Conference USA will name an Offensive, Defensive and Special Teams Player of the Week each Monday during the season. The awards are selected by a panel of media members with one representative in each league city.

The conference office also will produce a weekly football release Mondays during the season. It will be distributed directly to members of the media upon request and available at ConferenceUSA.com.



QUICK HITTERS

A LOOK AT WEEK ELEVEN

For the only time this season, seven conference games will be played on Saturday as Conference USA heads into the final three weeks of the regular season.

North Texas (6-3, 5-1) can clinch the West Division title and a spot in its first C-USA Championship Game with a win over UTEP (4 pm CT on ESPN3). Mean Green senior RB **Jeffery Wilson** has rushed for 1,001 yards and 13 TDs on the season, placing him in the top 20 of the FBS in both categories.

East-leading Florida Atlantic (5-0, 6-3) will take its five-game winning streak to Louisiana Tech (4-5, 2-3) at 2:30 pm CT (Stadium). The Owls, led by the nation's leading scorer in **Devin "Motor" Singletary** (20 touchdowns) will go against a hard luck Bulldogs team that has three one-point losses and another in double-overtime.

The teams that have combined to win the last three East Division titles meet in Huntington when Marshall (6-3, 3-2) welcomes WKU (5-4, 3-2) at 6:30 pm ET (BeIN SPORTS). The winner can keep alive hopes of a possible division crown this year. The Thundering Herd is already bowl-eligible and the Hilltoppers can join them with a win.

In its first year back playing football, UAB (6-3, 3-2) has reached bowl-eligibility and the Blazers will visit a UTSA team (5-3, 2-3) needing just one more W to gain bowl-eligibility for the second straight year. (KCWX and CUSA TV). UAB RB **Spencer Brown**, second in the FBS in rushing among freshmen with 1,054 yards, will have a challenge facing UTSA's rushing defense that leads C-USA at 119.5 yards allowed per game.

FIU (6-2, 4-1) is off to the best start in school history and bowl-eligible for the first time since 2011 as the Panthers get ready to host an ODU team (3-6, 1-4) that just posted the first shutout in school history.

Southern Miss (5-4, 3-2) will play at Rice, looking to get back into the win column and become bowl-eligible for the 21st time in the last 24 years (2:30 pm CT on Stadium on Facebook).

Middle Tennessee (4-5, 2-3) will look to even its record when it visits Charlotte to begin Saturday's action (2 pm ET on ESPN3).

FIRST YEAR SUCCESS

There were 22 new head coaches hired for the 2017 season in the FBS. Seven are currently bowl-eligible and only two have produced better records than FIU's **Butch Davis** and Florida Atlantic's **Lane Kiffin** (through games of Nov. 4):

UAB BOWL-ELIGIBLE

After not playing football for two seasons, UAB became bowl-eligible on the first Saturday of November, improving to 6-3 overall with a 52-21 win over Rice. The Blazers, who reached bowl-eligibility in the program's last season in 2014 are eligible for the fifth time in school history.

Junior QB **A.J. Erdely** finished 20-of-21 for 197 yards and three touchdown passes – to bring his season total to 12 TD passes in addition to 10 rushing scores. His .952 completion percentage is a new C-USA record, eclipsing the previous high of .947. True freshman RB **Spencer Brown** ran for 140 yards (129 in the first half) and notched a career-high three rushing touchdowns to bring his season total to 10. He now stands at 1,049 rushing yards on the season, becoming just the fifth player in program history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season.

MOTORING

Florida Atlantic sophomore RB **Devin "Motor" Singletary** posted his second straight 200+-yard rushing game in last Friday's win over Marshall, gaining 203 yards and scoring two touchdowns. He has a school-record 19 rushing touchdowns this season, tied for eighth in C-USA history, as he chases the record of his running backs coach, **Kevin Smith**, who had 29 for UCF in 2007. He now has six straight games with multiple scores and 29 rushing touchdowns in his last 13 games. Singletary also registered his seventh consecutive 100-yard rushing game. He is currently fifth nationally with 1,256 yards and leads the nation in rushing TDs with 19 (three more than any other player) and total TDs with 20. With Singletary leading the way, Florida Atlantic is seventh nationally in rushing, averaging 284.0 yards per game.

PANTHERS PROWLING

FIU's defense put in another strong effort on Saturday as the Panthers held off UTSA, 14-7, to become bowl-eligible for the first time since 2011 and just the third time in the program's 16-year history. FIU (6-2, 4-1 C-USA) is one game behind Florida Atlantic in the East Division and faces the Panthers on Nov. 18 in Boca Raton. FIU's 6-2 start is the best in school history and the Panthers are 3-0 at home.

WORST TO FIRST IN DENTON

One of the reasons that North Texas is one win away from clinching the West Division title is the improvement of their offense in its second season under head coach **Seth Littrell** and offensive coordinator **Graham Harrell**. Last season, the Mean Green were last in C-USA in total offense (341.6 ypg) and second-to-last in scoring offense (24.6 ppg). This year, North Texas leads C-USA in offense at 476.7 ypg and is second in scoring at 35.9 ppg.

Sophomore QB **Mason Fine** leads the league in total offense (296.3 ypg) and is tied for the lead in TD passes (18). Senior RB **Jeffery Wilson** is one of three C-USA backs to average more than 100 yards per game (third at 111.1) and is second in rushing scores (13). Sophomore WR **Jalen Guyton** has 44 catches for 779 receiving yards and is tied for the league lead with seven TD receptions.

SACK ATTACK

Conference USA teams have combined to register 124 sacks this season. That total is third in the FBS, just one behind the SEC and two behind the Big Ten for the lead. Old Dominion leads the way with 25, followed by Marshall (23) and Rice (22). Individually, Rice senior DL **Brian Womac** is tied for fifth nationally with eight and UTSA senior DE **Marcus Davenport** and Middle Tennessee sophomore LB **Khalil Brooks** are 19th with 6.5 each.

INTERCEPTION LEADERS

Conference USA has a pair of teams leading the nation in interception categories. Florida Atlantic's defense leads the nation in most passes intercepted with 18, with junior DB **Jalen Young** tied for second individually with five. UAB's offense, with junior QB **A.J. Erdely** throwing all but three of its 239 attempts, is tied for the fewest interceptions thrown with two.

Florida Atlantic leads the nation in turnovers gained (24) and turnover margin (+1.78).

ODU POSTS FIRST SHUTOUT

Old Dominion earned its first shutout in program history with a 6-0 victory over Charlotte on Saturday, holding the 49ers to 231 total yards. It was just the fourth game in C-USA history without a touchdown and the first since UAB posted a 15-0 win at UCF to conclude the 2008 regular season.

C-USA HAS THREE LOU GROZA AWARD SEMIFINALISTS

A trio of Conference USA players have been named among the 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place Kicker Award, presented by the Palm Beach County Sports Commission. The award honors the top kicker in college football and C-USA is represented by Florida Atlantic senior **Greg Joseph**, Middle Tennessee senior **Canon Rooker** and UTSA freshman **Jared Sackett**. C-USA players have won the Groza Award three times (2000, 2001, 2012).

UTEP'S HERNANDEZ NAMED AP MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICAN

UTEP senior OG **Will Hernandez** was named to the AP Midseason All-America team, as chosen by a panel of 16 Top 25 poll voters. He garnered second team honors through seven games and has racked up 44 starts in four seasons for the Miners. Hernandez is not new to the spotlight having earned 2017 AP Pre-season All-America second team recognition, and last season he was the first Miner offensive lineman to receive AP All-American second team honors.

SENIOR CLASS SEMIFINALISTS

Conference USA produced four of the 30 Senior CLASS Award candidates for the 2017 season, it was announced October 5. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA DI FBS senior and have notable achievements in the four C's of community, classroom, character and competition. C-USA is represented by Middle Tennessee K **Canon Rooker**, Rice LB **Emmanuel Ellerbee**, UTSA DE **Marcus Davenport** and WKU QB **Mike White**.

WKU'S FELDER A MACKAY AWARD NATIONAL TE OF THE WEEK

The John Mackey Award has named **Deon Yelder** of WKU as the John Mackey Tight End on Oct. 18. Yelder had career highs of seven catches for 92 yards - all in the first half - while scoring his second touchdown of the season in a 45-14 win over Charlotte,

MARSHALL'S YURACHEK NAMED NATIONAL TE OF THE WEEK

The John Mackey Award has named **Ryan Yurachek** of Marshall as the John Mackey Tight End of the Week for games ending September 30. The Thundering Herd senior had six catches for 77 yards and three touchdowns in a 38-21 win at Cincinnati. The receiving yardage and touchdown total were both single game career highs for Yurachek.

C-USA BOWL SYNOPSIS

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments with six bowl partners for the 2017 season, as well as one secondary agreement: Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla, Bahamas, Boca Raton, Gildan New Mexico, R+L Carriers New Orleans and Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowls are primary agreements. The Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La., is a secondary agreement, should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team. There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

C-USA and the College Football Playoff

As a member of the College Football Playoff, Conference USA will be a part of one of the College Football Playoff bowls if it has the highest rated champion from among the American, C-USA, Mid-American, Mountain West and Sun Belt Conferences.

The Playoff

During the 2014-15 season, college football entered a new era when postseason playoffs began. The format is simple: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The Selection Committee

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that No. 1 will play No. 4 in one semifinal and No. 2 will meet No. 3 in the other, with the two winners advancing to the national championship game.

The Rotation

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

For the 2017-18 season, the Goodyear Cotton Bowl (Dec. 29), Capital One Orange (Dec. 30), Playstation Fiesta Bowl (Dec. 30) and Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl (Dec. 31), will host its regular bowl games, while the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual (Jan. 1) and Allstate Sugar Bowl (Jan. 1), will host semifinals. The College Football Championship will be held on Monday, Jan. 8 in Atlanta, Ga.

2017 DYNACRAFT C-USA FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Conference USA will host its 13th football championship game in 2017.

The event is slated for Saturday, December 2, and will be televised by ESPN or ESPN 2. The team with the highest league winning percentage will serve as host site for the game.

The title game will feature champions from the East and West divisions of the league. Seven different schools have hosted the first 12 championship games.

WKU became just the second team in league history to win back-to-back Conference USA Football Championship Games last season, defeating Louisiana Tech, 58-44, in the highest scoring conference championship game in FBS history. In 2015, WKU became the first league school to go undefeated in C-USA play and then win the Championship Game, defeating Southern Miss, 45-28. Marshall took its first C-USA title in 2014 with a triumph over Louisiana Tech in Huntington, W. Va. In 2013, Rice won its first C-USA Football title with a victory over Marshall at Rice Stadium. Southern Miss won the 2011 C-USA Championship, when the nationally-ranked Golden Eagles defeated previously undefeated Houston on the Cougars home field. Former members East Carolina, Tulsa and UCF each won two championship games, while Houston claimed one crown.
