QUICK HITTERS
A LOOK AT WEEK TEN

Five league matchups and a pair of non-conference games at SEC schools make up the slate of action this weekend in Conference USA.

Florida Atlantic (4-0, 5-3), winners of four in a row and the only without a conference loss, will host Marshall (6-2, 3-1) on Friday night to get the week's action started (6 pm ET on CBS Sports Network). The game is a classic matchup of one of the league's best offenses in Florida Atlantic (39.5 ppg) against one of the best defenses in Marshall (17.6 ppg allowed).

West Division co-leader North Texas (5-3, 4-1) takes its perfect 3-0 division record to Louisiana Tech (4-4, 2-2), where the Bulldogs look to finish the season strong with three of their last four games at Joe Aillet Stadium.

An exciting cross-division matchup takes place when UTSA (5-2, 2-2) makes its first visit to FIU (3-1, 5-2). The winner gets bowl-eligible and stays squarely in the hunt for a division title.

The other two conference matchups include Charlotte going to Old Dominion and UTEP making its first trip to Middle Tennessee (1-3, 3-5).

The two games vs. the SEC take place about three hours apart. WKU (5-3, 3-2) will be playing Vanderbilt for the third year in a row and will be looking for its second straight win in Nashville (11 am CT on ESPN). Southern Miss (5-3, 3-2) seeks to bounce back from a tough home loss when it travels to Tennessee to close out its non-conference schedule.

GLANCING AT C-USA

Heading into November it is one of the wildest Conference USA races we've seen. Florida Atlantic (4-0) is the only team without a conference loss and is followed by three teams with one loss (Marshall, FIU and North Texas) and five schools with two defeats in league play. Marshall (6-2) is the only school that has reached bowl-eligibility, but seven teams are sitting one win away with five overall victories and another is just two shy with four wins.

MOTORIZING

Florida Atlantic sophomore RB **Devin "Motor" Singletary** ran for a season-high 244 yards and scored four touchdowns to lead the Owls to a 42-28 win at WKU. He added to his school single-season record for rushing touchdowns and now has 18 in the Owls eight games on the year. He now has five straight games with multiple scores and 28 rushing touchdowns in his last 121 games. Singletary also registered his sixth consecutive 100-yard rushing game, while going over the 1,000-yard mark for the season (1,053) and 2,000 in his career (2,074). Singletary is currently ninth nationally in yards per game with an average of 131.6 and leads the nation in rushing TDs with 18 (four more than any other player).

LANE TRAIN SETTING RECORDS

Lane Kiffin's Florida Atlantic Owls established new school records for points (69) and total yards (804) during a 69-31 win over North Texas on Oct. 22. The 804 yards set a new Conference USA record, originally set by Tulsa with 791 against UTEP in 2008. FAU

scored on its first 11 drives. Florida Atlantic, which is averaging 51.8 points in four C-USA games and 39.1 for the season, is eighth in the FBS in rushing yardage at 295.8 per game. In October, the Owls led the FBS with a 56.3 scoring average.

PANTHERS PROWLING

FIU kept its breakout season going with a 41-30 win at Marshall on Saturday, a victory that put the Panthers (5-2) one win from being bowl-eligible for just the third time in the program's 16-year history. With the win, the Herd (6-2, 3-1 C-USA) drops to a second place tie with FIU (5-2, 3-1 C-USA). Also, FIU has a 5-2 record for the first time in its history.

The Panthers used a balanced attack to rush for 224 yards against the top rushing defense in C-USA. The Herd defense had allowed 109.9 rushing yards per game before Saturday. Senior WR **Thomas Owens** caught seven passes for 114 yards and two touchdowns. Owens' two TD grabs give him 20 for his FIU career, moving him into third place ahead of former FIU TE Jonnu Smith, who had 18 scores.

UTSA TAKES OVER AS TOP D

UTSA's defense held UTEP to 243 total yards and came up with a pair of interceptions in winning for the third straight time in El Paso, 31-14. With that defensive effort, the Roadrunners took over the top spot in C-USA in a pair of key defensive categories and moved up nationally. UTSA is now 11th in the FBS in total defense (294.7) and 12th in scoring defense (17.4). Additionally, the Roadrunners now have the top-ranked rushing defense (122.3 yards per game) and pass defense (172.4 ypg) in C-USA.

WHAT UAB'S BROWN CAN DO

Freshman RB **Spencer Brown** used a 209-yard performance on the ground and broke Jordan Howard's single season freshman rushing record to lead UAB past Southern Miss, 30-12 on Saturday. Brown's 209 yards were the seventh-most in school history and just the eighth time ever a UAB back has eclipsed the 200-yard mark in a single game. His total yardage and 33 attempts are both career highs, while he recorded his seventh rushing touchdown of the season. Brown needed just eight games to break Howard's freshman rushing record of 881 yards set back in 2013. He now has 909 rushing yards this season and is averaging 113.6 yards per game (second in C-USA).

MASON IS FINE

Sophomore QB **Mason Fine** continued his ascent in the North Texas record book with another strong performance in a win over Old Dominion on Saturday. Fine completed 25-of-36 passes for 309 yards and a touchdown, his fourth game of 300-or-more yards passing this season, which ties for the Conference USA lead. He started a perfect 10-for-10 for the Mean Green Saturday, with a touchdown in the first quarter. Fine moved into a tie for ninth in school history for passing yards in a single season (2,388) and his 17 touchdowns, like his passing yards and passing yards per game (298.5) all lead C-USA. Fine remains eighth in school history on the career passing list for the Mean Green (3,960 yards in 17 games) and he also climbed into a tie for the lead in career passing efficiency at North Texas (132.26) with Scott Hall (2000-04).

ANOTHER BULLDOG NAIL-BITER

For the fifth time in its last six games, Louisiana Tech had a game that wasn't decided until the final minute, as senior RB **Boston Scott's** third rushing TD of the day gave the Bulldogs a 35-28 lead before they sealed the win with a pick-six to make the final, 42-28. Junior transfer WR **Teddy Veal** reeled in a career-best 11 catches for 118 yards and now leads C-USA with 50 receptions.

C-USA BOWL SYNOPSIS

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments with six bowl partners for the 2017 season, as well as one secondary agreement: Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla, Bahamas, Boca Raton, Gildan New Mexico, R+L Carriers New Orleans and Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowls are primary agreements. The Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La., is a secondary agreement, should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team. There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

C-USA and the College Football Playoff

As a member of the College Football Playoff, Conference USA will be a part of one of the College Football Playoff bowls if it has the highest rated champion from among the American, C-USA, Mid-American, Mountain West and Sun Belt Conferences.

The Playoff

During the 2014-15 season, college football entered a new era when postseason playoffs began. The format is simple: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The Selection Committee

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that No. 1 will play No. 4 in one semifinal and No. 2 will meet No. 3 in the other, with the two winners advancing to the national championship game.

The Rotation

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

For the 2017-18 season, the Goodyear Cotton Bowl (Dec. 29), Capital One Orange (Dec. 30), Playstation Fiesta Bowl (Dec. 30) and Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl (Dec. 31), will host its regular bowl games, while the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual (Jan. 1) and Allstate Sugar Bowl (Jan. 1), will host semifinals. The College Football Championship will be held on Monday, Jan. 8 in Atlanta, Ga.

Conference USA will host its 13th football championship game in 2017.

The event is slated for Saturday, December 2, and will be televised by ESPN or ESPN 2. The team with the highest league winning percentage will serve as host site for the game.

The title game will feature champions from the East and West divisions of the league. Seven different schools have hosted the first 12 championship games.

WKU became just the second team in league history to win back-to-back Conference USA Football Championship Games last season, defeating Louisiana Tech, 58-44, in the highest scoring conference championship game in FBS history. In 2015, WKU became the first league school to go undefeated in C-USA play and then win the Championship Game, defeating Southern Miss, 45-28. Marshall took its first C-USA title in 2014 with a triumph over Louisiana Tech in Huntington, W. Va. In 2013, Rice won its first C-USA Football title with a victory over Marshall at Rice Stadium. Southern Miss won the 2011 C-USA Championship, when the nationally-ranked Golden Eagles defeated previously undefeated Houston on the Cougars home field. Former members East Carolina, Tulsa and UCF each won two championship games, while Houston claimed one crown.
