slowly grow under then head coach Veronica O'Brien, who led the Miners to their first winning season in 1998 (13-6-1). The next one was not achieved until 2002, which was the second year of head coach Kevin Cross's tenure. The Miners have averaged 13 wins per season since that timeframe, making them one of the most consistent programs in the conference and region.

## PLENTY OF TALENT BACK IN THE FOLD

The Miners bring back seven starters and 14 letter winners overall from the 2014 season. The top seven point producers return, including 2014 All-Conference USA honorees **Aleah Davis** (first team) and **Angela Cutaia** (third team). Cutaia paced the team in game-winning goals (four), goals (eight), points (19), shots (65), shots on goal (35) while Davis was second on the squad for both goals (5) and points (11). Junior **Hannah Nicholson**, who led the team in assists (five) through efforts on set pieces, is back in addition to fellow classmate **Bri Barreiro**. Barreiro tied for second on the team in assists while checking in third for goals (3) and points (10). Another name to keep an eye on is sophomore **Sydney Rapp**, who was voted to the C-USA All-Freshman team.

## GOING OVER THE SCHEDULE

Eleven home matches, a midweek road match-up with I-10 rival and a pair of contests against 2014 NCAA Tournament teams highlight the 20-game regular-season docket. UTEP has a balanced non-conference schedule, with six home games and four road tilts. The Orange and Blue will pile up frequent flyer miles at the onset of C-USA play, with all five road contests coming within the first seven games of competition. UTEP will then have the opportunity to close out conference play with three straight at home for the first time since 2011.

## SHARING THE LEADERSHIP LOAD

With just two seniors (**Angela Cutaia** and **Taylor Kidd**) on the roster, the Miners' large junior class will help share the burden of the leadership load. UTEP's roster features eight juniors (**Keighton Allen**, **Alexa Bain**, **Bri Barreiro**, **Aleah Davis**, **Nicole Lindsay**, **Hannah Nicholson**, **Alexis Roberts** and **Bri Thomas**), including six (Bain, Barreiro, Davis, Lindsay, Nicholson and Thomas) who started for the squad in 2014. The eight juniors tie as the most during **Kevin Cross's** 14-year tenure at the school. The Orange and Blue also had eight juniors in 2006, 2002 and 2001.

## PRESEASON PREMONITIONS

UTEP was predicted to land fourth out of 14 squads in the Conference USA regular season, as voted on by the league's head coaches. The top-eight finishers in the conference will qualify for the 2015 C-USA Championships. Additionally, junior **Aleah Davis** was voted to the preseason All-League team. Davis was a third-team All C-USA honoree in 2013 while securing a spot on the first team last year.

## IT'S BEEN A WHILE

UTEP enters the season having won 12 contests in back-to-back campaigns. The last time the Miners peeled off at least three straight seasons with 12+ victories was during a six-year stretch (2004-09).

## CHANCE TO MAKE HISTORY OF SORTS

The Miners have taken home third place in each of the last two seasons in Conference USA. Despite much success during the program's history, UTEP has never strung together three straight seasons with a showing of third place or better in league play.

## MULTIPLE ALL-CONFERENCE PLAYERS BACK

Four Miners secured All-Conference USA accolades in 2014, and two of them (**Aleah Davis**-first team and **Angela Cutaia**-third team) are back in the fold this year. There have been 10 times under Coach Cross that multiple players who secured All-League recognition returned, and eight of them went on to achieve the feat again the ensuing year.

## FRESH FACES

UTEP features nine true freshmen on the roster, which matches the second-highest sum in the **Kevin Cross** era. The 2013 squad boasted 12 freshmen (10 true) while the 2008 team had 10 freshmen (nine true).

## SEEING DOUBLE

For the first time in program history, the Miners have twins on the roster. Identical twins and true freshmen **Brittney** and **Danielle Trought** joined the squad following a successful prep career at Aledo High School. Perhaps the best way for fans to keep them straight will be with where they're at on the field. Brittney is expected to receive playing time as a forward while Danielle is projected to aid the defense and midfield positions.



# PRESEASON NOTES CONTINUED

## NEW LOOK IN THE NET

One big spot to fill is the goaltender position. **Sarah Dilling**, who set program records for most wins (41) and shutouts (20) while starting all 82 matches of her career, has graduated. The task to replace her falls to redshirt-junior **Keighton Allen**, who backed up Dilling the past two seasons, or incoming freshman **Alyssa Palacios**.

## RPI SUCCESS

One of the best ways to measure a team's worth across the board is the RPI, and that's an area UTEP has thrived in. The Miners have produced a top-100 RPI rating in five of the past six seasons and 10 times total under head coach **Kevin Cross**, including a program-best 31 in 2005.

## REGION SUCCESS

Another way to calculate the performance of a program is through the NSCAA Regional Rankings. UTEP has secured a spot in the Central Region top-10 poll in 10 of the past 11 seasons.

## CONFERENCE SUCCESS

UTEP is one of the most consistent programs in Conference USA. The Miners have the second-most wins (130) among all league programs since joining C-USA in 2005. Overall UTEP has finished fourth or better 10 times during head coach **Kevin Cross's** career, including six top-three showings.

## DAVIS LOOKING TO MAKE IT THREE STRAIGHT

Junior **Aleah Davis** is the fifth player in program history to secure All-Conference honors in each of her first two years. But with another quality campaign, she could join an even more exclusive club at UTEP. Former Miner standouts Ja'net Esparza (1996-99) and Kaletia Roberts (2002-05) are the lone individuals in program history to be so distinguished in their first three years. Both actually achieved the feat four times in as many years.

## ROAD WARRIORS

UTEP has posted back-to-back seasons with winning records on the road for the first time in school history. The Miners are 10-4-3 in away contests during the time frame, including the mark of 4-2-2 achieved last year. Overall the Orange and Blue have now recorded five campaigns with a winning record in road contests, all of which have come under the watch of **Kevin Cross**.

## THE CROSS FILE

Texas native **Kevin Cross** is synonymous with UTEP soccer. He has been involved with Miner soccer since 1997-the program's second year of existence-, serving as a top assistant before replacing former head coach **Veronica O'Brien** in 2001. He is 40th nationally for winningest active coaches in NCAA Division I soccer as rated by percentage (.638). Cross enters the 2015 season with an overall record of 173-94-19. Aiding that mark have been 13 straight seasons with at least 10 victories, something achieved once in the program's first six years. The Miners have played in three conference tournament title games under Cross while making one appearance in the NCAA Tournament (2005). UTEP used a come-from-behind 3-2 overtime victory against host and Big 12 power Texas to advance to the second round.

## THE WINNING WAYS OF UTEP SOCCER

UTEP has piled up 170 wins to rate 25th in country since the start of the 2002 season, with a prolific offense that has produced the 14th-most goals (603) playing an important role.

## THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

The enthusiasm and passion for UTEP by Coach Cross has helped him build a loyal fan base, which has made University Field one of the toughest places to play at in the country. The Miners have forged a mark of 107-22-8 since 2002.

## PACKING IN THE FANS

The Orange and Blue's play has attracted El Pasoans to the venue in a big way. A C-USA best 58,938 fans have passed through the turnstiles at University Field since 2005, with UTEP pacing the league five times in that time frame. Overall the Miners have registered seasonal averages of better than 400 in 12 years of Coach Cross's career, including nine with a readout surpassing 500.

## NEW PLAYING SURFACE

While UTEP will once again play its home matches at the formidable University Field, there is something for both the fans and team alike to look forward to. The new look is the playing surface itself. The natural grass field was converted to FieldTurf Revolution CoolPlay in the offseason. Designed to reduce surface heat, FieldTurf's exclusive cork top dressing allows the revolutionary CoolPlay system to deliver the same results and overall stability as FieldTurf's proven elite systems found in the world's most renowned stadiums. Additionally, the playing surface received a FIFA level II grade.

## 2014 YEAR IN REVIEW

It was an exciting 2014 season for UTEP, which caught fire down the stretch by going undefeated (5-0-3) over the final eight contests of the campaign. The hot streak helped the Miners hit the 12-win plateau for a second straight season and secure third place in C-USA for the second time in as many years. It was also one for the record books, with UTEP setting school records for fewest goals allowed (15), goals against average (0.67) and overtime games played (10). Four Miners (**Hannah Asuchak**, **Angela Cutaia**, **Aleah Davis** and **Sarah Dilling**) secured All C-USA honors, with a school-record three (Asuchak, Davis and Dilling) landing on the first team, while **Sydney Rapp** was an All-Freshman honoree. Asuchak and Davis were also tabbed to the All-Region squad.

Texas native Kevin Cross is synonymous with UTEP soccer. He has been involved with Miner soccer since 1997—the program's second year of existence—, serving as a top assistant before replacing former head coach Veronica O'Brien in 2001.

He is 40th nationally for winningest active coaches in NCAA Division I soccer as rated by percentage (.638). Cross enters the 2015 season with an overall record of 173-94-19.

Aiding that mark have been 13 straight seasons with at least 10 victories, something achieved once in the program's first six years.

UTEP has piled up 170 wins to rate 25th in country since the start of the 2002 season, with a prolific offense that has produced the 14th-most goals (603) playing an important role.

He has built the program into one of the most consistent programs in Conference USA. The Miners have the second-most wins (130) among all league programs since joining C-USA in 2005. Overall UTEP has finished fourth or better 10 times during Cross's career, including six top-three showings.

The Miners have played in three conference tournament title games under Cross while making one appearance in the NCAA Tournament (2005). UTEP used a come-from-behind 3-2 overtime victory against host and Big 12 power Texas to advance to the second round.

UTEP has produced a top-100 RPI in five of the six past seasons and 10 times total under Cross, including a program-best 31 in 2005. Additionally, the Miners have secured a spot in the NSCAA Central Region top-10 poll in 10 of the past 11 seasons.

Team success has translated into individual accolades during the Cross era. Twenty of the 22 All-Region honors in school history have been during his tenure. There have been 37 All-Conference team recipients, which is boosted by seven separate campaigns with at least three selections. The Miners have reaped 56 athletic weekly honors (38 league and 18 national) under his leadership.

His players have filled up the UTEP record books, with the career leaders for assists (Kelly Parker), game-winning assists (Kia Sams), game-winning goals (Jami Tullius), games played (Kristin Wernimont), games started (Ashleigh Decker), goals (Tullius), minutes played (Azia Nicholson), multi-assist games (Kelly Parker), multi-goal games (Tameka Sumter), shots (Tullius) and shots on goal (Tullius) having been mentored by Cross.

He has impacted the game beyond the college level, with several players having achieved notoriety. Parker, who also served as an assistant coach under Cross, was a star in the Women's Professional Soccer league while also playing for the Canadian National Team.

Parker competed at the 2011 Women's World Cup and the 2012 Summer Olympics. Additionally, former Miner Anoop Josan competed with Team Canada at the U-20 FIFA Women's World Cup in 2008.

His enthusiasm and passion for UTEP has helped him build a loyal fan base, which has made University Field one of the toughest places to play at in the country. The Miners have forged a mark of 107-22-8 since 2002.

The Orange and Blue's play has attracted El Pasoans to the venue in a big way. A C-USA best 58,938 fans have passed through the turnstiles at University Field since 2005, with UTEP pacing the league five times in that timeframe.

Overall the Miners have registered seasonal averages of better than 400 in 12 years of Cross's career, including nine with a readout surpassing 500.

UTEP has also thrived in the classroom under Cross's direction. There have been four Academic All-Americans, 16 Academic All-District honorees and 15 Academic All-Conference team members. A total of 266 individuals have secured a spot on the annual conference academic honor roll while the program has garnered a team GPA award from the NSCAA the past five years.

It was an exciting 2014 season for UTEP, which caught fire down the stretch by going undefeated (5-0-3) over the final eight contests of the campaign. The hot streak helped the Miners hit the 12-win plateau for a second straight season

and secure third place in C-USA for the second time in as many years. It was also one for the record books, with UTEP setting school records for fewest goals allowed (15), goals against average (0.67) and overtime games played (10).

Four Miners (Hannah Asuchak, Angela Cutaia, Aleah Davis and Sarah Dilling) secured All C-USA honorees, with a school-record three (Asuchak, Davis and Dilling) landing on the first team, while Sydney Rapp was an All-Freshman honoree. Asuchak and Davis were also tabbed to the All-Region squad.

UTEP went 12-6-3, including 5-3-2 within C-USA play, to pile up 17 points and finish third out of 16 teams in the revamped league during the 2013 season.

Nicholson (first team), Jade Babcock (second team) and Davis and Tori Martyn (third team) earned All-League honors. Davis landed on the All-Freshman team too. Martin, Davis and Nicholson also took home All-Region notice.

It was a roller coaster 2012 season. The Miners got off to a 7-2 start before the loss of five key players to injuries and some tough breaks on the road impacted the season. UTEP managed to garner placement in the NSCAA Central Region Poll for a ninth straight year.

Nicholson (second team) and Tess Hall and Martyn (third team) were All-Conference honorees, with Nicholson also meriting All-Region accolades.

UTEP battled through some injuries and close calls during the 2011 campaign, but it put things together when it mattered most down the stretch. The Miners earned runner-up honors at the 2011 Conference USA Championships. UTEP pushed No. 4/6 host and unbeaten Memphis to the brink before being edged out on a golden goal in the second overtime session.

Dilling, Katie Dorman and Brittany Kindziarski became the first players since 2007 to be All-Tournament team honorees. Nicholson (second team), Hall and Martyn (third team) were selected to the All-League squad and Dilling was an All-Freshman team member. Nicholson secured the first of three straight All-Region recognition.

A high-flying attack which allowed UTEP to lead the nation in scoring for most of the season set the tone for another successful season in 2010. The Miners (11-8-0) climbed to as high as 29th nationally in the TopDrawerSoccer.Com ratings, were regionally ranked for the seventh straight year and defeated a top-25 program in the form of Memphis, 2-1, on Sept. 26.

Dorman was tabbed to the All C-USA third team and Nicholson was an All-Freshman honoree.

In 2009 UTEP registered a mark of 13-6-1, which was helped by becoming the second team in school history (2006) to post two separate winning streaks of at least four contests.

Some matches stood out more than others. In the inaugural battle of I-10, UTEP downed NM State, 1-0, in front of a school-record 1,610 fans at University Field on Aug. 21. The Miners showed their prowess in league play by besting two-time defending C-USA champion Memphis, 3-2, on the road on Oct. 2. UTEP posted a convincing 2-0 triumph against long-time rival SMU on Sept. 27, and it was one of six teams to qualify for the reduced field at the C-USA Championships.

A then school-record three players (Chelsea Winbush-first team, Sumter-second team and Skye Schultz-third team) were named All-Region performers. No other program in the region had more than two players on the list. League honors also poured in, with a quartet of Miners (Sumter and Winbush, first team, Jo Radcliffe third team and Schultz, Freshman of the Year) being recognized.

In 2008 UTEP showed tremendous character in overcoming an inordinate amount of injuries through the year to finish with a final mark of 13-7-1. Eighteen different players, the most since Cross's first year on the job in 2001, started at least one match. The Miners were fashioned a record of 5-2-1 to close out the regular season in style. Back-to-back wins against regionally-rated opposition (No. 13 Rice on Oct. 26 and No. 8 Colorado College on Oct. 31) were included in the stretch. Another notable triumph on the year

was the Miners downing Big 12 member Baylor, 1-0, in front of a then school-record 1,426 fans in the season opener on Aug. 22.

Sumter (first team) and Winbush (second team) were All-League honorees. Sumter also was an All-Region performer.

The Miners took care of business early and often throughout the 2007 season, boasting a final record of 13-7-2. UTEP advanced to the semifinals of the C-USA tournament and climbed as high as 10th in the NCAA's Central Region ranking.

Brilliant soccer attracted a then program-best 588 fans on average to home matches. UTEP rewarded the home faithful by going 8-1-2 at University Field, outscoring the opposition by a final count of 25-11.

Taking full advantage of Cross's offensive system, Tullius became the first player in school history to secure the C-USA Offensive Player of the Year. The native of El Paso led the lead in goals and points, and to this day remains the school record holder in those categories.

UTEP went 15-6 in 2006, setting school records for goals allowed (20), goals against average (0.93) and shutouts (11). Six of those blankings were consecutive, which also established a school standard.

The Orange and Blue defeated No. 17 Rice, 1-0, in front of a then school-record 1,106 fans on Oct. 8. The match was carried live nationally on College Sports Television, which was the first of its kind from the Sun City. UTEP blanked No. 25 Colorado College on Oct. 22, delivering its program-best second victory against a ranked foe on the year.

Individuals continued to be noticed for their play, as five different players combined to reel in a program-best-tying six league player of the week accolades, including sweeping the award two straight weekends. Nationally, four different Miners were placed on national teams of the week a school-record eight times.

Josan was an All-Region, All-Conference and All-Freshman honoree. She was joined on the All-Freshman squad by Sumter.

The 2005 campaign was a season for the ages. The Miners set the tone with a 15-match (14-0-1) unbeaten streak out of the gates, on the way to finishing at a then C-USA best 20-4-1.

UTEP received an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, and made its first appearance a memorable one. The Miners posted a thrilling come-from-behind 3-2 overtime road victory against Texas to punch their ticket to the second round. Tullius scored twice in the final 10 minutes to force overtime, and Leslie Platz buried the golden goal at 94:37. UTEP bowed out to #6 California, 2-1, in the second round.

The Orange and Blue, who earned the highest national ranking (31st) of any C-USA member institution, continued to thrive in all facets of the game, ranking 10th nationally in scoring offense, while registering a then program-best tying eight shutouts.

Brittany Popoff, Kaletia Roberts and Tullius (second team) were All-League honorees. Tullius also earned All-Region mention.

In 2004, the Miners won 13 games - including a 3-2 triumph over 20th-ranked SMU - and finished second in the WAC at 5-2-1. UTEP also ranked 28th nationally in scoring and spent much of the campaign among the SoccerBuzz.com Central Region top 10. Amber Mack and Roberts (second team) secured All-League recognition.

In 2003, Cross's squad racked up an 11-8 record and advanced to the semifinals of the WAC Tournament. Christine McCartney and Roberts (second team) earned All-WAC accolades. The squad was also a recipient of the NSCAA/adidas Women's College Team Academic Award.

The following spring, April 2004, Cross's team faced the Mexican national team in an exhibition match in front of 5,400 fans at Dudley Field in El Paso.

In 2002, Cross led UTEP to a magical season. His Miners finished the year 16-3. For his coaching efforts Cross was named the WAC Coach of the Year and the Central Region Coach of the Year by SoccerBuzz.com. UTEP snared runner-up honors in the WAC and ranked in the top 10 in the Central Region by SoccerBuzz.com throughout the year. Cross's unit led the NCAA in goals per match (4.42 gpm) and total goals (84), while its .842 winning percentage was eighth best in the country.

UTEP's 16-3 record was the fourth-best turnaround in NCAA soccer history. Cross mentored three of the top individual scorers in the NCAA and the top-three single-season point scorers in program history. Cohen was fourth in points per match (2.83) and sixth in goals per match (1.22).

Parker led the NCAA with 1.00 assists per match and was tied for 13th in points per match (2.16). Miranda Cuthbertson was seventh in points (2.53 ppm) and eighth in goals (1.05 gpm).

Cross's team set program single-campaign records for goals (84), assists (73), points (241), fewest goals allowed (21) and lowest goals against average (1.09).

In addition to his own postseason honors, Cross coached a single-season school record five All-WAC selections, including first teamers Parker and Cohen. He had four players selected to the WAC All-Tournament team, with Cohen being named the MVP. Cohen and Parker also secured All-Region awards.

The successful season led to several university awards as well. Parker received the UTEP Female Athlete of the Year Award, Cohen was chosen as the Golden Miner Award winner, and the team was given the Community Service Award for the 2002-03 school year.

His era as head coach began in 2001, as he tutored one of the top offensive players in the WAC in Cohen while landing two on the All-WAC squad.

Cross, the second head coach in school history, was a critical part of the program as an assistant the previous four seasons before becoming the skipper.

Cross helped UTEP to the WAC Mountain Division regular season title during the 1998 campaign by recruiting seven freshmen starters dubbed the "Magnificent Seven" by The El Paso Times.

As the Miners' top assistant, Cross was in charge of handling nearly every aspect of the program. He was an integral part of the recruiting process, both nationally and internationally. He helped mold five first team All-WAC picks, five second team All-WAC selections, one conference player of the year and a freshman All-American.

Cross holds the National Soccer Coaches Association of America National Diploma, a United States Soccer Federation "B" license and was an instructor for the South Texas Youth Soccer Association "G" license.

Following his playing career, Cross worked as a member of the Texas A&M men's club staff. While at Texas A&M, he was head coach of the university's club team from 1996-97, leading the unit to the NERSA nationals. He completed his master's degree in business administration in 1997 from Texas A&M.

Additionally, Cross was an assistant girls' soccer coach at Bryan High School in 1997. He was a staff member for the Bobby Moffat Techniques Soccer Camp and Austin College Soccer Camp.

Cross starred as a center fullback for Austin College from 1992 to 1994, playing an important role in the team's success. He helped the squad to second-place NAIA District VIII finishes in three consecutive seasons.

A three-year letter winner for the Kangaroos, Cross was a two-time NAIA Academic All-American and received the Charles "Bo" Miller Award as the school's top student-athlete of the year in 1995. In 1995, he graduated summa cum laude with degrees in business and economics.

Cross began his collegiate career by helping Richland Junior College to an 11th-place finish in the NJCAA during the 1991 season.

A native of Richardson, Texas, Cross was a standout at Berkner High School.

Cross is married to Carrie Cross, the former girls' head soccer coach at Franklin High School in El Paso. Cross and his wife had their first son, Chase, on July 1, 2004. Their daughter, Chelsea, was born on April 19, 2006.

Former UTEP soccer player and graduate assistant Heather Clark is in her sixth season as an assistant coach. Clark returned to her alma mater after being appointed to the position on Feb. 1, 2010.

She has helped the Miners reach at least 10 victories in all five of her seasons, including back-to-back 12 win seasons in 2013 and 2014. UTEP played in the 2011 Conference USA Championship contest and has finished in third place in consecutive campaigns.

The squad's defensive prowess has steadily improved with Clark's influence, culminating with a historic effort in 2014. The Miners set school standards for fewest goals allowed (15), goals against average (0.67) and overtime games played (10).

She rejoined the Orange and Blue following a successful two-year stint as an assistant for the then rapidly-improving Valparaiso soccer program.

Clark, who was standout defender and four-year letter winner under UTEP head coach Kevin Cross from 2001-04, got her start in coaching at the Sun City. She served as a program coordinator in 2006 & 2007 before being hired away as the top assistant for the Valpo program.

In 2009 Valpo registered a mark of 11-9-1, including 5-3 in the Horizon League, on the way to securing its top regular-season finish (third) since joining the conference. The squad advanced to the league tournament championship contest for the first time in school history, and ultimately finished with its sixth straight season of at least 10 triumphs.

In her first season on the Crusader bench (2008), Clark's defensive knowledge was instrumental in the squad setting school records for goals against average (0.71) and shutouts (10).

Clark's appointment to an assistant coach position with the Miners allowed her career to come full circle. She first arrived in El Paso as a freshman in 2001, and immediately became a fixture on the defense. The native of Alamogordo, N.M., played in 70 games, including 65 starts. She got in on the fun offensively, contributing 19 points on four goals and 11 assists.

A two-year captain, Clark's leadership skills are unquestioned. She personified the term student-athlete, earning first-team CoSIDA Academic All-American honors in 2004. At the time she was just the second Miner student-athlete to be so distinguished. Clark also garnered a pair of academic all-district awards by CoSIDA.

She also picked up several UTEP team awards in her time with the Orange and Blue. She took home the "Honor Award" in 2002 and then picked up the "Iron Women Award" in 2004.

Clark joined the UTEP soccer program as a player following a record-setting career at Alamogordo HS. She set a school record for career goals (69) while also registering 54 assists under the direction of her coach and father, Larry Clark.

Clark earned her bachelor's degree in interdisciplinary studies from UTEP in 2006. She received her master's degree in education administration from the school in 2008.

Former Miner Ashleigh Decker is in her fourth year as an assistant soccer coach for the UTEP soccer program. She was tabbed to the position on Feb. 10, 2012.

She has helped the Miners reach at least 10 wins in each of her three seasons, including consecutive 12-win campaigns in 2013 and 2014. UTEP has finished in third place in Conference USA in back-to-back years.

Decker's strong and physical style of play as a defender from her playing days has rubbed off on the squad. The breakthrough on defense came during a historic 2014 season. The Miners set school standards for fewest goals allowed (15), goals against average (0.67) and overtime games played (10).

As a player, Decker was as steady as can be. She was a four-year starter (2003-06) and captained the 2005 squad that advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Decker started all 84 matches during her time with the Orange and Blue, which rates tied as the most in program history. She logged the second-most minutes (6,916) in school history, making a name for herself a strong, physical defender throughout her career.

She helped the Miners forge a combined record of 59-23-2 and was a key component in their rise to one of the elite teams in the NCAA's Central Region.

It was no more evident than in 2005 when UTEP rolled to a program-best mark of 20-4-1, including a 3-2 OT victory at Texas to punch its ticket to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Decker was a leader of the back line that forged 33 combined shutouts over her four years in uniform, including the top two single-season efforts (11, 2006; 8, 2005) in program history.

She also got involved in the offense, tallying a pair of goals to go along with 12 assists. At the time of her graduation from UTEP, the 12 helpers ranked as the ninth most in program history.

Decker was a solid student as well, earning academic honors from the conference on three occasions.

She graduated with a degree in business management from UTEP in May 2007.
