AGENTS REMINDER

Any agreement with an agent, in writing or verbally to market his or her athletic skills will render a student-athlete ineligible for intercollegiate athletic competition. Additionally, any athletics department staff member that introduces an agent to a student-athlete is in violation of NCAA Bylaw 10.1.



SPORTSWAGERING (GAMBLING)

The NCAA prohibits any athletics department staff members, staff members who have responsibilities with or over the athletics department, and student-athletes from wagering anything of tangible value on intercollegiate, amateur or professional athletics competition.

Post NLI Contact and Publicity

Publicity After Commitment | Bylaw 13.10.3

After a prospect has signed an NLI, signed an institution's written offer of admission and/or financial aid, or the institution receives the PSA's financial deposit there are no restrictions on publicity.

- This does not apply to a PSA who signs a written offer of admission and/or financial aid prior to their sport's regular NLI signing period.

Contact after Commitment | Bylaw 13.02.5.5.2, 13.02.10.1 & Bylaw 13.02.13.1

A prospect is not subject to the application of dead periods or the restrictions of bylaw 13.1 after signing an NLI, signing an institution's written offer of admission and/or financial aid, or once the institution receives the PSA's financial deposit. Also, there are no restrictions on telephone calls or electronic correspondence after a prospect commits to the institution.

- This does not apply to a prospect who signs a written offer of admission and/or financial aid prior to their sport's regular signing period.

Football Contact After Commitment

- No contact is permitted with a committed prospect during the December or January Dead Period.

- No contact is permitted with a committed PSA during an all-star contest

- The head coach may not make an in-person, off-campus contact with a committed prospect during spring evaluation periods.

All Sports Contact After Commitment

- A visit cannot be made to a committed prospect's institution outside of a contact or evaluation period because recruiting rules still apply to other prospects at the educational institution.

Recruiting Ban After Signing

Once a prospect signs an NLI with another institution all recruitment of that prospect must cease.

Scouting Services | Bylaw 13.14.3

An institution may subscribe to a recruiting or scouting service which involves a prospective student-athlete, however: | Bylaw 13.14.3.2

- The service must be made available to all institutions desiring to subscribe, at the same rate for all subscribers;

- Information from the service must be provided in a standardized format, ensuring consistent distribution to all subscribers;

- If information is provided in any personalized or nonstandard formats, an institution may not subscribe to the scouting service;

- The scouting service may provide video of both

scholastic and nonscholastic competition; and

- Institutions may not request the scouting service record specific events or contests.

Scouting service rules specific to Basketball and Football | Bylaw 13.14.3.1

- The service must be made available to all institutions desiring to subscribe, at the same rate for all subscribers;

- Rates must be publicly identified;

- Information must be disseminated from the scouting service at least four times per calendar year;

- The geographical scope of the service must be publicly identified, and information disseminated must reflect a broad-based coverage of this geographical area;

- Information provided must be beyond demographic information or prospect rankings;

- The service must provide access to samples or previews before a subscription is purchased;

- Information from the service must be provided in a standardized format, ensuring consistent distribution to all subscribers;

- If information is provided in any personalized or nonstandard formats, an institution may not subscribe to the scouting service;

- It is permissible to subscribe to a video only service.

Video only services do not have to disseminate information four times per year and are not required to provide information beyond demographic information and prospect rankings; and

- In basketball and football, an institution may only subscribe to NCAA approved scouting services. | Bylaw 13.14.3.3

Booster Contact | Bylaw 13.1.2.1

Contact with prospects, their relatives or legal guardians during on or off-campus may only be made by authorized institutional staff members (e.g., countable coaches). A prospect may not come into contact with a booster during any on-campus visit.

Application of Nonrecruited/Nonscholarship Transfer Student Exception | Ed Column 10/28/19

A student-athlete could use the nonrecruited or nonscholarship four-year transfer exception following transfer, if:

- a) The student-athlete did not have a signed agreement with the previous institution that provided for institutional athletically related financial aid in the subsequent regular academic year/term had the student-athlete remained at the previous institution; and
- b) The transfer occurred prior to the student-athlete receiving any institutional athletically related aid that would trigger counter status at the previous institution.

Further, all scenarios assume that the student-athlete does not have an unfulfilled year of residence at the point of transfer.

A non-football student-athlete receives summer athletics aid during the summer prior to initial enrollment at the initial institution but has not signed an athletics aid agreement for the following academic year and transfer prior to initial enrollment for the fall	✓	✓	Yes
A non-football student-athlete with a signed athletics aid agreement for their initial year of enrollment receives summer athletics aid during the summer prior to initial enrollment at the initial institution and transfers prior to initial enrollment for the fall	✗	✓	No, Student-athlete's aid agreement guarantees aid for forthcoming academic year



A football student-athlete receives summer athletics aid during the summer prior to initial enrollment at the initial institution but has not signed an athletics aid agreement for the following academic year and transfer prior to the preseason	✓	✗	No, Receipt of summer athletics aid triggers counter status in football
A recruited football student-athlete receives only institutional aid in their first year and competes and transfer for the next academic year	✓	✓	Yes
A student-athlete has not signed an athletics aid agreement but received outside athletically related aid in excess of \$1000 where the choice of institutions is limited to a specific state and transfers in the summer prior to the next academic year	✓	✓	Yes
