AGENTS REMINDER

Any agreement with an agent, in writing or verbally to market his or her athletic skills will render a student-athlete ineligible for intercollegiate athletic competition. Additionally, any athletics department staff member that introduces an agent to a student-athlete is in violation of NCAA Bylaw 10.1.



SPORTS WAGERING (GAMBLING)

The NCAA prohibits any athletics department staff members, staff members who have responsibilities with or over the athletics department, and student-athletes from wagering anything of tangible value on intercollegiate, amateur or professional athletics competition.





Official Visit Activities

Coaches and staff may not arrange personalized recruiting aids and may not permit a prospective student-athlete to engage in game-day simulations during an official visit.

In addition to the activities that the NCAA automatically considers game-day simulation, the elements that make up game-day simulation are:

1. Any on field or on court activity;
2. In uniform or with sport equipment; and
3. Where the prospect displays athletic ability or where an athletic stance is taken.

Important Points

- If any of the 3 elements are not present, then there is no game-day simulation and the activity is permissible.
- If you take a prospect in uniform on to the field you are assuming the risk that they will take an athletic pose and there will then be game-day simulation.
- You can have prospects in uniform and making an athletic pose in front of a green-screen and then superimpose them onto the field.
- On-field and on-court includes both game and practice facilities.
- Taking a picture is not what triggers a game-day simulation violation. Even if the act is not recorded, meeting all three elements above constitutes a violation.

Official Visit Activities Q & A

Question: What constitutes personalized recruiting aids?

Answer: Any decorative items and any special additions to any location outside of athletic facilities. Examples include but are not limited to:

- Personalized jerseys
- Personalized audio/video scoreboard presentations
- Decorative items in hotel rooms, dorm rooms, or student union
 - *Personalized decorations for prospects are allowed in athletics facilities that are not available or viewable to the public.

Question: What constitutes a game day simulation?

Answer: Any activity that would be normally conducted on game day involving student-athletes. Examples include but are not limited to:

- Staged press conference
- Running out of tunnel
- Smoke machine
- Announcing names over the public-address system
- Video board announcements
- On field/court simulation of game activities
- Staged action shots on the field/court

Camp Promotion Rules: Student-Athletes

A student-athlete's name, picture and affiliation may only be used in the camp counselor section in a camp brochure to identify the student-athlete as a staff member. A student-athlete's name, picture or likeness may not be used in any other way to directly advertise or promote the camp (e.g. Instagram/Twitter posts and emails).
