QUICK HITTERS
A LOOK AHEAD AT WEEK TWO

A lot of home cooking is on the menu in Conference USA Football this Saturday, as 10 of the league's 14 teams will play in their home stadium.

Thirteen total games are on the docket, including the first conference game of the season, as FIU visits Old Dominion in a meeting of East Division rivals.

Five schools (Charlotte, Louisiana Tech, Marshall, North Texas and Southern Miss) will be on the home field looking to go 2-0. Among that group, Charlotte may have the most challenging opponent, as the 49ers face an Appalachian State team that nearly won at Penn State last week.

Florida Atlantic and UTSA will each have their home openers against Air Force and Baylor, respectively. Those games will also be the first two C-USA games that will be produced by CBS Sports Network and available on Facebook Watch.

Middle Tennessee (vs. UT-Martin) and WKU (vs. Maine) will each have their home openers, UAB will look to go 2-0 with a trip to Coastal Carolina and UTEP and Rice will be on the road against Mountain West Conference opponents, squaring off against UNLV and Hawai'i, respectively.

A FINE NIGHT IN DENTON

In front of the largest home crowd in school history (29,519), North Texas opened the season with a dominating 46-23 win over Metroplex rival SMU. The Mean Green allowed the Mustangs just two first downs and 46 yards total offense through the first three periods, surrendered 4 yards rushing for the game, got an interception returned for a touchdown from senior CB **Kemon Hall**, and forced six three-and-outs from the Ponies. Senior QB **Mason Fine** opened his junior season by completing 40 of 50 for three touchdowns and a career-high 444 yards, the second 400-yard performance of his career and ninth in school history. The Special teams unit was also outstanding, with senior K **Cole Hedlund** kicking four field goals and sophomore KR **DeAndre Torrey** returning a kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown.

FRESH NEW NINERS

In a game that saw multiple lightning delays, Charlotte ignited for 21 unanswered points in the second half to topple Fordham, 34-10. A pair of rookies stood out, as redshirt freshman QB **Chris Reynolds** completed 13-of-20 passes for 267 yards and one touchdown. Redshirt freshman WR **Victor Tucker** was on the receiving end of seven of those passes, collecting 127 yards and scoring a 12-yard TD to open the fourth quarter. Junior RB **Benny LeMay** added 218 yards of total offense (fifth-most in school history) in the win, with 135 rushing yards and 83 receiving yards. He added a pair of short touchdown runs.

THE QUEZ FOR GREATNESS

Southern Miss redshirt sophomore WR **Quez Watkins** scored a pair of touchdowns last season and then doubled that total in the 2018 season opener Saturday night vs. Jackson State. Watkins tallied a

career-high 138 yards on eight catches with three TD receptions (28, 22, 24) and also added a punt return of 81 yards for a score. He is the first Golden Eagle receiver to collect three TD catches since Allenzae Staggers did it against Rice on Oct. 1, 2016, while his punt return is also the first since Staggers returned a boot 75 yards the same season against Savannah State (Sept. 10). Watkins finished the day with 241 all-purpose yards - the most since Ito Smith tallied 254 against ULM last season. He also totaled with 103 yards on three punt returns.

A PERFECT TEN FOR LISA

UAB senior WR **Collin Lisa** had a career-high 10 catches for 93 yards and a touchdown in UAB's 52-0 victory over Savannah State on August 30. Lisa caught 10-of-10 targets and his 10 catches were the most by any wide receiver in Conference USA in the first week and the eighth-most nationally.

TACKLE THIS

FIU redshirt junior LB **Sage Lewis** posted a career night against Indiana last Saturday, racking up 18 total tackles, which tied for fifth-most in a single game in Panthers history. The 18 total tackles are also tied for the most in the FBS this season with Leon McQuaker of New Mexico State, while the number would've tied for the most in a single game in C-USA all of last year (Chase Hancock, Marshall). In addition to his 10 solo tackles and eight assists, Lewis also had one pass break up against the Hoosiers.

C-USA TO HONOR MIKE SLIVE

Conference USA Football teams will honor former C-USA commissioner Mike Slive and promote prostate cancer awareness in partnership with the Mike Slive Foundation by wearing custom helmet stickers this fall.

The Conference's Board of Directors voted earlier this summer to support the addition of the helmet stickers worn by the membership for the 2018 football season to recognize Slive's fundamental contributions to the conference.

Slive, a respected and accomplished leader in college athletics, passed away in May at the age of 77. He was named the first Commissioner of Conference USA when the 12-team league was introduced on April 24, 1995. Under his direction, C-USA quickly emerged as one of the nation's top conferences. Slive served as the league's Commissioner until 2002, when he became Commissioner of the South-eastern Conference.

As a prostate cancer survivor, Slive founded the Mike Slive Foundation for Prostate Cancer Research in 2017. The Foundation's mission is to save lives by funding cutting-edge research and by raising awareness of prostate cancer. For more information, please visit: www.MikeSliveFoundation.org

RETURNING NATIONAL STAT LEADERS

C-USA had six (6) individual leaders and three (3) team leaders in national statistical categories last season and each of those individual performers return for the 2018 season.

- Florida Atlantic running back Devin Singletary led the FBS in total touchdowns (33), rushing touchdowns (32), total points scored (198), and scoring per game (14.1);
- Rice wide receiver Aaron Cephus led the FBS in yards per reception (24.8);
- Charlotte defensive back Ben DeLuca led the FBS in forced fumbles;
- Florida Atlantic led the FBS in interceptions (20);
- UTSA led the FBS in fewest first downs allowed (166) and;
- FIU led the FBS in red zone offense (.976).

TRUE STUDENT-ATHLETES

There are just three FBS players that have earned an undergraduate and masters degree prior to the start of the 2018 season and two of them are from Conference USA schools. Middle Tennessee QB **Brent Stockstill** (leisure sport & tourism) and North Texas QB **Quinn Shanbour** (integrated studies/kinesiology) are joined by NC State QB **Ryan Finley** (psychology/liberal arts) in accomplishing this outstanding academic achievement.

C-USA BROADCAST INFORMATION

Conference USA has announced its broadcast schedule for the 2018 football season. The current confirmed schedule features games to air nationally by all five of the league's primary partners and every C-USA football game is expected to be available on traditional linear television or via streaming and social media.

CBS Sports Network kicks off the selection process of nationally broadcast games, followed by Stadium, beIN SPORTS, Facebook and ESPN Networks. The majority of these exposures will take place on Saturday, with select Thursday and Friday night telecasts also being featured.

"We are very excited that every C-USA Football game will be available this season on various platforms through our valued partners," said Conference USA Commissioner Judy MacLeod. "We are coming off a very successful season with nine bowl teams and look to build on that success this fall with our fans able to follow all of the exciting action."

The 2018 regular season begins on Saturday, August 25 when Rice hosts Prairie View on ESPN+ and continues through Saturday, November 24. Over the course of those three months, every game in a C-USA stadium will be available through its partners and road games will be available via FOX, FS1, FSN, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU, ACC RSN, the SEC Network and ESPN+.

The 2018 C-USA Championship game on Saturday, Dec. 1 will air on CBS Sports Network at a time to be determined.

CONFERENCE USA BOWL PARTNERS

C-USA BOWL SYNOPSIS

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments for six bowl spots for the 2018 season, as well as maintaining two secondary agreements. The Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton, Hawai'i, Makers Wanted Bahamas, New Mexico, and R+L Carriers New Orleans bowls are joined by a spot in either the Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla (Tampa Bay) and SERVPRO First Responder Bowls as the primary agreements. The Frisco Bowl in Frisco, Texas and the Walk-On's Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La., (should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team) serve as secondary bowls.

There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

Per conference regulations, all teams with seven or more wins shall be placed into conference bowls prior to any other bowl eligible teams without a winning record (i.e. 6-6 record).

C-USA and the College Football Playoff

As a member of the College Football Playoff, Conference USA will be a part of one of the College Football Playoff bowls if it has the highest rated champion from among the American, C-USA, Mid-American, Mountain West and Sun Belt Conferences.

The Playoff

During the 2014-15 season, college football entered a new era when postseason playoffs began. The format is simple: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The Selection Committee

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that No. 1 will play No. 4 in one semifinal and No. 2 will meet No. 3 in the other, with the two winners advancing to the national championship game.

The Rotation

The semifinals rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight teams in four compelling matchups.

For the 2018-19 season, the Rose Bowl Game presented by Northwestern Mutual (Jan. 1), Allstate Sugar Bowl (Jan. 1), Playstation Fiesta Bowl (Jan. 1) and Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl (Dec. 29), will host its regular bowl games, while the Goodyear Cotton Bowl (Dec. 29) and Capital One Orange Bowl (Dec. 29) will host semifinals. The College Football Championship will be held on Monday, Jan. 7 in the Bay Area (Santa Clara, California).

GILDAN NEW MEXICO BOWL

Conference USA will enter its fifth year as a primary partner with the New Mexico Bowl and is scheduled to send a team to Albuquerque each season through 2019. C-USA will face a representative from the Mountain West Conference each season at Dreamstyle Stadium on the campus of the University of New Mexico...C-USA has participated in the New Mexico Bowl four times, with UTEP playing in the game in 2014 and 2010, UTSA making its first bowl appearance in the 2016 matchup and Marshall winning last season's game...The bowl will be played on the opening day of the bowl season, which it has nearly each time during its existence, and will be the first game played to kick off the 2018-19 bowl season.

2018 CONFERENCE USA FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Conference USA will host its 14th football championship game in 2018. The event is slated for Saturday, December 1, and will be televised by CBS Sports Network. The team with the highest league winning percentage will serve as host site for the game.

The title game will feature champions from the East and West divisions. Nine different schools have hosted the first 13 championship games.

Florida Atlantic became the second school to win the championship game after going undefeated in the regular season, posting a 41-17 win over North Texas in the largest margin of victory in championship game history. WKU became just the second team in league history to win back-to-back Conference USA Football Championship Games in 2016, defeating Louisiana Tech, 58-44, in what was the highest scoring conference championship game in FBS history at the time. In 2015, WKU became the first league school to go undefeated in C-USA play and then win the Championship Game, defeating Southern Miss, 45-28. Marshall took its first C-USA title in 2014 with a triumph over Louisiana Tech in Huntington, W. Va. In 2013, Rice won its first C-USA Football title with a victory over Marshall at Rice Stadium. Southern Miss won the 2011 C-USA Championship, when the nationally-ranked Golden Eagles defeated previously undefeated Houston on the road. Former members East Carolina, Tulsa and UCF each won two championship games, while Houston claimed one crown.
