Built in the early 1930s, Kidd Field has been home to several All-Americans, national champions, national record-holders and Olympians.

Named after UTEP (then Texas College of Mines and Metallurgy) professor and athletic booster John W. Kidd, the facility was shared with the UTEP football team until 1962, when the facility became sole home to the track and field team.

The track features an eight-lane Mondo Track, the same surface used for the 2004 Athens Olympic Games. The track was made possible by generous donations from Wayne and Russ Vandenburg of EPT Management and Mark Fry.

In 2003, UTEP renovated its offices and locker room and also added a student-athlete lounge.

The lit facility also houses throws and jumps arenas, making Kidd Field one of the top track-only complexes in the country. Improvements continue to reshape the complex, as new aluminum bleachers were added in 2002. During the summer of 2004, the track was repainted.

Kidd Field will be the site of three home meets this season. The Miners will open the outdoor campaign with the Springtime Invitational on April 1. Then UTEP will host the highly-regarded UTEP Invitational on April 15. UTEP will hold the Conference USA Championships from May 10-13.

Record times have always been synonymous with Kidd Field. At the 1994 UTEP Invitational, former Miner Olapade Adeniken set the Kidd Field 100-meter record, a blazing 9.95 seconds. Obadele Thompson, then just a freshman, set the world junior 100 record in the same race with a time of 10.08.

In 1996, Thompson topped his mark in the 100 with a wind-aided 9.69, the fastest performance under any conditions in history.



# Head Coach

# Bob Kitchens



## Texas Tech '68

In 17 seasons at the helm of the UTEP track and field program, head coach Bob Kitchens has continually led the Miners into the forefront of the national picture while mentoring gold medalists both on the track and in the classroom.

He has been the architect behind UTEP regaining name recognition as a dominant track and field program throughout the world.

Since being hired as the UTEP head coach in August of 1988, he has accumulated a spectacular coaching resume. Kitchens has produced 106 outdoor All-Americans, 60 indoor All-Americans, 10 cross country All-Americans and his athletes hold 16 of the school's indoor records and 25 of the outdoor records. He has led the Miners to six top-five NCAA finishes (four indoor, two outdoor) and nine conference titles (four outdoors, three indoors, two cross country). Kitchens was honored seven times by the Western Athletic Conference as the Coach of the Year. He has overseen the training of 18 NCAA champions, 176 NCAA All-Americans and 262 conference champions. He has also sent 22 Miners to compete in the Olympics, including silver medalist Olapade Adeniken (1992, 400 relay) and bronze medalists

Obadele Thompson (2000, 100) and Aaron Egbele (2004, 400 relay).

Kitchens has made a career out of molding champions and has become one of the most highly-regarded track and field coaches in the country. In 36 years as a head coach his expertise has produced 210 NCAA All-Americans, 21 NCAA champions, 25 Olympians and 355 conference champions. His teams have finished in the top 20 at the NCAA championships 27 times, and he has overseen the development of 11 teams which have gone on to win conference titles.

Over the years, Kitchens has had the knack of turning the raw talented into the world's elite. He coached the world junior record holder in the outdoor 100-meter (10.08 by Obadele Thompson) and 200-meter (20.07 by Lorenzo Daniel) dashes and produced the world record holders in the indoor 55-meter (5.99 by Thompson) and 100-meter dashes. His athletes set NCAA indoor and outdoor championship records in the 200 with Thompson running 20.36 indoors in 1996 (since been broken) and Daniel running 19.87 outdoors in 1988.

Kitchens has made the sprinting events his forte. At UTEP he has coached eight NCAA champions and had 76 athletes gain NCAA All-America honors – an average of 4.5 per year – in sprinting events.

After years of success in the Western Athletic Conference, Kitchens will look to make his mark on a new field of competition presented by Conference USA in 2006.

In 2005, Kitchens helped the Miners close out Western Athletic Conference tenure in style. UTEP swept the men's indoor and outdoor titles. The Miner men finished 12th at the NCAA Outdoor Championships behind Mircea Bogdan's gold medal in the steeplechase and Mickael Hanany's silver medal in the high jump. During the indoor season, Adriana Pirtea captured the silver medal in the 3,000-meter run at the NCAA Championships.

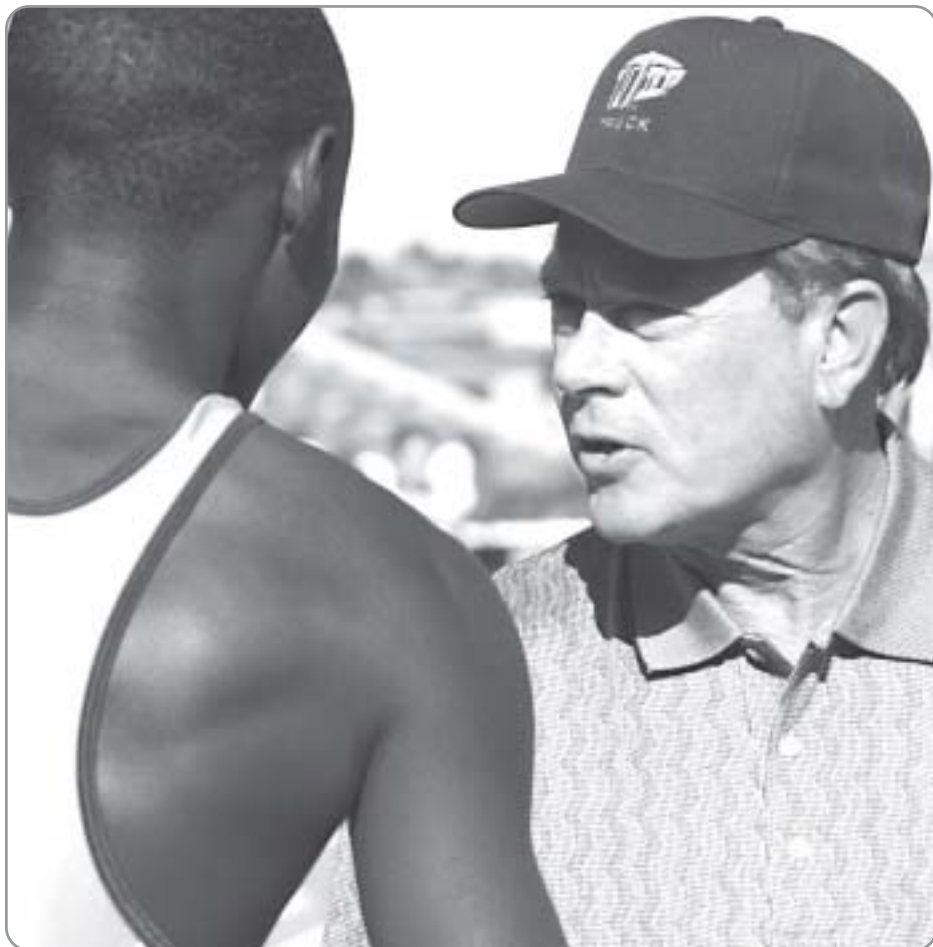
Since the inception of the regional meet concept in 2003, Kitchens has had 41 point winners and four NCAA Midwest Regional champions.

The Miners were the national runner-up in 1992 with Adeniken winning the 100 and 200 titles and current assistant coach Mika Laaksonen taking the gold in the hammer. Adeniken set the NCAA 100 meet record in 9.97 and was also the world indoor record holder in the 100 under Kitchens.

Adeniken was not the only Miner to win both the 100 and 200 at the NCAA Championships in the same year under Kitchens' guidance. Thompson pulled off the impressive double during the 1997 season.

Kitchens has also had a fair share of success stories. In 2003, Kitchens trained former walk-on Aaron Egbele to All-America honors in the indoor 200 and in both the 100 and 200 outdoors. Egbele, who continues to run professionally, later earned the Olympic bronze medal at the 2004 Athens Olympic Games as part of Nigeria's 400 relay.

Building successful track and field programs has become second nature to Kitchens. He came to UTEP following a nine-year tenure at Mississippi State, where he produced some of the most talented sprinters in the country. Among his various feats at Mis-



Mississippi State, Kitchens coached 28 NCAA All-Americans including three national champions. His athletes set 34 school records (18 outdoors, 16 indoors) and two NCAA records. One of the highlights of his coaching career came when his 1,600 relay won the 1982 NCAA outdoor gold, the first national title of his career.

In 1988 Lorenzo Daniel set the collegiate record of 19.87, winning the 200 at the NCAA Championships. The record still stands today. Daniels also broke the world junior record in the 200 and established the NCAA record in the 300 under Kitchens.

At Mississippi State he also started the women's program in 1986 and immediately produced three All-Americans and one Olympian.

Kitchens began his head coaching career at West Texas A&M, serving in that capacity from 1968-79. Kitchens transformed a program which at first consisted of mostly walk-on athletes into a winner. He quickly developed the program and produced six NCAA All-Americans and 70 Missouri Valley Conference champions. He was named the MVC Coach of the Year after leading the Buffaloes to the 1977 MVC cross country and the 1979 MVC indoor titles. Both teams dethroned national-power Southern Illinois, which had won each previous MVC title in the 1970s.

In addition to his coaching duties at West Texas A&M, Kitchens taught bowling, tennis, racquetball and weight training as an instructor in the department of physical education. He earned his master's degree in education from West Texas A&M in 1970.

A four-year member of the track and field team at Texas Tech, Kitchens gained a scholarship after first coming to the program as a walk on. He earned three letters, running the 100 and 200 as well as the sprint relays for the Red Raiders. After exhausting his eligibility he continued to work with the track and field program as a student assistant coach while he finished his degree in education.

Kitchens was born in Plainview, Texas, a small community located on the high Texas plains. He was raised on a ranch outside Silverton, Texas, and lettered in both track and football at Silverton High School.

Kitchens is a member of the prestigious Drake Relays Hall of Fame and the West Texas A&M Athletic Hall of Champions. In addition he was named a top-100 sports legend of the 20th century by the Panhandle Hall of Fame in 2000. Four of his former athletes, including 2006 inductee Andrew Tynes, have been enshrined in the UTEP Track and Field Hall of Fame.

Kitchens has four daughters (Kristy Racz, Janet Pezirtzoglou, Candice Uribarri, Morgandy Barnett) and resides in El Paso.

**Eighth year at UTEP**



In his eighth season as an assistant coach at UTEP, Mika Laaksonen has coached two NCAA champions in the javelin and 13 All-Americans in the shot put, hammer and javelin.

In addition, Laaksonen has coached 13 conference champions since 1999.

He also serves as meet director for each UTEP home track meet.

Laaksonen coached Matti Närhi to the javelin national title in 1999, and Angeliki Tsiolakoudi to the 2000 title. Along the way, Laaksonen helped both throwers attain school records and the all-time conference marks in the

javelin. Tsiolakoudi also established a then-collegiate record in the event with a toss of 197-8 (60.26).

Last year, Laaksonen guided Correy Harrison – a walk-on – to qualification for the NCAA Championships in the discus. Harrison was the 2005 WAC champion in the event and placed fourth at the 2005 NCAA Mountain Regional. He also worked with Nina Schvedoff, who broke the school record in the 20-pound weight throw and won the conference title and Kaisa Kiintonen, who was the conference champion in the hammer. Both Schvedoff and Kiintonen were national qualifiers in the hammer as well.

In recent years he coached All-Americans Janne Vartia in the hammer and Janne Sakko in the javelin. Vartia additionally took weight and hammer WAC titles during the 2003 season.

In 2001, Laaksonen trained three more All-Americans during the outdoor season in Vesa Jäppinen (second, javelin), Vartia (fourth, hammer) and Anne-Laure Gremillet (eighth, hammer). Vartia and Jäppinen won Western Athletic Conference titles during the outdoor season during this time.

Vartia (third, hammer) and Mats Nilsson (fourth, javelin) gained All-America honors in 2000.

In his first season as a coach, he worked with All-Americans Ilmari Verho (sixth, hammer) and Tera Reinikainen (seventh, shot put).

A former UTEP student-athlete and 1992 NCAA hammer champion, Laaksonen primarily works with the throwers and assists with recruiting.

Laaksonen grew up in Finland and spent two years at the University of Technology in Lappeenranta, Finland, where he majored in industrial economics before transferring to UTEP. He was an instant factor as a Miner, winning the 1992 NCAA Championship in both the 35-pound weight throw indoors and the hammer throw outdoors.

Laaksonen repeated his All-American performance in 1993, placing second in the hammer at NCAA's. His throw of 244-3 (74.44) still ranks second all-time among Miner athletes. Following the completion of his eligibility at UTEP, Laaksonen competed in several competitions abroad, including the 1994 European Championships and the 1995 World Championships. While coach Laaksonen no longer throws the hammer competitively, he did finish in the top 50 in the world in 1996 and 1997, including recording a career best of 250-1 (76.22) in 1996.

For his efforts as a Miner, he was enshrined in the UTEP Track and Field Hall of Fame in April of 2005.

Laaksonen received his undergraduate degree in finance from UTEP in 1995 and his masters of economics in July 1998.

## Paul Ereng

**VIRGINIA '93**

**Head Cross Country/Distance Coach**  
**Third year at UTEP**



The 1988 Olympic gold medalist, Paul Ereng became the first Kenyan to take a collegiate coaching job in the United States when he was named UTEP's cross country and distance coach on Aug. 8, 2003. Now in his third season at UTEP, Ereng has already elevated the Miner distance runners to a new level of excellence.

In two and a half years, Ereng has trained an NCAA champion, six NCAA All-Americans, 22 conference champions (two cross country, 10 outdoor, 10 indoor) and one Midwest Regional champion. He has had two athletes gain conference Runner of the Year and Freshman of the Year honors. In addition, Ereng has had 11 individuals qualify for the NCAA track and field championships and four individuals qualify for the NCAA cross country championships.

Last fall, Ereng brought the UTEP men's cross country team back to the NCAA Championships for the first time in 13 years. The Miners finished 14th behind All-Americans Stephen Samoei (20th) and Japheth Ng'ojoy (22nd). Samoei was named C-USA's Runner of the Year.

UTEP advanced to the NCAA championships with a second-place finish at the NCAA Mountain Regional with Samoei (fourth), Ng'ojoy (fifth), Mircea Bogdan (ninth) and Patrick Mutai (14th) finishing in the top 15.

Ereng led the Miners to their first-ever Conference USA title, scoring 23 points behind Mutai (first), Ng'ojoy (third), Samoei (fourth), Bogdan (fifth) and Joe Muñoz (10th).

In the spring of 2005, Ereng trained Bogdan to the NCAA title and Mutai to a fifth-place finish in the 3,000-meter steeplechase. His distance runners also played a major role in UTEP winning its final WAC title at the outdoor championships, scoring 93 of the Miners' 208.5 points. During the indoor season he had Adriana Pirtea win the silver in the 3,000-meter run at the NCAA Championships.

Ereng came to UTEP after working for the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) as the technical director for the development of the youth of Africa from 2001-03. While working at the IAAF High Performance Training Center in Eldoret, Kenya, he trained young men and women middle to long distance runners from various African countries.

Ereng's runners won medals in the 800, 1,500, steeplechase, 5,000 and the 10,000 at the 2001 African Junior Championships in Mauritius.

Ereng coached Janeth Jepkosgei, who won the 2002 IAAF World Junior Championship title in the 800, and also had a fifth-place finisher on the men's side.

He molded current Olympic steeplechase champion Ezekiel Kemboi, who ranked third in the world in 2003 in the steeplechase (8:02.49). Kemboi was second in the steeplechase at the 2002 Commonwealth Games in Manchester and was runner-up at the 2003 IAAF World Championships in Paris.

In cross country he trained Simrate Sultan, a top-15 female for the 2003 World Junior Cross Country Championships, and Ali Abdalla, who finished 25th at the World Cross Country Championships on a men's 4K course.

In 2002, Ereng was appointed to head the Kenya World Junior Championships team, which finished second overall.

Along with his IAAF duties, Ereng started and coached the Eldoret Track and Field club.

He is certified by the IAAF with a level two standing for coaching middle and long distance events. He has been the President of the Africa Region V Track and Field Coaches Association, founder and executive member of the Kenya Coaches Commission, president of the National Association of Kenya Olympians and secretary general of the Rift Valley Province Track and Field Association.

Over the years, Ereng has been the recipient of many awards, honors and titles. In 2004 he was inducted into the Drake Relays' Hall of Fame. In 2003 he was given the all-time top-10 achievers medal in track and field by the Atlantic Coast Conference. He received the IAAF's lifetime athletics award in 2002. He was granted Kenya's highest title of the Order of the Grand Warrior (OGW) in 1990. He received the Jumbo Elliott Award for demonstrating quality and leadership off and on the track in 1989. He picked up the Henry Cummings Award as Virginia's top male athlete in 1989 as well.

As an athlete, Ereng was a three-time NCAA champion, a four-time NCAA All-American, the 1988 Olympic gold medalist in Seoul, twice the World Indoor Champion and a former world record holder.

As a freshman at the University of Virginia, Ereng won the 1988 NCAA Outdoor 800 title.

He emerged on the world scene by defeating Joaquim Cruz and Moroccan Said Aouita in the 800 at the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games to take Kenya's first-ever gold medal in the event.

At the 1989 IAAF World Indoor Championships in Budapest, Hungary, he established the world record in 1:44.84. A few days later he claimed his second NCAA indoor title in the 800 and then the NCAA outdoor crown in the spring.

Ereng lost only one 800 race during the 1989 outdoor season in 15 tries. He also had the world's fastest time of 1:43.16 during the season.

He also was fourth at the 1991 IAAF World Championships in Tokyo and was a member of the Kenya Olympic team at the 1992 Barcelona Olympic Games.

Ereng graduated from Virginia in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in religious studies with a minor in sociology.

A native of Eldoret, Kenya, he attended the Starehe Boys Center as a prep.

He and his wife, Fatuma, have two daughters (Jasmine & Victoria) and one son (Paul, Jr.).



## Calvin Robinson

**SAM HOUSTON STATE '00**

**Jumps/Multi-Events Coach  
Second year at UTEP**



Now in his second season as UTEP's jumps and multi-events coach, Calvin Robinson looks to carry on the school's grand tradition of All-Americans and national champions. Robinson also overlooks UTEP's domestic recruiting.

Robinson had a most successful first season with the Miners. He trained an NCAA All-American indoors and outdoors, had three athletes qualify for the NCAA Midwest Regional, produced six conference titles and had an athlete compete at the 2005 IAAF World Championships in Helsinki, Finland.

Robinson molded Mickael Hanany who went on to gain NCAA All-America honors in the high jump at both the indoor and outdoor championships. Hanany was the national runner-up outdoors and fifth indoors.

Under Robinson, Hanany was the Western Athletic Conference Male Performer of the Year and the Male High Point Award Winner at both the indoor and outdoor championships in 2005. He became the first-ever conference athlete to win the long jump, triple jump and high jump at both the indoor and outdoor championships. He posted provisional marks indoors and regional qualifying standards with each of his conference-winning jumps.

Hanany had the second-best jump in school history in 2005 with a personal best 7-5 3/4 (2.28) at the UTEP Invitational. He went on to compete at the European Championships, the European Junior Championships and the World Championships for France.

Hanany was not the only Miner to have success under Robinson. Two-sport star Johnnie Lee Higgins, Jr. scored 19 points at the indoor conference meet and was an NCAA provisional qualifier in the long jump – his first-ever year competing in the event. Higgins was an NCAA regional qualifier in the long jump outdoors and scored 12.5 points at the conference meet. Desiree Crichlow additionally competed at the NCAA regional in the high jump.

UTEP won both men's WAC indoor and outdoor titles, largely due to Robinson's jumpers. His unit scored 59 out of 184 (32.1 percent) of UTEP's points indoors and 48.5 out of the team's 208.5 points (23.3 percent) outdoors.

Prior to arriving on campus at UTEP, Robinson spent the previous four years as the jumps coach at Sam Houston State. He also assisted with the sprints, hurdles and relays as well as served as recruiting coordinator in 2003.

During the 2004 season, he coached the Southland Conference champions in the men's 400-meter relay, the women's high jump and the women's 400-meter dash.

He tutored Precious Madison, Sam Houston State's first NCAA Division I All-American, in the long jump in 2001. She was also an NCAA qualifier in the long jump and the 100-meter dash in 2002. He trained Alisha Fowler, the 2003 Southland Conference champion in the high jump. Fowler was also an NCAA Midwest Regional Qualifier.

During his SHSU coaching career, Robinson produced the school record holders in the women's indoor long jump and the outdoor long jump.

He also was the meet director for the UIL Region III-4A Track Championships, the UIL Region III Cross Country Championships and the York Relays.

Robinson holds Level I and Level II (sprints/hurdles) certification from the United States of American Track and Field Association.

In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Robinson was an instructor in the Sam Houston State kinesiology department.

A 2000 graduate of Sam Houston State, he completed his master's degree in kinesiology in 2004.

While a student-athlete, he was an NCAA qualifier in the long jump in 1998 and All-Southland Conference in both the long and triple jumps in 1998 and 1999. He holds the SHSU school record in the long jump with a best of 25-5 1/2 (7.76) and ranks in the school's top 10 in the triple jump (50-8/15.44). He was also a three-year starter on the football team.

Robinson is the father of twins sons Kendall and Kamron, who were born in June of 2001.

## Keitha Mosley

**RICE '02**

**Graduate Assistant  
Second year at UTEP**



A former NCAA All-American, five-time WAC high point award winner and seven-time WAC champion at Rice, Keitha Moseley begins her second year as a graduate assistant at UTEP.

Moseley won the long jump at the 2003 Barbados national championships and was seventh in the event at the Central American and Caribbean Games.

As a senior at Rice, she qualified for the NCAA Indoor Championships in the high jump and gained All-American honors in the 1,600 relay. She also took the WAC outdoor crown in the 100 hurdles.

During her junior year, Moseley was the conference champion in the 55 hurdles indoors and in the heptathlon outdoors. She was also the WAC's high-point winner at the indoor championships. Moseley was the Barbados national champion in the 200 and 100 hurdles and took third in the 100 hurdles at the Central American and Caribbean Games.

As a sophomore, she took conference titles in the pentathlon and 60 hurdles indoors and was the conference's high-point winner and 100 hurdles and heptathlon champion outdoors.

In 2000 she was second in the 100 hurdles at the national championships and competed in the event at the IAAF World Junior Championships.

She held Barbados national records indoors in the 55 hurdles (7.97), high jump (1.79/5-10 1/2) and pentathlon (3,786 points). She set the national junior record in the 100 hurdles in 2000 in 13.60.

She has personal bests of 23.77 in the 200, 7.97 in the 50 hurdles, 8.46 in the 60 hurdles, 13.52 in the 100 hurdles, 5-10 3/4 (1.80) in the high jump and 4,862 points in the heptathlon.

Moseley, who is from St. Phillip, Barbados, is a 2002 graduate of Rice with degrees in economics, psychology and business management.

She is currently working on her master's degree at UTEP.

## Abby Peters

**Graduate Assistant  
First year at UTEP**



A former NCAA All-American while competing at Boise State, Abby Peters begins her first year as a graduate assistant at UTEP.

During the 2000 track season, Peters gained NCAA All-America honors by finishing seventh in the 10,000 running 34:19.93 at the NCAA Championships. She was a three-time Big West Conference Champion during the 1999-00 school year, winning the gold during the cross country season and the 3,000 and 5,000 at the outdoor championships.

Peters qualified for the 1999 NCAA Cross Country Championships and made the All-Region team by taking 16th at the 1999 West Regional.

She transferred to Arizona at the start of the 2000-01 school year and helped the Wildcats finish fourth at the 2001 NCAA Cross Country Championships. Peters advanced to the NCAA Championship by taking 21st at the 2001 NCAA West Regional.

Peters began her collegiate career at Eastern Oregon University where she gained NAIA All-America honors by taking eighth at the 1998 NAIA Cross Country Championships.

She ran personal bests of 34:12.22 in the 10,000 and 16:34.72 in the 5,000 during her career.

After graduating with a degree in business management from Arizona in 2002, she moved to Austin, Texas, where she worked one year with Americorps. For Americorps she assisted in an elementary school tutoring and mentoring at risk students. She additionally managed and designed various individual and group therapeutic sports programs.

# The University of Texas at El Paso





The University of Texas at El Paso is paving the road to success for thousands of students in the region and mapping the future of higher education across the nation.

We're no strangers to the task.

In 1966, UTEP – then named Texas Western College – changed the face of collegiate athletics.

An upstart squad of five African-American players beat Kentucky to win the NCAA basketball championship, breaking color barriers in college sports. This historical event is being depicted in the Disney/Jerry Bruckheimer movie "Glory Road," expected in theaters in early 2006.

Today's UTEP, located in the heart of the U.S.-Mexico border, is again breaking barriers and, this time, changing the face of higher education.

Nearly 72 percent of our student body is Hispanic, and another 10 percent are Mexican nationals. The majority are first-generation college students.

UTEP has embraced this not as a challenge, but as an opportunity to provide access and excellence in higher education. For many of our students, the road to glory begins here.

We rank second in the nation awarding undergraduate degrees to Hispanics. We are the country's only doctoral research intensive university with a student body that's predominantly Mexican-American.

UTEP offers more than 80 bachelor's degrees, more than 70 master's-level degrees and programs and 13 doctoral degrees – and counting.

We're experiencing unprecedented growth — record enrollments of nearly 20,000 students, a \$50 million building boom and nearly \$35 million in research a year.

#### **Top-Tier Research**

We rank second in federal research spending among all UT System academic institutions. With new labs and classrooms to support our rapidly expanding academic and research programs, we're gearing up for more.

That's a solid start to UTEP's goal of becoming a top-tier research university — exclusive membership that requires world-class faculty, the latest in research equipment and facilities, and \$100 million a year in research spending.

This spring alone, UTEP received a \$169 million in-kind donation of computer-aided engineering software and equipment and launched a new high-capacity network that opens the door to unprecedented collaboration between numerous universities and research centers across the U.S. and Mexico.

UTEP was one of only 11 universities nationwide to receive a \$5 million "Teachers for a New Era" research grant from the Carnegie Corporation of New York. The grant will help UTEP become a national model for teacher education programs.

#### **Campus Setting: A History**

UTEP has long been a major player in the development of the El Paso community.

The school started in 1914 as the Texas College of Mines and Metallurgy. After a fire destroyed the school's Main Building, a cluster of castles began to be built along El Paso's mountains. The buildings' architecture was derived from an article on Bhutan in "National Geographic" and today, the campus continues to resemble the Himalayan kingdom.

In 1949, the school became Texas Western College and in 1967 – a year after TWC won the 1966 NCAA basketball championship – the name was changed to the University of Texas at El Paso.

Today, key university athletic and entertainment facilities include the 51,500-seat Sun Bowl Stadium; the 12,000-seat Don Haskins Center; the Swimming and Fitness Center; and the Larry K. Durham Sports Center, a state-of-the-art athletics and kinesiology complex. The university also boasts a six-story University Library, a state-of-the-art Undergraduate Learning Center, and the Stanlee and Gerald Rubin Center for the Visual Arts inaugurated in September 2004.

A new Academic Services Building opened this spring, and a Biosciences Building, an addition to the Engineering Building and the Paso del Norte Research and Business Complex are not far behind. A five-level garage east of the Union Building and Phase II of Miner Village student housing are planned for the near future.

#### **Counting to 100**

With these and many more accomplishments to boot, UTEP last year celebrated its 90th anniversary. With that benchmark, the Centennial Commission was formed and charged with developing a vision for the university in 2014 – our 100th anniversary. The Commission of 100 individuals this fall will present their report to the community and recommend long-range goals and strategies to achieve them.

Over the past 90-plus years, we've paved the way to success for more than 76,500 graduates.

Together we will continue to mine the way for the thousands more who will become proud UTEP alumni over the next decade.

The **MINER ATHLETE ACADEMIC CENTER (MAAC)** is the first center of its kind at UTEP and is conveniently located in the center of campus. The MAAC was created to provide progressive academic services to student-athletes to ensure compliance with UTEP, Conference USA and NCAA academic eligibility standards. The MAAC has expanded its role to promote the individual and educational goals of each UTEP student-athlete. Each sport is assigned an athletic academic advisor whose primary responsibility is to serve as an advisor and mentor for student-athletes; to assist with educational goal setting, degree plans, and course selection; and to calculate and certify NCAA academic eligibility. Student-athletes are advised every semester by both their respective colleges and their athletic academic advisors in the MAAC.

The MAAC recognizes that one of student-athletes' greatest challenges is to maintain the delicate balance between academics and athletics. In response to such challenges, the MAAC has implemented its Three-Part Academic Support Program to provide a solid foundation from which student-athletes will cultivate the skills needed to successfully complete their college experience. The program requires student-athletes to meet with their appointed advisor weekly; offers one-on-one tutoring; and provides a large study area and computer lab for study hall. The MAAC computer lab houses 25 state-of-the-art "thin client" computers with the latest software, complete internet access and two laser printers. Computer lab, tutoring and study hall hours are Monday through Thursday 7:30 a.m.-9p.m.; Friday 7:30 a.m.-5 p.m.; and Sunday 2-7 p.m.



# Miner Village





*UTEP has added apartment-style living, the first of its kind on campus, to its community. The new UTEP housing, known as Miner Village, features one-bedroom, two-bedroom and four-bedroom units.*

*Miner Village's 12 apartment-style residence halls offer several floor plans, from cozy efficiencies to two- and four-bedroom units. Miner Village also features a community building which houses study rooms, a recreation area, private mailboxes and administrative offices.*

*The units are within walking distance to lectures, labs and other activities, as well as a short distance from the Sun Bowl and the Don Haskins Center.*

# Larry K. Durham Sports Center





The Larry K. Durham Sports Center opened its doors in August, 2002. Named for successful businessman and former Miner football standout Larry Durham, the 65,000-square foot building, situated adjacent to the Sun Bowl, features:

#### **Hall of Champions**

Honoring UTEP's athletic heritage...the room is utilized for university and Department of Intercollegiate Athletics receptions and functions...features include: 11 flat screen TVs (three hanging, eight set into wall); seven swivel banners, showcasing sports currently sponsored by UTEP; and photos of football great Ken Heineman, track and field standout Suleiman Nyambui and the 1966 national champion Miner men's basketball team.

#### **Strength and Conditioning Center**

Boasts 11,420 square feet of space (old weight room was less than 5,000 square feet), and is utilized by all UTEP student-athletes...features include: open space with 22 stations for all Olympic lifting; all-new equipment; two office areas, one storage area and a juice bar.

#### **Football Complex**

Features include: 12 coaches' offices and one conference room; business center; video equipment room; kitchenette and storage area.

#### **Football Locker Room**

First-class and luxurious with 120 individually milled wooden lockers...also features an open meeting area, showers and bathroom facilities.

#### **Sports Medicine Center**

Encompasses 4,798 square feet of space (old training room was 2,064 square feet), and is utilized by all UTEP student-athletes...features include: taping and treatment areas; one hot and one cold whirlpool in the Hydro Therapy Center; X-ray and exam rooms.

#### **Athlete Equipment Center**

Features include: six dryers and three washers; upper space for storage, sewing machine, etc.; 160 small lockers for student-athletes to store uniforms and practice gear.

#### **Student-Athlete Lounge and Computer Center**
