AGENTS REMINDER

Any agreement with an agent, in writing or verbally to market his or her athletic skills will render a student-athlete ineligible for intercollegiate athletic competition. Additionally, any athletics department staff member that introduces an agent to a student-athlete is in violation of NCAA Bylaw 10.1.



SPORTS WAGERING (GAMBLING)

The NCAA prohibits any athletics department staff members, staff members who have responsibilities with or over the athletics department, and student-athletes from wagering anything of tangible value on intercollegiate, amateur or professional athletics competition.

NLI Reminder

November 10th is the initial signing date for all sports other than football.

The early signing period for basketball is **November 10th through the 17th**. In order to be valid an NLI issued to a basketball prospect must be signed by the end of the day on the 18th.

In order for an NLI to be **VALID**, the NLI:

- Must be accompanied by an athletics financial aid agreement.
- Must include the NCAA ID.
- May not be signed prior to the signing dates for the applicable sport.
- Must be signed within 7 days of issue date. (during the early signing period in basketball the deadline is the final signing date)
- Must include a parent or legal guardian signature if the PSA is under the age of 21, regardless of marital status.

The conference office must validate the NLI within 14 days of signature.

Booster Contact | Bylaw 13.1.2.1

Contact with prospects, their relatives or legal guardians during on or off-campus may only be made by authorized institutional staff members (e.g., countable coaches). A prospect may not come into contact with a booster during any on-campus visit.

An exception exists allowing prospects to interact with former student-athletes only while on campus. | Bylaw 13.1.2.2(i)

IT IS A VIOLATION OF NCAA RULES TO INTRODUCE PSAs TO BOOSTERS!!!

Halloween Candy

As long as your budget allows, Halloween candy may be provided to student-athletes. No occasional meal form is needed because Halloween Candy is considered a snack, which NCAA Bylaw 16.5.2.5 allows us to provide to student-athletes at any time!

TOP 10 REMINDERS // Official Visits

1. An official visit should not exceed 48 hours. The 48 hour period begins when a prospect arrives on campus, receives entertainment, or recruiting activities begin.
2. A prospect is allowed a maximum of 5 complimentary admissions to regular season home athletics events. Such complimentary admissions are for the specific use of the prospect and those persons accompanying the prospect on their visit.
3. A student host must be a current student-athlete or a student designated in a manner consistent with the institution's policy for providing campus visits or tours to prospective students in general.
4. A student host may receive a maximum of \$75 for each day of the visit for entertainment purposes for the host, prospect and up to four family members. All entertainment expenses must come from the host money. It is permissible to provide a student host with an additional \$40 for each day for each additional prospect they host.
5. A maximum of three meals each day may be provided to a prospect and up to four family members. Snacks may be provided at the institutions discretion.
6. A prospect may never receive cash or gifts from student hosts, staff members, or boosters.
7. A prospect or student host may not be provided with the use of automobiles.
8. Boosters cannot have contact with a prospects during an official visit.
9. A former student-athlete may only meet with a prospect while on campus.
10. A prospective student-athlete may not attend events in which professional tryout or workout activities occur.
