QUICK HITTERS
A LOOK AHEAD AT WEEK SIX

Five conference games are on this week's schedule in Conference USA Football, beginning with a key East Division showdown on Friday night.

Middle Tennessee will visit Marshall, the second straight year that these foes have met on a Friday evening (7:30 p.m. ET). The Thundering Herd has won three of the last four in this series and will be on their home field looking for a 2-0 start in league play, as will the Blue Raiders. Middle Tennessee's last two victories against Marshall were thrillers (a 51-49 triumph in 2013 and an overtime victory in 2015).

All of Saturday's action will take place in the evening, beginning with Old Dominion at Florida Atlantic (5 p.m. ET). The visiting team has won all four previous meetings in the series, as the Owls look to extend their eight-game winning streak at FAU Stadium.

West Division rivals UAB and Louisiana Tech face off in Ruston (6 pm CT). Last year's game meeting was a thriller, with the Blazers blocking a potential game-winning field goal on the final play to earn a 23-22 win for their first-ever win over the Bulldogs. LA Tech just pulled off a similar feat last Saturday, handing North Texas its first defeat of 2018, sealed with a blocked kick on the final play.

North Texas looks to rebounds from that tough loss to Louisiana Tech as it gets ready for a trip to UTEP (5:30 p.m. MT). Though the Mean Green offense was slowed down last week, it continues to lead C-USA and ranks 13th in the FBS with a 44.4 scoring average per game.

A south Texas rivalry is renewed when Rice hosts UTSA (6 p.m. CT) in what has been a traditionally low scoring matchup. The Owls are back at Rice Stadium for the first time since Sept. 1 as they take on a Roadrunners squad that is looking to extend their winning streak to three.

CLOSE CALLS END STREAKS

Five conference games were played last Saturday and four were decided by single digits. Included was a three (Marshall, 20 at WKU 17), a two (Louisiana Tech 29, at North Texas 27) and a one (Middle Tennessee 25, Florida Atlantic 24) point game.

Those results ended a pair of nine game winning streaks. North Texas saw its nine-game winning streak at Apogee Stadium snapped, while Florida Atlantic's nine-game winning streak against C-USA opponents came to an end.

BLAZIN' IN BIRMINGHAM

History was made at Legion Field on Saturday night as UAB won their program-best ninth-straight home game with a 28-7 victory over the Charlotte. The Blazers are now 11-6 overall since reinstating their program prior to the 2017 season.

Senior QB **E.J. Erdely** threw a touchdown and ran for a score. He now has 16 rushing touchdowns in his first 17 games as a Blazer. The 16 rushing scores are fifth in school history.

SACK ATTACK

Louisiana Tech senior DE **Jaylon Ferguson** set a new career high with four sacks in a single game to help lead the Bulldogs to a win over North Texas on the road last Saturday. That mark, as well as his four tackles for loss, are both tied for the second-most in program history. Ferguson now leads the FBS in sacks per game this season at 1.50.

The four sacks allowed Ferguson, the nation's active leader in career sacks, to increase his career sack total to 33.5. Old Dominion senior DE **Oshane Ximines**, who is second, added another sack at East Carolina on Saturday to give him 27 in his career.

STOCK UP

Middle Tennessee senior QB **Brent Stockstill**, who threw one touchdown and the game-winning two-point conversion in the Blue Raiders' 25-24 win over Florida Atlantic Saturday night.

Stockstill also continues his rise up the Conference USA career charts. With 27 completions vs. FAU, he has moved into 11th all-time in C-USA history for career passes completed with 824, surpassing Tulane's Patrick Ramsey (798), FIU's Alex McGough (806) and Memphis' Danny Wimprine (808). His 259 passing yards on the night give him 9,933 career passing yards, enough to pass Rice's Chase Clement (9,785), WKU's Brandon Doughty (9,885) and UAB's Darrell Hackney (9,886) for 11th all-time in C-USA, while his second quarter touchdown pass gives him 85 in his career to tie Houston's Kevin Kolb for seventh in league history.

MOTORING INTO THE RECORD BOOK

Florida Atlantic junior RB **Devin "Motor" Singletary** ran for a pair of touchdowns at Middle Tennessee on Saturday, giving him an FBS-leading 12 rushing TD's on the season. The nation's leading scorer in 2017, Singletary leads in that category again this season, averaging 14.4 points per game. His scores at MT extended his C-USA record for consecutive games with a TD run to 18. With 118 rushing yards it was Singletary's 18th career 100-yard rushing game.

Singletary's second TD run allowed him to become Conference USA's all-time leader in rushing touchdowns with 56, breaking the record of 55 set by DeAngelo Williams of Memphis (2003-06). He also moved into a tie for 16th place on the all-time FBS rushing TD list.

LEADING THE WAY

Conference USA has three of the top 11 scorers in the FBS through the first five weeks of the season.

MORGAN MAKING IMPACT

FIU junior QB **James Morgan** threw for 341 yards and four touchdowns as the Panthers routed Arkansas-Pine Bluff at home on Saturday, 55-9. The Panther signal-caller, who is a graduate transfer from Bowling Green, tied FIU's single-game record for passing touchdowns with his four tosses, while his yardage was tied for eighth all-time at FIU. Morgan has thrown 12 touchdowns this season, which is one shy of the C-USA lead and tied for 14th overall in the FBS.

A MAN NAMED BRADY

Marshall senior WR **Tyre Brady** had eight catches for 162 yards and two touchdowns in Marshall's 20-17 win over WKU Saturday night. The touchdowns bookended the Thundering Herd's scoring as freshman QB **Isaiah Green** found him on a 40-yard bomb in the first quarter and again on a 32-yarder with 1:44 left in the contest. Brady eclipsed 100 yards in receiving for the second time this season and the sixth time in his two-year career with the Herd. He had his third career two-TD game, and the 162 receiving yards rank as the third-most in his career. This season, Brady now ranks No. 21 in the FBS in receptions per game (6.5), No. 24 in receiving yards per game (92.3) and is tied at No. 14 with five TD receptions.

QUEZ FOR GREATNESS

Southern Miss sophomore WR **Quez Watkins** has now recorded a touchdown catch in each of the Golden Eagles four games this season after collecting a 12-yard grab in the fourth quarter of Saturday's contest at No. 10 Auburn. He has seven total TDs (tied for second in C-USA) and is averaging 88.0 yards per game receiving (fourth in the league) and 126.5 all-purpose yards per game (second in C-USA).

UTSA D ROUNDING INTO FORM

UTSA scored 14 points off turnovers and limited UTEP to 278 yards of total offense, the second straight opponent that has failed to net 300 yards, as the Roadrunners posted a 30-21 win at the Alamodome on Saturday, their second in a row. Sophomore DE **DeQuarius Henry** led the way with a career game, posting six tackles, including two for loss and a sack, to go along with his first career forced fumble.

C-USA LEADS IN FIVE NCAA STATS

Conference USA has the leader in five different individual categories in the latest FBS statistics. Florida Atlantic junior RB **Devin "Motor" Singletary** leads in rushing touchdowns (12), total touchdowns (12) and scoring (14.4 ppg), Louisiana Tech senior DE **Jaylon Ferguson** leads in sacks (1.50 per game), Bulldogs teammate sophomore DB **Amik Robertson** tops in blocked kicks (two), and Rice senior RB/KR **Austin Walter** leads in all-purpose yards per game (209.0).

C-USA & THE CAMPBELL TROPHY

Five C-USA players were among the 63 FBS student-athletes who were named semifinalists for the 2018 William V. Campbell Trophy as college football's top scholar-athlete. The award is given based on outstanding football ability, academic achievement and strong leadership and citizenship. The semifinalists from C-USA are: Marshall senior LB **Chase Hancock**, Middle Tennessee graduate QB **Brent Stockstill**, Old Dominion senior DE **Oshane Ximines**, Rice graduate DE **Graysen Schantz** and UTSA senior P **Yannis Routsas**.

ODU HONORED BY ATHLON'S

Old Dominion was named the *Athlon Sports* Team of the Week on Sunday, while junior QB **Blake LaRussa** was named the publication's National Player of the Week.

ODU'S LARUSSA NATIONAL OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Old Dominion junior QB **Blake LaRussa** was named the Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week, the foundation announced Sunday. LaRussa completed 30-of-49 passes for 495-yards and four touchdowns, while rushing for 19-yards and a score in the Monarchs 49-35 win over No. 10 Virginia Tech. The 495-yards is the second-most ever given up by a Va. Tech defense, just three yards shy of Scott Milanovich's 498 for Maryland in 1993.

ODU NATIONAL TEAM OF WEEK

For knocking off a Power 5 conference foe for the first time since restarting the program in 2009 and earning the school's first win over a ranked opponent, Old Dominion has earned the Reveal Suits National Team of the Week for the weekend of Sept. 22, the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) announced on Monday.

This is the first time for ODU to earn this honor, which dates back to the 2002 season. This is first FWAA Team of the Week award for a C-USA team since UAB earned it in the final week of the 2014 season.

HIGH ON THE HOG

North Texas posted one of the biggest victories in program history on Sept. 15, dominating Arkansas in all three phases of the game in a 44-17 win in Fayetteville. The Mean Green turned in the special teams play of the year with sophomore PR **Keegan Brewer's** fake-fair catch, turned 90-yard punt return for a touchdown that put UNT up 14-0. The win is Mean Green head coach **Seth Littrell's** first over a Power 5 opponent and the program's first road victory over a Power 5 foe since winning at Texas Tech in 1999. The Mean Green's victory is the biggest by a C-USA team over an SEC team since 2004 and the second-largest margin against the SEC in league history.

C-USA TO HONOR MIKE SLIVE

C-USA Football teams will honor former C-USA commissioner Mike Slive and promote prostate cancer awareness in partnership with the Mike Slive Foundation by wearing custom helmet stickers this fall.

The Conference's Board of Directors voted earlier this summer to support the addition of the helmet stickers worn by the membership for the 2018 football season to recognize Slive's fundamental contributions to the conference.

Slive, a respected and accomplished leader in college athletics, passed away in May at the age of 77. He was named the first Commissioner of Conference USA when the 12-team league was introduced on April 24, 1995. Under his direction, C-USA quickly emerged as one of the nation's top conferences. Slive served as the league's Commissioner until 2002, when he became Commissioner of the SEC.

As a prostate cancer survivor, Slive founded the Mike Slive Foundation for Prostate Cancer Research in 2017. The Foundation's mission is to save lives by funding cutting-edge research and by raising awareness of prostate cancer. For more information, please visit: www.MikeSliveFoundation.org

TRUE STUDENT-ATHLETES

There are just three FBS players that have earned an undergraduate and masters degree prior to the start of the 2018 season and two of them are from Conference USA schools. Middle Tennessee QB **Brent Stockstill** (leisure sport & tourism) and North Texas QB **Quinn Shanbour** (integrated studies/kinesiology) are joined by NC State QB **Ryan Finley** (psychology/liberal arts) in accomplishing this outstanding academic achievement.

UAB LEADS IN GRADUATES

The National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame released a list of more than 1,200 student-athletes who have already earned their undergraduate degrees and are playing college football this fall while pursuing second diplomas. UAB identified the most graduates among all FBS schools with 19 players on its 2018 roster. Old Dominion is the other C-USA school reporting a double digit number with 11 graduate players.

FATHER AND SON

There are currently nine FBS schools where a player is playing for his head coach father and four of those are in Conference USA. Middle Tennessee coach **Rick Stockstill** and graduate QB **Brent Stockstill**, Old Dominion head coach **Bobby Wilder** and senior LB **Derek Wilder**, UAB coach **Bill Clark** and sophomore LS **Jacob Clark**, and UTEP coach **Dana Dimel** and graduate FB **Winston Dimel** are the three C-USA family duos.

C-USA BROADCAST INFORMATION

Conference USA has announced its broadcast schedule for the 2018 football season. The current confirmed schedule features games to air nationally by all five of the league's primary partners and every C-USA football game is expected to be available on traditional linear television or via streaming and social media.

CBS Sports Network kicks off the selection process of nationally broadcast games, followed by Stadium, beIN SPORTS, Facebook and ESPN Networks. The majority of these exposures will take place on Saturday, with select Thursday and Friday night telecasts also being featured.

"We are very excited that every C-USA Football game will be available this season on various platforms through our valued partners," said Conference USA Commissioner Judy MacLeod. "We are coming off a very successful season with nine bowl teams and look to build on that success this fall with our fans able to follow all of the exciting action."

The 2018 regular season begins on Saturday, August 25 when Rice hosts Prairie View on ESPN+ and continues through Saturday, November 24. Over the course of those three months, every game in a C-USA stadium will be available through its partners and road games will be available via FOX, FS1, FSN, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU, ACC RSN, the SEC Network and ESPN+.

The 2018 C-USA Championship game on Saturday, Dec. 1 will air on CBS Sports Network at a time to be determined.

CONFERENCE USA BOWL PARTNERS

C-USA BOWL SYNOPSIS

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments for six bowl spots for the 2018 season, as well as maintaining two secondary agreements. The Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton, Hawai'i, Makers Wanted Bahamas, New Mexico, and R+L Carriers New Orleans bowls are joined by a spot in either the Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla (Tampa Bay) and SERVPRO First Responder Bowls as the primary agreements. The Frisco Bowl in Frisco, Texas and the Walk-On's Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La., (should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team) serve as secondary bowls.

There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

Per conference regulations, all teams with seven or more wins shall be placed into conference bowls prior to any other bowl eligible teams without a winning record (i.e. 6-6 record).

C-USA and the College Football Playoff

As a member of the College Football Playoff, Conference USA will be a part of one of the College Football Playoff bowls if it has the highest rated champion from among the American, C-USA, Mid-American, Mountain West and Sun Belt Conferences.

The Playoff

During the 2014-15 season, college football entered a new era when postseason playoffs began. The format is simple: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The Selection Committee

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that No. 1 will play No. 4 in one semifinal and No. 2 will meet No. 3 in the other, with the two winners advancing to the national championship game.

The Rotation

The semifinals rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight teams in four compelling matchups.

For the 2018-19 season, the Rose Bowl Game presented by Northwestern Mutual (Jan. 1), Allstate Sugar Bowl (Jan. 1), Playstation Fiesta Bowl (Jan. 1) and Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl (Dec. 29), will host its regular bowl games, while the Goodyear Cotton Bowl (Dec. 29) and Capital One Orange Bowl (Dec. 29) will host semifinals. The College Football Championship will be held on Monday, Jan. 7 in the Bay Area (Santa Clara, California).

GILDAN NEW MEXICO BOWL

Conference USA will enter its fifth year as a primary partner with the New Mexico Bowl and is scheduled to send a team to Albuquerque each season through 2019. **2018 CONFERENCE USA FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME**

Conference USA will host its 14th football championship game in 2018. The event is slated for Saturday, December 1, and will be televised by CBS Sports Network. The team with the highest league winning percentage will serve as host site for the game.

The title game will feature champions from the East and West divisions. Nine different schools have hosted the first 13 championship games.

Florida Atlantic became the second school to win the championship game after going undefeated in the regular season, posting a 41-17 win over North Texas in the largest margin of victory in championship game history. WKU became just the second team in league history to win back-to-back Conference USA Football Championship Games in 2016, defeating Louisiana Tech, 58-44, in what was the highest scoring conference championship game in FBS history at the time. In 2015, WKU became the first league school to go undefeated in C-USA play and then win the Championship Game, defeating Southern Miss, 45-28. Marshall took its first C-USA title in 2014 with a triumph over Louisiana Tech in Huntington, W. Va. In 2013, Rice won its first C-USA Football title with a victory over Marshall at Rice Stadium. Southern Miss won the 2011 C-USA Championship, when the nationally-ranked Golden Eagles defeated previously undefeated Houston on the road. Former members East Carolina, Tulsa and UCF each won two championship games, while Houston claimed one crown.
